Nuclear waste storage options still could include an MRS site

The Clinton administration has not spoken yet on the subject of nuclear waste disposal, but according to a story published Tuesday in "The Energy Daily," a broad plan is beginning to take shape.

A nuclear storage site on the Mescalero Apache Indian reservation may or may not fit into the plans of Energy Secretary Hazel O'Leary.

Among his last acts as head of the Department of Energy, former Secretary James Watkins wrote a letter that might have put an end to the voluntary host program that catapulted the Mescalero reservation into the world of nuclear waste.

That program, funded by the Nuclear Waste Fund, has provided two grants to the Mescalero Apache Indian tribe. The grants, funded through the Nuclear Waste Fund, are earmarked for the study of siting a monitored retrievable

storage (MRS) site, presumably on the reservation.

An MRS is a system of temporarily storing radioactive spent fuel rods in a form where they can be retrieved and moved to a permanent site sometime in the future. Yucca Mountain repository is expected to be that permanent site, but problems there could delay placing the highly-radioactive nuclear waste in a final home.

Meanwhile, the federal government, through the Nuclear Waste Act of 1982, set up a process of taking custody of all high-level nuclear waste by 1998. In an amendment to that act, a process was set up to acquire "volunteer hosts" to store the waste.

The voluntary program relies on public input and participation and provides financial incentives to the entity that accepts the waste.

In Watkins' letter he raised questions about the voluntary pro-

gram, and recommended the spent fuel rods be stored on federal land.

But, meeting with the National Association of Regulatory Utility Commissioners (NARUC) last week, O'Leary left DOE options open.

"The secretary did say she wanted to quickly get an understanding with a sovereign entity, likely an Indian reservation, to serve as the host for a monitored retrievable storage site," according to the report of that meeting.

But she said she also could see several problems with that solution to the nuclear waste issue, and told the group she'll ask Congress for help. She mentioned the possibility of storing waste temporarily at federal facilities.

After that meeting the council passed a resolution restating its commitment to the voluntary siting process.

"The transportation problem,

how to get it to a sovereign is a big problem," Ron Russell, a Michigan Public Service commissioner is quoted as saying. "And she (O'Leary) has mentioned there are several ways you could define an MRS. It could just be a concrete pad or an elaborate research facility. But she is concerned about having 70 sites around the country."

O'Leary told the NARUC that her major priority for now is staffing her department.

The Office of Civilian Radioactive Waste Management reportedly has prepared an option and initiatives paper for O'Leary. "The Energy Daily" reported that the paper outlines several ways the DOE can begin taking title to spent fuel in 1998.

A DOE official reportedly told "The Energy Daily" that options might include the secretary asking

MainStreet expert pinpoints program strengths, problems

After 36 hours in Ruidoso, Don Rypkema had a few facts and comments to share with the public Tuesday about MainStreet Ruidoso and the future of downtown development.

"I have no idea what the answer is, but I do know there is a solution out there for you to find," Rypkema, a National Main Street consultant, said.

Rypkema and National Main Street program associate Rojean Evans were in Ruidoso Monday and Tuesday to find out more about the community and to assist the MainStreet group in assessing where it will go from here. Evans will continue to work with Julie Johnson, state MainStreet director who was also in Ruidoso, from Washington D.C. on any projects that the MainStreet organizations across the state are doing.

During his presentation Rypkema said in his time in Ruidoso he had learned several facts about the community, one of which is that change is going to take place. He said it could either be determined by the vagaries of the market place and those outside the community or

here at the pace and scale this community wants.

"No one has to live here and that is not true of most places in the country," he said.

"One reason people come here is because of the quality of life, which is a fragile commodity. It can't be replaced," Rypkema said.

He said there is no method, forum or mechanism for this community to decide what will happen in five years.

No two main streets are alike but there are some common factors they all usually share. Rypkema said some of the common factors are that it is a home of institutional leadership, serves multiple functions, serves as a place for public gathering, is the employment center, is pedestrian oriented and gives the town a sense of community.

A whole lot of these aren't true here, he said.

It is pedestrian oriented and Rypkema said he suspects that it does offer a sense of community because the institutional leaders, such as the village and the businesses, are supportive of the downtown.

"This gives abnormal challenges and opportunities to redefine the

downtown," he said.

Rypkema said the MainStreet concept of four points, promotion, economic restructuring, design and organization are all important to the enhancement of the value of downtown.

"MainStreet Ruidoso has to be described as a giant success because they said in the long run they have to make substantial changes in the physical downtown and that is now coming to fruition (with the streetscape improvement plan)," he said.

It was the absolute correct decision but they need to now look at

other elements, he said. He heard a lot of ideas in his short time including the completion of phases two and three for the streetscape, the river walk and the effort to survey merchants, customers and locals for basic information.

Rypkema said the downtown can be a success if there is a sense of community ownership.

"You won't have a successful downtown without it. It is crucial we attract the community to participate in non-sales activities," he said.

Two die in early morning accident

Two people were killed early Saturday when the driver of a car headed west on U.S. 70 near Hondo fell asleep at the wheel and collided with an oncoming pickup truck.

Dead at the scene at mileage marker 280 were the driver Ashley Turner, 19, from Kingwood, Texas, and Lauren Brandt, 19, from Spring, Texas.

Taken to Lincoln County Medical Center in Ruidoso was a passenger, Michelle Sivanni, 20, from Kingwood. She was listed as being in stable condition and still in the intensive care unit Monday.

According to a report filed by State Police Officer Rob Avilucea, at 8:35 a.m. Saturday, Turner and the two passengers were headed toward Ruidoso on U.S. 70 in a 1991 Mitsubishi when Turner fell asleep and the car left the road.

