Streets top survey list for village priorities

Streets and water top the village priority list for the 99 people who sent in written responses to a survey published recently in *The Ruidoso News*.

Transportation hit rock bottom on the list of priorities, with one respondent jumping all the way down to "100" to indicate how unimportant that item is in the entire scheme of village business.

The airport was close behind transportation issues at next to the last.

In their comments and in their ratings, respondents stated emphatically that they want the village to maintain streets and assure a safe and plentiful water supply.

The people surveyed made it clear that they expect the village to take care of the traditional municipal services — like streets,

water and garbage pickup — and leave the rest to private enterprise.

The survey asked readers to rate priorities using one for the most important on down. The list was printed twice, once including public safety departments of fire and police and once without, but readers made it clear that they have confidence that public safety will be placed high on the village's priority list.

Street maintenance was rated tops by 25 people, with a dozen people ranking street maintenance second, 15 people giving it a three and five people ranking street repair and maintenance as number four.

Building new streets ranked at the top for five people, second for three and third for five more; and snow removal was listed in second place by seven people, third by six, fourth by 17, fifth by six and sixth by three.

While a lot of respondents skipped some items on the survey, very few failed to mark streets among their top priorities.


Water is a major concern for many respondents with 14 ranking it number one; 16 people rating water as second; third at third; 10 at four; four at five and two as number six.

Another reader added his own number one: "Water Rate study-10-year delay," and noted the village may have "forgotten how to maintain streets. As number 3, garbage pickup and disposal, this reader warned that villagers are facing a big increase in cost of services.

Garbage pickup was rated as second by nine people; third by 11; fourth by eight; fifth by 10 and sixth by six.

The cemetery, as well as the air-

County negotiates to end lawsuit

The Lincoln County Commission is moving toward a settlement of its federal lawsuit against the Bureau of Land Management (BLM).

According to Commissioner Wilton Howell, as a result of a discussion during a closed-to-the-public session on litigation, commissioners last Tuesday selected a three-man negotiating committee to represent them at a March 25 meeting.

"Our new attorney briefed us on the lawsuit and we agreed along with the attorneys for the BLM, to petition the court for a 30-day stay," Howell told *The Ruidoso News*.

"During that 30 days, no action would be taken on the suit. It will give us time to get with the BLM officials."

Howell said the motion for the stay was filed late last week in federal court in Albuquerque. The meeting with the BLM representatives is scheduled for late in the month to allow agency administrative officials to fly into Santa Fe from Washington. The entourage could include new BLM director Jim Baca, former New Mexico Commissioner of Public Lands.

The proposed exchange of at least 1,115 acres of private land along the Rio Bonito near the historic settlement of Lincoln in exchange for 36,000 acres of federal property elsewhere in the state surfaced about two years ago.

"My goal is to come up with an agreement that's good for Lincoln County and one that the federal government will sign," Commissioner Wilton Howell.

Stirling Spencer and Monroy Montes, two members of the three-man county commission at that time went on record against the swap, pointing to the loss of more private land from the county tax base.

The commission raced to adopt an interim land use plan that would ensure more accountability from the BLM. Commissioners also secured several concessions contained in a memorandum of understanding initiated by agency officials, but never accepted by the commission.

The county's formal objections and contention that the agency had failed to follow its own mandated procedures were dismissed by the former Secretary of the Interior Manuel Lujan.

Shortly before the commission was expanded to five members in January, the incumbents approved filing suit in district court against the BLM, the Department of Interior and the Lincoln Valley Land Company (owners of the Rio Bonito acreage and initiators of the swap). Then later, in an attempt to unravel a 400-plus acre swap that already had occurred, they filed in federal court. The land company

has since been dropped as a defendant and the district suit was combined with the federal.

The major issue that kept the commission from signing off on the memorandum was that the BLM had failed to set a time period for the disposal of 35,000 federal acres identified in Lincoln County for disposal back into private hands.

Howell, who has long advocated reaching an agreement with the BLM, will be part of the commission negotiating team, along with attorney Dan Bryant and Spencer, who has led the fight to wring concessions from the agency.

"We will be looking for an agreement that contains all of the items in the memorandum of understanding previously initiated by the BLM," Howell said.

"But in addition, we will want to know exactly which 36,000 acres have been identified for disposal by the agency (within Lincoln County) and the date when that will be accomplished," he said.

Before the meeting, the threesome will get together to hash out details and ensure that they present a united front.

"Everyone agreed that Stirling and I were naturals to go because

he represents the fight that has been going on for some time, he represents the rancher's philosophy," Howell said. "I'd like to think that I represent a good common sense approach in light of where the situation has taken us. I'm not saying his position doesn't make sense. It's just time to get it over."

"They wanted us to go because if Stirling and I can agree on anything, we sure as heck can sell it to the BLM. And if we agree, when we leave, the agreement will have been signed."

"I'm really excited about it. My goal is to come up with an agreement that's good for Lincoln County and one that the federal government will sign."

Although he was against going to court over the proposed swap, having the court's sanction on an agreement may be to the county's benefit, Howell said.

