## Project gets a head start

Construction work on one of Ruidoso's major amusement developments has been red-tagged for excavating without a permit.

Fun Tracker owner Eidson has been red tagged and issued a citation for excavating and developing his property on Carrizo River without a permit according to village planner Cleatus Richards.

Village manager Ron Wicker said laws within the village need to be consistent and if laws are broken the village will respond to those violations.

"We want people to develop their property and improve the tax base within the village," Wicker said. "But they must adhere to the law."

"Eidson has an unusually fine establishment and has made substantial improvements to his property."

"We're not going about town searching for violations, but if we receive complaints, we have a duty to respond to those complaints," Wicker said.

Before approval was given by the planning board, Eidson was developing two areas of his property without a permit.

Planning inspector Larry Hill was asked by The Ruidoso News if citations were issued for both, the Carrizo Creek excavation and the other project, building the bumper pool.

The Carrizo Creek excavation was on the western end of the property across from residential homes. Eidson was widening the river and removing willows with a caterpillar tractor. The excess dirt was used to

build an 8-foot bank and level the land behind it for future development.

The bumper pool project, about 50 yards from the river excavation, is also next to the river and consists of a huge swimming pool, with floating bumper cars.

Hill said the citation was for river excavation only. He said Eidson had "dug a little hole" on the bumper pool project.

However, photos taken on the day Eidson met with the planning board for construction approval, showed the pool already had been excavated, contoured, rebarred, framed and was ready for a concrete pour.

Although it was noted Monday that Eidson had been red tagged and cited, as of Thursday, the planning and zoning citation had not reached the municipal court, according to a court secretary.

Also on Monday, Jim Wood of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers met with Eidson, village planner Cleatus Richards and Arlene Sanchez, owner of river front property across from Eidson's commercial land.

According to Wood, Eidson's excavation would not come under the jurisdiction of the corps.

If either of the rivers, Ruidoso or Carrizo, is excavated and widened, the work would fall under the control of the village, Wood said.

He said that replacement of fill material next to or in the rivers, would come under the corps.

Wood was asked what federal jurisdiction would govern excavation.

"As it stands, the river's not a navigable waterway, nobody has jurisdiction," said Woods. He said neither Carrizo or Ruidoso would be considered navigable.

Could anyone excavate out of the Ruidoso or Carrizo River?

"As long as they have the mineral rights or own the property. As far as excavation, the corps doesn't regulate that."

But the village does regulate, according to Richards.

In fact, the river's protection within the village is dependent on the planning department acting as a watchdog and issuing permits for any river front development.

"I'm a biologist by profession," said Wood. "And I don't think it's a very good idea to do this kind of work unless you know what you're doing. You can cause problems."

"This fill is real loose (on the Eidson property) and higher than this side (Sanchez property). There are things that could certainly affect the flooding of the area."

Wood said that although the corps helps in flood emergencies, disagreements or damage between property owners often is settled as a civil matter.

Wood suggested the property owners get together and come to an agreement with which each could live. He said that Eidson's side should be sloped more with trees and foliage planted to stabilize the fill. He said that the talks should begin as soon as possible.

Eidson said he was agreeable to changing the slope and planting material to stabilize the bank. He said he didn't know when he would be able to do the work.

## Clinton wins close student poll

If it were up to the students of White Mountain Elementary, Bill Clinton would be the next president of the United States.

Students in the second and third grade there learned how to use a voting machine to cast their votes for one of the three presidential candidates on Friday. Alice Payne's second grade class organized the voting day with the assistance of county clerk Martha Proctor.

Students, teachers and aides each had to sign in before getting a short lesson on how to use the machine. Climbing into the ballot machine on a step-stool, students then made the big decision and chose their favorite candidate. For some there was little hesitation while for

others it was a tough choice to make.

As each student exited the booth, the vote was recorded and by the end of the day it turned out to be a close race. The final results showed Arkansas Governor Bill Clinton receiving 128 votes, President George Bush receiving 118 and independent candidate Ross Perot earning 113.

"The kids were so excited about getting to vote. It was a wonderful experience for them," Payne said.

Her students really worked hard and learned a lot about elections, she said. During the campaign the students have done related social studies lessons and map work to help them gain even more from the

experience.


They had to learn the names of the candidates and also had to count the number of people who would be voting to make the correct number of "I Voted" badges.

