## Snow decorates Ruidoso

Ruidoso was blanketed with 11 inches of snow, but other communities in Lincoln County suffered the most over the weekend. About 1,000 families faced the storm without electricity when heavy ice and winds damaged a transformer and electrical lines of Otero Electric Cooperative, which serves Carrizozo, Capitan and surrounding rural areas.

Otero office manager John Vaughn said the first outage occurred in Carrizozo about 2 p.m. Friday, then hit Capitan around 10 p.m.

The majority of both communities were back on by 2:30 a.m. Saturday, but went out again Sunday. "Carrizozo lost 42 poles," Vaughn said. "With the ice, the

wires get heavier and then when the wind started, it blew down and broke off poles.

"It was unreal in Carrizozo. They didn't get any snow (Sunday). It was foggy all day.


"We had everything back on but 15 families by 8 p.m. Sunday, then both communities were knocked out again late last night."

Vaughn said he couldn't estimate when full electrical power would be restored.

"When the ice comes off, if it doesn't occur evenly, the wires slap into each other and knock the electric out again," Vaughn said. "We have 12 poles to replace today to get to those 15 families."

Sheriff James McSwane said many vehicles were abandoned on the roadways because their drivers couldn't move in the storm.

## RLT honors its own

## Lujan signs off on Lincoln land swap

A Lincoln County Commission protest against the swap of 1,100 acres along the Rio Bonito has been dismissed by U.S. Interior Secretary Manuel Lujan.

The protest was the last obstacle in the path of the acquisition of the privately-owned land in Lincoln County by the Bureau of Land Management (BLM).

Leslie Cone, Roswell district manager of the BLM, said Thursday she couldn't estimate how long it will take to accomplish the steps between now and the completion of the swap. A lot will depend on the number of cultural sites contained on property to be traded, she said. The proposal has been under consideration for about two years.

Although the protest was dismissed last Tuesday by Lujan, the BLM already has signed a memorandum of understanding, agreeing to eight conditions outlined by the commission; and also agreed Tuesday to sell or trade 35,000 acres of property identified for disposal in the county.

The only issue still separating the agency and the commission is the county's insistence that the federal property be put back into private hands at the same time the Rio Bonito swap is completed. Commissioners want to maintain land parity in ownership by federal agencies and private entities.

The BLM has maintained it legally cannot meet that requirement.

The commission, and probably the three commissioners-elect, will meet at 2 p.m. Monday at the county sub-office in Ruidoso to discuss the ramifications of Lujan's decision.

The two three current commissioners and two of those elected to take office in January signed a letter to Lujan Tuesday emphasizing their backing on the parity issue and the timing of the property disposal.

Cone said in spite of Lujan's action, the BLM still is negotiating with the commission, which has not signed off on the memorandum.

"It has been frustrating for us when at one point the commissioners say they will sign the memorandum and the next thing we hear, a letter has been drafted (to Lujan on the parity issue)," Cone said. "The county didn't tell us about the letter, but the people ... already told us who signed it."

She said that although she met with commissioners-elect Wilton Howell and Bill Schwettnann, the focus was to develop a better working relationship, not the Rio Bonito swap.

Cone said she did query Howell, Schwettnann and commissioner-elect L. Ray Nunley by phone to see how they felt about the proposal.

In confirming Lujan's decision to dismiss, Chris Gallegos with the office of U.S. Senator Pete Domenici (R-New Mexico) said the senator has told BLM he only supports the swap if the 35,000 acres are disposed of in line with the commission's insistence on land parity.

"In his mind there is no question at all that the land will be made available (for sale) and for that reason, he supported Lujan's dismissal of the protest," Gallegos said.

Cone took exception to claims by county officials that the BLM misrepresented to Lujan and congressional representatives the position of the three commissioners-elect.

But John Ryan from the office of U.S. Rep. Joe Skeen (R-New Mexico) said BLM officials did misrepresent the position of the three soon-to-be commissioners by indicating they were totally in favor of the swap. A more accurate description would be to include the condition on land parity by Schwettnann and Nunley. Howell has not stated his position definitively.

The agency also misrepresented

## Schools meet with Indians



More emphasis is being placed on Mescalero Apache culture and language in the Ruidoso school system, a group of educators and parents decided Wednesday.

The Mescalero parents and education representatives met with members of the Ruidoso School Board, principals and a few teachers in the annual session to identify needs for local Native American students.

More than half of the items put forth by four discussion groups formed during the session dealt with increasing awareness of Mescalero heritage.

They included forming student

dance groups at each school; asking teachers to incorporate Native American information and artwork into activities such as decoration of bulletin boards; in-service workshops for teachers on Apache culture; inviting tribe elders to the schools; setting up a separate Mescalero language/culture course; and placing Apache dictionaries at each school.

After each group listed its proposals, they were ranked in order of importance based on the votes by everyone attending the session.

Topping the list was to invite Mescalero elders into the schools, which then was coupled with the

other associated items in developing cultural awareness.

Next in priority was for Ruidoso school officials to conduct an open house on the Mescalero Reservation to meet parents and other interested individuals from that community.

The third priority was for the Apache language to be taught or incorporated into lessons from kindergarten through twelfth grade.

About 460 Mescalero students are enrolled in the Ruidoso school system. Many travel each day from the reservation to attend classes.

The district receives money to educate those children from specially-designated grants and programs, including \$53,077 from Title V Indian Education; \$180,070 and \$97,599 from PL 874 Indian

Education with focuses on raising the academic level of Native American students while maintaining positive traditional values, and on providing a counselor and special education teacher; and \$140,000 from the Title VII Bilingual education program.

