

Civic Center opens!

The Ruidoso Civic Events Center, a village project that has had more than its share of ups and downs, finally had its "official" ribbon cutting Saturday.

In an unusual twist, the ribbon was cut inside the building rather than at the front door or in the front foyer as in most openings.

A handful of people gathered in the big room as Mayor Pro-tem Barbara Duff, who was in charge of the opening, led the ceremony. Duff, who was worried about Mayor Victor Alonso's absence, surprised councilors by asking each of them to speak.

Mass transit systems tap into taxpayers' wallets

The Ruidoso Village Council is moving swiftly to establish a need for a transit system that would be destined to rock the general public for big tax dollars.

Ruidoso village manager Ron Wicker apparently was in error when he told the council last Tuesday that bus transit capital expense would be funded with 90 percent federal money, five percent state and five percent local money.

David Madrid, New Mexico's transportation planner who works with Urban Mass Transit Authority (UMTA), said Wicker's figures related to aviation. He said bus transit is 80 percent federal, 20 percent local. And operating costs would be a 50-50 split.

The big question being asked by most citizens, is "Why? What's the need?"

Various transit operators throughout the west were contacted by **The Ruidoso News** for comment on their experience with transit systems and opinions about a rural transit system for a resort town with a base population of 4,900.

Before answering, they asked: "Do you guys or the city planner have something like a Honda plant coming?"

"Is there something on the drawing board that is going to increase your population dramatically in the next few years?"

Subsidies add up to big local share

"Is some major employer going to come in?"

"Do you have major traffic congestion or something?"

The answer was "no" to each question.

David Grover, who heads the transit system in North Lake Tahoe, questioned whether there is a need for a bus line in Ruidoso.

"Well, I don't know why you guys are looking for transit other than the fact that there's a bunch of money out there that you want to compete for," he said.

"Transit is expensive. Unless people realize there's a horrendous cost to transportation, they shouldn't get involved in it. The maintenance is very expensive and labor is very expensive.

"A system will fail with inadequate funding. You can't expect ridership to support a transit system. That funding source and commitments have to be in place.

"That's why we would like to see more private firms, larger businesses, in our plan with commitment funding. Your post office, your telephone company, your sewer plant, businesses that are on line now that have a considerable employee base will benefit if they would ask employees or offer incentives to ride the transit into work.

"I'd take a real long look at an area with a base population of 4,900. You'd have to get more than 50 percent of your population riding your bus.

"You'd be better off just to have a taxi system that was subsidized for those people that want or need transportation."

He suggested a few alternatives.

"If we have a hotel that is soliciting people to come visit, we may have a small van pool to visit the local airport. The hotels own those. They go to the airport, pick the people up and drive them back to their facility," Grover said.

"Do you have land available to construct parking on another street? That's a hell of a lot cheaper than transit."

Transit operators queried gave a number of options for financing a system that if enacted would include subsidies from Ruidoso Downs Race Track, Furr's, Lincoln County Medical Clinic, Texas-New Mexico Power, General Telephone, Wal-mart, the U.S. Forest Service, as well as local government entities.

They said other approaches tried include increasing lodgers tax, gasoline tax, sales tax and personal income tax with the money designated for transit.

They gave the following examples:

—California picks up its transit funding from sales tax.

—in Oregon, public transportation is financed through a quarter of a percent on personal income tax.

—in the Tahoe area, the forest service has been asked to kick in some money, because the service is encouraging recreational use of that property, which increases transit needs.

—some areas utilize a Transit Occupancy Tax (TOT), a tax on each bed. New York is 12 percent, Reno is frozen at 10 percent.

—Ruidoso Downs Race Track seems a likely source for subsidy, the transit officials said.

If the village could find consistent commitment from the private sector, some money from local governments and combine the school bus system, the Americans with Disabilities Act, and senior citizens all into one system, it might float.

—grant money is available and gasoline tax is used by some areas.

