Auditors cite nine errors Lack of cross-checks noted

In 1991-92, Lincoln County lacked a cross-check system that would detect improper financial transactions.

The deficiency was among nine new and three unresolved criticisms cited by auditors in their review of the last fiscal year, although they pronounced the county financially healthy.

New problem areas pointed out by Emmons & Company of Albuquerque in its 1991-92 audit included improper allocation of interest income, lack of separation of duties in the finance department, violations of the county's purchasing policy and lack of documentation when terminating employees.

County Commissioners, who had not seen the report until the meeting Friday, postponed any action until they had a chance to review its contents.

"They (auditors) pointed out areas corrected from past audits and areas needing corrections, some are repeated," said county manager Andy Wynham. "We responded, concurring with some and not with others."

Under a section dealing with the county's ability to administer federal financial assistance programs, Emmons auditors wrote, "We noted certain matters involving the internal control structure and its operation that we consider to be reportable conditions... (which) involve matters coming to our attention relating to significant deficiencies in the design or operation of the internal control structure that, in our judgment, could adversely affect the county's ability to administer

federal financial assistance programs in accordance with applicable laws and regulations."

The auditors pointed out the county had corrected situations cited last year concerning re-appraisal fees, billing completed projects and maintaining insurance files.

But the county failed to act on auditor criticism last year about the lack of formally prepared annual financial statements and the lack of written employment contracts.

"The county cannot exercise effective control over its operations without the information contained in its financial statements," the auditors wrote. In past years, the commission has depended on its auditor to prepare the statements.

In his response to the criticism, Wynham wrote that county officials believe current budget and treasurer's reports are sufficient and provide more than the required data found in standard financial statements, meeting all requirements for local government.

No written documentation exists outlining the rights and obligations of either the county or six exempt employees who have no contracts, auditors noted.

Wynham responded that the contractual terms for those employees will be covered in a revised personnel policy to be completed before the end of the fiscal year in June.

Under new items, the auditors wrote that a number of functions such as cash receipts, posting of cash receipts, and initiating and posting of adjustments are being performed by one individual in the

Treasurer's office.

"There should be effective separation of duties in any operation to insure that adequate controls are present," they wrote. "It is possible for improper transactions to take place without detection by the employees in the normal course of their duties."

Wynham answered that certain duties now have been reassigned on a rotation basis.

It was no surprise that the auditors also criticized the county for frequent abuses of its purchasing policies and procedures.

Months ago before a disagreement with Sheriff James McSwane over the operation of the county jail erupted into public view, Wynham told commissioners he was working on revisions to the policy. One of the issues sparking the dispute was the county's purchasing policy that requires telephone bids on purchases of \$300 or more.

State law only requires such documentation on purchases of \$5,000 or more.

The auditors noted that the deviations from policy included the lack of open purchase order tracking, not recording the acquisition of three written or oral bids, amounts invoices exceeded the amount of the purchase order, or no formal bid procedures was evident when the present policy required bids.

During the meeting Friday, commissioners approved a revision to the purchasing policy as a temporary measure until a purchasing agent is put in place.

"Until such time that I appoint an employee as purchasing agent, I would like to allow up to \$900 (be-

Mass transit and Mechem top agenda

In an unusual twist, the village transportation board will ask the Ruidoso Village Council Tuesday for less professional services.

The board has opted to pay \$13,000 for a generic consultant to study the feasibility of Ruidoso mass transit and specifically made it a point not to hire a licensed engineer.

Also departing from normal procedures, purchasing agent Fonda Hazel was not asked to make the recommendation and the village council wasn't asked to participate in the request for proposal (RFP).

No general advertising, which normally is placed with other proposals, was used. A legal ad ran in the Ruidoso News, but no other newspapers.

Only one RFP was received. It came from General Business Consultants Doug Conley and Laury McKnight, both of Ruidoso.

The Ruidoso News contacted Dick Weber, chairman of the transportation board, to ask why a licensed engineer wasn't required. Without listing specific qualifications, anyone could submit a proposal as consultant.


"I don't understand the licensed engineer part," Weber said.

Weber was told past village records reflect a licensed engineer was one of the requirements for this type of proposal.

Basically, it's not an engineering study, Weber said. So a business consultant is appropriate. When we talked to David Madrid of the transportation group in Santa Fe, they said the people we selected were adequate. The people we sent out for RFPs are the engineers of the Ironhorse study.

Of the four RFPs sent, two

Hunters jam sherrif's phones

Shots rang out across the countryside last week, a sign that hunting season is open and poachers have returned.