Other priorities pinpointed during the group session were for more collaboration with the University of New Mexico; reworking the transportation agreement with the Tularosa school district, which some contended has created hardships for many Mescalero families; hiring more bus aides to monitor behavior; for the staff to become more informed on supply needs and the status of orders; for Apache dictionaries to provide at each school; to provide snacks for

students who stay after school for tutoring or extra curricular activities; to provide one liaison person per school; and to improve transportation for students participating in extra-curricular activities.

Last year, the top need identified by the group session was for more communication between schools and homes.

The administration addressed that need by adding another school-community liaison person to the staff.

That action also was seen as a way of helping to meet the next three top needs of too little parent involvement, not enough tutorial assistance and the need to teach the Apache language at the high school.

"We had a few minor accidents with injuries, but nothing major," McSwane said. "I think a lot of people stayed off the roads. The majority stranded were non-locals trying to get some place."

"Our dispatch center went down for short time, phones and electricity, but it was only for an hour."

The department received several calls from people who had oxygen-making machines that were powered by electricity, McSwane said.

"They had enough in their tanks to run for a couple of hours, but officers and (emergency medical service) had to respond and refill their tanks."

Capitan village clerk Debbie Cummins said power was on in that village Monday morning.

Worst than being without power was the on-again, off-again surges that occurred Sunday, she said.

"It's hard on the compressors (at Cummins Market)," she said. Reports about water well pumps burning up have been received and village hall lost information on its computers.

Ruidoso village road crews, headed by Charlie Armstrong, responded to a priority list of roads, which includes emergency and school bus arteries first.

The snowplows were out with salt and scrappers as the snowfall rolled into the area. They kept the main roads passable for most vehicles and then came back on

Saturday and Sunday for clean-up work and to open lower priority roads. A few areas still needed attention Monday.

County road manager Bill Cupit said his crew worked Friday night clearing Gavilan Canyon Road.

"Then the snow kept falling, but because we had put salt down when we came back Saturday morning to salt again, it already was pretty clear," Cupit said.

"We worked all day Saturday and got about 90 percent of the roads done. We finished up the rest by 10 a.m. Sunday. We're in pretty good shape. I've received plenty of calls complimenting the work. This morning we only had three calls (about problems)."

"We cover almost 1,000 miles and we don't stop until we get them all cleared."

Ruidoso's meteorologist Bill Hostetter said although 11 inches was the official snow measurement, as much as 16 inches has been reported in some areas of the county. The storm was the greatest in snowfall since December 7, 1988, when 13.1 inches was officially measured, he said.

But in 1987, on December 13-14, the area received 29 inches in one of the worst storms to hit the area in decades in that month.

He measured 1.26 inches of moisture in the weekend storm.

Hostetter said the next two storms expected in the area Tuesday and Friday should move through quickly and not be as intense.

some information to the Interior Department that all of the Congressional delegation favored the swap," Ryan said. "Congressman Skeen blew up at them earlier this week. He has never been in favor of the swap."

County manager Andy Wynham said that alleged misrepresentation was what led to the letter sent by the commission to Lujan clearly stating that the current commission and two of the three future commissioners want land parity as a condition to the swap.

Friday, Howell told *The Ruidoso News*, "If in fact, the transfer is going through, I'm glad to see it settled."

"I would like to applaud the commission for obtaining the concessions they did. If they had not held BLM's feet to the fire, that wouldn't have happened."

"But now it's time to get on with other business at hand."

Howell said he isn't bothered by the lack of time frame on disposing of the BLM acreage in Lincoln County.

"I'd rather have Pete Domenici's guarantee than some BLM official's signature," he said.

## Feds will fund airport roads

Senator Pete Domenici, R-N.M., announced that New Mexico has been awarded \$5.56 million to fund road construction work near Ruidoso and Las Cruces by the Department of Transportation (DOT).

The Federal Aviation Administration of the DOT awarded Sierra Blanca Airport Commission \$884,700 for construction at the Sierra Blanca Regional Airport near Ruidoso.

"The grant to the Sierra Blanca Airport will fund the installation of

taxiway guidance signs and the construction of a new hangar," Domenici said. "I am very pleased that the airport will receive funding for these very important additions."

Work to be performed by the Twin Mountain Construction company includes the construction of a roadway with drainage culverts, concrete headwalls, concrete drainage dips, and a guard rail.

The roadway is to provide access to the Air Route Surveillance Radar Site.

## Ruidoso considers agreement with Apache Tribe on road improvements

A joint resolution between the Village of Ruidoso and the Mescalero Apache Tribe to be signed at Tuesday's council meeting, shoots for major road improvement on Ski Run Road.

The request seeks for the New Mexico State Highway and Transportation Department to improve State Highway 532 between Ruidoso and Ski Apache, known as Ski Run Road.

The resolution, to be signed by Mayor Victor Alonso declares that Ski Apache ski resort is a popular tourist attraction in southern New Mexico operated by the Mescalero

Apache Tribe, bringing large numbers of tourists to the state, Ruidoso and tribal lands.

The document states the highway is the only means of access to Ski Apache and over the years has deteriorated to the point where it may discourage use of the ski area and therefore inhibit tourism.

The governing body of the village and the Mescalero Apache Tribal Council requests the highway department provide all necessary improvements on Ski Run Road, including overlaying, widening where necessary, repair of guard rails and to improve the safety and usability of this highway

to encourage travel to Ski Apache.

Regular items on the short council agenda include:

—An update on the reconstruction/improvements of the wastewater system.

