Water group gears up to take battle to the Supreme Court

The good news is that the Water Defense Association probably will win a favorable decision in the state court of appeals on its water rights case, association director Hubert Quintana said Wednesday.

The bad news is that the suit, in which the Mescalero Apache Tribe lays claim to an enormous chunk of water rights from the Sacramento Mountains, probably will end up in the U.S. Supreme Court.

That could mean another \$40,000 in expenses and another year in court on a case that already is eight years old.

The irony of the financial situation is not lost on association members.

They know that not only are they paying for their own defense, but through their tax dollars also are paying for the defense of their opponents in the dispute.

The last accounting of legal expenses for the tribe's case was several years ago and totaled nearly \$1-million at that time, Quintana said. Since then the association

has been unable to obtain a figure. Federal officials contend too many legal entities have been involved to accurately track the expenses.

Coming to the aid of the Tribe, have been the Bureau of Indian Affairs, the U.S. Justice Department and the U.S. Attorney's office. In addition, the Mescaleros also have dipped into their own pockets, Quintana said. Those books are closed to people outside the Tribe.

The association was formed as an umbrella group to protect the rights of users along the three river system of the Rio Hondo, Rio Bonito and Rio Ruidoso.

The fight to retain historic water rights owned by non-Indian settlers and their descendants or subsequent land owners also has been costly, but on a much smaller scale.

ASSOCIATION COSTS

A general review was presented during the association's annual meeting. In addition to a member assessment early in the legal battle, the report showed a total of \$533,000 had been reserved for the

case and \$475,524 had been expended. The breakdown included:

—a \$25,000 emergency grant from the State Board of Finance to the San Patricio Ditch Association awarded in 1986 that has been expended. The money was used to assist with legal defense costs.

—a \$75,000 assistance grant from the New Mexico Department of Energy, Minerals and Natural Resources to Chaves and Lincoln counties in 1987 that has been closed out. The money was used to collect historic and economic impact information and to prepare technical evidence.

—a \$66,000 grant in 1988 from the Acequia and Community Ditch Fund Act to the association for the preparation and filing of legal documents that has been exhausted.

—a legislative appropriation of \$142,000 in June of 1989 to Lincoln and Chaves counties to cover prior fiscal year costs and expenses incurred for technical and legal services. The allocation has been expended.

—a \$225,000 legislative appropriation in January of 1989

given to Chaves and Lincoln counties for hydrological studies, technical and legal services.

The balance of \$57,475 noted in the summary has been decreased by \$14,000 since the report was compiled at the first of the year, Quintana said.

Richard (Simms, the association's attorney) thinks another \$12,000 will be spent before we receive the appeals decision, Quintana said. Instead of going back to the State Legislature this session and asking for more money, he urged members to try to ride out the current year on what's left in the January 1989 legislative appropriation.

Quintana received support from members to extend the contract with Simms to December 1993. Any money left at the end of that time would revert back to the state.

"Then if more money is needed we could go back to the state and point out that we gave money back before and now the case is close to ending," he said.

Council postpones purchasing procedures review

The historical precedent for village purchasing through government auctions was to be examined Thursday. It wasn't.

After middle-of-the-year budget items were discussed, Ruidoso Village Councilor Jerry Shaw asked Mayor Victor Alonso if he wanted to review auction information he had requested at Tuesday's council meeting.

She said she brought her information and was ready to compare her list with Wicker's.

"I have some information," Wicker said. "I don't think it's not in the form, I just didn't have the time. It was Tuesday night, to get in the type of form so that I could present it. If you want it today, I could present my part of it."

Alonso said, "We were arguing on whether or not we had auctions before or not, is that what you're talking about?"

Shaw reminded Alonso, "You asked staff to come up with some information and then you asked me. I think that's pertinent to whether we are going to continue auctions or not, or if we are going to curtail them in some way, or whether we're going to continue the same policy."

Alonso said the staff was instructed to do a historical research so that the council could understand better how other administrations use the approach.

But Wicker continued to be hesitant to present his report.

"I would hate to give a report that was not, hasn't been checked over for accuracy," he said. "I have it, it's handwritten. I made copies of it, but..."

Alonso rescued Wicker.

"If you're not ready to talk about it yet, we'll just wait. Jerry, you're ready, he's not. Let's both get ready," he said.

"He's getting his information from the same place I got mine," said Shaw, wanting to proceed.

Councilor Frank Cummins pushed to end any discussion regarding the number of auctions authorized by Wicker.

"What is the purpose of all this?" he asked. "What are we supposed to get out of all this? If we document he went to 10 trips or 10 auctions, or whatever you say it is. After we decide one way or the other, then what do we do?"

Shaw said an inventory would be in order. Wicker has said an inventory was in the process now, although he has authorized purchases of a number of auctions in the past two years without an inventory.

Shaw said that policy regarding trades needed to be formed.

Cummins attempted to clear his position.

"When we talked about all this (in closed session), and we instructed him (about request for proposals) ...

"Before we go out for RFPs (requests for proposals) you all are to approve it," Wicker finished.

"My understanding," Cummins said. "Was that we also agreed as a body (in closed session) that we wanted him to continue going to auctions, in a selective manner that you mentioned, (Councilor) J.D. (James). You brought that up at that time, and be selective on what he purchases for the village."

James agreed.

And what he purchased he inventoried from the delivery ticket, and not just one lot," James said.

Cummins said whether the village has gone to 10 or 15 auctions doesn't make any difference.

"Why don't we just make a motion that we want an inventory, and then not go through all this, he has to document what he thinks, and you have to document what you think?"

Alonso's request for historical documents came about because Wicker declared he had authorized only three or four auctions and challenged Councilor Shaw, suggesting she got her information from the newspaper.

Alonso also wanted the records to show that precedent had been set for auctions by past administrations.

Shaw wanted Alonso to know that only one auction, properly accounted for, oc-

curred in 1988, and that the more than 15 purchase orders Wicker authorized, did not have any accountability, apparently by Wicker's choice.

Since The News broke the story, Wicker now says he is working to set up an inventory procedure for all departments.

"My recollection was like you recalled, Frank," Alonso said. "Do we want the manager not to go to auctions? Do we want him to continue to go to auctions? And we had decided as a body (in closed session) to my recollection, that you can continue to go to auctions? I don't know if it ever wound up in a motion, but that was in my recollection, fully discussed and agreed upon."

Shaw pointed out, "We said that in executive session (closed meeting), Victor without a tape or anything, it is not a matter of record."

Shaw was talking about the recent closed meeting where Wicker asked village clerk Tammie Maddox, village attorney Patricia Ortiz and the deputy manager Alan Briley, to leave the room to allow the council to discuss personnel. It turned out that he was the personnel, and they discussed more than what is allowed by the open government statute, according to their own recollections of the meeting.

"Nevertheless," Alonso said. "It is a matter of what we want to do."

(Councilor Ron Andrews was more blunt. "To me, if the body tells this gentleman

to buy something, quite frankly I don't care how he buys it. If we think he's going to buy junk, then he shouldn't have a job," Andrews said.

"There has been two cases in which this council has directly said, one is kitchen equipment, we suggested that he look at used equipment. We didn't say auctions. But I think any thinking individual would realize that a predominant source of used kitchen equipment would be from government auctions? Whether it's hospitals or bases that they've closed," he said.

Andrews was referring to a possible search through government surplus for used kitchen equipment to be placed in the village's \$2-million civic events center.

