## Drug task force logs 700 arrests in first year

Nearly 700 arrests were made by Region VI's multijurisdictional narcotic operations in 1992.

Lincoln County's White Mountain Task force was the first region formed for operations, according to Gonzalo Cordova, who is the agent in charge of the local force under the department of Sheriff James McSwane and Under Sheriff Bobby Miller.

During the year, Cordova said the force seized 1,964 pounds of marijuana, pulled 672 plants, seized 273 grams of heroin, 146 ounces of cocaine, four ounces of speed and 350 units of LSD, valium and other illegal Rx drug sales.

Cordova said last year began with catching two persons in a local tavern's parking lot.

In March, he said 14 pounds of marijuana was taken from an automobile on Highway 54.

A pound of cocaine was found after a highway car stop on in July. Cordova said they also took the vehicle.

In August, White Mountain seized \$23,000 in cash on Highway 54, Cordova said. The federal government is in the process of forfeiting that money to the force.

The two big raids last year were in January, 19 indictments, in Ruidoso and 27 arrests in Hondo Valley last October.

Region VI netted a total of \$197,000 in cash and \$200,000 in property with 81 vehicles and one aircraft seized.

Assists to other agencies resulted in another 105 arrests. In the assists, \$1,571 pounds of marijuana was seized along with 101 ounces of cocaine. Those arrests also netted \$70,769 in cash and \$191,350 in property.

According to Sheriff Jack Childers, chairman of Region VI, the narcotic task forces along with one multijurisdictional effort with the region are federally funded either through the Bureau of Justice Assistance Grants or High Intensity Drug Trafficking Area Funds, or both. These task forces assist in combating the illegal narcotics problem in the second largest region within the state, having the second largest population.

The Region VI Drug Enforcement Cooperative was the first of seven Drug Enforcement Cooperatives set up within the state under the direction of the New Mexico Department of Public Safety. The operation began January 1990 with Region VI being the pilot program.

## School reconsiders student athletic code

Criticism of the Ruidoso school district's athletic code prompted the administration to take another look and ask for parents' opinions.

Superintendent Mike Gladden, Ruidoso High school principal Don Weems and athletic director Ronny Maskew drafted a questionnaire that has been mailed to the families of athletes.

The three men broke the athletic code into sections and asked the parents or guardians to rate their agreement or disagreement on a scale of one to five.

"We're hoping to get a good response," said Gladden's assistant, Stephanie Lewicki. "They will sort out the forms, tally the points and give the results to the School Board to review."

The review will be part of the board's meeting at 7 p.m. Tuesday, February 8 in the administration

complex.

"If there is significant opposition at any particular section, the board may revise or take any other action necessary for next year," she said.

The perceived unfairness of the code sparked a flood of protest letters from the family of former Ruidoso student Eric Evans and a call by his father for a public hearing on the code.

Under the existing rules, an athlete would be suspended from a sport for the season on a first offense and would be suspended from the entire athletic program for the remainder of the school year on a second offense.

If the offense is committed while participating in a school activity, the dismissal would be for one calendar year. If a student has first-hand knowledge of a violation of the code while on a school ac-

## Boards get a fresh start

A fresh breeze blew through Lincoln County government Tuesday as the first five-member county commission appointed some new names to volunteer boards.

In several cases, they used a format by which each of the five geographical districts in the county were represented.

With more commissioners, the duty of representing the county on various boards was spread around.

The Lincoln Historic Preservation Board, as in the past, proved to be the most controversial entity requiring appointments.

During the last commission

regime, two commissioners were at odds with the president and several members of the board over the proposed acquisition of property along the Rio Bonito by the Bureau of Land Management (BLM). The members favored the move, as a means to keep the land out of developers hands. The commissioners initially opposed, then set conditions connected to the swap.

