Inventory saga ends; purchasing agent quits

Apparently steamed over criticism of his questionable purchasing practices, the Ruidoso village manager lashed out at his critics, a village councilor and the village purchasing agent.

During the village council meeting last Tuesday, it became evident that, ready or not, unwanted surplus would be filling the purchasing warehouse, confusing the inventory issue forever.

Last Thursday, shortly after 1 p.m., street department head Charlie Armstrong, and a dilapidated trailer filled with left over surplus invaded the purchasing warehouse

and took over.

The inventory list requested by the council still was incomplete and when Armstrong first arrived, he told purchasing agent Fonda Hazel that he would not be able to finish the list by day's end.

The surplus merchandise has been sitting for months at the street department without being inventoried.

Disarray at the street department yard caught the attention of The Ruidoso News and led to the shocking discovery that:

—public property was traded without following state statutes or notifying the purchasing and finance departments.

—no inventory was compiled of the items purchased at auctions and surplus sales.

—purchasing choices often were questionable and didn't seem to relate to the department against which they were charged.

Hazel felt the item by item check should have been made before the merchandise entered her warehouse where she would be held accountable.

Village manager Ron Wicker sent finance director LeeAnn Boswell to help with the inventory.

She, too, said it was doubtful the items could be counted in one day.

Boswell left to get Wicker. Street department workers con-

tinued to unload boxes of assorted esoteric items, such as camera projector reels, electric fixtures and other obsolete equipment. They placed them along the warehouse floor among the regular village inventory, already in stock.

Hazel appeared stunned as box after box was brought into the warehouse from the old brown government trailer.

Councilor J.D. James said the trailer should have made a stop at the landfill before being brought to the warehouse.

Now the "surplus" is to be sold at auction this spring and Wicker insisted it be taken out of the old trailer and stored in the warehouse

and he insisted that it be done that day.

There was confusion as to the method of inventorying the incoming boxes. James suggested one method, Boswell suggested another which she said would be quicker.

Items were shuffled as the workers tried to match merchandise with the right boxes.

NO INVENTORY LIST

The confusion might have been avoided had Wicker allowed an inventory list to be created when items were first purchased.

Employees say from the beginning Wicker didn't want such a list.


When asked to comment on that statement Monday, Wicker said it was not true.

Several months ago, when The News first discovered the surplus junk yard at the street department, the newspaper asked Wicker for an inventory list. He said there was none.

Neither the purchasing nor the finance department had a list.

When confronted, Hazel said Boswell tried to have a list compiled, but was told by Wicker that he didn't want her to pursue an inventory. Wicker said Monday that he did not tell Boswell not to

Downs forms Labor Board

By forming a local labor relations board Ruidoso Downs will be able to solve labor issues and grievances here instead of sending them to a state board.

The Downs trustees Monday approved a labor management relations ordinance after a public hearing and an approval to publish at the last board meeting.

Before the board passed the ordinance, village attorney Bob Beauvais said this final version had a minimal number of changes from the first draft at the suggestion of the New Mexico Municipal League. He reminded them that the state

gave local governments until April to decide whether to form a local board or allow a state board to handle contract issues, grievances and collective bargaining issues.

The trustees can now begin to look for people to serve on the three-member board. Beauvais said the municipal league suggests finding someone recognized as having been involved in collective bargaining, but it can not be an elected or public official.

They will need one person to represent management, and that could be anyone who has served in a management or supervisory position. A person will be needed to represent the labor side who has an

understanding of the conditions of the employees. A third member would be neutral.

Beauvais said they would have little to do until a petition to designate a bargaining unit is filed. The process they then go through is pretty much straight-forward based on the ordinance, he said.

The ordinance is also designed to compliment the current personnel manual, he said. Disputes arising that are not covered under that manual would then be covered under this ordinance.

Beauvais said many small communities are looking into labor

State Legislature tackles pet population problem

The State Legislature, in the absence of action by cities and counties, may step in to tackle the horrendous pet over-population problem in New Mexico.

A bill has been introduced by State Senator Ann Riley (D-Bernalillo County) that would require all animals adopted or returned to an owner from a private or public shelter to be spayed or neutered.

While not a total cure for pet overpopulation, the measure should go a long way toward taking care of the worst offenders; the owners who let their animals run loose and do not keep their females dogs and cats safely confined and isolated when in heat.

The bill is co-sponsored by Senator John Pinto (D-McKinley County) and Senator Richard Romero (D-Bernalillo County).

