

The traditional Thanksgiving opening of Ski Apache welcomed a five-inch snow last Friday night that was right on time for Lincoln County.

The usual slips and slides brought the wreckers out in search of ditches with a stranded car. But accidents were kept to a minimum because of the diligent effort of the village road department.

Police logs show only two cars that required wrecker service. One small car bumped the guard

rail on Country Club Drive and landed in the shallow Rio Ruidoso. No injuries were reported.

As a result of that accident, Country Club Drive was cordoned off by the road department until the guard rail can be repaired.

Residents wishing to reach Cree Meadows from Sudderth Drive should use either Paradise Canyon Road or Eagle Drive.

Another driver called for help at White Mountain and Gavilan. He

Police dispatchers also noted that the extreme cold weather made the snow extra thick. They said the village was fortunate that damage was so slight.

The snow's path covered a wide range, covering most of the state.

Village could buy Grindstone

A report on the proposed purchase of property around Grindstone Dam is scheduled for the Ruidoso Village Council meeting Tuesday.

Following up on reports that the Grindstone property, held by the Federal Deposit Insurance Agency (FDIC) had sold, The Ruidoso News contacted Gary Caughron, broker for Pine Mountain Realty,

which is handling the property.

Caughron could not be reached for comment, but his secretary conveyed the message that, "the office (Pine Mountain Realty) works for the seller and it's in their best interest that we don't discuss any information regarding the property at this point."

The property was listed by FDIC for \$495,000, but that does not mean it will sell for that amount, according to a FDIC official.

Jackson Quigley of the FDIC in Newport Beach, California, said the agency had two offers, one of which was the village. The FDIC recommended the sale to the village.

"Everything we do is handled by committee case," said Quigley. Mary Gerum is the FDIC account officer on the case.

Quigley could not give specifics. Disclosure laws in New Mexico are such that we are unable to divulge. Please see Grindstone, page 2A

Mass transit talks back on the table for Tuesday's council meeting

Despite the small year-around numbers, the Village of Ruidoso seems poised to embark on a mass transit system.

"We need a study first to determine if we need a transit system," Mayor Victor Alonso said.

However, enough groundwork has been laid to date to leave little doubt in which direction key council players are leaning.

—\$75,000 has been budgeted in the General Fund for transportation.

—An application for a transit system is nearly complete.

—A local bus operator has been contacted and wants the contract.

—Council supports a "study" that is limited in scope and only advertised in the local newspaper for proposals.

The study was approved during the last council meeting by a three to two vote. But, according to their legal counsel, David Thomsen, councilors violated one of their own ordinances and the item is back on Tuesday's agenda as "reconsideration of possible action on RFP concerning mass transit consulting services."

Although the issue was voted on in a public meeting, village manager Ron Wicker and Thomsen drafted a confidential letter to the council explaining the possible violation.

Wicker said he wouldn't release the contents of that confidential let-

ter without getting permission from the mayor.

The Ruidoso News contacted the mayor by telephone in Las Cruces last Friday.

"We're going to reconsider it (the action on the study) because we didn't do it according to our local ordinance," said Alonso.

"It is my understanding that we didn't follow the local ordinance procedure having to do with a committee rating."

Alonso said the council usually grades the RFP from a rating committee.

"We only had one reply," he said. Alonso said Thomsen reversed his decision.

"In direct response to my inquiry as to whether we were doing that correctly or not, he said 'yes.' And then he came back and reconsidered and said we might have violated our local ordinance in which case I said let's give it back to the council and that's what we did," Alonso said.

"But, I want you to know that it's not the fault of the transportation committee or (former chairman) Dick Weber or anything like that. It's our staff that let us down."

Alonso said he thought the whole process would have to start again.

"Yeah, I think it will. I have to appoint a committee to rate the responses and then proceed," he said.

"We are looking for a feasibility study and writing a grant and answering a questionnaire (on the need for transportation that was sent to the business sector). Those are all marketing type questions.

"Emphasis on requiring an engineer is misplaced."

Alonso said advertisement in one local newspaper is all that is necessary.

"It's going to turn out to be less than \$5,000 (for the study)," Alonso said. "It isn't even clear to me at this point if we need to do any advertising RFPs. We ought to just hire the people, it's under \$5,000 (the amount that triggers state requirements for bids) and just proceed."

Unless steps are condensed, the council has little time to send in its letter of intent to the State Transportation Department. That deadline is December 31.