"This is probably the proper way to do it," he said. "With just the memorandum of understanding, a lot say there's no way to ensure it would be honored. However, if it's signed on by the court and then not fulfilled, it gives us definite recourse."

Once the Rio Bonito issue is behind the commission, Howell said he hopes the board can review the interim land use plan.

He said, "I think we can come up with a better land use plan, one that is enforceable, constitutional and doesn't represent spot zoning by only addressing public land."

Council considers smoking ordinance

Smoking or limited smoking for public buildings operated by the village will be determined in a public hearing Tuesday during the regular Ruidoso Village Council Meeting.

Ordinance 93-4, restriction of smoking areas in village buildings, is one of two public hearings. Resolution 93-6, concerns operational policies and facilities rental of the Civic Events Center.

Regular agenda items for the 6:30 p.m. meeting include: —Steven Hightower's proposal from The Ruidoso Connection, Inc., for lease of land at the airport. Ruidoso Connection and Hightower's Mountain Aviation, Inc., will negotiate a lease from the village for approximately 11,000 square feet of airport space, not including parking, for the construction of an aircraft hangar and office.

—an emergency medical service request for a budget adjustment. Director Jim Stover will ask that \$23,000 be transferred from an operating line item to a capital outlay line item for the ambulance.

If approved, the money will be used as a down payment on the ambulance.

—an appeal of the planning commission denial of rezoning C-2 to R-3. Jeffery Smith, who wanted the property changed from commercial to multi-family residential, will ask the council to reverse a decision by the planning and zoning commission.

The planning commission considered this property to be prime commercial land would not recommend changing the Master Plan.

—a request for approval of pre-application for a crosswind runway at the airport.

Airport manager Lloyd Wayne said State Representative John Underwood (D-Ruidoso) has a bill before the House asking for a severance tax appropriation (on mining) which will provide the village with its share of the project.

—consideration of approval for the organizational chart of the village.

Based on a critical letter by Councilor Jerry Shaw, village manager Ron Wicker is requesting approval of a new organizational chart for the village.

—chamber of commerce requests for advertising budget approval.

Chamber director Joan Bailey is requesting \$20,725 of lodgers tax funds be approved from the council approved contract.

Roses raise money for Lion's Club

Ruidoso Evening Lions Club has set aside Friday, April 2, as Ruidoso Rose Day.

Mayor Victor Alonso, during Tuesday's council meeting, will proclaim Ruidoso Rose Day to help the Lions raise money for their charitable projects.

For just \$15, the Lion's Club members will deliver a dozen roses anywhere in town.

Ruidoso Rose Day will help pay for glasses for schoolchildren whose families can't afford them. The club gets referrals from the school nurse, and works with Dr. Randall Cox on this local project.

The Lion's Club also donates to the national eyebank and funds thousands of dollars in scholarships.

Main Street planner to visit

A National Main Street consultant will visit Ruidoso Monday and Tuesday to take a look at how well the Main Street program is progressing here.

Don Rypkema, a technical service consultant, is touring the MainStreet area and its businesses on Monday with MainStreet Ruidoso director Don Miller. Rypkema will then make a formal presentation on his findings at 1:30 p.m. Tuesday at Ruidoso village hall council chambers. The public is invited to attend and will have an opportunity to ask questions.

He will also discuss the local progress of the program and give insight on how the program fits in with the whole revitalization of the community. Rypkema may also have new ideas on how to improve on what has already been done.

MainStreet board members will also meet with Rypkema in an earlier session to discuss the program too.

Rypkema is recognized as an industry leader in the economics of preserving historic structures. Since 1983, he has provided ongoing consulting services to the National Trust for Historic Preservation and the National Main Street Center.

He has reviewed development proposals, appraisals and feasibility analyses for a range of historic properties, including Lyndhurst, Woodlawn Mansion, The William Aiken House and the James Madison Estate, Montpelier.

He served as the economic restructuring specialist for a three-year Urban Demonstration Program designed to promote commer-

cial revitalization in six U.S. cities and conducted training programs in 30 states and the District of Columbia for the National Main Street Center.

Rypkema was educated at Columbia University where he received a Masters of Science in Historic Preservation from the School of Architecture, Planning and Historic Preservation in 1985. Ten years before he had established The Real Estate Services Group in Rapid City, South Dakota, but has since relocated it to Washington D.C.

He is the author of several publications including "Real Estate and Retailing in Commercial Centers" and "The Economics of Rehabilitation."

From 1987 until 1992 he served on the Board of Directors of the Washington Council of Agencies.

14 of 16 charges dismissed against Lore

George Lore, a Ruidoso businessman who was charged with structuring deposits in a series of bank transactions, was sentenced last week to five years probation and ordered to pay \$100 in court costs.

Lore, whose sentencing hearing was in Las Cruces before Judge Bratton, said he was not fined.

The court also dropped 14 of the 16 counts, all of which were leveled

regarding bank deposits just under \$10,000. He was charged with "avoiding the \$10,000 rule."

"I'm on probation," said Lore whose problems were related to his business relationship with the Tapias, a Mexican family linked to the largest cocaine bust in United States history.

Lore was building a huge home for a member of that family, and

the federal government confiscated that home which was unfinished at the time of the Los Angeles drug bust.