The measure was initiated by Sangre de Cristo Animal Protection Inc., the Animal Humane Association of Albuquerque and the Alliance Against Animal Abuse Inc.

Shirley Hendrixson, system upgraders with the humane association, said the bill first was introduced in 1991 by State Representative Max Coll (D-Santa Fe). It was passed by the House of Representatives and went through Senate committees successfully, but the session ran out before a vote.

"We had virtually no opposition," Hendrixson said.

The enormous public financial cost, if not the cost in animal suffering, seemed to convince legislators that the time for mandatory spay and neutering has come.

Eleven other states have laws in place requiring sterilization of shelter animals.

"As it now stands, 19 out of 33 counties in New Mexico have animal control ordinances, but those deal mostly with livestock or licensing and rabies vaccinations," Hendrixson said. "Larger cities may have mandatory spay and neutering of shelter animals, but some don't enforce it."

"You can go out and the guys (who manage the shelters) will give you the dogs. A few months later, they get the dog's litter back. We want to prevent shelters from perpetuating the problem."

Under the proposed legislation, no animal can be released from a shelter to an adopting person or returned to an owner, unless a sterilization agreement has been signed and a sterilization deposit has been paid. The sterilization procedure must be accomplished within 30 days, unless the pet is under six months of age; then the procedure may be delayed until the pet reaches the six month mark.

A sterilization fee of at least \$25 must be charged in addition to any

adoption fee. The deposit will be reimbursed only after the owner presents a receipt from a veterinarian showing that the adopted or reclaimed animal has been sterilized.

Although passage of the bill and signing by the governor will create a state law, counties and municipalities that want to impose higher fees to fully cover spaying and neutering costs, or to impose tougher stipulations may adopt their own more stringent ordinances. The law requires counties and municipalities to be at least as strict as state statutes, but allows them to pass regulations that are more comprehensive.

For instance, Ruidoso's mandatory spay and neuter ordinance requires spaying and neutering for all dogs and cats in the community over six months of age. But in practical terms, most communities don't have the resources, nor the inclination, to go into people's home to check on pets. Only when the pet turns up as strays at shelters or is the subject of complaints is enforcement pursued, or when information comes to light about illegal breeding operations.

What finally grabbed the attention of public officials is the high price tag of animal control. The public is paying the bill for irresponsible pet owners.

The city of Albuquerque spent more than \$784,000 in 1990 to shelter and then dispose of about 21,000 animals. That same year, more than 29,000 stray animals were brought into just six cities in New Mexico, according to statistics supplied by Hendrixson.

Unfortunately, when statistics are so enormous, they don't always hit home. As the Communist dictator Joseph Stalin put it, "If one man dies, it's a tragedy. If a million die, it's a statistic."

Additional costs to the city in 1990 included another 4,700 cats and dogs killed on Albuquerque's streets. It requires almost half of one employee's time just to pick up road kills. According to the Humane Society of the United States, more than half of the cats and dogs killed on roads are unaltered.

Ranchers also are losers because owners, many of them ranchers, fail to sterilize pets. According to an article in the Journal of American Veterinary Medical Association in 1989, more than \$5-million in livestock losses were reported by Texas ranchers claiming that wild dog packs killed many of the sheep and cattle.

According to the same article, one to three million animal bite cases are treated annually, resulting in \$80-million to \$120-million in medical costs. The Humane Society of the United States

estimates that the majority of those bites are from free-ranging unaltered animals.

The following statements were part of a fact sheet assembled by Hendrixson and her group in an attempt to persuade legislators:

—only one way exists to solve the pet overpopulation problem, eliminate the source instead of treating the symptoms. Unsterilized animals are the source, but currently, society is so focused on dealing with surplus animals, it is not aggressively working to eliminate the source by requiring sterilization.

—in New Mexico, more than 67,000 cats and dogs were killed in 1990 in 12 cities. Albuquerque led the list by destroying 20,652, followed by Las Cruces, Roswell, Farmington, Clovis, Santa Fe, Grants, Gallup, Las Vegas, Carlsbad, Taos and Portales. That tally doesn't reflect the many shelters in other non-reporting communities, including Ruidoso, which puts down about 1,200 animals a year.

—purebred animals represent about one-quarter of the animals destroyed each year.

—according to Community Animal Control Magazine, a study in Charlotte, N.C. showed that as many as 72 animals will return to a community shelter in a 10-year period as a result of the adoption of one unaltered female dog. This means that a typical New Mexico shelter will spend more than \$2,600 on 72 animals, while they collect \$10 in adoption fees.