Alonso said the council should spend the money on a study to determine what the cost would be before making a commitment.

"Without getting a market analysis and a feasibility study and comparing it with other communities, is to give the answers be-

fore you have the facts," Alonso said. "I want to get the facts first and make an enlightened decision."

Alonso said \$5,000 for a study in a \$12-million dollar budget is not a lot of money.

"We're talking about serving an awful lot of people. What are we talking about? Spending one dollar per person to find out if we can serve those people, and the community and the tourist base better," he said.

Alonso said there's nothing in the world that can progress if money isn't spent.

"A \$2-million dollar civic events center is a lot of money," he said, referring to the recently completed community project. Alonso, admitting the center will lose money, said it would be an even bigger loser without a transit system.

"The lodgers (owners of motels, cabins and lodges) have gone on record and they've supported those increases. They're collecting for this community \$200,000 a year. That's big money," Alonso said.

The lodgers have the responsibility to collect a local tax that is used in part to pay for advertising the entire community.

As it stands now, the general taxpayer will be asked to foot the transit bill.

"In my view, that's the fairest

tax," Alonso said. "It taxes the tourists, the locals. Someone said that's not as fair, because it taxes the locals. But it's fair in the other respect that the tourists' contribution is much greater than the local contribution. That's a pretty interesting tax. We import our tax dollars from elsewhere. I think the lodgers are doing their fair share."

Alonso said it's too soon to say the council is going to take on the transit system.

"You're already assuming that we're going to finance this \$50,000 year deficit (for the transit system) one way or the other," Alonso told The News.

Yet, if the council does not intend to apply, why did Weber take out an application for a mass transit for next year?

Weber told The News that he had discussed a transit system with David Madrid and Josette Padilla of the State Transportation Department.

Madrid said he told Weber that the former chairman had missed the deadline to make application this year, but he could try next year.

"That's a good idea," Alonso said. "If we find this study is going to be a minimal cost, we ought to see if the State Transportation Authority might not be interested in helping

us fund it

Alonso was told that Madrid is the main area contact for the state and is the channel for the 80 percent federal grant money from the Urban Mass Transit Authority (UMTA).

"Well, we haven't applied then," Alonso said. "But if this feasibility study comes through, then we're going to be asking (for money) in the second round. The way we broke up the RFP, is to come back and write a grant application and proceed with that. That's where the grant application is going to go."

Alonso said just because applying for the grant was part of the original RFP doesn't mean the council has decided to submit an application.

That grant application was eliminated (during the last council meeting) until we see if it was feasible or not," Alonso said.

Alonso said whatever application work Weber may previously have done has no bearing on the current situation.

If the study shows a mass transit system is feasible and the council decides to proceed, "we're going to find somebody and have to pay somebody to fill out the application. It's going to cost us money this time around."

Padilla said Weber missed the deadline last year because he didn't bring in a letter of intent by the December deadline.

County gets ready to fix up houses

Most of the homes are neat and kept up the best their owners can manage.

But that best effort just isn't enough when a person is elderly or handicapped and lives on a small income.

Lincoln County Commissioner Monroy Montes has been visiting homes around the county to see if they qualify for help under a \$250,000 housing rehabilitation grant received by the commission.

It was on his suggestion that the commission considered applying for a Community Development Block Grant and he has been dogging the bureaucracy ever since to make sure the dollars reach the people. Please see County, page 2A

for whom they were intended.

Montes is touring some of the homes Tuesday with contractors who may bid on the work and with coordinator Paul Keuster from Tierra Del Sol, the Las Cruces firm supervising the project.

"We walk them through to assess the needs of each house and they submit bids, which will be reviewed and recommended by Tierra Del Sol, then reviewed by the commission and sent to the state," Montes said.

"But what we're finding is that the government guidelines are not realistic for this community and the money available for each house is not enough."

The shingle roof of the home of Olivia Miranda in San Patricio was damaged in a hail storm last June.

"But because of the grant standards, we can't just replace it, we have to gut the roof, level it off and put on the new material," Montes said.

Miranda, 69, is a widow, a former housekeeper. She's lived in the little white house for 40 years. The windows in her home were improved as part of a weatherization program, but some have been

broken and will need to be replaced. Mrs. Miranda's major concern is that a new entry step be built, because she is due for knee surgery soon and already has difficulty entering the house at the front door.

"The windows and front step are minor (repairs), but there may be a problem with the roof replacement," Keuster said. Electrical wiring also may be a concern.

