School election set for Feb. 2

Ruidoso voters will go to the polls Tuesday, February 2, to elect two new members to the school board and decide whether or not to continue a two mill tax levy.

James Paxton is running unopposed for one position on the Ruidoso School Board and Kent Beatty and James Varnadore are running for the other open slot.

Ruidoso School Board President Lynn Willard and Vice President Rod Adamson are both completing their current terms, and neither are running for re-election.

During Tuesday's School Board meeting, the board heard plans to conduct this election in a new polling place.

Superintendent Mike Gladden said the election board had asked to move the election out of the Middle School lobby because that spot is so cold and noisy.

The February 2 election will be in the public meeting room at Ruidoso High School.

Gladden said the parking around the circle will be left open for voters on that day.


Polls will be open from 7 a.m. until 7 p.m. Tuesday, February 2, with absentee balloting already under way.

To request an absentee application, call 648-2394, or write to the County Clerk at Box 338, Carrizozo NM 88301.

The last day to vote absentee is January 29, with the ballots to be returned before 7 p.m. on election day. Those ballots must be returned to the county courthouse, either in person or by mail.

Candidates for the school board will have a chance to speak during a candidate forum at 7 p.m. Mon-

Ruidoso Police recount busy year

In 1992, citizens called the Ruidoso Police Department for service 7,712 times, 18 percent more than 1991.

Also during this year, Dick Swenor became senior municipal police chief in the state and is slightly older than the collective ages of the department's vehicle fleet.

But things will change for Ruidoso in 1993. While Swenor will continue to age his 79 colleagues, four police-patrol cars will be replaced in February. And upon receipt of the 1993 models, the oldest police cars will be three 1986 models and a pick-up that are scheduled for replacement in the 1993-94 budget.

The entire police patrol vehicle fleet will be modernized and standardized with new reflective mark-

ings probably in February.

Ruidoso's 1992 traffic accidents continued to increase, according to a report by Swenor. The 22 percent increase over 1991 represents 402 accidents in 1992.

No fatal accidents occurred in Ruidoso for 1992. Every third day, an adult was arrested in Ruidoso for DWI.

Crime was down in numbers from 1991, but the type of violent crime such as assault, and domestic violence continued to increase by as high as 40 percent over last year.

Burglaries have also been on the increase, but a strong arrest rate (60-70 percent) is coupled with property recovered at nearly 70 percent over 1991.

Adult arrests that resulted in detention had a modest climb of 13 percent. About 800 adults were

MRS proposals 'far from dead'

Robert Walters of Ruidoso's MRS Advisory Committee returned from a January meeting of the Nuclear Waste Technical Review Board (NWTRB) in Arlington, Virginia, and reported that the Mesalero MRS project is far from "dead."

Presentations to NWTRB by Charles B. Lempsis, chief of staff for David Leroy, Nuclear Waste Negotiator, and by staff of the office of Civilian Radioactive Waste Management of the Department of Energy (DOE), indicate Leroy is continuing efforts to reach an MRS siting agreement with the Mesalero.

Leroy expects to be able to send an agreement to Congress by the end of 1993, Walters said.

The DOE in a policy shift outlined by Secretary James

Watkins, will aggressively pursue siting an MRS facility either on a military reservation or other federal lands.

Walters said this second prong of DOE's new two-track approach is designed to avoid complications presented to MRS siting efforts by opposition from state governments and citizens in areas of proposed siting.

Walters said that although New Mexico's congressmen and senators continue to oppose a siting, their unanimous support of a call for a congressional investigation of DOE's radioactive waste management system was not assured.

In December, the Ruidoso Village Council sent a resolution to Governor Bruce King, asking his support for Congressional hearings regarding DOE's policies and costs.

Robbery attempt stalled

A man wearing a ski mask attempted to hold up a Mr. Burger employee late Sunday night.

Holder told police the deposit was still in the car and the attempted robbery failed. She said the man, after a scuffle, ran toward the old True Value store. Holder said she sustained several cuts on her right arm and a rip in her shirt.

Artist celebrates life through her sculpting

She's one of those people who sees the joy in life no matter what the twists or turns, who is open to learning new skills and breaking new ground.

And for the past 22 years, Betty Day has shared those qualities with the elementary-age students she taught art.

The experience also taught Day that she possessed a considerable talent herself. Her small 4 to 8-inch terra cotta sculpture portraits hit the mark.

"I tried to work with larger sculptures, but I just couldn't seem to get the proportions right," Day said during an interview in her Ruidoso Gardens home last week.

