Schools report test results as "average"

Ruidoso students bounce around average on most tests used to measure performance in New Mexico.

Paul Wirth, director of support services for the Ruidoso school district, Tuesday reviewed with the school board the results to be contained in a public accountability report to be published in **The Ruidoso News** today (Monday).

"It's real important to realize this is a small portion of student assessment," Wirth said. "It's one snapshot, one period of time."

One place students seem to shine is on the high school competency examination. Statistics contained in the accountability report detail the percentage of tenth graders who pass the test the first time compared to the rest of the state.

For the past three years, Ruidoso has kept ahead of the state by as much as seven percentage points.

In 1990-91, 74.9 percent of students statewide passed all subtests in the examination, while 81.4 percent passed in Ruidoso. The next year, the gap narrowed with 76 percent and 77.1 percent. But in 1992-93, Ruidoso tenth graders not only recaptured their lead, but also gained by more than 10 points from their scores two years earlier, with 91.4 percent passing compared to 84.1 percent statewide.

The subjects cover reading, language arts, math, science, social studies and composition.

Ruidoso students taking the ACT college entrance examination have never scored on a par with national averages. Only in 1989-90, out of three years of testing, did they score higher than state averages. But they weren't far behind in any of those years.

In 1989-90, the mean composite score for district students taking the ACT was 20.4 compared to the state at 20.1 and the nation at 20.6.

In 1990-91, the district score was 19.9 compared to the state at 20.1 and the nation at 20.6; and in 1991-92, the district score was 19.8 compared to 20.0 for the state and 20.6 for the nation's students.

"It's very comparable," Wirth said.

One place where the district places near the top is salaries for its teachers.

Ruidoso ranks fifth out of 88 school districts in the state with an average teacher salary in 1992-93 of \$31,088 compared to \$26,464 for the state and \$35,000 for the nation.

For the past three years, the district's average teaching salary has consistently stayed about \$3,000 to \$4,000 below national figures and \$4,000 to \$5,000 above state figures.

Enrollment in the district continues to increase from 1,694 students in 1983-84 to more than 2,200 this year.

Wirth said the survey sent to parents about the quality of education in Ruidoso came back with generally good reviews.

The survey included 10 questions devised by the State Department.

Court clears Hoggard

Ruidoso Downs police chief Will Hoggard was acquitted Friday of purposely influencing one of his patrol officers to ignore a subpoena.

The misdemeanor charge was the only indictment returned by a Lincoln County grand jury last summer, after reviewing evidence connected to public corruption allegations involving Hoggard and State Representative H. John Underwood (D-Ruidoso).

"I feel absolutely, positively great," Hoggard told **The Ruidoso News** Friday. "It's a nice Christmas present early. I had a great lawyer and I appreciate that."

"I'm glad the judge was experienced and able to sort things out. I also am thankful to the mayor and board of trustees for standing behind me one hundred percent."

Twelfth District Judge Richard A. Parsons said he was not convinced by the prosecution's case that Hoggard intended to break the law.

He delivered his ruling in the non-jury trial before the defense presented its case and on a motion by defense attorney Gary Mitchell.

Calling the charges against Hoggard "selective prosecution," Mitchell argued that Hoggard was the first person in the state to be tried for failing to appear at a driving license revocation hearing. State statistics show that officers don't appear in about 20 percent of the administrative hearings.

Mitchell contended assistant attorney general Dan Pearlman failed to prove that Hoggard had acted with criminal intent last February.

Although Hoggard didn't take the stand, he has denied that he encouraged patrolman Raymond Montes not to attend an administrative hearing on the license revocation of one of Underwood's clients. The client previously had pled guilty to drunken driving, but still faced the possible loss of his driving license.

Montes testified that during an informal discussion, Hoggard told him it would be a good idea if he didn't appear at the hearing, because Underwood was a legislator

State revamps leases to pay millions more

Mastering the system has netted a Roswell contractor more than \$700,000 in annual state leases, but some say convoluted state rules and an inside track helped.

Ruidoso office landlords appear to have been the main victims of a state system insensitive to the plight of small communities.

Remarkably, by the end of the lease, the state will have paid out enough in rent to own the building it leases.

Two members of Governor Bruce King's cabinet agree that wasteful policy should be changed.

But they also told the losing bidder on a controversial lease in Ruidoso that it was written by the books and she could do nothing about it.

Human Services Secretary Dick Heim told Hazel Haynsworth, low bidder on the lease that was

awarded to contractor Don Elwell Jr., that as a result of what happened in Ruidoso, significant procedural changes have occurred.

However, many unanswered questions remain after Haynsworth's brief one-hour meeting with top state officials during the recent governor's tourism conference.

—why was a builder given an extra year to complete a contract that called for a 90-day move in?

—how did an unwritten agency policy supersede a state statute requiring disclosure?

—why is there such a difference in weighting of factors on leases for similar facilities?

—why were the key determining factors left up to a local staff, who had a vested interest?

—why were costs of leases allowed to more than double over the

projected budget?

—why has one contractor been awarded nine leases when state statutes direct officials to "spread the wealth?"

—why couldn't state officials give Haynsworth an audience before the lease was finalized?

—why, in a market glutted with empty buildings, did the state opt to have a contractor construct a new one?

—why would the state pass over a bid more than \$100,000 lower?

State's response

Heim and General Service Department Secretary Laura Threet met with Haynsworth, resident Chay Rennick and a reporter for **The Ruidoso News** in the village clerk's office during the governor's conference.

Heim, responding for the state, called the lease "a legal procure-

ment based on the rules that were in existence at that time."

One of those rules denied competing bidders the right to view bid information even after contracts were awarded.

Human Services (HSD) officials said they were following instructions from the General Services Department (GSD) that called for confidentiality. They cited state statute 88-501.

When a review of that law showed there was no mention of confidentiality, HSD staffers changed their tune and said it was an unwritten policy by the GSD.

Pressed for an explanation, Heim blamed the unwritten policy on his Republican predecessors.

"These were rules that were set out by the General Services Department in the previous administration," he contended.

Summer residents protest paying for service they don't use

Members of the Eagle Creek Summer Home Association, who lease property in the Lincoln National Forest, want a break on monthly charges for garbage collection.

They're sending an attorney, Richard F. Rowley of Clovis, to talk to the Lincoln County Solid Waste Authority board during its meeting at 10 a.m. today (Monday).

