Skiers go too far, get booted

Four individuals won't ski this year, at least not at Ski Apache.

Saturday afternoon, three men and one woman skied out of bounds past boundary ropes. They were spotted immediately and apprehended by ski patrol members who escorted them off premises.

The four, whose names were not released, were all adults from the Las Cruces area, said ski area spokespersons.

Skiing past closure ropes into out of bounds areas violates federal law. Signs advise this fact throughout the ski area. Violators become subject to a fine as well as loss of skiing privileges.

"This is the standard in the west for a skier who gets out of bounds," said Roy Parker, Ski Apache's general manager.

Ski ropes are not put up arbitrarily.

"Several dangers exist out of bounds," said Parker. "First, it's unpatrolled. If skiers go there, we don't know it. If they become injured, it's difficult to get rescue personnel and equipment to them. Plus, evacuating them out, injured or not, may prove difficult and dangerous.

"Second, we don't know whether they're lost or not, and so start searches that often extend until dark. This imposes a danger and inconvenience to rescuers.

"Third, some out of bounds areas are avalanche-prone.


For all those reasons, out of bounds skiing is against the law. We do not put up closure ropes to inconvenience skiers, but do it for their own safety."

County road boss lays out costly 5-year plan

Lincoln County Commissioners peeked at the future Wednesday and it was spelled "M-O-N-E-Y."

Road manager Bill Cupit opened the pages of his five-year project book for his bosses and it was packed with repair and maintenance needs across the county.

In addition to 48 requests for work on school bus routes, Cupit detailed his plans for installation of cattle guards, to replace bridges, to place low water crossings, to pave and chip seal roads and to apply base course of caliche.

Cupit said he met with each school bus driver in the county to hear their complaints. He ended up with 26 requests for improvements on non-county roads and 22 on county roads.

"It's a big task," Cupit said. "Actually, it's astronomical. I'll start with the first and work until I'm finished."

Now that he has a starting point, Cupit should set a particular date by which the schools must each year request continued maintenance or a road's coverage will sunset, Commissioner Stirling Spencer suggested.

"That puts the ball in their court to meet with you or not get what they want until the following year."

"I think we need to wait until 90 days after the start of school when they know where the students are and where the muddy roads are," Cupit said.

He asked for direction from the commissioners on how to rank bus routes in importance.

"Isn't it your job to establish priorities?" Commissioner L. Ray Nunley asked.

"Yes sir, and these are," Cupit responded, waving the list in the air. "But it's got to be in black and white so I don't get a call from a commissioner (diverting him to another project). Let me get it done first and then I'll work other projects in."

"You set the priorities and run the department," Commission Chairman Monroy Montes said. "If we get to the point that we can't live with it, we'll let you know."

Cupit said in establishing his priorities for state cost-sharing projects, he listed the worst to the best without political consideration.

"I shouldn't be involved in politics," he said.

He also reviewed accomplishments in the road department since he took over nearly two years ago.

"Some areas I'm extremely proud of," Cupit said. "We were in the dark ages. The paperwork and records were terrible. How can you know what you have if there is no record?"

He credited the addition of a secretary for the department with fixing that situation.

"I want it to be like my own business and that's how I treat it. I try to satisfy the customer/taxpayer. I have paid for my wages for the next 10 years alone in savings the first

two years," Cupit said.

He actively looks for efficient and effective ways to save. He doesn't just sit back and wait for something to drop into his lap, he said.

The top project proposed by Cupit was the widening and surface improvement of 3.9 miles of Airport Road to Fort Stanton. Depending on the type of surface, the cost

Council considers smoking policies

Smoking, drinking and partying are all topics of discussion Tuesday for the Ruidoso Village Council meeting.

Authorization to draft an ordinance prohibiting smoking in public places is Item Seven in an eight-item regular agenda that begins at 6:30 p.m.

The council will also discuss approval to apply for a liquor license to be used at the Ruidoso Civic Events Center.

Village attorney Patricia Ortiz wrote the mayor that no record could be found of the council approving a governmental liquor license and does the council want to apply for such a license.

Ortiz said a decision needs to be made whether the license will be operated by employees of the village or by a lessee-operator.

Smokey Stover, village parks and recreation chairman, requested

council time to discuss and recommend consideration of Camp Prickly Pear's proposal to operate a camp facility and other public recreational facilities in either Wingfield Park or Grindstone Lake recreational area.

Stover said the concessionaire proposal, also known as the Amarillo proposal, is similar to one already discussed before the council several times.

The contract calls for the village to lease its parks to a concessionaire and the concessionaire to pay the village 10 percent of its gross receipts.

The council will also hear a report on Monitored Retrieval Storage by the village advisory committee.

Other board items will include: —A review of the 1991-1992 fiscal year audit.

—Discussion of road

MainStreet improvements on schedule

The MainStreet Ruidoso streetscape improvement project is right on schedule but paperwork is still left to be done before actual construction begins.

MainStreet project director Don Miller reported to the board of directors Thursday he still has six work permits to be signed by property owners to allow construction on their property. He said of the six, three are from in town and three are out of town owners, but he was to meet with two of those on Friday.

Miller said he feels confident that they will be able to get the permits signed, but it takes time to sit down with the people and go over the plans.

The group needs to have all of the permits signed by January 29

before Miller and project consultant Mary Maul meet with state and federal highway officials at a Plans, Specifications and Estimates meeting that day in Santa Fe. Before that date the village council is expected to approve joint powers agreements between itself and the state and federal highway departments.

If the plan is approved by these officials on January 29, the next step would be to take it before the village council for approval to go out for bids for the construction. They could probably open bids at the beginning of March and in about a week award it to begin construction the first of April.

Director Tom Rigsby asked what would happen if they can't get the remaining six permits signed. Miller said it is his understanding that those owners won't get any work

done in front of their property, but he does not believe that will happen.