—Park City (Utah) uses a business tax. The concept was approved by voters. The tax is based on square footage of the business. A small business would pay less than a large supermarket.

—in another approach, a local hospital subsidizes a senior citizens transit service, which also benefits from "clear air" money, air mitigation fees and others sources. But it's a very expensive system.

—funding is spiderwebbed in Tahoe.

"It comes from all different directions," Grover said. "We also get help from the Tahoe Area Regional Planning Agency (TARPA), federally mandated ecological controllers.

The North Tahoe system doesn't run on ridership money.

"We're subsidized by Chapter 13 funds from the state of California, which is a transit gas tax that is added to each gallon of gas purchased in the state," Grover said.

"That goes into a general fund, which is designated for transit, and then returned to us on a population basis. That's the money Placer County uses."

For a winter transit system, Grover said his organization initially contracted out to private people.

"They don't have enough riders to carry the winter season, so we will take it back over," he said. "It will be funded in a five-way partnership. Two of the partners are Nevada County and Placer County. Three other partners are the ski

areas: Squaw Valley USA, Alpine Meadows and Perrine Resort, a large development company.

That program costs us \$45,000 just for the winter season, which was 121 days of operation.

CLOSER TO HOME

At the last Ruidoso Village Council meeting, both former village transportation board head Dick Weber and village Councilor Ron Andrews offered examples of transit systems.

Weber mentioned Melrose and Fort Sumner. Andrews talked of north Lake Tahoe. Neither had details about the costs or operation. Weber said he would research Melrose and Fort Sumner.

According to Madrid, those two communities operate demand response units.

"In other words, you can notify them 24 hours ahead of time, give the time when you would like to be picked up in those cities for a small fare," Madrid said. "The one in Melrose is called Melrose Senior Citizens Center and the one in Fort Sumner is called the DePaca County Senior Citizens."

They are public transportation vans. It just so happens they are administered by the senior citizens. Both are one-van systems."

Trash group works on partnership plan

It looks like a long one for members of the Lincoln County Solid Waste Authority Monday.

Several issues connected to the authority's operation of a regional landfill with Otero County are scheduled to be decided during the meeting that will begin at 9 a.m. today in the recycling center at 222 Second Street in Ruidoso Downs.

The issues include how the Lincoln group will reconcile casting one vote at joint meetings.

Authority attorney J. Robert Beauvais also will present some options for voting when members are absent, such as proxies.

He will review with the board the memorandum of agreement with Otero.

The authority is set to meet with its counterpart in Otero at 6:30 p.m. Thursday, November 19, in the Tularosa Senior Citizens Cen-

ter.

One of the main topics at that get-together will be the hiring of a consultant to handle the application for a state landfill permit.

Members also will wrestle with the selection of a final landfill site.

In issues closer to home, authority manager Gene Green Monday will present bids and offer a recommendation for litter control and white goods disposal.

He also will review the status of collection in the unincorporated portions of the county. The State Highway Department has approved for six months the placement of dumpsters at sites along U.S. 70 and other major arteries.

Green will discuss the monthly billing procedure, as well as the authority's joint powers agreement with the Lincoln County Commis-

sion.

A plan to paint dumpsters with scenes in an attempt to make them more attractive also is scheduled to be brought back to the board.

Last month, without a quorum necessary to take a vote, authority members present at the meeting indicated they did not favor the plan because of the difficulties connected to maintenance. Some also said they felt dumpsters should blend, not stand out.

But at a subsequent special meeting following a closed-to-the-public executive session of the board, a vote on the proposal split 3-3.

Green has asked the painting plan proposer to come back to the board and pitch the painting idea again.

Contacted by **The Ruidoso News**, Gus Cordova, city manager

in Taos, said his council considered a similar plan a few years ago, but it never materialized.

"I think the only concern we had was that the dumpsters are harshly treated by loading trucks and would be damaged and scratched," Cordova said. "It would require a commitment and a lot of coordination to maintain them."

Taos only uses dumpsters in commercial areas. Polycasters are provided in residential sections, he said.