Shaw said apparently she had complied with Alonso's request for nothing. She suggested dropping the issue.

Councilor Duff wanted to see Shaw's research.

"You didn't make it for nothing, because she said."

"I'm not going to pass them (her research) out," Shaw said.

"Why?" asked Duff.

"Because there's no reason to. Barbara We're not going to get any further," Shaw said.

"That's not something you can decide. Did I instruct you? Or did the council make

Gag rule on speech is partly lifted

Ruidoso village employees can officially talk to the press, but not about anything official.

Councilor Jerry Shaw said Thursday she still wanted to straighten out the policy where everyone had to go through the village manager for documents.

Councilor Ron Andrews said he has never seen any organization that didn't have an information officer to keep track of requests and work them into a schedule.

Shaw asked Andrews why this hadn't been done three years ago.

"Because I didn't know...," Andrews started, but Shaw didn't let him finish.

"That's the strange thing..." Shaw said.

Andrews apparently did not like Shaw interrupting his speech and became angry.

"Because Jerry, I didn't know anybody was getting it without putting it in writing," he shouted.

Shaw, only a few feet away, informed Andrews that she could hear him clearly.

"Well, if you let me finish and quit interrupting me, I'll tell you why," said a calmer

Andrews.

He then said he filled out written requests and paid for tapes when he wanted information.

He said he didn't know people were getting copies of documents for free.

Village clerk Tammie Maddox told Andrews that people are not getting free documents.

Councilor J.D. James said the timing was wrong for village manager Ron Wicker's memo.

"It looked like, and I'm not saying it happened, but it gave the impression that it was directed to the newspaper here. And that is who it was directed to," James said.

James said he was in favor of putting requests in writing to have a record.

"But I don't want it to come up all of a sudden to cut off information to whomever," he said.

Wicker said there was a misunderstanding on information dissemination.

"I didn't put a gag order on anybody. If you read the memo, there is not a gag order. I had a staff meeting on Wednesday morning and I basically told the staff I didn't want a gag order. If they felt comfortable talking to the press, then talk to the press. If it was official documents and official information and they had a problem

with it, then check with me," Wicker said.

"I think it was a timely memo that went out and it was a timely process of putting Mr. Stallings (Ruidoso News reporter Chuck Stallings) on notice that he is going to have to pay for more than just the copies that were generated as a result of this research," Wicker said.

Wicker said there was a letter to Stallings and the memo. He said the memo only was for public documents, not putting pressure on employees not to speak to anybody.

"I have to make sure this city operates," Wicker said. "The only way I can do that is to know what is happening, who is being asked for what."

Andrews said he read the memo and didn't interpret it that anyone was hiding information. He said he interpreted it that somebody needed to have control of work to be created from handling public documents.

James said he found out about written forms to request documents that were in existence for a long time.

Village clerk Tammie Maddox said the form

was in place when she started with the village.

But the document Maddox referred to also contained questions that cannot be legally required, such as a statement of citizenship and a promise to use the documents in a certain way. The form would have to be amended to eliminate those requirements.

James said he also doesn't want everyone to come into the finance department or the lawyer's office or the clerk's office asking information, because of the work load of those departments.

But James said people should have a right to talk to those employees.

"That's what I resented," James said. "I'm 100 percent for you (Wicker) to be the manager of this office. If that form comes to you, an exceptional manager will delegate that form to where it goes, and not interfere with that employee until the report is completed. But I object to where they have to have his

authority or his permission to speak to an employee. I think that's been corrected," James said.

What document James was referring to, didn't become apparent right away.

"That's not in the memo," Andrews said.

Cummins said he has never seen that.

"Where did you see that? I got the memo right here and it doesn't say that. It doesn't say anything about speaking at all," Cummins said.

James said he made a note that he disagreed with certain items and agreed 100 percent with the rest of the items. He said the item he disagreed with, he interpreted as talking to the employees.

Shaw said there were other memos going around.

"If there is, I'd like to see them," Wicker said.

James said he remembered where he read it.

Andrews thought he knew what James was talking about.

"I think what you all are looking

at, and to me that's where this whole thing got out of hand. There was a memo from an employee (village attorney Pat Ortiz) who was having problems, asking that the manager consider certain actions. That didn't set policy," Andrews said.

"I didn't see that," James said. "That's the memo you're talking about J.D.," Andrews said. "It was from her (village attorney Patricia Ortiz)."

Only after Andrews fingered Ortiz, did she respond. And at that, she wasn't specific about what she had written on the same day as Wicker's memo.

"I wrote one (memo) to Mr. Wicker saying, why don't you do this, this and this, and then lock the front doors and shoot them. I apologize. I'm making a big joke here," she said.

What Ortiz really wrote in her memo that Andrews was referring to was the following:

"Develop a protocol for dealing with the news media which prohibits the village employee from

speaking directly to the news media; directs the employee to refer all media to you (Wicker)."

Copies of that memo circulated at village hall.

Ortiz's second proposal, essentially the same as Wicker's memo, was to require all requests for public documents, or requests for information from public documents to be in writing and be approved by Wicker before distribution to the press or other persons making requests.

James still insisted he was referring to another document.

"What I'm talking about is before I got that nine items," he said.

This hint led councilors to believe that James was referring to a job description. Alonso met with Wicker for Wicker's job evaluation and a possible raise earlier in the week.

James said job description is not the same as job evaluation and did not carry the same confidentiality. He said, although he could not divulge what was on the job evaluation, he disagreed with the job description, which apparently was

changed by Alonso and Wicker, before the evaluation was made.

That change apparently dealt with closing doors to the media except through Wicker.

"I wrote down on there, I disagree," said James.

"I know what you're talking about," Wicker said. "And I'll ... But ... There is not a signed memo, that

I'm aware of, that Ron Wicker signed ..."

"I'm not saying it was from you Mr. Wicker," James said.

"That we should not discuss administrative policies," Cummins said.

"I'm not saying that," James persisted. "What I'm saying is, I read it, and I made that note on there."

"My point, J.D., is that there was no memo that set policy that said that (prohibit employees from talking to the media)," Andrews said.

Although the memo by Ortiz to Wicker was a proposal that would set a gag rule as administrative policy. Apparently, James thought the amended job description was

changed, also, to avoid employee contact with the media.

Andrews introduced a different kind of logic.

"How can you disagree with something that didn't set policy?" Andrews asked. "I'm not saying there's not a piece of paper. I'm saying you can't object to something that is in writing that was never implemented."

That statement would indicate Andrews feels that a person must wait until after a policy has been enacted before a person can object to it and that a person can't object to a proposal to try to prevent it from becoming policy.

James said all councilors saw the document.

Shaw said she and James were the only two who didn't agree with that one item.

Andrews seemed to catch on to what James was talking about.

"OK. I know what you all are talking about." He said he hadn't reviewed (the job description.)

After the meeting, Andrews and other councilors looked at the job description in Wicker's office.

LEGAL ARGUMENTS

Association president David Lee said a big crowd of water rights owners showed up at the appeals hearing Tuesday in Albuquerque.

"I hope that let the court know we think this is a real serious matter and it most certainly is," he said. "If you don't have water, you don't have anything."

Lee said he was impressed by the association and state's arguments against the Tribe.

"I had hopes it would end here, but I guess you know, after this decision, it will go to the U.S. Supreme Court," he said. "We have a long road to hoe."

The oral arguments Tuesday were heard by Appeals Court judges Lynn Pickard, Thomas Donnelly and Bennie Flores.

