Eatery plans get P&Z OK

Plans for Riverside Ruidoso, a 3000-square foot indoor-outdoor restaurant, were approved by Planning and Zoning Monday.

According to representatives of owner John Houghton, the restaurant design will be based on the circular concrete pad already in existence and is to be a casual dining area that would sell wine and beer with abbreviated menus.

Inside the restaurant, seating will accommodate 60 patrons. Outside arrangements will seat 40.

Anticipated closing hours would be at sunset.

Fifty-one parking spaces are provided which meets the one space per two occupant requirement by the code.

Larry Southerland, owner of a residence in the area, said he was concerned that the relatively quiet neighborhood may take on a different demeanor once the restaurant is built. He said nature, such as fishing and deer, and the solitude the area currently enjoys may be interrupted.

The commission was sympathetic, but noted the property was zoned commercial and Houghton was well within his rights to construct such a restaurant.

Commission chairman Robert Donaldson said real estate agents and buyers should make sure of zoning in the area to be purchased. Southerland's property borders commercial property.

Houghton's property was approved for a replat and commercial site development.

Commission member and developer Tim Hoyt requested a variance to allow mini-warehouses on his property zoned C-2.

Hoyt removed himself from the table during discussions.

Hoyt intends to build 25 storage units in two buildings off of Carrizo Road.

Planner Cleatus Richards said current restrictions severely limits available properties for such developments. Additionally, smaller sites tend to be more compatible with adjoining developments and aesthetic considerations of development.

Richards recommended that size limitation be reconsidered as conditional use procedure provides a safeguard for considering acceptability of development.

The motion passed unanimously. Hoyt excused himself from the vote.

Have patience, LCMC updates admissions

If patients at Lincoln County Medical Center can have patience for just a couple more months they will be rewarded with a computerized admissions process.

LCMC board president W.C. "Dub" Williams compared it to a student registering for college courses. He said each semester the student has to give the same information to be registered. It is the same for patients at the hospital, who each time they come in have to give similar information.

Hospital administrator Valerie Miller said it won't be much longer before a new computer system will stop that process. They will begin installing the hardware for the system in March, and it should be up and ready to go by May 1.

Two other regional hospitals affiliated with Presbyterian Healthcare Services, Tucumcari and Clovis, have completed the process and will serve as a model for LCMC to follow. Miller said they hope to eliminate some of the

glitches these two had but there will likely be some things they will have to work out.

She said it is a personal computer based network with no main frame necessary. It will be extremely cost effective and when all of Presbyterians' regional hospitals have it installed they will be able to network with each other and to the main office in Albuquerque. The local physicians will also be able to access it to gain information they may need.

The current admitting system is about 30 years old and cannot be modified any longer, Miller said. It requires a tremendous amount of paperwork, especially with the increased number of outpatient cases, and it is all done by hand, she said.

"We just have to hang in there with admitting for a couple of months," Miller said.

The hospital just completed a telephone system conversion last week, which will cut down on the amount of calls that will need to go through the switchboard. If people know the correct extension number

they can dial directly through to whatever department they need. Patients will also be told what the number is for their room so family members can call them directly.

"It went extremely smooth for a phone conversion," she said.

Patients will be given the specific numbers needed to arrange for appointments in different departments. Miller said those phones not staffed during certain hours of the day will have voice mail, which will allow patients to leave a message.

For those who do not know the specific number they need, they can still call 257-7381 to be transferred to the correct department.

The board decided to install a new phone system because of the cost of repairs for the old system.

Miller said the hospital had its third million-dollar month of this fiscal year in January. The net revenue for the month was up \$58,546 from December and up \$103,150 from January 1992.

Airport lease is a good deal for private enterprise

Apparently, the Ruidoso Village Council has leased the Sierra Blanca Airport hangar in violation of state statutes.

And by severely under-renting the facility, they also failed to get a fair return on taxpayer's property.

The \$200,000 hangar, owned by the village, was rented by Jim Franklin Aviation Inc. for \$500 per month in October of 1991. That rent included water and electricity.

Some Ruidoso area residents have called the rental agreement totally inadequate, shortchanging the village taxpayers.

Aviation investment counselors contacted by **The Ruidoso News** say rent should be more in the \$2,000 a month range.

Because of an employee gag order imposed by village manager Ron Wicker, airport manager Lloyd Wayne has informed **The Ruidoso News** that all airport related questions would have to come through Wicker.

Contacted Monday, Wicker was asked how the village determined the amount of rent to charge Franklin Aviation for the hangar.

He said the amount per square foot was determined at the original time of the lease and carried over with the renewal.

Asked if anyone double checks to ensure a fair return, Wicker said airport manager Wayne determines the market value.

Wicker was asked if the village advertised for any other interested parties to rent the hangar before it was rented to Franklin.

"No," said Wicker. "We've got plenty of land out there to lease." He said when Franklin showed an interest, it was brought before the council and the council agreed to the rent.

Wicker confirmed that the agreement was neither an ordinance nor a resolution.

Wicker said he believed that attorney David Thomsen drafted the addendum.

According to village minutes of October 29 1991, Wayne presented a proposed lease agreement with Franklin for the hangar space for operation of an airplane maintenance service.

Before the Franklin agreement, the village had its own mechanics.