Payne said the students also educated their parents in the process, and she hopes it will encourage the parents to go out and vote on election day.

Although this was the first use of a ballot machine in the elementary school, Proctor has taken machines to other schools for use.

On Monday she said she took it to Hondo for students to learn to vote for presidential candidates.

## Polls open from 7 to 7

Lincoln County voters will cast their ballots for president, vice president, state and county offices from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. Tuesday, November 3.

County voters, for the first time, will ballot on county commissioners by district, and some precinct balloting will be in new locations.

Check last Thursday's election special for precinct locations, or call the Lincoln County Clerk's office at 648-2394 to find out where to vote.

Paper ballots, which will be run through opti-scanners for immediate recording, will be another new element in this year's election. The simple ballots, with candidates on the front and constitutional amendments and bond questions on the back, will be marked with special pencils.

This new process should ensure there will be no long lines at any precinct.

# Judge rules Lincoln County provided due process to fired deputy assessor

A district court judge has found that former Lincoln County appraiser Joe Wheatley was not denied due process when he was fired in August 1989.

Although Twelfth Judicial District Judge Robert M. Doughty II ruled against Wheatley on the due process issue, he noted that former county assessor Julia Samora had acted in bad faith in the matter.

The case was heard by Doughty last August in a non-jury trial. An order was issued October 21 ruling in favor of the county and dismissing the case.

Wheatley, 63, told *The Ruidoso News* Sunday that he had not talked to his attorney, Charles Hawthorne, but he thought Doughty "made a terrible decision. It's unreal."

"Certainly, we can't let it end here. There's so much to this case. I think a jury would have decided differently. I feel some pertinent information was not allowed (to be introduced into the record)."

"I was granted unemployment benefits by the state. I guess they didn't think there was a case for firing me."

"Until I filed to run for office against (Samora), there was no disciplinary action against me for four

years. Once I filed, she started all this and there was testimony to that effect."

Wheatley declared his candidacy for the assessor's post in April 1988, running against incumbent Samora.

In his letter to county attorney J. Robert Beauvais and Hawthorne, Doughty noted that he accepted the fact that Wheatley had no record of disciplinary action before declaring his candidacy.

"At all times material hereto, the defendant Julia Samora acted in bad faith with the express intent to fire the plaintiff because he had announced his candidacy against her for the position of county assessor," Doughty noted.

He added that the county personnel board reversed Samora on three allegations against Wheatley that may have required progressive discipline and were cited as reasons for termination: tardiness, misuse of county property and interference in the workplace. Samora had included no previous complaints about those alleged deficiencies in Wheatley's personnel file.

But the personnel board found that allegations about misuse of Wheatley's position and improper conduct in two incidents fell within the provisions for dismissal without progressive discipline and that they

could be defined as "illegal activity or other similar violation which presents a serious case for termination."

"This court does not have the ability as a matter of law, constitutional or otherwise, to substitute its judgment for that of the defendant assessor at the conclusion of the pre-termination hearing so long as procedural due process was not violated," Doughty wrote. "I have (ruled) the procedural due process was not violated after conducting the August 22, 1989 pre-termination hearing."

Doughty said he intended to strike form the record evidence (submitted by Hawthorne) and provisionally admitted by the court that was not presented to the grievance board.

Wheatley said that evidence would have shed new light on a complicated case.

"I fully recognize that I have found that the defendant Julia Samora acted in bad faith," Doughty wrote. "However, the plaintiff's procedural due process rights were not violated and substantial evidence supported the decision of the grievance board in the post-termination hearing and therefore, the plaintiff may not recover for a substantive due process violation."

Beauvais said he was pleased that the county was completely absolved in the three-year-old case and that no damages were awarded.

He noted that in the first offer of settlement from Wheatley, a figure of \$400,000 was mentioned. Although accounts differ, apparently several more offers or counteroffers were fired back and forth without agreement.

The case could be appealed, Beauvais said. But as it now stands, Wheatley may end up paying some of the costs incurred by the county.

Wheatley contends county officials did not follow guidelines in personnel policy when he was fired. He contended even the county personnel board realized there were serious problems in the assessor's office in 1989.

He read from the end of the personnel board letter where members put all elected officials on notice that in the future, the board won't consider cases that aren't properly documented, preferable with corrective notices and periodic evaluations as well as valid attempts to correct deficiencies.