The board meets in the recycling center on Second Street in Ruidoso Downs.

Association members contend since they do not own the land and

only stay six months or less a year, they should not pay the full price of collection. The authority board previously has turned down their request, saying they cannot make an exception and the group does not qualify under the variance policy.

As part of the monthly manager's report to be presented to the board, Joe Lewandowski listed \$103,386 in outstanding accounts. He noted 476 special pickups and clean-ups for the past month, worth about \$6,760, with an accumulated expense since mid-June of \$34,760.

Ron Hemphill has started the

authority's 1992-93 audit, Lewandowski said in his report.

A summary of bids received by the city of Alamogordo for heavy equipment to operate the regional landfill south of its borders will be reviewed during the meeting.

Alamogordo is responsible for handling the start-up arrangements and daily operation of the landfill that is shared by the Otero and Lincoln solid waste authorities.

Lewandowski is recommending acceptance of the specified bids on all five pieces of equipment. Each has an outright price, minus a buy-

back price for the bottom line expense.

The total package comes to about \$893,442 outright and \$450,000 bottom line. The equipment package includes a track dozer, elevating scraper, articulated compactor, front end loader and a used water wagon.

Rust Tractor was the low bidder of the three received, Lewandowski noted.

"All of the equipment will come from Rust Tractor, making us an important customer to them," he wrote in the summary. "This should

give us excellent service when required."

The final budget and dumping fee at the landfill are to be presented to the board by Alamogordo city manager Bob Stockwell at its meeting in December.

In his budget summary to be reviewed by the board, Lewandowski noted that the authority is \$76,744 over budget on an actual cash basis of accounting and without dipping into \$77,000 of accumulated environmental gross receipts tax. Future tax payments are committed to repayment of

bonds for construction of the landfill.

"This is because of the busy season," he wrote. "As we go into the quiet season, the expenses will decrease, but revenues will remain the same. Actually, the revenues will probably increase with the route audits."

The route audits assure that businesses and individuals pay for the level of service they are receiving.

William Smith also is on the agenda to talk about county service billing.

ment of Education. Out of 2,049 surveys sent home, 286 were returned, more than half from the elementary level schools.

The question with the most negative answers, although still overwhelmingly positive in total (188 positive to 64 negative) concerned whether the schools put adequate resources into extracurricular activities.

Results from the Iowa Test of Basic Skills, introduced for the first time last year, continue to be lower than preferred nationwide, but that is expected until some regrouping occurs to match its goals, Wirth said. Statistically, the fiftieth percentile represents where half of the children in the nation should fall, but that hasn't happened, he said.

"Our district scored comparably in all three areas, some a little be-

low, others a little above and some a lot above," he told school board members.

The third grade composite scores fell in the forty-fourth percentile compared to the thirty-ninth percentile for the state.

Fifth graders at Ruidoso placed in the forty-first percentile compared to the state at the forty-second percentile.

Eighth graders scored in the thirty-eighth percentile while the state fell in the thirty-ninth percentile.

In the New Mexico Portfolio Writing Assessment, scores for fourth and sixth graders generally were higher than for comparable students statewide, Wirth said.

He pointed out that because of the mobility of the enrollment at Ruidoso, trying to track grades by scores is deceptive.

"We have a 44 percent mobility

rate, one of the highest in the state," Wirth said. "Only 25 percent of the students in fifth grade were the same ones tested in third grade. Seventy-five percent weren't there in third grade."

He said the district needs to devise a way to test those students who have come through the system and see how they are doing to really pinpoint problems.

"It may not be the school system that's the issue on test results," he said. "It would be an interesting item to explore this school year."

A brief budget breakdown included in the report shows direct instruction at \$3.9-million and accompanying benefits at \$1.2-million as the single largest expenditure in the \$8.1-million budget. Instructional support accounted for about \$900,000 and administration about \$203,000.

and had introduced a bill to provide money for construction of a new city hall.

According to a report in The Albuquerque Journal, Attorney General Tom Udall denied any political motivation for the prosecution. He said he did not regret pursuing the well-publicized case, because the evidence justified the action.

Governor appoints two locals to state boards

Two Ruidoso men have been appointed by Governor Bruce King to state boards.

Ronnie Paulger has been named to a five-year term on the Real Estate Appraisers Board, and Paul Crown was appointed to the Rural Development Response Council.

Paulger, a registered Democrat, is president of the First National Bank of Ruidoso.

He and his family have lived in Ruidoso since 1986.

"It's kind of a neat deal," said Paulger, who is pleased to be able to serve on a "working board."

Paulger, who was named to a five-year term, has already attended his first meeting in Albuquerque.

The Real Estate Appraisers Board advises and makes recommendations to the Real Estate Commission on matters affecting real estate appraisal, including rules, regulations, licensing and

certification.

Paul Crown, a Republican, is the manager of Lincoln Cablevision.

Crown has lived in the Ruidoso area for more than 20 years.

The Rural Development Response Council works to develop a partnership among federal, state, local and tribal governments and private and non-profit organizations interested in improving conditions in rural areas and communities in the state.

"But because of the experience here, we have made several changes."

"We are going to elevate the decision on leases to the Secretary's office."

On the Haynsworth lease, a five-member committee of low-level employees was assigned to review and recommend. Two didn't participate and two worked in the Lincoln County office, according to Haynsworth.

"Fred Muniz who is Deputy Secretary for Finance is going to have the responsibility so that every lease will be reviewed by him and approved by him," Heim said.

Previously, Threet had responsibility for final approval. Heim did not indicate what type of improvement Muniz would represent.

Those changes are now in effect, he said.

Heim said in the future, greater emphasis will be placed on cost.

Based on the old rules, that have been changed, only 15 points out of a total of 100 points were given to cost," he said.

However, an Elwell lease in Truth of Consequences written during the same period, also for Human Services, called for 25 points to be given to cost.

"Cost estimates should have a greater weight up to 50 points, but no less than 30 points," Heim said.

"That's a wide range," Haynsworth said. "How do you come between the two averages? What would qualify?"

Heim said it would be at the discretion of the GSD.

"They have the rule making authority for that, no lower than 30, no more than 50," he said.

Regarding the 20 point swing, Heim said when regulations are written, "you do need a little latitude."

In Haynsworth's case, changing the factor to 30 points would not have changed the result. Subjective factors like quality of atmosphere and spacial relationships still ruled.