Lore's charges were not drug-related, but were all involved with money.

Lore, who said he is pleased to put this whole thing behind him, will have to write a report to his probation officer once a month.

"I feel wonderful," said Lore,

who pled guilty to two of the 16 charges.

In addition to dropping 14 of the 16 charges, the court ordered the federal government to pay Lore's construction firm, Ruidoso Building Corporation, an undisclosed amount of money for the liens Lore had against the Tapias.

"They sold some of the property and they had the money," explained Lore.

Watch for illegal dumping

Area villages want to put a stop to the illegal discharge of septic waste, and they're calling on citizens to help, according to Village of Ruidoso deputy manager Alan Briley.

"Discharging of septage waste in any location other than an approved discharge site is prohibited," said Briley in a news release.

"If anyone witnesses the above violation, please notify your local police department," he continues in the release. In the Village of Ruidoso, call the police department at 257-7365, and in the Village of Ruidoso Downs, call the police department at 378-4001.

Septage haulers may discharge septage at the regional wastewater treatment plant four miles east of Ruidoso Downs on U.S. 70 between the hours of 7 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. daily.

Two 15-year-old RHS students arrested on charges of taking handgun to school

Two students were arrested last Friday at the Ruidoso High School for allegedly threatening another student with a gun.

Gregory Urias and Wayne Anthony Dusek, both 15, were charged with felonies after a brief investigation by the local police.

Urias was charged with conspiracy to commit aggravated assault. Dusek was charged with aggravated assault with a deadly weapon.

According to police reports, the police dispatch received a call about 9:30 a.m. that a student with a firearm was making threats.

Officers talked to four students at the school who said a gun was stuck inside the pants of Dusek, and that he had directly threatened a student with the handgun.

Detective Lanny Maddox said he found the loaded .22-caliber pistol in an unlocked trunk of a 1975 green Plymouth Duster.

Maddox said the student said he had confronted Urius last week after Urius told him not to leave the school grounds until he was able to see him in the parking lot. The student said Urius told him he thought the cops were coming to get

him and that he had ditched his pistol in the student's trunk.

Maddox said he took the student's statement as a confirmation that Urius had the firearm on school premises on at least two separate occasions.

Maddox said Urius and Dusek later made statements admitting to bringing the pistol to school. He said Urius brought the gun and gave it to Dusek prior to the assault.

Ruidoso Police Chief Richard Swenor, who spoke on guns in school last year, again voiced a

strong statement regarding his department's stand on firearms.

"I want everyone to understand the seriousness of having firearms around the school yard. It violates state laws and federal laws," Swenor said. "Within my power, the situation in Ruidoso is not going to mirror the rest of the country. People come to Ruidoso because it represents a safe place to live. This abuse of firearms will not be tolerated," he said.

Both students were taken to the youth detention center in Alamogordo.

Downs board to rule on animals in village

Ruidoso Downs trustees will make a final decision on allowing members in 4-H and FFA to have animals within village limits at their meeting at 7 p.m. today at the Downs fire station.

A public hearing for the change of ordinance to allow these members to have the animals from April 1 to October 31 is the fourth item on the agenda. The hearing will allow community members to present their comments on the concept, and

after the hearing the trustees will vote on it.

The issue was brought up at the last board meeting in February by the leader of the new 4-H club, Pam Millar. Lincoln County cooperative extension agent Barry Herd and FFA sponsor Shawn Dennis were also at the last meeting in support of the change in the ordinance.

The current ordinance allows no animals in the village limits except horses, with the requirement of

one-eighth acre per horse. It also requires owners to keep the property clean and spray for flies weekly.

A public hearing is also scheduled for an animal control ordinance which will change the prices for licenses for pets, with a reduced rate for senior citizens. The ordinance also outlines how animals are to be kept under control.

Also on the agenda will be a discussion on septic tank user fees and commodity charge increases to help

pay for repairs to the treatment plant. The sewer rates have already increased for residents with a portion of that going for the repair.

Trustees will open sealed bids on a 1974 fire truck the village is selling.

A report on the Ruidoso Downs Ladies Auxiliary arts and crafts fair, bleachers for the Beavers Arena and monthly departmental reports are also on the agenda.

port, is near the end in the list of priorities. But one respondent checked just one choice as her top priority, and that was cemetery upkeep.

Most respondents believe developing tourist attractions should be the responsibility of private enterprise rather than the village.

Falling right in the middle are the library, economic development, parks, recreation and youth activities.

One reader wrote across the survey, "Education #1"

Readers have a lot to say about their village, and most of them signed their responses, although names are not included in this report.

Here's what some of the people surveyed had to say:

Stick to business

The village should leave some of the items (in the survey) for private business to conduct. The village should use the revenue that is available for municipal services instead of wasteful spending on auctions, studies, etc."

"The village should stay away from private business ventures and maintain and advance the municipality business in a reasonable and prudent manner."

"The mayor seems to think his job is to conduct a show. It's not. It's to operate the city well and frugally."

"More attention to residents' needs."

"The village council has the cart before the horse. We need to back up and take care of our village first."

