Lincoln-Otero form 50/50 trash deal

No wedding banquets were exchanged, but a long-term commitment. The only vows will be reduced to contracts yet to be signed.

But state officials hope it's a marriage made in heaven and that neither side will want to change partners.

The union of Otero and Lincoln counties was approved Thursday and has forged new ground in New Mexico. Never before have two counties and their municipalities

joined together to construct and operate a regional landfill.

"We're the first place in the state that has reached the point of actually becoming contractually obligated," said Lincoln County attorney J. Robert Beauvais. With former county manager Nick Pappas, Beauvais has molded the project since its infancy.

"This is the first really serious effort to comply (with new state landfill and garbage disposal goals) and the state is really excited.

"It represents three years of work since the old (county) commission told Nick to start looking for alternatives when they closed the county landfill."

To come together, 10 separate elected governing boards had to mesh, he said.

"That's like 10 school districts with only enough money for one football field trying to decide where to put it and how they all can use it," Beauvais said Saturday.

The 11 members of the Lincoln County Solid Waste Authority represent the county commission and the municipalities of

Ruidoso, Ruidoso Downs, Capitan, Carrizozo and Corona. The Otero counterpart organization is comprised of 11 members from that county's commission, and the cities of Alamogordo, Cloudcroft and Tularosa.

"We will have a three party contract with Alamogordo as the lead," Beauvais said. "They're doing the preliminary work such as requests for proposals for the contractor and they will eventually take the option on the site selected."

Each of the two solid waste boards will

remain autonomous and have one vote when they come to the joint meeting.

In case of a deadlock, they will sit at the table until the problem is worked out, Beauvais said. "We just couldn't find a third neutral party," he said.

"Some of the Otero County officials really were opposed to a 50-50 arrangement. They said they generate most of the garbage and the landfill will be in that county," Beauvais said. "But we said that Lincoln is taking 50 percent of the risk and

Police put brakes on near RHS

High school drivers better be careful out there.

Ryan Wall, 16, a Ruidoso High School student driving a red 1989 Ford, was stopped on Gavilan Canyon road at a point where the two-way roadway was divided by double yellow lines.


Wall was waiting in a long line of traffic when his car was rear-ended by a white 1990 Honda driven by Frankie Lee Reynolds, 15, a student.

Outside of a bump on the head by one of the passengers in Wall's car, there were no injuries.

With Wall were Jason Macy, 17; Bill Cash, 16, and Matt Cantu, 16, all students.

In Miss Reynolds car were Alexas Huckins, 16, Kendra Eggleston, 15, and Lindsey Willard 15, all students.

Police speculated from small paint chips missing on the back bumper of Reynolds' car that there might have been more of a chain reaction involving another car, but police reports read that Reynolds was not sure if she had gotten hit from the rear or not.

Council considers high cost mass transit system

The best bet for most interesting news item in Tuesday's Ruidoso Village Council meeting will come from a closed session.

At a special council meeting on the village's Capital Improvement Plan two weeks ago, councilors asked for an additional \$25,000 to be budgeted for improvements on Grindstone property, which they don't own.

Shortly after that proposal, they moved into closed session to discuss acquisition of real property by the village.

Action proposed in a closed session is brought back into regular session to comply with the open meetings act.

Although it is not known what property the village intends to bid on from that meeting, Councilor Ron Andrews was the only dissenting vote. No reason was given.

Tuesday's closed session is about the same acquisition of real property by the village.

The Grindstone acreage, held by the Federal Deposit Insurance Company (FDIC) and to be sold by

either FDIC or the Resolution Trust Company, has an estimated value of \$460,000 to \$500,000.

In regular agenda items to be discussed Tuesday, MainStreet director Mary Maul will speak on the proposed Joint Powers Agreement between the village and the New Mexico State Highway and Transportation Department.

The joint powers agreement is in relationship to severance tax money to be used for portions of the MainStreet project.

State planner Luis Duffy sent Maul four copies of a joint powers severance tax agreement to construct MainStreet phase one, provide construct engineering and design and engineering of phases two and three of the MainStreet project.

Duffy said after the agreements were signed, he would answer questions to ensure mutual understanding.

Duffy noted that the funds are from a bond issue sold on July 28, 1992, and the village must contract for this project no later than January 28, 1993.