Miller said the Ruidoso Village Council recently adopted a resolution to request the legislature approve \$1,580,000 to do the engineering plans, management and construction for phases two and three, which will cover Fern Street to Mechem Drive and Country Club Drive to Carter's Lane.

The reason for the large amount is that these phases will require \$50,000 for a storm water drainage study. He said in order to use federal funds they need to study and solve the problems of drainage in those areas.

The group had hoped to have some funds left over from the phase one state and federal allocations, but it is not likely they will. Miller said part of the cost of phase one

was that the project used federal funds, which made it necessary to do environmental studies.

Director Audean Franklin and village liaison J.D. James said the engineers should have known when they did their estimated cost that they would have to do this. Miller said at the time the engineers, Bohannon-Huston Inc., did not know they would be using federal funds.

He said deputy village manager Alan Briley is working with the group to review the costs and they are all justified. Village engineer John Shaw has also been consulted during this process.

MainStreet Ruidoso is moving on in its other projects, too. Miller said the group's market survey is going well, and he was to meet with

News stories anger Mayor Alonso and village manager

Recent articles by **The Ruidoso News** over the village's purchasing practices sparked ire by both Ruidoso Mayor Victor Alonso and village manager Ron Wicker.

After discovering a street department yard littered with items purchased at government surplus auctions, **The News** also brought to light questions regarding trades and accountability.

The mayor, after spending Thursday morning with Wicker, visited **The News'** publisher Sammy Lopez to complain about the articles he said were pointed at the village manager.

Since the articles appeared, the village council has not conducted any open meetings about them.

Key areas of the articles dealt with trading village equipment to employees with the village manager's blessing and by-passing state

designated procedures, purchasing surplus items with questionable merit and failing to inventory items acquired.

Lopez said it was the newspaper's responsibility to point out problem areas in any transactions involving taxpayers' dollars.

The mayor told Lopez that the newspaper should look into past auction practices by the village.

Wicker called Frankie Jarrell, editor of **The News**, to complain about Thursday's news coverage of the village's radio department, which he personally supervises.

He said he and Virgil Reynolds did not go to Albuquerque to pick up donated items for the radio department as **The News** reported Reynolds said. He also said he objected to being identified as a ham radio operator, his hobby. He contended **The News** misquoted him after using an exact and accurate

quote on the same subject in another story. Jarrell pointed out that the second reference was a paraphrase, not a quote.

Contacting fire chief Virgil Reynolds about the Albuquerque trip, he told **The News** that there had been a misunderstanding. He said he had talked with Wicker about the incident.

He said he had been to two auctions in Alamogordo, but didn't participate in the auctions.

He said he had gone to Albuquerque with Chet Southard, Wicker's part-time radio maintenance employee and full-time fire department employee.

Reynolds said that they had picked up some radio equipment and air-tight cabinets donated to the village by the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

Reynolds said the items were returned to Ruidoso and stored in a

building behind the Water Department.

Reynolds said he did not know why the equipment wasn't stored at the Radio Maintenance Department, but he did know they were stored.

Water Department manager Richard Sanchez said there was no radio equipment or cabinets stored in his building, but pointed to a locked building maintenance department storage shed. He said that room was used in the past to house tools when building inspector Larry Hill worked as the village's only building maintenance employee.

Past village budgets show that radio equipment was charged off to building maintenance, but at some point was changed to the radio equipment department.

Attempts to locate Southard, Hill or Wicker for further comment failed.

Before noon, Friday, **The News** called up the village's finance department to ask for the 1988 budget and was told that particular budget was not available because a different accounting system was used at the time. The request would require research.

Under a new rule imposed by the village administration, the newspaper will be required to pay for any information it requests.

Wicker already has instructed several department heads, including purchasing and finance, to contact him any time **The News** asks them questions.

Last Friday morning, **The News** asked Wicker if the lawsuit had been settled against the village by the family of a victim who drowned at the corner of Hull and Paradise Canyon Road in 1988.

The News had assisted the village lawyer by providing free pic-

tures of the accident area. Wicker said he couldn't say if it had been settled or not and that it would have to be researched.

Then Wicker handed **The News** a memo, stating the village's right to place a charge for the time required by a village employee to perform research and for the cost of any copies.

Apparently, enforcement of the rule of charging for research varies according to subject matter.

Alonso had asked the newspaper to look at past budgets for a history of prior auctions. When **The News** called for that information, finance director Leeann Boswell suggested getting an estimate on the research cost.

The News declined at that point, but less than an hour later, Boswell called to offer an abbreviated computer version of the 1988 budget.

An intoxicated 15-year-old high school student allegedly jumped a student, slugged the school's principal in the jaw and then later had to be subdued during three separate altercations last Friday.

The student, Brian Dolan, was charged with assault on a school official (battery), damage to property, allowing self to be served and disorderly conduct.

No one was able to determine any reason for Dolan's outbursts.

Ruidoso High School officials called police after Dolan, a student living in Mescalero, became embroiled in a fight with principal Donny Weems, in the principals office.

Weems said the student, about 5-foot, 6-inches and 110 pounds, earlier scuffled in the hallway with

one student before entering his afternoon class under Galen Farrington.

Sometime during that class Dolan allegedly jumped another student and had to be restrained by Farrington.

Weems said Farrington brought Dolan to assistant principal Danny Flores' office where the student scuffled with Flores.

As Flores was calling Dolan's mother, Weems said he walked by and took the youth into his office, when Dolan apparently attacked Weems and hit him in the jaw.

On arrival, police officer Robert Achterberg met with assistant principal Danny Flores who advised that the student was highly intoxicated and had attempted to strike both Weems and himself.

Officer Achterberg said he was told the student was calm at the

time and the officials asked if the police would wait until Nancy Dolan, his mother, had a chance to talk with her son.

Achterberg said Mrs. Dolan arrived about 10 minutes later and entered Weems' office.

Achterberg said they could hear Dolan yelling and cursing, but still under control.

