Tickets are available at the Ruidoso Chamber of Commerce, customer services booths at Ruidoso Downs Race Track and all area banks.

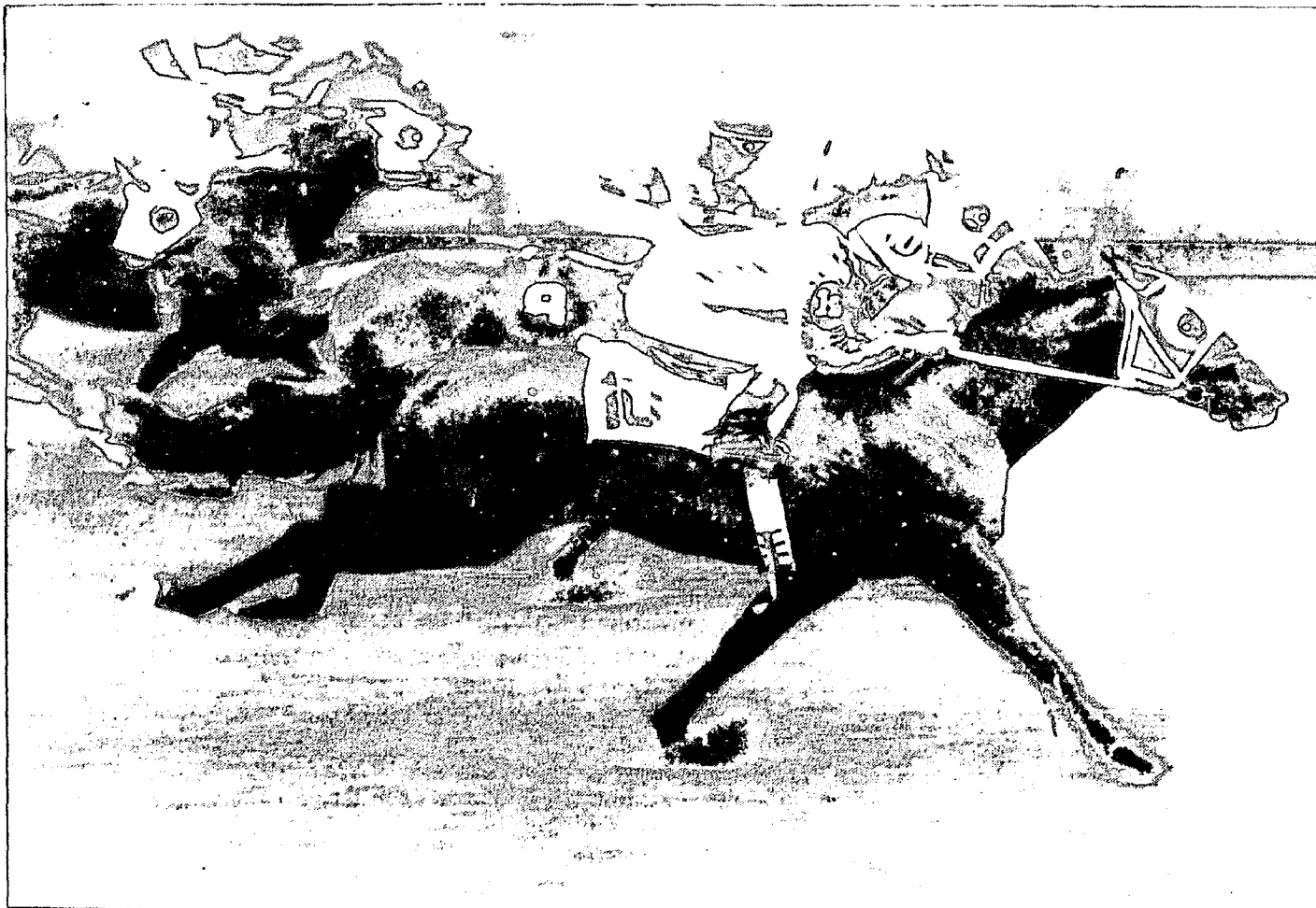
Area artist supports Futures for Children

'93 racing season takes off

Grade I futurity winners Treacherously and MD Hammertime did not disappoint the opening day crowd at Ruidoso Downs as they posted the two fastest qualifying times for the inaugural running of the Grade I \$400,000-estimated Ruidoso Quarter Horse Futurity.

Sun Country Futurity winner

Treacherously lived up to his reputation as the 2 to 5 favorite in the seventh trial with an easy 1 1/4-length victory under jockey Nancy Summers. The time for the 350 yards was :17.54 seconds.