—Sign Ordinance Review Committee recommendations.

—Parks and Recreation Commission request for use of the Civic Events Center.

—budget line item change request from operating category to the personnel service category to create a building maintenance position.

—discussion of the required random annual audits of lodging

vendors.

—boards and commission appointments.

Consent agenda items, which are acted on collectively, include:

—minutes for the regular meeting of November 24, 1992.

—schedule public hearing/special meeting for December 15 regarding the transfer of a liquor dispenser license.

Applicant William G. McCarty is to use the liquor license at the business known as Bennett's Shbar Save, located on Mechem Drive.

The council will move into closed session to discuss pending or threatened litigation.

## Telephones ring in this year's holidays

The telephone rings continuously and receptionists write down names and addresses until their fingers are numb.

This has become a routine each day at the Ruidoso Chamber of Commerce as people call in to find out about visiting the area. Already in the first three days of December the chamber has taken more than 500 calls from people asking about Christmas accommodations and, of course, skiing.

Chamber executive director Joan Bailey reported on this continuing trend of high numbers of inquiries at the chamber board's meeting on Thursday. Compared to 1991, the chamber staff has answered 40.6 percent more phone calls so far this year from people requesting information.

The chamber has also done 102.2 percent more mailings. Walk-in visitor numbers are also about 10 percent higher than last year.

Special events have been an important part of drawing people in as well as raising money for the chamber. In a final financial report for Aspenfest, which had one of the biggest crowds ever, an excess of revenue over expenses of \$267 was recorded for the event. Although that amount was a little lower than the chamber had expected it was better than the loss suffered last year.

Oktoberfest was also a successful event for the group, making about \$700 more than budgeted. The group made a little more than \$2,200 on it.

An upcoming event expected to bring out visitors and locals is the revived Connoisseur Classic IV. The chamber did not host one last year after having it for three years in a row. The fourth classic will be February 19-21 at the Civic Events Center.

Bailey said they plan to continue having the event each year at the same time as Mardi Gras in New Orleans, so people can remember the dates more easily.

The traditional wine-tasting will be on Friday with wineries from

New Mexico, Arizona, Texas and Colorado represented. The center will also be decorated with art work from local galleries, Bailey said.

Saturday a new event is set, a race at Ski Apache, to add some fun and diversity to the classic. Also on Saturday is the gourmet lunch hosted by Altrusa and the Wine in the Pines. Sunday will be the Poor Man's Wine Tasting for a more relaxed event for locals.

Bailey said the classic will be a dynamite event that could become as important fiscally to the chamber as the annual art festival, which is the major fundraiser for the group. She said they will try to establish consistency for the event by using the same logo and colors, white, metallic gold and burgundy.

A poster to advertise the event has already been created using these, but Bailey said they are requesting artists submit a design for a color poster that could be used as a souvenir for guests to the classic and as a fundraiser for the chamber. The posters would be sold at the event and buyers could get them signed by the winemakers.

Director Karen Kopp is the chairperson of the Connoisseur Classic committee and has a great group to work with, Bailey said. As with any project, though, they can always use more volunteers to help do the work, she said.

Even though the biggest special event isn't until July, applications for the annual Arts and Crafts Festival need to be sent out by the first of the year. President Paul Crown, who is the chairperson of the festival committee, said he would like anyone who was involved in past years or is interested in this year's event to meet with him on Tuesday at the chamber office to review the application before it is sent out. He said it should only take about 30 minutes to do.

Applications are sent out to a variety of artists and then they are juried in early spring. More than 200 artists show off their talents at the summer festival.

In other business the chamber will host the Business After Hours in combination with a Christmas

open house from 5:30 to 7:30 p.m. Thursday. Bailey said everyone is invited to the event, not just chamber members. Directors are especially encouraged to come and bring a friend or invite someone to attend too.

Bailey said she and staff want to make this an annual tradition for the chamber.

Crown told board members that director Ron McWilliams has submitted his resignation from the board because he and his wife will be moving back to San Angelo, Texas, although they will be back often to visit. The board will now need to fill the position and Crown said in the past the person has been the one who received the next highest number of votes behind those elected in the annual voting.

Crown also up-dated the board on the suggested by-law change to have a director serve as chair of special events committees. He said the by-laws only address the executive board so they will need to make it a change in the policy manual. The manual, though, is out-dated and needs several changes before they add the new suggestion.

In the financial report Jack Muhn, contract accountant for the chamber, said he was quite pleased with where the chamber is compared to the budget. Both chamber operations and visitor services are close to budget. The visitors center is spending more on postage than planned but it is because they have had to do more mailings to potential visitors.

In the advertising program the village has approved about \$113,000 leaving about \$102,000 left for the chamber to request for its advertising campaign for the fiscal year. Advertising funds have been spent on New Mexico Magazine, Texas Monthly, Ski New Mexico, Trailer Life, trade shows, Santa Fe Visitor Booth, Albuquerque Balloon Festival Brochure, Santa Fe Visitor Guide and The Ruidoso News Winter Visitor Guide among other projects.

In Bailey's executive director report, she said she attended the

New Mexico Chamber Executives Conference in Las Cruces in November. It was time well spent with many good speakers, but she was also excited to find out things the larger chambers are talking about, this one is already doing.

The next conference will be in the Spring in Clovis and Bailey said she would like to have the fall one here. She said she will make a presentation to the chamber executives to try to accomplish that.

Bailey and Kopp, who is also the director of the Economic Development Corporation of Lincoln County, also just returned from a trip to Juarez, Mexico, to meet with chamber representatives there. She said they have a natural love for Ruidoso and are literally waiting for Ruidoso to decide what it wants to do to get the word out and will then help in anyway possible.