"About two minutes later things began to crash and we heard glass break," Achterberg wrote. "At that point, officer (Jim) Biggs and myself entered the principal's office and did attempt to control the student by taking him into custody."

The police wrestled Dolan to the floor and handcuffed him.

"During the whole incident, he did threaten to kill people and was cursing," Achterberg said.

Dolan was then taken to the

Ruidoso Police Department and later transported to the juvenile detention facility in Alamogordo.

Achterberg said that while at the Ruidoso police station, Dolan continued to curse and make death threats.

He said his mother was present during the whole incident and attempted to calm her son, but he would not listen.

Dolan's mother, after a brief discussion, allowed the police to transport her son to the center in Alamogordo.

Police said Flores reported damage to his watch and there were items damaged in Weems' office.

Achterberg said Weems complained of a sore jaw from a punch and that he was generally sore from the tussle.

Lock's out

The contract of Capitan school district superintendent David Lock was not renewed by the School Board in a special session last Thursday.

In a brief meeting that lasted only a few minutes, the board voted unanimously not to renew on a motion offered by member Preston Stone.

Some dissatisfaction with Lock's style of management had been expressed by Stone in reference to a few incidents that occurred in the last two years since he came on board. However, the unanimous vote against his contract renewal came as a surprise to several officials associated with the school district.

the executive directors of the Economic Development Corporation of Lincoln County and the Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce to finalize the surveys. He said they have created three surveys to send out.

One will go to visitors from a list developed from the chamber's list of inquiries and from lodgers' registration. A survey for locals will be sent out based on a list from public records, such as voters registration and water meter hook-ups. A business survey will be sent to most businesses with permits.

Miller said the information they get back will tell what the community and MainStreet needs to be doing for the future, so it is important they get as good a response as possible.

When he meets with the EDCLC and chamber they will discuss how to offer incentives or prizes for the people to return these surveys. Because the groups don't necessarily want the people to identify them-

selves on the survey, the responding person may need to send in a separate postcard to register for the prizes.

Miller received the board's approval to spend up to \$1,000 for prizes, but he will also see if the EDCLC and chamber will contribute some funds for the prizes too. The \$1,000 would come from next year's budget, he said.

Franklin and James both voted against the request because they said the two other groups will benefit as much from the survey as MainStreet, so each should pay a share. James was also opposed to the idea of spending money from next year's budget.

In other business, Miller reported he and president Alden Deyo attended the second meeting of the village's parking advisory board. The committee has been doing an off-street parking inventory of the phase one streetscape improvement.

The advisory board is still taking the approach of cooperative or shared parking lots and Miller said

his next step is to take pictures of the possible parking areas. Deputy village manager Briley will then be able to give a cost estimate to bring the areas up to code and do the lighting.

Although the details have not been worked out, one possibility is that the property owner would agree to a parking easement with the village, and the village would put an all-weather gravel surface on it. MainStreet would then maintain the parking areas, doing such things as snow removal.

In addition, the village has a contract with the highway department to maintain the downtown area, but MainStreet could take that responsibility on as a common area maintenance program (CAM). Miller reminded the group it had

talked about the concept at the last board meeting, and it would include snow removal on sidewalks and removal of trash.

Director Bill Carrigan asked Miller if he had much of a feeling from the businesses on doing such a project.

road and improvements to the Lincoln County Fairgrounds (in Capitan).

"We're fog sealing the road without asking the village for any financial help."

"We need to fog seal this year," Cupit said. "It fell apart faster than I expected with the cold, wet, w.c.m. cold weather changes. The tire chains tore it up faster. We should do it this year, but I don't have any money, so it will have to be next year with some state money."

"Since I've been here, the county has maintained the road, because we're not going to let anybody get hurt."

Over the next five years, he sees a need for 136 cattleguards to be installed, Cupit said. Using a smaller width guard on the predominantly

"The county gave two priorities to our legislative delegation, this underized roads in the county, he will be able to reduce the cost from \$4,284 each to \$1,900 each.

"We can't have the best, but they're sufficient," he said.

He estimated a total of \$244,800 at a cost of \$61,200 a year over four years. The county contains about 300 cattleguards. He installed 47 last year, Cupit said.

"I did \$150,000 in cattleguards this year," Cupit said. "They're caving in right and left. A lot of them were put in 45 years ago."

The guards he's installing now could last as long as 30 years, depending on the conditions and level of use.

Cupit proposed replacing nine bridges with culverts at a cost of \$14,000 each or \$126,000 over the next five years. Topping his list is the White Oaks School bridge, which was scheduled to be removed last week, the Barbers Loop bridge and the Transwestern bridge.

"They're scattered all over the county," Cupit said. Some of the bridges are 50 years old. Guard rails are not part of the projects.

Fifteen low water crossings are

planned for installation, some will replace existing structures. The cost is estimated at \$15,000 each for a total of \$225,000 over the next five years.

The top six on the list are Alamo Canyon Road, O-Bar-O Road, Arabela South Base Road, Corn's Road, Skeen's Road and Salazar Canyon.

Commissioner Wilton Howell suggested Cupit install markers noting the depth of water at the crossings to alert drivers when they should not attempt to travel through an area.

"I set the priorities by how many times I have been out there repairing it," Cupit said. "But I may find myself somewhere doing repairs and since I'm already there, I'll just fix it at the time."

Under roads proposed for paving and chip sealing, Cupit detailed 11, although he noted the only way chip and seal will work is with good annual maintenance.

No cost estimate was offered.

Miller said he has found that people are more than willing for MainStreet to do the CAM program for a fee. Businesses also know this is a pedestrian district and will especially be one when the streetscape improvements are made. It brings in more walking, impulse buyers and so businesses are more willing to open up their parking lots.

Miller now needs to collect all the information and details on costs and will make sure the concept is ironed out.

President Deyo said the parking lot proposal was made several years ago but it fell by the wayside because none of the details were ever determined.