The council has permitted parks and recreation personnel to paint 32-gallon galvanized trash cans in the main plaza with flowers and designs, Cordova said.

"The department maintains them and they are emptied by hand," he said. "But we are looking at replacing them with a more modern trash disposal unit that's finished with pebble rock and has a 30-gallon container hidden inside."

Consultants gathering data for transportation survey

With the help of a state highway and transportation department project, Ruidoso may get a marketing plan for Sierra Blanca Regional Airport.

Federal and state grants are being used by the New Mexico Highway and Transportation Department to do a statewide air service study to be completed by the spring of 1993.

Representatives of S.H. and E. Inc., a transportation and aviation research firm of Boston, Massachusetts, were in Ruidoso Thursday to explain the survey process and to begin obtaining data for this area.

David Drinkwater, executive with S.H. and E., said the state department is making an extensive effort to study the transportation infrastructure that will be needed for the future and aviation will have a major role in it. He said the three goals they will have in doing the study is to accurately analyze the current air transportation, to understand the needs and objectives of individual airports in the state and to create a plan that will help develop a market plan for the individual airports.

Drinkwater said the group had done some research through public sources but will now meet with members in the communities to obtain more information to support what it has already found or fill in any blanks. About a handful of business people related to the travel and tourism industry, along with Village Councilor Barbara Duff and state highway department and aviation officials, were at the

Ruidoso meeting.

The research group is now collecting more data and doing field work, but Drinkwater said the study should be done by spring. The study would result in one main statewide report on air travel and five reports on the larger communities. One aviation report for the tourism markets of Ruidoso and Taos would also be completed.

The current situation of Taos and Ruidoso are similar in that they have a large tourist population coming in but no daily air service. For Ruidoso an alternative airport for people to fly in on is at least two to four hours away.

Former village councilor Al Junge pointed out that when a city has an airport that serves as a hub, a large percentage of the people are on their way to somewhere else. When Ruidoso has people coming in, this is their destination. Many of the people coming also aren't going to fly because they want to have their own cars to tour around in and that should be considered in the equation, he said.

Drinkwater said the option to this is that people could fly in to a point and then rent a car to come to Ruidoso. He said they may want the convenience of a car, but if they have to drive a long distance and have a short time, a car wouldn't be convenient.

In the research they had available on Ruidoso, it has shown a growth rate of 11 percent for the past 10 years and 7 percent is projected for the coming 10 years. The lodgers tax receipts have followed a generally upward trend although the oil and gas bust in the

1980s did affect it.

Junge said the increase in the last few years may also be because of an increase in the tax. Drinkwater asked if the occupancy capacity had maintained the stable rate in that time, and audience members said it had.

Patricia Espinosa of Discovery Travel said the village did have a pretty good increase in the occupancy in the last few years. Drinkwater said he could use any kind of data available on the occupancy and where the people originate from.

She said the business of the two travel agencies in the village is almost solidly with the local people. Shelly Streck with S&S Charter said most of their groups are from outside of the area, mostly from Mexico and California.

Dick Weber of Shadow Mountain Lodge and the Resort Air project said four lodging establishments are computerized and can give Drinkwater that information. He said they can either show the source by zip code or city for the summer season, winter season and off-season. The four businesses would represent about 25 percent of lodgers in Ruidoso and shows a variety from a chain to a country inn, he said.

Drinkwater and his assistants will continue to collect data through the information turned into the Ruidoso Chamber of Commerce or the Economic Development Corporation of Lincoln County. The Ruidoso meeting was organized by Lloyd Wayne, airport manager, and Joan Bailey, director of the chamber of commerce.

Abandoned dogs hope for a second chance

The rough life he's led is written on his face in nicks, scratches and scars.

A sad Sunnybrook Lad was brought into the shelter as a stray about two weeks ago. It's not the first time.

"He's been tranquilized, trapped, wounded by a barrage of porcupine quills and abandoned," said Randy Basch, manager of the Lincoln County Humane Society animal shelter.