Last meeting, commissioners decided to cut down the number of preservation members to five, eliminating representatives from the State Monuments Division and the Lincoln County Heritage Trust, which both own historical properties in the Lincoln settle-

ment. They also emphasized that in the future, the preservation board should stick to architectural review and local compliance issues in the Lincoln historic district.

The terms of four members of the board had expired in December. David Lee, the member-at-large, had one more year to serve. Four members of the preservation board must be property owners and one may be appointed at-large.

Commissioner L. Ray Nunley nominated Glen Dennis for the first seat, Commissioner William Schwettmann picked Ralph Dunlap

## Local college booming

It took years and several false starts, but Ruidoso now is home to a thriving, dynamic community college.

Compared to the spring semester last year, enrollment at Eastern New Mexico University-Ruidoso has grown by 30.5 percent.

"Last year, the enrollment for the same semester was 389 and this year, we have registered 508 students for classes," said campus administrator Jim Miller.

In addition to the steady growth, Miller has seen some changes in the composition of the student body.

"This semester, 113 students are attending with some form of financial aid," he said. "We have 61 Native Americans, up 151 percent from one year ago.

Ninety-five Hispanic students are in classes, an increase of 39.7 percent. That makes a combined minority enrollment of 30.7 percent."

Residents from Ruidoso, Ruidoso Downs and Alto account for 66.5 percent of the enrollment, Miller said.

"The rest of the county and northern Otero rounds out the total with 165 students," he said. "We have some from as far away as Corona. In the past, we had a student who drove in from that area,

but this semester, we are conducting a computer class there to accommodate the interest of residents."

The university education center employs 37 part-time faculty members.

Women still comprise the major portion of the enrollment, 67.7 percent, with 344 registered this semester.

Computer courses continue to be the favorite, with heavy enrollment, but they are leveling off, Miller said.

Spanish also is popular. "The business community is interested in doing something for their customers from Mexico," he said.

More full-time students also are attending the center, he said.

"We show a 170 percent increase in the category of students taking 12 hours or more in a semester."

The center will celebrate its first commencement exercise May 15 with two graduates who have completed their associate of science degree programs.

"The regents will be there and all the administration," Miller said. "Everyone in the community is invited to attend."

The university also has approved a masters of arts degree to be offered in the fall semester that starts in August. The focus will be on education and school adminis-

tration, including early childhood and Headstart, not just kindergarten through twelfth grade, Miller said.

The main university will send the faculty. In conjunction with the graduate degree program, university officials have presented a bill to the State Legislature this session for money to purchase instructional television in Ruidoso, he said.

"If it goes through, additional programs will be broadcast," Miller said. "If people want to find out more about the program and broadcasts, they can call me at 257-2368."

"The university is taking a new direction," he said. "They're in the process of hiring a full-time teacher to travel the region and conduct classes, not stay in Portales. They are recognizing the fact the everybody can't drive to or live on campus. I expected to see more of this over the next few years."

Within the next few weeks, center officials also will kick off a scholarship drive, Miller said.

"We'll be careful not to take away what the high school has developed," he said.

Cheryl LaCounte, who handles student services for the center, is available at the office on Sudderth Drive to help students with financial aid and scholarship questions, whether they plan to attend the center or another university.

## Drug raid leads to long jail sentence

The first guilty verdict from a string of arrests during a two-county drug raid last year, was handed down Friday.

Joe Elugio Moreno, 40, of Alamogordo was found guilty by a Carrizozo jury Friday of trafficking heroin and conspiracy to traffic heroin.

According to assistant district attorney Scot Key, Twelfth Judicial District Judge Richard A. Parsons wasted no time in sentencing Moreno to 12 years in prison.

Moreno was part of the large raid held in Lincoln and Otero Counties last October and November.

At that time, the New Mexico State Police Narcotics Division, in conjunction with the White

Mountain Task Force, United States Border Patrol Anti Smuggling Unit and the Otero County Narcotics Enforcement Unit searched for 27 persons with outstanding warrants.