People are seeing red in most of the communities around Ruidoso.



County tosses subdivision request back to planning and zoning board

They've been burned by past mistakes of previous commissions and developers.

Lincoln County Commissioners don't want to perpetuate the negative legacy for those who follow them on the board.

Unfortunately, for Jerry Deal that means another month's delay before he can move ahead with River's Edge subdivision in Hondo Valley off U.S. Highway 70.

"This subdivision is suffering the backlash from this commission running into a lot of previously approved subdivisions gone sour and we want to make sure this one is correct," Commission Chairman Stirling Spencer told Deal Tuesday.

Commissioners said they want a "clean" recommendation from the county's planning and zoning board.

Right now, that recommendation refers to the subdivision as a one-stage development. Deal has asked the commission for approval in two phases of construction, one on each side of the river.

He contended Tuesday that from the start, two phases were intended.

Commissioners responded that they can only react to what is down in print.

"I spent three hours listening to tapes of the planning and zoning meeting," Spencer said. He heard no mention of two phases and also has talked to board members, who told him they were unaware of phases, he said.

"It's my opinion that we should approve it on the basis OK'd by planning and zoning as full improvements in place before lots are sold," Spencer said.

"In my opinion, you have to go back to that board if now you are asking for two phases."

Deal said he doesn't have much choice. "After 11 months, it doesn't make much difference. I missed the selling season this year and it's advantageous to have two phases, with the changes in the economic situation in the year that has

passed. The next zoning meeting is set for Thursday, October 29. The recommendation from that board would go to the commission at its November meeting.

Just to be sure no other problems are lurking in the background, he asked commissioners, "If I were changing gears, is there a problem with having two phases?"

"If the planning and zoning board recommends it, I probably don't have any worries except how the roads and bridge set," Spencer said.

Deal said he's very discouraged by the delays. He felt in August, approval would be granted. Now it's October and he still hasn't been given the green light.

"This is the first I've heard about (the misunderstanding with two phases) and it doesn't seem very reasonable to me. Sorry," Deal said.

Spencer insisted that at the last commission meeting, he specifically asked whether it had been presented to the zoning board as a two-phase development.

The county isn't the only source of delay, the State Highway Transportation Department also has raised flags about access to the subdivision from U.S. 70 three miles north of Glencoe.

Officials with that department have noted that a new access must be pinpointed because the proposed road is situated on the middle of a horizontal curve. They also have written that a suitable culvert must be installed, a traffic impact analysis must be performed and a permit for access to the highway must be obtained.

Commissioner Monroy Montes told Deal, "This commission has been dealing with a lot of problems from subdivisions approved by other commissions in the past. We want to be sure that's not the case 10 years down the line so some other commissioners don't have the same situation and have to eat the bridge."

In another subdivision review, county road manager Bill Cupit

recommended acceptance of Mountain Lakes subdivision, owned by Mark Casey.

In a letter to the commission, Cupit wrote that he performed an inspection of roads in August and noted six items that needed to be completed. He re-inspected on September 18 and "was well pleased with the outcome."

The commission followed Cupit's recommendation and accepted the subdivision, but had some disagreement over the wisdom of no longer using an engineer to review and approve roads.

"Personally, I have a problem with not having a licensed engineer sign off," Commissioner Bill Elliott said. "I have a lot of confidence in the county road manager, but I don't think he's in a position to make this determination."

Even if not using an engineer saves the county money, Elliott said, "I have heartburn over this. From the standpoint of liability, to protect the county, and from the standpoint of working with developers."

Montes pointed out that plenty of roads approved by an engineer and accepted by the county don't even fit the proper design. "I feel ready to go with Bill Cupit's recommendation," he said.

Beauvais said approval by an engineer is not required by law, although it is referenced in the county subdivision ordinance.

If someone were to sue the county over a road, design is not an aspect subject to compensatory damages, he said.

"But if a road starts to deteriorate, whether you have recourse depends on if it was built right," Beauvais said. "Cupit assures me he feels competent to make that determination."

"We haven't had a county engineer for a long time. The one we did use was on contract."

"Cupit is going to be the man maintaining the roads within the restrictions (of his budget) we hang over his head," Spencer said.

The council wants to amend prioritization of the Capital Improvement Plan (CIP).