She prefers working on persons she knows and from her own photographs. But on several occasions, she has been asked to sculpt a head and upper torso of someone's late family member, using old photographs.

"It's much harder," she said. "When I get to a certain stage, I bring in the person to look at what I have and I leave them with a pen and pencil and go to another room."

"(Sometimes) it looks so much better with their suggestions. They knew the subject. Other can't see what it needs."

Day, 69, and her husband, John "J.C." Day, moved to Ruidoso 33

years ago from Lovington, although they both originally were from Snyder, Texas.

The company he was with was going to transfer us to Utah, but the kids would have to ride 40 miles to school and we didn't like that," Day said. "We had vacationed in Ruidoso for five or six years and loved it."

They both found jobs, Day at Brunell's and her husband at the Lincoln County Medical Center.

"There were only six houses here when we moved into this home 25 years ago," Day said. Two of their four children still live in the area.

She was working at Brunell's when the opportunity opened for a teacher aide.

"I was one of the first four ever hired for the system," she said. "That was 1970-71, but a lot of teachers didn't know how to use an aide. I needed to be busy, so I found a little kiln in the bathroom of (the elementary school) that had never worked."

"I asked (principal) Sid Miller if I could try to use it and he said yes. He told me to go to Capitan and have a woman there teach me. So I did (in a one-day session)."

"I came back, bought some clay and started teaching the kids. Miller at that time was principal of both the elementary school and

The meeting will begin at 10 a.m. at the authority's recycling center at 222 Second Street in Ruidoso Downs.

Members also will consider a request from authority manager Gene Green for fencing at the Capitan landfill to keep out scavengers. Members also will be asked for feedback on setting up a salvage operation there.

Concerning the proposed site of a regional landfill on Otero County, Bob Fish, representing the Prairie Dawg Motorcycle Club is on the agenda to voice the concerns of his group, which uses property near the site south of Alamogordo to ride their cycles.

Smokey Stover, parks commission head said, "This is a new concept and everyone interested in greatly improving Ruidoso's parks and recreation services should attend and give their views."

Stover said the city of Amarillo, Texas, entered into such an agreement and last year the concessionaire paid the city \$154,000.

Departments look back on '93 accomplishments

Department directors for the Village of Ruidoso prepared a year-end list of accomplishment for the calendar year of 1992.

Patricia Ortiz, new village attorney, prepared a list that also contains many accomplishments by past attorneys of the village, including David Thomsen, who served most of last year.

Some of those accomplishments include:

—District Court judgment af-

firmed by the New Mexico Supreme Court in favor of the village in the Dacy vs. Village of Ruidoso case. Possible savings to the village amount to \$253,000.

—Collected approximately \$10,000 in past due water accounts.

—Handled approximately 30 criminal complaints.

—Drafted 18 ordinances.

—Drafted 16 resolutions.

—Negotiated sale and prepared contract for the purchase of the T-

hangars from Airspace.

—Drafted and reviewed seven contracts, including: Avis Rent a Car, and Sierra Blanca Motors Rent a Car, Counseling Center, On Track, White Mountain Search and Rescue, Joint Powers Agreements with the Ruidoso Downs Jail, and the Solid Waste Authority.

—Settled a lawsuit against the town of Carrizo for a disputed airport fuel bill. Settlement was paid for \$3,000. This amount was \$2,500 in favor of Ruidoso.

—Converted the Ruidoso Municipal Code from Display Write, a word processing program, to Wordperfect 5.1.

—Kent Berkedal and Robert Steward wrongful termination cases were settled. It was agreed between the parties that the amount would be kept confidential.

—Dorothy Ullman, a slip and fall case of Sudderth Street, was settled for \$3,000. This amount was paid by the village insurance company.

day, January 25, in the dining hall at Ruidoso High School.

Information on the public school capital improvements tax levy was also presented to the board on Tuesday.

"The two mill levy is extremely important to Ruidoso schools," said Gladden, adding that the funds can be used for such necessary items as remodeling and activity vehicles.

Bonding counsel Charles Casey explained that the two mill levy, because of state yield control, doesn't always have a net effect two mills. A rather involved state law relates reappraisal to mill levies to maintain the amount of money collected through a mill levy at a set level.

In this area yield control was called into play last year, so that non-residential taxpayers' rate stayed at 1.801 on a two mill levy, said Casey. Residential taxpayers still were assessed the two mills.

After this election, if voters approve the two-mill levy, yield control begins all over again, said Casey.

An informational brochure dis-

tributed at the meeting answered the most common questions asked about the two-mill levy.