Distance from an existing Human Services building counted against Haynsworth in Ruidoso, but wasn't a consideration in an Elwell-Human Services lease in Truth or Consequences when his site was further away.

"We also agree that leasing should be for a five-year period with one five-year renewal option," Heim said.

Elwell's Ruidoso lease was for eight years with an option for two

more years.

"So we're not going to go with these long 10-year leases anymore," Heim said. "It's going to be five year leases."

The secretary was asked if five and five didn't amount to 10 years.

"No, because you do have to exercise the option," Heim said. "If it's an option, it would be up to the department's discretion."

Critics say it is unrealistic to believe the department would submit a new request for lease proposals (RFP) at the end of the first five-year lease on a new building.

Rennick, a local consumer advocate, told the cabinet secretary that Haynsworth's offer specified six years, which followed the RFP. Elwell proposed eight years, which was beyond what the RFP specified, yet he was awarded the contract.

Rennick asked why Haynsworth was not given the opportunity to revise her offer or protest that Elwell's offer was in excess of what was specified.

Heim never answered that question.

According to Heim, all future office space lease decisions will include a community impact review. He also said he wanted to avoid any negative economic impacts by adding new office space to a local community already glutted with vacant space.

"In other words, it's going to be mandatory that we take a look at what exists in the community," Heim said.

"The future process will include a legal sign-off from one of our attorneys," he said.

Regarding lobbying by HSD employees in the Haynsworth case, Heim said staff will be directed to remain impartial in deliberations.

"This is something, too, which flies directly with what I understand happened down here," he said. "Staff attending public meetings will answer questions with factual information, and will not support or oppose any proposed position."

Threet said there are two goals for the procurement code process, "and that's to ensure equity and to attempt to find the best deal for the state."

However some of the department's "unwritten policies" seem to contradict requirements of state statutes and interfere with "finding the best deal for the state."

While Threet said the state wants to encourage competition for leases, the department's approach to the Ruidoso lease would seem to

accomplish the opposite.

By specifying that the new quarters would have to be ready within 90 days, most contractors would be eliminated from bidding.

However, once in negotiations with only Elwell and Haynsworth, state officials changed their requirements. They allowed Elwell an extra year to construct a building.

Threet said the state realizes the process can be extensive and costly.

"You have to put in time and energy, which you did," she told Haynsworth. "It's a cost of doing business, but state leases are excellent leases."

In fact, the lease business may be so lucrative, it could be artificially driving the state's economy skyward.

Of the four Elwell leases The News checked, all buildings were newly constructed or under construction.

In a list of 373 leases by the state, 260 have been signed since 1990. If many of those leases involve new construction, state government may be responsible for the state's sizzling boom. But in a state with such a small population base, prosperity also could be short lived when state building slows down or stops.

Haynsworth told Threet she felt ignored during the whole process.

However, one time she did receive some advice from state officials. Elwell included a 3.5 percent escalation clause in his lease that would drive the rent up over a period of eight years. Haynsworth's lease contained no escalation clause, but state officials advised her to add a three percent escalation charge, she said.

That change served to raise Haynsworth's bid closer to Elwell's cost. Even with the escalation charge, Haynsworth's total lease cost over a period of six years was \$100,000 less than Elwell's lease price.

The Human Services lease at the Stroud Building last year was about \$13,000 and was proposed to be increased this year with the new quarters to \$37,000 annually. Under Elwell's agreement, the cost leaped to an average of about \$70,000 over the next eight years.

Threet explained the past evaluation system.

"The evaluation of the proposal is always a department evaluation," she said. "General Services has not been involved in that, it was decentralized a number of years ago."

"What we have discovered, and different departments do it in dif-

ferent ways, but generally, employees will prefer a new building, because they can say, can you add this, can you move that. So it's just the way they are able to deal with it. That is something that we're concerned about, and one of the reasons that we changed the rules, and why it has to come back before General Services, simply to act as a stop gap."

It was pointed out that contrary to the state philosophy "to spread the wealth," lease contracts have been awarded to Elwell or Elwell business interests across the state: Los Lunas, Truth or Consequences, Santa Fe, Alamogordo, Silver City, Clovis, Raton, Artesia and Ruidoso.

"This is a guy, a good businessman, who has figured out the system," Threet said. "Basically, that is what he has done. And that makes him a real adversary for Hazel."

Both Threet and Heim said they had never met Elwell, despite his huge investment in state leases.

"Some of my staff at GSD and property control may have met him," Threet said.

"I don't feel that there has been any preference, in the sense of anyone doing anything under the table. I think it's the system. I think he's gotten it down to a science. He goes in and picks up a very low cost piece of property, and he's got a design done, and so he can do it. So it makes him a very competitive bidder."

Rennick pointed out that Elwell's lease will cost the state a quarter of a million dollars (\$100,000 plus two more years) more than if it had gone with Haynsworth and could hardly be called competitive.

He proposed removing employees from the decision process altogether, but allowing liberal input as to their needs. Property management people should make the decisions, he said.

Rennick asked Threet how the process could be fair to proposers when erroneous information was submitted by the local employees on the evaluation committee and Haynsworth was not given an opportunity to challenge. Her bid was a quarter of a million dollars below Elwell's bid. Her bid met requirements and Elwell's didn't.

"They misread the blueprints, they just flat-out misread the blueprints," Rennick said. "They said the bathrooms were here, when in fact they were over there. (They) will not talk to her and explain to her what's going on, other than to say, you've lost the contract."

What can you tell a person like her that wants to bid in the future, that she's going to be handled fairly, besides simply saying, we'll do it fairly. How can you show that she is going to be handled fairly?"

"Well, we do have a new tracking system in place," Threet said. "But it has been something we've struggled with. The only thing that I can say to you is that we have redone the rules. And you can see what Dick has done where they have inserted some of their management now in the process. That it is not strictly employee driven anymore."

"We now have added a review that did not exist previously with our department. We are now handling the distribution through state purchasing, which was not done previously."

"Those are the kinds of things we are putting in place to try to safeguard this."

At that October 28 meeting, Heim told The Ruidoso News he would provide written confirmation of the changes, but to date, no information has been received.

Threet emphasized that in the future, existing buildings will be given special consideration.

"If it doesn't make sense to us, it isn't good business to have stock, housing stock or business stock, that's vacant, and to build new construction," she said.