They noted severe problems in the assessor's office under Samora, including lack of supervision and communication.

Clinton received the most votes there, too, followed by Perot and then Bush. She said about 160 students in kindergarten through 12th grade and teachers cast their votes at that school.

Proctor has also taken a machine to Ruidoso Middle School for students to cast votes for student council representatives. She said if a machine is going to be used in an election it can't be used in this manner for 30 days before the election.

She said the machines probably won't be used much anymore, except for school board elections, because they are going to paper ballots read by scanners, so machines should be free to use.

In this election New Mexico will have 10 presidential candidates to choose from, and they wouldn't all fit on this type of machine, she said.

Whether the choice of area students will be the actual winner will be determined by Wednesday morning, but the experience of learning to vote was the real issue for these students.

# Word of Ruidoso attractions is spreading like wildfire

Information on the Ruidoso area is showing up in the most unlikely places, like the New York Times and Dallas Morning News, and the benefits are bound to be good.

Chamber of Commerce director Joan Bailey said Ruidoso's popularity is coming about because of a plan, not only by the chamber and the village, but individual businesses too.

Bailey told chamber board members at their meeting Wednesday whether they all work together on an advertisement or each business advertises separately it is still getting the word out to people about the activities in the area.

"We are getting everybody's attention," she said.

Whatever it is they are doing it's making the chamber's telephone ring constantly, said chamber president Paul Crown. In the time that he spends at the office, meeting with Bailey on chamber business, many times he can't discuss business with her because the phone is ringing so much.

The mention of the Ruidoso area in the two newspapers in the last few weeks are "give-me's" not advertisements that cost, he said. The area was also featured in magazines earlier this year to promote it as a summer vacation site, and a

writer from Southern Living magazine visited this fall for an article that should come out in the spring.

Board director Clark Carpenter said he did not remember this type of response happening ever before, but he is pleased that it is.

To help the chamber respond to the increasing number of inquiries about the area, the village of Ruidoso Downs has agreed to pay for a part-time person to specifically answer calls and send out information in the mail to potential visitors. The contract has been signed by both parties and has taken effect.

Board member James Hobbs reminded them that at the board's annual retreat they had discussed having board and chamber members come in to see how the office operates on a daily basis. If people came in for just a few hours they would find out how busy things are, he said.

Crown said he agreed that would be a good idea to bring people in to see what actually happens. He said all the board members should do it.

Hobbs and Carpenter volunteered to talk to 10 members each to get their ideas on the project before scheduling a time to come in. They will also talk to the people after the experience and get their reactions.

Bailey told board members that

the Ruidoso logo, Seasoned Just Right, has also been used by Ashland, Kentucky. She said she is not too concerned about it because Ruidoso has been using it for more than a year.

The chamber is working on registering it now, and she should be able to do it with the assistance of a lawyer.

In another promotion of the area, Bailey said she is working with a company in Lubbock, Texas, on creating a mascot for Ruidoso. She said the mascot would go to trade shows and conventions to promote the area in a way people will remember.

Board members responded favorably to the concept and will be waiting to see how it turns out.

Another thing that has made Ruidoso a hot destination spot has been its special events this fall.

Aspenfest brought many people into the area and resulted in a profit of about \$370, while the Oktoberfest made the group a preliminary net profit of about \$2,250 with the largest crowd it has ever had.

A last-minute circus also added to the excitement in town and the bank book by a few dollars.

In discussion of the financial report, contract accountant Jack Muhn said the overall membership revenues are about \$150 more than

budgeted, which should carry them into November when one of the two big billings are sent out.

One basis that the budget was built on was that the chamber would be able to increase memberships by a certain amount each month.

He said the operating expenses for the chamber are over budget at this time, but the main reason is that they needed extra printing done, including stationary, envelopes and a new lodgers guide. The Lincoln County Hospitality Association donated \$1,000 to offset part of the cost of the guide, he said.

Muhn said he is pleased that the chamber is so close to budget for the first three months of the fiscal year. They are in a more comfortable position in cash compared to last year, he said.

In other business, Bailey said it had been suggested by a member that the chamber's special events be chaired by someone on the board. She said a board member could then make any last minute decisions needed and know the board will support it. It would also get the board members more involved in activities, she said.

"Board members draw more board members," she said.

Crown said the idea of it is that

the board is the policy maker, so if a board member makes a decision the board would stand behind it. The decision shouldn't be put on the shoulders of the staff either, he said.