"The Public School Capital Improvements Tax Act enables school districts to impose a levy in the amount of two mills for three years with voter approval," reads the brochure. "This present election is to renew the existing levy for another three years."

Funds generated by this levy are used to maintain and improve public school buildings and to purchase small equipment that would not be included in a bond issue.

Casey said a two mill levy amounts to 20 cents per \$1,000 of taxable value. For instance on a house with an appraised value of \$90,000, the taxable value (at a third) is \$30,000, so the levy would cost the property owner \$6 for the entire year.

Also during Tuesday's meeting, the board approved the sale of a \$3 million general obligation bond series. Casey said six groups submitted bids, with The Principal/E.G.T. and Associates the low bidder. The board approved his recommendation of that group, noting that there are local

participants.

Casey said the school system did a little better on this bond sale than the one in January of 1992, adding that the local participation through the First National Bank of Ruidoso may be one reason for that.

Later in the meeting, the board instructed the superintendent to write a letter of thanks to Ronnie Paulger, president of the First National Bank.

"Bonds are guaranteed and they'll appear as AAA bonds, the highest rating you can get," said Casey.

The board approved Sunwest Bank as the paying agent, after reviewing three bids. Sunwest and First National Bank of Albuquerque submitted identical bids, but the board endorsed Sunwest because it already is the paying agent for another school bond series.

In other regular business Tuesday, the board heard plans to use state land for two environmental education projects.

White Mountain Elementary School principal Frank Cannella reported that the schools have the use of 50 acres of state land directly behind the high school. Using

grants and about \$25,000, the school will accomplish two separate projects.

An agricultural education project will include animals, pens, a waterline and a small metal building, with the students doing much of the construction work.

The other project will be to construct a nature trail on state land.

Cannella said the funds will be obtained through a mix of local, state and federal grants.

The board also heard Rob Hill, principal Roger Sowder report that school ski days begin Tuesday, January 19, for four weeks, with one extra Tuesday set aside in case a makeup day is needed.

Lincoln County schools are expected to take part in the program offered by Ski Apache.

The cost remains \$5 to rent skis, \$2 for a lift ticket and \$1 for ski school, said Sowder.

Superintendent Gladden expressed appreciation to Mescalero Apache Tribal President Wendell Chino for offering this unique opportunity for students and their families. He said the help of the ski shops is also appreciated.

logged through the Ruidoso Adult Detention Facility last year.

Juvenile arrests skyrocketed by 48 percent with increased juvenile involvement in felony type crimes.

Swenor said 1992 reflected progress toward implementation of E911 emergency reporting for Ruidoso and the county. Tentative dates for equipment-software in-

stallation is in March, with full service this June.

Lincoln County will have two public service answering points. One will be at the Ruidoso Police Department and the other at the Lincoln County Sheriff's Office in Carrizozo.

After several months of review and bids, a new computerized digital telephone system has been purchased for police communications with installation just completed.

The 1992 special events included the Golden Aspen Motorcycle Rally and the Aspenfest Parade. Both were handled without major incident.

Ruidoso's Civic Events Center activities have increased police service requirements, Swenor said.

He said that 1992's major holiday periods of Memorial Day, July 4th, Labor Day, Thanksgiving and Christmas-New Years have shown increased population and

traffic volumes and comparisons with historical statistics reflect 1992's holiday periods were comparable to 1984-1985.

In 1992, Ruidoso Police personnel were involved in or directed Hunter Safety Classes, Santa Cops, Drug Free Schools program, Family Crisis training and other school and community activities along with other fraternal and professional organizations.

Nob Hill. When a new principal now superintendent Mike Gladden was hired to handle the elementary school, Miller went to Nob Hill and Day went with him.

As enrollment grew, the district built an intermediate school and Day was given her own room where she conducted art classes. It was a large kiln was purchased and supplies were plentiful.

The kids did life-size busts of themselves, she said. At one time, there were 76 busts sitting around. They were so cute and most everyone could recognize who made them.

"I've worked with three principals and they've always been good about doing what was needed," Day said.

After 22 years, "now I'm teaching the kids of the kids I taught," she said. "I feel good because their parents usually say they learned a lot in my class. It seems like the job gets better every year and that's the way it's suppose to be."

Day said she knew she had some natural talent, but up until she began working with the school children she had just been dabbling.

"Growing up I never knew I could draw, not until I started teaching kids at school. Now that's mainly what I do with them, but my personal love still is clay."

Watching children discover their talent is a thrill, she said. "A lot who don't excel in academics feel good when they know they can draw, and everyone can with the right training."