"We have a problem with state codes in that if we touch any piece of electricity, we have to do the whole works. So we're limited. A lot (of homes) have to be turned down because there's not enough money per unit to cover that," he said.

In the valley, many of the homes are adobe, built by the owners, who added rooms as the family grew.

"With adobe, the only way (to correct electric) is to chip away the way, insert it and then repair, patch and paint," Keuster said.

"If we chip, there's no money left to patch and repair. We leave the painting to last. We feel members of the family can handle that."

But there's not much else the family can do, unless members are qualified roofers, carpenters, electrician or plumbers. And often, they are too busy trying to keep their immediate families afloat to have

time to do extra work, Montes said.

"Another (costly) code requirement is to change the water heaters and put them outside the bath and living area," he said. "When these houses were built, no one thought of codes. None of them are in compliance, so if we come in and do one plug, we have to do the whole house and it's cost prohibitive."

Six contractors responded to the first round of projects ready to bid. "None were local except for one

plumber for the homes in Carrizozo," Montes said. "Maybe the local firms hope to act as subcontractors on some portions of the work."

Keuster said construction prices tend to be higher in Lincoln County, especially septic tank work and wells in the higher elevations. That shrinks the dollars even more.

Nearly 70 applications have been received for the home improvement program, but more still can be submitted. If eligible, but not chosen for the current grant, the homes will kept on file for future programs. Preference is given to the elderly and handicapped.

"We had to turn down 15-20 where the people were over income guidelines," Keuster said. "Some didn't own the property or didn't live in the house, so they didn't qualify."

Montes explained that often when a parent reaches an advanced age, they sign over their property to their children.

"Technically then, we can't help them," he said.

"I've suggested they change to a life estate situation (where the property stays under their control), but a lot don't understand," Keuster said.

The grant program will target 20 homes, each eligible for \$10,000 in repairs.

"The safety items come first, then if there is money left, we do the rest," Keuster said. "We put everything down on the list that should be repaired or replaced. The contractors bid separately on the other items in case they are deleted."

In choosing the homes to repair, the guidelines require first consideration to the elderly, handicapped, single parents with children in the house and families that are overcrowded, Keuster said.

Nine houses will be put up for bids to be submitted by November 30. The contractors are required to walk through the homes with Keuster to ensure they don't bid on a job blind.

Before they are finished, every one of the nearly 70 houses submitted will have been examined by Keuster. Those eligible will be rated and ranked on a point system according to age, the condition of the house and income guidelines.

Montes said the worst case he's seen to date probably won't qualify because too much needs to be done and there is no provision for razing a house and providing a replacement.

"The man has no well and carries his water, there's no plumbing, no heat, only a portion is insulated, there's no power, the roof is bad and the floor has deteriorated," Montes said. "He runs an extension cord (to a neighboring house). He has more than 1,000 square feet from adding on porches and rooms, but he's single and about 75 years old. He doesn't need that."

The next step was to see the home of Eva Chavez, a widow who raised eight children and added on to her home by working several jobs, some for as little as 50-cents an hour. She lost her husband in 1965, and two sons later in vehicle accidents. She's lived in the house since 1946.

Her house is spotless. Her pride is evident.

"We started with one room and added on one at a time," Mrs.

Chavez said. "Her daughter) was just a little girl when her father died. We were living in one room and added on with my job. I earned \$1 or even 50-cents an hour, but electricity was not so high then."

Montes said he is concerned about where home owners will stay if the repairs are extensive enough that they can't live in their houses while under construction.

"I think there may be some money for temporary relocation," he said. "I'll check that. She said she could stay with her daughter, but there's no heat."

In some cases, Montes said it would be better for people living alone to close off some of the rougher portions of a house, reducing the living space and allowing contractors to concentrate on bringing a smaller area up to standard.

He added, "We're hoping to get some leeway with the federal regulations to make them more realistic for conditions in this community."

any information out of escrow," he said.

He did say that, as of last Friday, "It (Grindstone property) is not under contract."

Quigley said FDIC sales at exceptional bargain rates often are exaggerated by the public.

"We would never sell anything less than 60 cents on the dollar,"

Quigley said. He indicated even that type of bargain was rare.

Although FDIC owns the majority of Grindstone, individual lot owners include: Nicholas Stevens, Robert Rhodes, Mark Doth, DMMT Inc., Charles Hamilton, DWER Partnership, YuvRaj Nehra, Diane Printi, trustee Donald Dorman, Stanford T Ward, Morris Foster, Ken Dorman Inc., WIDCO Inc., Ruidoso State Bank, and Harold and Gandra Green.