"The eight horse (Neon Runbows) broke a step in front of us, but by the second jump we had him caught," said Summers who became

the only female jockey to win a Grade I quarter horse race in the Sun Country.

"I hit him once right-handed early on, then kept the pressure on him all the way," said Summers.

Lawsuit settled on valley water

A New Mexico appeals court decision Wednesday on Mescalero Apache water rights should provide a good night's sleep for hundreds of individuals in the Hondo Valley.

On an appeal filed by the Mescalero, the court had been reviewing the trial court's decision to award the tribe 2,322.4 acre feet of water with priorities of 1873-75, 1883-84. (An acre foot of water is the amount of water that would

cover an acre to a depth of one foot, equivalent to about 325,829 gallons.)

The tribe's and United States' attorneys, acting as trustee for the Mescalero, contended that the trial court erred in its determination of the quantification and priority of the water right.

During the trial, they asked for 17,750.4 acre feet of water with a priority of "time immemorial," according to the court.

Charge dismissed in fatal shooting

A Ruidoso magistrate judge ruled Wednesday that a retired policeman shot his father in the head by accident during a heated argument last January 10, 1993.

A Lincoln County assistant district attorney may seek a grand jury investigation on the shooting.

After listening to five hours of court case, Magistrate Judge Jim Wheeler dismissed the state's charges of voluntary manslaughter brought against Walter Tony Suttle, 44, of Ruidoso.

According to various police reports, Suttle was called to his father's mobile home where his parents had been arguing. His mother remained in a bedroom

while he and his father, Walter A. Suttle, argued in the front room. They were the only three people in the house.

Wheeler said he made his ruling after hearing the state's case.

"I never did hear the defense," Wheeler said. "The state convinced me that there was an accidental shooting."

Testimony at the hearing indicated that the father was holding a gun when his son first entered the mobile home. Suttle then wrestled the gun from his father who had been drinking.

Suttle admitted he then cocked the gun which reduced the pounds of pressure to fire from 11 to 15.

Fans, handle show dramatic increases

Attendance and handle figures for the second day of the 1993 Ruidoso Downs meet showed major increases with total attendance up nearly 16 percent and handle up over 26 percent compared to 1992 figures.

Roger Knight Jr.'s amazing filly Deceptively continued her storybook career with a half-length triumph in her three-year-old debut and posted the fastest qualifying time for the Grade I \$122,333 Kansas Derby.

The daughter of Runaway Winner broke sharply from the #10 post position and had a half-length lead midway through the 400-yard dash. Nearing the wire, Deceptively held off a late charge from longshot Desert Orchid, but was never asked by jockey Jerry Yoakum. The Bruce Bell-trained filly stopped the timer in :19.76 seconds.

"I had a pretty good hold of her all the way down," said Yoakum who has ridden the filly in all five of her career wins. "It's good when you don't have to push her in the trials and so you can save her for the rest of the season," said Yoakum.

Deceptively won both the Kansas and Rainbow Futurities last year, but was sidelined for the remainder of her freshman season with a leg injury.

"This race will help her get climatized to the altitude," said the 21-year-old jockey Yoakum. "She's gonna be better this year. She's not on the downside of her form at all,"

said Yoakum.

The second fastest qualifier for the May 31 Derby was Sue May's Cream To The Top, a 17 to 1 long shot who won the first trial in a time of 19.78. The Easily Smashed filly led from start to finish to beat Specially Fast by a 3/4 length. Cream To The Top is trained by Fred Danley and ridden by Joe Martinez.

The big story in the first trial division was the disappointing seventh place finish of 1992 All American Futurity winner Dash Thru Traffic. The Jack Brooks charge broke awkwardly from the #8 post, then was bumped shortly afterwards by Beduinos Royal. The First Down Dash colt had not started since the All American and never seemed to hit full stride.

Dash Thru Traffic's time of :20.26 was however, fast enough for him to qualify for the \$21,927 Derby Consolation to be run May 30.

The following is the list of qualifiers for the Grade I Kansas Derby in order of qualifying time: Deceptively (:19.765), Cream To The Top (:19.785), Desert Orchid (:19.840), Specially Fast (:19.875), Super Duper Couper (:19.915), First Down And Ten (:19.920), All American Cash (:19.965), Time Bender (:20.025), Choculo (:20.030), Perfect Sign (:20.035).