After the last meeting regarding CIP, the Mass Transportation section was added to the village program.

The council-appointed transportation board has gone most of the year without turning in minutes. Transportation board minutes are included in this Tuesday's council packet.

According to the minutes, members present at an October 20 meeting were Dick Weber, Victor Alonso, Patricia Espinosa and Ed Fleck.

Although not much has been said at council meetings regarding the proposed mass transit bus line, minutes read that proposals on the business plan were mailed to the vendors and the deadline for return is October 25.

The minutes read that "Victor requested that the council be kept up to date on the happenings of the transit system."

Apparently, Alonso feels the council should know what's going on with the transportation board before it implements any mass transit plan.

The council has budgeted money for a feasibility study, but that money has not been spent.

The CIP is a guideline for the Department of Finance Administration (DFA) to know community needs and priorities. Village departments were asked for input on their department needs. DFA could question if a mass transit system, ultimately subsidized with tax payers money, is necessary for a community as small as Ruidoso.

Ruidoso could not stop subsidized Mesa Airlines from pulling out of the area when it became apparent funding would be cut.

The CIP funding projections for a village mass transportation system include: 1993, \$850,000; 1994, \$150,000; 1995, \$150,000; 1996, \$250,000; and 1997, \$150,000.

Weber mentioned that the council also should be updated on the progress of his Resort Airline idea.

The private airline proposal no longer co-mingles its money with the village funds and not much information has been heard from the venture.

The Iron Horse Railroad idea, a 100-million dollar transit system that is a private venture of Dick Weber, was not mentioned at the transportation meeting. However, Weber has returned money loaned by the Economic Development Corporation of Lincoln County for a feasibility study.

Deputy manager Alan Briley is requesting the council prioritize the CIP section again.

Priority ranking by the council to date is:

1. Wastewater collection
2. Water distribution
3. Regional wastewater treatment
4. ADA compliance (ramps, etc.)
5. Streets
6. Civic Events Center
7. Planning (?)
8. Airport (share of FAA funds)
9. Senior citizens
10. Police Department
11. Main Street
12. Parks and Recreation
13. City Hall
14. Fire Department
15. Library
16. Vehicle maintenance

The mass transportation proposals could be added somewhere within those line items.

Parks and recreation has been a low priority for this council and last Ruidoso councils, although the town bills itself as Playground of the Southwest.

The council projects only \$30,000 for capital improvement in 1993, \$69,620 in 1994 and a whopping \$790,000 for 1995, without noting any particular projects. The council recommends a drop to \$80,000 in 1996 and a modest \$44,000 in 1997.

Those figures could change with a new administration within two years.

Village purchasing agent Fonda Hazel recommends the village fire

department purchase a 1993 4x4 cab and chassis from low bidder Galles Chevrolet of Albuquerque. Galles had the low bid at \$18,532.

Director Joan Bailey of the Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce will request advertising budget approval for Winterfest special events, a one page Ruidoso News Winter Guide for \$1400.

Village planner Cleatus Richards will recommend that the council acknowledge substantial completion of the civic events center and authorize signing the certificate of substantial completion.

Richards said the village has held 10 events in the center since August 21, with approximately 30,600 people attending the respective events. He said this clearly represents use of the facility for which it was intended.

Richards said signing the document does not alter the responsibility of the contractor to complete remaining items of the project according to the contract.

Reworking carpet seams appears to head the list of incomplete items.

Richards also submitted a memorandum to the council for the partial release of retained money to Bradley Construction Inc. for the civic center.

A pay request from Bradley, was tabled at the October 13 meeting, because of items of work remaining, particularly carpeting repair and replacement; payment by Bradley of claims from subcontractors; and approval of the bond company regarding the release.

Richards will report on those items.

Other agenda items include:

—A bid award for furniture for the civic events center.

—An environmental department agreement.

—Appointments to boards and commissions.

Donald Miller, Alden Dayo and Herb Brunell were recommended by the board of directors of Main Street to be on the village's downtown business district zoning task force.

is providing 50 percent of the financing."

At the meeting Thursday, representatives from the two solid waste boards voted to sign a memorandum of agreement (essentially a contract) to undertake and finance together a long term regional landfill.