Moreno was originally charged with selling heroin to an undercover agent on November, 10, 1988.

That particular operation was a joint effort between the border patrol smuggling unit and the New Mexico State Police.

Key said after the jury verdict, Parsons sentenced Moreno to nine years for trafficking and three years on the conspiracy charge, consecutively, for a total of 12 years.

Key said Moreno will be tried on another charge in Alamogordo next month.

# Commissioner Howell pulls out of MRS nuclear tour

Citing a basic disagreement with letting nuclear waste industry groups pay his way, Lincoln County Commissioner Wilton Howell pulled out of a tour of two Eastern nuclear plants.

"Originally, we said (Commissioner Chairman) Monroy Montes and I were going, but I've decided not to," Howell said at a commission meeting last Tuesday.

"It is financed by the nuclear industry itself. I know you should know your enemy, but when I choose to go, I'll pay my own way."

"I think others should go if they feel comfortable. I don't want to be involved in a dog and pony show and I think that's what it's going to be."

Several other elected officials, business people and press representatives left Saturday with Mescalero Apache Tribe spokesmen. The tribal council has been studying the possibility of building on its land a monitored retrievable storage (MRS) facility for spent nuclear fuel rods. Federal agencies have been dangling high dollar incentives.

Commissioner Stirling Spencer said he considers the expense-paid trip good from the standpoint of obtaining information and to have a working knowledge of the technology and industry.

"I feel strongly that someone should go," he said.

Montes stuck with his decision

to take the tour.

Some sources predict the move to negotiate with Native American tribes, which maintain sovereign nation status on their reservations, is nearly dead. They say the new direction, involuntary forced siting, is aimed at military reservations.

But Dr. Bob Walters, who heads the MRS committee created by the Ruidoso Village Council, told commissioners "contrary to news reports, (the negotiate with the Mescalero) is very much alive and proceeding at a rapid pace."

He said he recently attended several meetings in Washington

D.C. and "the nuclear waste negotiator is going full speed to have an agreement with the Mescalero to present to Congress by the end of 1993."

At Walters' urging, the commission passed a resolution restating its strong opposition to building an MRS in Lincoln County or any area that would impact the county.

Walters said lumped in with military reservations was the phrase "and other federal land." Attempts to obtain a more specific definition have been unsuccessful, he said.

County attorney J. Robert Beauvais pointed out that Fort Stanton between Capitan and Hondo, is a military reservation. A portion currently is being used as a hospital and training center for developmentally disabled clients.

"Down the road, the idea of stockpiling in the immediate vicinity

of the Waste Isolation Pilot Project (WIPP in Carlsbad) could be advantageous," he said. "That's only 100 miles away from Fort Stanton. Don't be lulled into thinking there are no suitable sites in Lincoln County."

Walters pointed out that when WIPP first was planned, high level nuclear waste was to be stored. Only through heavy opposition from the people was the type of waste scaled down to low level.

It's doubtful the permanent repository for the high-level, spent nuclear fuel rods (at Yucca Mountain in Nevada) will be ready by the target date of 2010, he said.

"It won't be ready anywhere near that date," he said. "They haven't even decided whether it will be a hot or cold repository, which is a major decision. They could be spending millions on designing casks (to contain the rods) that may not be right."

"I'm appalled at the lack of planning and the impact of decisions."

"We're governed by idiots."

"I hope that's Washington you're talking about," Howell shot back.

At some point, local people are going to have to go to the nation's capital to testify in front of Congress about the nuclear waste policy, he said.

That may be when governing bodies in the county should get together and allocate some money to help the lobbying cause against an MRS, Walters said.

"I have a problem giving dollars (without tight supervision)," said Commissioner L. Ray Nunley. "There has been millage referendum money not spent as I would have liked in the past. I don't want it to go for administration instead of being productive."

Referring to lax handling of tax dollars by the Department of Energy (DOE), Walters said even though customers of nuclear power plants have been paying into a fund for years through a surcharge, it's over-drawn by about \$1-billion. The DOE has spent every cent and more, without significant results.