—stray animals constitute health hazards from contaminating food and water supplies to transmitting diseases such as rabies, plague, toxoplasmosis, salmonellosis and giardiasis.

—euthanasia only reduces the animal population by one animal. Sterilization reduces the future population by many animals.

—one female dog and her offspring can be the source of 47,000 puppies in just six years. One female cat and her offspring can be the source of 420,000 cats in only seven years.

Every person who allows their pet to have even one litter is guilty of directly contributing to the problem, as difficult as that may be for some pet owners to understand.

—while benefiting society at large and cutting down the number of unwanted pets, the one-time cost of sterilization also will save pet owners money in the long run as their animals will be healthier and less likely to roam.

—animal suffering as a result of the overpopulation problem is staggering. They endure exposure to the elements, disease, starvation and injury from other animals, cars and people.

prepare a list.

After Hazel initially told The News of Boswell's memo requesting an inventory, The News asked Boswell about Wicker's unusual denial. She was candid, but uncomfortable about releasing any information to The News on her two page request to Wicker. Although Boswell reluctantly confirmed Wicker's denial, she informed The News she would have to tell Wicker about the conversation.

Hazel claims to have seen the request that Boswell claims to have written. Both Hazel and Boswell were instructed to call Wicker right away if The News asked any questions.

NOT SO MERRY-GO-ROUND

While the boxes were being unloaded from the trailer Thursday, Hazel told The News that she thought she would be fired by the end of the day. She said Wicker already severely criticized her earlier that morning for calling Councilor Jerry Shaw regarding a village council matter. Wicker had warned her she had no right to call Shaw.

Shaw had asked the council to require a disposition report on all surplus items. To Hazel, it was important to be sure that items checked off to the warehouse actually made it into the warehouse.

Hazel called Shaw to clarify her motion of Tuesday's meeting.

According to Shaw, she was concerned that everyone was in agreement with the intent of her motion. She called Allen Briley, deputy manager who is over the street department, to see if the inventory list was completed and the disposition reported. He indicated that it had been done.

Shaw said she immediately called Hazel, who was on the line with Wicker. Hazel said Wicker had just called to tell her he was very angry because she had called Shaw.

"Briley must have run to Wicker's office," Shaw said.

Shaw then called Wicker to explain Hazel's call.

"I have never been talked to like that as a councilor by a city manager," said Shaw, "And I've had two city managers before Wicker."

"I told him Hazel's call was to clarify my motion about disposition and that she had a right to call any councilor, as other department heads have called me in the past."

"He didn't agree, saying that I made myself too available. It got much worse."

"After my conversation with Mr. Wicker, I can certainly understand Hazel's feelings, if he spoke to her like he spoke to me."

Wicker was asked Monday to comment on Shaw's assertions.

"I don't discuss my conversations with council members," he said.

Shaw said she drove to village hall to pick up the list and disposition report, but Briley had gone.

Many village employees had said much of the merchandise either had been traded or disappeared from the street department.

"It's about time somebody done something about this," one worker said.

More than a dozen witnesses have talked to The News about the unusual practices allowed by Wicker. In closed sessions, the council discussed the matter and a majority of members approved some of those practices.

Hazel was known to be a stickler by other employees, going by the book. She didn't approve of the rush to put items in the warehouse without proper procedures and she said too many people were counting the items.

Hazel, about six years ago, created the first central purchasing department for Ruidoso. By all accounts from other village personnel, her performance has been outstanding. Through her hard work, the village warehouse became a neat showcase of efficiency.

One employee talked of a 50-cent light bulb that cost \$5 before the village had a central purchasing department.

Purchasing agents often are offered gratuities for awarding the right bid. Hazel said she wasn't turning her head for anyone.

When her clean warehouse started to be filled with articles of

little to no benefit to the village, she said she felt it was pay back time.

Certainly, there have been past conflicts between Hazel and Wicker.

Wicker had asked Hazel to open an account at Radio Shack. Hazel didn't do it. She said the village didn't need an open account at the Radio Shack.

"I don't recall doing that," Wicker said Monday. He said he does remember purchasing an answering machine for village hall from Radio Shack. He said he had asked her several times whether the village had accounts at several places.

Requests for proposals (RFP) are normally handled through the purchasing agent. Not too long ago, Hazel would have been called to recommend a (RFP) for a mass transit feasibility study she considered inadequate. She let it be known to everyone that she could only recommend to reject the proposal or not make any recommendations at all.