"For the last four years, I've used a book called *Drawing for Children*, written by Nora Brooks, designed for elementary age children.

"When I read the book, I knew it would be perfect. (White Mountain Elementary Principal) Frank Cannella was very enthusiastic."

First she tried out the approach on about 21 students at home. "It was a charming success," she said.

The teachers love it. I have their kids one hour a day and that gives them some time."

Second and third graders are eager to learn and her art classes are different from their other breaks. They look forward to the break from regular academics and tend to behave well in class.

She conducts 16 classes a week and is the only one of the original four teacher's aides still working in the system.

"When I started, I would carry my supplies, but things got too much and (Frank Cannella) said he would get me a cart like the science cart," Day said. "I just push it into the room with all my supplies and then load it up afterward and go to the next class."

A few children will insist they don't like art at the beginning of each year, she said.

"But that's because they haven't really accomplished anything in the past," Day said. "With this approach they can and pretty soon they can't wait to see me."

"One boy after three to four sessions is drawing really well now and it's marvelous to watch."

Sometimes a child will cry because a drawing isn't perfect. Following the lead of the author, Day will divert the child's attention away from the perceived imperfection and turn it into a unique, individualistic touch.

"If a Christmas mouse's foot is too large, I say it might have gotten caught in a trap and it's swollen. They're just as happy as can be,"

she said. "The book says you can always make something out of a mistake."

Day was recognized by the state for her contribution to education in 1990. She went to Albuquerque to receive a "Recognition of Excellence" award from the State Board of Education and the Governor's Business Administration Council.

At home, her first human sculpture was of her granddaughter. She previously had created turtles and other animals. "I was so excited, the turtle turned out well," Day said. "I've done gobs of animals since."

Venturing outside of her immediate family, she tried a sculpture of a friend with whom she rode to jury duty several days.

"He had such good character in his face, I asked if I could do his sculpture," Day said. "It felt so good when I saw what I could do."

Since then she has completed 10 sculptures and sold seven. One family was so satisfied with the results of her first sculpture of their late father, they asked that three more be completed. She's working on that assignment now.

"I've done some I was not so pleased with, but the clients were," Day said. "I was concerned because I keep working and working on (a piece), then I read that Michelangelo took his brushes to the museum to touch up his work."

In some cases, her friends saw her work and began to ask her to do commissions. Other times, she just saw a face that interested her.

"I did one of Gerald Tully and when I was finished, I took it to him to show him. He bought it."

She prefers working with terra cotta because the warm tone seems to suit her subjects and a finish

doesn't have to be applied to the material.

"I feel a finish changes the look too much," Day said.

Although it's intermittently, a sculpture takes from 60-100 hours to complete, Day estimated.

She starts by pulling out a string of clay, then throws it onto a cloth to get the bubbles out.

"I start shaping it into a head and shoulders and leave enough for a hat in place or to be added later," she said. "Then I just start carving with small tools, trying to get a

likeness." From there she refines and removes.

"I use a magnifying glass for the fine details," she said.


She's pleased with her faces, but Day said she still needs to work on the clothing, to define better the wrinkles and folds.

"They just don't interest me," she said. "It's the face features I'm after."

Although she's been teaching children for years, Day said she'd still like to take lessons. There's always more to learn.

The Dreamer

Jack Frost delivers mild winter weather

Our winter weather started a month early this year, and now the weather spirits and Jack Frost brought us days and nights that are very mild, taking it year after year, when we are well past the beginning of the "deep of winter."

All the Northwest, the Midwest, the Northeast, even California, are paralyzed, snowed in, pounded by blizzards and driven to high ground.

In Utah, they are digging out from the deepest snow on record, with roads blocked from one end of the state to the other, livestock and wild creatures heading for the lower desert country looking for feed.

And here we are in our mountain land with good snow falling on the mountain, and down in the valleys, light rains, just enough to soak into the ground, preparing the land for a green and flowery Spring.


This Spring-like spell here in mid-winter is bringing us the usual sight of willow, Chinese elm and cottonwood trees turning the color that lets you know they are thinking of leafing out. This is especially true down around San Patricio, Hondo and Picacho, and even more so over around Lincoln.

When the big cold fronts come out of the North and East, you will notice that it is colder in Roswell than it is here in Lincoln County. We are protected by the Capitans, the hill down the Ruidoso and Hondo valleys.