Most of the property fell into government hands from a failed business venture.

Individually, councilors have discussed using a portion of the property, backed up to the Lincoln National Forest, for recreational purposes.

If purchased, property already developed as a subdivision might be turned over to real estate offices to sell, council members have speculated.

have to go by," Padilla said.

"The first step is to send out notices for applicants to send in their letter of intent that are due in this office by December 31. No letters will be accepted after that date."

"Once we receive all letters of intent, we send out blank applications to every interested party. They have a couple of months to fill out the application," she said.

The applications then are reviewed in Padilla's office. If there are any deficiencies, like forgetting to send the certification with the application or failing to sign a form, a deficiency letter will be sent with another 15-30 day deadline to respond.

Once the application is completed, the annual application is sent to the federal government with recommendations, Padilla said.

The money applied for at this time, will not be available until October 1, 1993.

Before money is awarded, a pre-audit will be performed on any grantees by the state.

Padilla said Weber told her that the village had approved \$75,000 for transit. She said his application this year is nearly complete.

The village approved \$75,000 for the transit system for fiscal year 1992-93.

The village budget item named

Transportation Fund, lists revenues as: grant operating 50 percent federal, 50 percent village, \$45,271; grant capital outlay, 80 percent federal, 20 percent village, \$90,400; bus fares, \$6,000; from general fund, \$75,000. Total net revenues listed as \$216,000.

Expenditures listed are: salaries, \$62,940; feasibility study, \$13,130; insurance, \$6,651; uniforms, \$950; vehicle maintenance, \$3,000; fuel, \$15,000; general supplies, \$2,000; 4x4 vehicle, \$30,000, two passenger busses, \$80,000 and radios for \$3,000. Total cost of expenditures listed were \$216,671.

Rick Simpson, local school bus-line owner, said he had approached the village about the transit system.

"They were talking that they would rather contract it than to try to run it themselves," Simpson said.

"We already have the license for that. We have a New Mexico State Commerce Commission (NMSCC) license, purchased in 1989, and we have an ICC authority also. Plus we have the equipment, places we can lease additional equipment and we have our own maintenance facility."

"We've got 25 buses altogether now, between our school buses and our charter buses. And then we've got our own instructor. We do our own driver training. We have a certifier that certifies drivers."

"We'd like a shot at it, if it does

go through or they get the funding for it."

Simpson said past attempts for Chapter 18 money failed, apparently at the hands of the state.

He said, although he had letters of support and village backing to front the operation as a loan, and he had hand carried the application to Santa Fe, he never got a reply.

"They weren't even polite enough to tell us, 'no,'" he said. Simpson said research was heavy.

"We discovered that they really frown on putting money into tourist stuff that is seasonal. They (State Transportation Department) don't want to do that," he said.

"Now a public transportation system that would operate year round, they're more apt to fund something like that. We do have two seasons, which is more than a lot of other places."

"If we ever get a permanent scheduled air transportation coming into our airport, then a shuttle bus back and forth might be (good). A shuttle service would be something to tie into the air transportation."

"It would primarily function in Ruidoso, Alto, and most likely Ruidoso Downs. Of course, Alto is county. It's not going to be really servicing Alto Village. There's Swiss Chalet and High Country Lodge. That would probably be as far as it would go, which is just out

of the village limits.

"Then (the bus would head to) Mechem and Sudderth, and probably down to Ruidoso Downs. The people of Ruidoso Downs probably wouldn't use it very much. Then again, they might. There's quite a few older citizens in Ruidoso Downs," he said.

"You have to have the fares down enough to make it attractive for people. And you can't even pay for the fuel off of fares. It just won't make it on its own."

Simpson said he has a partner in his S and S Charter Corporation, and is sole owner in the school bus line. He said any agreement with the village would be with S and S Charter.

"What we would probably do, if everyone agreed, is to agree to operate it at so much per mile, which is the way we operate most everything else anyway, on a per-mile basis," Simpson said.

"Urban mileage is higher than highway mileage. And we would figure our cost of operation, our profit margin, and then operate it on a cost per mile basis."

"You might even break it down to a cost per run, from point A to point B and back to point A."

"During busy periods they might want five runs a day; slower periods, spring and fall, they might want to cut it down to two runs per day. So we could just figure the round trip mileage and figure cost

per run per day and bill it out accordingly. It would be real simple to keep up with that way.