Director Madeline Shackelford said she thought businesses would want to do it knowing it would be resurfaced and that they would get it back at the end of the easement period.

The group asked Miller to work out the details of the project to have the information to take before the village council.

The roads proposed for work included the 26-foot wide Airport Road-D004 to fog seal 7.3 miles and the 24-foot wide Cedar Creek Road to single chip seal resurface 3.2 miles. The other roads targeted for work were one mile of High Mesa Road, 1.80 miles of Deer Park Drive, 3.7 miles of Cora Dutton Road-C017, 4.45 miles of Old Fort Stanton Road-D002-D008, 1.03 miles of Agua Fria Road, .35 miles on Palo Verde Road and .88 miles in Fawn Ridge outside Ruidoso.

Six roads are scheduled to receive base course and caliche. They are Dump Road in Capitan, which will be widened, culverts and shoulders added; five miles of Transwestern Road-B007 to be widened; resurface 3.60 miles of Aneho to Luria Road; 1.7 miles of Long Road in Mesa Verde Subdivision, widened; resurface three miles of Salazar Canyon-C002; and resurface with caliche four miles of Fort Lone Tree Road-C006.

In other road-related issues, the

In board membership discussion, Deyo recommended Stan Cape to replace former director Tracy Hymer, and the board approved the recommendation. Hymer has not been active on the board for the past year and her term was to end in March 1994.

Deyo said it was suggested by Maul, when she was project director, to reduce the number of directors and so they hadn't replaced some that had resigned from the board. The by-laws state that the group has 13 directors and a liaison from the village, Deyo said.

A replacement has not been found for Mike Line, who resigned in December.

Director Shackelford also submitted her resignation from the board. She said she was resigning because she will be out of town traveling and wouldn't be able to put in the time necessary to do a good job. She said she would be willing to help Miller with projects when she is in town.

Jacqueline Bentley's, Don Dutton's, Bonnie Mattox's and Tom

Rigsby's terms will also be running out in March, although the directors can continue to serve if they express their interest in doing it.

Miller said he is developing a packet of information that will help potential board directors understand what to expect. He said he needs a board that can do more than come to meetings once a month and will volunteer to help accomplish projects.

If any directors have suggestions of people to fill the resigned positions, they can contact Miller and he will approach the people.

The board approved a nominating committee with Carrigan as chairperson, James and Bert Brunell to make selections to replace out-going directors.

A performance evaluation committee for Miller was also approved with Mattox as chair, and Tom Battin, Franklin, Carrigan and James serving.

Absent from the meeting Thursday were Bentley, Dutton, Walter Merchant and Peggy Wash. Battin had called Miller to report that he would not be able to attend.

commission:

—reviewed the proposed state cooperative project for 1993-94, in which the state pays 60 percent up to \$62,534. Cupit has suggested 2.25 miles of Dump Road, with the county providing its 40 percent as in-kind labor.

—selected 1.25 miles of Sun Valley Drive in Alto as the state financed school bus route project for the year, with the state paying up to \$45,731.

Cupit said he would rather see the road given an asphalt surface than chip and seal, but the cost would be prohibitive.

Commissioners said about the only way it could be accomplished would be if property owners agreed to an abatement.

—reviewed Cupit's proposed list of projects for the state's CAP program under which the state pays 75 percent up to \$195,110.

As with the other state participation programs, he pulled out several projects from his priority lists. They are to chip and seal 2.3

miles of Cedar Creek Road for \$84,848; to fog seal and restripe 7.3 miles of Airport Road-D004 for \$29,000; to replace a bridge on Barber's Loop-E009 for \$14,000; to replace a bridge on Transwestern-B007 for \$14,000; to install three low water crossings on Alamo Canyon Road-E024 at \$15,000 each; and to install a low water crossing on O-Bar-O-A010 for \$15,000.

—agreed to delete a clause from a resolution setting the procedure for road review. Cupit said he is more qualified than members of the road review committee to make a decision on whether a road can be maintained by the county.

"I think that's out of their realm," he said. "I go can around myself and make the decision."

"We don't need any more bureaucracy. It wasn't suppose to be in the resolution. It should be left to the discretion of the road manager. I recommend it be deleted."

Wynham said he would redraft the resolution.

Hop in a Softub for fun and relaxation

It takes about an hour to set the Softub up and make sure the water will accept the necessary chemicals, he said.

Tomison said it takes about 24 hours for the water to heat up, but the thermometer can then be set to keep the tub continuously warm and ready to go. The heater will kick on when the water gets to that temperature, but it doesn't make much noise, he said.

The cost of keeping it warm is also inexpensive. Tomison said his customers have confirmed to him that it can cost less than \$10 a month.

Tomison said part of the reason it is so economical is that it uses the heat from the water pump to keep it warm. The tub also holds the heat in well because of a bonding process used on the polyolefin foam.

The foam substance also makes the spa lightweight and portable. Tomison said it goes through doorways easily, and it doesn't take a crew to move. People can place these inside, outside, on decks, basements or even in lofts. If they

decide it should be some place else, it isn't a hassle to move.

Maintenance on the Softub is also simple and easy. With the purchase of a Softub, the customer gets a free starter kit to get them going. Tomison said Softcare products are not as harsh as those used in regular spas.

Sierra Spas has four of the 31 rainbow of colors available in the store, while the rest can be ordered and delivered in a week to 10 days, which is usually quicker than a regular spa can be installed. Colors in the store are black, light gray, tan and burgundy, but customers can choose from yellows, blues, greens, red or orange among other colors.

Tomison said if a person decides to redecorate or moves the Softub the colored cover comes off easily and the person can purchase a new one. He said the covers are made of a tough indoor-outdoor vinyl, and the liner is the same material used in outdoor swimming pools.

The vinyl covering is also less slippery than a regular spa covering, so accidents are less likely to occur. The walls and floor aren't as hard and wouldn't be as dangerous if someone were to fall against it.