The early Spanish settlers discovered this feature of Lincoln County. You can see that, because the settlements of San Patricio, Hondo, Picacho and Lincoln were established before Roswell, Alamogordo and Clovis. Lincoln, a favorite spot for early Spanish settlers, is protected from all sides. You can see why Lincoln was the county seat of old Lincoln County. The winters of the early days were more severe, generally speaking than they are today. The folks did not have the protection against the cold that we have now, so they looked for spots where the winters were not so rough.

Ruidoso itself has a climate something like the Northwestern states, with its pine, spruce and Douglas firs and wild strawberries and raspberries, and the wild violet and forget-me-not Scotch blue bell, and other trees and flowers of the temperate climates.

And yet Ruidoso has a much milder climate than the Northwestern states, because it is at the foot of a lone mountain all by itself with needles, rhines and desert surrounding it on all sides. This makes it a special spot with a



charm all its own.

And here we are in "the deep of winter" with all the New Year starting off with a perfect winter.

JACK FROST PAYS A VISIT

During the last few days, we have seen every kind of winter weather, snow, rain, sleet, hail, frozen mist and freezing fog.

The other day when I was driving home, the beautifully formed crystal-shaped snow flakes plastered onto the windshield, lingering for a moment, little emblems of mid-winter. Other flakes, half formed, joined them. Then the pure white balls of sleet came driving on the wind and bounced off the hood and side windows and windshield. Next the rain and half frozen rain came showering down.

This morning, the sun came over the mountain into the Vale covered with a heavy frost, outlining every twig, branch, weed, bush and grass stem in pure sparkling white. The sun turned the frost first to gold and then rainbow colors, as it quickly began to melt under the bright sun. The frost drops formed on the branches of the small apricot tree and clung there shining like jewelry in the quiet still air. The snow birds alighting on the tree sent the drops falling to the ground.

Before your eyes, the frost was gone like magic and you were in a day of spring in winter. The lilac buds are beginning to swell, and the new grass already is green on the sunny side of the Vale.

I asked Al if he wanted me to write another column for the new edition and he said he did.

After the summer was over, I said to Al, "Well, I guess you will discontinue the Monday paper now that summer is about over."

"Oh no," said Al. "We will have the Monday paper from now on."

NOTICE OF PROPERTY TAX REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

Property which was valued in 1992 in this county by the county assessor is not required to be reported or rendered for 1993 or 78 subsequent years.

EXCEPT FOR:

1. mobile homes
2. livestock, and
3. land used for agricultural purposes

If, for any reason, your property was not valued last year and it is subject to valuation this year, you are required by law to report it to the county assessor on forms provided either by mail or at the assessor's office.

All nongovernmental entities (property owners) which claim to be exempt from the property tax must report their property and claim their exemption for 1993 if the exemption was not claimed in 1992.

Reports for mobile homes, livestock, land use for agricultural purposes, property not valued last year and claims for exemptions by nongovernmental entities must be completed and

mailed or delivered to the county assessor not later than the last day of February.

If you made improvements to your real property and:

1. the improvements cost more than \$1,000 and
2. a building permit for the improvements was not issued;

you must report the nature of the improvements and their cost to the assessor not later than the last day of February. These reports must be on forms provided by that assessor.

If you believe your property decreased in value during the preceding year, you must report, on forms provided by the assessor, a signed statement which:

1. describes the property affected,
2. states the cause and nature of decrease in value, and
3. states the amount you contend the value has decreased.

This statement must be filed with the county assessor no later than the last day of February.

If the veterans exemption will be claimed, claim must be made by the last day of February. Please present or mail in original

certificate to the County Assessors Office.

if the head-of-family exemption was claimed and allowed in 1992 no new claim for that exemption is required to be filed. However, if that exemption was not claimed and allowed in 1992 and it is now claimed, claim must be made by the last day of February by filing with the assessor the form provided by the assessor.

Beginning in the 1982 tax year, taxpayers are responsible for declaring their property classification to the assessor, as residential or nonresidential. When the declaration is accepted by the assessor, it shall remain as such and need not be made in subsequent years unless the classification changes. If a taxpayer has not declared their property to be residential in 1992 and desires that classification for 1993 they must complete a declaration of residential classification and return the signed declaration to the county assessor's office by the last day of February, 1993.

Certain mineral property and personal property of contractors operating in more than one county are required to be reported to the Taxation and Revenue Department, Property Tax Division of the State of New Mexico in Santa Fe.

Information about property to be reported to the Taxation and Revenue Department, Property Tax Division can be obtained from the county assessor or the Taxation and Revenue Department, Property Tax Division, Central Assessment Bureau, P.O. Box 630, Santa Fe, New Mexico 87509, Phone: (505) 827-0893.