Wayne, hired by Mayor Victor Alonso shortly after Alonso took office, explained the area proposed for lease was 6,000 square feet of hangar space. Wayne said Franklin would pay \$500 per month plus gas. The village would furnish electricity and water.

Wayne stated the lease would

increase to \$700 per month after the first year and was subject to renegotiation after a two-year term.

At that time, village attorney David Thomsen said the contract required Franklin to carry liability insurance with indemnification of the village and a certificate of insurance should be supplied to the village annually.

According to the agreement, the Village of Ruidoso was required to insure all improvements on the premises, whether constructed by Franklin or the village, against all loss or damage by fire or other casualty in the amount not less than the full replacement value for all improvements, tools and tooling parts.

Alonso called for the vote and the motion to enter into a lease agreement with Franklin carried with all eyes.

But according to Article 54 of the New Mexico state statutes regarding the leasing of real property, the village may lease village property with an appraised value in excess of \$25,000 only under certain conditions.

One of those conditions clearly states that any lease of real property shall be by ordinance of the municipality, allowing a public hearing first before any agreement. The village appears to have failed

to follow that statute.

Also, the value of the property to be leased shall be determined by the appraised value and not the value of the lease. An appraisal shall be made by a qualified appraiser and submitted in writing to the governing body.

Although the new rental rate of \$700 was to kick in after one year, which would have been the following October, an addendum to the 1991 agreement was not submitted for formal signatures until the February 1993 council meeting.

That addendum noted that the council agrees Franklin probably would not be able to make the rental payments of \$700 required by the lease and agreed to amend the lease by modifying the monthly rental agreement for the second year to \$500 per month.

The new agreement was handled by the council as a consent agenda issue which was lumped in with other items and required no public discussion, just a single vote.

Past village lease agreements have been created through an ordinance. The Links of Sierra Blanca golf course, part of an overall airport plan, was passed by ordinance after several public hearings.

Controversy arose when a negative referendum petition was circulated to stop the planning and

many signers removed their names.

An angry Victor Alonso, after he took office, pushed a bill through the legislature to prevent persons from removing their name from petitions once they have signed.

The Ruidoso News made several calls to various airports for rental rates, noting different costs between storage of planes and hangars used for maintenance and repair business.

Based on an approximate \$200,000 hangar value, the monthly payment excluding insurance and taxes would approach \$2,000 per month, to break even, experts said.

Investment counselors contacted said the rental should be triple debt. The renter paying all the utilities, insurance and taxes.

However, under the lease agreement, Franklin pays some utilities and some insurance.

Franklin, under the agreement, also gets free use of a power unit and the gasoline tug to tow airplanes.

According to the investment counselors, the village should add \$200 to \$300 on the break even costs for a modest profit.

One aviation businessman asked, "What fool would put \$200,000 into an investment and collect only \$500 a month?"

History buffs plan museums

Fight leads to felony charges

Two employees of The Ruidoso News were jailed Friday following an argument and fight at the home of Frank Apodaca on George McCarty Drive.

Ruidoso Police officers were called to the residence by neighbors after several shots were heard shortly after midnight.

Officers reported finding Frank Steven Apodaca and Jory Allen Perea bleeding from head wounds. Both were taken to the Lincoln County Medical Facility where they were treated and released.

Gary Garza, 35, "F.O." Falcon, 35, were later apprehended Friday morning by officers. Detective Lanny Maddox charged the two men with three counts each of a third degree felony.

Bail was set at \$100,000 with no 10 percent.

According to Garza, he and Falcon had gone to the Apodaca residence to confront him regarding unflattering statements Apodaca is alleged to have made about Falcon's family at a local bar.

The heated argument turned violent with Garza and Falcon, apparently gaining the upper hand.

A gun apparently discharged twice during the fracas, but no one was shot.

Neither Garza nor Falcon were seriously hurt, but Garza did have his glasses broken during the melee.

The Apodacas and Falcons were apparently good friends at one time. Neither pressed charges against each other.

Garza and Falcon were transported to Lincoln County Jail last Friday after a first appearance hearing before Magistrate Judge Gerald Dean Jr., substituting for vacationing James Wheeler.

Seminar focuses on violence

A two-day seminar on "Trends Toward Violence and its Impact on Education," will be presented this week at the Ruidoso High School public meeting room.

Part of the University of New Mexico's continuing education in connection with the Drug Free Schools and Communities program, the seminar's featured speaker will be Hank Cellini, Ph.D..

The sessions are scheduled from 4 p.m. to 8 p.m. Friday, February 26 and from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., Saturday. The seminar may be audited free for no credit or a participant

can pay \$35 for one-hour of college credit.

In particular, Cellini will focus on gangs and how to prevent violence and intervene in schools.

The course description states that "teachers and administrators are presently being asked to work in increasingly violent atmospheres and with more violent students."

The 16-hour workshop is designed to "provide educators with information to counter some persistent myths on gangs and violence. It will address successful gang and violence prevention and interven-

tion strategies and will discuss why youths band together and why identity with a group is important to them."

Credit participants will be evaluated on their ability to successfully pass an essay and short answer test completed at the end of the class. They also will be required to write a paper assessing the level of gang involvement in their community and to make recommendations to help alleviate the problem.