Besides the convenience of the Softub, Tomison said the spa is good for hydrotherapy for back pain, sore muscles or rheumatism, although it won't cure the problem. He said Softub owners can get a booklet showing exercises that a user can do to help.

It's a great stress reliever, and Tomison can attest to that. He said after a long day of working, he likes to get in a Softub for awhile to relax. Some may make it a daily ritual, while others wait to use it for special occasions.

Other Softub products for sale at the store include a line of practical and fun items. He has everything from a rubber duck to a floating chess board and drink holder. A

Softub catalog at the store will show all the choices a customer has.

Tomison said they plan to add lawn and patio furniture to their stock at the store in the future.

Keith Sitten is the Softub distributor for this area and is factory trained to service any problems the tub may have.

The cost of the Softub is more than comparable to other spas, starting at a little more than \$2,000, and Sierra Spas has financing plans available, Tomison said. The Softub is also covered by a five-year warranty.

The Softub has been out for more than five years, but Tomison said it still gets some funny looks when people come into the showroom.

Lujan nixes video gaming for Mescalero

As perhaps his last official act, former Interior Secretary Manuel Lujan Jr. nixed video gambling on the Mescalero Apache Indian reservation.

According to Associated Press reports, Lujan said he denied for procedural reasons the Mescalero Apache request that he approve video gambling on the reservation.

"The law doesn't call for a direct compact between the department and the tribe without certain steps being taken, and those were not taken," Lujan was quoted as saying.

He went on to say he's not opposed to gambling, and believes it's a legitimate economic tool for Indians. Still, Lujan said he couldn't do what the tribe had asked him to do.

AP said some Interior officials speculated that the tribe's request was an indication the tribal government was following an administrative step while considering a lawsuit to force the Interior Department or the state of New Mexico to allow it to continue to operate video gambling machines.

Interior spokesman Bob Walker said Lujan turned down the request after receiving a legal opinion from department lawyers, continued the report.

"The department solicitor found that the secretary couldn't impose a gambling compact on a state," Walker was quoted as saying. "That's not to say the new (Clinton) administration will agree with that interpretation."

U.S. District Judge John Conway ruled last month that tribes couldn't force the state into negotiations on gambling. Judge Conway also said federal law didn't allow tribes to sue states for enforcement of the act.

The ruling followed the filing of lawsuits against the state by the Mescaleros and Sanilla Pueblo. Both tribes have sought to persuade Governor Bruce King to sign negotiated gambling compacts.

King has consistently opposed any expansion of gambling. He has said the issue should be put to a statewide vote.

U.S. Attorney Don Svet reportedly said he is informing tribes of his position that video gambling machines cannot operate without King's consent.

He said he has a plan of action, but wouldn't reveal what it entails.

Meanwhile, a successful video gambling operation continues at the Inn of the Mountain Gods.

State Representative John Underwood, who pushed a bill to extend gambling into the Ruidoso area during last year's legislative session, said he has no plans to introduce such legislation this year.

The AP reported that the Interior Department did publish in the Federal Register an ordinance the Mescalero Tribal Council passed authorizing tribal President Wendell Chino to meet with the secretary to seek Class III gambling approval and to form non-profit organizations.

Accidental discovery may end obesity

WASHINGTON—Researchers may have discovered a way to end obesity—by accident!

In a study with a potential cholesterol lowering agent, scientists noted an unusual side effect. Instead of lower cholesterol levels, patients receiving a natural plant colloid lost weight while body weight in a control group remained constant.

The scientists say the mechanism behind the weight loss is not clear, but suggest it is partially due to a decrease in the intestinal absorption of calories. Scientists in another study published in the *British Journal of Nutrition*, found that patients consuming the same colloid lost weight in spite of being instructed not to alter normal eating patterns. Despite this evidence, other scientists may not agree on the weight loss benefits of colloids. Someday, pending further study, there could be universal agreement that colloids are helpful in confronting the problem of obesity.

National Dietary Research, whose research topics have been the subject of articles published in recent medical and nutritional journals, has successfully incorporated a series of colloids into a chewable food tablet called FS-1. When used as directed, FS-1 replaces high calorie fats with lower calorie nutrients, thus providing optimum nutrition with a minimum number of fat calories. According to an article published in the *American Journal of Clinical Nutrition*, consciously limiting the amount of food one consumes is not necessary to lose weight, provided you limit the fat.

Housing rehab project frustrates county commissioners

Trying to move a housing rehabilitation project into a construction phase has proven to be a tough experience, Lincoln County Commission Chairman Morray Montes said Wednesday.

"It's been the slowest, most frustrating thing I've dealt with," Montes said of the \$250,000 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program. "If I had my druthers, we would have been in construction last June."

"But lately, they have been moving along at a better pace. We will have to ask for an extension, which isn't unusual. It should be the exception. We were to be finished in February."

"It's been the slowest, most frustrating thing I've dealt with."

The supervisor was scheduled to walk through the final 10-14 houses last Thursday. During the tour, the extent of possible repairs is determined and contractors are given a chance to compile their cost estimates.

"It's a very valuable program, but the bureaucracy is very difficult," said county manager Andy Wynham. "We have no program in Lincoln County to deal with substandard housing. Going on the tours really brought home the need. The delay is not going to impact the county going for additional money this year."

Montes said one of the problems with the program is the \$10,000 cap per house.

"The contractors eat half of that up," he said. "I think \$15,000 is more realistic."

He recently attended a meeting on the grant program in Roswell and I think we'll see some changes," Montes said.

In connection with the grant, commissioners agreed to advertise a public hearing for the proposed repeal of the county's existing fair housing ordinance and the adoption of a new ordinance.

Commissioners also followed Wynham's advice and adopted Robert's Rules of Order with provisions that allow chairman Montes to vote and specifically state that technical violations of the rules will not invalidate action taken by the board, if members are in harmony on the issue.

"The chairman is an elected official from a specific area of the county and needs to participate in decisions accordingly," Wynham said.