"I believe that the village is responsible to provide basic and essential services. The private sector should handle economic and tourist development, make Ruidoso a good place to live for the residents and the tourists will come!"

"Taxpayers expect basic services

first as residents of this village tourist development and marketing should be secondary."

"Tourist attractions should be developed privately."

"Take care of the basic necessities and that will lead to improvements in the other areas."

"Put residents of Ruidoso's needs first. Water is number three with emphasis on quality and amount, youth activities and facilities are up to schools and parents."

Infrastructure, planning

The downtown retailers could use sidewalks, restrooms and a parking facility for our tourist trade to increase."

"Not sure how streets building fits in. Developers should build streets to city specs."

"Master plan should be approved and voted on by the citizens of Ruidoso."

"The renewal of the walkways is the most important to start combined with a better city decoration (flowers)."

"If we are a mountain village wanting to attract tourists, we need decent streets (with stripes), good water, attractive parks and recreation. To charge to use parks would be stupid."

"Our first priority should be maintaining and improving the infrastructure then we can work on development, growth and 'nice to have' projects."

"I know the mayor said roads were not his priority, but I live and work here and I need to get around. As for tourists, driving down one of our great streets get a flat, ruin their cars, not matter what wonderful attractions we have, I wouldn't come back!"

"The main priority must be water quality. Our tourists and locals shouldn't get sick by drinking water in Ruidoso."

"1, 2, 3, 4 and 5 (street maintenance, water, garbage pick-up, snow removal and enforcing regs) should all rank like number 1. Thank you for your allowing us residents to score these things."

Cleanliness

"Village council provide the leadership, the motivation and plan to clean and beautify the village. A plan whereby all the community gets involved. Also have a serious plan to maintain a clean and well maintained village."

"Clean main street once a week."

"A long-time visitor and now owner of vacation home here. One reason I also spend time in Oregon; cleanliness well-kept towns. The natural beauty of the area will sell itself. Send the right signal: 'we locals are clean, substantial and dependable.'"

"I'm furious because they have removed all the dumpsters in Black Forest and left three by the entrance gates which no one will be responsible for to clean up."

"I wish that this community be maintained in the luxurious, healthful clean manner that our taxes entitle us to."

Leadership

"Elect capable mayor and council members that do not have so many conflicts of interest."

"The present council shows little interest in defining what is important what is not and then taking action on the most important problems — malaise."

"Elected officials are paid representatives — servants of the people and community. To honorably serve the people's majority priority interests. Otherwise resignation or reelection of these officials is in order."

Suggestions & kudos

One respondent added on as 12, "free ski area in town with hand held lift." He also suggested, in-

stead of continuing the Economic Development Corporation, "how about a small business development center at ENMU-Ruidoso?"

One couple added sewers as number one, and also suggested more town meetings.

"I'd like mailboxes put on more streets, especially in that area that uses the Hollywood Post Office. It's a traffic jam there."

"Good idea (the survey). Analyze the results vs. what receive the most effort by the village."

"The mayor should name a committee to study and recommend ways of cutting government city spending to help cut taxes."

"I think the town meetings are a great idea."

"Would only have number two garbage pickup and disposal if it was to include an aggressive recycling program."

"Tourist marketing by a tourism board similar to Alamogordo, not marketing by a couple of chamber employees."

"No bus transportation, use taxicabs."

"Transportation for senior citizens and school kids," responded one reader, who listed transportation last among his priorities.

"Snow removal is being handled well now."

"Think you do a good job of reporting. I have been here 40 years. My father was a newspaper man, in fact, I was born in the back of a newspaper office."

"First class law enforcement is top priority on my list!"

"Had you listed the animal regulation enforcement, re neutering cats and dogs/breeders license, confinement, leashed would have been number 9. Would add to the safety of the community."

"Village needs a Better Business Bureau. Quality of work done in new homes, auto repairs poor in many instances."

"Caring about families, #9"

"If we 'take care' and improve on our natural resources and our residents, people will come because of our positive experiment."

"RE: priorities like the other part-time residents who pay full taxes, which we intend to provide the best of services in the beautiful community we feel cheated that we receive inferior maintenance of services. It seems that our taxes are used for empire building or business interests."

"The library needs more up-to-date books and a nicer and larger children's library — more youth activities for teens."

"Please continue to report what goes on in our village even if councilors do object. Councilors should be more responsive to people."

"If proper items are accomplished, items like economic development will take care of themselves."

"I am totally opposed to mass transit and the sign regs."

The News received 99 responses, and of that 99, 70 were signed. Some responses were for couples instead of individuals, and one respondent, Don Mathews, wrote the letter:

"I was very pleased to see that you requested a citizens survey regarding the priorities for our village. You asked us taxpayers if we want to subsidize various business and enterprises (like a mass transit system) or do we want our leaders to take a more conservative approach to using taxpayers' money."

"I believe that many of the citizens of Ruidoso resent the fact that our mayor and city council seem to represent only the merchants and innkeepers of our village. Indeed, the council is composed mostly of these people. They seem to be willing to impose any taxes on the citizens which will enrich themselves. Mass transit is a classic example. The motorcycle rally is another example. There are many other examples of this disregard for the citizens of this village."

