Council to rule on recreation policy for Grindstone Lake

Grindstone Lake rules, stripping Sudderth Drive, rezoning and professional fee increases are but a few of the important agenda items Tuesday that will confront the Ruidoso Village Council.

The Grindstone Lake Ordinance 93-5 will cover use of boats, fishing, concessionaires and enforcement of the ordinance, rules and regulations.

The village planning commission's denial of a rezone and change in the Master Plan will be acted upon by the council in a public hearing.

Builder Jeffery Smith of Columbia, Missouri, seeks to change four acres of property off U.S. Highway 70 from C-2 commercial to R-3 multi-family. The flat field is located in front of Miner's Mountain Castle.

Smith also wants to amend the village Master Plan Map for that property from community business to high density residential.

Stripping on Sudderth in front of the Cattle Baron Restaurant poses a special problem for the council, the elimination of valuable parking space to several nearby businesses, notably the Old Dowlin Mill.

Although the area marked off by Tim Basler of the New Mexico State Highway and Transportation Department now stops short of the water wheel, it still would seriously impact parking for the historical monument.

Future plans call for all of Sudderth Drive from the "Y" to Carrizo Creek Road be changed to include a center "left turn only" lane. This would eliminate all street side parking in that area.

Highway department officials say the change is necessary to provide safer roadways for the traveling public.

The Old Dowlin Mill is Ruidoso's most significant historical landmark that sometimes is overlooked by local marketing.

Owned for years by Carmon Phillips, the wheel and grounds are kept in such pristine condition that few realize the Old Mill is more than 130 years old. Donna Bruss is the official millkeeper, living in the house next to the structure.

The 20-foot high overshot wheel still is turned by water and visitors can see corn and wheat ground on flint stones inside the building.

Billy the Kid hid in a barrel in

the mill. Pat Garrett and General John Pershing also visited the mill.

As time goes by, historians say the Old Dowlin Mill will gain greater prominence for its historical significance. Some day the state could own the mill. If cutting off customer parking would cause the closing of the mill, and perhaps stop the maintenance of the wheel, this important landmark could be seriously damaged for future generations.

The council will listen to the recommendations of a special committee investigating the fee increase request by Bohannon-Huston, the consulting firm that overspent its MainStreet contract by \$74,268 without written authorization.

The special committee, Tom Battin and Don Miller of MainStreet, Alan Briley and Cleatus Richards of the village staff, reviewed all documents, including correspondence which outlined Bohannon-Huston's position in requesting a fee increase.

The committee will recommend the council defer any action until the current construction project has been completed and accepted, listing two reasons.

Total funds available from all sources are \$1,216,000. The committee did not know what the total costs will be, including base bid amount, contingencies, field change orders and construction management.

Also, the committee wants further review by the New Mexico State Highway and Transportation Department (NMSHTD) for an opinion on justification. Also, the committee wants NMSHTD assurance that funding for any fee change is approved and available.

According to a committee memo to the mayor and council, Brian Burnett, vice president of Bohannon-Huston, agrees with the committee's recommendation. Apparently, company officials are willing to take their chances that the project will have enough money left over to take care of the overrun.

In other agenda items, the council will:

- hear bid award recommendations for the construction contract for the MainStreet project. Any approval by the council is contingent on state highway department and federal highway administrations' approval.
- hear a bid award recom-

mendation from deputy manager Alan Briley on a manhole cover raising project and a sewer line infiltration repair.

- schedule a public hearing for a zone map amendment from C-1 to C-2 for John Brown Tracts on Gavilan Canyon Road.

- consider park dedication of 1.8 acres in the Airport West Subdivision. The village planning department said dedication language was not contained on the original plat, and to correct the omission, George McCarty has executed dedication instrument and is requesting village acceptance.

- hear a Leeds-Hill-Herkenhoff engineering consultant report on the airport project.

According to deputy manager Briley, an item to be discussed will be to provide construction management and inspection of the project.

- hear a request by Leeds-Hill-Herkenhoff that the village authorize additional monies in the amount not to exceed \$5,000 for the purpose of the additional duties anticipated in the work with the village's asphalt plant.

The original \$5,000 committed by the council as in-kind use of the village's asphalt plant, was spent in the grant application.

- consider annual appointments to boards and commissions.

- award a contract for audit services for the 1992-1993 fiscal year.

The evaluation committee of village manager Ron Wicker, finance department director LeaAnn Boswell, Penny Clark and Terri Ward will recommend Ronnie L. Hemphill, P.C.

Consent agenda items to be voted on collectively are:

- extension of land lease to the Lincoln County Humane Society.

- act on a request for approval of the chamber of commerce advertising plan.

- authorize to sell the Hall-Brown, Wingfield Park property.