Lincoln County Sheriff James McSwane said the county has been undermanned this season due to an automobile accident just before the opening of the season that put Ron Moore of the State Game and Fish Department in the hospital.

"The sheriff's department has been kept busy on calls ranging from trespassers to illegal deer possession and hunting," McSwane said. "It's normal for this part of the year to get calls. We've got a statewide hunt, with only two men assigned and one is on sick leave, thrown out of a vehicle in a roll-over."

"This is a real busy year for everybody. It's keeping us busy, because we're short a few people too. A child shot himself while hunting near Red Cloud during the second hunt. The State Police handled it. He's all right. We usually get a couple of those."

County election results validated

Two of the three new Lincoln County Commissioners elected earlier this month attended the commission meeting Friday to see it all become official.

District 3 Commissioner-elect Wilton Howell and District 4 Commissioner-elect Bill Schwettmann watched as County Clerk Martha Proctor reported on the election results and the totals were approved. The commissioners will not be sworn into office until early January when the board will be expanded from three members to five.

Proctor, who supervises elections, said voters seemed pleased with the paper ballot-type machines that were mandated by the state when an excessive number of

candidates declared for President in New Mexico.

The only mistake from original figures disseminated the day after the election was one number transposed in one precinct for retention of a judge.

Commissioners congratulated Proctor, noting that the accuracy and cooperative tone in her operation were applauded during a television report on election night.

Glitches tied to machines included having to hand tally 91 absentee ballots out of 949 returned to the county, because a machine wouldn't accept them.

In precinct 2A, the county courthouse in Carrizozo, a tape came out of the machine with 90 blank ballots.

"We knew that had to be wrong and we hand tabulated them," Pro-

ctor said.

Countywide, voter turnout hit 81.5 percent. The three four precincts in voter response were number five, the Bonito Fire Station and Sun Valley with 85.4 percent; old city hall in Capitan with 84.3 percent; San Patricio with 84 percent and Hondo with 83 percent.

Those last two precincts helped return Republican Commissioner Monroy Montes to office in District 5. He beat his Democratic opponent James Sanchez solidly in those precincts, won the Capitan-Lincoln area (with an 82.1 percent turnout) by a smaller margin and lost his section of Ruidoso Downs by only 21 votes.

Republican Schwettmann, elected to a new District 4 seat on the board, also won two precincts by substantial margins (precinct

three, Capitan at the fair building, and five, Sun Valley), but lost in his portion of Ruidoso Downs to opponent Democrat Fred Hansen.

Howell for District 3 swept both of his precincts in and around Ruidoso, beating Democrat Charles Griffin.

The lone Democrat elected, I. Ray Nunley, also took both of his Ruidoso-area precincts. He will fill the other new seat, District 2. Nunley was the top vote-getter, winning 72.2 percent of the ballots cast in his race against Republican Mike Kakuska.

Incumbent Commission Chairman Stirling Spencer, a Republican, posted the second biggest win in his District 1 race against Democrat Harold Garcia. He took all five precincts for 67.4 percent of the vote in that district.

Chairman calls for road removal

The road caused him a lot of grief during the primary campaign and Friday, the chairman of the Lincoln County Commission said he wanted it removed from county maintenance.

Called C030, the road to his Bar W Ranch and cattle pens has been in the county maintenance system for 24 years with little work performed, Chairman Stirling Spencer said.

"Then the road manager did some work with a donation of materials (from Spencer) and there

was a bad political reaction," he said. "I talked to the others on the ranch. We have a blade ourselves and it's not the main artery. I'd like it removed to avoid any controversy in the future."

The county road review committee will take a look at his request along with three others, all submitted by Road Manager Bill Cupit. The four roads represent 7.16 miles, Cupit said.

Two are on the list to be removed from maintenance because the owners have locked gates that cross them, denying public access in an attempt to block trespassers.

"I warned them that the roads could be removed (from maintenance) if access was denied," Cupit said.

County attorney J. Robert Beauvais said specific statutory penalties exist for people who lock gates on public roads. The property owners should be given notice to allow them to participate in the review, he said.

Meanwhile, Cupit could break the locks, Beauvais said. The recourse is to go to magistrate court.

Commissioners voted to send letters to the owners advising them

that the locks are wrong and must be removed. If public money is used to maintain the roads, then they must remain open to the public.

"If we don't see improvement, let them know we'll take civil action," Spencer said. "We mean business."