MainStreet board looks beyond streetscape for long-range plans

The beginning of construction of phase one of the MainStreet streetscape plan is just months away, but the group is also looking forward to the next phases of the project.

A few steps remain to be taken before the crews begin work on the streets this spring. Project consultant Mary Maul updated the MainStreet board Thursday about what is left to be done on this phase.

Maul and project director Don Miller have gotten 56 of the 57 temporary work permits needed to allow work on the right-of-way up to the property owners' buildings.

Miller said he has tried several times to contact the one property holder who has not signed but he is scheduled to speak to him today, Monday. He said he is sure he will be able to get the person to sign once he has a chance to explain the project.

Maul said the design in that area is to provide handicap accessibility to that building, which it doesn't currently have. The right of way in the area is undocumented, and it seems most of the work will not be on private property, she said.

With about 99 percent of the property owners in favor of the project, the board recommended the Ruidoso Village Council approve the right-of-way certification at its meeting Tuesday. Maul said this is the procedure that has been used in this type of project for many years and will keep it going forward, even without the final signature.

President Alden Deyo said it was fantastic that Maul and Miller got that many work permits signed for the project.

To continue with the project the council also will need to approve authorization to advertise for bids, sign a joint powers agreement with the state, sign a lighting agreement that will allow that part of the construction to participate in the federal funds, and certify it is a non-hazardous waste area. Maul said the lighting can now be paid for federally since they received a waiver from the state highway department.

During the Plans, Specifications and Estimate meeting in January with the state and federal highway departments, the group decided there were three possible construction choices to take. The first was to start in April and work until it is completed. They could also start in April and work until July, then do night construction to complete it.

The final option, and the one they selected, was to start in April, work until July and then stop work until September. The construction crew could still be working on tak-

ing soil samples and putting up signs during the off time, so the project would continue, Maul said.

They decided on this approach because it was brought up in all of the public hearings about the project that people did not want construction going on during the peak summer period. The construction has also been broken down into eight phases so work is only going on in a small area at one time.

She said the pause may increase the cost of construction but that should not be a problem either.

Maul said if the construction bid comes in too high for the funds they have available, they can go before the state road betterment committee. The committee has contingency funds available that it can use for any project that it decides is worthy in its district, she said.

She said she is fairly confident they would approve more funds for this project because the state and federal departments have made a major commitment to it already.

They should be able to award the bid by the end of March, with construction to begin the first of April. Maul said the bids are usually opened at village hall by the purchasing agent, but since the agent has recently resigned it will probably be the deputy village manager, Alan Briley.

A district agent from the state highway department will also be on hand for the bid opening. He will then take the bids to Santa Fe where the state and federal highway department officials will make the decision on which bid will be selected.

Miller said Maul has done a superb job with this project and put many hours in on keeping all aspects going. She has also practically written the guide for the newly developed federal funds for highway enhancement, he said.

Maul hasn't stopped there but is now striving to get funding for design, engineering and construction of phases two and three. These phases will complete the project from Fern Street to Mechem Drive and from Country Club Drive to Carter's Lane.

She said they will request about \$1.3 million from the legislature to fund these phases. Representative H. John Underwood is sponsoring House Bill 636 for the funds, and there will be a committee hearing on it at 8 a.m. Friday. Maul invited all of the board members to come to the hearing to support the project.

Senator Pete Campos is also sponsoring Senate Bill 378 for the funds but a hearing has not been scheduled at this time.

Maul said the strategy will be to get enough funds to keep the ball rolling. If they can get \$49,800 it would give them the needed match-

ing money to get the federal funds to continue with the design. She said it took about 18 months to do the design for the first phase so it will likely take them as long for the next two phases.

Now that the streetscape plans seem to be well on track, Miller has started several other projects to help the community. He has developed and is sending out a market survey to business owners, residents and visitors to determine what needs to be done to help the community survive.

He was to send out the surveys to the businesses on Friday and they are to be returned by March 1. The Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce and the Economic Development Corporation of Lincoln County are also helping with the survey and are preparing the lists for the residents and visitors.

The membership drive for the organization is not going as well as planned yet, but Miller handed out membership packets to each of the present board members to sign up new people. He had sent out 300 letters inviting people to join, but so far the response has been low.

"The community needs to get behind an organization that will make this community survive. They will realize 10-fold on their dollar. We just need to get out and sell ourselves," Miller said.

The group is planning to have its annual meeting at Cree Meadows Country Club on March 18, and board members will soon have tickets for sale for the event. The agenda for the meeting will be an update on the streetscape project by Maul and Miller, election of new board members and presentation of awards.

Four board terms are expiring and the group will need to fill two more positions from resignation. Three of the outgoing board members, Bonnie Mattox, Don Dutton and Tom Rigby, have agreed to continue to serve the board. The nominating committee has a list of other people to approach to ask to serve on the board.

The group adjourned into executive session to discuss the personnel evaluation for Miller who has been in his position for about six months. Deyo said no action was taken after the session, but the group did report to Miller on his evaluation.

When asked if Miller received an increase in salary, Deyo said the original plan was to give Miller a pay raise after three months and then again at the time he is made the full-time program manager.

Board members absent from the Thursday meeting were Jacqueline Bentley, Don Dutton, Walter Merchant and Peggy Wash. Village liaison J.D. James was excused.

tories.