Consultants already have been working on behalf of the group and on November 16, when they sign the agreement, the consultants will go over the short list of recommended sites," Beauvais said.

"The consultants have been drilling core samples. The state requires at least 100 feet to ground water. They are analyzing the com-

position of the material in the core, because it could change the value of the site.

"They're finding the closer they go toward White Sands, the more the water table rises. No sites are in Lincoln County, they're in northern Otero. Only one is south of Alamogordo."

Beauvais said a contractor must be hired to take the two entities through the design and permitting stages.

"That could possibly be a contentious subject," he said.

"They've looked at about 12 sites," Beauvais said. The five best sites will be ranked based on the criteria for a permit and drilling information on water table depth and quality. The information will be presented to the group at the No-

ember meeting.

He was pleased that the State Department of Environment already has assigned one person to work with the two boards. "We hope to eliminate any last minute surprises," he said.

The state has a stake in this union working well.

"I think everyone had a sense of history," at the Thursday meeting when the vote was recorded, Beauvais said. The two counties share no other interests in common, making the feat even more impressive.

To give Lincoln the footing it needed with the more populated Otero, "we had everything ready, so they worked off our documents," Beauvais said. "I'm really heartened by the cooperation."

At school this week, poster contests are planned, elementary kids will draw drug-free slogans on paper grocery sacks to be returned to the store and handed out to customers, and trash cans will be painted with drug-free slogans.

A drug-free New Mexico banner will be placed on school grounds; an assembly of students and parents is

planned with each grade presenting a few program minutes; and a drug free dance is set with reduce admission for those wearing red ribbons.

Buddee is looking for loving home

She's different from most of the other dogs in the Lincoln County Humane Society shelter.

While they greet the familiar visitor eagerly and are happily diverted when handed a treat through the kennel door, Buddee's excitement ebbs as she sniffs the snack.

She knows the cookie is a substitute for attention. She knows snacks are offered on the days the visitor can't take her for a walk.

Buddee hungers for kind words, gentle stroking and companionship, not for food.

Shelter workers aren't quite sure how Buddee arrived, but it was about four months ago.

She's not a pushy dog. She's not demanding.

"If you want to spend time with her, she's tickled to death for the attention," said shelter manager Randy Basch. "If not, she'll find a spot and lie down."

About two years old, Buddee is a chow/golden retriever mix with the latter's traditional easy-going disposition.

"She's good with other dogs and with children of any age," Basch said. "She's gentle enough to be good with older people too. She's very quiet, doesn't bark excessively."

"With her heavy coat, she's well suited for the outdoor life, if she has a good dog house and secure yard."

Not a large dog, Buddee is built solidly with caramel red coloring. She would need to be spayed as part of the adoption agreement.

All animals adopted from the

shelter must be spayed or neutered to ensure they do not reproduce more unwanted and abandoned litters that die of neglect or must be destroyed.

One of the past pets featured in The Ruidoso News attracted the attention of a benefactor, who paid for her spaying. Bouncy, the small Clumber spaniel mix, successfully underwent the procedure two weeks ago and now is back at the shelter ready for adoption.

"The stitches have been removed and she's happy, healthy and ready to go," Basch said. Bouncy is reddish brown in color with black tips to her ears and tail.

Three of the Airedale puppies featured last week still are available, as is one of the cat siblings called The Juds.

Other past pets who are hoping for new homes are Sugar, a spunky terrier intent on discovery; blue heeler Rustler and Ringo; and Wrangler, the Australian shepherd.

Other breeds represented at the shelter include a collie mix, a cocker spaniel named Token, several shepherd mixes, a miniature pinscher mix female who's a quick learner, a milky white standard poodle mix, several white Labrador mixes, two hound dogs and a friendly black chow mix/question mark named Midnight.

Four puppy litters currently are in residence. Plenty of choices also are waiting in the cattery, next to the canine shelter.

Sponsoring an animal for spaying or neutering greatly improves their chances for adoption since the procedure is the major cost.

But if time is the commodity

most available, the discarded pets enjoy being taken for walks or just being cuddled in a isolated corner of the shelter property.

Volunteers also are needed for foster homes or just to help out around the kennels. Foster parents take new litters left at the shelter into their homes to give protective shots administered by Basch time to take effect.