"There is money in that market, and they love Ruidoso 12 months out of the year," Bailey said.

Juarez has more than 2.5-million people and Chihuahua has another million, she said. One way to get the word out may be Telemundo, Mexico's television. Bailey and Kopp met with this officials to find out more about it, but they will also be coming to Ruidoso to meet again to discuss a particular approach.

In new business, director James Hobbs told the group he had just returned from a chuckwagon convention in Arizona where his group performed with eight others during a three-day event. Hobbs said he is excited to get to host the event in May 1994 after last hosting it in 1986. In 1986, 17 states were represented in the tickets sold, he said.

Hobbs and director Clark Carpenter also up-dated the group on getting business people to come into the chamber for a couple hours a day to see what goes on there.

Hobbs checked with several people and received 100 percent interest and the two will now meet with Bailey to work out details, Carpenter said.

# Cubbie set to make Christmas merry

A rich heritage and proud tradition wrapped up in a soft bundle of dedication would like to be the package under someone's Christmas tree this month.

Seven-month-old Cubbie, a red-wheaten Rhodesian ridgeback, is one of the friendly temporary residents of the Lincoln County Humane Society animal shelter.

"She came to the shelter about one month ago as a stray," said Randy Basch, shelter manager. "She was found in the same area as another dog about the same size a few weeks earlier. I suspect someone's dog had a litter and they just turned the pups loose."

Ridgebacks first were imported to America in 1950 and were recognized as a breed five years later.

The ridgeback was developed in the late nineteenth century by the Boers, who settled in Africa. Through selective breeding for very specific traits, the standards were fixed in Rhodesian in 1922.

The Boers needed a good hunting dog to flush game, a loyal guard dog and an animal able to withstand the rigors of the African bush and its drastic changes in temperature, Basch said. They wanted the dog to have short hair to keep from being pestered by ticks and insects. It must like children and be devoted to its master, willing to sleep by his side when traveling in the wild.

"It's an extremely intelligent breed," Basch said. "She should pick up obedience training very

easily.

"Because of her heritage, she has a desire to please her master. Rhodesian ridgebacks are good-natured and they get along well with children. She's laid-back, non-aggressive and not quarrelsome."

The name describes the breed's most unique characteristic: a clearly defined symmetrical ridge running the length of its back, formed by hair that grows in the opposite direction from the rest of its coat.

The average female ridgeback at adulthood weighs about 65 pounds and stands about 24-inches high.

"Cubbie is quiet and doesn't bark unnecessarily," Basch said. "The breed is becoming more popular every year."

Cubbie is very neat in her cage, but may need some housebreaking training.

"With her intelligence and willingness, she should learn anything the owner wants," Basch said.

Cubbie will have to be spayed as must every animal adopted from the shelter to be sure they do not contribute to the pet overpopulation problem.

## PAST PETS

With the busy days leading up to Christmas, adoptions have slowed down at the shelter while the number of abandoned animals has increased.

Several of the pets featured over the past weeks, or their litter mates, still have not found new homes.

Those looking for people willing to open their hearts or homes include:

—Cherokee, a catahoula mixed breed, who eagerly greets visitors and has a great disposition. With black and gray markings, he's good with children and other dogs.

—Snoopy, whose owners dropped him off on their way out of town. A year-old Walker hound, he's housebroken and good with kids.



# Parks and Recreation advisory board meets, reorganizes

Family and youth related activities headed the schedule when the Ruidoso Parks and Recreation Commission met Tuesday, December 1, at village hall. Chairman Smokey Stover said with its newly appointed members, it will now be possible for the commission to operate with a required quorum. The commission is currently made up of: Stover, chairman; Walterine Hughes, vice chairman; Carla Grover, secretary; and Patricia Schrader, chairman of the youth activity committee. "Those vitally interested in helping to advance and develop parks and recreation programs and facilities should indicate their will-

ingness to serve by calling Mayor Victor Alonso or myself," said Stover. He said the commission agreed that they would need two regular meetings per month to handle all of the anticipated work load. It was agreed these meetings would be held on the first and third Tuesdays of each month at 5 p.m. in the village hall. "The public is not only invited but urged to attend and participate. The public is also urged to discuss their concerns about parks and recreation with the mayor, members of the village council and the above named members of the parks commission," Stover said. The commission indicated its

first concern would be to provide activities and facilities for the youth of our community. "It is believed that these needs (recreation for youth and families) have gone unmet for far too long," Stover said. To accomplish this, the commission agreed to help organize and sponsor dances in the civic events center when it was not being used for commercial programs. Four dances were scheduled after discussions with the village manager. The newly formed Optimist Club of Ruidoso volunteered to sponsor one dance on December 31, New Year's Eve, for both local and visiting families. This will be a non-

alcoholic beverage dance. Details to be announced. Stover said Karen Morris, Kathy Echols and others interested in youth activities have formed a committee to hold a dance on Saturday, December 26, for local and visiting high school students. Another dance is being planned for the visiting and local Middle School students during the Christmas holidays, according to Stover. A Valentine Dance is being planned for local and visiting families. This will be a Sweetheart Dance with kings and queens being selected from various age groups, he said. Everyone interested in further-

ing activities for the youth and families should call or contact one of the park commissioners. Stover said there was some discussion of updating plans for the Grindstone Lake recreation area, but it was pointed out that this purchase was primarily for water supply for the village. Recreational uses would be strictly secondary, but important for local use and tourism. The commission talked of the major parks and recreation needs of our community and acknowledged that the village would probably be unable to meet all of them, therefore it was agreed that serious consideration should be given top con-

tractors or concessionaires for park and recreational facilities where feasible. Stover mentioned the Thompson Amusement Park in Amarillo, Texas, as an outstanding example of contract operation which benefited not only the contractor and the city, but their people too. The commission announced that their 5 p.m. meeting on Tuesday, December 15, will be primarily to discuss the needs for youth activities and facilities. Anyone interested is urged to attend and present their recommendations and offer their assistance. For information call Stover at 258-3000.