In another road related issue, commissioners agreed that Cupit and county manager Andy Wynham should prod the Lincoln County Solid Waste Authority to buy a magnet system.

It could be mounted on a county road department vehicle and driven over the road to the Capitan debris Please see Road, page 2A

landfill a few times each week.

"I sent one trailer out and it got three flats," Cupit said. "I'm getting calls and Andy is too. The nails are everywhere."

Wynham said the nails drop off the debris piled into trailers and hauled to the dump by contractors.

"The road is littered with them," he said.

When Authority manager Gene Green said he was having difficulty finding a magnetic system, Wynham and Cupit located one in three hours and sent the information to him, Wynham said.

"We're right there and we'll donate the time and vehicle to mount it on," Cupit said. "It needs to be bladed because of the traffic, but I can't because it could become more of a hazard (with the nails still there)."

In another issue, the commission approved \$500 as its share of support for the Emergency 911 board, chaired by Dr. Bernhard Reimann.

The board has representatives from all community entities in the county, but it has no budget.

"We feel each community should kick in some money and the county can disperse it," Wynham said. "We thought \$500 from the county, \$500 from Ruidoso and then \$200 from each of the other communities."

As it now stands, Reimann has been footing the bill for any necessary travel and expenses, such as reviewing space situations at the sheriff's office and Ruidoso Police Department. But he said he needed \$217 to attend a vital conference on requests for proposals on the E911 equipment. Wynham said Reimann is Capitan's representative on the board while Maggie Bohks, the county's emergency services coordinator, is the commission's official.

"Capitan has limited resources and (Mayor) Frank Warth said they

couldn't cover the expenses and the county could," Wynham said. "Our response was that it is not a county board. Each community should put in. If we approve \$500 as our share now, that will more than cover his immediate expenses."

"Should we put \$500 up, contingent on Warth putting up \$200," Spencer asked, then he offered an aside, "Man, he's tight," referring to Warth.

Commissioners passed the motion for the \$500, but said they would not come up with any more money until the communities each contributed their shares.

"It's such an important thing for all of Lincoln County," Commissioner Bill Elliott said. "We're the lead agency. That doesn't mean we should fund it all, but it is important."

Wynham agreed.



"It's an important board with a purpose, not purely advisory," he said. "They will decide how E911 is implemented throughout the county and cities. We agreed to be fiscal agent, so we already will be incurring some additional expenses. We feel Capitan is gaining because the chairman is their representative."

Spencer couldn't resist a parting shot to Reimann, "Don't stay around Frank too much, you'll get as tight as he is."


In other road matters, the commission:

—approved a road width variance in Fox Run subdivision to 22 feet from the originally required 28 feet since the road leading to the development is 21 feet wide. The planning and zoning board recommended approval.

—approved River's Edge subdivision in Hondo Valley to be developed in two phases north and south of the river by Jerry Deal, with all improvements (for each phase) and highway access in place before lots are sold.

fore telephone bids are required) so that the senior citizens centers and jail can continue to run smoothly," Wynham told commissioners.

"Meanwhile, I assure you that we try to get the best price no matter what the amount. It doesn't relieve the responsibility of getting the best price, only of the documentation."

"When we have a purchasing agent in place, then I will recommend an ever more strict policy, as low as \$100, but it's unfair to put the burden on department heads. Food purchases for the centers and jails seldom exceed \$900. Sometimes \$300 is not practical for food purchases and if it goes \$301, we get cited in the audit by our own hand."

Once a purchasing agent is on board, all orders will flow through that person.

It will be different for all departments and agencies to have to go through an agent," Commissioner Bill Elliott said. He then asked where Wynham would find an agent.

"I plan to reorganize my staff before the end of the year, not hire a new person," Wynham said.

"Good," Elliott said.

AUDIT CRITICISMS

Other current year criticisms listed by the auditors were:

—all interest earned on county funds, regardless of the source, is being recorded in the county general fund. The interest should be posted to the same generating fund, especially when the revenues are designated for specific purchases such as a the Lincoln County Medical Center.

The effect of this accounting procedure is to credit the assets of the special revenue fund to the gen-

eral fund instead of the purposes for which they were legally intended," the auditors wrote.

Wynham responded that interest now is being pro-rated at the end of each month, although a former county treasurer had been instructed by the Board of Finance and Commission to receipt the interest earned into the general fund.

—that "special revenue" funds have been posted to the general fund and general fund revenue has been posted to "special revenue" funds under road improvement projects financed by the state. Revenue received is not sufficient to meet the county's long term debt obligations for road department equipment.