Saturday's feature event was the \$29,950 Road Runner Handicap for 3-year-olds New Mexico-breds.

went off. Then they would have never charged him. He was honest," Wheeler said.

Police reports did not indicate if there was a past history of domestic problems from the elderly Suttle's household, but the victim's wife praised Wheeler's decision.

Wheeler, based on testimony, said he had the option of binding Suttle over to the district court on the charges, or discharging Suttle and releasing him so that the charges or no longer pending.

Suttle was not arrested the night his father died when the shooting was under investigation. Upon his arrest, January 11, Suttle was booked and released pending the preliminary hearing.

According to Hubert Quintana, executive director of the Water Defense Association, which mounted a citizens defense against the tribe's claims.

The "time immemorial" claim would have assured the tribe the earliest priority on the river, as well as a right to the entire flow of the Rio Hondo stream system, Quintana said.

The appeals court provided the Mescalero with 13 percent of the tribe's claim and upheld the trial court's legal conclusions.

"The court found that the tribe and the United States failed to prove that the proposed agricultural projects were irrigable at reasonable costs," Quintana said. "The Mescalero had proposed to grow strawberries, carrots, asparagus, cane fruit, Christmas trees, barley, potatoes and various other crops on the proposed Pajarito and Rinconada projects."

"With respect to the tribe's and United States' claim that the trial court ignored the testimony of many of their experts, the appellate court stated that 'the trial court could reject the tribe's expert testimony...when it appears to border on the fantastic.'"

However, the appeals court did approve an earlier federal reserve water rights priority date for the Mescalero.

He has spent no time in jail relative to the shooting.

Assistant district attorney Viola Rhodes said her options following Wheeler's discharge of Suttle are to present Wheeler with a motion for reconsideration or to take the matter before a grand jury.

"Those are the only two (options) that I would be considering at this time," Rhodes said.

The state had originally charged voluntary manslaughter, but later upped the charges to second degree murder.

According to state statutes, manslaughter is the unlawful killing of a human being without malice. Voluntary manslaughter consists of a manslaughter committed upon a sudden quarrel or in the heat of passion. Voluntary manslaughter is a third degree felony.

The trial court selected 1873, the earliest date for any of the five executive orders that created the reservation. But in a split decision, the appeals court reversed the trial court and concluded the priority date should be 1852, the date of a peace treaty between various bands of Apaches and the United States, Quintana said.

"The appeals court agreed with the trial court's interpretation of the historical documents, but arrived at a different legal conclusion 'by imposing its 20th century notions of fairness and justice to its determination of the issue,' he said.

However, that interpretation was not unanimous.

"A vigorous dissent maintained that the trial court's determination on priority should have been upheld based on the undisputed historical facts," Quintana said.

Despite the disagreement on priority date, the association, which represents non-Indian farmers and ranchers in the Hondo Valley, was pleased with the overall decision, Quintana said.

The association will meet at 7 p.m. Wednesday at the Hurd La Rinconada Gallery in San Patricio to hear attorney Richard Sims explain the decision, what it will mean to the members and the next steps.

Picking a name for Sweetie didn't take long for workers at the Lincoln County Humane Society animal shelter.

Her tender nature and sweet disposition made it natural to select Sweetie for her shelter name.

The medium size female, who appears to be a Croatian sheepdog/border collie mix, sports white toes, brown paws and brown and white facial and chest markings on her basically black coat.

She was brought to the shelter as a stray, but was wearing a collar. Her hair is medium length.

"She loves to snuggle and cuddle," said a shelter volunteer. "She'd make a good family pet."

"And she loves to go on her walks," added shelter manager Bob Huckins.

Sweetie keeps her cage clean over night and may be

housebroken, he said. She will require spaying.

By state law, all animals adopted from the shelter must be sterilized. By Ruidoso ordinance, all pets over the age of six months must be sterilized unless the owner has a breeder's permit and pays for a special license to maintain a fertile animal.

A handsome male Labrador mix, possibly with Rhodesian ridgeback blood, also is waiting for someone who will give him a new home.

Short-haired, buff color and about two years old, Poindexter came to the shelter two weeks ago as a stray.

"He's very affectionate and would need space to exercise," Huckins said. "Given a little attention, he calms right down. But he is able to jump pretty high, so he would need some training or a high fence."

"He's great with kids. He's not a

loud dog or a fighter."

Looking for homes

The shelter also is home to some good looking ranch dogs, a red heeler mix called Red Rider and a male called Zowie, who appears to be a pure bred Australian cattle dog with the classic markings and a good disposition.