"But in this case, that happened before any of us at the upper level got involved in it."

However, the inequities in the Elwell-Haynsworth situation were brought to Threet's attention prior to the signing of the lease with Elwell. It appears in this case Threet considered the low-level recommendation veto-proof.

Threet said that towns targeted for new leases will be notified when the state is looking for space.

Threet was asked why most state leases were renegotiated since 1990.

"I'll tell you why that is," she said. "When our administration came in, I would say half of our leases were on month to month. Previous to this administration they had not gone out on RFPs. They just let the departments go, without a contract, month to month."

"We said no way. That's not the way our administration operates. Tax and Revenue had about 60 that were on month to month. That's not fair. So we insisted all of those go out on RFPs. Some of those have been on month to month for four,

five and six years."

The cost to the state of updating and initiating leases has been staggering in some cases.

A check of GSD records shows that on October 15, 1990, that department approved a contract for the Taxation and Revenue to rent a division of Motor Vehicle (DMV) office in Artesia for \$14.28 per leaseable square foot. The lease with B & H Partnership will run until October 14, 2000.

The lease is one of the highest in the state for a rural community. Real estate agents contacted in the area say \$9 a square foot is the going rental rate. The building that houses the DMV office is an old structure, built in the 1950s, the agents said.

"So the reason why you're seeing so many (new leases) is that we have said to departments, you cannot do month to month," Threet said. "You've got to go out, open this up for request for proposals. That's why there are so many."

"Let me tell you, there aren't any more eight- and 10-year leases. That's something else we're not doing. We're doing a maximum of five to six, with options for renewals."

Threet said Elwell "got in real early.... There are those that master the process. They're sharp business people. They see it as a good steady income stream, and so they get in there and master it. It's their business. That's what they do for a living."

"And you will see that there are several that have had contracts for a long time. They mastered the process."

"Honestly, it has taken us two years to clean up the mess in our department. But just to be very honest with you, the property control division could be one that you could make great political hay out of. You see that. Contracts could be directed. We know in the past some administrations have done that. The governor said, do it by the book. And that's what we are trying to do."

Sigrid Olson, general counsel for HSD, wrote Haynsworth on August 26 that, "if upon review of the proposals and evaluation you believe you have a legitimate claim for breach of the procurement responsibilities against the state, I will recommend to Secretary Heim that he waive any requirement of protest that may exist in this particular case and allow you to proceed in First Judicial District Court."

Share your Thanksgiving turkey with a new pet

With big sad brown eyes, set off by a rich golden retriever coat, Lincoln would like to spend Thanksgiving in a home where he will be welcomed and loved.

Brought to the Lincoln County Humane Society animal shelter as a stray, the 10-month-old male was found last July begging for food and

attention in a trailer park off U.S. Highway 70 West.

"He's shy, but eager to please," said shelter manager Esther Harper. "Kathy (Tetreault, shelter secretary) and I have worked with him now that he has learned to trust us. He already responds to the 'sit' command and he's learning others. He would be easy to train."

Lincoln will need to be neutered

in line with the society's commitment to end the pet over-population problem through control of births, with the goal of eliminating the needless destruction of animals. State law also requires that all animals adopted from shelters be spayed or neutered.

Several dogs in the kennel already have been sponsored for the cost of their procedure by caring humane supporters.

Doug and Caroline Armstrong of Rockwall, Texas, who frequently donate food and other items to the animals at the shelter, sent a check to cover the cost of spaying Panda, after reading about her need for a home.

The shepherd mix, with brown eyebrows and a black coat, was brought to the shelter as a pup and has survived many diseases that have swept through the kennels and killed other pups. Workers and volunteers are rooting for her to find loving new owners. She's probably full grown and has a small frame.

The Armstrongs also sponsored Lager the Schnauzer, who has since been adopted, as have several other recently featured pets. They include Chip, Dickens, Cookie, Tiny Tim and Sugar, another long-timer who was kept because Harper was convinced the golden Labrador was worth saving.

Harper urged people thinking about adopting a cat or kitten to stop by the cattery right away.

"We are really loaded with some beautiful cats right now and

several kittens, some Siamese mixes," she said.

One of her personal favorites is Mr. Tom, a Siamese/tabby mix with a beautiful striped face, blue eyes and medium-length white coat.

He's about a year and a half and very loving, she said. "He wants attention and is in good shape."

If a visitor is looking for a particular type of cat and doesn't see one in the cattery, ask Harper or Tetreault, because more cats are housed in the isolation area of the main kennel.

"We're too crowded with healthy cats to have them all in the cattery," Harper said. "As one is adopted, I bring another one up from isolation."