Wynham pointed out to commissioners that the latter comment relates to lease-purchases the county had arranged on equipment and was not relevant. He wrote to the auditors that the commission

disagrees with their interpretation and believes the county is allocating the money correctly.

—that no written documentation exists for the support of proper procedures when terminating employees because the commission hasn't establish written procedures, resulting in inconsistencies.

Wynham responded that termination of employees is covered in the personnel policy, but a formal paper-trail will be put in writing.

—the county's classification chart does not provide for all current employee classifications and there is no written procedure for documenting changes to the chart.

Wynham pointed out that the classification chart is current for all classified employees with one exception and it will be modified to cover that department head.

—no formal written procedures for fixed asset accounting and con-

trol exists. The result is that fixed assets could be misappropriated or lost without detection.

Wynham said a policy will be developed for the county.

The auditors found the county is in good financial shape with \$12.8-million in assets and \$2.3-million in liabilities.

General fixed assets were listed as \$7.1-million, the general fund balance grew from \$2.3-million at the end of the 1991 fiscal year to \$2.6-million at the end of the 1992 fiscal year.

Projected revenues in several categories fell short of predictions, the highest was a \$30,696 shortfall in charges for services. Bottom line showed an \$290,280 excess of revenue over expenditure in the general fund. On the other side, many of the departments' actual expenses were less than budgeted, including the manager and clerk, assessor and treasurer.

The county attorney ran about

\$2,200 higher at \$103,455. Public safety divisions, including the sheriff's department, was more than \$100,000 under projections.

MEDICAL CENTER

In another matter, commissioners approved a budget adjustment transferring \$570,000 for capital outlay to the medical center in Ruidoso and \$250,000 for facilities improvement for the Carizozo Health Center. The money was generated by a special tax levy for support of the center.

Commissioners also transferred \$152,000 from the general fund to the road fund to cover the cost of reimbursing land owners who for years had been charged a front footage assessment although their roads never had been accepted or maintained by the county. Most own lots in subdivisions that were never finished by developers.

recipients worked on the \$55,000 Ironhorse (Railroad) feasibility study. Weber is president of the Ironhorse venture.

One of those recipients was an economist, Bob Grassberger, who worked on the Ironhorse study.

Neither of the other contacts, Dr. Eddie Dry of the Robert O. Anderson School of Management or General Business Consultants are licensed engineers.

Weber said Fonda Hazel came to him for advice. Hazel said she asked Wicker for help in preparing the RFP and he instructed her to get with Weber.

"Fonda was asking where we should go out to bid and I listed four people that are professional research study people that know how to get whatever expertise they need," Weber said.

He said Conley is director for computing for Ruidoso State Bank.

"They (Conley and McKnight) have a business here in Ruidoso that does business plans and research and consulting, that sort of thing," Weber said. "I believe they did the business plans for Richard's Puzzles and Warp Speed. They're a logical choice, because we need a plan of operation, if the council plans to do a transit system someday."

"If specific technical expertise is

needed, I'm sure they know where to go to get one," Weber said.

Contacted Sunday by The Ruidoso News, Hazel was asked why a licensed engineer was not requested.

She said Before she met with Weber, she asked Wicker what licensing should be required in the request.

"I was instructed to request proposals from a consultant as opposed to a licensed engineer," Hazel said.

The News asked if she was told by Wicker not to ask for an engineer.

"No, I was told an engineer wouldn't be required," she said.

Hazel was asked how many proposals of this kind had come across her desk that didn't require a licensed engineer.

"None that I can recall," she said.

Weber had asked the village clerk by memo on October 27 to place his presentation ahead of Hazel's RFP recommendation because "it probably would be a help to the council."

Wicker, also a transportation board member, wrote Mayor Victor Alonso, another transportation board member, on November 4 that "Dick Weber, Chair of the Ruidoso Transportation Board, will be present to make the recommendation of award and request authorization to enter into an agreement with the

proposer."

Hazel was asked why she wasn't making the usual presentation.

"I wasn't asked," she said.

When Weber was told that Wicker apparently had opted for him to make the recommendation instead of Hazel, he said he didn't feel that was right.

"I only intend to give a progress report," he said. "She (Hazel) should make it (the presentation) because she's purchasing."

Weber was asked why the RFP didn't go through the council first, as is the normal procedure, before being submitted to Hazel.

Weber said the council had approved funds to do the study.