# Mother nature spruces up the valley

### Early December Half Moon

Here we are already over into December, the Sacred Month, just after sundown on December 2.

Here in early December the sunsets give special display that is in harmony with the approach of Christmastide.

This evening as the sun went down, it sent back into the sky over the mountain a pure sunset light which turned a thin row of clouds all along the mountain horizon, to clouds of fiery gold.

These glowing colors began to blend with crimson and purple, and reached out higher into the sky. And here away to the south was the half moon, very light silver, shining down upon the Vale, now reflecting the sky colors as the twilight moves in. Twilight quickly turns to dusk, and the half moon is joined by the evening star twinkling silver, and pale blue and green — all in a sky of purple.

Rainbow light shines down on the half moon beams casting a benediction on the mountain world here in early December.

### Mother Nature's Christmas Decoration

We are fortunate here in the land of the piñon and pine in having a wide variety of natural Christmas decoration. We have the evergreen of the lands across the water cherished by our forefathers and by the people over there today — with the approach of Christmas time. These include the Douglas fir, long time favorite as a Christmas tree throughout our land; the blue spruce; Ingleman spruce; white pine; pine cedar; blue juniper and the piñon.

All these are favorites for Christmas trees, wreaths, and evergreen displays of all kinds. Each evergreen has its special cone which can be added to the wreath, or colored gold or silver and used as Christmas tree decorations or



pine-cone chains.

A special touch is added to the wreaths by the silver berries of the juniper, the purple berries of the cedar, and the small round cones of the piñon.

### A Cousin To The English Holly

Throughout the foot hills and the mesas, and the lower hills of Lincoln County you see a bush with leaves resembling the English holly, beloved tradition Christmas decoration of the British Isles.

This is the Algerita, in early summer and spring a solid mass of sunlight yellow honey-fragrant blossoms; and in the late summer you will see the scarlet Algerita berries. These make wonderful jelly, especially when mixed with apple or peach. The red berries are gone before the Christmas season, yet the foliage — so closely resembling the English holly, adds a festive Southwestern touch to the evergreen wreaths.

### The Sugar Plum Tree

You can take a small branch of the mesquite, or some other thorn brush like the cat claw or "wait-a-bit bush" and place it on a bucket of sand. Then place gumdrops or jelly beans on the thorns, and you have a sugar plum tree.

Mistletoe is a traditional feature of Christmas and New Year's celebrations. We have the traditional mistletoe with the white berries, and the Southwestern mistletoe, which grows

on cedar trees, with pink berries.

A yucca stalk, with the cluster of dried seed pods on the top can be also placed in a bucket of sand, and decorated with ribbons and, made attractive by painting the pods gold or silver, or in the Christmas colors of red and white.

### Luminarios

One of the Christmas traditions handed down to us from the early Spanish of New Mexico is the Luminario or "Lighter-of-the-way" — that is lighting the way to church for services at midnight mass.

At San Patricio in the Ruidoso Valley, on Christmas Eve the people of the Village would build a fire on top of the hill just to the south of town, so that people would know that church services would be held at the Church of San Patricio. This custom was followed in many places throughout the state and the Southwest. Travelers through the land would see the fire and know that there was a church nearby where they could celebrate the birth of our Infant Savior.

Down at the church the people of the neighborhood would place lighted sticks of pitch pine all along the pathway to the church, and all around the building, and sometimes special small lanterns on the edges of the roof.

One type of Luminaries very popular today is made by filling a paper bag half full of sand and then placing a lighted candle upright inside. These are placed along the pathways to homes and churches, and along the edges of the roofs. There is a certain special cheery glow to these candles on paper bags that calls back days of the early Spanish times, bringing us an appreciation of our pioneers of the Southwest, and lending a historical touch to the Christmas celebration.

Truly, in our hearts, and in the deeds of this special season, we carry many lighters-of-the-way to the celebration of the birthday of Our Lord and Savior.



# Wildcats freeze out the Warriors

Even with snow falling and roads icing over, a few die-hard fans were in the stands for the first game of the season for the Warrior boys basketball team.

The Warriors' opponent, the Tularosa Wildcats, was a little hesitant to come over the hill in the wintry conditions Friday afternoon, but once they hit the court they were at full steam for Tulie's second game of the season.

It was getting back home that turned out to be tough. By the end of the game Highway 70 had been closed and the Wildcats had to stay over night in Ruidoso.

The Warriors didn't make it an easy night for the Wildcats, although they took the game 68-77. The blue and gold jumped out to an early 12-6 lead in the first quarter before Tulie scored 12 unanswered points before the period ended.

Coach Norman Wright said the Warriors handled Tulie's pressure well at the beginning of the game but then began to make turnovers and get careless, giving Tularosa the opportunities it needed.

The Warriors came back in the

second quarter to score 15 points to Tularosa's 17, with two of those coming right before half time.

"We were still very much in the game at half time and when we went out for the third quarter," Wright said.