The chamber has several events coming up in the spring including the Connoisseur Classic in March and possibly a Cinco de Mayo celebration and a golf tournament.

To make the suggestion into a policy, Crown said they will need to put it in the by-laws, which would require written notice to members 30 days before approval. The chamber will send out the change, and the board will make the approval at the next meeting.

Ron Wicker, board member and village manager, informed the group that the village will no longer require the \$1 million in liability insurance to use the Civic Events Center unless the village determines that an event is hazardous and would need it.

He said most small organizations didn't have the funds to pay for the insurance and had to move to other locations.

Wicker also invited the board to the official grand opening of the Civic Events Center from 3 to 5 p.m. on November 14, which is during the Ruidoso Valley Greeters' Christmas Jubilee.

Although this will be the grand opening, he said about 30,000 people have been through the center for events.

Crown said the Greeters have asked for a few people to help them move tables and chairs into the center for the Jubilee and also return them following it. He has trucks and trailers lined up but needs some people to help load them. For the chamber of commerce's banquet at the center it took about three hours to do it, he said.

In her executive director's report, Bailey updated the board on the membership and on her activities for the month. Seven new members joined in October and three businesses have renewed for a total of 335 members.


The chamber also hosted a luncheon for a German principal, Antje Traude, who visited here in an exchange program between the two countries. She was one of 35 principals that each visited individual schools in New Mexico to exchange information on education.

The board was also reminded that the chamber office will be closed on Tuesday for a fall cleanup. Bailey said she and the staff will be sorting through things and storing things away before the ski season begins.

## P&Z to consider sign request

A sign designed to curb unnecessary traffic in Upper Canyon comes before the Ruidoso Planning and Zoning Commission (P&Z) at 2 p.m. Monday, in village hall.

If passed, campers and visitors driving to the Indian Reservation Entrance Gate will be met with a sign at the Main Street circle warning persons the gate to the campground is either "open" or "closed" to the public.

Hazel Haynsworth, applicant for the sign, will provide a letter explaining an agreement with Mesquero Apache Tribe President Wendell Chino.

Artist and sign maker Candyce Garrett is commissioned to construct the sign.

The sign, if approved by P&Z, will be located within public right of way and village council approval also is required.

In other new business, Jim Peables has asked for a variance to allow for a carport to within 16 feet of his front property line on Lot 9, Block 8, of Golf Course Estates.

Planner Cleatus Richards said one third of the houses on frontage have garages or carports closer than requested by Peables.

Under averaging allowed by 10-4-2 E3, Peables is entitled to a setback less than 20 feet required by

code according to Richards.

Based on area development, and side and rear yard areas not available for an alternate location, Richards recommends that the variance be granted.

Bonnie Miltner is requesting a variance to construct a 22x10-foot carport within 4.36 feet of her front property line on Lot 1, Block 9, of Airport West.

Planner Richards noted that construction began without building permit and a portion of the carport has been completed. He said that an area large enough to have constructed a carport within legal setbacks was available on the Bonanza frontage of her property.

Although Richards recommends denial of the variance, he left the possible alternative to allow retention of a portion of the carport completed and direct removal of the portion that is framed.

Under that alternative, a variance of 9.35 feet would be required to retain the completed portion.

Robert Bridges, doing business as Cochera restaurant and lounge, seeks a variance to extend his building along Leon Parrar

Richards recommends that the commission grant the variance to allow reasonable use of the property.

# Abandoned dogs wait patiently for new families to love

It's a story that dismay workers at the Lincoln County Humane Society animal shelter. They've heard too many times.

The owners were moving out of town. For some reason that meant the family dog had to be left behind.

Snoopy was dropped off at the shelter like a piece of unwanted furniture, instead of being treasured as an affectionate and devoted friend.

Sometimes it's hard for shelter workers to conceal how they feel about people who abandon their pets.

"The couple said their kids were really upset and I asked them, 'Oh, where are you dumping them?'" said shelter manager Randy Basch. "They just kind of smiled as they left."

Snoopy is a year-old Walker Hound mix with a good disposition. He's housebroken and would be great with kids.

"He loves everybody," Basch said. "In fact, they said he won't necessarily be a good watchdog because he likes everybody."