In Ruidoso, a third organizational meeting is scheduled for 7 p.m. Thursday, March 11, at the public library.

"We're still speaking in generalities about a museum and trying to gather ideas, because we have to know what people's interests are and if there is substantial community support before we can choose a theme," said Cem McClellan, who has a long-standing interest in the history of the community fostered by his collection of antiques and stories from his grandmother.

"We need to get a group large enough to carry things through," West said. "To choose a theme prior to that could cost us people."

"The idea is to start a chapter of the Historic Society in Ruidoso where it could really be local people carrying out their own themes and getting involved," said Ann Buffington, a member of the society who edited "Memoirs of a Country Doctor," a book recently published by the organization.

"Such a variety of history exists in this county," West said. "I met a former cowboy from the Fort Stanton experimental ranch (now defunct) and he said he found areas where soldiers had carved their

names in the rock face, a cliff surface with petroglyphs and an area where soldiers had thrown their dishes.

"Capitan people are interested in doing a railroad museum. The railroad from El Paso built a spur directly to Capitan for access to the coal fields, but eventually they found better fields somewhere else.

"One entire town is even underwater (at Bonito Lake and dam).

"There's such a variety between ranches, gold mines, outlaws and Indians. Unless you break that down into separate museums, you will never cover it all."

McClellan pointed out that museums draw thousands of people each year to the historic settlement of Lincoln, which has five. The town of Roswell has two museums.

"A lot of people like to take their kids to a museum when they visit an area," he said.

The possibilities are wide open, West said. Oral histories could be included, separate rooms depicting different eras, displays involving sight, hearing and smell.

McClellan said some cabins still are standing in the surrounding forest that are close to 100 years old and possibly could be incorporated into a museum.

"What we've found is when you're talking with a local group, you can listen to everyone's ideas

and stories," West said. "In Capitan, we gathered around old 1930 aerial maps provided by David Cummins and Dr. Bernie Reimann had the original plat of the town showing it was eight times as large as it is today.

"But when the society conducts its quarterly meetings, it's too diverse a group and you have to speak more in generalities."

Buffington thinks Eve Ball would be an important part of any section relating to the Mescalero Apache and oral history. For many years before her death, Ball lived among the Mescalero Indians and recorded their history.

"Because of her, the Mescaleros are one of the few Indian tribes with a written history," Buffington said.

"You get the idea," McClellan said. "Now is the time for those who want to get involved or have their ideas heard to attend the meetings and voice their thought. Their opinions are just as valid as anyone's at this point."

"If we don't get organized, we will continue to lose many of the old landmark buildings. At least with a museum, artifacts and photographs can be preserved. Families will know there is a safe repository for their historical items where they can be shared with others for generations to come."

at Presbyterian, but to continue to do it there needs to be communication among the hospital, doctors and the board.

"We are all in the ship together and whoever knocks a hole in the wall will bring us all down," he said.

After reviewing a current policy on discounts for present and former long-term employees, the board voted to only continue the discount for present employees and their dependents. Miller said discount policies at all hospitals were coming under the scrutiny of the Internal Revenue Service as it began to assess the continued appropriateness of not-for-profit status for hospitals.

One alternative would have been to give each of those receiving a discount a 1099 form to report it as income to be taxed but that would require more paperwork.

Williams said a lot of agonizing went into the issue but they decided it was a step they should take before they were told they had to do it.

Williams said they are doing phenomenal things at LCMC and

Adopting a pet is life or death choice

Look into her eyes and see the generations of loyal dogs that followed their masters into the frozen wildernesses of Siberia and Alaska. Tundra exhibits the regal bearing and strong resolve of her ancestors. But her eyes, one crystal blue and the other a mellow brown, also show her mixed genetic background of Siberian Husky and Akita Inu.

The latter accounts for her smaller size, leaner and more leggy build than a typical husky.

The black and white female is between 11 and 18 months old, estimates Randy Basch, manager of the Lincoln County Humane Society shelter. She was brought to the shelter as a stray about one week ago.

"She's very affectionate and very alert," Basch said. "Typical of the breed, she's also very active and will need a good size yard or other avenues for lots of exercise. But she's also very loving and will not want to be a backyard dog."

"She appears to be housebroken and is very neat in her cage."

Tundra will require spaying. All animals adopted from the shelter must be spayed or neutered to ensure that they do not contribute to the pet over-population problem that results in 14 million abandoned cats and dog being destroyed in shelters each year.

A much smaller new resident of the shelter is Popcorn, a terrier/minature pinscher mix who will be two years old in May.

Her owners brought her to the

shelter because they are elderly and a recent debilitating illness made it very difficult to care for their special pet.

All of Popcorn's shots are current and she has been spayed, Basch said.

"She's housebroken and loves kids, which is good because she's a high energy dog," he said. "She's very much a lap dog and loves attention."

PAST PETS

Unfortunately for the animals at the shelter, the early months of the year tend to be slow on adoptions, but not on new abandoned pets coming into the facility.

When the kennels fill to capacity, Basch has the heart-breaking job of choosing which dogs and cats will live and which must die through no fault of their own. Most end up in the shelter because their owners failed to responsibly care for them by allowing them to run loose, not protecting them during their heat and not getting them sterilized. The pups are dumped because those same owners again fail to accept responsibility for their lack of proper pet care.