She said Wicker told her not to attend the council meeting, that it was too political and he didn't want any employees to have anything to do with it.

"I believe what I said was that I didn't feel like it was necessary for her to attend and that I would handle it," Wicker said Monday.


In fact, he signed a personal leave day request for that day so she could be in Albuquerque.

That night at the council meeting, Wicker looked around at the audience as if searching for someone and announced that he thought Hazel would be there to present the RFP. He then asked Dick Weber, former transportation board head, to make the request.

IT'S OVER

As more merchandise entered the warehouse Thursday, and with Armstrong, Wicker and Boswell counting, Hazel's emotions finally gave way. She called Councilor James into her office. Wicker rushed to follow them.

"I'm officially resigning right now," Hazel said. "I'm not going to be a part of the chaos in here."

"What is the chaos?" Wicker asked.

"Nobody knows what they're doing in there," Hazel said. "There's stuff in there that I'm appalled at... I'm not going to be a part of what's going on in there right now."

"I don't know what you're talking about, being a part of," Wicker said.

"You're bringing an inventory list in, Mr. Wicker, on a sheet typed by the street department that has nothing to do with the items originally purchased," Hazel said.

Reading from a sheet, she said, "Inventory of brown trailer. Of what? I don't know."

"Why do you have to know?" Wicker asked the purchasing agent.

"Why do I have to know?" Hazel answered in disbelief.

"Fonda, I don't know what your problem is, but you do what you have to do," Wicker said.

Councilor James asked Hazel to reconsider her resignation.

"There's no way, J.D.," Hazel told James. "I love the city and I'm not going to be here while this hap-

pens. There's stuff in there, 50, 100 and 200 toilet fixtures that would never work for us (the village)."

Armstrong brought in a jewelry polisher and laid it near some motors.

The polisher was a single item purchased for \$100. Councilor Shaw had several times asked where it was stored and why it was purchased.

Armstrong asked The News if it wanted to get a picture of the "famous" jewelry polisher he and Wicker bought.

The News asked Armstrong the purpose of the original purchase.

"I don't know," Armstrong said. "We thought we'd sell it."

NOT ANOTHER DAY

Although Hazel gave two weeks notice, Wicker, through personnel, informed Hazel she couldn't stay another day and demanded all her personal belongings be out of the purchasing office by noon. She also would have until noon to pick up her check for two weeks and a

week's vacation pay.

Asked to comment on this action, Wicker said Monday that he would not comment on personnel matters.

Hazel left her resignation letter with personnel. It read:

"Effective February 11, 1993, I, Fonda Hazel, am resigning my position as the purchasing agent for the Village of Ruidoso.

"Working for the village has been a very rewarding and educational experience.

"I can no longer work for the current village manager, Mr. Ron Wicker. While working for the village, I have had eight different supervisors. Mr. Wicker is the only supervisor that I have been unable to communicate with or please.

"It is my desire to apply the skills I have learned in an atmosphere of honesty and integrity. Under different management, it would be my pleasure to once again work for the Village of Ruidoso. It is with regret that I submit this letter of resignation."

management ordinances, including Ruidoso, Capitan and also Lincoln County.

In other business, trustees decided to set the minimum bid for a 1974 fire engine at \$2,500 after village Leann Wehbrecht researched its value. The village is selling the truck since it has purchased and received a new truck at the beginning of the year.

The board also reviewed and approved a resolution for budget adjustments. Clerk Wehbrecht said she met with the department heads and discussed particular line items in the budget that may have been a little low or high. Several general fund revenues line items increased because they have received more funds than were budgeted.

Monthly reports from the fire department, police department, maintenance department, animal control and municipal court were approved by the trustees. The fire department responded to just one fire in January, while the police department made 14 arrests, including three driving while under the influence of alcohol.


The police also assisted the county with one call and the Ruidoso police with eight calls.

Animal control officer Tom Armstrong picked up 20 dogs and three cats, but also handled six skunks and one horse for the month. The village maintenance crew is still working to complete an animal shelter to hold the animals picked.

The board decided in January to no longer contract with the Humane Society Animal Shelter because of an increased charge for the service.

All four trustees and mayor Joe Hayhurst will attend the New Mexico Municipal League on February 26 in Santa Fe. The purpose of the day is to discuss the League's priorities and status of league issues, but it will also allow time for trustees to meet with legislators about other topics.