Ending the regular agenda will be the reports from the village manager that will include:

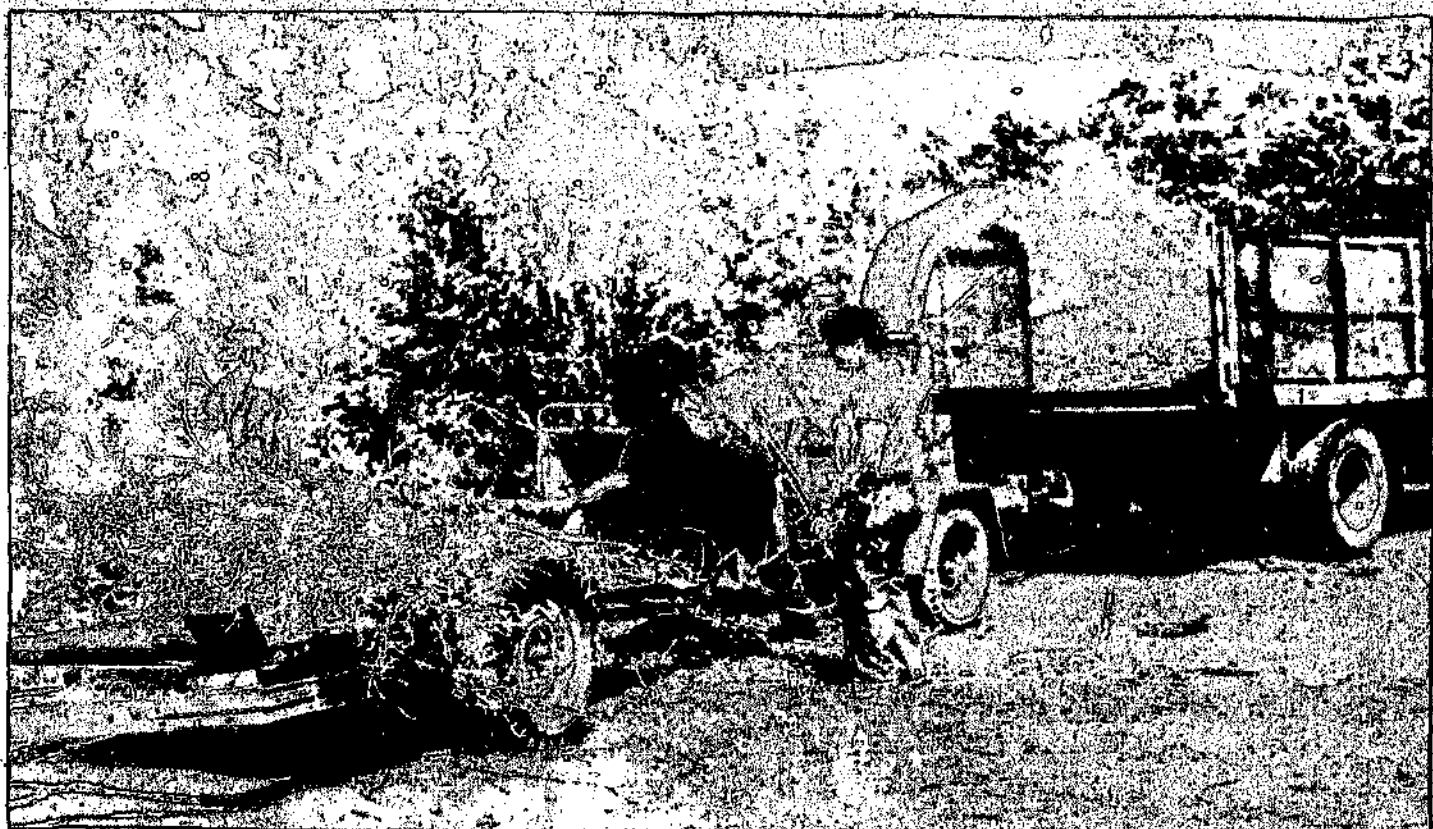
- an update of the nuisance ordinance by Cleatus Richards.

- discussion on the removal of a bridge on Short Street.

- a report on Innsbrook Village water line repairs and paving.

- a discussion of temporary employees.