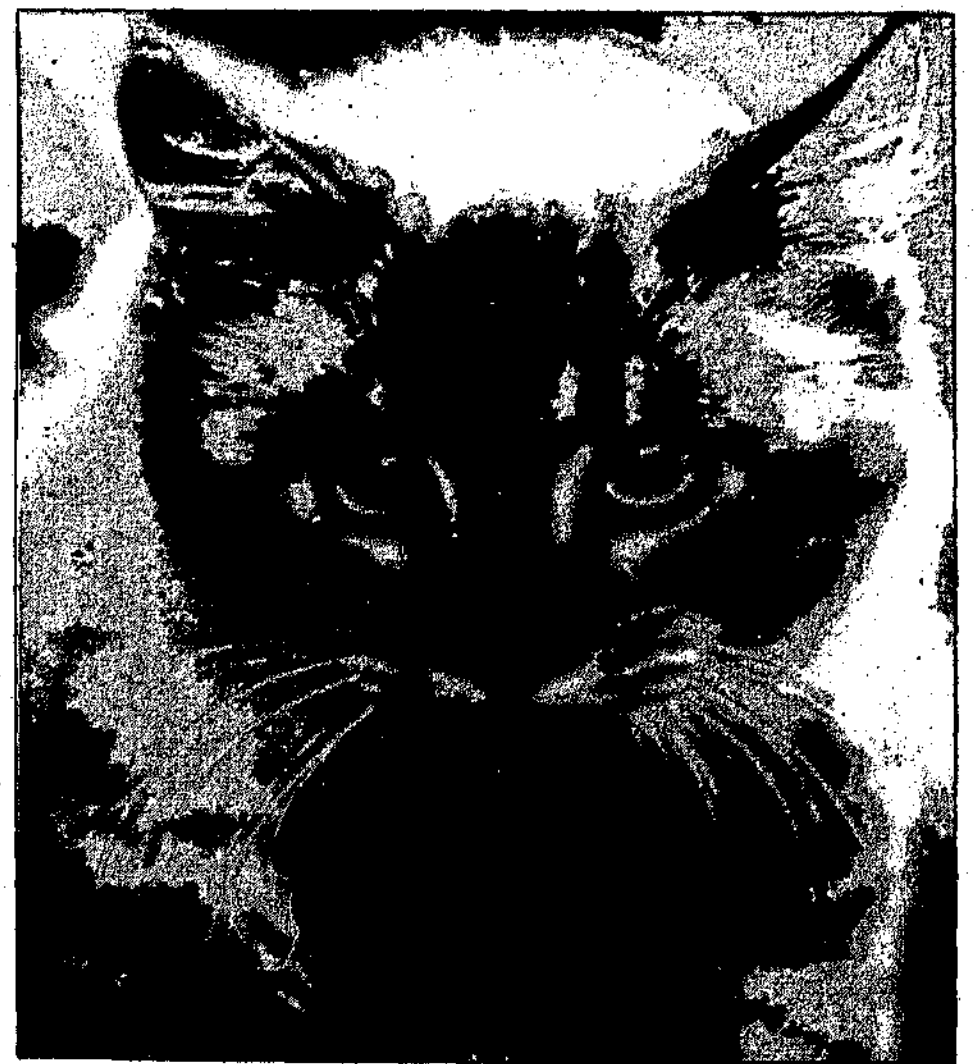

Parents, teachers call for consistent discipline policy

The handling by Ruidoso school officials of an alleged incident of unwanted sexual contact by a freshman boy on a girl in his class has left some parents uneasy.

The allegations stunned school board members last week and stirred calls by parents to close the school campus and for consistent enforcement of rules.

Those attending a board meeting November 9 were outraged to hear from the girl's mother that the accused boy still was in class and apparently, had not been punished for the alleged incident.

At the direction of the school board, superintendent Mike Gladden has initiated a review of existing rules and is forming a committee to come back with recommendations for consistent enforcement.

Meanwhile, high school principal Don Weems said the parents of both students want "closure" on the incident.

"We met after school Friday with Mrs. (Helen) Higginbotham and we all decided we want closure on this thing," Weems said. "We want to give these kids time to heal."

Mrs. Higginbotham could not be reached for comment.

Misled

During the school board meeting, Mrs. Higginbotham said she

was misled by school officials about the action that would occur concerning the alleged incident.

At that same meeting, Weems told *The Ruidoso News* that the parents of the boy had agreed to take him to the police the day after the alleged incident the previous week.

Police involvement

However, Detective Lanny Maddox said that he first learned about the situation when Mrs. Higginbotham came into the police department November 8.

"It sounded like a possible criminal sexual contact incident and I said I would have to interview her daughter, if she wanted to pursue charges against the boy," Maddox said. "I guess she decided not to at this time."

"The thing she did ask me was if the school had ever reported the incident to the police. Anyone who is in a custodial capacity with children has a duty to report allegations. I guess that was never done."

"I checked the records and the boy's mother never came in until Wednesday (November 10), not right after the alleged incident." Apparently school officials did not fulfill the requirements of the law to file an official report of allegations, Maddox said.

When contacted by *The News*, Weems contended when the mother took her son to the police that

amounted to official notification.

"Officially, the parents took the child down to the police," he said.

Officer Robert Achterberg said when he interviewed the mother and son, the boy denied the allegations.

"Our conversation was not to get guilt or innocence, just to tell him the kind of problems he could be facing," Achterberg said.

The boy did receive counseling because of the alleged incident, Weems said.

Gladden responds

Superintendent Mike Gladden said until there is an admission of guilt or witnesses verify the victim's account, the district has a responsibility to protect the rights of both students.

"He did deny it," Gladden said. "After the incident supposedly occurred, the staff was trying to get all the information and thought they had resolved the issue last Friday morning (November 6). Then other things occurred."

"What's belabored the process ... there was an immediate investigation begun at the school level. We have to have some proof that there is a reason to report something."

However, Maddox said school officials have the responsibility to report allegations to the police, not to investigate them.

"That's probably something we do more of when we believe abuse

has occurred at home," Gladden said. "I know teachers report suspected abuse."

Weems did confirm that the boy has received counseling because of the alleged incident. Neither Weems nor Gladden would discuss if any other type of action was taken as a result of the allegations.

Committee reports

During the school board meeting, teacher Galen Farrington reported on some recommendations from a discipline committee called together by Weems.

Two of the most important items listed by the committee were that discipline actions must be supported by the administration with communication district-wide, and that the staff must be unified to ensure rules not enforced on arbitrary basis.

Students need to know that offenses will result in consistent and meaningful consequences immediately, he said.

More recommendations

Other recommendations included that:

—insubordination must have severe and immediate consequences, no matter to whom on the staff it is directed.

—for minor discipline infractions, a first offense would result in a teacher conference with the student to begin a paper trail in the students file. For the second offense, the parent would be con-

tacted. For the third offense on the same issue, an automatic suspension would occur.

—punishment for tardies needs to be spelled out in the hand book. For four to six tardies, detention should occur the next day; for seven to nine, an in school suspension; and after the tenth, an out of school suspension. Three tardies equal an absence to be counted against the 10 day maximum.

—specific areas of the campus could be assigned to campus teachers and their classes for picking up litter.

—seniors must carry at least a half-day load of classes, all in the morning or all in the afternoon.

—the hat policy be re-evaluated. It has generated a lot of bad feeling for what appears to be a simple policy, Farrington said. Trying to enforce no hat policy at certain times of the day has been a problem.

—plain T-shirts should be given to students to wear who come to school with objectionable T-shirts. If they are allowed to just turn-around their shirts, they probably will put them back the right way again in an hour.

—parking lot violations should be punished with detention, in school suspension and out of school suspension for first through third offenses.

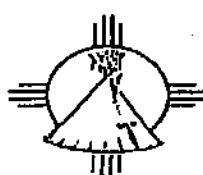

Ruidoso Care Center (RCC) has planned a variety of activities during November in honor of National Alzheimer's Month.