"Then if they wanted to cut down or expand at any time, it's all laid out as far as costs."

Simpson appeared before the village council in 1990 regarding implementing a transit system.

Leon Eggleston, who was acting village manager, had requested adoption of a resolution supporting the application for mass transit, Section 18 funds from the U.S. Department of Transportation with money to be used to provide public transportation for the village.

The adoption of the resolution was required in order to apply for the money, according to Eggleston. Lloyd Davis was mayor.

In a special meeting of March 19 that same year with Alonso as mayor, Rick Simpson and Jim Streck representing S and S Charter Service, Inc., explained that an application was being filed for federal funds for mass transportation.

Simpson presented a plan for two trolleys to transport people from the Swiss Chalet on Mechem Drive to the race track with stops all along Mechem and Sudderth.

Simpson explained that that meeting that the trolleys would run every day of the year and the route would be flexible with the seasons.

Simpson detailed the application and the request for funds totaling

\$187,750 that included a local share of twenty percent. Simpson requested a \$37,550 local share from the village.

Eggleston said the village would have an advantage through support from private enterprise and discussed alternatives for the village to finance the request, one being a loan.

Councilors Ron Andrews and J.D. James questioned the ability to obtain supporters from local businesses to help. There was discussion regarding collateral. Then village attorney John Underwood stated that he did not believe the federal government would allow the village to take a first lien on the trolleys since it had invested 80 percent.

After discussion, Andrews moved to deny the request for \$37,550, however to assist in obtaining private supporters. Councilor Al Junge seconded the motion and, after some discussion, the motion failed. Andrews, Junge and Councilor Barbara Duff voted aye. Councilors James, Jess Stinson and Bill Karn voted nay. Mayor Alonso broke the tie by voting nay.

Councilor Stinson then moved to approve the requested \$37,550 to guarantee the local share. James seconded and the motion carried with Stinson, James and Karn voting aye and Duff, Andrews and Junge voting nay. Mayor Alonso broke the tie by voting aye.

Take home a Token of canine affection

A freckled face and big brown eyes, set off by cocker spaniel curls create a winning combination in Token.

The year-old male is housebroken and has a great personality, said Randy Basch, manager of the Lincoln County Humane Society shelter.

"Yet somebody either let him loose or lost him and never called to check," Basch said. "He had no tags when he was brought into the shelter. He's been here too long. He's really dying for some individual attention."

"He's laid back, but will play when given the chance. He just eats up attention, but doesn't bark excessively."

"Token is cream-color and would have to be neutered. All dogs and cats adopted from the shelter must be altered to ensure they do not contribute to the horrendous pet over-population problem in the country that results in 14-million animals being killed in shelters each year."

HOLIDAY STUFFING

While it's incomprehensible to conscientious pet owners how others can abandon, abuse or ignore their pets, animals fanciers can err in the name of love.

Basch said family pets can suffer through the holidays from over-indulging in rich table foods.

"Everybody is leaning down to give just one little bite and by the time the dog has circled the table,

he's bloated," Basch said.

The dog may enjoy the tasty food, but it may pay with pancreatitis, gastritis and other gastrointestinal ailments.

Basch said, don't feed pets poultry bones or any other types of bones that could splinter.

If you can't stand those pleading eyes, turkey meat with fat removed and in limited supply could be given.

That advice and some other tips are part of a sheet handed out to new pet owners at the shelter. It was compiled by veterinarian Mar Doering and reprinted from Dog Fancy.

PET SPONSORS

The need for sponsors willing to pay for the spaying and neutering of pets brought to the shelter is a never-ending.

Just as the flow of abandoned animals continues each day, each week, each month; money is needed to improve their chances of adoption by taking care of the cost of spaying or neutering. That cost is the major expense connected to adoption.

Depending on the type and sex of the animal, the procedure can cost \$18 to \$45.

The temporary residents of the shelter also welcome visitors, who have the time to take them for walks or just play one-on-one in the fenced commons area.

The cattery is set up with an enclosed play space between the rooms with cages. It's equipped with clawing posts, sleeping ledges

and swinging toys.

In the last few months, a benefactor has adopted the cattery as her special project.

Josephine Strain, newly arrived in Ruidoso, has reworked the accommodations for the felines so that they feel as close to being in a home as possible, Basch said.