Herb Becker represented the

U.S. State Attorney's office and led off the Tribe's case. In addition to Simms representing the association, Martha Frank was there on behalf of the state and an economic expert on contract with the association.

Quintana said the legal arguments were broken into sections starting with the issue of whether aboriginal rights guarantee the Mescalero access to all of the water.

"Martha Franks (argued) that for the Tribe to be entitled they had to be able to quantify the amount the Mescalero used before the Reservation was established," he said. "Since they never did, they are not entitled to any except for domestic use, fishing and gathering until the Reservation was established."

If they aren't required to abide by the standard, then all later water rights laws passed in the

state that are based on quantification would not mesh, he said.

Historical evidence favors non-Indian water rights claimants, Quintana said.

"The Treaty of 1852 granted peace, it didn't create the Reservation, certainly not in the Sacramento," he said the attorneys pointed out.

There were discussions in Congress about other sites in the Hondo Valley and in Arizona. The first Reservation was near Fort Sumner in the 1860s.

The actual date the existing Reservation was created significantly impacts on the amount of water the Mescalero legitimately can claim, he pointed out. Most of the settlers along the stream systems were there long before the Reservation was established and therefore, have claims that predate the Tribe's, he said.

Attorneys also argued over the validity of the economic plan used by the Tribe as a basis for the need for the additional water.

"The U.S. officials felt the (district court judge) erred in his decision to only grant the Tribe an additional 2,300 acre feet of water," Quintana said. "They felt the judge shouldn't use locally accepted data and statistics on crops and crops evaluation and should accept on face value what the Tribe introduced, regardless of whether it made economic sense off the Reservation."

The association countered that the (Tribe's) figures were skewed, especially in labor and quantities to be produced. The Economic feasibility was wrong."

Lee said he felt "the U.S. attorneys and the Indians are grasping at straws."

Member Leonard McCutcheon

said it irritated him that "history meant everything for the Indians when it served their interests, but nothing if it served ours."

"By putting (the Mescalero) over there (in the mountains), they (the Congress) obviously didn't want to disturb the settlers (along the streams) already cultivating crops."

Member Jenny Ortiz said if the association had been able to secure records from Mexico, they probably could have established water rights to non-Indians well in advance of 1852 when the area was a Mexican territory.

In other business, the association

re-elected unanimously the existing slate of officers. They have served one term and the association by-laws allow officers to serve two consecutive terms.

Lee, from the Rio Bonito basin, will continue to serve as president;

Joe Salazar, from Rio Bonito, as vice president; Phelps Anderson of Rio Hondo as secretary; Dr. Walter Hopkins of Rio Hondo as treasurer, and W.C. "Dub" Williams of Rio Ruidoso as member-at-large.

The association board consists of 15 members. In addition to the officers, members are Robert Owen from the city of Roswell, Ortiz from Rio Hondo, McCutcheon from Rio Ruidoso, Fred "Peg" Pfingsten from Rio Bonito, Frank Warth from the village of Capitan, Gail Hopkins from Rio Hondo, LaVerne Cole from Ruidoso Downs, Bill Karn from Ruidoso, Monroy Montes from Lincoln County and Rory McMinn from Chaves County.

—heard a report from D.L. Sanders, special assistant attorney general for the State Engineer's Office, on water-rights proposed legislation slated to be introduced this session and other water-related issues.

a motion to instruct you?" Alonso asked.

Apparently, the mayor forgot that he had decided not to press the issue since Wicker said he wasn't prepared. Now he and Duff were insisting on seeing Shaw's research.

The village clerk said there had been a motion.

Then that's not a dead issue," Alonso said. "You may be wrong on this issue, and I can understand why you might not want to discuss it. But it's not a dead issue."

I may be right on it, too," Shaw told the mayor. "I say either get on with it or get off."

Andrews shifted the conversation. He said that some councilors were taking Shaw's statements to accuse the council she wasn't part of (Andrews, Duff and Alonso) of starting something new (look at Alonso).

When she put words in my mouth that the motorcycles have been purchased at an auction," Andrews said. "I said the manager told Bill Karn and I ..."

James interjected.

"You did say in a previous administration, there was a practice ..."

Andrews seemed irritated. "I didn't say it was a practice, I said I was told by ..."

James broke in again. "You gave an example, you used the two motorcycles ..."

"If the man lied to me," Andrews said. "I used the word very specifically, that the previous airport manager told me and Bill Karn that they had been purchased at auction. If that's wrong, it's not my fault."

Alonso was still concerned about his instructions from Tuesday.

"We did instruct, through a motion, very formally, part of the meetings, part of the minutes, we can't just drop it the way I see it. Unless we want to go back and redo another motion, another discussion, and then we would be doing it without the aid of the newspaper, the cameras, the people," he said.

James said Wicker and the street department are now in the process of making a physical inventory. He favored to check that inventory with documents that have items listed.

"Those items that are not in the physical inventory that's being taken now, we want to know what happened to them," James

said. "They either went to service, or they went to a trade, or they just weren't inventoried."

He said if items were missing from the inventory he wanted to know where they were.

Shaw agreed.

"Then why don't we do this," Andrews offered. "We got a motion. Rather than drop it, we asked for information. I would say we wait and get all the information at the same time. The city manager hasn't got his compiled."

Wicker said it wasn't his intention to have a dispute with Shaw.

We've got information, and we've provided that same information to Chuck (Stallings of the Ruidoso News. The News maintains not all information requested was provided). I just want to get it cleared up. The bottom line if you all don't want me buying surplus property, then I won't buy surplus property."

Alonso was aggravated.

"That bothers me that you should even ask that question, because we've discussed this (in closed session) and you're authorized to continue," he said.

"I understand that, Mayor, but it's still coming up. All I'm saying is I committed to you when it was discussed. It will be a long time before I authorize anybody to go back," Wicker said.

Alonso still was irritated.

"That bothers the heck out of me," he said. "Because what's happening is, that we're letting Chuck Stallings and one councilor ..."

James interrupted the mayor.

"Don't just say one councilor," he told the mayor.

"A minority," Alonso clarified. "Where a majority has clearly indicated a certain avenue, and we're letting a minority opinion rule. That bothers me."

If Shaw and James were the minority, the majority supporting Wicker's activities entirely must have been Andrews, Duff, Alonso and Cummins. It is not know if Councilor Bill Karn attended the closed meeting.

"I think there's a lot of difference between surplus purchase, necessarily, and auctions," Wicker said. "That's one of the things I'm going to do is to try to define the different types of purchases that we make,

"If it's something we can benefit from, we will try to go about it ... if we find an engine or piece of equipment that we can save two or three thousand dollars, we'll try to save."

Wicker described a trade with one of his employees revealed by a story in The News, saying he never saw the trucks and he never saw the welder that he could recall.

"I approved the transaction after I had consulted with an attorney, after I had made sure that Charlie (Armstrong) got permission from the federal property agency that this could be done. The trade was done," he said.

But when Wicker talked to The News he neither knew when the deal was made or where the items were located. At the time, the employee had both items, the trucks to trade to the village and the welder he obtained in return, at his house.

"I know how it looks, all that does not totally look above board. I will not do that again. I've already instructed Charlie ...," Wicker said.

Shaw asked Wicker if the welder was the only trade.

"That's the only trade that I'm aware of," he said.

Alonso asked if any motion was going to be made or whether or not the council was going to rehash old news.

