Feds target two area soil offices for cutbacks

A federal decision to close the Soil Conservation Service offices in Capitán and Carrizozo is biased against ranchers and rangeland, and would deal a severe blow to the local economy.

Those criticisms were part of a letter from Carrizozo Soil and Water Conservation District chairman Knollene McDaniel to the Secretary of Agriculture mailed Friday. The letter was in response to official notification from the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) received Thursday that the Capitán office and its Carrizozo sub-office will be closed.

Employees had been forewarned the offices were marked along with many others statewide in a budget-cutting consolidation move by the USDA.

But they hoped more sensible heads would prevail in view of the large geographical area and many rangeland acres covered by the office.

"We were given one day to respond to the news," Sue Stearns, who works in the

Carrizozo suboffice told **The Ruidoso News**. "It makes us feel embarrassed, like we haven't done our jobs."

Eight jobs could be affected if the two conservation service offices and the Farmers Home Administration office in Ruidoso, also previously indicated for closure, are eliminated, according to Hollis Fox, agent in the Carrizozo office.

In his response to the USDA, McDaniel, chairman of the Carrizozo soil conservation district board, wrote that the decision to close the office makes no sense and that

federal officials should be looking at cutting heavy administrative costs instead of hands-on field offices.

"Closing these offices would result in the absence of a soil conservation service office in Lincoln County," McDaniel wrote. "This makes no sense in a county of 4,860 square miles with a population of 12,000 and a heavy (conservation) rangeland workload."

While Lincoln County would have no office, the neighboring county of Torrance would have two field offices and Chaves would have a regular office and a field of-

fice. Eddy County would have four offices, Las Cruces and Tucumcari each would operate three.

"There are 54 SCS offices in New Mexico, although under the proposal, a new field office would be opened in Crownpoint," McDaniel wrote. "Of the 54 offices, only 35 are field offices while 19 are administrative, Resource, Conservation & Development project, soil survey and technical support offices."

Classic presents wine in the pines

To add a little more fun to the event, the ski teams will be auctioned off at Friday night's Grand Tasting and the proceeds will go to the Lincoln County Humane Society and the Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce.

Lisa Storey, ski race chairperson, has sent out entry forms to ski areas, chambers of commerce in West Texas, New Mexico and

Juarez, Mexico; and in information packets sent out through the chamber. Local individuals can stop by the chamber office to pick up a form.

Also new this year will be the Poor Man's Wine Tasting from 1-4 p.m. Sunday, February 21, at the Civic Events Center. The event will cost \$7.50 for adults and \$2 for children. As the guests enjoy wine, bread and cheese, they will also be entertained by a variety of performers to add to the family atmosphere. Souvenir T-shirts and wine glasses will be on sale for this event.

Connoisseur Classic IV will kick off Friday, February 19, with the tasting of the best wines from New Mexico, Texas and Arizona. The Grand Tasting will be from 6:30-10:30 p.m. Friday night at the Ruidoso Civic Events Center. The cost for the event will be \$15.

Besides the colorful decorations for the event, art exhibits by local galleries will also be on display for guests to view. The chamber has also sponsored a poster contest for area artists to create a poster to be used as a souvenir for the classic. The deadline to enter the contest is January 15.

Two fine events are on tap for Saturday, February 20. Select area restaurants will be hosting gourmet luncheons for about 30 guests each. The cost of the luncheon will be \$22.50 with a variety of restaurants and foods to select from. Participating this year will be Ahna-Michelle's Restaurant, Hotel Chango Restaurant in Capitán, The Incredible La Lorraine, Ma Maison, Terraza Companarios, Texas Club and Tinnie's Silver Dollar.

The Wines in the Pines Dance will be from 8 p.m. to midnight at the Civic Events Center. Hosts and co-sponsors for the event will be the Altrusa Club, but a band has not been selected at this time.

Village trading practices prompt questions

Don't throw away that prized piece of junk, Ruidoso's village manager may want to trade for it.

In the wake of a discovery late last year that the Ruidoso Street Department had turned into a salvage yard, employees also complained of unfair treatment by village management.

Specifically, they told **The Ruidoso News** of municipal officials trading village equipment with one employee and no one else.

It's all perfectly legal as far as the New Mexico State Agency for Surplus Property, the state Department of Finance Administration and the local village council is concerned.