Without citing the source of his figures, Walters said an estimated \$280-million will have been spent on Yucca Mountain by 1994. He said that even though a design has not been selected, the figure of \$690-million is being tossed around as the final cost.

"I assure you the DOE has no strategic plan, not even the data base to do something on," he said. "They are spending our tax dollars up there like it was a spigot and not getting anywhere with it."

"And we are being forced by Indian sovereignty to take this unless we do something about it."

Howell said nuclear waste is like water, "It will seek the path of least resistance."

"I'm very disappointed that the federal government allowed waste to be created when it had no plan on how to handle it."

In another matter, commissioners declined a request for an additional \$10,000 for The Counseling Center, which serves county residents.

They said they would consider boosting the annual allocation for the center in the next fiscal year's budget. "And that's just around the corner," Montes said.

Center director James Kerlin explained that the center, based in Alamogordo with an office in Ruidoso, also serves residents in Hondo and Corona.

Its staff works with the health clinic in Carrizozo, crisis intervention and runs a 24-hour help line. In addition to general counseling, staff also provides court-mandated service that the commission would have to purchase at a much higher dollar figure if it contracted with another agency.

"We are not a social service agency asking for assistance," he pointed out.

Kerlin said it takes \$185,000 to serve Lincoln County for one year.

The state pays \$120,000; Medicaid, third part insurers and regular fees account for \$14,000; the village of Ruidoso kicks in \$12,000; another \$3,000 comes in from other sources; and the county budgeted \$10,000, half of what was requested.

But those figures still leave the center \$16,000 short for the year. In the past, Alamogordo produced enough extra sources of revenue,

that any loss could be absorbed. That not longer is the case, Kerlin said.

Because of the help available through the center, commitments to a state hospital have dropped by 75 percent. "Lincoln County is the third from the lowest in the recidivism rate when substance abuse is a related factor," Kerlin said, contending counseling received by jail inmates has helped.

When the commission voted to table the request until next fiscal year's budget preparation, Nunley abstained, declaring he has a conflict. He explained that as a pharmacist, he does business with the center and his assistant manager is a consultant for the center.

In other business, the commission:

—approved a resolution asking for financial assistance from the State Legislature for improvements on 3.9 miles of Fort Stanton Road.

—agreed that all action on ordinances will require a roll call vote. That decision prompted the commissioners to go back and revoke on several actions taken that morning.

—approved the purchase of computer mapping software at a cost of \$21,300 from the Computer Mapping Company in Colorado.

The price accepted by the commission includes a \$900 annual maintenance contract. Only \$12,000 was budgeted, but Wynham said an \$18,000 cash balance remains in the reappraisal fund.

—an update on enrollment and progress at Eastern New Mexico University-Ruidoso by administrator Dr. Jim Miller.


—a presentation on the Title VII Bilingual program by Paul Wirth.

for the second and Commissioner Stirling Spencer tapped Colleen Salazar.

But the unanimous support of individual commissioner's choices stopped when Commissioner Wilton Howell nominated Cecilia Apadoca, who had been closely aligned with a pro-swap group during the visit of BLM federal director Cy Jamison. His motion died for lack of a second.

Nunley jumped in with the name of Pat Ward.

County attorney J. Robert Beauvais noted that Ward would need to sign a statement that she was willing to serve.

County manager Andy Wynham added that David Lee's term as member-at-large on the board had not expired and with Ward's appointment, Howell would be left without a slot.

"It was my understanding that the board had disbanded itself," Nunley said.

"You have to take a member off the board by majority vote of the commission (to place Ward in that position)," Beauvais advised.

On motions by Spencer, commissioners then voted unanimously to remove Lee and to appoint Ward. Ward said she didn't agree to

take Lee's place, but commissioners assured her, the outcome would have been the same whatever the procedure.