"I would like to make a motion that the city manager, in charge of the budget and in charge of running this city, be allowed to use his best judgment in the acquisition of capital property that we have approved the purchase of," Andrews said.

Under Andrews' motion, items would not necessarily require individual council approval. If an item on the budget said office equipment, the manager could purchase office equipment any way he wanted, as long as he stayed within that budget.

"It's obvious what you're doing," Alonso said. "Making the previous discussion that we had (in closed session) official."

This marks the second time the village had to redo a decision to make it official. The other incident, more than a year ago, was at the suggestion of Deputy Attorney General Daniel Yohalem.

Shaw asked about the trading of inventory.

"I said the most efficient way," said Andrews. "That includes trades, auctions,

sales, silent bids."

State statute 13-6-1 allows for the disposition of obsolete, worn-out and unusable personal property and reads in part:

"The governing authority shall dispose of the item by negotiated sale to other state agencies, local public bodies, school districts, state educational institutions or municipalities or through the central purchasing office by means of competitive sealed bid or public auction or through the federal property assistance bureau of the general services department."

James added inventory to the motion.

Alonso clarified inventory.

"Ron, you want to include in the event we buy used equipment," the mayor said.

"Then an inventory, that would be OK."

Andrews conceded that errors had been made.

"There may have been an oversight. I think anybody understands that if you have capital property, there's supposed to be an inventory of it. There was an oversight. The man admitted to that," he said.

Then Andrews referred to oversights of past administrations.

"The fact is that when this council took office back in March of 1990, there was no inventory of the real property that this village has bought," he said.

Alonso said he had was no argument with that statement.

"But in the spirit of seeking a compromise, Ron ...," Alonso started.

"That an inventory be updated accordingly," Andrews finished the statement.

The council then discussed what would be eligible for an inventory list.

Shaw brought up an electric polish machine for jewelry.

"It may not be worth a dollar, but I would like to know what happened to it," she said. "If you look at this, there are some strange things. I think they should be accounted for."

That issue was avoided by the rest of the council and Andrews told a story about auctions he saw on a television program.

Shaw returned to other items.

"There's two councilor upright vacuum cleaners," Shaw said. "I said why couldn't we use one of those for the convention center. I was told nobody knows where they are. Do you see what I'm saying. It may be nickels and dimes, I don't care. I

want better accountability ... Everything I have gotten, I have gotten from your records, Ron (Wicker)."

Alonso steered away from Shaw's questions.

"Let's focus on the discussion, because I want to get out of here. We got a motion to instruct the manager to buy the stuff the way he sees fit, to take an accounting and that supports his ability to go to auctions and sales. We've amended it to include an inventory procedure. The inventory procedure as Leeann (Boswell of the finance department) has indicated is not real tight. Any other discussion on the motion and the amendment?" he asked.

"OK. To make it clear and maybe this will satisfy Jerry's problem," Andrews said. "I don't want this city to start inventorying trash cans that cost five bucks apiece. So I think if the list comes in, and we know we bought it, it will either be put into the permanent inventory or a note will be made as to its disposition."

"If it's under \$250 or has a life expectancy. It's brought in, a vacuum cleaner, it's an upright and went to the civic center. What happens after that, I really don't care," Andrews said.

"But it didn't get to the civic center," James complained.

"Of course, it may disappear after it gets to the civic center," Andrews said.

Shaw said that none of the items ever went through the purchasing warehouse.

"I never perceived that it needed to be in the warehouse," Wicker said. But now I have decided that we will put it in the warehouse, and we will inventory it and we will find room for it and we're going to put it down there. What we don't need we'll auction off."

Shaw asked about one list of purchases that was divided, part to go to the purchasing warehouses, part to go to the street department. She said the warehouse never got the items.

"That bothers me, too," she said. "And that was the electric polishing machine."

Shaw's question went unanswered.

James told of his warehouse experiences on recording inventory.

Wicker said there had been mistakes made, but he agreed that an inventory such as James mentioned was needed.

Alonso asked for the motion and it passed.

Homeless dog finds a good Samaritan

Adobe had been scavenging food in the area east of Ruidoso Downs for a couple of weeks.

Judy Blakeney of Hondo Valley Kennels tried to get close to her with no luck, until the cinnamon and buff-colored animal became so hungry it approached for food and was captured.

"The first few days, we were worried about her because she just sat in the back (of her kennel cage), bared her teeth and snarled every time someone approached her," said Randy Basch, manager of the Lincoln County Humane Society animal shelter.

Blakeney and Basch were concerned that the animal would not be suitable for adoption. But the

human caring and kindness Adobe received from Blakeney and shelter workers in the last month have paid off, allowing the dog to show her true nature.

"She responded so quickly to affection," Basch said. "Now she stays at my side when I let the animals out in the morning. She doesn't race (to the community exercise area) with the rest of the dogs until I tell her to go."

Visitors now receive a warm welcome from Adobe. She loves getting treats and thrives when given special attention.

Adobe appears to be a shepherd mix, probably with some retriever or yellow Labrador blood.

To give her a better chance at adoption, Blakeney is sponsoring Adobe for the cost of her spaying, which is the main expense associated with taking a dog or cat home from the shelter.

All animals adopted from the shelter must be spayed or neutered to ensure they do not contribute to the pet over-population problem that results in 14-million abandoned dogs and cats being destroyed each year nationwide.

One of Adobe's many roommates at the shelter is Cricket, an 11-month-old female, who Basch calls "a classic Heinz 57 mix."

"She probably has some husky in there somewhere, maybe some shepherd or maybe not," he said. "She came in as a stray and has a very good disposition."

"She's very playful and likes to chase balls or to be chased herself. If she's around another dog who's

aggressive, she tends to be passive."

Cricket was brought into the shelter three weeks ago and will need to be spayed.

In the cattery next to the main shelter, several orange tabby and a couple of black cats, both short and long hair, are looking for homes. Previously featured was Reeba, who has a rim of gray hair that sets off her face against a black coat, and Stitches, a black and white "talker," who greets visitors with feline conversation and an invitation for stroking.

A spayed gray Persian, a Siamese mix and an intriguing-looking tortoiseshell also are available.

Past canine pets who can't figure out why they haven't been picked include:

-Chocolate Sundae, with a chocolate and vanilla face. The border collie/heeler mix is full of fun and eager for a family with children who could play with her.

-Buddee, a cinnamon-colored, spayed Keeshond mix who's short, sturdy and would be a loyal companion.

-Pinto, a terrier hound with one blue eye and one brown eye, who was spayed through the generosity of a sponsor.

-Tucson, a housebroken, low-to-the-ground mix with a reddish tint to his medium-length coat and a very tender personality.

-Licorice, a two-year-old black Schipperke/chow mix, less than one-foot-tall, with a calm, sweet disposition.

-Coffee au Lait, a two-year-old freckled cocker spaniel, who keeps a neat cage and walks well on a leash.

-Pocus of the Hocus and Pocus pair of shepherd mix pups.

EDCLC directors turn out in force to plan for fundraising

Members deal with shortfalls, surveys

With directors seated elbow-to-elbow at the board room table, the Economic Development Corporation of Lincoln County dispensed with past business and made plans for future months.

All but two directors filed in for the meeting after the group had not been able to get a quorum for meetings in November and December. Directors Dick Mound and Gordon Ross had called in that they would not be able to attend the meeting.

Also attending the meeting were county commissioners Wilton Howell and Bill Schwettmann.