In the final quarter, the Warriors dropped in 20 points to the Wildcats 23. The Warriors also got their shots at the free throw line and did fairly well. For the entire game the Warriors made 19 of 29 shots from there, which Coach Wright was fairly pleased with for the first game of the season.

Sophomore Raul Davis was the Warriors leading scorer with 18 points, all coming in the second and fourth quarters. He was five for six on free throws and also had nine

rebounds, Wright said Davis played pretty well for his first high school basketball game.

Junior Jeff Chapman, who was the only returning starter from last year's team, had seven rebounds and scored nine points, most of which came early in the game.

Freshman Cory Hood also had a good game for his first varsity experience. He had eight assists and drew one charge.

Junior J.R. Chino was three for six on three-point shots, a good average for the first game of the season.

The Warriors did have 18 assists as a team, which was not too bad, Wright said. One problem they had was 35 turnovers, but Tularosa also had 30.

"I was pleased, even though we lost, that the kids gave it their best effort all the way. We knew we were inexperienced coming in but the only way to gain it is the hard way," Wright said.

The varsity team has no seniors and only Chapman back as starter from last year's team. He said the team did show some signs of prom-

ise on Friday night. They passed the ball well and played very unselfishly, which will be assets to build on for the next game.

The team will see how much it learned from the loss on Thursday when it begins competition in the three-day Bruce King tournament in Moriarty. The first match-up for the Warriors will be at 1 p.m. Thursday against the Tucumcari Rattlers. All the teams participating will be AAA.

"A loss is something to learn from and we will find out how much we learned from this game," Wright said.

The Warriors will have their second shot at the Wildcats on January 5 at Tularosa and hope to revenge this loss after a little more experience on the court.

The C-team will make its first appearance on Tuesday against Mayfield at the high school gym. Both the boys and girls will be playing games, with the girls starting at 4:30 p.m. and the boys following. The freshmen will also play Alamogordo Chaparral there on Saturday.

# Wrestlers struggle in tough Cruces tourney

The young Warrior wrestlers hit the trail to Las Cruces again this weekend to compete against some of the toughest teams in the area.

About 20 teams participated in the two-day tourney with Ruidoso finishing 15th in team standings. Coach Gerald Ames said it was a good tournament for the kids, and they gained a lot of experience by wrestling strong teams.

The Warriors took 10 wrestlers to compete in the meet. At 112 pounds Jose Prieto won two and lost two during the tourney. The freshman wrestled several excellent matches and just missed going into the third and fourth place bracket.

In his first outing on the varsity Johnny Flores won one match and lost two at 119 pounds. At 125 pounds Gunner Johnson wrestled three times, winning one and losing two. Johnson wrestled well, including a match with last year's state champion from Co-bre.

Senior Scott Stricklin was 0-2 at the meet but did well against the top seed from Eastwood in the 134-pound class. Chris Carusona, who had a rough time last week, won two matches and lost two and did well until he received cracked ribs in a match. The injury will probably keep Carusona out of action for several weeks.

At 145, Joe Brooks went 0-2 at the tourney, but Ames said he is improving and going good. Billy Austin won one match and lost two at 152 pounds.

Matt Bates finished the day at 3-2 at 160 pounds. He won his first match, but lost his second. He then received a forfeit because his opponent didn't make weight. He earned another forfeit on Saturday when his next

opponent's team didn't make it back to the meet because of the snow storm.

Senior Poncho Portillo earned a fourth place medal at 171 pounds at the meet in his first time on the mats this season. Portillo compiled a 3-2 record and wrestled well in his first two matches. An arm injury he suffered in football then slowed him down in his final matches.

Last year Portillo was the Warriors' only district champion, and he lost less than 10 matches during the whole season.

At heavyweight, senior Robert Murry went 0-2 although he wrestled hard in both matches.

The varsity's next tourney will be at Belen on Saturday. Ames said he expects this one to be tough as well with several good teams including Carlsbad and Los Lunas competing.

The junior varsity had been scheduled to participate in the Carlsbad JV tourney, but it was canceled because of the snow and weather conditions. The JV team will have two meets this week.

On Tuesday the group will travel to Los Lunas for a dual, and will then be in Oñate on Friday.

Wrestling fans will have several opportunities to see the Warriors in action this season with one night coming up before Christmas break. The Warriors will dual Roswell starting at 6 p.m. December 18. Both JV and varsity will wrestle.

Right after break the Warriors will host the Oñate Knights for a dual on January 5 with JV and varsity competing. Later this season, January 23, the team will host its varsity tournament.

## P & Z to consider variance requests

Ruidoso Planning and Zoning meets today, Monday, to take action on two replats, a variance and amended commercial site development.

G & S Joint Venture are asking for a replat for Lots 23 and 34, Block 3 of Mountain View Estates.

The owners are proposing replat to protect views from Lot 23.

Planning director Cleatus Richards said no objection is being made to the replat as proposed. Lot areas meet minimum requirements and reasonable building area is maintained on Lot 23A. Approval, however, must be conditioned on obtaining approval of all utilities on plat.

C and M Pillinton is seeking approval for replat Lot 1 and 2, Block 4 of Forest Heights Subdivision.

Pillinton is joining with adjoining owner to eliminate encroachment of structures on Lot 2 and Lot 1.

Subject lots are Zoned M-1 Mobile Home which requires minimum frontage of 60 feet and minimum lot area of 8,000 square feet.

Richards recommends approval of replat as proposed subject to approval of utilities and mortgage holder.

John and Patricia Grace is asking for a variance for a rear yard setback on Lot 8, Block 10, amended plat of Riverside Addition.