But that approval was to put \$13,000 in the budget that would cover a study, if the council desired one. Councilor J.D. James had challenged that figure and was told it was an arbitrary working figure and not an actual figure. The RFP designed by the Transportation Board was exactly \$13,000.

If an engineer had been requested, by law no dollar amount could have been included on the RFP.

"We went to Ron Wicker (for RFP approval)," Weber said.

But Wicker is not the village council.

"Well, if they decline (Tuesday) approval (of the RFP), that's the end of it," Weber said.

"I'm sure someone would have called a flag along the way if it (excluding council on approval to draft a RFP) wasn't appropriate," Weber said.

"We've (Weber, Alonso, Wicker and fellow transportation member Ed Fleck) kept the village management informed. We actually helped write it with Ron. I was assuming the council (approved), in setting the money aside."

The transit system has been a favorite project of Mayor Alonso ever since the transportation board was created.

He even has discussed a desire to move money from the sale of the village's sanitation equipment (dumpsters, trucks and a transfer station compactor) to mass transit needs.

According to officials with the State Department of Transportation and the Division of Motor Vehicles, Los Alamos with a population of 18,000 is the smallest area with a bus transit system. It is heavily subsidized by county taxes and other federal funds.

DMV officials said such a transit system was very costly, noting capital expense, operating costs and several types of insurance.

Weber was asked how the village could operate a bus transit here without a tax subsidy.

"I don't know that it ever can work totally without tax subsidy,"

Weber said. "I think the rides need to be priced to allow the system to break even as best as we can. We'll just use as good a business sense as we can about this."

In other business, the council will vote on a resolution in support of the New Mexico State Highway and Transportation Department's redevelopment of State Highway 48 (Mechem Drive).

The department requested endorsement of selected designs that would allow either reconstruction or rehabilitation of the Mechem Drive.

Rehabilitation, about a one-year project, is essentially a repaving program.

The village council has determined that reconstruction, about a two year project, would be better, as well as safer for motorists.

Reconstruction would consist of a three-lane road that would balloon to five lanes in high density areas. It would necessitate condemnation of property for rights of way and relocating water lines.

Both road options will draw support from federal funds.

When approved, the resolution creates a citizen advisory board to consult with the transportation department.

That committee is to include a village staffer, village councilor, affected property owner and a citizen-

at-large.

Other items on the agenda include:

—citizens comments concerning Ruidoso Pops Concert.

—comments on political and media intrusion of citizen privacy in Ruidoso.

Consent agenda items include: —approval to place a sign near the traffic circle and on right-of-way informing motorists that the Indian Reservation gate is either open or closed in Upper Canyon.

—a resolution that encourages the governor to conduct economic, environmental and social studies for the impact of the storage of spent nuclear fuel rods (MRS) as requested by the village's advisory committee.

—approve village workers' 1993 holiday schedule that includes three mandatory "floating" holidays.

—three budget line item shifts within departments that require no increase or decrease in the budget.

The council is scheduled to move into a closed session to discuss the acquisition of real property by the village.

The council will hear two requests for public hearings: a transfer of ownership of a dispensers liquor license by Three Bees Market on Mechem and a beer and wine only license for Ma Maison in midtown.

Tanya and sweet pups crave love

The German shepherd markings are evident on the back and sides, but when Tanya turns to face visitors, a whole new impression is created.

With soft facial features accented by off-white and light tan coloring, Tanya reveals her gentle nature.

She's one of those super dogs, who's bright, loving and obedient. She's very good on a leash and she's spayed, which reduces her adoption cost to \$27.50 for a rabies shot and city license.

Tanya was released by her owner to the Lincoln County Humane Society Shelter three months ago, without any reason workers can recall. She's about one year old.

"She'd probably adapt to just about any family and living situation from apartment to ranch," said shelter manager Randy Basch. "She's very gentle and is about the size of a small to medium shepherd. She's probably a shepherd/collie mix.

"Tanya would be a great kids' dog, for a young teenager with lots of energy. She'd enjoy chasing a ball, a kid or a cat."

SWEET PUPPIES

In one of the outside pens, because the inside kennels are filled, three young woolly-looking puppies eagerly try to catch the attention of visitors. Peaches, Cobbler and Pumpkin Pie are predominantly golden retriever and about three months old.

"They're all outgoing and friendly," Basch said. "They probably will grow to the size of a small retriever."

Peaches and Pumpkin Pie are females and Cobbler is a male. They've been at the shelter six weeks, one of the many cast-off, unwanted litters dumped each year by negligent and uncaring owners, who fail to alter their pets.