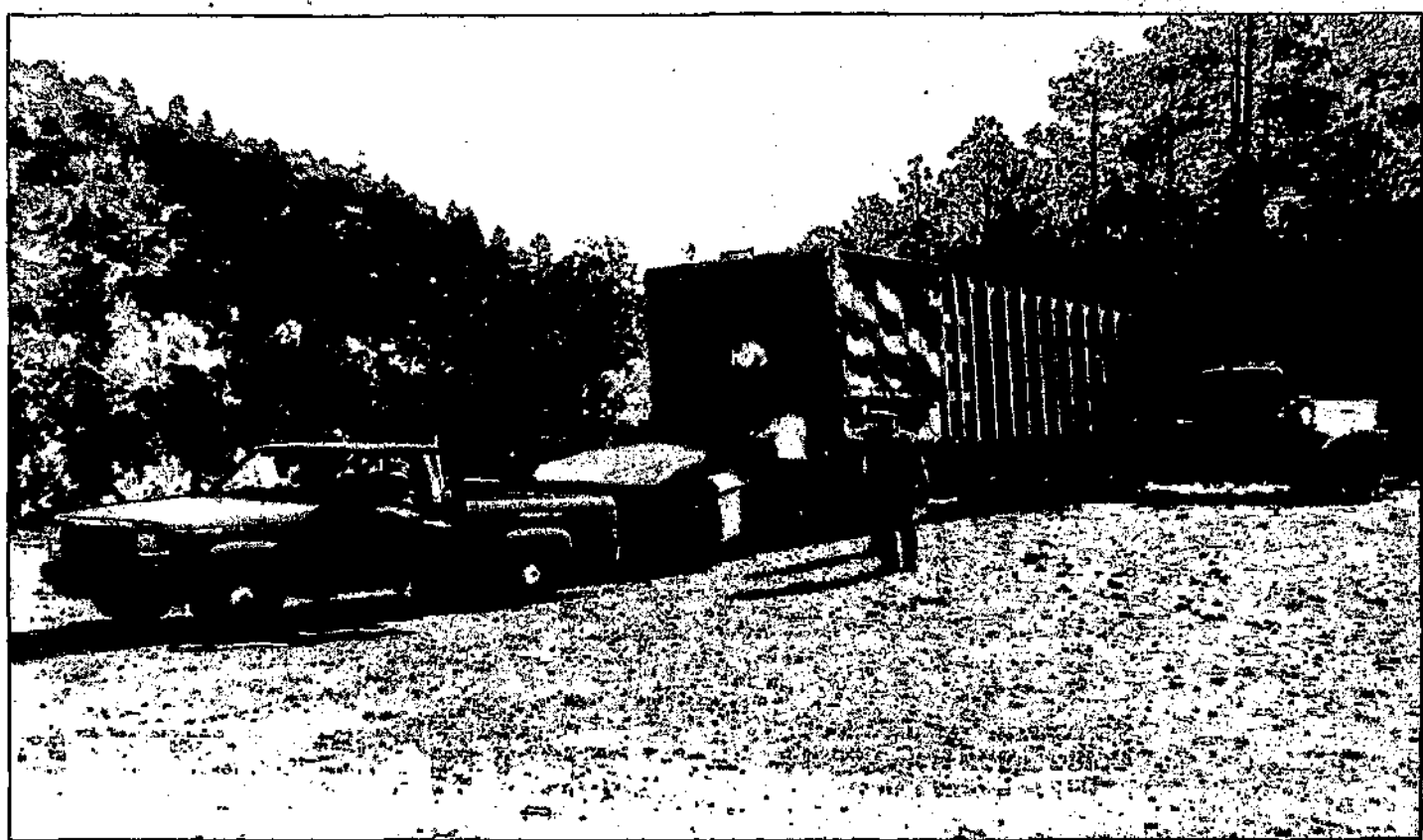
The council has scheduled a closed session regarding threatened or pending litigation.

Montes said the consensus was that McSwane needed no new employees, some other commissioners appeared to waver.

The secretarial position was one of three new employees requested by the sheriff in his 1993-94 budget proposal to the County Commission Tuesday.

McSwane has been trying unsuccessfully for about a year to reclaim the secretarial position that was removed when the commission relieved him of the responsibility for the jail.

Commissioners at the time reasoned that without the jail, McSwane would not have as much administrative paperwork. The money that would have paid the secretary was funneled into the jail operation to boost the salary of the head jailer and help pay for an assistant.

During a budget session Tuesday, commissioners noted that the three new positions request by McSwane, a deputy, a secretary and a dispatcher, would cost \$70,000.

County manager Andy Wynham, who now handles the jail, said when McSwane takes over the emergency 911 system, he will need a coordinator.

"I don't think we can put more responsibility on Jay without more help," Wynham said. "The system could be installed within the next two months and he needs a better dispatch area."

"It's hard for him to operate in this configuration (the layout of the jail, dispatch and sheriff's department)."

Apparently unmoved by Wynham's statement, Commissioner Sterling Spencer said, "I think he doesn't need more."

"I'll go for one," said Commissioner Wilton Howell.

"More personnel means more recurring expenses," Montes said.

"My preference is no new em-

ployees. I haven't seen a major law enforcement problem. We're not Los Angeles."

Wynham said that although McSwane has been asking for the reinstatement of the secretary position for the past year, he couldn't say which of the three positions requested was the most important to him when pressed.

The sheriff's department currently operates with 13 deputies, but one is assigned to drug education in schools, another handles animal and litter control and a third is assigned to forest-related patrol. Salaries for deputies run from a low of \$18,341 (\$23,467 with benefits) to a high of \$24,098 (\$31,000 with benefits). McSwane earns \$31,610 (\$41,880 with benefits).

It will be up to the commission to decide next week whether to add raises into the budget equation.

Commissioners restored McSwane's line item for telephone service to the \$32,000 budgeted this year. He had dropped it to \$25,000.

"I think he cut it too low," Howell said of McSwane's request.

Overall, McSwane is asking for a \$41,737 increase for a total of \$841,770 for operation and salaries. Under the county's capital outlay category, he also has requested two four-wheel drive vehicles, one patrol car and one van. The commission will deal with all capital outlay items during their budget session at 8 a.m. Tuesday in the courthouse at Carrizozo.

The budgets of other elected officials and of the Lincoln County Medical Center sailed through with little comment from commissioners last week.

Hospital administrator Valerie Miller told commissioners, "This is a difficult budget year with health reform."

That reform means a two-year cap on medical expenses such as hospitals, medical supplies and medicines.

"It's better than in 1974 when there was a cap on hospital rates,

but not on the providers," she said.