The first time Lad came to

Basch's attention was during efforts by the animal control department and a worried resident to trap him.

The four-year-old Collie was obviously hungry, his muzzle full of quills and he was too wary to grab. Even a tranquilizing gun didn't work, but finally he was captured and taken to the shelter.

It wasn't long before he was adopted, but Lad is back. The adoptive owners never had him spayed, a procedure required by the society. It appears that he has been abandoned for the second time since no

one has reported him missing.

"He's a terrific dog. He's great with other dogs," Basch said. "He's housebroken, gentle, very quiet and laid back, but he needs a securely-fenced yard. Once he gets outside the confines of his yard, he goes stone deaf and is just about impossible to catch."

"This is a dog who really deserves a good, loving home."

Two kennels down from Lad, a Catahoula mix named Cherokee eagerly responds to visitors as they tour the shelter. But so far, he hasn't been able to attract someone to take him home.

The black and light gray vagabond also was picked up by animal control as a stray.

"He's about one year old and has an absolutely great disposition," Basch said. "He's good with other animals and a good kids' dog."

"He's been here too long and needs to have a real home. He will have to be neutered."

Cherokee would require some training to ensure he is housebroken. He'd also be able to live outside with a properly constructed doghouse to protect him from the bitter winter days and nights.

SHELTER CROWDED

The shelter has been swamped the last few weeks with new dogs abandoned by their owners.

Several puppies have died because their owners failed to give them protective shots before dropping them at the shelter.

Soon Basch will have to destroy

some healthy dogs to prevent over crowding.

It's a time when a few adoptions could help relieve the crush and give the other dogs a better chance to survive.

Several of the dogs featured by The Ruidoso News in past stories still are sitting in kennels:

—Sugar, a terrier mix with high energy and curiosity who's ready to run and have fun with a pal.

—Buddee, the heart-breaker golden retriever-chow mix who hungers for love more than treats, and is eager for a new home and someone who cares.

—shy Duke of the fetching gold-brown eyes and matching mottled brown coat; Pinto with one blue and one brown eye, a mix of hound and short-haired terrier; and Snoopy, the year-old Walker hound, who was discarded by his family when they moved out of town.

—Tanya, the shepherd mix with a gentle, cream-color face, who's smart and housebroken.

—Peaches, Cobbler and Pumpkin Pie, three woolly golden retriever puppies about three-month old.

—three Airedale-yellow Labrador mixes, who are the brothers and sisters of Sienna, the pup adopted after being featured. Two are black and one is apricot.

—Token, the freckled-faced cream-color cocker spaniel, who was part of special Humane Society section published by The News.

SPAY AND NEUTER

The society next plans to take its

campaign for mandatory spaying and neutering to the Ruidoso Downs Board of Trustees at its November 23 meeting.

The ordinance requiring the procedure for animals older than six months owned by non-breeders already has been passed in Ruidoso. Enforcement recently started, targeted primarily for owners of dogs that are picked up running loose.


Society officials hope eventually to extend the blanket of care for animals into the unincorporated parts of Lincoln County and to all other municipalities in the county.

Only by putting the lid on the

pet population through control of the birth rate can the society stop the destruction of abandoned animals at its shelter.

"Killing animals is not a humane solution to the pet population problem," Basch said. "Responsible and caring owners, who will spay and neuter their pets and keep them safely secured are the only long-term solution."

Henceforth there is laid up for me a crown of righteousness which the Lord, the righteous judge shall give me at that day."


Karita Dean at the organ and Donna Willard at the piano played prelude music.

Accidental discovery may end obesity

WASHINGTON—Researchers may have discovered a way to end obesity — by accident!

In a study with a potential cholesterol lowering agent, scientists noted an unusual side effect. Instead of lower cholesterol levels, patients receiving a natural plant colloid lost weight while body weight in a control group remained constant.