The group reviewed financial statements for September, October and November before reaching December's six-month picture.

For the period the group had revenues of \$23,874.24 compared to a budgeted amount of \$36,899.98. Total expenses for the period were \$34,455.49, while \$46,530.19 was budgeted. Reserve funds have been used to help pay the \$10,581 expenses not covered by revenues.

To gain ground on the growing deficit and to establish a firm funding source, the group will soon be kicking off a fund-raising project. The project is modeled off such programs as United Way in which a team leader directs a team of several people to meet with business owners to discuss pledges or memberships in the EDCLC.

President Ronnie Paulger said they have developed a brochure for the people to take out to the business which tells what the corporation has brought to the community. He said executive director Karen Kopp has done an excellent job of getting the information together through a survey of businesses brought in to the group.

The EDCLC sent out surveys to Lincoln Laminated Log, Juma Farms, Apache Futures, Richard's Puzzles and Warp Speed.

From these returned surveys the

gross sales from the businesses were \$3.75 million, while the payroll was \$1.14 million. The total spent in Lincoln County based on the business response was \$2,989,095.

Surveys returned from the employees of the businesses showed a total spent in Lincoln County of \$1,105,185, for a total from the businesses and employees of \$4,094,280 for the county.

"The total impact for last year was \$4 million and that is significant. The county commission has challenged, persecuted and chastised because we are not doing anything," Paulger said.

"Previous," commissioner Howell pointed out.

Paulger said that may be, but The Ruidoso News has also been totally adverse to economic development and the corporation.

Frankie Jarrell, editor and general manager of The Ruidoso News, disagreed with Paulger's statements, noting that she had made attempts to work with Paulger on a promotional project to benefit EDCLC.

Jarrell said in the past the corporation, funded mainly with tax dollars, had failed to account for some of those tax dollars. Hoping for more accountability and communication with the new leadership and new executive director, Jarrell and publisher Sammy Lopez came up with a combination promotional/fundraising project that was briefly described to Paulger in a telephone conversation.

Apparently, no mention was made of that during Thursday's meeting.

"I just don't know what he's talking about when he accuses us of being adverse to economic development," said Jarrell. "We'll continue to scrutinize any group that is receiving and spending public money, but such oversight certainly isn't a negative; on the contrary, it's a positive service to our readers."

Paulger went on to say that many economic development corporations haven't had this much success in their first few years.

The group knew it would take four to five years to get some impact, Paulger said.

The EDCLC divided businesses into groups by classification and a team leader has been selected for each group. The team leaders, who will serve as the coordinators and information centers, will meet in the next couple of weeks to get started on the plan, Paulger said.

Each team will have five or six people who will visit with the businesses in their group. These people will attend training sessions before they go out so they will be prepared for any questions the businesses have, he said.

Kopp said a pledge card will be left with the businesses to send in or the team member will collect the pledge amount when they meet. She said secretary Joanna Gallagher has been a great help in getting this project together.

Paulger said he hopes that the board members will take an active part in getting the fundraising project off the ground.

In her executive director's report, Kopp told the group that the Southwestern Public Service Business Quarter, of which the EDCLC is a member, has developed a prospecting procedure for the nine groups that it consists of.

When the central coordinator for the quarter, Dan Red, gets inquiries he will ask the nine to send him site proposals. He will then give all nine to the prospect and will then let the groups know if the prospect needs more information.

Kopp said she is satisfied with this procedure because Red also does quarterly reports that give the status of every prospect.

She said Red and two representatives of the state economic development department visited the county two weeks ago for a tour.

Kopp, along with Jim Bassett of Texas-New Mexico power, showed them buildings and properties in Carrizozo, Ruidoso and Ruidoso Downs so they would know more about the county.

Kopp said the Business Quarter doesn't have the buildings and property available on file so she is going to have area realtors develop specification sheets on those.

She said the changes the EDCLC directors had suggested for a brochure by the Business Quarter have been done. Carrizozo and Capitan were added to the map and Highway 380 was completed through the area. They also added Highway 48 and the Ruidoso campus of Eastern New Mexico University.

The EDCLC has gotten back responses from Marriott and Hyatt hotel corporation on the possibility of building a hotel on the property near the Civic Events Center. Kopp said both stated they are not expanding at this time but would be willing to manage it after it is built.

She had sent out 15 letters to hotel corporations, but will be getting more corporations when she can get access to a large source for those names.

Kopp said she had also written a letter to R.D. Hubbard to discuss the issue, and he had tried to contact her during Christmas, but she was out of town. She said she has talked to his secretary and will plan to meet with him the next time he is in Ruidoso.

Hubbard has a contract with the village to build a hotel on that property and anyone interested in building a hotel would have to go through him until it expires in July, she said.

Directors John Van Tussenbroek and Joe Griffin both commented that the hotel industry is currently not doing well because of the economy. Griffin asked how much time Kopp has been spending on the project and said since the industry is

in a tail spin she might not want to make it a priority.

Director Joan Bailey pointed out that they do need to make it a priority because the contract with the Village of Ruidoso is based on the EDCLC searching for hotel. She said she can get the address for a national newsletter for the industry.

Griffin said in an industry newsletter they should be able to find a few looking to build.

Kopp said she has also looked into getting a 1-800 number for the EDCLC and found that NTS would have the best system for the group. Director Glen Crane had suggested checking into it and said it has really helped in his business. He said people won't hesitate to call a 1-800 number.

The number may come in handy if the group goes ahead with a direct mail campaign to coupon processing companies across the United States. Kopp said she has obtained a list of 168 companies and would like to send a mailing about the area to them.

She said she would like to get an advertising agency to help them develop a special letter to send out to these businesses. The estimated cost for the project would be about \$4,000 without an ad agency she said.

Phil Price Advertising Agency has developed a whole campaign for the Business Quarter, but Kopp said she would try to get a New Mexico agency.

Bailey suggested they should talk to local artist Debbie Jones if she could develop a letter for them. She said no one knows Lincoln County better than the people who live in it.

Paulger asked if this project would be duplicating what any of the other communities in the area or the Business Quarter is doing. The board asked Kopp to get more specific information on the project since there is no time frame on it.

Bailey asked how a business finds out about the EDCLC and Kopp said they most often find out by calling the chamber of com-

merce. She said she also gets a lot of inquiries from advertising done by Texas-New Mexico Power, but she doesn't know how specific its ads are.

One trade show Kopp would like to attend is Trends 2000 in Los Angeles, California, later this year. She said it is specifically for companies wanting to move out of California and many other areas will be after these businesses.

The group has tentatively set the date for the annual meeting on March 11. Three terms will be running out at that time. Paulger, Pat Huey of Capitan and Jim Miller.

A nominating committee of Bailey, Tom Riggsby and Scott Shaffer are in the process of contacting people to see if they would like to serve on the board. The group will be contacting more than the number of those terms expiring because Paulger said he wanted to give directors an opportunity to say they can no longer be involved.

He said when they selected directors to serve during past elections they were asked if they would participate, but with the recent attendance problem there may be some who might have had a situation or commitment change. Paulger said people have valid excuses for not being able to make it to meetings, but he doesn't want to burden the next president with a board that is absent.

He also mentioned outgoing member Huey has been a player in the EDCLC since its formation. Huey missed only two meetings in those five years, he said. It was an effort in Huey's business, concrete pouring, to be committed to doing that, Paulger said.