The center has not raised rates since 1990 and has been able to compensate because of an increase in patient volume. But before the government imposed cap goes into place, rates will be hiked, she said.

New Mexico has a good track record when it comes to holding down medical costs, she said. Albuquerque has one of the lowest in-patient admission rates, 67 per 1,000, and there is a \$2,000 difference between the average hospital bill in Denver and Albuquerque.

"We are even less than Albuquerque," Miller said. One of the reasons is that the center offers less "high tech" care.

Commissioners agreed that the county will continue to pass through the special property tax levy for the support of the Carrizozo Health Clinic and the medical center in Ruidoso. The former will receive \$187,807 and the latter, \$390,000.

The clinic faces a potential \$250,000 in remodeling to comply with requirements of the Americans With Disabilities Act, but Miller said a consultant is optimistic that exemptions can be obtained for some areas.

For the center, Miller said she would like to replace obsolete diagnostic equipment in the 1993-94 budget year, including buying one new anesthesia machine this year and next year. She said the hospital has \$1,249,384 in carryover balance.

Wynham reminded commissioners that the money already is available for the purchases Miller recommended.

"If upgrading the equipment improved efficiency and you see the need and the money is there, spend it," said Commissioner Sterling Spencer.

Miller said the hospital has increased its market share in the North Otero, Chavez and Lincoln County area from 57 percent to 68 percent.

Talk of lawsuits fuels fear as council plans for lake's future

Would Grindstone Lake be better off as a park? Maybe so.

Fear over possible lawsuits resulting from future accidents at Grindstone Lake has fueled several meetings between recreationalists and the Ruidoso Village Council.

In a recent suit involving the City of Albuquerque, a section of a state statute surfaced that, although it had no bearing on the case, attracted the attention of a local attorney who saw a positive application for Grindstone Lake.

Ruidoso lawyer Don Dutton, in reading a weekly judicial newsletter called the State Bar Bulletin, noted that water storage areas, such as Grindstone Lake, if declared public parks, would appear to enjoy immunity from certain law suit risks that could

reduce the cost of insurance.

Dutton said Statute 41-4-6 regarding liability contains a sentence that pertains to water storage areas such as Grindstone Lake.

According to the statute: "The immunity granted pursuant to Subsection A of Section 41-4-4 NMSA 1978 does not apply to liability for damages resulting from bodily injury, wrongful death or property damage caused by the negligence of public employees while acting within the scope of their duties in the operation or maintenance of any building, public park, machinery, equipment or furnishings. Nothing in this section shall be construed as granting waiver of immunity for any damages arising out of the operation or maintenance of works used for diversion or storage of water."

In the opinion of Judge Harris Hartz, the natural interpretation of the second sentence of 41-4-6 preserves immunity with respect to damages arising out of the operation and maintenance of works used for diversion or storage of water in public parks and on the grounds of public buildings.

The judge cites examples of immunity for liability arising from ponds and ditches in public parks, however he cautions that the immunity preserved by that second sentence of 41-4-6 does not extend to liability arising from the maintenance of diversion channels on public property in general.

Apparently, village officials are unaware of the legal immunity provision since no discussion has occurred during public meetings on the issue.

Shelter resident Bear is a big bundle of love

A big floppy-eared bundle of energy and affection, Bear has captured the hearts of everyone who works at the Lincoln County Humane Society animal shelter.

"He's terrific," said shelter manager Bob Huckins. "The biggest battle I have is not taking him home myself."

Bear was brought to the shelter two weeks ago by a person who said he was being mistreated at a rela-

tive's home, Huckins said. The person hoped Bear would find a new owner who would be kind and care for him.

"He can be somewhat timid with new people, but not for very long as soon as he sees they aren't going to hurt him," Huckins said. "He just needs some love and reassurance."

The nine-month-old dog appears to be a shepherd mix, possibly with Great Pyrenees blood. His guzzled expressions and soft, semi-erect ears create a sometimes comical,

but always endearing appearance in contrast to his strong, muscular body.

Bear would need space to exercise and has a heavy enough coat to be outside during winter days.

However, the society advocates bringing pets indoors at night because they are part of the family and should not be isolated. Being pack animals, dogs expect to be allowed to join owners (pack leaders) when they come home from work. If they are isolated in a back yard or on a chain, experts say that equates to punishment.

"He's great with kids," Huckins said, although he's probably too big to be around toddlers.

He probably needs to be housebroken if he is going to be inside for long periods. Overnight would be no problem.

In a kennel next to Bear, a sensational-looking Loki also needs a new home.

The 1 1/2 year-old male was brought to the shelter by his owners, who said they were not able to care for the dog.

While he has brindle markings, his conformation and hair-length indicates shepherd and possibly some Borzoi or Italian hunting hound blood.

He has a very sweet, even-tempered disposition and is housebroken," Huckins said. "He can be a bit aggressive with other male dogs, but is fine with females. He's good with all people, adults and kids."

Both males must be neutered as required by both state law and local ordinance.

Persons who want to enhance a dog's or cat's chances for adoption may become sponsors by paying the cost of sterilization for specific animals or by donating to the sponsorship fund. The society also allows new owners to pay off the cost of adoption (rabies shot, city license and sterilization) over a period of 60 days.