Several previously featured pets still are looking for homes. They include:

—Licorice, one of the most beguiling little gentlemen in the shelter.

Calf-high, the Schipperkee mix with the curled tail and deep brown eyes, prances on a leash, keeps a neat cage and is not a barker. He loves children and adults and seems to get along well with other animals.

—Buddee, who desperately needs a caring family and has been at the shelter far too long. The Keeshond mix won the heart of a sponsor, who paid for her spaying, which was accomplished several months ago.

She's sturdy, about knees high and cinnamon in color. Intelligent, protective and playful, Buddee loves to go walking with a pal, drinks in attention and would be forever loyal to her new owner.

—Tucson, a perky and affectionate Welsh corgi mix, who is another well-behaved male at the shelter. He's fun loving, walks well on a leash, and earnestly appreciates even the slightest attention. He would do better in a home without another male dog.

—Pinto, a striking terrier mix female, who has been spayed and gets along with everyone. Her brown and white markings are set off by one blue and one brown eye.

One look at Chocolate Sundae's rotund body and black and white face and the origin of her name is obvious. The friendly and lively border collie needs lots of love and would be a great child's friend.

Other adoptables include several blue heeler mixes, one with frosty tips to his coat; adorable spaniel pups and shepherd pups; a border collie puppy named Panda; a husky mix blonde pup named Jelly Belly; and a young adult Springer Spaniel dubbed Ricochet.

Some Indian gambling enterprises need protection

Native American groups need stricter application of current regulations to protect them from being cheated out of gaming profits, said Senator Pete V. Domenici (R-NM) in a news release.

A limited audit conducted on Indian gaming operations nationwide revealed that gaming operators were cheating Indian tribes out of millions of dollars.

That prompted Domenici to write a letter to Anthony Hope, chairman of the National Indian Gaming Commission.

Hope told Domenici that his panel has only recently completed the regulations to oversee a segment of the gaming activities now operated on Indian lands.

The Department of the Interior has had interim authority to enforce Class II Indian gaming operations, which mainly deal with Bingo and Lotto operations.

The Mescalero Apache Indian Tribe operates a Bingo hall on the reservation, and also sells Lotto tickets at the Inn of the Mountain Gods. The tribe also operates a

busy video gaming room in the convention center on the reservation.

The report didn't make mention of the Mescalero operations.

"I was disturbed by examples of theft and mismanagement of Indian gaming operations outlined in the final report," said Hope in response to a letter from Senator Domenici.

"Sadly, I cannot say that I am surprised. These kinds of problems will continue until the tribes and states face up to their responsibilities."

Hope stressed that it is the responsibility of the states and tribes to regulate gambling, including Class I (social games played solely for prizes of minimal value) and Class III (banking and casino-type games like blackjack, roulette, craps and such).

Hope also reported that his commission had completed work on six major rules necessary for the commission to begin to fully exercise its regulatory responsibilities. These regulations were to go into effect February 22.

Lady Warriors battle Knights tonight

The two wins the Lady Warriors collected from the Oñate Knights won't mean much tonight when the two teams meet for the first round of District 3-AAA post season tournament.

The game will begin at 7 p.m. at Ruidoso High School gymnasium.

Although the Lady Warriors will be more confident having defeated the Knights twice in regular season, both teams realize this could be the last game of the year and will be putting forth their best efforts.

Coach Dennis Davis said it is scary to be meeting a team for the third time and trying to pick up a win. He said the girls have a great chance to win the game, and they do have the added confidence of having defeated them twice before.

"We have done well against them this season and we have a good chance of beating them. We are better at several positions and with a little luck we should beat them," he said.

When the squad picked up its first win against the Knights on January 23, it was the first time since the two teams began playing that the Lady Warriors defeated the Oñate cagers. The scores for both games were rather convincing, too. They won the first match here 54-38. The game in Las Cruces was a little closer but the girls pulled it out 36-31.

If the Lady Warriors win the contest tonight the next step will be a contest with either Cobre or Silver City on Wednesday. Those two teams will play Tuesday in Silver. The Lady Warriors will host the game if it is against Cobre but would have to travel to Silver City for a game with the Colts.

Socorro is the top team in the district and will play Deming later this week to determine who would play the winner of these two games. Socorro is ranked second in the state in class AAA, while Deming is sixth.

The Lady Warriors lost their battle with the Deming Wildcats on Saturday in the last regular season game. The squad was defeated 30-52, compiling a 6-14 record for the year.

Both teams started out a little slow-reacting, Davis said, but Deming seemed to start reacting first. He said the girls seemed to be hesitant and not as aggressive as they usually are. They looked kind of lackadaisical, he said.

The team's defense did fairly well in the first quarter, but Deming seemed to get a few extra points on rebounds. The first period was low-scoring with the Lady Warriors picking up just five, while Deming had seven.

The tempo picked up in the second period as the Wildcats added 19 points to their total. The blue

and gold hit just 13. Davis said they wanted to force Deming to take shots and the Wildcats did, but they rarely missed.

A slump in the third quarter stalled the team long enough for the Wildcats to take a substantial lead with 15 points to Ruidoso's seven. The final quarter also went to Deming 5-11.