"There are many, the majority, if you include both the (full-time) residents and (part-time) residents (and visitors) of the village, that are retired people. They are not interested in lining the pockets of the merchants and innkeepers at their expense. They want, and expect, decent and adequate services such as public works and maintenance for their taxes. It is unfortunate that there is not greater representation on the council for this 'silent majority.' Until this occurs I am afraid the citizens will be at the mercy of this council who have never seen a tax, or self-serving proposal, that they could not enthusiastically endorse. All at the expense of our basic services."

But since coming to the Lincoln County Humane Society animal shelter as a stray about two months ago, Dandelion's life hasn't been a bed of flowers.

The rottweiler mix gave birth to a litter of nine puppies. Shelter manager Randy Basch moved mother and babies to the more isolated and quiet quarantine area, but the stress of the kennels was just too much for Dandelion.

"There is something about the makeup of all mother dogs that they would rather kill their litters than take a chance of a another predator getting them," Basch said.

Dandelion was so fixated on her brood that she actually licked through the skin of two of her puppies. Another one died and Basch was forced to destroy all the pups.

"The chances of raising a litter in a shelter kennel and keeping them healthy is practically nil," he said.

A similar situation also occurred with Adobe, a good-looking cinnamon and buff-colored shepherd mix previously featured as pet of the week.

"Both females still are looking for their puppies," Basch said. "It's heartbreaking."

Dandelion and Adobe need loving families willing to take the

time to help them get over their loss.

"Dandelion is very sweet, affectionate and playful," Basch said. "She's an excellent kids' dog. She has a good heavy coat and would need a large yard and plenty of exercise."

Black and tan in color, Dandelion has medium length hair. She and Adobe would have to be spayed.

Currently, three other rottweiler mixes also are residents of the shelter.

A recent owner-released black cocker spaniel named Beau Noir also is looking for new owners.

"The previous owners apparently had children who tormented the dog and when he decided not to let them continue, they got rid of the dog," Basch said. "For that reason, he probably would do better in a family without children."

Beau Noir is selective in choosing friends.

"He's very unsure with new experiences and people, but once he has warmed up to someone, he's a very affectionate dog, a typical cocker," Basch said.

Beau Noir should be an indoor dog. He is about two years old, already neutered and housebroken.

Plenty of other dogs and cats are waiting at the main shelter and the nearby cattery for someone to adopt them. In addition to previously featured pets, there are two black and white huskies, several puppies in the four month age range with shepherd and husky mixes and var-

ious colors, and several medium to small-size dogs.

Past pets still looking for love are:

—Panda, the four-month-old border collie pup, who is lively and affectionate. She's one of the fortunate few pups put in a foster home after she was dumped by her previous owners with several other siblings. She's very sociable and healthy and has been sponsored for her spaying.

—Pinto, a blue eye-brown eyed terrier, who's about one year old, very intelligent and neat in her kennel. She's white with brown spots and would make a terrific jogging partner.

—Tucson, who rides low to the ground. A possible Welsh corgi-dachshund mix, he's very sweet and calm. A favorite of shelter workers, Tucson needs someone he can call his own. He's very lonely.

—Chocolate Sundas, one of those sweet dogs who are crazy for attention. The minute visitors start to pet her, she just melts into their arms. A border collie with a split black and white face, Sundas is about nine months old and gets along with everyone.

Ballyhoo, a droopy-eared Walker hound, who is sweet-tempered. About five months old, she would make a good tracking dog and would thrive on a ranch or in a rural area where she could bay when the mood moved her.

—Cobbler, a strikingly attractive golden retriever mix male who's about seven months old with a white body and tan ears. He'd be a great pal for a child.

Some tourists turned off by local hosts

Tourism is the wheel that turns the Ruidoso economy, with a great deal of time and money spent in promoting the area and its attractions.

But, over time, many visitors have complained to The Ruidoso News that their vacation dreams were shattered because of their treatment by some lodgers.

With no "better business bureau" in the area, visitors have taken their problems to the news media.

Two families enjoying Ruidoso over the recent Christmas holidays contacted The Ruidoso News regarding lodging.

Councilor J.D. James happened to be in The News office when one

of the families arrived.

After contacting a travel agency in Houston, the young couple and three children arrived at a Ruidoso motel sometime after supper one cold evening to find they had no heat in their room and no bath towels.

Tired, they walked to the office to pick up some extra blankets, but the office was closed.

That night, wind whistled through an inch gap at the bottom of the door and the husband took ill.

They left for the Lincoln County Medical Center where the father was treated and a prescription written.

Back at the room, the family

tried to take a bath, but there was no hot water.

Complaining to the front desk employee, they were told "hot water" could not be guaranteed.

The family decided to check out and move into another motel in town. They were then charged an extra day for early check out from the motel they departed.

Last week, another tourist wrote The Ruidoso News to tell the following story:

"We paid in full for lodging and meals for our planned visit to Ruidoso on December 28-29, but had to cancel on December 16.

"The owner refused at that time to refund the prepayment, stating that the room would remain empty

because she would accept no more reservations, she said the chamber was asked that day to stop referrals.