The group will plan to meet with Rep. H. John Underwood and Sen. Pete Campos and possible other key legislators.

"The solution to this problem is extremely simple, do not allow these unwanted animals to be born in the first place by having pets sterilized before they reproduce."

—spay and neuter laws alone will not solve the pet over population problem.

Low cost spay/neuter programs should be available for other pet animals purchased from other places, including pet stores.

Differential licensing laws for sterilized and unsterilized animals (already in place in Ruidoso) should be adopted.

Public education helps tremendously, especially reaching

children to ensure they bring informed attitudes on responsible pet ownership with them into adulthood.

Hendrixson said the Senate Public Affairs committee, headed by State Senator Shannon Robinson (D-Bernalillo), probably will review the bill this week. From there, it will go straight to the floor of the Senate. Representative Coll may introduce it on the House side.

Panda the dumped pup is waiting at shelter for new home

A playful bundle of happiness, Panda already has gone through some sharp highs and lows in her short four-month life.

She was left with several siblings at the Lincoln County Humane Society shelter, the un-

wanted product of a female border collie whose owners failed to spay her or protect her during heat.

Fortunately, on the day Panda was dumped at the shelter, someone was there willing to give the litter a foster home for two weeks, said shelter manager Randy Basch. That's the time necessary to ensure

that the protective shots given by Basch against Parvo and distemper have time to take effect.

During those weeks, the puppies also benefited from the human attention and affection. They came back to the shelter happy, healthy and ready to be adopted.

Their return coincided with a Christmas promotion and eventually, all the pups were adopted.

But one was returned, because a friend already had bought a puppy as a holiday gift for the new owner. That pup contracted a particularly strong strain of one of the illness that prey on the young, and died shortly after it was returned.

Then a week or two later, Panda was caught by the Ruidoso impounding officer running loose. Basch said no one has ever called to report her as lost, so maybe she was lucky after all. She'll have another chance and she may find a good, caring owner this time around.

Dubbed Panda by Basch because of her black and white markings and rotund little shape, she has a sweet disposition.

"She's very loving, social and not hyperactive," Basch said. "She'd make a very cuddly and devoted pet."

Panda is sponsored for the cost of her spaying when she reaches six months of age. Sterilization is the major cost associated with adoption from the shelter. When someone agrees to pick up that expense, it greatly increases a pet's chances for

adoption. All animals adopted from the shelter must be altered to ensure they do not contribute to the pet over-population problem.

In one of the kennels next to Panda, Ricochet also waits for someone to pick her as a companion.

The ginger and white Brittany spaniel mix is very outgoing and healthy, Basch said. She's about seven months old and came to the shelter as a stray.

"She'd make a good kid's dog, but not a toddler, because she's so playful," Basch said. "She's good with other dogs and probably needs a home where there are other animals or someone to be with her or else she could redirect that energy in undesirable ways."

Ricochet also is sponsored for her sterilization.

With warmer weather just around the corner, a good way to exercise and give the abandoned pets at the shelter a treat is to come out and walk the dogs. The interaction on a more personal level with humans keeps up their spirits and brings out their personalities.

In the cattery next to the canine shelter, visitors may take a few cats at a time into the center playroom for a romp. A caring volunteer, who spends many hours at the feline shelter, has decorated each cage with pillows and boxes, and has filled the playroom with toys and baskets. The experience will be a pleasure for visitors and the cats. Volunteers always are welcomed

and needed at the shelter. Donations of food, blankets, treats, leashes for dog walkers to use and other items also are appreciated.

Basch's policy is to give each healthy animal brought to the shelter the best chance possible for survival. Protective shots are administered and animals are not destroyed until the shelter becomes

full. Sponsored animals have the best odds. Donations can be earmarked for specific animals or set aside for prospective owners who may need the financial help.

Accidental discovery may end obesity

WASHINGTON—Researchers may have discovered a way to end obesity—by accident!

In a study with a potential cholesterol lowering agent, scientists noted an unusual side effect. Instead of lower cholesterol levels, patients receiving a natural plant colloid lost weight while body weight in a control group remained constant.

The scientists say the mechanism behind the weight loss is not clear, but suggest it is partially due to a decrease in the intestinal absorption of calories. Scientists in another study published in the *British Journal of Nutrition*, found that patients consuming the same colloid lost weight in spite of being instructed not to alter normal eating patterns. Despite this evidence, other scientists may not agree on the weight loss benefits of colloids. Someday, pending further study, there could be universal agreement that colloids are helpful in confronting the problem of obesity.