Davis said it was not just the fact that the girls got behind, but it was also their attitude. They couldn't make plays work and made too many mistakes. He said they also had a shooting percentage of 24 percent, probably the worst of the season.

One goal the team did accomplish was to hold Deming's star Theresa Gutierrez to as few points as possible. In this contest that was just six, while in the first match of the two teams it was 21.

Sarah Dix scored 13 points and pulled in 12 rebounds for the team. Michelle Morris chipped in eight points and grabbed six rebounds. Cicelee Makowski had six points and five rebounds. Kristie Ryan added two points; while Mandy Parker had one.

The junior varsity team also put in an improved performance from the last few games it has had. The girls were defeated 34-44 but had kept it close through halftime. They were behind by 17-21 after the first two quarters before losing control

in the third period.

They picked up just two points in that eight minutes, while Deming scored 11. Davis said they played hard and came close to winning the contest.

Mono-skis make the sport possible for athletes who are paraplegic

"Bend your knees, flex your ankles," ski instructors exhort.

But what if a skier's knees and ankles don't move? What if that skier is a paraplegic?

If the skiers are Wayne Hatchel, 29, and Lora Pierce, 34, of El Paso, Texas, the answer is simple: they use a Mono-ski.

To Diana Person, executive director of Ski Apache Handicapped

Skiers Association (SAHSA) and Mono-ski instructor, nothing is impossible, even a paraplegic's participation in a sport that usually depends upon leg motion.

Person explains the concept of the Mono-ski.

"Laterally, one sits balanced over a single ski. Between the seat and the ski's mounting bracket is a large shock absorber. Naturally, this absorbs terrain, bumps, etc.

The paraplegic holds an outrigger, which is a forearm crutch with short skis attached, in each hand. He or she skis by twisting the shoulders.

By balancing on this three-point contact of Mono-ski and two outriggers, the paraplegic can ski anything on the mountain, including black diamonds and moguls, says Person.

Hatchel and Pierce didn't hit the bumps on Terrible, but they had

fun. "It's great to be back into the sport again," Hatchel exulted after a morning with his instructors. He had skied prior to the accident that left him with spinal cord damage that limited motion to his upper body.

"I'm really pumped up," he said with a big grin.

Catching his enthusiasm, Pierce said she enjoyed her first time ever

skiing. "It was hard at first to learn everything, but I'll definitely do it again."

Person points out another advantage of the Mono-ski.

"It can be loaded onto a chairlift easily, without stopping or slowing the lift, with the skier in it."

Just as the wheelchair mobilizes a paraplegic's everyday activities, so also has the Mono-ski expanded his or her leisure options.

"Skiing's such freedom — and excitement," continues Hatchel. As president of the National Spinal Cord Injury Association, Rio Grande Chapter, he foresees group ski trips.

"We can do it; we just do it differently," he enthusiastically reminds other skiers.

These words will forever go echoing down the years as we celebrate the birthday of George Washington, Father of our Country.


Thomas Jefferson, author of the Declaration of Independence, said "Washington was the greatest of good men and the best of great men."

Senate conservation group considers endangered species

The New Mexico Senate Conservation Committee will consider a bill Tuesday that critics say could end the long standing cooperative state-federal relationship on endangered species.

Senate Bill 57, entitled Endangered Species Listing, was introduced by State Senator Tim Jennings (D-Roswell).

The proposal lines up opponents and proponents on either side of the dividing line of environmental concern.

On one side are the timber industry, ranchers, miners and others who suffer financially from the closing of segments of the state and national forests. On the other side are environmentalists, sportsmen and wildlife specialists.

An analysis of the bill's impact by staff in the office of the Attorney General cited an estimated loss of \$227,500 in federal money if the bill is passed.

The bill flies in the face of the federal/state partnership on endangered species that was established by the Federal Endangered Species Act of 1973.... It would probably result in cancellation of the Cooperative Agreement between the Department of Game and Fish and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service on endangered species, which in turn would mean that the department would no longer qualify for federal... funding (that totaled nearly \$280,000 for 1991).

By declaring that the state will refuse to cooperate with the federal

government's endangered species effort, and thereby jeopardizing the longstanding cooperation between the two departments, the bill will likely sour relations between the state and federal agencies in relation to wildlife issues. Ultimately, this will reduce the state's input and influence on all similar issues.

According to the staff analysis, the bill would:

—amend the definition of endangered species to eliminate the provision allowing the commission to incorporate into the state's list species that have been listed on the federal species list.

—eliminate the provision mandating the state to assist in enforcing the federal Endangered Species Act by prohibiting the taking, possession, transportation of federally-listed species.

—add a new requirement that the director, whenever any species is proposed for listing or delisting, conduct public hearings in each county containing a habitat of the species in question, and make a record of such hearing, including summaries of public testimony. The director must submit this record to the commission as part of his findings and recommendations.

—add a new requirement that the director prepare an economic impact analysis for every species proposed for listing or delisting, and submit that analysis to the commission together with his findings and recommendations.

Lincoln County Commissioner and rancher Stirling Spencer favors

passage of the bill. He said allowing people who live around areas affected by species that may be listed, a strong voice in the decision is their only protection against government excess and interference in local economies.