The scientists say the mechanism behind the weight loss is not clear, but suggest it is partially due to a decrease in the intestinal absorption of calories. Scientists in another study published in the *British Journal of Nutrition*, found that patients consuming the same colloid lost weight in spite of being instructed not to alter normal eating patterns. Despite this evidence, other scientists may not agree on the weight loss benefits of colloids. Someday, pending further study, there could be universal agreement that colloids are helpful in confronting the problem of obesity.

National Dietary Research, whose research topics have been the subject of articles published in recent medical and nutritional journals, has successfully incorporated a series of colloids into a chewable food tablet called FS-1. When used as directed, FS-1 replaces high calorie fats with lower calorie nutrients, thus providing optimum nutrition with a minimum number of fat calories. According to an article published in the *American Journal of Clinical Nutrition*, consciously limiting the amount of food one consumes is not necessary to lose weight, provided you limit the fat.

Teachers go wild in environment project

The number of people living in New Mexico is increasing every year. As more and more people move into the state, our cities and towns expand, leaving less room for wildlife. What does the future hold for wildlife?

I don't have an answer for this question, but I do know one thing. The future of our wildlife depends on the value placed on it by our young people. The more knowledge and appreciation youngsters have for wildlife the better it's chance for survival.

This is the reason the Department of Game and Fish began an environmental education program in the state. The program is designed to help learners of all ages develop an awareness and appreciation for the wildlife resource. It is called "Project Wild" and so far almost 8,000 educators in New Mexico have gone through the program.

The program was developed for use by educators who work with kindergarten through high school age youth. Although primarily designed for use by school teachers, the materials can easily be used by other youth leaders including those who work with Boy and Girl Scout troops, 4-H groups or FFA clubs.

The heart of the Project Wild instructional materials are two manuals which contain about 140 wildlife related activities. There is also an "Aquatics" Project Wild manual avail-



able which contains another 40 activities dealing with our precious water resource. They may be used to help teach all subject and skill areas from kindergarten through the 12th grade. The manuals are not a full curriculum, but are individual activities that are intended to supplement and enrich, not replace, educational materials teachers are already using.

Perhaps the greatest asset of the program for teachers is the fact that it is based on wildlife. Children of all ages are naturally interested in wild critters. Using wildlife to teach other subjects increases student interest and participation while at the same time giving the youngsters some basic wildlife principles. The activities may be used to teach a wide variety of subjects including math, reading, language arts, history, biology and even music. Project Wild may just be the way to add a little extra zest to a normal teaching technique.

There are three other qualities of Project Wild that make the program attractive to educators. First, each activity contains a section with all the necessary background information on the wildlife concept involved. In other words, busy teachers will not have to do additional research in order to be able to perform the activity. Second, most of the teaching activities do not require expensive or elaborate materials or preparations. And last, most of the activities may be easily conducted in the classroom or on the school grounds eliminating the need for expensive and difficult to arrange field trips that are normally associated with nature study.

Teachers and other interested educators that wish to participate in Project Wild can do so by attending a workshop coordinated by the Department of Game and Fish. To set up a workshop in your area contact Heidi Solper at 827-7867. Workshops can be either a normal six hours in length or a longer 16 hours that earns the participant one hour of college credit.

If you are a teacher think about Project Wild. The future of our wildlife depends on our youth and without knowledge and understanding sound decisions on questions concerning wildlife cannot be made.

Racetrack operators demand a fair share of gambling pie

Ruidoso Downs Race Track may be forced out of business unless the legislature protects them against competition from Indian video gambling.

"I think this industry is worth saving. The Legislature has a big stake in it right now," said Ken Newton, Santa Fe Racing Inc.

Newton was referring to tax breaks the industry has received.

"But if we don't do something, the industry won't make it as we know it today," he said.

The horse-racing industry revealed its proposal to expand gambling in New Mexico last Thursday: to allow race tracks to offer the same gambling that's legal on Indian land.

The latest proposal wouldn't allow video gambling at race tracks unless it becomes clear video gambling is legal, not just available, on Indian land.