"By what we have done, you have taken his place and now you have the position of member at large unless we want to continue to shoot ourselves in the foot," Commission Chairman Monroy Montes said.

But in fact, County Clerk Martha Proctor said Friday, it was Howell's final nominee, Dorothy Bel Knapp, who really took Lee's place on the board as member-at-large.

Knapp is a well-known artist who owns the Buckhorn Art Gallery in Glencoe.

Those selected for board positions were checked by the assessor to confirm property ownership, Wynham said.

The manager reminded commissioners they had directed him last month, when they cut the number of members on the preservation board, to create a new countywide board to deal strictly with history. That would allow the county to retain its designation as a certified local government, which puts it in a favorable light for history-related

grants and projects.

In other actions concerning boards, the commission:

—appointed to the board of registration, often called the purge board, because they review the list of people who did not vote in either the last primary or general election. If those people fail to respond to a letter advising of the potential purge, they would be removed from the voter rolls.

Approved in a 3-2 vote (Democrat Nunley and Republican Howell against) were Republicans Jackie Rawlins and Dave Skeen, and Democrat Inez Marrs. Approved in a 4-1 vote (Nunley against) were alternates Mike Kakuska, the county Republican Party chairman, and Dorothy Talley.

—reappointed Spencer to the Carrizozo Health Center Advisory Board.

—reappointed Maggie Bohks as civil defense director.

—appointed Commissioner Howell to replace chairman Montes on the Economic Development Corporation of Lincoln County.

Montes has stated on previous occasions that although initially, the corporation was financed heavily by the county, he felt it has failed to accomplish anything substantial.

## Townhouse appeal on agenda

A plan to build townhouses, denied R-3 zoning by the the planning and zoning department, will be appealed before the Ruidoso Village Council Tuesday.

Appellant Johnny Mobley said the basis of his appeal is that the property is too expensive for residential use. Mobley said Timbers Townhouses is across the street and is zoned R-3 and a Country Club tract across the street-south of his property is zoned P.U.D., which allows a mixture of townhouses and commercial.

Mobley also contended that the planning commission erred. Planning director Cleatus Richards said the allegation of error is incorrect and plans to discuss it with the council.

The council meeting will begin with a report from Councillor J. D. James on DWI penalties.

Village manager Ron Wicker will follow with a report on the Ruidoso Civic Events Center. Architect Charles Nolan will be present.

Wicker, assisted by the finance department, will also offer a response to a letter from Al Junge.

Wicker will submit a report on auctions/surplus sales and a historical analysis of past auctions as requested by Mayor Victor Alonso.

James Porter of Carrizozo Lodge and Wicker will discuss possible installation of water lines to the lodge by the village.

Porter said that C-Net Resorts and the Carrizo Condominium Homeowners Association will have a genuine interest in being annexed into the village corporate limits and connecting into the village water system.

Porter said he still hopes to be connected before the summer tourist season begins in April or May of 1993 and are prepared to do whatever is possible to accomplish the connection.

Porter said the original proposal was to pay for the cost of approximately 7,400 feet of six-inch pipe of village specifications.

"We anticipated this amount to be no more than \$25,000," wrote Porter. "It was not our intent to supply fire hydrants nor water connections at our costs along this 7,400 feet, although we assumed the village or other property owners would want to support this cost."

Porter said he also didn't anticipate the approximate \$13,000 in fill sand costs as a base for the pipe.

"We had proposed the village supply the labor and machinery for this installation since we assumed the village already had adequate labor and equipment, although this was only an assumption on our part," Porter wrote.

Under information items, a quarterly report will be submitted

by the Economic Development Corporation of Lincoln County.

A public hearing will follow on Ordinance 93-2, amending the planning and zoning code concerning parking and variance requests.

Under regular items, the village will:

—schedule public hearings on Ordinance 93-4, concerning non-smoking in municipal owned buildings.

—schedule public hearings on Ordinance 93-5, concerning the operation policies at the Civic Events Center.