Snoopy is sponsored for the cost of his mandatory neutering as part of the terms of adoption from the shelter. He bears the traditional brown on white markings of a Walker Hound with striking deep brown eyes.

Two other residents of the shelter who are top candidates for adoption are Pinto and Duke.

With one blue eye and one hazel eye, Pinto appears to be a mix of hound and short-hair terrier.

"She's an alert dog, very attentive and would be a very good watchdog," Basch said.

She came into the shelter three months ago as a stray and needs to find a new home and some constant human companionship.

Basch estimated her age at about two years.

"She's good with other dogs except at mealtime," he said. "She's very protective of her dish," probably going back to her puppy days or her time on the road without regular meals.

Pinto is white with reddish brown patches.

Duke was another drop-off by owner, several months ago. A heeler mix, his coat is mottled brown accented dramatically with matching light brown eyes. It's an overall unusual, but attractive, picture.

"I haven't seen any behavior problems since Duke has been at the shelter. I don't recall why the owners said they brought him here," Basch said. "He's good with other dogs. He's definitely a submissive animal and shy with newcomers, but he warms up quickly on a one-to-one basis."

"Once he becomes used to his own yard, I think he'll be very protective."

Two previously featured pets still searching for the right people to open up their homes and hearts are Bouncey, already spayed through the kindness of a sponsor; and Buddee with the tender heart and hunger for attention, who now also is sponsored.


The society welcomes direct financial help for the animals in the form of sponsorships that greatly improve their chances for adoption. Many other avenues are open to help, including just stopping by to walk the dogs.

Pet owners should be aware that Ruidoso's new mandatory spay and neuter law is being enforced. Animals picked up running loose will be subject to its requirements.



# Football team faces tough test in Cobre

The Ruidoso Warrior football team held onto its goal of another win this season into the fourth quarter before the Socorro Warriors ripped the score out of reach.

Although Socorro got on the score board first with a run for a touchdown in the first quarter the Ruidoso defense stopped them several times in the first half to keep the score at 0-7 at half-time. The blue and gold offense made several stabs into Socorro territory but couldn't carry through with a score.

With the game still well within reach Ruidoso came out in the third quarter ready to even it up. After running most of the game, Ruidoso went to the air with a 26-yard pass from John Echols to Jaime Ordorica for the six points. The point after attempt was no good.

Socorro's offense scored its next touchdown on a run, but then its defense took over. The skies turned unfriendly for Ruidoso in the fourth quarter, and Socorro took advantage of each pass. Quarterback Echols was intercepted twice for 21-yard and 38-yard returns for touchdowns to give Socorro a 28-6 victory.

Ruidoso earned seven first downs with 59 yards on the ground and 52 passing for a total of 111 yards. Socorro made 12 first downs with 179 yards rushing and 49 passing for a total of 228 yards. Ruidoso attempted 16 passes and completed three, while Socorro made three completions in 10 attempts.

Each team had two interceptions and Socorro picked up a fumble, although for the season Ruidoso has recovered 14 fumbles compared to the opponents' 10. Each team also had to punt three times, which is

fewer than Ruidoso has had to for most of the season. Ruidoso was flagged five times for 40 yards and Socorro was penalized four times for 45 yards.

Leading rusher for Ruidoso was Lance Roe with 12 carries for 37 yards. J.R. Chino picked up 29 yards on nine carries, while Anthony Torres had six carries for 13 yards. Ordorica caught all three passes for the 52 yards and one TD.

Ruidoso, now 1-9 on the season, will face its toughest tests on Friday when it meets the district's top team, Bayard-Cobre, in the last game of the season. Cobre upset the Oñate Knights for the top spot two weeks ago and then proved it had what it takes in an overtime win, 19-18, against Deming Friday. As the last game of the season, though, the Warriors will be ready to put everything on the line for an upset.

The junior varsity came close to earning a win on Saturday in its last game of the season against Deming. Deming scored first but the Warriors made a quick response for six points. The Warriors made the go-ahead score in the third quarter but missed the extra point attempt again.

The Wildcats came back with two unanswered touchdowns. With just a few minutes remaining in the game the Warriors were pushing toward the goal line, but couldn't make a fourth down conversion. The defense got the ball back within a few plays on a fumble but the Warriors couldn't make a first and had to turn it over to Deming, who let the clock run out.

The young JV team had several freshmen and sophomores who gained good experience this season with these games and will take that with them for next year.




### A Happy Birthday