Although the Warriors are now 1-10, they have had four good games in a row with a chance to win each. Wright said they have gained experience and confidence with each one.

The team will need all the confidence it can get to play at Artesia on Tuesday. Wright said the Bulldogs have a lot of good athletes and have a good press. They also play fast-paced and force their opponents to do the same.

The Warriors will return home Friday to play Socorro in the first district game. Tip-off for the C-team is 4 p.m.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF THE VILLAGE OF RUIDOSO MUNICIPAL SALES TAX REFUNDING AND IMPROVEMENT REVENUE BONDS, SERIES JANUARY 1, 1993 IN THE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF \$2,985,000 FOR THE PURPOSE OF DEFRAYING THE COST OF REFUNDING, PAYING, DISCHARGING AND LIQUIDATING THE VILLAGE OF RUIDOSO MUNICIPAL SALES TAX REVENUE BONDS, SERIES AUGUST 1, 1987 AND FOR THE PURPOSE OF CONSTRUCTING, PURCHASING, ACQUIRING, FURNISHING, EQUIPPING AND IMPROVING AIRPORT FACILITIES, INCLUDING BUT NOT NECESSARILY LIMITED TO ACQUIRING AND IMPROVING HANGER FACILITIES THEREFOR PROVIDING FOR THE CREATION OF AN ESCROW WITH RESPECT TO THE PAYMENT, LIQUIDATION AND

DISCHARGE OF SUCH OUTSTANDING BONDS; THE INVESTMENT OF MONEYS THEREIN, THE EXECUTION OF AN ESCROW AGREEMENT PERTAINING THERETO AND THE REDEMPTION OF SUCH BONDS; PROVIDING THAT THE BONDS WILL BE PAYABLE AND COLLECTIBLE FROM THAT PORTION OF THE VILLAGE'S MUNICIPAL GROSS RECEIPTS TAX WHICH IS DEDICATED TO AIRPORT PURPOSES AS AUTHORIZED BY SECTIONS 7-19-1 THROUGH 7-19-9, NMSA 1978; PROVIDING FOR THE DISPOSITION OF THE RECEIPTS DERIVED FROM SAID TAX PROCEEDS; PRESCRIBING OTHER DETAILS CONCERNING SAID BONDS AND SAID TAX PROCEEDS, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO COVENANTS AND AGREEMENTS IN CONNECTION THEREWITH AND THE FORM, TERMS, CONDITIONS, AND MANNER OF EXECUTION OF SAID BONDS AND CONCERNING THE PROJECT, RATIFYING ACTION PREVIOUSLY TAKEN IN CONNECTION THEREWITH; REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

The following is a general summary of the subject matter contained in such Ordinance No. 93-1

Preambles recite such matters as existence of the Village; the prior issuance of the Village of Ruidoso Municipal Sales Tax Revenue Bonds, Series August 1, 1987 (herein the "1987 Bonds"), to which has been pledged the certain revenues distributed to the Village pursuant to Ordinance No. 86-8 as amended by Ordinances Nos. 86-12 and 87-4, an additional one-half of one percent Municipal Gross Receipts Tax levied on certain persons engaging in business in the Village

(the "Pledged Revenues"), and that otherwise there is no outstanding pledge of the Pledged Revenues; the Village has determined to prior redeem and refund the 1987 Bonds with the proceeds of the "Village of Ruidoso Municipal Sales Tax Refunding and Improvement Revenue Bonds with the proceeds of the "Village of Ruidoso Municipal Sales Tax Refunding and Improvement Revenue Bonds, Series January 1, 1993" ("Bonds" or "1993 Bonds"), in the aggregate principal amount of \$2,985,000 and specifying the reasons therefore; determine the need for the Improvement Project defined therein and further described herein; that the Bonds consist of the Refunding Bonds and Improvement Bonds; that the Bonds will be issued to refund, refinance, discharge and pay the 1987 Bonds on the designated prior redemption date ("Refunding Project") and for the Improvement Project as hereafter defined; that the Bonds quotes Section 3-31-6C, NMSA 1978, which prohibits the repeal or amendment of laws authorizing the pledge of revenues to pay the Bonds; declares the necessity for the Refunding Project, Improvement Project and the Bonds recites the receipt of a Bond Purchase Agreement wherein the Village agrees to sell the bonds to The Principal/Eppler, Guerin & Turner, Inc. for the principal amount thereof less discounts designated therein plus accrued interest to the date of delivery, a form of Escrow Agreement, a Preliminary Official Statement and Final Official Statement relating to the Bonds; determines that the Bonds will not be issued until the Village has received the approval of the Refunding Bonds by the New Mexico Department of Finance and Administration; and determines that the project financed by the 1987 Bonds and the Improvement Project are governmental purposes and will not cause the Bonds to be "private activity bonds" as defined by the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, and that neither the Village nor any

subordinate entity thereof reasonably expects to issue no more than \$5,000,000 of bonds and similar obligations during 1993.