"She's sewn pillows and brought beds, blankets and toys for individual cages," he said. "She supplies

her own cleaning material, has brought food and has put up and painted storage cabinets to get the newspapers and other supplies off the ground.

"She really loves the cats and we're grateful she found us."

Downs to consider rate hikes

Ruidoso Downs residents have one chance to let Downs trustees know how they feel about an increase in water and sewer rates at their board meeting at 7 p.m. tonight at the fire station.

The village's minimum water rate is currently at \$11.50 for 4,000 gallons, but if approved by trustees it would increase by \$3 on January 1 and then \$1 per year for the next three years.

The increase is for a repair and maintenance fund that is required by the company holding a loan for the village's water system.

Sewer rates will also be on the increase starting January 1. The current minimum rate is \$6 for 4,000 gallons of water, but will increase to \$8 gallons at the first of the year and then \$1 per year for the next three years. This increase will help pay for the cost of improvements for the regional sewer treatment plant.

Trustees discussed the increase at their last meeting on November 9, but are required to have a public hearing before adopting them.

Also on the agenda for tonight is a presentation by Randy Basch from the Humane Society. He will be speaking on a mandatory spay-neuter ordinance for the village. Ruidoso passed the ordinance in April to become only the second place in the nation to do so.

The law would require all dogs and cats to be altered, but professional breeders could get a permit to continue breeding.

Under general business, police chief Will Hoggard will request the hire of Nick Herrera and Jan Hazel for part-time dispatchers.

"I try to listen to my customers wants and needs and try to stock what they want. A lot of our inventory was built that way."


Paulette's also has access to beautiful lingerie for the full figured woman.

Warrior/Tulie Tiger rivalry continues

Tularosa is back on the Warriors' 1993 football schedule. Ruidoso High School athletic director Ron Maskew said he received confirmation from the New Mexico Activities Association about 4 p.m. Thursday.

Community business owners and school alumni were the most vocal in stating their objections to the decision to replace Tularosa with Belen for the September 17,

1993 play date.

School officials last November decided it would be better to play within Ruidoso's 3A district and not confront Tularosa, a 2A team. But they admitted they didn't realize how important the traditional rivalry had become, as well as the revenue it generated in gate at the game and in spin-offs such as fast foods.

When word began circulating a few weeks ago about the decision, both communities reacted, asking

the Ruidoso district to reconsidered.

Maskew said the athletic director in Tularosa was aware of the switch in schedule when the decision was made last year.

He produced a contract signed by athletic director Larry Marrajo dated December 12.

"I consulted with my administration on this issue," Maskew said. "I assume he did the same. I don't know why the decision suddenly resurfaced again this year."

He said the Tularosa game is not the biggest draw of the year, but the rivalry has been going on for more than 30 years.

"It's not the most important game of the year. As far as gate is concerned, the game with the New Mexico Military Institute was higher," he said.

"We were trying to do something to help the Warriors get back to state. We were trying to look out for our program."

"I am cautiously optimistic about the season. We have some potential, some good kids with decent skills," he said.

One concern is that some of the girls have not played together a lot, but with time on the court they should be able to come together as a team.


Harvest Home

MainStreet merchants open for holiday candlelight hours

Shopping in Ruidoso for Christmas will be more convenient this year as downtown merchants join together for Candlelight Hours.

MainStreet Ruidoso director Don Miller and promotions chairperson Audean Franklin announced the plan at a MainStreet board meeting Thursday. Stores will be open until 8 p.m. on Saturday and Monday nights, starting this Saturday, and continuing through Christmas. Some stores may extend their hours longer if they have customers coming in.

To inform everyone of the businesses who will be staying open, Miller and Claudia Gumbert, sales representative for The Ruidoso News, met with individual businesses on an advertising campaign to begin in The News in the Thanksgiving edition, Wednesday and to continue until Christmas.

Franklin said all businesses, not just those in Midtown, have been encouraged to decorate their buildings inside and out for the holiday

season. Many of those participating in the Candlelight Hours will also be serving refreshments to customers to add to the festivities. The businesses have also been encouraged to light candles.

Franklin said the project has been well accepted, and she hopes it becomes a tradition, especially after the streetscape improvements are made next year.

Miller said this is the first time Midtown has decided to do group nights like this.

The extended hours will give area residents an opportunity to shop after they get off work, at a time when parking is usually more convenient. Board member Tom Rigby said it will also give the skiers something to do when they come off the slopes late in the day.