In the cattery next to the main shelter, several felines are available for adoption that already have been sterilized, which will reduce the cost of adoption.

Huckins also needs homes for three puppies who showed up at the shelter late last week. Two possibly were lost. A shepherd mix, about 2 1/2 months old named Kiko is sharing a kennel in quarantine with a white fluffy husky mix, who has become a surrogate sibling for a black and white Labrador mix. The lab appears to have been taken away from its mother before of barely weaned, Huckins said.

It was brought in by a woman who said it had been given to her grandson while he was visiting a friend in Ruidoso.

"She said he wasn't taking care of it properly," Huckins said. "Unfortunately, that sends the wrong message to kids. It's not up to the animals to teach children responsibility. It's up to the parents. They should participate with the child to ensure proper care for the animal. By bringing it to the shelter, the message is, if the animal or responsibility is inconvenient, just toss it away, abandon it. Pets are not pieces of furniture."

The society is interested in recruiting new members, who will be more actively involved in projects such as expansion and education, as well as shelter support and the thrift shop. However, board officials also welcome a show of support through donations and membership, even if a person cannot be active.

Plenty of ways also are open for volunteers to help, from walking the dogs and playing with the cats, to helping with daily maintenance or special projects. Donations of

food and cat litter also benefit the animals.

The public is invited to the monthly society meeting at noon, the third Wednesday of each month at the Texas Club.

Don't forget, it's time for pet owners in Ruidoso to renew their city licenses.

Local supermarket chain is included in planned merger

For people who shop at the local Furr's stores it will be business as usual if the company is purchased by another food chain later this year.

Megafoods Stores, Inc., and Furr's Supermarket's, Inc., have signed a letter of intent for Megafoods to purchase Furr's for about \$74 million in cash plus a contingent payment based upon Furr's future earnings.

If all conditions are met, the merger is expected to close in early June, according to a news release from Megafoods.

Stuart Rosenthal, president and chief operating officer for Furr's, said there are steps the possible purchase must go through but several of those procedures are already under way.

They must go through a due diligence process during which Furr's opens its financial books and makes all information available for Megafoods. Megafoods then also has the assurance that Furr's stockholders won't be looking for other possible purchasers at this time, Rosenthal said.

Rosenthal said it is also his understanding that Megafoods is currently working to obtain financing. Megafoods has retained Paine Webber Incorporated as its financial ad-

viser.

He said they must also work with the Federal Trade Commission, but they expect no problems because the two companies have contiguous trade areas, not overlapping areas.

"There is always the opportunity that a deal like this will crater (fail), but I am confident that it will be consummated. It will likely be consummated in early June," Rosenthal said.

Furr's operates a total of 79 stores doing the business under the names Furr's, Bag'n Save and Solo in West Texas and New Mexico. That includes two stores in Ruidoso.

Rosenthal said the sign on the store will say Furr's and the same associates will be serving the people. He said he also doesn't anticipate any changes in store management either.

"There shouldn't be any other consequence the shoppers will notice," he said.

The opportunity the possible merger gives Furr's is capital to remodel stores. Rosenthal said they would be able to accelerate that program, but they have not begun any plans or set priorities for doing it yet.

Dean Miller, chief executive of-

ficer of Megafoods, said the purchase of Furr's is intended to allow the company to increase its critical mass and growth rate. The acquisition should result in a financially strong company which, on a combined basis, would have had revenues exceeding \$1.1 billion during 1992, he said.

Fleming Companies, Inc., provides distribution services for Megafoods in Arizona, Nevada and California, and for Furr's in New Mexico and Texas. Megafoods expects to continue these arrangements based on its existing supply agreements, Miller said.

Megafoods currently operates 23 super warehouse stores with 20 additional stores to be opened by December 1994, in their current marketing areas of Arizona, Nevada and southern California. With the Furr's purchase, Megafoods would immediately have nine additional warehouse stores and 70 conventional stores.

It is anticipated that 10 additional warehouse stores will be built in the New Mexico and West Texas markets during the following two years. Together with the stores purchased from Furr's, by the end of 1994, Megafoods would be operating 70 warehouse and 69 conventional stores, according to Miller.

RD village board will meet today

Members of Ruidoso Downs board of trustees want more than just a spring clean-up for their community, but their crack down on nuisances is being protested.

The Downs board will meet at 7 p.m. today, Monday, at the village fire station with the clean-up on the agenda.

Several of those who have been cited for such nuisances as abandoned or dismantled vehicles and outdoor automotive storage will be before the board to discuss why they don't agree with the citations.

The village ordinance states that a property owner may not leave a wrecked or discarded vehicle on the property for longer than 90 days except if the vehicle is in an enclosed building or behind a fence or wall so that neighbors and passers-by can not see it.

The penalty for having general nuisances can be a fine up to \$800, imprisonment for up to 90 days or both.

The trustees have discussed area nuisances at meetings in the past and have said that they received many calls from residents who want the village cleaned up.

Also on the agenda for the meeting will be the approval to publish amendments to the water and sewer ordinances. The water rates will be increased in accordance with a state legislative bill passed this session. The sewer rates will be increased by 50 cents to help pay for maintenance and repairs of the waste treatment plant.