—review department schedules for the street and water.

—discuss state highway cooperative agreement for 1993-1994.

—consider boards and commission appointments.

—appeal of rezoning denial for Lot 3 of Tract A, Cree Meadows Country Club Subdivision, from R-1 to R-3.

Consent regular items include:

—minutes for the January 26 regular meeting and the January 28 special meeting.

—addendum to the Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce, Inc., agreement.

—addendum to the Jim Franklin Aviation Service, Inc., agreement.

The council will then enter closed session to discuss limited personnel matters.

five members.

—appointed Doyle Howell and reappointed Dub Williams to the property tax protest board.

—appointed Montes to the Regional Waste Water Joint Use Board.

—appointed Montes as representative to the Water Defense Association

—appointed Spencer and Schwettmann, effective immediately, to the Lincoln County Solid Waste Authority, reflecting the board members' conviction that their representatives on the authority should be elected officials when decisions are to be made affecting future financial obligations of the county.

—appointed to serve on the agricultural and rural affairs committee, Bill Hays from Spencer's district one, Bob Harcrow from Nunley's district two, Jolinda Perryman from Howell's district three and Joel Bonnell from Montes' district five.

Schwettmann examined the list of nominees and commented that none were from his district. Montes corrected him, noting Preston Stone, former Capitan school board president, lived in his district.

Schwettmann then nominated Pat Huey to round out the board.

# Sporting hound howls for new home

Shout Tally Ho for Ballyhoo, a droopy-eared Walker hound looking for a new family.

The sweet-tempered, four-month-old female was hauled as a stray into the shelter of the Lincoln County Humane Society.

"She looks like a purebred and would make an excellent tracking dog," said shelter manager Randy Basch. "Ballyhoo would be better suited for a ranch or rural area, because most hounds when they are alone or lonely will bay and that tends to annoy neighbors."

"Hounds do well in a pack and usually gets along great with other dogs. They need a lot of room to run. Like most working dogs, they're high energy and don't usually adapt well to being indoors."

They can be very destructive confined inside."

Ballyhoo is sponsored for adoption, which means someone will pay for the cost of her spaying, if the expense is a problem for the new owner. Spaying and neutering are the major costs associated with shelter adoption. All animals from the shelter must be altered to ensure they do not contribute to the production of more unwanted pets who later will be abandoned and may end up being destroyed.

Although her breed is known for its outstanding reputation as a working dog, Idaho probably is too timid to do well on the range, Basch said.

The eight-month-old blue heeler

came to the shelter as a stray and is extremely timid. She may have come from an abusive environment.

"She will need love to give her more confidence," Basch said. "She's very sweet and just melts in your arms. She will do better as a companion than a worker because her confidence has been shaken too much."

"She needs to be somebody's lap dog."

Idaho also has to be spayed. Several other blue heeler and one red named Cinnebar, also are available for adoption at the shelter, many well suited to become working ranch dogs.

## WANT TO HELP?

Preparing to celebrate a birthday or anniversary?

A couple in Las Cruces who love dogs came up with a creative idea to help their local humane society.

Instead of celebrating their 25th wedding anniversary by receiving gifts of silver, Hannah and Bill Monsimer asked their friends to invest in supplies to feed and care for the abandoned dogs and cats.

The couple sent out 525 invitations to their anniversary party. They knew even if they told their friends not to bring gifts, they would anyway.

By directing the gifts to the Dona Ana County Humane Society animal shelter, they felt their anniversary could result in something positive for the community.

According to a report in the El Paso Times last week, the list of

gifts included 600 pounds of dry dog and cat food, \$350, 150 pounds of cat litter, 80 cans of dog and cat food, 19 packages of dog treats and four cat scratching poles.

Those who are fond of animals can help the shelter in many ways: direct financial contributions as sponsors, donating food and blankets or baskets, walking the dogs, playing with the cats, helping to clean the cattery a few days a month or volunteering for the follow-up committee being put together to check on the success of adoptions.