MainStreet's last seasonal promotion, Halloween, was a success for trick-or-treaters as well as for the police department. Miller said the businesses were well attended by children, and he also received a letter from police chief Dick Swenor in appreciation for the event.

The Community Update, originally scheduled for Friday, was canceled until after the legislative session, Miller said. He said they were having difficulty arranging for the main speakers to come at this time and will try to confirm a date in March they can all come. The update is co-sponsored by MainStreet and The Ruidoso News.

Miller reported that project consultant Mary Maul is doing a great job keeping up all the necessary work with the streetscape project.

The board gave a recommendation for Miller and Maul to present several documents to the village council during its meeting Tuesday, including an agreement between the village and the highway department that the village will pay for the lighting power, a power company agreement and a landscape maintenance agreement.

The two also received approval from the board to act as temporary agents of the village, if needed, to get temporary work permits signed by property owners in the area to be improved, from Fern Street to

Country Club Road. Miller said the permits will be needed because in many cases the construction will be going on right up to the front doors of the businesses.

The final walk-through of the project by state and federal representatives will be December 8. After approval and the plans have been signed, they can then go for bid on the project, probably in January 1993. Construction could possibly start in the spring.

Miller said they have new drawings at the office for people to look at after the last walk-through. He said there were some corrections but not any significant changes.

A new MainStreet directory should also be coming out this spring. Board members decided Thursday to let Miller redesign the directory and catch-up on all the new businesses to create an updated directory in time for the summer season.

Miller said they have quite a few copies of the last one left, but he wanted to come up with a better one. The directory is used as a

hand-out from the merchants and as material sent out at the chamber of commerce.

President Alden Deyo said MainStreet received matching funds from the state to do the directories and there may be a deadline by which they have to use it. He said they usually put one out twice a year so they can keep up with all the changes in businesses. He said he had hoped they would have one out for Christmas.

Miller said he will check into the date the funds must be used by and he is also getting the guidelines on what the match can be used for.

Reporting on old business, Miller said he has met with Karen Kopp of the Economic Development Corporation of Lincoln County and Joan Bailey of the Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce on a marketing survey that would assist all groups.

He said he is now developing a draft of the survey and it will become a high priority because it takes time to get all the surveys back. Dr. Jim Miller, director of the Ruidoso campus of Eastern New

Mexico University, has offered to help in any way possible with analyzing the results, he said.

Miller and Madeline Shackelford also evaluated the dues structure and had several suggestions for changes. The amount will no longer be based on property size, with the highest dues for utility companies and financial institutions at \$500 annually. They also created a new membership application and Miller made a brochure that tells about MainStreet. Beginning January 1993 all members will be on a quarterly or annual payment, instead of long-term pledges.

Board members accepted the changes in the dues.

Treasurer Rigby reported all the MainStreet financial records and member billings are now on the computer at the office, which should help in getting the billings out quarterly. He said they are right on budget for most items, except for travel because Maul has had to come down from Santa Fe several times to complete work for the streetscape project.

Apache Trails takes its tourism message to Governor's conference

Although the funds available are a little low, the regional Apache Trails group is planning to expend some to make sure people know its name and purpose.

Secretary Ed Way of the Alamogordo Space Center asked members to consider getting a booth at the Governor's Conference on Tourism in Taos December 5 through 8. The \$500 for the booth includes registration for two people for the conference to have someone to staff the booth.

He suggested two or three people work together showing all aspects of Apache Trails with a banner over the top of the booth. Way and Ellen Mitchum, also of the center, will be going to show brochures for the Space Center and Alamogordo, and Lisa Storey of Ruidoso Chamber of Commerce and another person will go to present Ruidoso and the surrounding area.

Way said he wanted to bring the idea up because of a recent state tourism meeting he attended. A proposal has been made to divide the state into five tourism areas with half of the state matching funds going to make regional brochures for promotion.

A representative of the current Sun Country group said he was supportive of the idea because the larger groups used to be strong until the smaller groups, such as Apache Trails, started. Way said he told them Apache Trails was formed in part because Sun Country was not serving this area, which really has the heart of Sun Country attractions. He said he would be concerned about the state dumping so much money into the division.

"We need to show people that Apache Trails is groups and communities working together effectively," he said.

President Mariann Schweers agreed the group needs to be visible to get this across and the Governor's conference would be a good place to do it.

Laura Doth of the Museum of the Horse said she shouldn't have enough money in her budget to help with booth registration, but she will be attending and could help staff the booth. Other representatives of the area also will be attending the conference as participants.