According to a news release, the special events are designed to create public awareness and promote understanding of Alzheimer's disease.

This week the center's Alzheimer's Unit will be host an informal open house with tours planned and staff on hand to answer questions. Information about Alzheimer's Disease will be available.

A dance is scheduled for Saturday, November 20, followed by an elegant dinner for the Alzheimer's residents and their families.

For information, please call RCC at 257-9071.

The Alzheimer's Living Center, a 24-bed wing at RCC, provides specialized care for Alzheimer's residents.

The unit is designed to provide a safe and secure environment with an unobtrusive alarm system that

alerts nursing staff if a resident should wander off the unit. The unit has a separate dining/activity room and enclosed private patio and courtyard for the residents' use.

Michael Hickey, M.D. is the medical consultant for the unit. He is available to consult with patients, physicians and their families.

The unit has a full-time activity director who provides individually planned activities seven days a week for the residents. Activities take into account each resident's particular needs and capabilities.

Each resident has an individualized Care Plan that is developed and reviewed every 90 days by an interdisciplinary team as well as the resident's family.

"Placement of residents on the unit provides structure, task segmentation and cueing as an alternative to chemical and physical restraints to ensure and preserve the highest quality of life

for each resident," explained Dawna Reyes, Alzheimer's coordinator at RCC.

Family support is an important dimension of the program, she continued.

Currently plans are being developed to establish an Alzheimer's support group in Lincoln County.

Alzheimer's disease is a brain disorder that produces progressive intellectual impairment. It affects an estimated four to six million Americans.

The disease is characterized initially by forgetfulness, especially about recent events. As the disease progresses, memory loss increases.

Other changes such as confusion, irritability, mood swings and personality changes are likely to occur. The behavior of the Alzheimer's victim becomes unpredictable.

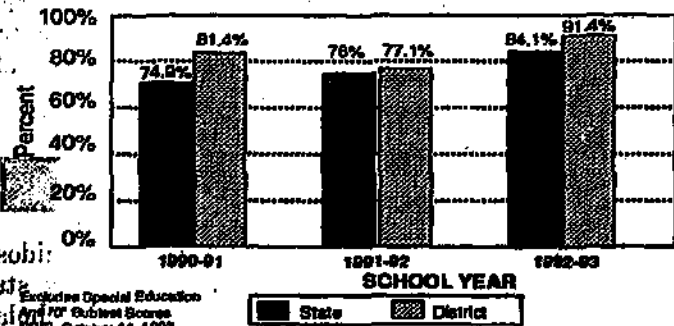

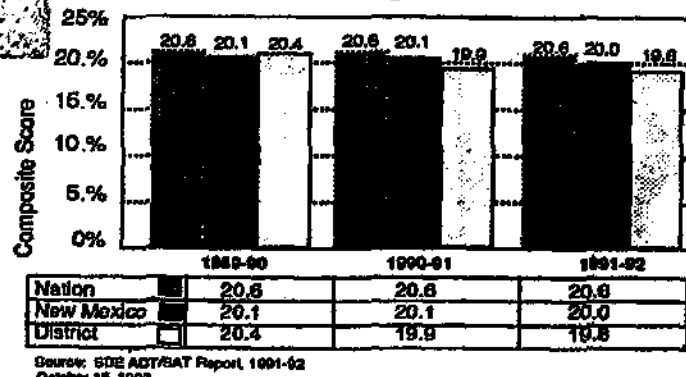

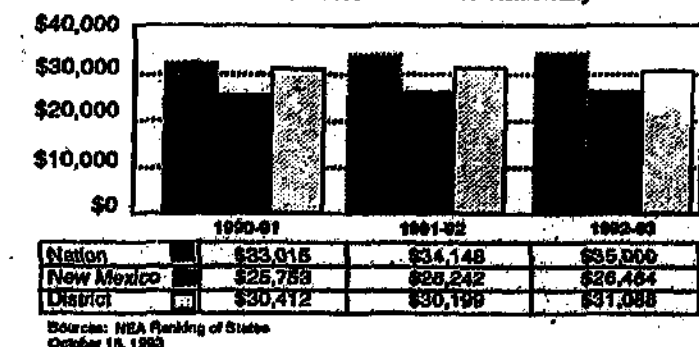
Percent of 10th Graders Passing All HSCE Subtest By Year District Ranking: 22 of 88 District



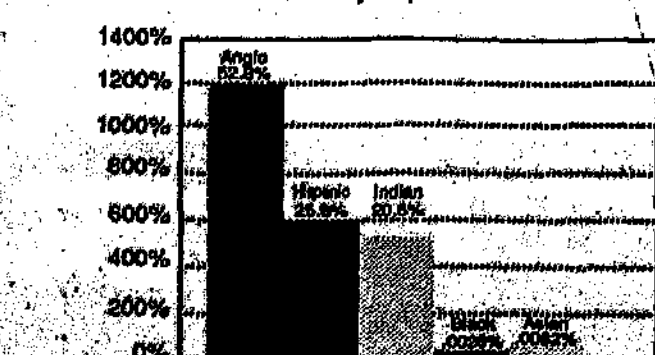
MEAN ACT COMPOSITE SCORES BY YEAR College Bound Students