Sections 1 through 4 define terms used in the ordinance, ratify previous action by officers of the Village; authorize the refunding of the 1987 Bonds ("Refunding Project") and purchasing, acquiring, constructing, making additions to, enlarging, bettering, extending, furnishing and equipping the Village's airport facilities, or any combination of the foregoing, including without limitation the acquisition and improvement of hanger facilities therefore; (herein "Improvement Project") and the issuance thereof of the Bonds, in the principal amount of \$2,985,000 payable from the Pledged Revenues.

Section 5 provides details of the bonds including but not limited to dating the bonds January 1, 1993, specifying denomination of \$5,000 or any even multiple thereof; providing that such bonds shall be registered as to both principal and interest; providing for varying rates of 3.150%, 3.700%, 4.200%, 4.500%, 4.800%, 5.100%, 5.350%, 5.500%, 5.600%, 5.750%, 5.850%, 6.000%, 6.250% and 6.625%, per annum for the maturity of the bonds payable August 1, 1993 and February 1 and August 1 of each year thereafter, the place and manner of payment of principal and interest of the Bonds including provisions for payment of interest on the Regular Record Date and Special Record Date; provide that the Bonds shall mature in varying amounts on August 1, 1993 through August 1, 2012, and provide for continuation of interest upon nonpayment of principal at maturity.

Section 6 through 14 provide terms and conditions of prior redemption and mandatory sinking fund redemption; that the Bonds are negotiable instruments under the Uniform Commercial Code and are

special obligation payable solely from the Pledged Revenues; provide for the manner of execution and authentication of the Bonds; provisions relating to registration, transfer, exchange, replacement and cancellation of, and Registration records for the bonds (i.e., registration books), transfer and exchange, authentication, times when transfer and exchange not required, payment to registered owners, replacement bonds, delivery of bond certificates to registrar and cancellation of bonds; successor registrar or paying agent; further provide for the form of the bonds, certificate of authentication, assignment and legal opinion certificate; and declare the Bonds to be qualified tax exempt obligations under Section 265(B)(3)(b) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, and determine the period of usefulness of the Improvement Project being acquired with Bond proceeds.

Sections 15 through 21 provide for the execution and delivery of the Bonds and initial registration; for disposition of proceeds of the Bonds into several funds and obligations in connection therewith, including but not limited to an Escrow Account for the 1987 Bonds, Bond Fund Reserve Fund for the Bonds; for the administration of all funds and special accounts created by the ordinance; the places and times of the deposits in the funds and accounts; and that the Bonds constitute an irrevocable and first lien (but not exclusively first lien) on the Pledged Revenues.

Sections 22 through 25 set out the terms and conditions under which parity lien obligations may be issued, prohibit the issuance of obligations having a superior lien, permit the issuance of obligations having a subordinate lien, set forth the terms and obligations relative to refunding obligations and provide for equally among the Bonds in the application of the Pledged Revenues.

Section 26 provides

protective covenants whereby the Village covenants with each registered owner for the protection of such registered owners covering such matters as prompt payment of Bond principal and interest, records, audits, extending interest payments, performing duties, other liens on Pledged Revenues, duty with respect to amount of Pledged Revenues, continuity of the Village's existence, no impairment of contract, and a tax covenant.

Sections 27 through 39 set forth defeasance provisions; delegate certain powers to Village officers; describe events of default; provide for remedies and duties upon default; provide for a method of enforcing the ordinance; provide separability and repealer clauses; provide for the amendment of the ordinance; provide for prior redemption of the 1987 Bonds and a form of notice thereof; provide an repealability clause and provide for an emergency and effective date and a summary for publication.

Just the facts, ma'am, nothing but the facts

On Monday, January 11, 1993, the citizens of Ruidoso were invited by the Ruidoso Village Council to a Town Hall meeting to talk about downtown transportation.

What's so strange about this event?

Perhaps nothing, except for the fact that Town Hall meetings are generally planned by the local citizens who want to express their views and complaints on several subjects.

This was a single subject on transportation, dictated by a council decision which, in this case was the result of a council unable to decide whether to spend taxpayers' money for a feasibility study on a transportation issue.