She also said they should all send individual letters to Secretary of Tourism Michael Cerletti to let him know the divisions won't work. It will make a double impact on

him when they then have a booth at the conference too, she said.

Members also agreed to help pay for a table with Ruidoso at a legislative reception in Santa Fe in January. Joan Bailey, Ruidoso chamber of commerce executive, received the information to attend but offered it to Apache Trails as well. The group will pay \$100 for the half table.

To remind the legislators again, Doth said they should make little gifts to place at each senator's and representative's desk. She said the museum presented them with coffee mugs with snacks in them, and that went over well. They could gather something from each of the villages for the gift and also include an Apache Trails brochure, she said.

Doth said they should also contact Lincoln and Otero county legislators ahead of time to let them know their plan. The legislators can then present Apache Trails to the others as being from their counties and tell how well Apache Trails is doing.

Schweers said she can begin to work on a gift idea, which will probably be a small basket filled with items from the communities. The products should only cost about \$50

to make, and she will begin collecting pins, buttons or other items to represent the area.

In other business, Schweers said she has spoken to the Internal Revenue Service on getting non-profit status. Before they can get a state tax number they need to get a determination of recognition from the IRS, which will cost \$175. She said after that there is no charge for the federal identification number or for the state tax number.

If the group doesn't have an income of more than \$25,000 it won't have to file yearly reports, Schweers said. The IRS will ask for other information at random times, though, she said.

Doth said the Lincoln County Cowboy Symposium just completed the application process for non-profit status, and they found it is easiest to have an accountant do it. An accountant will better understand how to answer the questions, she said.

Schweers will continue working on getting that accomplished so the group can get the state and federal designations it needs. She and Storey have completed and filed the applications for the state corporation commission.

Storey reported Apache Trails has almost used the amount needed for its state matching funds. They have paid for an advertisement in the New Mexico Magazine vacation guide and for a reprint of the brochures, but that still leaves about \$150 to use to receive the match, she said.

Other members asked if she had included the cost of distribution and other such expenses in that total because it may be they have already gone over that amount. Storey said she will re-check everything to see if they have.

The group has about \$2,300 in its account that it could use for the cost of the two conferences, but it may also want to save some for other projects that have been discussed.

Members have discussed placing special Apache Trails signs at the entrances to all trails communities. Schweers said the signs would cost about \$30 to \$40 each for ones made like the state highway department street signs.

Doth said they may want to have the signs made in the shape of the Apache Trails logo, because people may otherwise think it is just one street.

The signs may also be a way

some villages could contribute to the group. Schweers said she had approached many of the smaller communities that said they would try to contribute if they could. If they re-approach the communities asking them if they would pay for the signs, they may like it better because it is something tangible.

A sign may also remind the communities year-round of Apache Trails, said Mark Doth, marketing director of Ruidoso Downs Race Track.

Several members will check the cost of making signs at businesses around the area, before the group approaches the communities. They will also need to measure current city limits signs so the Apache Trails sign will fit on the existing poles.

To earn more money for the group, members will continue the membership drive in the area as much as possible, although people are busy with the holiday season.

"We should keep on, even if it's at a snail's pace through this season," Schweers said.

Because of the upcoming conferences, the group won't meet officially in December, but will be back on schedule for a meeting on January 13, 1993.



Radiation readings announced

Background Radiation readings in the Ruidoso area between July 23 and August 7, 1992, are about average, according to Bill Petty, who took the measurements.

Equipment used was a Geiger mueller tube with alpha window calibrated for altitude. Readings were taken for 1 hour each at Angus and near Cree Meadows Golf Course, then were averaged.

The Ruidoso area experiences background radiation in the middle of the estimated range (100-200 MREM/YEAR). For a comparison, it is estimated the average American citizen receives a radiation dose of 39 MREM/YEAR from medical and dental X-rays, or a dose of 5 MREM on a coast-to-coast round trip airline flight.

(A millirem, MREM, equals one thousandth of a REM, the measurement used to gauge the amount of damage done to body tissue by nuclear radiation).

In 1987, the Radiation Effects Research Foundation, a joint Japanese-United States research establishment with Department of Energy funding, calculated that health risks from low dose radiation are 11-16 times greater than previously assumed by radiation regulatory bodies.

The foundation report strongly suggested the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission should lower "acceptable" levels of whole-body radiation exposure for U.S. nuclear workers from the current 5 REM/YEAR.