Kopp will work out the details of the annual meeting and although they didn't intend to have a speaker, commissioner Schwettmann suggested contacting Aubrey Dunn, a former legislator and promoter of the Sun Bird Treasure Fest. He said he is entertaining and well-known which may add to the interest of the event.

Invitations and ballots will be going out as the date approaches.

Chamber offers prizes to members who return surveys

Getting a good return on surveys sent out by three area groups could have important results for the Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce.

The group decided at a board meeting Wednesday to give \$250 for prizes to people who participate by sending their surveys and a postcard back in. The survey has been created by MainStreet Ruidoso with the help of the chamber and the Economic Development Corporation of Lincoln County.

MainStreet has developed three surveys with one going to local residents, one to local businesses and a third to visitors. Chamber executive director Joan Bailey said she has helped develop the list of names to send the visitors survey to by getting lists from lodgers and also taking names off the registration book at the chamber.

Tom Rigby, acting chairperson in the absence of president Paul Crown, said he is also a member of the MainStreet board and the surveys will provide a lot of good information for the groups. By offering shopping spree prizes it will give the people an incentive to return it.

Bailey said the surveys will be sent out through the mail and the person who receives it will have a stamped and addressed envelope to return it in. Because the surveys are to be anonymous, the people will also receive a stamped postcard to return to enter the prize drawing.

She said a survey hasn't been done in a long time and will likely confirm some ideas they already have and answer questions about others. MainStreet director Don Miller created the surveys and made them as user-friendly as possible, Bailey said.

The groups would like to offer \$1,000 in prizes and MainStreet will be providing \$500 of that while the chamber and EDCLC will donate \$250 each.

Director James Hobbs updated the group on a volunteer project he and director Clark Carpenter are working on to help chamber members learn about the chamber office. Chamber members could come into the office for a half day or a full day to answer telephones or questions from the people who come in to get an idea of what the staff does, he said.

Hobbs said they met with eight businesses one day to see if they would be interested in the program, and six were very positive about it. They had also met with Bailey and Lisa Storey, visitors services center director, to discuss some ideas to make the program successful.

The approach Hobbs and Carpenter took with the businesses they talked to was that as chamber members they get their bill for dues and may wonder what they are getting in return. He said he also told them the volunteer program was being developed in the interest of getting people involved in their chamber.

Hobbs said they would like to come up with a catchy name for the program to show that this is a program that is coming from within. The program should start with the directors spending time in the office first, if they are interested in continuing with the idea, he said.

If the directors get involved they would then go out in the business community to sign up two more people to come in.

"It has to be a networking thing," Hobbs said.

Bailey said besides getting an education about the chamber, volunteers will also learn many new things about the community they live in. If directors have already spent time at the office, they can also tell the people they sign up what it is like, she said.

As far as the regular staff members are concerned, they are extremely excited about the program, Bailey said. It would also give Bailey more time to get out to meet with the membership which was her goal when she took over as executive director.

The board asked Hobbs and Carpenter to continue working out the details of this program.

Membership for the chamber is now 348 members, with six joining in the month of January. Bailey said since April 1992 they have earned 75 new members, while 17

have discontinued membership for a 95 percent retention rate.

In her executive director's report, Bailey said she has talked to her chamber counterpart in Juarez, Mexico, Carlos Murguia, about an advertising campaign that city is developing. She said his group wants to advertise that Juarez is the only Mexican city with a ski resort, Ski Apache.

Ruidoso's Mexican television campaign will be carried out on Channel 26 which will cover Chihuahua and the El Paso area. Bailey said during the holidays, she and her staff asked many Mexican visitors what station they watched

and Channel 26 came up consistently.

She said they will start the commitment with Channel 26 and if they are not happy with it they can try another station. They selected Channel 26 instead of 44 because it has a stronger signal for the area they want to cover.

The commercial spots will begin in February and continue through March for a total of 180 30-second spots. They will run three times a day, five days each week and will be in Spanish.

Jack Muhn, contract accountant for the chamber, and Scott Muhn, owner of Ruidoso Printing, will

represent Ruidoso at Expo Vacaciones 93 in Mexico City this week. Bailey said these two will be going because they are fluent in the language, and they also lived in South America for about 15 years. She said they also have a respect and love for that culture.

Bailey and Storey have also been representing the region at a legislative reception in Santa Fe hosted by the Santa Fe Chamber of Commerce on January 25. Chambers from across the state are invited to set up booths at the event at which legislators are honored as they begin a new session.

She said this was the first time

the Ruidoso chamber has attended and the turn-out was very good. Many of the legislators who stopped by were familiar with the area and had come here for a visit.

The Ruidoso area booth always attracts a lot of people with its stuffed Smokey Bear because everyone loves Smokey, Bailey said.

The reception also offers an opportunity to see what other communities in the state are doing, she said.

Next year Bailey said she would like to see board members and members of the private sector attend the reception. She said she hopes the village council will also

consider attending the event to represent Ruidoso.

Jack Muhn gave the financial report for the month and said he is comfortable with how close they are to what was budgeted. In December the group had its second largest billing of dues for the year and received about \$9,000 of about \$15,000 billed. He expects to receive the remaining amount through January and February.

The visitors services center was a little under budget for salaries because they had not planned to have two full-time people but have had to because of the increased amount of work necessary for inquiries.

Warriors struggle with mistakes in Deming defeat

An almost even match-up didn't turn out as well as the Warrior boys basketball team had hoped Saturday as the Deming Wildcats surged ahead in last half to pick up their first district win, 48-56.

Coach Norman Wright said the Warriors were more closely matched with the Wildcats in size than the previous five teams they have played. The Wildcats, though, had a good average height around six feet and had a few years experience on the young Warriors.

The squad started out well and took an early lead before the Wildcats called a time-out to settle down and get back to their game plan. The Warriors slipped a little by the

end of the quarter to 12-13.

The team kept right in step with the Wildcats in the second quarter and was only behind by one point, 29-30 by the halftime buzzer. The Warriors had their ups and downs in the third quarter but were only behind by 39-42 going into the final period.

Wright said the fourth quarter is where the young team lost its composure. They made some mistakes they hadn't made all season, he said. They received two lane violations on free throws which could have been two points. Two technicals were also called on the Warriors in the second half.

"That really turned the

momentum against us and that was part of the reason we didn't win," he said.

Freshman Cory Hood, who has done an outstanding job this season as a guard, was also unable to play because of a leg injury that put him out of practice all week.

"Despite that we had the chance to win, but we didn't do what we needed to," Wright said.

As a team the Warriors made five of 15 three-point shots, four of which came from sophomore Raul Davis. The team didn't do as well on the two-pointers and made just 10 of 24. On free throws the team shot 13 of 21. The Warriors did fairly well on turnovers and had just

21, but Deming only had 10.

"This was a team we could have beaten had we played well. They were 2-12 overall and 0-2 in district competition," Wright said.

Sophomore Daniel Espinosa had a solid game in just his third start of the season. He picked up two out of two free throws and pulled in five rebounds. He also had one steal, two assists and no turnovers.

Davis was the leading scorer with 16 points, including the four three-pointers. Wright said Davis didn't go inside as much as they would have liked him to but more from the outside. He also picked up seven rebounds.

Junior Casey Kearns scored 14

points, most of which came in the first half. He was six of eight on free throw shots. Junior Jeff Chapman was the top rebounder with nine and sophomore Harvey Shim lead in assists with four.