"We have since read that the holiday season brought record number of visitors to the city, and we find it hard to believe that another couple was turned away with an empty room available.

"Unfortunately, we were here in Atlanta on those dates and the owner refuses to communicate with us regarding even a partial refund.

"The loss of \$212 will not change our plans for Ruidoso residency, but we now must hesitate when making "blanket" recommendations to others regarding local lodging."

The council is now getting many ideas ready for school spirit. They will have a spirit week and dance in conjunction with SADD March 22-27.

The group is having its second annual Spring Olympics on April 8. They are also doing a campaign called Buckle Your Bod, and in April they will attend the district meeting in Clovis.

AARP offers free tax help

Al Guzeika and Bill Dean will tell you that you can get something for nothing.

They are volunteers with the AARP Tax Aide program which helps low income taxpayers with their income tax.

In Ruidoso, tax aide volunteers will be on duty from 2 to 4 p.m. Mondays until April 15, at the Ruidoso Senior Citizens Center. For more information, call 257-4565.

"Residents with less than \$16,000 income for the year may be eligible to receive rebates. They just have to file a New Mexico tax return and claim the rebate," explains Guzeika in a news release.

"That's not all, they may be eligible for the earned income tax credit on the federal return which entitles them to a tax refund even if they had no tax withheld," adds Dean.

Volunteers with the AARP Tax Aide program have helped hundreds of older taxpayers over the last 25 years. Most of the taxpayers are elderly, but some are younger with low incomes.

The program started 25 years ago with four volunteers who helped some 100 taxpayers with their tax returns. This year more than 30,000 volunteers are working at 9,000 locations nationwide and are expected to help approximately 1.6 million taxpayers.

In New Mexico last year, 275 volunteers at 95 locations helped about 20,000 taxpayers.

"The AARP Tax Counseling programs has only been in Ruidoso for the last three years, but each year more taxpayers take advantage of it," says Dale Miller, coordinator for Lincoln County.

"We now have five volunteers helping low income taxpayers, and we could do more if we had more volunteers. It is a very rewarding experience."

Other volunteers are receptionists, Sharon Miller and Marie Traweek, who put taxpayers at ease.

The counselors receive special training through the Internal Revenue Service and the New Mexico Department of Revenue and Taxation.

Tax collections up for January

Gross receipts tax collections by the Taxation and Revenue Department reached a record high in January, according to Dick Minzner, department secretary.

"We collected \$119 million in January for sales made in December, about six percent increase over last year," said Minzner.

"But more importantly, collections in the first seven months of the fiscal year are eight percent above the same period last year."

Minzner attributed the increase to a stronger than expected New Mexico economy and a higher level of voluntary compliance by taxpayers.

"It is difficult to put any figure on increases in voluntary compliance, or even to prove that it is occurring; however, the results we are seeing in collections are the results we would see if voluntary compliance were improving," said Minzner.

Minzner also stated that corporate income tax collections are running about 13 percent ahead of last year's collections for the same months.



Changing environment endangers animals

When I talk to various groups, organizations and individuals about wildlife one of the topics that often comes up is "endangered species."

When asked why some species are in danger of extinction, most people respond that humans are killing them. As they answer, I can almost see the picture they conjure up of a hunter out there with a gun, blasting away at all kinds of animals. Hunting has had an impact, but there are also many other human activities that have been far more deadly.

Take the American bison for example, hunting was a major cause in its decline. Of course, I'm not talking about regulated sport hunting, but hunting for profit or market hunting. Railroads built after the Civil War opened up the western plains, home of from 60 to 100 million buffalo. This provided a means to ship large numbers of hides from the western prairies to eastern market places. Herds of buffalo at times numbering as many as four million animals, migrated across the plains searching for forage. This made them easy prey for market hunters and literally millions were slaughtered for their hides.

The devastation of the buffalo herds was not only very profitable it was also encouraged by U.S. Government policy as a way to subdue the Plains Indians. Buffalo were their mainstay and extermination of the herds led to their defeat. Competition for prairie grasses was another reason for the demise of the buffalo. Cattlemen, attracted by the rich grazing of the west, moved in huge herds of cattle that took over range once occupied by buffalo. Finally, there remained one small herd of 250 animals living at Yellowstone Park.

Buffalo were just one of the animals hard hit. Elk, antelope and deer were also heavily

hunted to provide fresh meat for railroad workers and miners. These species, through protection and management, have managed to rebound. Why not the buffalo? It doesn't take much imagination to see that large herds of these big animals migrating around on the plains will never happen. The plains are now crisscrossed with highways and divided by fences. Towns and agricultural crops occupy the prairies that once nourished herds of buffalo. There are few areas left for them.

There is another story that is truly a black mark on American history, the passenger pigeon. Billions of these birds once darkened the sky traveling in huge flocks that could cover an area a mile wide and 240 miles long. Once again, market hunting started the extinction of the passenger pigeon. Millions were smoked out of roost trees, netted and sent to cities for food.

Even with the heavy toll taken by market hunters, passenger pigeons might still be around today except for their nesting and feeding habits. They required hardwood forests within their range to supply nuts and acorns for food and shelter for nesting. Their fate was sealed when these forests were cleared by loggers.