National Dietary Research, whose research topics have been the subject of articles published in recent medical and nutritional journals, has successfully incorporated a series of colloids into a chewable food tablet called FS-1. When used as directed, FS-1 replaces high calorie fats with lower calorie nutrients, thus providing optimum nutrition with a minimum number of fat calories. According to an article published in the *American Journal of Clinical Nutrition*, consciously limiting the amount of food one consumes is not necessary to lose weight, provided you limit the fat.

Promoters go south of the border

Ruidoso by-passed the border and headed straight for the heart of Mexico to round up potential visitors.

Three people manned a booth about the area at the annual Expo Vacaciones 1993 in Mexico City on February 2 and 3. Jack Muhn, contract accountant for the Ruidoso Valle Chamber of Commerce; Bob Carter of Ski Apache and Trina Garcia of the Best Western Swiss Chalet, who all speak Spanish fluently, spread the word about Ruidoso to hundreds of travel agents from that area of the country.

Although the trade show has been going strong for about 15 years, this was the first year for the chamber of commerce to send a representative. The chamber has become determined to dip into a willing market in Mexico but has barely gotten its feet wet with an advertising campaign for the northern part of the country, which seems to be bringing quite a few more people to the area. The southern part of the country may be a different story.

"We will get a few individuals from this show. A few travel agencies will tell clients, I have this information on Ruidoso and it looks like a neat place to go, but as far as development of a new market that will take a few more steps," Muhn said.

One problem will be product

recognition, getting people to know Ruidoso, so they can go to a travel agent and say that is exactly where they want to go. Muhn said some of the people at the show did know of Ruidoso, mostly because of the ski area. They are less interested in the race track because they have that available closer to them.

One concern Muhn had was that people would hear the name Ruidoso and translate it literally to mean noisy.

"Do they really want to come to Noisy, New Mexico?" he said.

He was reassured at the show that people recognize Ruidoso as the village itself and what it has to offer. Visitors from Mexico indicate they want to have amusements, family activities and to shop, and this area offers all of that.

A second problem Ruidoso faces in getting people from the Mexico City area is transportation. Muhn said for them to come here, they first have to fly two hours to Juarez. They then have to rent a car and cross the border to drive two hours in what they think will be piles and piles of snow in the winter, he said.

Muhn said they have many charter flights out of Mexico City to places like Orlando, Florida; Las Vegas, Nevada and Aspen, Colorado, as well as the many other big name attractions Ruidoso is in competition with to get vacationers. Somehow Ruidoso needs to get

those charter planes to stop here, he said.

At the trade show Muhn handed out about 3,000 brochures to interested travel agents. Ski Apache had its Spanish brochure available, and the chamber also gave out brochures in Spanish, as well as the lodging and dining guide and an Apache Trails brochure. The last two brochures are in English but points out the various sites in the entire region.

The chamber's Spanish brochure is a few years old, and Muhn said he is adamant that when a new one is done it should be originally written in Spanish, not in English and then translated. He said when it is translated it doesn't necessarily come out with the right sentence structure or translation.

This process is currently being used in the television advertisements that are being shown on Channel 28, covering the Juarez and El Paso areas. The chamber advertising committee received funds to do the campaign for a two-month period and then will evaluate for continuation for four more months.

The 30-second advertisements will run three times a day, five days a week during February and March to entice visitors to come up for Easter and spring vacations.

"We have to find new markets. If we just stand still we will lose ground," Muhn said.



Ellis Store owners

Cody Lofton, Gail Rutherford, Jinny Vigil and David Vigil are the new owners of the Ellis Store and Company in Lincoln, a bed and breakfast and catering business. The Vigils will be working to open the store in the next few weeks, while Lofton and Rutherford will be moving here from California after it opens. Long term goals of the four are to also open a conference center, a reservation-only restaurant and host western art shows.

P&Z to consider restaurant plans

Riverside Ruidoso, a 3,000 square-foot restaurant with seating capacity for 60 patrons inside and 40 persons outside, is being proposed at 2 p.m. Monday before the Ruidoso Planning and Zoning Commission in village hall.

The river view restaurant is being developed by John Houghton and is to be located off Eagle Drive across from the current miniature golf course.

According to the plans, 51 parking spaces are provided and the surfacing for the parking lot is proposed to be compacted gravel to reduce site runoff.

Landscaping includes ten aspen trees which meets code requirement of one tree per ten spaces.