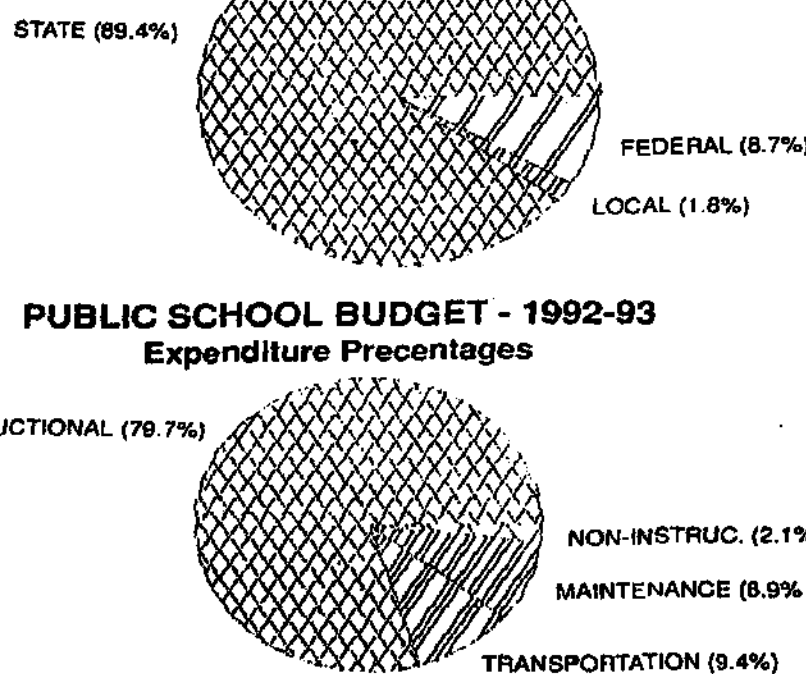

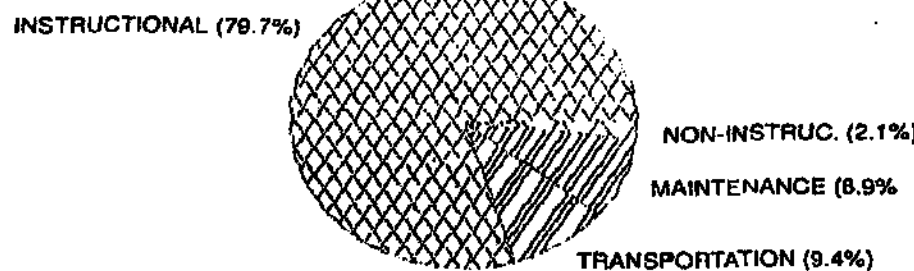

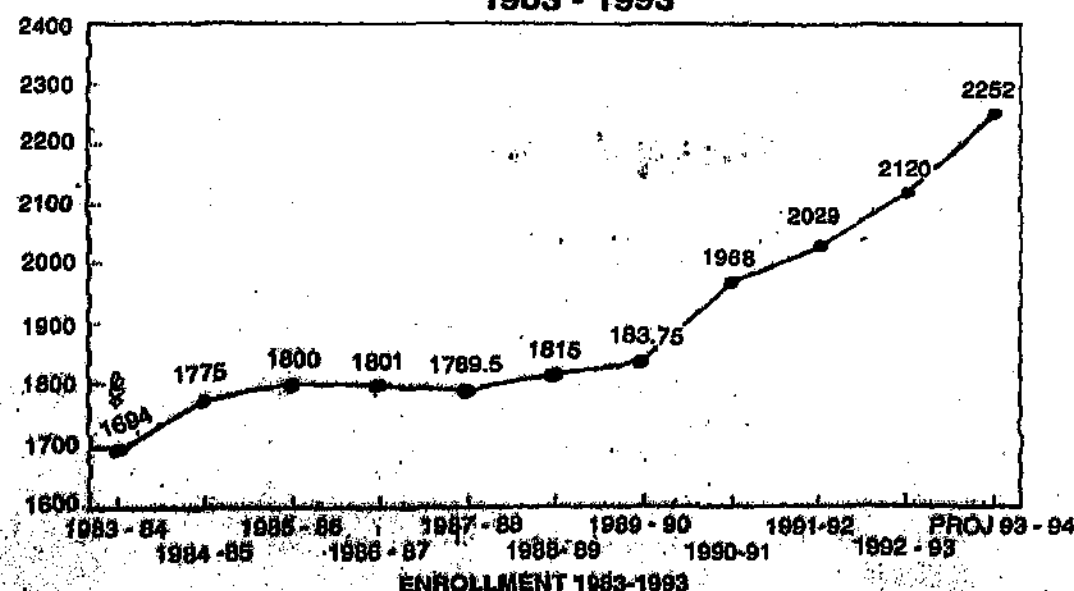
PUBLIC SCHOOL REVENUE SOURCES STATE, LOCAL, FEDERAL - 1992-93 SY



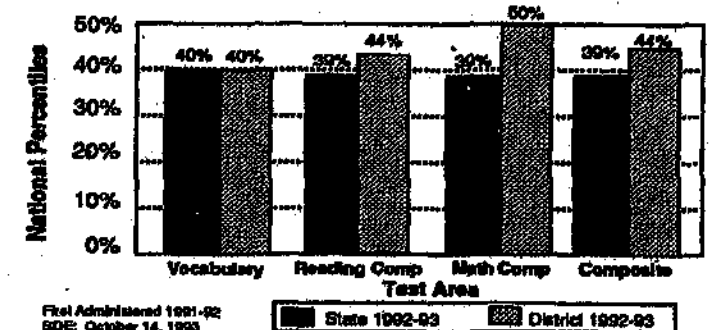
PUBLIC SCHOOL BUDGET - 1992-93 Expenditure Percentages



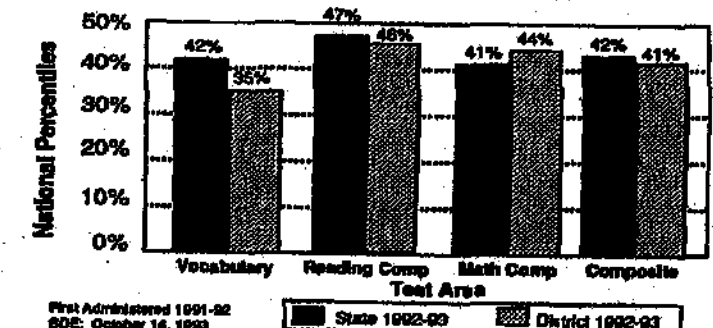

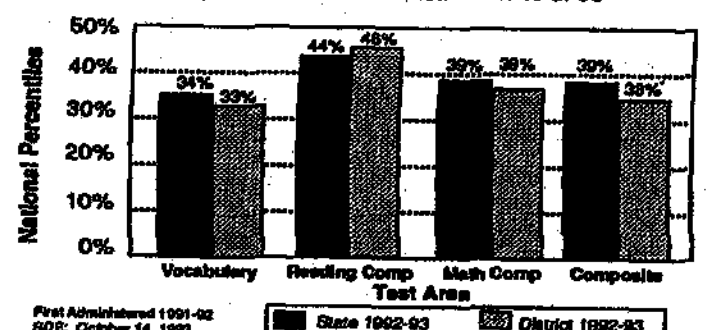
1992-93 Iowa Test of Basic Skills National Percentile Scores By Test Area Grade 3, District: Ruidoso Dist. Rank 40 of 88