The transactions don't even have to go through the purchasing department or the finance department. Just a little transaction note tucked away in a file cabinet.

The News received a letter to the editor that complained a Lincoln welder was "traded for junk." That letter, whose writer couldn't be located, prompted an investigation and a search for the welding equipment.

Street Department director Charlie Armstrong and village manager Ron Wicker occasionally attend surplus auctions and sales at Holloman Air Force Base and Santa Fe. Numerous items have been purchased over the past two years, including the welder. None have been inventoried, according to Wicker, who says he's working on it.

Questioned about the welder trade, Wicker said he believes in trades if they are in the best interest of the village.

"I discussed the trade I know you're talking about with David Thomsen (village attorney at the time)," Wicker said. "It was his opinion that if we could do it in the best interest of the village, yes, we could accomplish it."

Wicker was asked why only one person is allowed to make trades.

He said he did not know why only one person was allowed to trade for village equipment.

"I do know (in) the case that you're talking about, we got two (1952) trucks for a \$250 welder," he said.

The village budgets for items that cost \$250 or more at the beginning of a fiscal year, but Wicker said that was not necessary if government works with government in auctions.

Surplus property purchased at auction from the government can be sold after 12 months if that property has a value less than \$5,000.

If you will check with purchasing, and I'm sure you talked with Fonda (Hazel, purchasing agent) before. If we deal with another governmental agency, the purchasing

procurement procedure is different than a normal bid process," he said.

But according to Hazel, items purchased at surplus auction or sales are not even placed into the inventory at the village warehouse.

Wicker said whether the village had an inventory list or not, purchases have been good buys.

He may be right, but without an inventory list, the village has no record of items traded or sold or given away.

In January of 1992, Wicker purchased a \$1,800 van at Holloman to house tools and equipment for the sewer department. It has been sitting in the yard for a year without being put into service. Wicker said that it was not necessary to go before the council for the purchase. Again, it was a government to

government deal.

Wicker said the van was running and in good shape. He said it has been sitting in the yard for a year because he didn't have enough personnel to finish installation. Street workers say it will be sent to Arizona for television installations. Wicker denies that.

When we have time, we will get to those things," Wicker said. He said the village has other water projects and sewer line repair that are higher priorities.

Wicker was asked the location of the trucks traded for the welder.

"I don't believe we've received them. I don't think the welder has been transferred yet," he said.

Wicker said the trade was with Charles Alston, village mechanic.

"I don't think the trade has ever been made," Wicker said.

Local man dies after shooting

A 66-year-old Ruidoso man was shot to death following a disturbance Sunday night in his trailer.