Another need of the shelter is for foster homes, people willing to provide temporary homes for litters of puppies after they have received their protective shots. The immunizations take about two weeks to become effective. Fostering not only gives pups a better chance of surviving in the shelter, but also tends to make them more sociable and happy, improving their chances for adoption.

**Ruidoso mayor proclaims Massage Therapy Awareness week in village**

Ruidoso is currently favored with four licensed massage therapists working for the health of their clients: Becky Tillman, Judith Palmer, Jan Prince and Dan Barrow.

Each of them completed rigorous training programs and holds a state license to practice massage therapy.

This week, February 8 through 15, has been proclaimed "Massage Therapy Awareness Week" for the Village of Ruidoso.

The proclamation, signed by Mayor Victor Alonso, states the village is proud to have the services of a significant and growing number of licensed massage therapists. It also urges all citizens to give due recognition to the role of professional massage therapy as an important health care service.

New Mexico only last year passed legislation which is known by the short title of "Massage Therapy Practice Act." The law defines massage therapy as "the

treatment of soft tissues for therapeutic purposes, primarily comfort and the relief of pain...a health care service...includes but is not limited to effleurage, petrissage, tapotement, compression, vibration, friction, nerve strokes and Swedish gymnastics.

"Massage therapy may include the use of oils, salt glows, hot or cold packs or hydrotherapy.

"Synonymous terms for massage therapy include massage, therapeutic massage, body massage, myomassage, body rub or any derivation of those terms."

While specifically excluding qualified members of other recognized professions that are licensed or regulated under New Mexico law from rendering services within the scope of their license or regulation, the law goes on to say that "it is unlawful for any person to practice massage therapy for compensation, to offer service as a massage therapist for compensation or to

purport to be a massage therapist unless that person possesses a license to practice massage therapy under the provisions of the Massage Therapy Practice Act."

So if someone is "treating soft tissues for therapeutic purposes, primarily comfort and relief of pain" that person is doing massage therapy and should have a license and you have a right to see it.

If they advertise, their license number is required to be in the advertisement.

New Mexico currently has close to 1,500 licensed massage therapists. Ruidoso is blessed with four. This is a good week to call one of them and ask any unanswered questions you may have or to schedule an appointment for a massage. You will be glad you did.



Thank goodness for The Ruidoso News that informs us of just what is going on — good job. Maybe we taxpayers should


make it a habit to attend those meetings and have some input on what these folks are doing.

The Las Vegas Dunes is closing. The strip's most notorious gambling casino is being razed for a bigger and better \$200-million hotel.

Good riddance! That casino personally killed one of my boyhood dreams.

It was a cold Indiana winter and I was two years out of high school when my friend Bob Huelman and I decided to take a trip out West and taste the world.

Young and unconcerned about direction, we had worked and gambled most of the summer away. When North Carolina booted a field goal to beat the spread with no time remaining, we found ourselves with untold wealth, about \$1,400. Which was quite a piece of change for 1957.

We figured if we kept gambling, we'd lose it all. So we decided to take a trip and spend it all.

We were given all kinds of do's and don'ts before we left. But our minds were focused and after an all-night drive we pulled into our first destination, Juarez.

We hit all the border towns on the way to California and then dipped below Tijuana to spend a few days on Rosarita Beach.

Back in California, we rode every ride in Disneyland, bought my first cowboy boots ("Maverick" was a big hit on television) and took pictures of the Rose Parade in Pasadena. At Knotts Berry Farm, we panned for gold. I bought Dad a giant beer stain with a cover and Mom a set of unusual dishes. If you held the cups against a light, a pretty Chinese girl's face appeared through the bottom.

With all our spending, we still had hundreds of dollars left, probably because gasoline was 15 cents a gallon and good motels were less than \$6.

When we drove through Las Vegas the first time, it was the biggest, brightest, most intimidating place I'd ever seen.