The group is also expected to approve the publishing of an ordinance to add the penalty clause to all ordinances because currently some ordinances do not have penalties.

Warrior golfers claim first Gooch Invitational title

Playing perhaps the best team golf in school history, the Ruidoso Warriors took a big step Thursday in establishing themselves as a bona fide power in AAA golf, when the team took a two stroke victory in the Leroy Gooch Invitational at Alto Lakes Golf and Country Club.

The Gooch is the state's largest and most competitive high school golf tournament.

Competing against 13 other AAA teams, the Warriors went into the final round tied with district rival Socorro at 319, they held a four shot lead over last year's state champs Lovington and were five strokes ahead of pre-tournament favorite, NMMI.

The Warriors got the lead after the round at the Links off of Jeff Chapman (79), Jimmy Varnadore and Matt Cantu (82) and Byron Soules (92). That score qualified the Warriors for the state tournament,

thus relieving a lot of pressure on the team.

During the second day, Wall stumbled a bit on the front nine at Alto recording a double bogie on the fifth hole after three puttings, a triple bogie on the sixth after losing a ball, and a bogie on the seventh with a buried lie in a bunker. But the junior stormed back with five consecutive pars to get back in the game, finally recording a solid 80 after that shaky start.

Chapman, who did not finish strongly at the Links, made up for lost time with an excellent 75 at Alto, the second low round of the day from the 120 plus players.

Individually, Chapman finished fifth among the AAA players and Wall was sixth.

Cantu and Varnadore, both juniors, played very solidly during both rounds, nailing home the victory with good back-nine hole

scores at Alto, easily the toughest nine hole layout in Ruidoso.

Freshman Byron Soules, playing in his first varsity tournament also

turned in a good performance with a 93 at Alto.

The Warriors will meet a similar field Monday and Tuesday when they travel to Las Cruces for the Dona Ana Classic. Monday's play will be conducted at Picacho Hills while Tuesday's action switches to New Mexico State's golf courses.

Both courses are considered in the state's top 10, and will be another tough test for the Warriors, who will see all of their district opponents at the tournament.

The season ends on May 5 with the district championship at Deming.

Team appointed to study recovery needs of Mexican Spotted Owl

A Mexican Spotted Owl Recovery Team has been appointed to determine recovery needs for the species.

Dr. John Rogers, southwest regional director of the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, appointed the 10 members following the final decision last month to list the owl as a

threatened species under the Endangered Species Act.

The species was listed by the service because of the bird's loss of habitat primarily caused by logging and fires. About 2,160 Mexican spotted owls are known to exist in the mountains of New Mexico, Arizona, southern Utah, Colorado and

west Texas.

The team's role will be to develop a recovery plan for the owl and to provide recommendations to the service on specific Mexican spotted owl issues, including habitat needs and suitability, agency actions, distribution and populations.

The service allows a period of up

to 2 1/2 years for teams to prepare final recovery plans for a listed species, but officials intend for this plan to be completed as quickly as possible.

After peer and public review of the draft recovery plan, the team will submit it to the Southwest Regional Director.

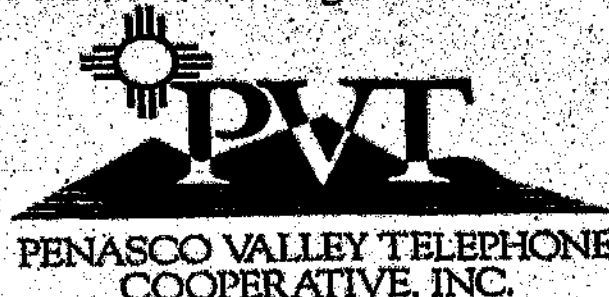

Business booms at the hospital

Funding from the county mill levy for the upcoming year at Lincoln County Medical Center seems to be in line but the group will have to wait for final approval from the county commission and the state.

Hospital administrator Valerie Miller told LCMC board of trustees members Thursday she went before the commission with a request for \$1.2 million of the mill levy for the current fiscal year. A significant amount of that is for items and expenses carried over from last year when funds were specifically designated to those items.

From the request \$187,000 will go to the operating fund for the Carrizozo Health Centers and \$260,000, which had been designated last year, would go to the possible remodeling of the center to comply with the Americans with Disabilities Act.

As has been the same for the past three years, Miller said \$390,000 would go to the operating expenses at LCMC.

The commission's final decision on the request will be put into a preliminary budget to be submitted to the State Department of Finance and Administration in May. After the DFA's review it will be returned for a final public hearing.

Also a new procedure for this coming fiscal year will be that the county will forward all mill levy money to LCMC as it is received, not as a specific amount each month, Miller said.

Funds for LCMC and the Carrizozo Health Centers will still be kept separate as required by the wording of the mill levy ballot, she said.

Although Miller had expected things to slow down in March, it

was a very busy month at the hospital and centers. The net revenue was up \$178,350 from last month and up \$98,619 from March 1992. With the mill levy amount subtracted from other revenues the loss for the month would have been \$6,000.

Miller was also pleased with the performance of the hospital as it ended its fiscal year ahead of the budget in revenues. The net revenue was \$1,074,506 ahead of this time last year and \$700,810 over budget. The excess revenue over expenses is \$108,598 ahead of last year and \$30,179 ahead of the budget.