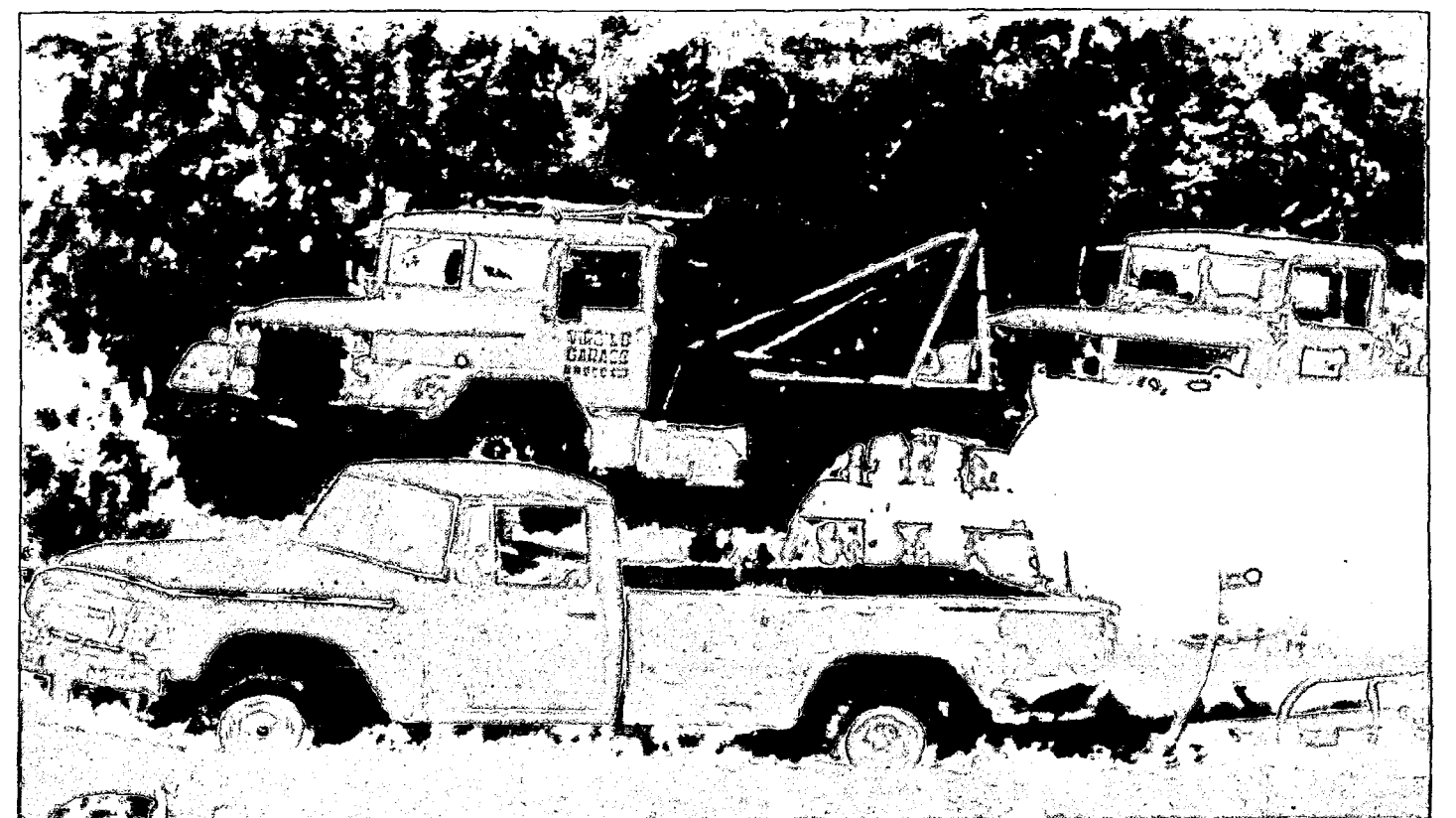
Walter Marshall Suttle, living at 1108 Mechem Drive, No. 3, was pronounced dead at the scene by Deputy Medical Investigator Danny Sisson at 8:52 p.m.

Death was apparently caused by a single gunshot wound to the head.

According to Ruidoso Police Chief Dick Swenor, the Ruidoso police responded to the shooting call about 8:30 p.m. Several family members were at the scene when the officers arrived.

Swenor said Ruidoso detectives Lanny Maddox and Lou Wardwell are investigating the incident at this time. He said all involved parties have been identified.

No further information was available at this time.

Police also were called to an attempted suicide Sunday night, where they took a deer rifle from a man who was threatening to shoot himself.

Also on Sunday, Ruidoso EMS picked up a stabbing victim in Mes-calero and transported him to Lin-coln County Medical Center.

The victim, whose name was not released at press time, was listed in stable condition at LCMC this morning.

A 20-year-old Capitan man was run over early Sunday morning ap-parently after the driver of the vehicle was refused entrance to a party.

Daniel Salcido, 20, of Hondo was charged with causing bodily injury with a vehicle, aggravated assault and failing to give immediate notice of an accident.

Meanwhile Paul Hernandez, 20, is being treated at Lincoln County Medical Center in Ruidoso for a severed ear, stomach wounds, a

broken clavicle and torn ligaments, according to reports from arresting Capitan police officer Ron Lam-brecht and assisting officer Lance Zink.

Contacted in his hospital room, Hernandez, who works for bronze sculpture artist Wes Smith, said he didn't know Salcido.

"I was talking to a friend of mine," he told The Ruidoso News. "I don't know what was said to the man. I was just walking back across the street to where I was staying and he hit me head on."

In his report, Lambrecht wrote that there was a party at the house of the victim's father and Salcido was told that he could not attend just before he allegedly hit Hernandez. The report states the car was going in reverse when the impact occurred at about 1:30 a.m. Sunday.

Salcido was booked into the Lin-coln County jail in Carrizozo at 7:15 a.m. Sunday. He indicated he was unemployed. His bail was set at \$20,000 and he bonded out four hours later. He was scheduled to appear in court this morning.