Grace is requesting a variance to add a 15-foot by 25-foot addition in the rear of the existing structure, which will require a variance of three feet.

Richards recommends that variance be granted in this instance to allow reasonable development and use of the property. There is no other area on site where addition could be placed without a variance.





It's truly experiencing a genuine part of the real cowboy world. The food is wonderful and it tastes so good in the atmosphere it is served in.

To get this done it takes quite an effort on everyone's part. These wagons come from all over the country and they are surely not Hollywood style. They are as real as they can get. Most of the cooks competing are still cooking on some of the big cattle ranches that still exist. It's the genuine thing that you are experiencing.

Again to get this done you have to offer something so we offer a \$2,500 first prize to the best cook, \$1,200 for second place, \$600 for third place and \$400 for fourth place. Authenticity of the wagon and neatness of camp, \$200. Ap-

pearance and attitude of cook and helpers, \$200. Best meat \$125, best beans, \$125, best bread \$125, and best desert, \$125. This is \$5,600 in prize money making this the richest chuckwagon cookoff in the world. We supply the meat and vegetables and the Culligan man, the soft water for the beans and we also furnish the conversation wood.

L.P. Bloodworth and his wife donates one of the prettiest belt buckles you've ever seen for the champion cook, made by their son Lee Bloodworth. So all in all it costs us about \$6,500 to have the chuckwagons and as usual we need help for this type of event so we look for donations.

This year the people that helped us with donations were our old friend Bones Wright from the C&L Lumber Company, Ruidoso State Bank, who also helped us with some condos, one of our favorite night spots, The Win, Place & Show, our buddy Dan Shaver of the Shaver Tire Company. Sometimes it's hard in any community to get a big chain store to sponsor something local, but not Walmart, they came across great, thanks to Mike Daulton and L. Ray Nunley. Our friend Chuck Reynolds who owns the Texas Cafe's sponsored one and next year he says "I want to sponsor two". Then there is Joan Davis of the Old West traders who has stores in Ruidoso and Lincoln. Our rancher friend Goodloe, from Capitan and who also serves on the Board of Directors for Robert O. Anderson said he shore wants to sponsor Red Stegall's wagon.

Ted Bennett of Bennett's Shur-Save is a prime example of a local businessman helping a good cause. Thanks, Ted, for helping us with our meat and groceries for the chuckwagons. The Cattleman's Steakhouse was very generous with us, also if you ever need some good paint with lots of quality and good friendly service you can't beat the Ruidoso Paint Center. Floyd Canaway of the Downs Texaco came across with a good donation. Thanks, Floyd, you are a real friendly Texaco dealer.

You know to cook good beans at this altitude you had better have some good soft water. The wagons have had this soft water the last three years. Leland and Neva Bartlett, who own and operate the Culligan Water Service & Ice Company have furnished the water and ice, at no cost to us for the last three years. What a great thing to do. Thanks, Leland and Neva.

Then there's our trail rides, another event that adds a lot to our Symposium. Craig Whipple and his wife Connie take care of ramrodding this event. This year Craig had a bad accident, breaking both ankles and both heels. Little Connie, along with her friend and fellow trailrider, Linda Wallace, didn't let it phase them, they kept it going

Also on the Tunstall trail we thank Sonny Varvell and his boy for a great job. # Local hiker plans "lucky 13" walk into the Grand Canyon

## Mary Stroemer takes the challenge — again

The next time complaints of stiff joints or sore muscles come to mind, reflect on the quest of Mary Stroemer.

At 74, this small package of determination has trudged the trails of the Grand Canyon 12 times by herself.

In spring chill and summer sun she has hiked to the bottom, crossed the Colorado River on the mule suspension bridge and stayed overnight at the Phantom Ranch. The next morning she has climbed back to the top of the last ridge, but not always without incident.

And this coming spring, she is planning a thirteenth assault on the Grand Canyon.

Challenge became a way of life for Stroemer early. After graduating from high school, she pursued a nursing career, timing her diploma with the start of World War II.

Six months later, she had enlisted in the Army Nurse Corps and was on her way to New Guinea. She worked in field hospitals and spent time in Manila. Never one to back away from new experiences, when a notice was posted for four nurses to transfer to a hospital ship, Stroemer signed up. A wise move. She finished up the war in Sydney and Brisbane, Australia.

"We had milk and ice cream, a life of relative luxury," Stroemer said, recalling those days. "Life was going on in Sydney."

She stayed in the service for 26 years.

"There was a future to it," she said. "It was better than working in a Brooklyn hospital and getting hospital pay."

The service gave her an opportunity for more travel with stays in Germany, a tour of duty in Europe, a high security assignment in Africa and then a field hospital in Korea.

"I swear the MASH unit on television was the one I was with, there were so many similar incidents and the colonel was the same," she said.

Back in the States, she was in demand as a nurse-anesthesiologist. She first was attached to a unit in Colorado, then Texas and finally was transferred to Sandia in New Mexico.

It was at that point, she decided to retire from the service. She worked at the Bernalillo Indian County Hospital and heard about an opening for an anesthesiologist in Ruidoso at the Lincoln County Medical Center. At first, she filled in on a temporary basis, but eventually decided to move down for two years.

"In one year's time, I had bought a house and decided to stay awhile and I've been here forever," she said.

In 1987, she retired again and that's when she began her adventures in Arizona's Grand Canyon.

Ironically, she had never tried any major hikes before. In fact, she never had hiked anywhere else.

She quickly changed that history, mastering the canyon trails in March, May, September and October of 1987 at the age of 68; then again in May, September and October of 1988. The following year, she was back in March, April and September.