"Are you going to be our parliamentarian, if we adopt this?" asked Commissioner L. Ray Nun-

ley. "If you promise not to shoot the messenger," Wynham quipped. "If we adopt this, does that mean I can't abstain anymore," asked

Commissioner William Schwettmann, who declined to cast a vote on a controversial issue at his first meeting earlier this month. "What if I leave?"

"That's a technique used well by state legislators," Wynham said.

In other business, the commission heard from road manager Bill Cupit that he now can trace road-

work performed during the year through a computer program. If someone wants to know how much work their road has seen and the associated cost, the information can be provided.

Lady Warriors earn first basketball win from Oñate

The Lady Warrior basketball team is holding its own against tough district competition and now has a 2-2 record after the weekend in action.

On Saturday, in the Warrior gym, the girls varsity team made history.

For the first time in the years since Oñate was formed, the Lady Warriors defeated the Knights in girls basketball by a score of 54-38. Coach Dennis Davis said he didn't tell the girls about the record before the game, but they were all happy to learn of their achievement after the game.

The squad traveled to Socorro on Friday to take on the third place team in the state for AAA basketball. The Socorro team had a record of 7-6 before going into that night's game. The Warriors lost 39-53.

In Socorro, the first quarter looked good for Ruidoso as the girls took a 16-9 lead. The team had no turnovers and had some easy shots to go up by eight or nine points, but in the second quarter Socorro finally pulled its act together under the leadership of junior Cassandra Anaya, who scored 26 points.

By halftime the blue and gold was down 20-25 after a few mental mistakes and missed shots. In the third quarter the group made a comeback but couldn't make a serious run at Socorro.

Coach Davis said the Lady Warriors shot about 43 percent, which isn't great but was better than they had been doing. They also had 23 turnovers, which was a reduction from past games. Many of the lost

balls came in a couple spurts where Socorro got the ball three or four times in a row, allowing them to score unanswered points.

The turnovers may well have been the difference in the game because otherwise the defense was playing pretty well, Davis said. Anaya also made a big difference in the final score, and if it hadn't been for her Ruidoso would have a good chance of winning.

Davis said he is still pleased with the way the girls played against a strong ranked team. He said they knew it would be tough to play there, but the girls had Socorro scared after the first quarter.

"We feel we are going to be able to be competitive in our district from the way we played with Socorro," he said.

Sarah Dix led the Lady Warriors in scoring with 16 and in rebounding with 10. Cicelee Makowski also pumped in 10 points and pulled in five rebounds. Mandy Parker scored seven points and earned six rebounds. Michelle Morris scored four points, and Kim Floyd made two.

The Socorro junior varsity came out aggressive and pressed the ball to defeat Ruidoso, 37-70. The Lady Warriors scored half as many points in the first half as Socorro, but came back in the third quarter to score 19 to Socorro's 22.

Davis said the girls never gave up, and as they started catching up Socorro had to go back to the press to maintain its lead.

The top scorer for the team was

Megan Kumler, with 13 points. Lindsay Willard and Tina Barnes each picked up six. Bernadine Mote scored four and Dayn Moore made three. Crystal Taylor and Danielle Morris each scored two, and Candie Barber had one.

The C-team had one of its best games all season but still struggled with Socorro, losing 29-38. Amber Livingston chalked up seven points, while Cindy Richardson had six. Vada Stillwell made four points and Mote and Maya Mascarenaz each had three. Kumler, Monique Ramos, and Angela Simms all had two apiece.

In the home game against Oñate on Saturday, the varsity girls took the lead early, and went to the locker room at halftime with a score of 26-10 to put them well on their way to the 54-38 win.

The team kept the Knights to just three points until well into the second quarter, and the Oñate team didn't start to narrow the gap until one player hit several three-point shots in a row late in the fourth period. The Lady Warriors outscored the Knights in all four quarters.

Davis said the girls played well in the game, as they have been since their first win against Artesia several weeks ago. They knew Socorro and Oñate would be two tough teams to beat, and by beating the Knights they know they are still improving.

Dix and Makowski each scored 11 points in the game. Robyn Hirsch scored eight points and Parker had seven. Kristie Ryan

Davis said both teams are just not making good shooting attempts and the C-team seems to be having trouble on defense as well. The coaches will be working with the girls the next week to put them back on the right track.

The young girls always put out a lot of effort and that is something that can be built on, Davis said.



Warriors struggle with Socorro, Oñate in district openers

The momentum the Warrior basketball team carried into district competition began to wear off by the end of the third quarter Friday night against the Socorro Warriors.

After five fantastic games against top AAA competition, the team thought it was prepared to meet its first district foe. Although the Warriors played fairly well Friday, Socorro had what its coaches called the best game of the year.

Socorro shot at about 60 percent and used its height and quickness to score. The Warriors did a good job in the first quarter of controlling the ball and being patient on offense so Socorro wouldn't have its hands on the ball as much. The team knew if it could keep Socorro's scoring opportunities down it would have a chance of winning.

The first quarter ended with the Warriors down by two, 10-12, and they knew they were doing well. The second quarter, though, got out-of-hand as Socorro forced the Warriors into a quicker paced game. The Warriors picked up 21 points in the quarter, but Socorro earned 31.

Coach Norm Wright said 21 was

a great quarter for the Warriors, but Socorro's points really killed them and took the game out of hand. The squad then had to work on catching up in the second half. In the third period they picked up 17 to Socorro's 22, but then only made 14 to the opponents 20 in the fourth, for a final score of 62-85.

"Socorro is tough and really tall. That hurt us, but their quickness hurt us even more," Wright said.

Even with a loss, the Warriors saw some bright spots, especially in the performance of sophomore forward Raul Davis. Wright said Davis had the best game of his life on Friday, after playing in just 12 high school basketball games.

Davis, who is 5'10," scored 31 points and pulled in 11 rebounds against a team with players 6'7", 6'5" and 6'4." He made 10 of 14 two point shots and three of eight three-pointers. He was also 2-3 on free throws and had three assists.