Freshman Rex Gomanche also had a solid game as he took over the ball-handling chores for Hood. He had just three turnovers and hit three out of four from the field.

Wright said the Warriors didn't rebound as well as they should have against a team of about the same size.

The Warrior varsity team is now 1-14 overall and 0-3 in districts with two of the toughest teams in

the district on the schedule for Friday and Saturday.

First up will be the Silver City Colts there on Friday. The Colts are ranked fourth in state class AAA with just one loss this season. Wright said the Colts are favored to win the district competition.

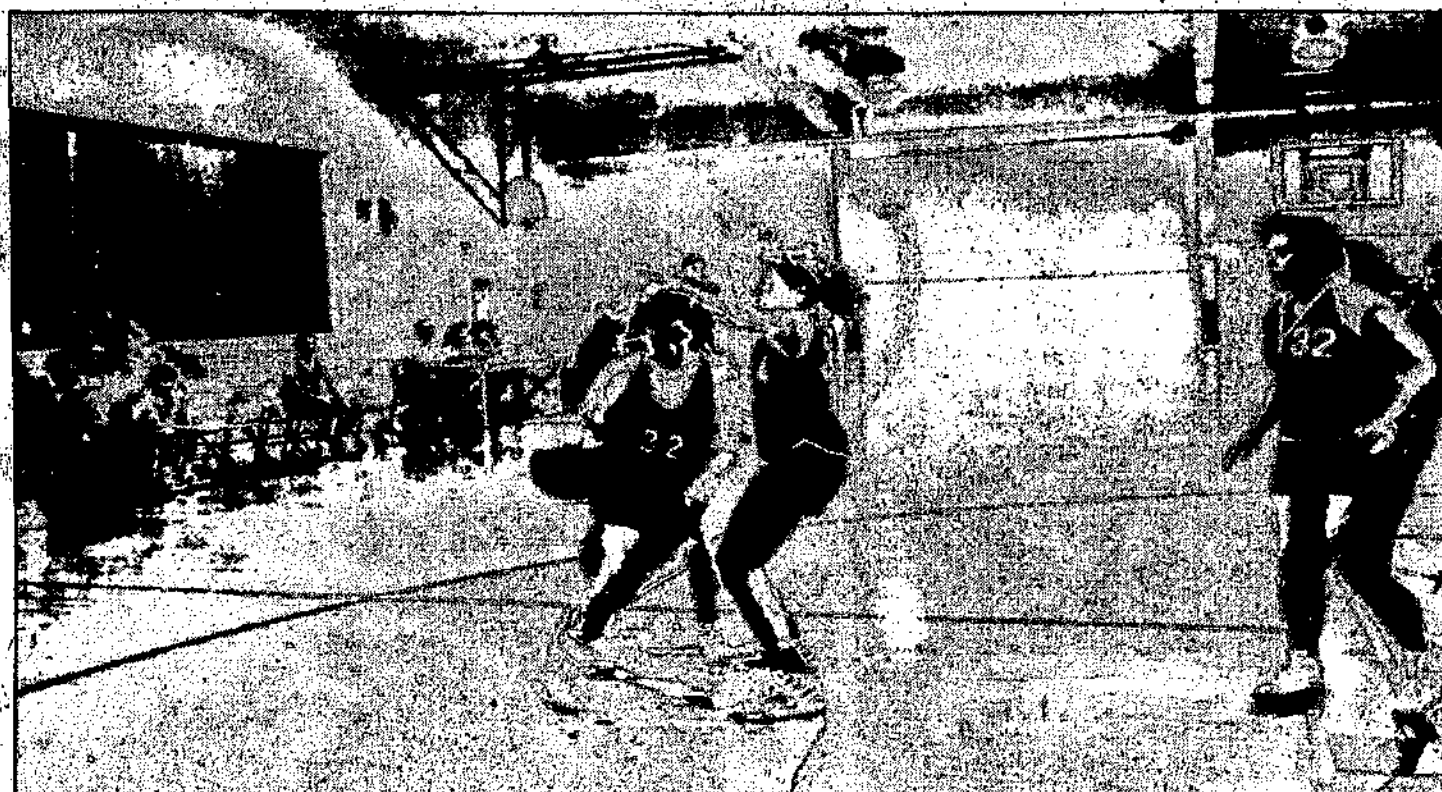
On Saturday the boys will play Cobre there, which won't be an easy task either. Wright said they had a young team last year and now have all their players back plus a 6'7" transfer student. He said they are vastly improved from last year's team.

"We'll just do the best we can," Wright said.

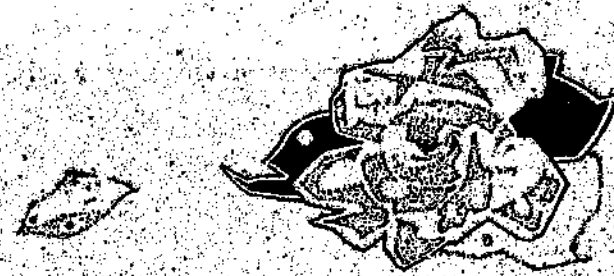

Our choices for the Ruidoso School Board

Voters in the Ruidoso School District are lucky to have only good choices in tomorrow's school board election. The candidates themselves — James Paxton, Kent Beatty and Jim Varnadore — even agreed during a candidate forum that the voters will be well served no matter who wins the election.

The fact that just three candidates are running for two slots could well mean that the community is pleased with the direction being taken by the schools. On the other hand, a small number of candidates could be a reflection of apathy on the part of district residents.

All three candidates indicated during the forum that the Ruidoso schools are good and can only get better, and none of the three seem to have any special agenda other than quality education.

James Paxton is unopposed in his bid for a term on the Ruidoso School Board. Paxton is a businessman with close ties to the schools through his wife, who is a teacher, and his two daughters, who are students. Paxton, although unopposed, gets our endorsement for the school board.

Kent Beatty and Jim Varnadore are running for the other position on the board. Both are good men with an honest desire to serve the community on the school board. Beatty already is contributing to the community and the school district through his work with the golf team.

Varnadore, a local businessman with two students in the school system, gets our endorsement for election to the school board. Varnadore's past experience as a school teacher should serve him well. He also indicated that he has a clear view of the board's role in setting policy, approving the budget and approving the superintendent's contract.

Although I have only been here four months, I have not met or heard of anyone who moved to Capitan because of the quality of the schools. (At last week's meeting) I simply wanted to know why the new school was necessary, but Mr. Lock (who never introduced himself) kept talking about overcrowding and programs.

The very real, underlying problem of "raging hormones" and the need for separation of the children

by age groups was not fully addressed. Following the meeting, it was explained by Mary and Howard Shanks and several teachers. Had it been explained at the beginning of the meeting, there would have been very little discussion I believe, as "those are the facts, ma'am."

I am told by several members of our church that the meeting the next day at the senior center started out with those facts and that, as your article stated, support for the bond issue was strong at the close of the meeting.

I felt stressing the point that the three of us who questioned the need

for increased property taxes, were from California was not necessary and implied negativity on our part.

Personally, I wanted to be educated as to the need to spend more of my hard-earned money.

I also hoped to make it clear that I had seen excellent education provided in sub-standard physical environments due to the excellence and strong motivational forces of the teachers.

I also wanted to explain that, coming from California, I had seen families literally taxed out of their homes; and hoped that there was a true need to increase taxes, rather than just a desire for "more and

fanfiction." It is important to remember that those of us who moved here from other states did so because we value the quality of life here, not because we want to make this area like the one we left — otherwise, we would have stayed put!