Then there are other species that were never hunted and still face extinction, such as

the black-footed ferret and the California condor. These species were never abundant to begin with and have possibly become too specialized to survive in our modern world. Specialization leads to vulnerability.

The black-footed ferret depends on prairie dogs as almost their sole source of food. Programs were carried out to eradicate prairie dogs and eliminate their competition with livestock. The downfall of the prairie dog led to the demise of the ferrets. The only known colony is now in a captive breeding program in Wyoming.

All California condors are also in captivity for a breeding program to try to reestablish their populations. Their problem is their extreme sensitivity to human disturbances. They require large areas of wilderness free of the slightest encroachment by man. California has attracted masses of people which have crowded the condors into smaller and smaller areas.

An even greater threat to wildlife than hunting are the degradation and changes in our environment brought about by agriculture, industry and increasing human populations. They bald eagle, peregrine falcon and osprey have low population numbers because of the use of the pesticide DDT. Residues of this chemical in their bodies cause these birds to produce eggs with very thin shells that crack during incubation.

Thinking about it, the answer to the question "Why are some animals endangered?" that most people give is right. Humans are killing them, but which is the culprit—profit, the plow, the chemical factory, the chainsaw or the hunter?

Utility regulators stick with MRS siting process

Nuclear Waste Negotiator David Lacey was given a vote of confidence and the Mescalero Apache Indian Tribe a ray of hope in siting the Monitored Retrievable Storage (MRS) facility on the reservation. The search for a voluntary MRS site through the Nuclear Waste Negotiator's office gained support by regulatory utility commissioners in

a meeting held last week in Washington, D.C. Before it convened for the winter, the Executive Committee of the National Association of Regulatory Utility Commissioners (NARUC), passed a resolution. The resolution specifically concerned voluntary and negotiated processes regarding interim storage

siting through the Nuclear Waste Negotiator's office. The resolution stated that the Department of Energy (DOE) has responsibility for development of this nation's MRS and other interim storage programs pursuant to the Nuclear Waste Policy Act. It further stated that an MRS could accelerate the removal of

spent nuclear fuel from the nuclear reactors and provide the DOE with a waste processing facility. The MRS, according to the resolution, is a voluntary and negotiated process that has proved successful in other countries in resolving difficult issues and may expedite the siting process in the United States.



Fifty years ago

My thoughts drifted back to the great Australian people, so kind, so courageous — such loyal friends of ours, who stood with us shoulder to shoulder during the war.

Their National folk song, "Waltzing Matilda," went echoing through my memory. I thought once more of their tame and gentle wild animals — koala bear, wallaby, flying fox and flying squirrel, and their wonderful birds, parrots of all kinds, many-colored kingfishers and the lyre bird.

Also the flowering trees acacia, jacaranda

and Christmas bush.

After leaving Australia, I went all through New Guinea, the Philippine Islands, and from there came home and arrived here in the Vale in early February 1945.

I have fond memories of the Australians, the New Guinea natives — who carried many a wounded soldier out of the jungle to safety — and the Filipino people.

Saint Patrick's Day

After February, with so many special days, comes March with Saint Patrick's Day all by itself out in the middle of the month on the seventeenth.

The Irish, fond though they are of their Emerald Isle, have wandered to the distant corners of the world, taking with them their love of their green island, their traditions and their songs. To say nothing of their great love of life, their friendly spirit and their devout nature.

And so taking one thing with another, the honoring of the Patron Saint of Ireland has become a world-wide celebration.

The New York Saint Patrick's Day parade is the second largest in the world, second only to the one in Dublin, Ireland.

Parades are staged all over the world, notably in Texas, a state with a strong Irish tradition.

New Mexico also has an Irish tradition, including the celebration at our own San Patricio.

Since Ireland is the Green Island, Saint Patrick's Day is a celebration of the green — of spring which comes three days after.

ENMU-R professor likes to see that light come on for students

It's hard to imagine Judi Whitecotton being apathetic about anything. Enthusiasm bubbles forth, no matter what the subject, and spills over onto her students.

And she has plenty of students. Whitecotton teaches introduction to computers, computer software, advanced word processing and interpersonal communication classes at Eastern New Mexico University-Ruidoso.

This semester, she even took a computer class to the Mescalero Apache Reservation and a communications class to Hondo.

Although Whitecotton said she is seeing more immediate high school graduates attending local university classes each semester, the predominate group still is "middle age."

"It's just neat seeing them in the classroom," she said. "The first night, I can read their expressions and they're saying I can't believe I'm taking this class. But after they become comfortable, it's great watching them relax and open up to the material. I encourage all adults to take a course in computers whether for credit or community education to see how wonderful computers are."

Whitecotton earned a bachelor of science degree in business education from Louisiana College in 1978, and a master's degree in public administration from the University of Oklahoma in 1986.

Her teaching experience includes two stints at Capitan High School, first in business and then in English; several college positions in Korea and Japan and as a business

educator at Ruidoso High School.

She also was employed as a personnel specialist for the Ruidoso-Hondo Valley Hospital from 1979-81 and as an administrative assistant at the University of Texas at Austin.