His teammates also did a good job of finding him with the passes. Casey Kearns had six assists and Cory Hood had five, many of which went to Davis. Kearns also scored 11 points. Corvin Lester, in his

third game for the Warriors, had four points, five rebounds and three steals off the bench.

As a team the Warriors shot 54 percent on field goals, which would usually be good enough to win a game. The Warriors did have 28 turnovers compared to 12 by Socorro, who pressed the ball well.

As good as Socorro was on Friday, Oñate was even stronger on Saturday, as they defeated the Warriors 44-83. Wright said the Knights are the best team they have seen all year and will definitely be headed for state competition.

Kearns scored 17 points for the Warriors and did a good job of driving into these big guys to score or get fouled. Davis never did get going in this game, scoring only four points.

"The Knights dominated in every phase of the game," Wright said.

Ruidoso is now looking forward to its next game on Saturday against Deming, here. The Wildcats are a team the Warriors haven't beaten in many years, but this may be the year they have a chance.

Emergency 911 service still on hold in Lincoln County

Four years ago, a flurry of publicity announced to Lincoln County residents that a computerized emergency 911 telephone number soon would be in service.

Local governments approved a surcharge on their residents to help finance the program.

Although many volunteer and government hours have been spent trying to put together a system, the county chairman for the enhanced 911 project still cannot predict when a working number may be operable. He's frustrated by the slow progress, but says the final results should be worth it in terms of lives and property saved.

"The extended 911 emergency telephone calling system is a computer system that permits a dispatcher to realize immediately the origin of a call, the telephone number and its location," said chairman Dr. Bernhard Reimann, who was appointed in September of last year.

"Anyone who has ever encountered a medical emergency knows that it is a must to have, an important tool for prevention of loss of life and property."

He reviewed some of the events to date.

The 911 law was enacted by the

1989 New Mexico State Legislature and provided for a surcharge of 25-cents per customer for the purchase of the necessary equipment and another 25-cents for the operation of the system by the phone companies.

The glitch turned out to be the provision for voluntary participation.

"Not all the communities in Lincoln County opted to participate in the E-911 opportunity because of the surcharge," Reimann said. "Many people thought, with justification, that the surcharge would increase."

A number of other obstacles also interfered.

"Lincoln County and its municipalities are served by four telephone companies, GTE Telephone Operation (formerly Centel of the West), U.S. West Communications, ENMR Telephone Cooperative and the Penasco Valley Telephone Cooperative Inc.," he pointed out.

"Two of those companies, GTE and U.S. West are large corporations. To meld these four service supply entities together proved to be a problem."

GTE serves Ruidoso Downs, Ruidoso, White Mountain, Alto, Capitan and many rural areas. U.S. West covers Carrizozo, Penasco

Cooperative serves Hondo and ENMR handles Corona.

Another obstacle in the county was that in many instances, there were no address systems readily available within the incorporated areas or the unincorporated areas, Reimann said.

Despite the setbacks and problems, on June 18, 1991, an agreement became effective for the entire county and its incorporated communities providing for an enhanced 911 system. A district was formed and a board appointed from each community and the county.

"Unfortunately, the Sheriff's Office, a major player in any local law enforcement activity, was not specifically mentioned in the agreement," Reimann said.

Since that time, several key points have been accomplished, including:

- that incorporated communities have nearly finished an addressing system designating unduplicated street names and property numbers. The county still is working on its system that apparently has been displaced by other higher priorities, Reimann said.

- a framework for the E-911 system has been prepared under mutual agreement of the political entities and the State Department of Finance and Administration

(DFA). It provides for two public safety answering points at the sheriff's department in Carrizozo and the Ruidoso Police Department, and one, secondary point in Ruidoso Downs.

"In an emergency, when one of the answering points cannot respond to an incoming call, another will take over," Reimann said. "With the push of a button, an incoming call pertaining to the jurisdiction in Ruidoso Downs is transferred to that office. All three have a dispatcher on duty 24-hours."

A contract between the DFA and Motorola Communications and Electronics Inc. in October 1990 and offered to Lincoln County in November 1991 did not satisfy all of the requirements, Reimann said. As a result, a request for proposal, called an RFP, was issued on September 30, 1992 for the purchase, installation and maintenance of enhanced 911.

Proposals were to be submitted by November 6, 1992.

"Proposals were offered by AT&T, GTE, Nine One One Inc., Stockton and U.S. West," Reimann said. They were evaluated by a committee appointed by the DFA in Albuquerque a few days later. Reimann and his co-chairman participated in the evaluation process.

Nine One One came out with the

highest score, but did not bid on the layout for Lincoln County.

"An indication is now made that this vendor will be able to accommodate our requirements," Reimann said. "Uncertainties still exist as to what the costs will be for the necessary network and the use of a common database. With that in mind, the four telephone service providers for the county were to answer that question by mid-December. Those answers we hope will be available after January 15."

"After this date, the individual vendors for the E-911 equipment will be invited to demonstrate their equipment in Carrizozo. Subsequently, the E-911 equipment most suitable and the most cost efficient network and database configurations will be chosen."

But when it will be available to the public still is a question mark.

"One cannot dare to promise a definite date," Reimann said. "After the law was enacted, it seemed so easy to implement such a system for Lincoln County. Countless volunteer and other hours, many presentations before town and village councils and county commissioners were made until the present status was reached."

"Much of the credit has to go to Maggie Bohks, who coordinates the county's emergency services, and

Robert Gunter of the Local Government Division of the DFA in Santa Fe. Both have diligently worked on the project. Once the equipment is in place, one of the major tasks will be the completion of the rural addressing system for county residents."

County manager Andy Wynham said the county still is a long way from completion on its readdressing system.

"This project was underway when I arrived," Wynham said. "It was tied into other efforts such as identifying all county roads, which required a lot of updates and changes."