"The bill asks that any time before a species is listed that Game and Fish go through the same studies in affected areas as the federal government has to do, but more in-depth and locally oriented," Spencer said. "They'll have to look at the impact on customs, culture and economy, as well as the ranges of the species. They'll have hearings in the local area so the government does not run rampant and affect our lives when a species actually is not endangered."

"I don't think anyone wants to endanger a species."

Many urban advocates of endangered species listings, seem to think the only economic impact will be in the immediate areas around the habitat of that species and they won't be affected, Spencer said.

"The truth is they will feel the impact, too, but at a later date. When you close down forests to timber cutting, the price of lumber goes up, not just here in the West, but back East too."

"There should be full disclosure. Our forefathers set up a government of representation that sets things at a slower pace. In this case, it would ensure that the state government is not over-reacting."

As far as losing the \$230,000

federal dollars, Spencer said, that's very little to give up compared to the financial loss to the ranching and timber families that are damaged by some of the listings.

No one cares about the land more than the people who make their living from it and depend upon it, he said.

"Let the people who really know about the animals have a say," Spencer said. When hunters nearly killed off an entire herd of deer, he put up locked gates to stop them.

"I don't want every coyote killed, because then there would be too many rabbits," he said. "I'd like to see a deer or two survive."

Jennings told The Ruidoso News Monday that he introduced the bill because he believes by agreeing to adopt the federal endangered species list by reference, New Mexicans, who are affected by the list, have been denied a voice in the decision.

"Number one, I'm not sure its constitutional for the state to adopt by reference," he said. "We would never consider any impacts in the state of New Mexico, which I think is basically wrong."

"The bill is real simple. It says they have to have public hearings where the habitats exist and weigh the potential economic and social impacts."

"Say it puts 1,000 timber people out of work. If we know the social impact, we can adjust and maybe institute new job training in that area, not just say see you later and ruin the whole economic base."

That's what happened with the federal act. No one even considered what might be happening in New Mexico. The national act was very clear that the states have rights.

"But (the federal officials) came around and said if the state adopts (the list by reference), we'll give you money, which is economic black mail to me."

"We worry more about a government entity losing money rather than the people who pay the taxes. That doesn't make sense."

The attorney general's staff recommended against adoption of the new bill. In its analysis, the staff states that by establishing substantial, but vague, new requirements for economic impact analyses, hearings and hearing records, the bill would open up major new areas for litigation against the state.

The staff pointed out that because the bill doesn't clarify whether it would apply to species now listed, it also would invite litigation concerning those species.

In addition to the loss of the direct federal funding, the bill would burden the game department with the cost of hearings, more studies and record-keeping and the need to hire additional staff to accomplish those directives.

"The bill is internally inconsistent," the staff noted. While some of the amendments seem to provide that the state will have nothing to do with the federal Endangered Species Act, they leave intact the section that allows the commission, by regulation, to adopt

the federal endangered species list. "This contradiction makes the bill virtually impossible to interpret and enforce as currently drafted," the staff stated.

It also would leave unsettled whether species currently on the state's list would have to be eliminated and start the process of listing all over again under the new criteria.

The bill would tie the hands of the Game Department's law enforcement personnel, the staff added. In essence, it would create a corridor through New Mexico from Mexico for the illegal trapping, transportation and sale in the United States of exotic animals that are federally listed such as the jaguars and leopards.

"Renouncing (the state-federal cooperative relationship) seems particularly questionable in light of the fact that this bill does not seem to bring any benefit to the people of the state in return," the staff concluded. "(The game department) already provides full notice and opportunity for public comment every time it considers listing or delisting a species. Adding another layer of administrative and bureaucratic hurdles and accompanying costs and potential litigation, which this bill does, would not help."

Other groups against the bill include the Wildlife Legislative Council, which represents sportsmen, and the Audubon Society in Santa Fe. Representatives of those groups could not be reached for comment.

"Wheeling" proposal would impact electric rates

State legislators are debating a measure this week that supporters claim will lower electric rates for New Mexico residents.

Electric utility companies disagree, saying the bill would open the door for huge companies to come in and make special deals with the biggest users and leave the area companies in disarray trying to recover lost revenues and still provide reliable service to small customers.

And the small electricity consumers — households as opposed to big industry — would have to make up the difference, according to officials with Texas-New Mexico Power Company.

Texas-New Mexico Power, which serves Ruidoso and Ruidoso Downs, is joined by many other private utilities in fighting the bill that calls for "retail wheeling."

They have denounced SB501 introduced by freshman Senator Tom Wray of Albuquerque, saying it would be a "bad deal" for small electricity users and, if passed, will ultimately lead to higher rates for residential consumers and small businesses.

Margot Steadman, a member of the Coalition to Lower Electric Rates, an Albuquerque citizen's group, reportedly favors the measure and believes, through free enterprise, it would lower rates.

According to information provided by Texas-New Mexico Power company, retail wheeling is a theoretical concept in which individual consumers would be allowed to obtain electric service from a power provider other than their local electric company. The outside company would have the right to use the local utility company's lines to deliver power to certain customers.

Utility companies have for years been highly regulated, and Bundick said the local company would still be required to deliver power to all the rest of the customers.