Mexico, 60 work in the state office, 90 in field offices and 60 in other of-fices.

"From these figures, you can see that 65 percent of the offices are field offices, 43 percent of the em-ployees are true field employees as-signed to work directly with farm-ers and ranchers delivering the pro-grams as intended," McDaniel wrote. "The other 57 percent of em-ployees are administrative or sup-port personnel that farmers and ranchers rarely, if ever, see."

"It is apparent from the offices proposed for closure that such fac-tors have not been considered. It is obvious that considerable money could be saved through reorganiza-tion/consolidation without field of-fices being closed or curtailing ser-vices to recipients of USDA ser-vices."

The USDA is using a flawed evaluation, McDaniel said.

"It must not have given consid-eration to SCS programs and espe-cially not to rangeland programs," he wrote.

"For example, the Capitan field office (which includes the Carrizozo sub-office) has more active Great Plains Conservation Program con-

tracts than any other field office in New Mexico, a fact that must have been overlooked.

"This represents a heavy work-load and a program that is very im-portant to us. The recommended closures are biased against rangeland programs and the evaluation ratings reflect the mis-conception that if there is no cropland (farms), then there is no need for USDA services. Our county is mostly rangeland (ran-ches), with only a small amount of cropland. Ranching is vital to our local economy, being worth more than \$27-million a year to this county."

Fox previously has noted that if the local offices are closed, Lincoln County ranchers and farmers would be served out of Las Cruces. The USDA has proposed closing 1,200 field offices. In New Mexico, the third largest state in the na-tion, the three agencies (Soil Con-servation Service, Farmers Home Administration and Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Ser-vice) under the department have 89 offices. Thirty would be affected. Federal officials said the national closures could save \$90-million an-nual from the department's \$62-billion budget.

radios, other than the police, was in need of radio repair.

He said a small room for radio maintenance was built inside the fire department at the White Mountain station.

The small room, about the size of a house closet, includes some tool boxes, some radio test equipment, but very little else.

For 1992-93, the village budgeted about \$37,000 for the radio department. Around \$10,000 is for part-time salaries, social security, state retirement and workers compensation. Also provided are: professional services, \$18,000; shop tools, \$1,500; as-sorted tools and adapters, \$1,500; inventory stock, \$5,000; office sup-ples, \$150; telephone \$300; and travel, \$1,500.

Chet Southard, a full-time em-ployee of the fire department, also works as a part-time employee and department head of the radio maintenance division for the vil-lage, according to Wicker. Southard also works as a part-time employee for A & B Electronics, the village's main vendor.

Wicker was asked if he saw any conflict of interest in a village em-ployee working in those three capacities.

"As long as I oversee the invoices that come to us and we maintain a communication system, I don't see that there's been any conflict there," Wicker said.

Village deputy manager Allen Briley said Armstrong has told him he would have the street depart-ment yard clean within 60 days.

been consummated, as I under-stand it. When we get the trucks, he'll get the welder," he said.

Wicker said the welder was still at the street barn.

But on checking with Armstrong on a request from The News, he was informed that the welder has been at Alston's home for several months and so are the trucks.

The 40-year-old trucks were mil-itary surplus years ago, said Al-ston. He said the trucks were then bought by the county, then the city of Roswell and then sold to Virgil's Wrecking Service. Alston said the wrecking service kept them for about 20 years and then he bought them. Now they are the property of the Village of Ruidoso.

Alston said one works and one doesn't. He said Armstrong was going to put a battery in one and a new winch line so it would be safe to pull the other.

According to auction invoices, radio equipment items were pur-chased for the village's newly creat-ed radio maintenance shop.

For the past two years, money has been set aside for tools and in-ventory equipment for the shop.

The radio vendor for the village is A & B Electronics, Inc., based out of Roswell. More than \$20,000 has been spent with the electronics firm in the past two years.

Ruidoso School Board to hear from parent; Village Council faces a routine agenda

An appearance by the father and the attorney of an athlete dis-ciplined for a violation of the Ruidoso school district's new behav-ioral code tops the agenda of the School Board meeting Tuesday.

The session will begin at 7 p.m., January 12, in the administration complex next to Ruidoso Middle School.