It is also clear the horse-racing industry isn't any closer to accepting the expansion of gambling into New Mexico's bars and taverns.

Bar owners renewed their proposal Thursday to allow video gambling machines in their businesses, something they said would generate millions of dollars for the state.

Representatives of both industries made their proposals to the Legislature's interim Gaming and Wagering Committee.

The panel was formed this year to try to help sort out the often conflicting testimony on how best to expand gambling in New Mexico, if that's what the Legislature votes to do.

Lottery and video gambling proposals have been made and rejected repeatedly recently. One ex-

ception came in 1989, but that measure was vetoed by then-Governor Garrey Carruthers.

There's no indication current Governor Bruce King would act any differently.

Although King approved legislation two years ago allowing betting on bicycle races, he has said he opposes the expansion of gambling in New Mexico, particularly if it includes video gambling.

Larry Calloway of the Albuquerque Journal noted Governor King's strange behavior at the Inn of the Mountain Gods recently. Calloway wrote:

"He entered the hotel convention center, lowered his eyes and clomped up stairs without shaking one hand, slapping one back or elbowing one rib.

"He didn't see anybody or anything on that first floor. No sir. Not even one blip or light. He didn't hear even one electronic bleep or a single jangle of gambling tokens. And he clomped out the same way, passing the Mescaleros' lucrative slot-machine room in total denial."

The ever present John McKean, King's spokesman, said, "It's not for us to know what's going on at the Mescalero reservation, and it's none of our business."

Newton said that King's opposition is one reason the horse-racing industry isn't embracing the bar owners' gambling proposal. He also said racetracks would object to the competition from bars for a limited number of gamblers.

Racetrack owners are asking if they can offer Bingo and "pull tabs" similar to what's legal on Indian land.

If the Indians win the right to offer video gambling, either through pending lawsuits or changes in

state or federal law, then racetracks also could offer it, according to Newton.

Bert Clemens, former president of the New Mexico Retail Liquor Dealers Association, said the group commissioned a study showing 7,000 jobs would be created if 17,000 to 20,000 video gambling machines were installed in bars.

While the gaming committee so far has refrained from debating the merits of gambling, several members expressed frustration that gambling pervades the state with limited benefit to the state treasury.

In addition to legal gambling, there is illegal gambling and quasi-gambling, such as business promotion, in New Mexico several members said.

"It seems like everybody's involved in the gaming industry in New Mexico except the state of New Mexico," said Senator Shannon Robinson, D-Albuquerque.

Members of the committee said they support the horse racing industry, but questioned Newton's assertions that it would force race tracks out of business.

"If you're coming in telling us that racing in New Mexico is going to die if we don't do something, bring us the figures that are going to show us that," Shannon said.

Newton referred to horse racing as "a large agriculturally based industry."

Liquor lobbyists referred to bars as "age-controlled environments" for gambling.

Representative H. John Underwood, D-Ruidoso, noting the crowd at the committee hearing, commented, "It's clear that money attracts a whole lot more people than ethics."

Do we really want to sue ourselves?

On the one hand, elected officials are battering away at the rights of individuals to have their day in court, and on the other hand governments are suing governments for all kinds of reasons.

And, when government sues government, as in the case of the Hobbs School Board's threat to sue the State of New Mexico, it's us against us. We taxpayers are the government, so we pay to sue ourselves.

Let's not forget, we local taxpayers are the same ones paying state and federal taxes. The bottom line is, the taxpayers pay for both sets of attorneys, for expert witnesses on all sides, court costs and for any eventual settlement. And who wins?

For example, if the Hobbs School Board is concerned about the school funding formula, believing that its district isn't getting its fair share of state tax dollars, how can it possibly afford the high cost of litigating its claims? If the dollars are so short, why isn't there a grass roots movement to influence the state law that establishes school funding? If a state law is unfair, voters can use their influence by calling and writing legislators, and even going en masse to the State Legislature, to effect a change. That would cost the school district very little; and each concerned citizen could do their part for as little as 29 cents or as much as it costs to make one quick trip to Santa Fe.

