probation officer may have to find new quarters.
The Lincoln County Commission, which is legally required to
provide space for the probation serprovide space for the probation ser-
vace, voted Tuesday to offer to pay about half of the rent being charged ny Ruidoso Downs for the service's
use of an office at the town hall
Wednesday, county manager Andy Wynham received a response from Mayor Joe Hayhurst. "He rejected the offer and said August 27," Wynham told The Ruidoso Ne