Their coloring is white with apricot overtones.

The pups can be adopted for a \$20 deposit, with the balance paid off within 60 days. When they are six months old, they must be spayed or neutered.

BEHAVIOR

Many of the animals brought to the shelter end up there because their owners' situation in life has changed, Basch said.

"They may have lived in the country and now they have to move into the city, or to an apartment," he said. "The dog is used to running unrestricted and then suddenly needs to be on a leash or behind a fence.

"The owners haven't exposed the dog to any other conditions and the dog finds it difficult or impossible to adjust."

A recent example occurred when a couple who had owned two dogs and lived in the country for three years brought them to the shelter because they were moving into town. They were worried because the dogs were extremely aggressive with other dogs. They were afraid of the liability.

"I had to put one to sleep because he had no chance at all of being adopted," Basch said. "He was snappy and scared."

"People never know when their situation might change and it's important to expose your pet to other people and environments," he said. "A pet that has been isolated will be no more protective and it will be less reliable. The dog will be more controlled, if it is used to many experiences."

He suggested taking a dog in the car when grocery shopping, so that it gets use to vehicles pulling in and out, and people walking past.

"Put the dog on a leash and go to the park, stop and talk to other people and make the pet stay in a sit," Basch said. "Let the people pet him and let him get used to people, traffic and city sounds."

"I recommend leash breaking dogs even if you don't plan on walking them, because you still have to take them to the veterinarian." When the only time you put your dog in a car is to go to a vets, you can expect a major fight. If you put him in the car and take him to the park for a half-hour romp, he won't put up such a battle.

"The more exposed, the more reliable they'll be with old people, young people, noisy people. It teaches them to be calm in stressful situations. Just like people, they can cope better if they've been exposed to more of the world."

Dogs who have lived in a shelter for a prolonged period especially need to be gently and gradually exposed to broader experiences. They tend to withdraw and become frightened of new people and new experiences. That's one of the reasons, Basch and his staff try to find homes as quickly as possible, before a dog begins to experience a loss of spirit.

SPONSORS NEEDED

One of the best ways to help dogs and cats in their search for new and loving owners is to sponsor them for the cost of spaying and neutering, the major expense associated with adoption.

All animals adopted from the shelter must be altered to ensure that they do not contribute to the pet over-population problem. The society doesn't want to see their offspring arrive at the shelter next year, just to be euthanized.

A sponsor may earmark the money for a particular animal or for any animal with prospective owners who need the financial help. A sponsor can request that the procedure be performed immediately or to wait until someone adopts the animal.

Another area where financial help directly impacts puppies is the foster home program in which a family agrees to take puppies home for two weeks to give time for protective shots to take effect. Too often, negligent owners drop off litters without giving them shots and refuse to keep them for another two weeks after Basch administers the dosage. The foster families give the puppies a chance to survive and fight off the many fatal diseases that kills large numbers in the shelter each year. Money donated toward this program is used to buy food for the puppies to ease the burden on the foster family.

If money isn't a strong point, but someone wants to help the animals, volunteers are welcome to visit and walk the dogs or play with the cats. The interaction with humans helps keep the pets socialized and more appealing to people looking for new companions.

Often Basch will hear from people that they would come to the shelter, but they get too depressed to see the lonely dogs and cats just waiting. He pointed out that people should think about what the hour or two of companionship will do for the dog or cat, how it can revive their spirits and give them hope.

Boys cross country wins fourth title

The Warrior boys cross country team has one more banner to add to its collection after dominating for the fourth year in a row at districts in Silver City on Saturday.

The boys had 29 points, while second place Oñate had 59 points. Silver scored 69 points and Cobre had 74. Deming finished with 90 points.

Coach Ronny Maskew said a 30-point margin of victory is quite an accomplishment for the team, especially in such a small meet.

"Winning districts has been their goal all season, and they did it convincingly," he said.

Ruidoso has been running cross

country for about 10 years, and although it had several individual champions in that time, four years ago was its first district title. Several of this year's runners were also on the varsity or junior varsity as freshmen when the winning streak began.

"We have some younger runners, freshmen and sophomores, who will have a lot to live up to," he said.

In individual performances Jeremie Livingston earned first place, while Josh Norbury finished in fourth at the district meet. Faustino Miranda completed the course in eighth place, while Saul Mendez was 11th. Kody Sparks fin-

ished in 19th place and Lalo Espinoza was 26th.