Rick Evans and attorney Gary Mitchell have requested a hearing before the board on several occa-sions to discuss the athletic code, which they contend violates stu-dents' due process rights. Although no special hearing has been granted, the two will have an op-portunity to present their viewpoint at the regular meeting.

Evans' son Eric, after being removed from track and prohibited from using other athletic facilities, withdrew from Ruidoso High School. A senior, he now attends school in Albuquerque where he plays basketball and is pursuing a scholarship in cross country. Con-cern that he could lose that scholar-ship if he stayed at Ruidoso is one

of the factors that prompted the 18-year-old Evans to transfer.

As written, the rule requires that a student be removed from a sport for the season if he/she drinks any alcoholic beverage or uses an il-legal drug at any time or any where. The student can be denied access to other athletic facilities or, at the discretion of the coach, could be redirected into another athletic activity.

For a second offense, a student must be banned from all athletic activities for the remainder of the school year. If an offense occurs during a school event, the student will be cut from sports for a full calendar year.

Eric Evans has admitted that he drank part of a wine cooler at a friend's house.

District superintendent Mike Gladden said Mitchell wrote a let-ter to him on behalf of Evans. He responded over the holiday break by sending Mitchell the procedures necessary to be placed on the agenda. He noted that this ap-

pearance is not a special hearing on the issue.

The rest of the board meeting will focus on construction, finance and the election February 2.

How about taking Coffee au Lait home?

His personality is as smooth and warm as his name, Coffee au Lait. The playful white and beige Cocker spaniel was brought into the Lincoln County Humane Society Shelter as a stray.

He was wearing tags, but shelter manager Randy Basch has been unable to contact his owners and they have never called to ask whether he was found. They may have moved away and left Coffee behind.

The two-year-old male is playful, but minds well, Basch said.

"He's good with other dogs and walks well on a leash."

Coffee au Lait keeps a neat cage. Whether he is totally housebroken is difficult to judge in a kennel situation. He will need to be neutered and can be aggressive if other male dogs are around.

Four shelter residents who have been featured in the past, but have been disappointed time and again as they were passed over for other choices are Tucson, Buddee, Pinto and Ming.

Buddee, a rusty-color Keeshond-retriever mix, has been there the longest. Her tender heart won the affection of a sponsor, who paid for her to be spayed. She would be fiercely loyal and eats up kind words and strokes.

Ming, a Siamese mix with deep, deep blue eyes, was an owner release. She has a sweet disposition, is used to being around other cats and doesn't appear to be frightened of dogs.

Pinto is a loving and lovable

terrier-hound, who's very intelligent. About one year old, she's a neat dog in her kennel and being short-haired, would demand little grooming.

Tucson, another low-to-the-ground pal, was very depressed after his owners left him at the shelter. His sweet disposition and calm manner has won the affection of shelter workers, who would like to see him find a secure home.

The shelter is scraping the bottom of its resources on sponsorships for potential adoptees. Sponsors enhance the chances of adoption for abandoned animals by paying for their spaying or neutering, the most expensive part of the adoption fee.

Other ways are open for people who want to help the animals.

Basch welcomes visitors who would like to play with the cats or walk the dogs around the grounds. Volunteers also can give personal touches to kennels or the cattery. The attention helps the animals become comfortable with humans and keeps their spirits high.

People who collect aluminum cans and newspapers for recycling also can benefit the shelter by designation their items to the society's account at the recycling center of the Lincoln County Solid Waste Authority. The center is situated on Second Street in Ruidoso Downs.

"If they can't make it to the center, they can drop the items in the basket at front of the shelter door on Gavilan Canyon Road and a volunteer will haul them to the

recycling center later," Basch said.

"I think it's a terrific idea and I should have thought of it," he said. "Thanks to the authority employees who did."

"People who recycle are conscientious anyway and aren't usually doing it because of the money. They're interested in the environment. By dedicating their donations to the humane society, they're doubling the benefit. I think it's an excellent idea."

"It's like those nickels, dimes and pennies that add up from our banks around town. People don't want to take pennies home and we can use all they have."

Basch has been asked by Eastern New Mexico University-Ruidoso to teach a dog obedience course. He has more than 16 years of canine training experience, including working with dogs in the military.

The tentative starting date is

January 30. The price is \$47.