Without the mill levy support the deficit of revenue over expenses, year to date, is \$99,248 compared to \$194,998 in 1992.

"I think the financial turn around we have had in the last three years has put us in as good a position as any hospital to deal with any federal reforms that may come down the pike," Miller said.

Even though there was a loss without the mill levy, that loss has improved considerably from last year, Miller said she feels good about the volume they have been handling, but the concern will be whether it can retain that volume. To keep the volume they will need to explore other services, especially in outpatient care which has seen the most growth, she said.

The hospital alone, without the Carrizozo Health Centers, would have been about break even, despite \$1.1-million in free care, Miller said. The hospital has also not seen an overall rate increase since April 1990.

In their separate finances the Carrizozo Health Centers are also \$3,617 ahead of budget year to date and have seen a gain of \$2,591 for

the month of March. It has had a year to date gain of \$19,124 with a mill levy funding of \$190,497.

The Ruidoso Emergency Medical Service, which had been budgeted at a loss of \$52,000, had a gain of \$3,551 for the month and a year-to-date gain of \$21,538.

The hospital has also received an abundance of applications for scholarships for seniors in the county planning to go into a medical field. Eleven applicants have submitted their information and a committee will select the winner later this month.

Miller reported the Honda clinic is back in business with Dr. Brenda Owens having the clinic one day a month. The clinic was on hold for several months when Dr. Michael Garbino, who had been going to Honda each week, decided to continue his education. Dr. Owens was then recruited to the community and took over the Honda visits.

Miller, board president W.C. "Dub" Williams and chief of staff Dr. Gary Jackson will be attending a regional meeting of Presbyterian Healthcare Services later in May. Miller said the topic of the meeting will be teamwork and will address difficulties between the medical staff, the administrator and board of trustees.

Board member Dr. Roger Beechie said the medical staff and administration relations are real smooth here and there is always open communication.

Williams said although they do a good job now, they can do a better one and all hospitals will have to improve to be successful at providing care for people.

The hospital's strategic planning committee has met once and will be meeting again soon. Miller said in the first meeting they analyzed

what they have and haven't achieved from the last plan.

At the next meeting they plan to review the results of a market survey done by the same company that did one in November 1990. Miller said they have made significant strides in being recognized as a quality institution, but they are still seen as being limited in what services they offer.

People seem to think, because of its size it doesn't have as much to offer, so now Miller said they will need to determine what the perceived and real needs are in services.

The survey was given to those who do not use LCMC but the impression was that LCMC is as good or better than others they use, she said.

One service the hospital provides is health screenings, one of which they just finished as a huge success. Miller said more than 100 men attended the prostate screening earlier this month and 20 of those had abnormal results.

Dr. Jackson said they recommend that men begin getting the screening at the age of 40.

Miller said more health fairs will be scheduled for October for LCMC and the Carrizozo centers.

Nellie Ruth Jones, auxiliary president, recommended a new slate of officers for the upcoming year and received approval from the board. The president will be Charlene Jones, while Dorothy King will be vice president. Al Guzeika will serve as treasurer and Greta Cabot will continue as secretary.

She said the auxiliary is planning to purchase a wall clock for each room. The group worked 2,300 hours last month and were honored at an appreciation luncheon by the hospital staff.

Downs lodgers tax board recommends funding to promote area tourist events

Four events received recommendations for funding from the Ruidoso Downs Lodgers Tax Advisory Board but not all received unanimous approval.

All four requests were put on hold, waiting for the board to barely make its quorum as chairperson Mike Warren and board member Camille Mansell were running 20 minutes late. Board member Judy Miller was present, while Tony Wilcoxson and Shelly Barnes were absent.

Art Fest U.S.A.

Passing by a narrow margin of two to one was Don Breedlove's request for \$1,500 for Art Fest U.S.A.

Art Fest is located at the old Fantasy Mountain across from the race track and will have a variety of artists with all handmade items when it opens for the summer. Indian dancers, cloggers and other activities will entertain visitors and special events are planned throughout the summer season.

Chairperson Warren said in concept it is a good business, but that is the problem. It is a business and he would rather see the individual events that will be happening there come before the board to ask for funding.

"I can see others on the schedule of events (happening at Art Fest U.S.A.) coming to ask us for money, too. How will we know what the money we give you is going to?" Warren asked.

Breedlove pointed out that most of the events going on at Art Fest are being done by him and his brother as the owners, so his request at the meeting was for advertising that would include these events. A few other groups having events there are just being offered a place to have the activity and Art Fest receives no money from it.

Events scheduled for July 4 to Labor Day

As required by the lodgers tax ordinance, Art Fest would also have to show receipts and tear sheets or proof of advertising to receive the funds.

Breedlove said they think they will be able to bring a lot of people

into the area for the Art Fest U.S.A. itself, which will be open Thursday through Sunday from July 4 to Labor Day. Most of the people will be coming from Arizona, Texas and other areas of New Mexico, and the festival is almost booked full of artists for July 4 and Labor Day.