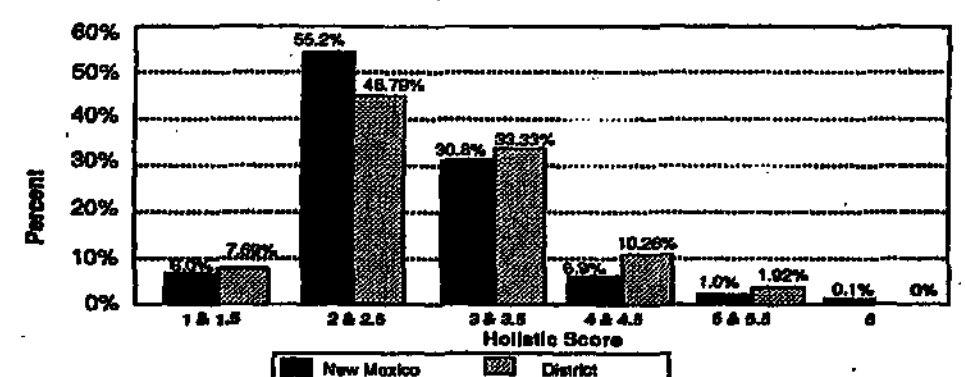
1992-93 Iowa Test of Basic Skills National Percentile Scores By Test Area Grade 5, District: Ruidoso Dist. Rank 52 of 88



1992-93 Iowa Test of Basic Skills National Percentile Scores By Test Area Grade 8, District: Ruidoso Dist. Rank 43 of 88

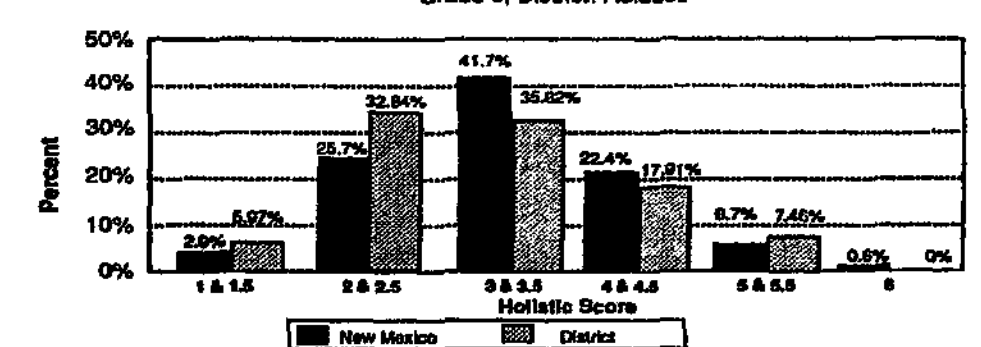


New Mexico Portfolio Writing Assessment Percent of Students at Each Holistic Score Grade 4, District: Ruidoso

This curious reader was just wondering...

TO THE EDITOR:

Did you ever wonder...

...why, with as many unemployed people as there are around and in the summer, the number of teenagers needing summer jobs, the Village of Ruidoso finds it necessary and/or desirable to hire inmates from Camp Sierra Blanca and permits many of them to operate village vehicles and equipment, sometimes without driver's licenses?

...why a telephone call from Ruidoso to Capitan is long distance, while an even greater distance call to Bent is a local charge? And if it legally is a long distance call, why doesn't it go through one's selected long distance carrier (AT&T, MCI or Sprint) instead of being billed and collected by GTE? By comparison from Alamogordo to Cloudcroft is a local call.

...why GTE subscribers in Capitan can obtain a monthly flat rate charge (\$9) for unlimited calls to Ruidoso, but such a flat rate is unavailable to Ruidoso subscribers needing to frequently call Capitan?

...why in-state long distance calls are far more expensive than out of state calls? Something's

wrong when one can call California cheaper than Albuquerque.

...why folks like us who save the Postal Service money by being denied home delivery have to pay for a post office box in order to receive our mail? And why does it often take three working days to get a letter from one box to another? Seems like every time postage increases, service decreases.

...why the school boards, who spend tax monies, are not required to follow the same personnel policies and purchasing requirements/procedures as other governmental agencies? The same logic can be applied to the Lincoln County Fair Board as well, whether or not it operates as a county commission board or as a separate entity. Tax dollars are tax dollars.

...why the law doesn't require the police and courts to confiscate vehicles having no insurance coverage? Either we have a requirement for insurance or we don't — the law makes no exception for whether or not one can afford the insurance. In Europe, license plates are not issued until proof of adequate insurance coverage is provided. I got the horse laugh from

the MVD director when I proposed a similar procedure in New Mexico as a way to ensure compliance. Let's enforce the law or get rid of it.

...what difference is there between motorcycle helmet and motor vehicle seat belt requirements? Why is refusal to protect oneself OK for motorcyclists and taboo for motorists? Seems like a double standard to me. (I feel qualified to speak to this issue with my 100,000+ on a motorcycle and as the investigator of dozens of accidents.)

...why Ruidoso consistently has the highest gasoline prices in the state, while in Carrizozo, an even farther distance from a distributor, is consistently 10 cents per gallon cheaper? And why is there no price competition between retailers? Please don't insult my intelligence again with the so-called "transportation costs" argument — if distributors agree to prohibit retailers from competitive pricing, that's a conspiracy and/or price fixing.

...if it is possible that EDCLC and the Chamber of Commerce are talking to the wrong people? Chain stores and franchised establishments have a national or regional

name recognition and acceptance, especially for folks unfamiliar with an area. Almost guaranteed to succeed locally would be a Taco Bell, a Wendy's Hamburger Restaurant, a Long John Silver's or small Red Lobster, a J.C. Penney's catalog outlet, a Dairy Queen and a Midas Muffler shop. Each would employ at least a few local folks and would probably pay more gross receipts taxes than a small factory. Also, despite the number of 18 wheelers using US 70, there isn't a modern, full service truck stop between Amarillo and Las Cruces. Perhaps someone should talk to the owners of the Petro Truck Stop chain about looking at this area for one — incidentally, they live here in Ruidoso you know. Let's not pass up the bread and butter while reaching for the gravy.

and finally...why ladies' sweat pants are obtainable with open cuff legs, while sweat pants for men, who have ugly ankles and big feet, only come with elastic cuffs designed to creep up their legs? Isn't that gender discrimination?