In 1990, Stroemer only made it down to the bottom once, in October. She skipped a year for a knee operation and was at it again in September 1992.

What possessed her to start her treks?

"A Sunday newspaper supplement written by two men," she said. "I found that article entertaining. It stayed with me for a number of years. I just decided I was going to hike the Grand Canyon."

Not knowing what to expect, she started her first venture in March

on the Kaibab Trail. A hiker should at least carry one gallon of water.

"It never gets any easier, but it's more fun because you know your way around," Stroemer said. "The first walk down I thought was the hardest. I had ever taken in my life (with knee difficulties). Coming up is OK. I take two steps and puff, then take two steps more."

"Pacing makes a difference. I stop a lot to drink and rest."

Every time she begins a hike "I know it's something extra special. Although I've done it several times, it's like the first time. The feeling is there," Stroemer said.

By the time she reaches the canyon interior, most of the other hikers have vanished. She can speculate on the lives of the people who inhabited caves, now high on the side of the canyon walls, but once close to the water before the river carved its course deep in the earth's stomach.

"There's quiet," she said. Amid the stone temples, "all I hear is an occasional bird or critter crawling or moving. Other than that, there's a oneness with everything, a feeling of being with God. That's my feeling. Something just takes over. When you see your size compared to the mammoth rocks and formations. You start thinking why are we on this earth and for how much longer."

"The silence and the beauty are enormous. It's a chance to get in touch with yourself."

Two maintained trails lead in and out of the canyon. No water or shelter is available.

She prefers taking the Kaibab down and the Bright Angel out and up. A third route, the Tonto Trail, runs over 150 miles and cuts across the canyon from east to west. Several spurs intersect, but they are not maintained or patrolled, she said.

Many people walk just to Indian Gardens on Bright Angel, a plateau point before plunging into the deeper part of the canyon.

The Red Wall is a landmark everyone looks for on the Kaibab, Stroemer said. "It takes me about four hours to get there (a half-way mark). I walk slowly. It's steep and with the small rocks, your foot can slip."

"With a walking stick, I feel comfortable."

"That comfort doesn't extend to her feet, which have lost their nails by the time she completes the hike."

"I still haven't figured out how to pack my socks to avoid what they call black toes," she said.

At the bottom, the sounds of the river create a backdrop for Anasazi ruins against the canyon walls on the north bank.

"It's so calm there, it's hard to believe that down a little more there are rapids," Stroemer said.

"Great things happen to me on these excursions," she said. "On a trip down in October 1987, I met the author who wrote 'On Foot in the Grand Canyon,' the book I bought the first trip out and that has become my hiking Bible."

"I was coming out and stopped at a rest area. This woman took my picture with my walking stick and backpack and said it was for a book. I asked if she was Sharon Spangler and it was her. She's from Littleton, Colorado."

Not that every moment of each trip is a wonderful memory, although the end results have been good. Twice Stroemer became

dehydrated to the point of becoming ill.

"Both times I had packed only one gallon, instead of two gallons of water," she said. "I thought I would be all right in late September, but it gets hot in the canyon."

"In March, there's snow on top, but in the canyon, it often reaches the high 60s and 70s."

Her first bout with dehydration occurred in May 1991.

"I stopped at Indian Gardens for a snack (on the way out)," Stroemer said. "A ranger came by and asked me my car license number, social security and the like. He was testing me to be sure I was clear-headed."

He left and she continued up the trail.

"I thought I was doing fine (hiking out)," she said. "All of a sudden, I realized the sun was going down."

When she searched her backpack for a flashlight, she realized she had left it at the ranch and decided to stay at a rock outcropping she had seen.

It wasn't long before another ranger appeared with a flashlight. He had been looking for her at the top and kept asking people if they had seen a gray-headed woman hiking alone. They hadn't because

at that time Stroemer had put her cap back on and it hid her gray hair.

"He knew I was dehydrated and

nauseated and made me sit and drink fluids and tried to get me to eat trail bars, but I couldn't," Stroemer said.

The ranger had come prepared to spend the night with Stroemer back at the rest stop on Indian Gardens. He had a bed roll and food.

"I said there was no way I was going back down and then walk up again," Stroemer said. "On their way back to the top, they heard noises on the trail. It turned out to be a couple stumbling around in the dark without a flashlight."

"They were most happy to see the rangers," she said.

"The last trip, last September, it was so hot, the sun was heating on my back. I was dehydrated when I got to the ranch, really nauseated and then my legs cramped."

A male hiker had come back up the trail and asked if he could walk down with her.

The two heard sounds and it turned out to be people from the ranch coming up to look for them.

"I'd told them to save my dinner," Stroemer said. "The steak dinner costs \$27 and I didn't want to miss it."

When she finally arrived, the ranger took over like a physician.

"The park rangers are really caring people, concerned about you," she said. "He made me drink water, water and water, but I couldn't eat my \$27 steak dinner. I packed it out with me the next day, but I still couldn't eat."

Only once did she acquiesce and stay overnight at Indian Gardens. A ranger issued a special permit and furnished a bed roll for her.

"But bottom line if you hike down, you hike back," Stroemer said.

"It's important when you are hiking alone, to tell someone where you will be going and the expected time of arrival or return," she said.

Of her next trip scheduled in April, Stroemer said, "I've done it 12 times before, this is the thirteenth and last, but I'm going again and this time I have a friend (Shirley Stephenson of Ruidoso) going with me."

"The canyon does something for me," she said. "I'm drawn back and back."

"This is my personal challenge, between God and me."