Food booths needed

He said Art Fest is still looking for food concessions at this time and that could be open to service organizations or groups. Art Fest U.S.A. wants to return as much to the community as possible and is offering the site for civic organizations to use, Breedlove said.

"All the big things, like the track and the museum, are here in Ruidoso Downs and we are looking forward to being one of those big attractions," he said.

The Breedloves currently publish art catalogs in 28 states and also have art shows. They were looking for a permanent home for one when they found Fantasy Mountain was for lease.

Mansell, who made the motion to approve the \$1,500, said it will draw people into the community, but it is probably not something they will want to fund each year. Miller agreed.

In explaining his 'no' vote, Warren said, "I still feel these groups having activities should come before us on an individual basis."

Blue Grass Festival

One group having an event at the Art Fest location did receive a recommendation for \$1,500 from the board. The Spring Time in the Rockies Blue Grass Festival will be June 11-13, before Art Fest opens.

Event organizer Jerry Perry said this is the third year for the event and they have found a great place to have it this year. The first year they had it at Bonito Lake and were a little hit in the red on it, he said. The second year at Ruidoso Civic Events Center was break even and Perry said he expects it to be at about that again this year.

Perry said they plan to advertise locally and in the surrounding market of El Paso and Lubbock,

Texas. The main advertising they do will be mailouts to a list of people compiled from those who attended and registered their names for drawings in the years before.

He has also placed an advertisement in Blue Grass Unlimited, a national magazine.

The Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce will also be helping to advertise the event.

"There is a lot of money going out, but we are going to bring a lot of people in, too," Perry said.

He requested \$5,000 but said he would be pleased with any funding he could get. Board members decided to recommend \$1,500 since it is the first year for the event in Ruidoso Downs.

Perry also plans to ask the Ruidoso Lodgers Tax Advisory Board for \$1,500.

All-American Festival

The All-American Festival, an event coming back for its second year of funding, received \$1,000 as organizer Lara Johnson requested. The festival is in its fourth year and has events in Ruidoso Downs and Ruidoso from August 1 through Labor Day.

Johnson said the advertising will be done on radio and in newspapers and she sends out press releases highlighting events and the entire festival. The chamber of commerce will also be advertising the festival in July as a way of attracting visitors.

The festival newsletter will be sent to about 10,000 people in New Mexico and West Texas, she said. She said they are also sent out to responses to mail-in type advertisements.

The event also receives funding from Ruidoso Downs Marketing and Johnson will be requesting funds from the Ruidoso board and the state for matching funds.

Golden Aspen Rally

The Golden Aspen Rally also received a recommendation for \$1,000 to help advertise that event this year.

Rally promoter Rgn Andrews, who is also a Ruidoso village councilor, said this event is in its 24th year and will have an advertising

budget of about \$14,375. They have already printed brochures and posters, which include the Ruidoso Downs logo along with Ruidoso's and the county's so people are encouraged to experience the whole area, he said.

Rally offers activities during area off-season

Three individual Ruidoso Downs campgrounds and three lodgers are also supporting the brochures, Andrews said. One rally event will be in Ruidoso Downs at the Prime Time lounge, but other Downs businesses will participate in the poker runs and other races.

"People know the event provides income when there is not much else going on. It is too easy to throw an event on a busy weekend. We want to make it a success so the area is successful too," he said.

He said last year's event was written up in two publications. "Rider" magazine, which has a monthly circulation of 150,000, had two pages on the event, and the Texas motorcycle association's newsletter was full of information on the event.


Board wants locals too

The Golden Aspen Rally has also been designated as the western nationals site for the American Motorcycle Association. Andrews said they expect good attendance at the meet and they will be going into new geographic areas with the national designation.

Warren asked if they are finding a way to attract area people to the event. Andrews said they do advertise in local publications and they also sell a day pass at the trade show for local people who wouldn't want to spend the whole week.

The chamber of commerce will also host an open house for locals on the Wednesday before the trade show begins on Thursday. Andrews said this offers local people a chance to come down and find out about the people who come to the event.

The four recommendations will now need approval from the Downs board of trustees at their meeting Monday.

America's Education Revolution: A Report from the Front

Education reform is a hot political topic, but how much influence can politics wield in improving the nation's schools?

America's Education Revolution: A Report from the Front takes a first-time look at education reform efforts in the country's public schools and the impact the political system can have on educational change.

Reported by former New Jersey Governor Thomas H. Kean, the documentary examines various approaches to reform by profiling four different programs. Coinciding with the 10th anniversary of "A Nation at Risk" — a report that raised serious questions about American public education — the documentary examines the education reform efforts launched by the report and looks ahead to the future challenges.

Executive producer Timothy E. Smith said that he and his researchers considered a wide range of programs from across the country, seeking reform

efforts where political change played an important role. They concentrate on programs in Gainesville, Florida; New York City; and Rochester, New York; and statewide reform efforts in Kentucky.

Case study segments feature four distinct profiles. In East Harlem, the "school choice" approach emphasizes the importance of enabling parents to choose from a number of alternative schools with unique curricula. In Alachua County, Florida, the "early childhood" and "hub of services" approaches encourage family involvement — in partnership with the school — to help the child develop academically. In Kentucky, the guiding metaphor is the student as a worker rather than the teacher as a deliverer of instructional services.