Although the proponents of the bill are emphatic that rates would be lower, Bundick is just as sure that it is highly unlikely the homeowner would ever have a choice.

Under the proposal, one company buys power and pays a wheeling fee to share transmission lines.

Retail wheeling has never been implemented on a statewide basis anywhere in the United States and was specifically rejected by the U.S. Congress last year when considered as part of the National Energy Policy Act of 1992, according to Buddy Bundick, regional manager for TNMP.

"We think it's a bad bill," said Bundick, who was in Ruidoso Friday after spending the early part of the week in Santa Fe lobbying against the measure.

"The attractive customers would be picked off, leaving the rest holding the bag," said Bundick, predicting that the only savings would be to the very big consumers.

Steadman told an Albuquerque Journal reporter that retail wheeling most likely would stimulate competition between utilities and independent power producers rather than pitting utilities against each other.

She explained that if allowed access to a utility's existing lines through a retail wheeling law, the independent producer could compete with the utilities to serve school districts, municipal buildings or major industrial users.

In Ruidoso, the biggest consumers of electrical power are paying bills in the neighborhood of

\$2,000 a month, said Jim Bassett, area manager.

And, if the big customers were picked off by utility giants coming into New Mexico to sell their extra power, the small companies, like TNMP and co-ops, would face raising rates or cutting back on employees and services to meet financial obligations undertaken in view of the current customer load.

"Some small companies or co-ops could face bankruptcy," said Bundick.

He said utility companies have to plan years in advance to match service capabilities to customer loads, and the loss of one big customer could topple a small utility.

Retail wheeling has been rejected at the federal level, and although it's come up in other states, the concept has been turned down there, too.

Looking at the concept from an economic development standpoint, Bundick said destabilization of utility companies is just not a good idea.

If the scenario described by Bundick occurs, with utility giants, perhaps from as far away as California, come in to sell their power to big customers, like a manufacturing plant or factory, and the utility is unable to meet its long-term financial commitments, then the question becomes, who pays?

Advocates for lower rates point out that SB501 would bar utilities from passing the impact of wheeling on to their remaining customers.

Bundick contends it will be the residential customers who make up the shortfall, because a utility is allowed to cover investment costs within the company's obligation to serve.

Texas New Mexico Power Company has joined Southwestern Public Service, El Paso Electric, the Rural Electric Cooperative Association, Plains Generation and Transmission Cooperative and other electric providers, who collectively provide service to the majority of New Mexico's electricity consumers, in strongly opposing SB501 as detrimental to their residential, rural and small business customers.

TNMP currently engages in purchased power and "wholesale wheeling" agreements with other utilities in a constant search for lower cost and reliable power, according to a news release provided by Bundick. He said the economic benefits are passed along to all TNMP customers, small and large, not a select few.

Bundick spoke with pride of TNMP's stability in pricing, noting that the price of electricity has actually gone down over the years in this area.

Currently TNMP serves around 207,000 customers, and of that number 40,000 are in New Mexico.

Retail customers are charged 8.63 cents per kilowatt hour (kwh). According to a report in the Albuquerque Journal, Southwestern Public Service customers in Roswell pay 4.67 cents per kwh and PNM's average retail rate in Albuquerque is 8.72 cents per kwh.

TNMP pays a two percent franchise tax to operate in Ruidoso and Ruidoso Downs, and that amounts to around \$120,000 a year in Ruidoso and \$12,000 a year in the Downs.

"I believe this bill is not only bad for our company, but bad for the customer and bad for the state," said Bundick.

Legislation drafted to help clarify open meetings

A Senate bill designed to clarify the state's Open Meetings Act and to provide better methods of tracking compliance has been introduced by State Senator Janice Paster (D-Bernalillo).

It also provides for two additional exceptions to the act (bringing the total to nine) and for meetings of public bodies by conference telephone or similar communication systems.

Added as a new exception to the open meetings act would be deliberations in connection with an administrative adjudicatory proceeding. That term is defined as "a proceeding brought by or against a

person before a public body in which individual legal rights, duties, or privileges are required by law to be determined by the public body after an opportunity for a trial-type hearing."

However, the bill states that "except as otherwise provided... the actual administrative adjudicatory proceeding at which evidence is offered or rebutted and any final action taken as a result of the proceeding shall occur in an open meeting."

The second proposed new exception pertains to school boards and covers "the discussion of disciplinary action against any individual student; provided that final disciplinary action is taken in an

open meeting."

The already existing exception for discussion of single source purchases of more than \$2,500, has been expanded to include the portion of meetings when competitive sealed proposals are discussed during the contract negotiation process. In both cases, the actual action regarding the purchase or selection must occur in an open meeting.

Under the section describing procedures for going into a closed session, the phrase proposed to be added would require that the subject to be discussed must be stated "with reasonable specificity" in the motion and the vote of each individual member shall be recorded in the

minutes.

Although initially the attorney general's office pushed for public officials to have to swear individual oaths verifying after a meeting what was discussed in a closed session, the new section dealing with verification is somewhat softer.

It only requires that minutes will be presented at the next open meeting stating that the matters discussed in the closed meeting were limited only to those specified in the motion for closure.

When the public body approves the minutes, then each public official essentially declares that the minutes are accurate. That accomplishes the same purpose.