The top three teams in the district will now go on to state competition as will the top 10 individual winners if they are not on one of the top three teams. State competition will be Saturday at Milne Stadium in Albuquerque.

"State is real tough, and we are going to do the best we can and hope to finish in the top five," Maskew said.

One member of the girls team will also be competing at the state meet. Stephanie Haas had one of her best performances all year to finish third at districts. Pam Hig-

ginbotham was 19th, and Sarah Dix finished in 25th place. Michelle Gabaldon earned 27th place. Ann Marie Evans was 29th and Ann Buck finished in 30th place.

The girls team finished in fifth place and Oñate took the district title. Maskew said all of the girls have made tremendous improvements over the season. He said four of the six girls had never run before, and they competed well against some of their competitors who have been running for years. The team also had no seniors so it should have experienced runners returning for competition next year.

On Friday the Ruidoso Downs Sports Theater will telecast the Holyfield vs. Bowe Heavyweight Championship fight live from The Mirage Hotel in Las Vegas.

Undefeated, undisputed heavyweight champion Evander Holyfield will put his coveted crown on the line when he faces his toughest challenge to date in the form of number one contender Riddick Bowe, in a scheduled 12-round bout.

Jimmy Vaccato, addsmaker at The Mirage, has opened the Holyfield-Bowe match-up at "pick 'em." The last heavyweight title fight to open at even money was the September 25, 1962, Floyd Patterson-Sonny Liston bout.

Holyfield, (28-0, 22 KO's), captured the undisputed crown October 25, 1990, with a devastating one-punch knockout of James "Buster" Douglas. The Atlanta native will be making his fourth title defense. The 6'2", 210-pound champion, in addition to a seventh-round knockout of Bert Cooper, owns decision victories over former world champions Larry Holmes and George Foreman in successful title defenses.

Bowe, (31-0, 27 KO's) is ranked first by the World Boxing Association and by the International Boxing Federation. The 6'5", 235-pound Brooklyn native is also ranked third by the World Boxing Council. His seventh-round technical knockout of top-ranked Pierre Coetzler July 18 vaulted him into the position of mandatory challenger for Holyfield's undisputed crown.

Football team ends season with 6-19 defeat

The Ruidoso Warrior football team dug in its cleats for the last game of the season, but it wasn't enough to upset the district's number one team, Cobre, who won 6-19.

The Warrior defense stopped the Indians on several drives in the first and second quarters before they scored with just a minute remaining in the half. Warrior Jimmy Varnadore had picked off a Cobre pass on the play before the score but it was given back because of a roughing the passer penalty.

The offense also had one of its best performances all year and gained several first downs before the Indians could adjust. The leading rusher for the Warriors was

freshman Rex Commanche, who had 18 carries for 64 yards. Several other freshmen gained experience in the game, including Jesse Fromknecht and Mark Wiseman, while Byron Soulea has been kicking for the Warriors for most of the season.

Cobre scored its remaining 12 points in a burst in the third quarter. Two of their running backs each had more than 90 yards and quarterback, Charlie Ortega, passed for 74 yards and ran for 14 yards and one touchdown.

The Warriors one score came late in the fourth quarter when Jeff Cox recovered a fumble. The offense put Scott Stricklin to work immediately. Stricklin caught a 10-yard

pass and then had three carries for 42 yards, including the 20-yard ramble into the endzone. For the game Stricklin had five carries for 55 yards and was also a leading tackler.

Ruidoso earned 11 first downs with 175 total yards, while Cobre had 21 first downs and 358 total yards in the last regular season game. The turnovers came out even for the teams, as Cobre had two interceptions and the Warriors recovered two fumbles, one by Cox and one by Freddie Sanchez.

Quarterback Victor Cocchiola completed three passes out of 13 but had two interceptions. Stricklin caught one and Jimmy Varnadore

pulled in two for 23 yards.

For the season Anthony Torres lead the Warriors in rushing with 311 yards and two touchdowns but was unable to play Friday because of an ankle injury. Leading passer for the team was John Echols, who threw for 290 yards and two touchdowns. Jaime Ordorica was the leading receiver with nine catches for 149 yards and three touchdowns.

The Warriors ended their season at 1-10 against some of the toughest teams in the state, including five ranked teams, but the team has a strong young group to build from for next year's season.

Babysitters switch money for meals

Relatives, friends or acquaintances who feed children they are babysitting in their home are eligible to receive reimbursement from the Child & Adult Care Food Program.