The Dunes was on the left and as we drove by, the marquee read "Candy Barr." It sent a rush of blood through my head.

Now some people thought Marilyn Monroe was the hottest thing in the fifties, and maybe she was. But when I first gazed on Candy Barr in a 35-cent girls' magazine, I was hooked.

She was Texas blonde, she was beautiful and she was wearing a cowboy hat, boots and holsters. That was all.

It darn near broke my heart when I read she married some gangster named Mickey Cohen.

It was late when we first entered the Dunes

and there wasn't much going on except the slot machines.

Bob and I stopped beside one older woman, over 40, who was playing three machines at one time. She had a bag of groceries beside her and we guessed she must have been there for hours.

At one gaming table, a man with a jacket, but no tie, was throwing dice.

It was remarkable. He angrily kept throwing \$20 bills on the table, and this other guy with the bow tie would matter-of-factly stuff them down a slit in the table using a piece of thin flat plastic.

As fast as he lost, new twenties were fed to the table. There was an urgency the way he tossed the dice.

I never saw the guy win.

After six or seven rolls, he left in anguish, only to return in less than a minute with more twenties. His face seemed to be mixed with pain and excitement. Hopelessly hooked, it was hard to watch.

To the far corner of the room, a line was gathering behind some plush curtains that led to the show room and Candy Barr.

To this day, I remember my excitement when I approached that line and the heart sinking disappointment when the doorman asked for my I.D.

"I'm sorry, but you have to be 21 to see this show," he said.

Too young to gamble and too young to see Candy Barr. Some sin city. Not even worth confessing to Father Murphy.

Every time we bought anything in Las Vegas, we collected silver. Buy a Coke with a twenty, you would get 19 silver dollars and change. Silver to fit the dollar slot machines, I guess. But we weren't allowed to play the slots, so we just had a pocket full of silver dollars. Just for fun, we thought we'd see how many we could collect.

The next morning, after breakfast, we decided to hit The Dunes again. Maybe a new

guy was at the door who wouldn't check our I.D. Maybe Candy Barr, herself, would be in the main room and we could say, "Hi!"

Unbelievably, that same woman was still playing the slots, her bag of groceries beside her. We didn't know why this was wrong, we just knew something was wrong.

It was a lot like how we acquired part of that money to go on our trip. It wasn't all winnings from that one game, you know.

Bob and I helped adults that summer and fall by being messengers, so to speak. Our small town had no bookies, so Bob and I would drive 20 miles to Evansville to lay down bets for people.

We began to notice that people who bet on three or more teams on one wager rarely won. So instead of giving the Evansville bookie those bets, we kept them for ourselves.

We won much more than we lost and were quite proud of our enterprise.

Then one day, we were sitting in the Twigs Cafe sipping on a Pepsi and dabbing potato chips in ketchup when these two well dressed businessmen came in and sat beside us.

They told us what nice boys we were and how successful they heard our new business had become. Then one said, very politely, "We'd prefer you not do that anymore."

He was really polite and so was his partner. And somehow, we just knew it was best we not do that anymore. I think we even said, "Yes, sir."

That was another reason we took our trip. To get away, so to speak.

Outside the casino, the bright Nevada sun bounced off the city pavement to point out every crevice of imperfection.

Like a carnival that suddenly lost its glitz, the whole city somehow looked less respectable, less clear. Cheap. We headed home.

Our collection of nearly 400 silver dollars was a big hit with the gang back at the Twigs Cafe. After a week, we traded them for lighter, more sensible paper money. Why would anybody want to keep all that heavy silver, anyway?

I always thought at some class reunion Bob and I would reminisce about our trip, but we never saw each other again. He died of a heart attack a few years back while driving a meat truck in Cairo, Illinois. He was 62.

I'm sure he would have remembered the Dunes, and the little old lady on the slots, and the beloved Candy Barr we didn't get to see.