"Normally, I charge \$250 for private lessons so I think this is a good opportunity for dog owners," Basch said. "Once they've completed the course, they should be able to train any other dog they may get in the future."

"I firmly believe if every owner took a dog training course or at least read a training book, we could eliminate all adult dogs picked up running loose. Then our spay and neuter ordinance could eliminate abandoned pups. That could put me out of business and I'd love it."

Members still are being sought for a Friends of the Shelter organization to help with daily needs of the shelter and money-raising events.

Decorators Studio is still up to date at 20

As styles in interior design came and went, one place has had the latest ideas and colors in Ruidoso for the past 20 years.

Decorators Studio, owned by Shirley Smith, has provided every possible product to redecorate a house or just a room or area since 1972. The studio is located at 700 Mechem Drive in the Jira Plaza and is open five days a week.

The business is open from 9:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. each week day, except Tuesday, and from 9:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. Saturday for people to stop by and browse through design books or to set up appointments with Smith to discuss what they need.

Decorator Studio has become a family affair for Smith, as her sons Steve and Jack Smith and grandson, Jay Cooper, help her with installations and deliveries. Her daughter also helps sew ordered items.

Smith said they do complete interior design from start to finish and specialize in window treatments, bedspreads and wall papering. They also do such accessory items as pillows, bath rugs, table cloths, placemats and cloth napkins.

When people call to set up an appointment Smith then goes out to

the house to take measurements and see what all they will need. After the person has chosen the items and colors needed, she gives an estimate of cost and then custom orders the materials. She said it takes about a week to get the fabric in and she makes sure it is the right color and material.

A work order is then made and passed to a seamstress to review and complete. When it is finished Smith makes another appointment to install the items and make sure nothing else is needed at that point.

"We are on the job start to finish. We stay with it while it is being fabricated and install it ourselves," she said.

After it is installed, Smith said she doesn't want that to be the last time to meet with the customer. They want to continue helping with any future needs.

"We want every job to be the very best," she said.

Smith started in interior design in 1969 with a store in Alamogordo, after receiving training through the Chicago School of Interior Design. She said she had always been interested in it in high school when she took four years of home economics. She said she has always had the talent to put colors together.

She still runs the Alamogordo

store, which serves more as a workshop to complete orders now. She drove back and forth between the two stores until 1981 when she moved to Ruidoso permanently.

Smith has seen a lot of changes in the more than 20 years that she has been in the business, but she always keeps updated on what is current. She said when she first started draperies and a few shades were about all that were available along with the big Venetian blinds. In 1973 the mini-blinds came in and then in 1976 the vertical blinds became popular. In the 1980s pleated shades became available and now there are more ideas and designs to choose from.

The popular style when Smith began was called Mediterranean, a Spanish style. It then changed to traditional and then to country, which lasted a long time, she said. The Southwestern style was popular from 1988 to 1992 but has been beaten out by traditional in most parts of the country. She said it is still strong here and she can still get the materials needed for that design.

Smith has many of the new designs on display as well as the various colors that are popular. She said colors that have become popular again with the traditional style

are blues, emerald green, lilac, burgundy, wisteria and plum. She also carries Waverly and Fabricut fabrics, Kirsch and Graber rods and Louvre drapes.

Smith said Decorator Studio has been successful the past 20 years because of the service they offer. She said they are always honest when working with people on designs. They also have the ability to deliver fast.

"Whether it's a small job or a big one, if it's done right it gives us a feeling of satisfaction," Smith said.

Elvis stamps are selling like hotcakes here

A few people may have been humming "Jail House Rock" or other hits by the King, but most waited patiently to purchase a piece of Elvis Presley.

Mike Currin, officer in charge at the Ruidoso Post Office, said about 10,000 to 12,000 Elvis Presley stamps had been sold since 12:01 p.m. Friday when they went on sale. He said at least 95 percent of their business Friday was people asking for Elvis stamps.

The rush was typical of what postal workers see the first of December when people begin to ask

for Christmas stamps. Customers were not limited in the number of stamps they could buy, but supplies are running low at the office.

"It was an enormous day for us, typical of Christmas," he said.

Currin said they have about 3,000 stamps remaining but those will probably run out by later today. For those who miss the stamp, it may be a long wait until they can get more. He said it would take at least 10 to 12 days before he can get a new supply.