"We want the public to be aware that there is a reimbursement for babysitters for meals they serve to children," said current program coordinator Donna Saldana.

"The babysitter can be a relative and doesn't necessarily have to be a paid babysitter. There are no income guidelines as long as one child is a non-resident in the home."

The children must be between the ages of three through 12 years old and the providers must be at least 13.

The monthly reimbursement for up to three meals per child per day is aimed at ensuring children receive the best nutritional meals in a healthy and safe environment, Saldana said.

Saldana said locally the Child & Adult Care Food (CHINS) program, under the supervision of the State Department of Children, Youth and Families, has been run out of an office in Alamogordo. Corina Montoya was brought on board to operate an office in Ruidoso, which now is open.

"We want people to be more comfortable and Corina also speaks Spanish," Saldana said.

The CHINS program was enacted eight years ago and is federally financed.

"With New Mexico being so rural and with so many children in family day care, the federal government has said here's the money since you're carrying for them," Saldana said.

Enrollment in CHINS will not affect social security, food stamp or other financial aid eligibility because it only reimburses the day care provider for food expenditures, she explained.

According to a pamphlet on the program, the average monthly reimbursement for five days a week and three meals a day would be \$107 for two children, \$161 for three and \$214 for four.

Babysitters will be reimbursed in cash for their own children as well as those they are caring for in their home.

To sign up for the program, a \$15 registration fee is charged at the time of registration.

Saldana said a few requirements for health and safety are imposed such as having a first aid kit on premise, a fire extinguisher and a smoke alarm.

"We give the participant three months to get it together and will help them, so that is not that important at the time of enrollment," Saldana said. "We will come to their homes to train them and fill

out the paperwork. Just call the office and leave a message on the machine, if someone isn't there."

The program currently works with 114 providers in Lincoln and Otero counties. Since Montoya joined the office, the number in Lincoln has increased from two to 22, she said.

Saldana, who has been with the program in Alamogordo for the past three years, soon will be leaving for Alaska and will be replaced as program coordinator by Karen Stewart.



This is being sent to you just one hour before high noon on November 5, and all the mountain world is overcast in a solid unbroken cloud ceiling, with the temperature just at fifty.



explorers from northern New Mexico, who may be discovering Ruidoso for the first time.






WIPP public hearings start today

The New Mexico Environment Department has scheduled four public meetings in New Mexico to solicit public comment on the Part B permit application for the Waste Isolation Pilot Plant.

The permit application is only for the "test phase" at WIPP and does not include a request for permanent disposal of mixed waste at the WIPP site.

"While the New Mexico Hazardous Waste Regulations do not require these meetings, the department is requesting policy and technical input from citizens early in the process," said Environment Department Secretary Judith M. Espinosa.

"We hope that by receiving input from the public at this early date,

we will be able to address many of the issues before the draft permit is completed and issued for comment next year," Espinosa said.

The public meetings will begin at 9 a.m. and continue until 9 p.m. in all four locations. The Environment Department will present an overview of the permitting process at 9 a.m., noon and 6 p.m. at each meeting, then take public comments. Those wishing to comment should sign up at each of the meetings on a first-come, first-served basis.

Groups expecting to present technical experts should notify John Geddie of the Environment Department of their time requirements and the meeting at which they wish to make their presentation. Geddie can be reached at 827-

2850 in Santa Fe.

Written comments will receive equal consideration. They may be addressed to Susan Collins, WIPP Permit Coordinator, New Mexico Environment Department, P.O. Box 26110, Santa Fe 87502.

While anyone may attend any or all of the meetings, a presentation by the same person on the same subject will be limited to one meeting, in order to accommodate as many commenters as possible. The department would also appreciate brevity in order to accommodate more people.

Espinosa said the meeting chair will require any demonstrations to be held outside the meeting room, so that discussions can progress efficiently inside the room.

The public meetings now scheduled are an attempt to solicit specific comments on issues and concerns that the department should consider in the draft permit.

Meetings are scheduled for today in Las Cruces at the Elephant Butte Irrigation District Auditorium, on Tuesday in Roswell at the Oil Field Training Center Building 110 at 52 University Boulevard, on November 16 in Santa Fe at the PERA Building in Apodaca Hall at 1120 Paseo de Peralta and on November 18 in Raton at the Raton Community Center at 128 North Third Street.

Copies of the WIPP Permit application are available at libraries in Albuquerque, Santa Fe, Carlsbad, Raton, Socorro, Roswell, Las Cruces and Hobbs.