"We've just gone through the stage where we renumbered all county roads and put up road signs."

County commissioners still have several issues to decide, he said.

"We have to determine whether we use road numbers or name assignments and how we will handle the measurement."

Although it would be better to have all of that finished before the E-911 system was implemented, it's not a requirement, Wynham said. "We're not holding that up. They could go ahead and get the equipment. It would just make the system work better."

Skeen joins defense appropriations sub-committee

Congressman Joe Skeen (R-NM) will move to the Defense Appropriations Subcommittee in the 103rd Congress.

According to a news release provided by his office, Skeen will continue to serve as the ranking Republican and vice chairman of the Appropriations Subcommittee on Rural Development, Agriculture and Related Agencies.

"These subcommittee assignments will allow me to keep a close watch on two of New Mexico's premier industries and how those industries are treated by the Federal Government," Skeen noted.

Skeen was sworn in last week as a new member of the 103rd Congress, marking his seventh term serving in the House of Representatives. The subcommittee assign-

ments were announced by the House Appropriations Committee leadership.

By serving on the Defense Appropriations Committee, Skeen will have jurisdiction over several projects important to New Mexico's future including projects important to New Mexico's future, including projects at White Sands Missile Range, Holloman Air Force Base, Cannon Air Force Base, Kirtland Air Force Base Los Alamos National Laboratory and Sandia Labs.

"Since 1985, defense spending in real dollars has been cut by one-third. More severe cuts are expected in the next five years," Skeen said. "We have reached a new era in defense policy in which Congress and the incoming admin-

istration will be forced to make some very difficult decisions as we downsize our military and defense structure.

"I plan to be a strong advocate on the subcommittee for the kind of research, development, testing and evaluation projects, that are based in New Mexico. I will work to ensure that these projects, plus New Mexico's other defense assets, are treated fairly."

Skeen has served on the Agriculture Appropriations Subcommittee, since moving to the Appropriations Committee in 1984. From that seat, he is instrumental on funding decisions affecting the U.S. Department of Agriculture and all of its agencies and programs, including the Food and Nutrition Service; the Food Safety and Inspection Service;

Women, Infants and Children (WIC) supplemental feeding program; and the School Lunch Program.

Skeen has also worked from this subcommittee to ensure that the important agriculture research being carried out at New Mexico State University receives funding, including research projects on chile wilt, broom snakeweed, locoweed, and alternative plant research.

In order to assume the Defense Subcommittee seat, Skeen said he was forced to relinquish his position on the Interior Appropriations Subcommittee.

"But I intend to continue to be a strong voice on western issues and an advocate of fair grazing fees, multiple-use lands and property owner rights," Skeen maintains.

The survey, published first on Thursday, January 21, inadvertently left off a couple of key municipal issues, not the least of which was public safety. Here's an amended survey:



Parent is disappointed with School Board

TO THE EDITOR:

"Thank you for your comments, but don't let the door hit you in the rear on the way out!"

For the first time the public has seen the "Iron Curtain" that we have been dealing with for months in the case of my son, Eric Evans.

The Ruidoso School Board, driven by a higher purpose, obviously believes that "the rules," whether they be good rules or bad rules, have to be blindly defended even if they result in harm to a student. Well, I disagree!

Any rule which proves to be unfair, unjust, unreasonable, or illegal and poses a threat to the students should be immediately reviewed. To take the matter "under advisement" is not good enough.

Our participation in the meeting, which was arranged for by (attorney) Gary Mitchell, was allowed by the school board, but only after

several written denials and only after extensive discussion between Mitchell and the school's attorneys in Santa Fe.

Our purpose in the meeting was to appeal to the conscience of the board members and persuade them to revise or rescind the current athletic code at Ruidoso High School. That code (which led to the problem with my son), in our opinion, is very flawed from both a legal and moral standpoint for these reasons.

1. Eric's situation evolved as the result of hearsay (gossip). Nobody saw anything happen, including the lady (who does not even have kids in school) who started the whole situation. The athletes were told at the time the code was introduced that no action would be taken on hearsay.

2. The incident occurred in a private home of a friend. The code as

written projects the authority of the school into private homes which, in my opinion, is very questionable. For example, the Albuquerque public school policy in these matters relates to school grounds, school functions and school activities. Their policy does not begin to tell students or parents what they can and can't do in the privacy of their own homes.

3. The code makes a student accountable for the bad conduct of their peers. The code says "If the student does not remove himself from a situation where an offense is occurring, the student is just as accountable under the code as the student who is committing the offense." I am sorry, but it is not right that anyone be held totally accountable for someone else's bad judgment or actions.

4. The code does not provide for subjective application. It does

not matter if you are a first offender or the biggest problem student in the school system. It does not matter if you do a minor offense or "burn the school down." Every offense under the code is a "capital crime" and you get swift and harsh punishment without the hope for appeal to a higher authority. We had to bring pressure to bear through Santa Fe to get a hearing before our own school board.

What happened to my son should never have happened. But lightning could strike again (and this time it could be your child) so long as board members and administrators blindly embrace flawed policies that hurt students rather than protect them. Once again, we appeal to school board, take the iron curtain down now and revise or rescind the athletic code.

The reason I am sending this letter is that there have been so many statements on the flat tire problems occurring in the past six months. The flat tire problems have been ongoing for several years, only to

worsen when LCSWA took control of the landfill.

I hope the residents on the landfill road experience relief from the nail problem, and I hope the magnet works well. I would like to thank the Lincoln County Road Department for getting involved and the truth of the matter is, it is a problem created by LCSWA and they should take care of it themselves.

Also, if LCSWA believes the resident on the landfill road do not have a flat tire problem, they should be willing to set up an account with a local tire repair shop and pay for our tire repairs. If it is not a problem, they should not mind paying \$7 plus tax for each flat fixed.

I am sending you this letter from the last residence on the landfill road, I have been silent too long, if it takes griping to get anything done, then I will start practicing right now.