Planning director Cleatus Richards recommends approval of the site development plan.

A variance in lot area require-

ment is being requested by Tim Hoyt to build 25 mini-warehouses at the corner of Carrizo Creek Road and Tomahawk Trail.

Richards said of the village's eight existing mini-warehouse developments, six are under the one acre requirement and none meet paving, fencing and driveway width requirements. He said all were developed prior to adoption of the current zoning regulation of June 28, 1988. He said plans for expansion of two mini-warehouse complexes are being developed, both of which involve sites of less than one acre.

Richards recommends that the variance be granted for size requirement of the site. He said current restriction severely limits available properties for such development and smaller sites tend to be more compatible with adjoining developments and aesthetic consider-

ations of developments.

John Houghton is asking the commission approval to replat and consolidate his lots, tracts and vacated right-of-way area into one lot containing approximately 1.5 acres.

Houghton said the replat is requested in conjunction with development of the lot and is necessary to avoid problems of setback and construction of his restaurant over property lines.

Richards recommends approval as proposed with plat to include approval of all utilities.

George Watts is asking approval to replat his 1.3 acre tract into three lots of 10,700 square feet, 24,700 square feet and 20,300 square feet.

Richards recommends approval of the replat as requested with the condition that approval be obtained from all utility companies.

State BLM sells oil and gas leases

The New Mexico state office of the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) last month collected \$1,654,378 from the sale of oil and gas leases on public and acquired lands in New Mexico and Kansas.

The total includes bonus bids, administrative fees and first-year rentals. The oral auction was conducted on January 20 at the Santa Fee BLM office on Rodeo Road.

The BLM offered 188 parcels totalling 104,835 acres, of which 119 tracts totalling 47,123 acres were leased. The breakdown of bonus bids by state is:

-New Mexico, - 111 parcels totalling 45,648 acres sold for \$1,461,300.

-Kansas, eight parcels totalling 1,475 acres sold for \$119,439. The highest per-acre bid and the

highest per-tract bid was paid by Mitchell Energy Corporation in Woodlands, Texas. Officials from that company bid \$470 per acre for 640 acres in Lea County, New Mexico for a total of \$300,800.

The leases are awarded for a period of 10 years and thereafter, as long as oil and gas is produced in paying quantities.

Lady Warriors nip Knights for fourth place finish

Porcelain artist designs Classic IV poster

Turning a scene of nature into a piece of art comes easily for Paula White-Hosmer, and it will be her porcelain painting of grapes that represents the Connoisseur Classic IV on February 19-21.

Hosmer said she was delighted to have the opportunity to submit her work for the recent Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce contest, to find the representative poster. She said a friend told her about the contest a week before the deadline, and she submitted two paintings for it.

Hosmer will be signing the poster during the Connoisseur Classic IV Grand Tasting on Friday, February 19, at the Ruidoso Civic Events Center and the winning piece will also be auctioned off during the weekend. The posters will be \$15 unsigned, \$20 signed and \$30 after Friday night.

The winning entry is of wine grapes that were painted from photographs taken near La Luz.

"I love the transparency, the juicy quality of a grape," she said.

Hosmer said she likes to photograph them early in the morning. The leaves are also unique because they all have a different shape and texture, she said.

Her postcard, entitled "Tularosa Vineyard," will serve as a party favor during the "Wines in the Pines" dance Saturday evening co-sponsored by the Altrusa club.

Hosmer was born in Roswell and raised in Lovington. She made her way to Ruidoso about 12 years ago, and has lived here on and off since then. Her mother introduced her to porcelain art, or china painting as it is sometimes called.

She and her mother had a business together where they sold paints and supplies and taught lessons to about 50 students. Hosmer continues to teach, but not as many are private lessons.

She belongs to the Professional Porcelain Artists Association which has six schools throughout the East and Midwest. During the summer she taught at Getzenova, New York, a small college town founded in the 1600s. For six days in the summer porcelain artists take over the campus as 18 teachers expand the concept of porcelain painting for more than 300 students.

She also teaches seminars for private porcelain guilds and private studios. Hosmer said she has had the honor of giving lessons for the California association of porcelain painters.

It was through workshops and seminars that Hosmer developed her own art skills. She didn't limit herself to learning just porcelain art, but also learned basic skills from water color artists and oil painters. She said she dabbles a little in oils and some water colors.

"I love to paint no matter the medium."

She said porcelain art has never

been hard for her to learn, but has been a God-given gift.