Currin estimates at least 50 percent of the stamps purchased prob-

ably won't be used, at least for now. The people that bought them were either Elvis fans or they think the value of the stamps will go up, he said.

It wasn't quite a stampede at the Ruidoso Downs post office, but the office still sold quite a few stamps, said office window clerk Wayne Bradley.

"It was more commotion than I've ever seen (in 15 years of postal service) for any stamp," Bradley said.

The Downs post office still has about 3,000 stamps left for those

who missed the opportunity on Friday or Saturday. Bradley said for most people there is either a strong liking or disliking for the stamp. Some of his customers were young people buying the stamp for their mom or dad, he said.

Ron Glover, window clerk at Hollywood station post office, also sold about 2,500 to 3,000 stamps but still has quite a few left. He agrees that a majority of them will be saved as he sold them he put them in special envelopes for the customers to keep.

Tax volunteers needed here

Volunteers are needed in the Ruidoso area to serve as counselors in the Tax-Aide program.

Tax-Aide provides free personal income tax counseling and tax form preparation to low and moderate income taxpayers primary age 60 and over.

Anyone who is willing to assist older persons, can become a counselor. Volunteers should have knowledge of or an interest in income-tax matters and be willing to donate a minimum of four hours a week from February 1, to April 15. Volunteers will be required to pass the IRS open-book test.

Counselors are trained to assist with federal as well as state returns, and emphasis is placed on the special benefits available to older persons, such as state credits and rebates for food and medicine, property tax, and low income.

The AARP Tax-Aide program is celebrating its 25th year of volunteer tax assistance. In 1992, more than 30,000 volunteers assisted 1.6 million low income elderly taxpayers nationally.

New Mexico's 250 volunteers, working in 95 locations assisted 19,000 people.

Free tax assistance for low to moderate income elderly will begin in Ruidoso in February at the local Senior Citizens Center.

There has been a mood of calm and peaceful reverence here in the mountain land all say as Mother Earth enjoys the spring-like weather.

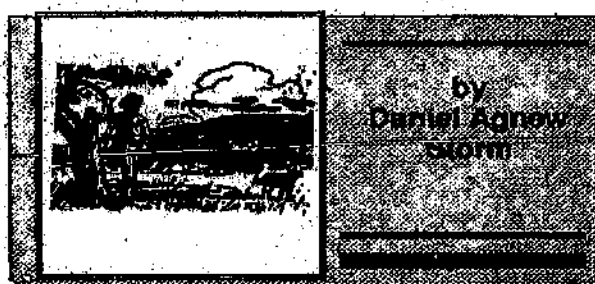
Birthday of a Young Cow

The contract for the past year cost the village \$300 per month, but the society has requested the amount to be raised to \$750 per month.

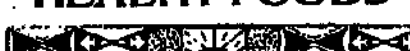
The last item on the agenda is to appoint trustee Ray Hayhurst as liaison to the fire department.

Lady Warriors earn two tough wins from Artesia

A double-header against the Artesia Bulldogs turned out to be just what the Lady Warriors basketball team needed to get on the winning track.

The team had been beaten by Artesia in a tournament in December after leading most of the game. It was almost the same scenario Thursday when the girls hosted Artesia, but they held on to win 48-42.

"They put the pressure on and we didn't do too well," he said.

Leading, then getting behind and then catching up to win was a real test of character, Davis said. The win was the first of the season for the team and was especially ex-

citing because the players knew they would have to play hard in the fourth quarter to win, he said.

Cicelee Makowski scored 14 points and picked up 10 rebounds. Sarah Dix earned 12 points and Michelle Morris had eight. Robyn Hursch made seven points and Kristie Ryan had four. Kim Floyd picked up three points.

Morris also pulled down 11 rebounds and Ryan had 10.

The third meeting of the two teams was the most exciting. The Lady Warriors picked up the second win 45-44 in overtime there.

Davis said the squad was behind in about every quarter but kept close enough to strike. At the end of the first quarter they were down by four and then were even at halftime. Artesia was up by seven at the end of the third and at one point took it to 12.

As time began to run down the Warriors started a new strategy to get the ball back. It didn't work as neatly in the next few attempts, in part because of Portales' Homer Vasquez, a returning starter from last year who made eight of 10 free throws in the fourth quarter. Not even a loud

As a team, Portales made 14 of 20 free throws in the fourth quarter and 20 out of 30 for the entire game, which really made the difference in the 54-61 loss, Warrior coach Norman Wright said.