Without that protection, puppies and kittens introduced into the shelter often contract one of the fatal diseases that are hard to control in that closed environment. Usually the owner won't consider keeping the litter for the extra life-saving time period.




Birthday brings back memories of Valdez

On My Birthday

This is being sent to you just before high noon on October 22, and will reach you on October 26, the eve of my birthday.

The American flag is floating under a blue and white sky of light clouds, with the oak brush orange and crimson on the hill beyond, with the apricot trees shining in pure gold — a day of true Indian summer.

Not quite 83 years ago in Valdez, Alaska, our mother was praying that her second child would be born safely. And I was waiting to see the light of day.



I dreamt that there beside the Valdez Bay I soon would see the light of day a beaming.

Our father was about 50 miles away in the Village of Cordova, preparing to make the voyage on foot to be present at my first birthday. Father's partner was a giant Swede, N.P. Olson, nicknamed North Pole Olson on ac-

count of his initials.

They started out up the coast about the 26th, and planned to travel inland around the frozen inlets.

North Pole's motto was "Have no fear." "Have no fear," he said. "We can save time crossing on the ice."

On one of the inlets, North Pole fell through the ice and Father rescued him after nearly falling through himself.

The delay caused Father to arrive at our home just after I was born. The long hard trip, and our mother's prayers, formed a special bond of love between Mother, Father and me. And today, after nearly 85 years, I feel this bond stronger than ever, and I feel the presence of Father and Mother ever fondly near as their spirits visit me from Heaven.

Warriors stomped by Silver Colts

With just two games left this season, the Ruidoso Warrior football team will need to plug into its team spirit to recover from a 7-40 beating from the Silver City Colts Friday night.

Although the Warriors received the opening kick-off, the offense couldn't convert it into any yards and J.R. Chino had to punt. Silver's receiving team then did all the work to get the first score as Ear-sey Ross ran it back 68 yards for a touchdown.

The point after kick failed, and the Warriors were able to hold the score at 0-6 until the second quarter.

Silver bulldozed its way into the end zone three times in the second quarter to plow ahead of the Warriors by 32 points. Luck was definitely running against the Warriors in the quarter as three of the scores came on fumbles and an interception by the fighting Colts.

The offense stalled out on several attempts and had to punt the ball to ready Silver receivers.

Flags began to fly in the second quarter, but it wasn't until the third that two players from each team were ejected from the game for unsportsman-like conduct with one more Silver player ejected in the fourth.

The Colts scored their final score of the night on the opening drive of the third quarter.

The Warrior offense was once again stopped without a first and had to punt, but the defense soon had the ball back in the quarterback's hands, as Jeff Cox recovered the one of two fumbles he picked up in that quarter. Anthony Torres also intercepted a pass in the third to return the offense to the field.

It was early in the fourth that the Warrior defense got the offense the shot it was looking for. After holding the Colts for three downs

deep in their own territory, the ball was snapped over the kicker's head and the Warriors tackled him on the two-yard line.

A hand-off from quarterback Victor Cocchiola to Torres was all it took to get the Warriors on the board.

The offense had several more good plays in the fourth quarter but couldn't complete another drive to the endzone. The ball changed hands several times in the last few minutes, when Silver recovered a fumble and then Cox intercepted a pitch with about 25 seconds left in the game. Silver then got the ball back to run out the clock.

The Warriors earned seven first downs compared to 13 for Silver, but only made 80 yards on offense. Quarterbacks Cocchiola and John Echols rotated in on each series but weren't too successful in the air. Cocchiola threw seven passes with two completions for 22 yards and

one interception. Echols attempted seven passes and had two interceptions. Running back Jaime Ordorica also threw one pass, but Silver intercepted it.

Ordorica had two catches for 22 yards and had seven carries for 35 yards. Torres had 11 carries for 22 yards and the one touchdown. Lance Roe carried the ball five times for 18 yards, while Chino ran six times.

The Warriors will play Socorro at 7:30 p.m. Friday at W.D. Horton Stadium with a chance to improve their record by one.

Socorro lost a close game to Deming Friday, and is also without a win in the district.

The final game of the season will be in Bayard against the Cobre Indians on November 6. Cobre proved itself Friday night by defeating the top-ranked Oñate Knights and will likely still be on a roll for the last game of the season.