"I have tried to expand on it to become the porcelain artist I am now," she said.

Hosmer said her emphasis is in the murals and decorations for homes, but she also does painting on wood furniture. She would like to expand that to doing murals on walls in homes or businesses.

She said she also loves to do portraits or figures on porcelain because it is more challenging. They are difficult to paint because there are so many processes to go through and the colors are different than regular paintings, she said.

She has been married to husband, Ken Hosmer, for five years and said she is delighted to be married to an artist. They can share the art world, painting and photography together, she said.

Hosmer is also thrilled to be included in a new book entitled "The International Collection" by Tricia Bradford which will be published next month in Australia.

"This will be a wonderful record of our art form," she said.

Each of the 30 artists from 24 countries will have six pages telling about themselves and also giving a lesson of how they complete a porcelain piece. The book will also have 150 color reproductions of the artists' work.

Hosmer was just one of five to be chosen from the United States.

She has four art instructional videos with two on roses, one on grapes and one on blackberries and wild roses. The videos are sold in the U.S., Japan and Canada among other places that have comparable video equipment.

Her husband also does art instructional videos, and they both try to produce high quality videos at a price aspiring artists can afford.

She said to teach, an artist needs to have a specialty so in 1980 when she began to give seminars she wrote a book called "The Essence of Lustre in Porcelain Art." Her specialty, lustreware, is porcelain decorated by applying to the glaze metallic compounds.

All of the colors look alike in the bottles and painted on the porcelain, but it is almost like Christmas when she opens the kiln to see all the bright colors, Hosmer said.

"It is always exciting to get a piece out of the kiln," she said, but many of her artist friends in other fields say that it is too long to wait to see how a piece turns out.

A person can specialize in any facet and not ever be in contact with others in porcelain painting, she said.

Hosmer begins the basic process with a glazed white porcelain or china blank, which usually comes from Germany, France or Japan. The paints she uses are mineral base and are in a powder form. They are then combined with an oil

and applied to the porcelain with a brush in layers called washes.

After each painted layer is applied the piece is fired in a kiln to a temperature of 1400 to 1700 degrees Fahrenheit. During the firing process the paint fuses with the glaze to become permanent.

"A piece can be fired as many times as you want to build up depth and intensity," she said.

Painters must understand the technical aspect of the colors as well to know which will work together wet or will need to be layered. Hosmer said she tries to give her paintings a misty watercolor look that is more impressionistic than realistic.

"There is so much misconception that we are a craft," she said.

Hosmer said that may come from the fact that during seminars students are allowed to trace or copy designs, but artists in other areas also copy the old masters.

"This area (Ruidoso) has so many famous artists, and I have been accepted into the community. That is an honor considering how others feel (about porcelain painting)," she said.

Many of the great artists in porcelain painting can create such masterpieces because of how they feel about a piece. They feel the porcelain, she said.

Artists have to take into consideration the shape of a piece, whether it is a plate, a vase or a tile. Hosmer said her favorite is to paint flat porcelain tiles to be framed, which is comparable to any oil painting.

Porcelain is also much more permanent than an oil or watercolor. Hosmer said porcelain will always be here, and evidence of that is the pottery that people are dig-

ging up at historical sites today.

Porcelain painting became strong in the Chicago area and across California in the early 1900s and it was also spurred on by the Chicago World's Fair, Hosmer said. Before people had to meet in groups to paint together because there were no teachers, she said. These groups eventually developed into the organizations they have today.

She said there is practically a porcelain painters club in every community, and there is also a state organization.

"It's a huge network. I can go to about any town and have a list of people I can contact. They welcome you with open arms," she said.

"We all seem to have a spirit kinship through our art form."

Hosmer also belongs to the International Porcelain Artists and Teachers association, which has a series of instructional lessons that are the equivalent of college courses. When a lesson is mastered, the person is presented with a certificate of accomplishment.

Through the local, state and national organizations they hope to educate the public on what they are doing and how it is done, Hosmer said.

In July 1994 the International Porcelain Convention will be in Albuquerque. She said it will have about 1,200 of the finest international pieces on display and if someone is even vaguely interested in the art they should attend the convention.

Hosmer said at this time most of the people who are interested in learning about porcelain painting are older people.

"We are trying to get younger people involved because we will lose the art if we don't," she said.

"For I am now ready to be offered and the time of my departure is at hand."


"I have fought a good fight, I have finished my course, I have kept the faith."