Trekker, the female side of a Bernese Mountain dog duo brought into the shelter as strays, still hasn't found a new owner.

She's spayed, which is the major cost associated with adoption. Shelter workers have given her the nickname of Patience, because she is so laid back and resigned to waiting for someone to choose her. She is smaller than the usual mountain dog.

A few puppies are available, one is a hound mix. The other two are Petunia, a black Labrador and

Aster, a soft, ivory white retriever, both of whom were featured last week.

Stripe, the young brindle Labrador/Staffordshire female, terrier mix also featured, would make a great companion dog for children and is extremely loving.

Several kittens also are up for adoption in the cattery next to the main building, as well as some sterilized adult cats ranging from black to tabby and white.

Other past pets still alive in their cages and running out of time are:

—Pinto, a spayed blue-eye, brown-eye Labrador mix with a white coat and brown spots, a great jogging partner with perfect conformation.

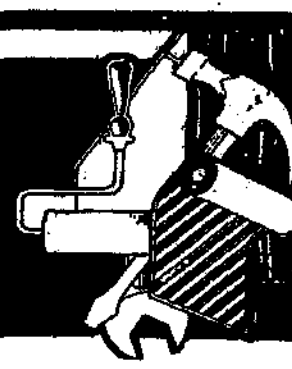

P&Z surveys seven requests

The Ruidoso Planning and Zoning Commission has scheduled discussions on seven requests at its 2 p.m. regular meeting Monday at village hall.

Claude Miller is asking for a replat (redesign) of the south one-half lot of 637 and Lots 638 through 650 of Skyland addition.

Miller's 14 lots contain about 20,000 square feet and are zoned C-2, community business.

Miller wants to allow car sales development on the lot without extending water and sewer service to the sales office.

Planning director Cleatus Richards said that services were available in an existing building and would serve all uses on the property. He recommended plat approval.

Miller also is seeking a conditional use permit and site development of the property to allow the used car sales lot.

Richards recommended that any decision from the commission should be with the conditions that the 25-foot driveway from Outlook Drive be the only access allowed from Said Street; that Miller provide evidence to show increased drainage from the development will be retained on site; and that Miller provide information on parking lot and driveway surfacing and treatment, guaranteeing the surface to be dust free and capable of handling drainage.

Douglas Brown is asking for a side yard variance for Lot 8, Block 1, of White Mountain Estates (108 Marble Court), to allow construction of a 225 feet by 26-foot garage addition.

Richards said there is no site related hardship limiting placement and recommended denial because conditions for granting a variance have not been met.

Windsor Lacawell of Lot 11, Block 2, Pinecliff Subdivision will ask the commission to vacate a right of way and replat his property.

Richards recommended approval, with Lacawell paying 50 cents per square foot for the area.

Frank Potter is requesting a commercial site development to construct a 24-foot by 42-foot structure on Sudderth.

Richards said Potter has not provided information to support the need for a variance, which is granted when the "variance is not contrary to public interest, will avoid unnecessary hardship and serve substantial justice while meeting the spirit of the zoning ordinance."

Commission chairman Robert Donaldson has told Richards at a previous commission meeting that, in his opinion, the building would be in the best interest of the MainStreet development and that the village council had given the commission the right to waive parking requirements when it is, in the opinion of the commission, in the best interest of the community.

Richards has recommended denial of the site without correcting the parking deficiency.

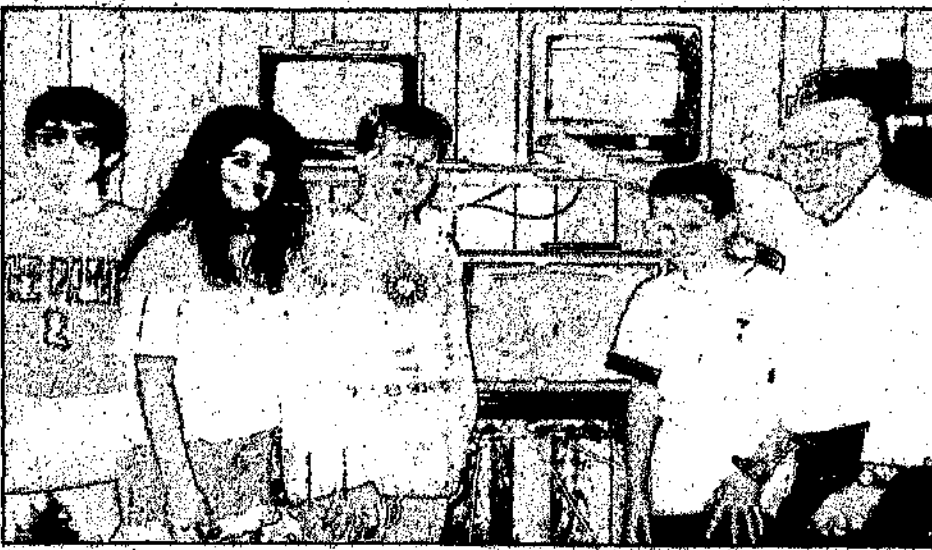
John Houghton was red tagged by building inspector Larry Hill for constructing a foot bridge across the Ruidoso River. Richards said the improvement was not included in the site development plan approved by the commission.