Ruidoso, too, is among those small, rural school districts that receive less in per-pupil funding than Albuquerque. We, too, have had to bite the bullet, but we would hope our school board would avoid being pulled into this Hobbs lawsuit threat.

While individuals need, and should cherish, their right to take their disputes before a jury of their peers, governments and governmental agencies should not use tax dollars to fight each other in court. When two government entities disagree, resolving those differences should begin at the bargaining table, not in the courtroom. Final resolution should go forward through mediation, not litigation.

Clinton: good news/bad news for Bingaman

Part one in a two-part series

Jeff Bingaman and Pete Domenici. Who's up? Who's down?

Will Domenici's undisputed advantage in grabbing the headlines and securing for himself those coveted sound bites on local evening news throughout the Reagan-Bush era wane with a Democrat in the White House?

Will Bingaman finally move out of his GOP colleague's shadow and loom larger as a political force to be reckoned with in New Mexico now that his party controls both congress and the presidency?

From the moment it became clear that Bill Clinton would be the nation's 42nd president, state politicians and pundits have seemed positively giddy as they set themselves to pondering and opining on these questions.


And, although it has gotten a bit silly at times, we are admittedly dealing with intriguing stuff here.

Domenici shot to national prominence in 1980 when Ronald Reagan rolled into Washington and the GOP took control of the U.S. Senate.

Overnight he became chairman of the senate budget committee and, for the next two years, made himself one of the architects of what is now called Reaganomics.

It was heady stuff, and Domenici plainly relished the spotlight which came with multiple appearances on MacNeil-Lehrer, Ted Koppel and all of those wall-to-wall Sunday morning TV political gabfests.

Meanwhile, two years later, Bingaman took his seat in the senate, where, as a junior Democrat in the nation's Republican-dominated

capitol, he quietly went about the business of mastering the excruciating details of the whole range of complex issues which find their way onto the congressional agenda.

In time he came to be recognized by those who stalk capitol hill, Democrats and Republicans alike, as a thoughtful, sober-minded and uncommonly hardworking authority on such issues as national defense-industrial policy.

These are undeniably cutting-edge concerns in this post-cold war period of massive transitions and global economic competition. Moreover, by all accounts, Bingaman played a leading role in shaping many of the ideas advanced by President-elect Clinton and Vice President-elect Al Gore on these issues during their campaigns.

In other words, Bingaman's influence in a Clinton-Gore Washington is likely to be greater than at any time since he went to the senate. What's more, his political visibility in New Mexico ought also to increase.

Throughout the Reagan-Bush years, Domenici enjoyed all of the delicious political perks which went with being a GOP senator in a Republican administration. Not the least of

those advantages was the pleasure of announcing good news to the folks back home. Thus, when the administration authorized research grants for state universities or disaster relief for some flood-plagued region of the state, the glad tidings came from Pete.

Beginning January 20, however, after the new Democratic president takes control, that honor and attendant local press notice will, by tradition and protocol, flow to Jeff Bingaman.

But does Bingaman's expected new prominence signal the eclipse of Pete Domenici?

Hardly. In the first place, Domenici remains ranking minority member of the budget committee, a position from which he should have little trouble making his presence felt. Besides, he is far too assertive and wily an operative long to linger on anybody's sidelines.

Nor, by nature of his personality, is the self-effacing and often reticent Bingaman the kind of politician congenitally predisposed to seize all of the opportunities which will now come his way.

It is one of the things which madden his admirers. As prominent state Democrat and longtime Bingaman supporter Dorothy Cline puts it, "Jeff is sometimes just too damned nice."

Or, in the words of a former Bingaman staffer, "Sen. Bingaman is never going to blow his own horn. Never!"

It might be wise if he did. Because Bill Clinton's election may be a mixed blessing for Democrat Bingaman who is up for re-election two years hence. That story next week in this column.