Even with the loss, Wright was far from disappointed in the game.

In the second quarter, the Warriors outscored the Rams 14-7 in-

Besides individuals, businesses or groups are also invited to participate in the event with the businesses making a pledge or the

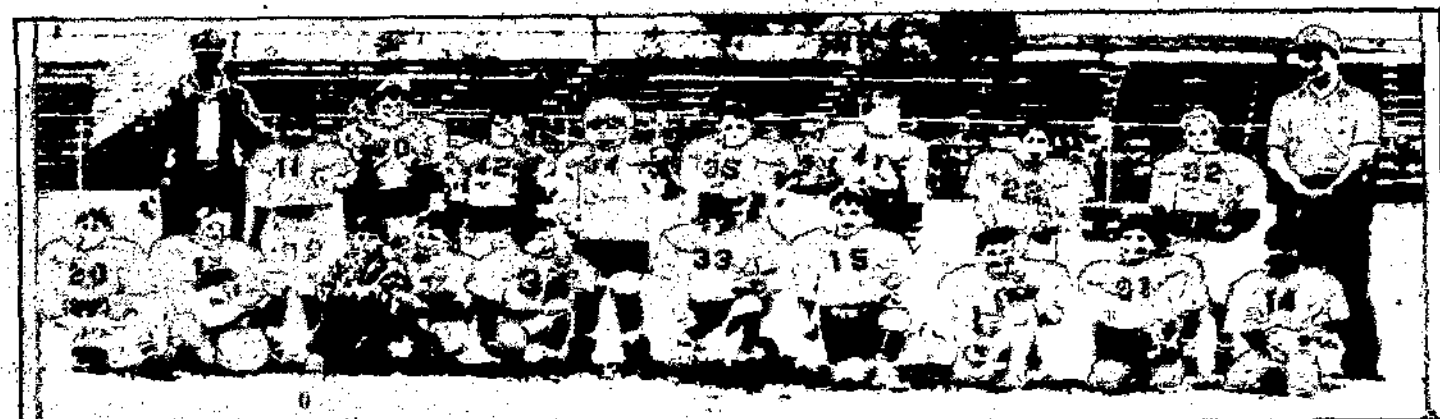
team members can find pledges.

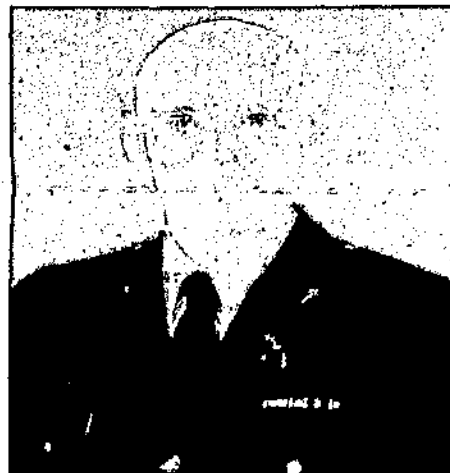

Editorial

Town hall meeting could lead to better communication

Communication is an easy word to bandy about, but REALLY putting it into practice — talking to one another and actually listening — is much harder.

Communication is particularly important to newspapers because that's an important part of their mission — getting the facts and passing them on in stories to readers. It's regrettable when the news sources — elected officials, public employees and other newsmakers — want to hide facts and information instead of being forthcoming when asked questions.

Some newsmakers are in the habit of crying out for more accurate reporting, and then dodging questions and playing word games. That leads to often unfounded suspicions, ill feelings and speculation; whereas a straight answer could save time, energy and ill feelings.

Mayor Victor Alonso and councilors Ron Andrews, Barbara Duff and Bill Karn ran on a platform promising open government and better communication. Maybe tonight's town hall meeting will be a beginning.

The council called the meeting, and that's a first step. It's up to the people of the village now to show up and speak out on the issue of mass transportation. If this town hall meeting is well-attended and successful, the council can be expected to call more such meetings on various issues.

The meeting, to be moderated by Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce executive director Joan Bailey will begin at 7 p.m. at the Ruidoso Civic Events Center. Everyone is encouraged to attend, whether it is to speak or to listen.