Richards asked Houghton to submit an application for amended site development that shows evidence that the construction meets all requirements of the flood hazard regulations; a certified agreement with the adjoining property owner; plans and specifications showing bridge location, construction detail and elevations.

Failure to comply will result in issuance of criminal complaint with the municipal court to effect removal of the bridge, according to Richards.

Village plans fun-packed summer

Jim Colbert's prediction comes true early when RHS Warriors win state golf title

Four years ago in the Ruidoso Downs Jockey Club, touring professional Jim Colbert unveiled the plans for a new golf course that he hoped would be built on the old airport site.

That sold me on the idea. As the course progressed during construction, I would take the kids over — not to look at the holes in particular, but the driving range and putting green was the main point of interest. I knew if the Warriors had access to such a fantastic practice facility, that quite possibly that Mr. Colbert wasn't completely off his rocker.

Three years ago The Links opened and three years ago the Warriors started getting better. Last year, the team finished fifth in the state tournament and of course they took the title this year.

The reason for the resurgence of the Warriors in golf is simple. They can practice. They can hit many, many kinds of shots at the

Links, so they just don't get may surprises upon playing different courses.

It's been a pleasure working with the golf professionals at all of the courses. Their interest in our program is truly remarkable. I hope that the members, players and staff at Alto, Cree Meadows, the Inn of the Mountain Gods and, of course, The Links will hold their heads high and know that their course was part of the Warriors success this year, and part of a lot of future success.

And, most of all, I hope that every time that you play and see that junior golfer go by with his or baggy shorts and T-shirt and maybe that Royal Blue "Warrior Bag," that you will just smile and think "There goes a future state champion."

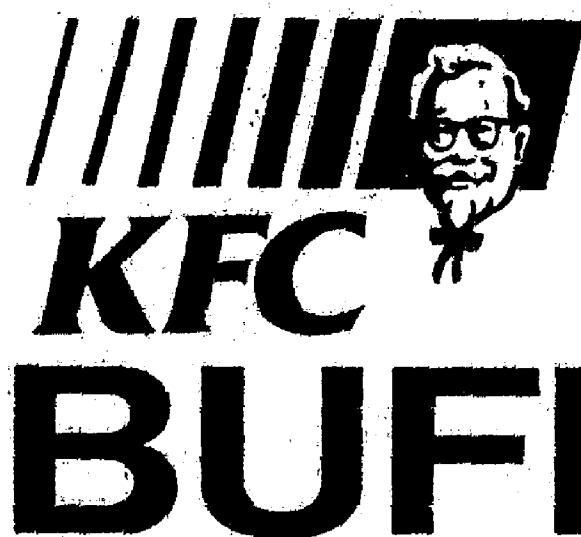

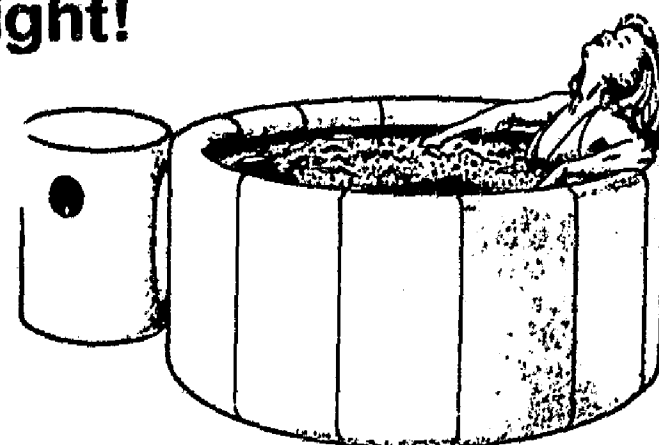