MainStreet makes plans to help Midtown

With the streetscape project moving along under the guidance of the project consultant, the new MainStreet Ruidoso director is looking for new ways to help the downtown.

Director Don Miller presented a four-point program for continued progress to MainStreet board members Thursday at the monthly meeting. Miller's four points will be organizational structure, a market survey, central business district regulations and a MainStreet service center.

The organizational structure would include establishing four committees based on the National MainStreet points with each committee developing an activity plan for 1993.

Miller has already begun work on the market survey and met with the directors of the Economic Development Corporation of Lincoln County and the Chamber of Commerce, who were both receptive to

assisting with the project. He said the scope of the survey would be as broad as possible and would help identify the types of businesses here, the property owners and other information that would be helpful to all three groups.

The third point will involve developing a task force to work with the village to write a new central business district zoning regulation, especially concerning parking and signs. The village has already approved the task force and Miller, MainStreet member Herb Brunell and president Alden Deyo were nominated by the board to serve on it. Other members will come from the Planning and Zoning Commission and the planning staff.

The MainStreet service center plan would also need a task force to study the possibility of locating a center to provide public restrooms, automatic teller machines, chamber of commerce information, Ruidoso Board of Realtors information and a lounge area.

Miller said the village council

approved funds for five items for MainStreet for the 1993-1994 fiscal year capital improvements program request, including \$75,000 for the service center. The problem is that the MainStreet projects are ranked 11th on the village's priority list, but both Miller and project consultant Mary Maul were pleased they made the list.

Each village in the state is required by the Department of Finance and Administration to have a capital improvements plan.

Miller had first announced the four-point program in October but the meeting did not have a quorum, so some of the programs did not get started immediately. He said Audean Franklin agreed to start the promotions committee, while Tom Battin will head the economic restructuring committee.

Since MainStreet has already adopted a project of work for this year this plan would be an amplification of that and would carry the group into 1993-1994, Miller said. He said with Maul and


the board earning the money for the sidewalks, it built a plateau for him to begin working from.

Maul reported that state and federal highway representatives did a field inspection for the streetscape plan on September 29 and a few corrections will be needed before a plan-in-hand inspection the first of December. She said they will also be working with village engineer John Shaw on a storm drain analysis and utility certification for the project.

She is also still working on approval from property owners to do work on the right of way. This may require a title search for the properties and then she would ask each to sign a temporary work permit, she said.

Maul said she would like Bohannon-Huston, Inc., which created the plans, to work on this because their representatives know the project best.

Maul said she also received the joint powers agreement with the village from the state.

Beware of proposals on legal reform

TO THE EDITOR:

All of us have important judgments to make before we cast our votes on election day. There are issues that concern our legal system that have been bandied about in recent weeks by certain candidates for office.

No one wants to believe that the right to trial by jury in this country is really an issue as we approach the year 2000, or that this right could be threatened by the result of a particular election, whether for state or federal office. Yet, when in the name of controlling "crazy" lawsuits, candidates begin to blame all of our most serious problems on lawyers and juries, it is time to stop

and consider what is really at stake.

The real consequences of the kind of "legal reform" being urged by some candidates today would be an inevitable erosion of the rights of consumers and victims. It is no accident that the kind of legal system being urged by these candidates is a system opposed not only by the legal profession but also by virtually every consumer organization. The candidates who are bashing lawyers and juries are doing so only to protect the vested interests of corporations manufacturing defective products, doctors and hospitals who negligently injure their

patients, and insurance companies refusing to pay valid claims. They want a legal system which would insulate them, from liability and would deter citizens from pursuing their rights in court for fear of monetary sanctions should they lose. The only real winners will be businesses and corporations that injure consumers.

The founders of our country believed that the right to trial by jury was as sacred as the right to vote. Two of the 10 amendments to the Constitution preserve the jury system. Let us not let our system of justice become an issue that can be handed away to those who curry

political favor by ridiculing lawyers. Limitations on the amount of damages an individual can recover and his or her right of access to the courts is something that could affect you in the future. Additionally, without the fear that they could be brought into the civil judicial system and held accountable, manufacturers would have no inducement to distribute safe products. Ultimately, every consumer would suffer.

I hope that these rights are taken into account when we vote in November.