"I've always been interested in the business world and did my undergraduate work in business education," Whitecotton said. "I found out I liked teaching other people better. Helping them learn to think on their own and not just master secretarial skills."

She enjoys teaching at the high school and college level. The thrill of "seeing the light click on" mentally when someone grasps a new concept is exciting, she said.

Whitecotton's husband, Bill, now a pilot for Mesa Airlines, previously was a fighter pilot and was sent to Japan by the Air Force for four years. Whitecotton taught elementary classes and Central

Texas College communications classes at Yokota Air Base.

She also taught English to Japanese students while learning from them about their culture and home life.

"We rode the rails all over Japan," Whitecotton said. "The people were friendly and helpful."

The couple, already with one son, Kurt, a licensed black belt and instructor in Jujitsu, adopted three Japanese children. Daughter Tashina now is in third grade and sons, Aaron and Jacob are in first.

While assigned to a base in Korea, Whitecotton said she submitted a proposal for a parking lot that was chosen over a plan laid out by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers. She also was a volunteer teacher for the family support center at Osan Air Base and a business and management teacher for Central Texas College on the base.

"I bring all that experience back into the classroom with me," she said. "The message I try to convey is that there is nothing you can't do. Try it. I tell my students 'Don't mind asking anything as long as you can stand the answer.'"

The Whitecottons had lived in Ruidoso about four years before being assigned to Japan and Korea. When they came back to the States, they resettled here after they managed to convince officials Tucson wasn't the right spot for them.

They thought Lincoln County would be a good place to raise their children.

Whitecotton and other instructors at Eastern New Mexico University-Ruidoso are being profiled by The Ruidoso News in a community service series.

The features will give prospective students a chance to find out what courses are available at the instructional center and to learn about the backgrounds and credentials of those teaching the classes.



School board to act on athletic director's resignation Tuesday

Toward the bottom of the Ruidoso School Board agenda Tuesday, but of most interest for many alumni and parents, is the resignation of Ronny Maskew as athletic coordinator.

While Maskew filled that post for the past three years, Ruidoso High School teams saw mixed fortunes. Track and cross-country, coached by Maskew, excelled, claiming a district championship. But football and basketball continued to struggle with losing seasons.

Maskew told The Ruidoso News Monday that one of the main reasons he resigned as athletic director was to spend more time with his track and cross-country teams.

"I've been gone a bunch working on the reclassification (of athletic categories based on the size of schools)," Maskew said. "I've missed too many track and cross-country practices and they're my first love. I'd rather just coach track and cross-country."

During the past year, the administration of the athletic program came under fire on two issues: the adoption and handling of the current athletic code and the decision to cut Tularosa from the playing schedule.

School officials backtracked on

the latter decision and reinstated Tularosa after loud protests from residents of both communities. At the time, Maskew said he felt the decision to remove Tularosa was in the best interests of the Ruidoso football team.

More recently, the father of a senior athlete protested the athletic code adopted last August, which he contended denied students due process by requiring that they be removed from a sport for the season on a first offense involving liquor or illegal substances.

The code had been approved in reaction to punishments the previous year that varied broadly among coaches and athletes.

The school board called for a citizens' review of the code and sent out questionnaires. A report on that study is due Tuesday.

The meeting will begin at 7 p.m. in the administration complex.

Maskew, who has taught in the Ruidoso area since 1979, said he will be staying in the district as a teacher and coach.

District Superintendent Mike Gladden told The News he will advertise within the district first for applicants to fill the vacancy and hopes to have a recommendation within one month.

"Ronny will finish out the year and transition the new person," said Gladden.

TO THE EDITOR:

After listening to the speech made by the President, I would like to express my concerns with this plan. I am against paying more taxes and the way this program works out, it will be the largest increase in history. Raising taxes now will destroy the economy.

We are just starting to see a dim light of recovery and the President is pushing us backward. The last time there was a tax increase (during a recession no less) the revenue was supposed to be used to pay the national debt. We now have many plants closing their doors and laying off thousands. General Motors is closing four plants and laying off 200,000. Sears is laying off 50,000. IBM is laying off thousands. Where is the job market for these newly-trained workers? Welfare recipients could, instead be given civic duties such as cutting weeds, cleaning highways, maintaining parks, urban renewal construction or work in hospitals and daycare centers to perform the necessary services for the compensation they already receive.

As you know, New Mexico is rural America. We will really suffer with this Clinton plan to stop subsidizing our rural electric companies. The price of electricity will be out of our budget range.

The plan for National Health Care will bankrupt the nation. Who wants to be told when they can see a doctor and have their doctor picked by a bureaucrat? More and

EDITOR'S NOTE: Lincoln County Humane Society shelter manager Randy Basch explained that the society only keeps \$5 out of each adoption fee, not enough to cover the overhead of caring for a dog. The rest goes to veterinarians for a shot and sterilization. "Our priority is placing the animals in responsible homes," Basch said,

and he will work with new owners. The adoption cost may be spread out over a two-month period after paying \$20 down. Or, a sponsored animal, whose sterilization costs have been paid by a benefactor, could be selected at a greatly reduced price.