We cannot be expected to know all about the history and needs of the area, and deserve honest answers to our questions.

Since Mr. Lock and some of the other school officials do not own property in Capitan and do not pay taxes and will not be paying for the proposed middle school that they are requesting, I can understand why they want all that they do for the school.

If Mr. Lock were faced with this debt, he might be more reasonable about the use of portable classrooms instead of trying to put his

hand in every property owner's pocket.

Over 20 years ago, my son attended classes at a portable classroom in Santa Fe. He went on to become a civil engineer. I was by the same school a few years back and this same portable classroom is still in use. The reason for the continued use of these portable classrooms in Santa Fe is that their school officials do not try to overburden the property owner with unnecessary taxes.

Superintendent Lock states that he wants to separate the sixth through eighth grades from the rest of the school. Portable classrooms

will accomplish this same task as well as a \$1.3 million tax burden.

Superintendent Lock states that he desires quality education by maintaining small classes. Why, then, is Mr. Lock allowing transfers from outside this district? After all, our classrooms in Capitan have not even reached average attendance, according to Mr. Lock.

This community will soon be faced with new EPA regulations concerning our drinking water and solid waste removal. The property owner could face a major increase in utility bills. This alone will cause a major hardship on many of us.

If we have extra money to use,

let us put it to work repairing our roads and improving our community.

These youngsters cannot spend all of their time at school. They also need a comfortable environment elsewhere to live.

We need to wait until the present school bonds are paid and then, maybe we can afford to build more at school; things that are needed, not just wanted.

I repeat my contention that quality education depends on teachers, not buildings.

A dream comes true for young man who wants to visit Billy the Kid's homeland

He's dreamed of riding trails that criss-cross the hills of Lincoln County, retracing the steps of his favorite Old West character, Billy the Kid.

But Jason (his real name is being withheld on a request from his family) is unable to ride a horse. He suffers from a form of muscular dystrophy, yet the 17-year-old approaches life with energy and enthusiasm. He attends regular school, makes good grades and looks forward to accomplishing many new goals in the future.

His interest in The Kid and fascination with the West was brought to the attention of the Make-A-Wish Foundation of Wisconsin.

Diane Bunker-Thomas, who represents a 10-county area in Wisconsin as Wish Granting Director, is trying to ensure that Jason's dreams become reality in as many aspects as possible.

One of her first steps was to contact Joe and Marilyn Bowlin, who head The Billy the Kid Outlaw Gang. Her letter arrived last week.

"What he's trying to do, he wants to experience what it was like," she said. "Billy the Kid is the major hero in his life and he wants

to see and feel what it might have been like."

The Bowlins were touched by the boy's story and are planning an itinerary that would make any western fan envious. His stops will include a stay at the Home on the Range bed and breakfast operated by Janean Grissom on a working ranch outside Fort Sumner; points throughout the Old Fort Sumner area, where Billy roamed, as well as the historic settlement of Lincoln and other sites nearby.

Jason, his two siblings, a friend and his mother and stepfather will be in the area six days and five nights.

"We're happy to have a chance to be part of this experience for Jason and are working to create a week he'll never forget," Mrs. Bowlin said.

"He decided that he would prefer to come by train," Bunker-Thomas said. On the rail, he'll be able to see the prairies where magnificent herds of buffalo roamed a more than a century ago. He will disembark Amtrak at Lamy, where a posse of gang members will greet him, Old West style.

But the Bowlins want to keep the exact details of some of their plans a secret. They want some sur-

prises for Jason.

"I told Jason, these people are going to do fun things, but I'm not going to tell you what," Bunker-Thomas said.

If the weather looks good, Jason will come to New Mexico the last week in March.

Since Jason cannot ride a horse, the foundation will be looking for an all terrain-type vehicle to use.

"His best friend since childhood will be coming with him and we hope to be able to give them some time alone to explore," she said. "We need to make arrangements so at some point, he can get out and feel what it was like."

"I would like to get Jason and maybe the other members of his family entitled to walk around the Old West in Nikes. He has a younger brother, age 5, and sister, age 7."

Bunker-Thomas said her chapter of the Make A Wish group was formed in 1989, and handles about 100 children a year. From her particular area based in Appleton, Wisconsin, about 30 children are granted wishes annually, she said. The case that prompted the creation of the foundation occurred in 1980 in Arizona and involved a seven-year-old boy who suffered

from acute leukemia.

"We don't take money specifically for wishes, but if someone owns a Western shop or horses, or something that would help fulfill his wish, we'd be happy to hear from them," Bunker-Thomas said.

The foundation receives most of its financial support from fund raising activities throughout the year, which is the Milwaukee chapter's primary function, she said.

"We are not trying to save anyone, only to fulfill life-long wishes," she emphasized.

Jason is so excited, "it's almost breath-taking to listen to him," she said. "I don't think he ever believed anything like this could happen to him."

To prepare himself for the trip, Jason enrolled this semester in a course that deals with western desert-dwelling animals.

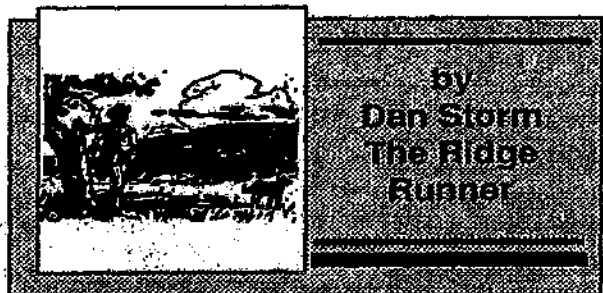
There it stood for a minute or so, like a heavenly silver medallion, and then it faded away, and the sky was all gray again.

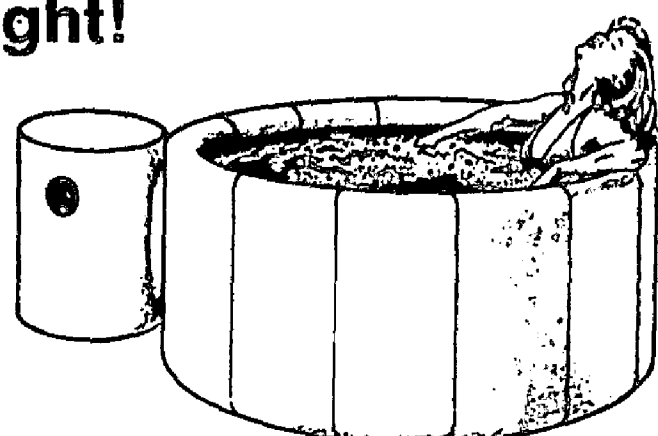

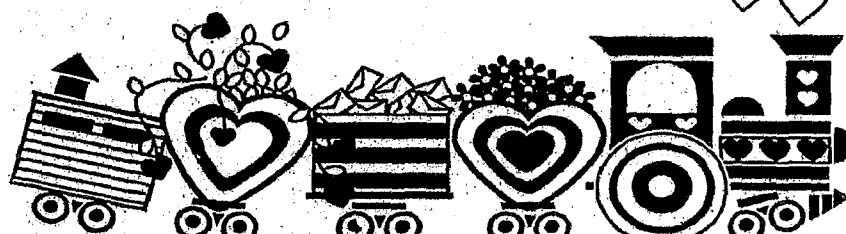