This issue was fully discussed in previous council meetings. It was a simple case of buck passing, a play for time.

The Town Hall meeting, the first in almost nine years, was well conducted, attended by a respectable but not overflowing crowd, and, in the end, an obvious conclusion was reached.

No one objects to downtown transportation, just DON'T SUBSIDIZE THE PLAN WITH TAX MONEY.

Of the many speakers the majority favored the "no tax" approach.

Ruidoso Village Councilor Ron Andrews approached the idea of a group of investors combining to plan and to finance downtown transportation with no tax assistance.

The council, in its regular meeting on January 12, did not discuss the Town Hall meeting or the results of that meeting. I would suggest that the council give the Andrews plan consideration and backing.

The citizens of Ruidoso have shown a lethargic lack of interest in the political affairs of their village. This state of lack of interest has been evident much too long.

To wait nine years for a meeting to discuss the matter of downtown transportation while the city strains in the throes of a straight-jacket brought about over much more serious problems is incredible.

Except for an occasional comment before the council, with a polite nod and no visible action, no one seriously questions the village administration on problems deemed much more important than the transportation question.

I mean pocketbook items, waste of taxpayers money, poor municipal services, decline of infrastructure maintenance — and on and on.

TO BE SPECIFIC

Councils are quick to spend tax money on feasibility studies which, in most cases, are simply stall practices for those unable to make decisions and need more time. The results are often no more than a confirmation of facts already known.

Consider this. The Ruidoso Village Council voted recently to offer Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC) \$452,000 for land of an undetermined acreage at the Grindstone Dam area.

The decision was made in a closed session with instructions to the village manager, in an open session, to make an offer.

This was reported in The Ruidoso News on December 17. I addressed a letter to the administration on December 21 objecting to the offer made, along with reasons and suggestions dealing with the village's apparent need for additional land to improve recreation and water storage capabilities.

There are flaws in the offer which should be addressed and which would have been made if the plan to buy the dam property had been fully addressed in the open public discussion.

It is doubtful that the Department of Finance and Administration will go along with the plan as presented.

And this!

Water users in Ruidoso have been over-charged since the emergency water rate increase of 1981-82. Water rates and water service were to increase from 50 percent to 600 percent. These were TEMPORARY RATES made with the promise to the public that rates would be studied annually with reductions made after the emergency was over.

Councils following 1984 have constantly refused to make good on the promise to study water rates annually.

So, in 1991, after making many oral requests, I made two written requests to the administration and council. I received neither an answer nor an acknowledgment. I made two written requests in 1992, requesting a water study be made.

When you consider that the 1981-82 rate increase pumped multiple millions of dollars of revenue into the water revenues, it is small wonder that no council wants this fact questioned.

The recent statement by the village manager that the village has a surplus of \$847,000 for the purpose of the Grindstone property lends credence to the claim that excess water

rates are yet pumping large sums into the water account over and above the regular rates normally collected.

And this.

When two or more coffee drinkers get together, more times than not, the condition of our streets is the main topic of conversation.

For more than five years our streets have deteriorated to a point of almost no return. The continual repair of potholes and worn out areas is so poorly done that it is a no-win process with no end in sight.

An example. About two years ago the paved area in front of the Ruidoso Post Office was replaced by our street department. As late as last month, the paving job was repeated for the third time with additional repairs made last week. Pot holes at that location are evident as of today.

It is apparent now as for the past several years that the street department has not learned paving techniques evident in towns and cities all around us.

This is an administration to solve, not ignore. The way we pave our streets has remained unchanged through three village managers. Nothing has changed in how we pave our streets.

The taxpayers of Ruidoso have much more to worry about than downtown transportation.

Why not conduct a number of Town Hall meetings and ask the administration and council to explain the facts and failures of the village operation and to recognize the more important matters dealing with the pocket books and well being of the taxpayers?

The time is passing when the taxpayers' obligation stops at the ballot box. Taking an interest in the operations of the village to see that good service is provided at reasonable cost is equally important.

It is time to stand up and smell the flowers.

EDITOR'S NOTE: Al Junge was a village councilor from 1982 to 1984 when the entire council was recalled after residents voted to restructure the council from four to six members. Junge was again elected for the 1988 to 1992 term, but resigned July 30, 1991, after falling twice to get the administration and the council to make an annual water study. Junge said his council in 1982-84 had made the promise of an annual water study and if he couldn't keep that promise, there was nothing to do but resign. At his final meeting, he received a key to the city, the only key to the city every given by the village.