Apparently, Turner awoke and over corrected, crossing the center lane of the highway. Avilucea reported.

The car was struck sideways by a 1984 Chevrolet pickup truck heading east and driven by Kevin Gomez, 20, of Glencoe. Neither Gomez nor his passenger, William Gomez, 58, also of Glencoe, were injured.

Avilucea noted that no alcohol was involved and seatbelts were in

use.

Gomez was pulling his eight-year-old quarterhorse, Katie, in a trailer behind the truck. The trailer came off at impact and flipped, landing nose down and on top of the truck, according to veterinarian Warren Franklin, who was called to tend the animal.

"It's a wonder she wasn't killed," he said. "She was upside down. We tranquilized her and attached ropes to her front legs to get her out. She got right up and just had multiple bruises and cuts."

Also this weekend, the Ruidoso Fire Department stayed busy answering calls to a series of grass fire calls, a structure fire and several minor vehicle accidents.

On Sunday, about 4 p.m., firefighters were called to 100 Ramer Drive where they extinguished a fireplace fire that also caught the attic on fire.

A spokesman for the fire department said three units and eight people answered that call. He said there was minimal damage to the house.

Children playing with matches were blamed for two of three grass fires this weekend. The youngsters weren't identified in one case, but were located in the other.

MainStreet meets


MainStreet Ruidoso is finishing up its fifth year with an annual membership meeting on March 18 at Cree Meadows Country Club.

Reclassification to equalize schools in state competitions

The future classification of schools for district athletic competition will be put to a vote next Wednesday when coaches from across the state meet with officials from the New Mexico Athletic Association.

Ruidoso school district athletic director Ronnie Maskew updated the School Board Tuesday about proposals being considered.

Every school district in the state had an opportunity to submit a plan, he said.

Five proposals to be put to a vote include that:

schools will be divided into five classes (instead of the current four). Classification will be determined by placing 20 percent of the schools into each classification.

A school may elect to move up a classification, but must move up in all sports. If competition in a specific sport is not available in their respective district, schools may choose to move up to a higher classification for that sport only.

to be voted on by single A and double A schools only, the two classifications will be combined for football with 11-man and six-man divisions. Only schools beginning football or with 100 student membership or less can play six-man. All schools presently playing six-man football can be grandfathered into the six-man division.

the time a school would be allowed to stay in a classification it has outgrown would be shortened from three years to two years.

Presently, it takes three years after a school goes over the maximum before it moves to another classification and in that time, it

could grow from 1,200 to 1,800," Superintendent Mike Gladden said.

Each school would provide a student count in grades nine through twelve on the fortieth day of enrollment, beginning in the fall of 1993-94.

Gladden said that under the existing classification system and the proposed, Ruidoso would stay in the lower enrollment end of the class even though it would move from 3A to 4A.

Coach Roger Head, who handles junior varsity basketball and assists with football, suggested the board look at declaring the district independent under another proposal the association will consider.

The proposal would allow high schools to apply to the association executive committee for independent status for a two year block of time.

"It's very difficult for young athletes when they go two seasons in a row win-less," he said. "It's difficult to teach the proper attitudes."

Being independent would allow Ruidoso to play teams closer to their size.

The current 3A enrollment range is from 401 to 1,200. Under the proposed that would expand the number of classes and using 1993 enrollment figures: class 1A would cover Mosquero with 14 students up to Magdalena with 91; class 2A would start with Melrose at 92 and go through St. Catherines at 175; class 3A would range from Mora with 192 to Thoreau with 477; class 4A would go from Pojoaque with 517 students (Ruidoso at 568) up to Belen with 1,159; and class 5A would encompass Espanola Valley with 1,227 students to Gadsden's

2,788.

Gladden said association officials in reviewing new district lines, have agreed to create competition areas with equal numbers of teams and will consider travel times.

In other action, the school board: approved a system of reimbursement to employees for unused sick leave days as an incentive for better attendance.

At the end of each year, unused sick leave would be reimbursed at a rate of \$200 extra for 60-120 days and \$400 for 120 days or more.


Board president Ron Hemphill said he liked the plan better than previous suggestions because the board will be able to calculate the impact each year.

Gladden said the estimated cost is \$9,800. It will take two years for an employee to reach the 60-day mark. About 49 employees are now in the 60 to 100 day range.

agreed on a suggestion from new member James Paxton to move the board meetings to the public information room at the high school starting with next month's regular meeting and for the duration of construction on the administration complex.

"Nothing would tell me it (the downtown) is for more than the visitor."

He told the group that while he was preparing his speech for the meeting he had gotten a headache. He went from the MainStreet office to find a place to buy aspirin. He walked from the Gazebo Shopping Center to GTE and didn't find a place to buy it. If any of the stores did sell it, they gave no indication they would have that type of item.

He said there is a whole lot of information the community needs to know that it doesn't. Rypkema said they can't move forward without knowing that and the survey is the first step in doing that.

"This community needs to decide for itself what it wants. Say what are we and build on that. What is this place? What do we like and want to keep? What do we want to change? The hard part is thinking it through," he said.

Joan Bailey, executive director of the Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce, agreed the downtown

has to be more for the community.

"So much of what we've done is for the visitor. Let's have something for us first," she said.

Earlier in the day Tuesday Rypkema was to meet with Bailey, representatives of the village staff, the Board of Realtors and the Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce, but only Bailey attended. The group was joined by two MainStreet board members and a business owner.

Rypkema said he wanted to just listen to what the group had to say. He asked several questions to get to know more about their perceptions of the community.

Bailey said the town has a high turnover of businesses because it is hard for them to survive when they don't realize what it is going to happen in the off season. People come here and say they would love to own a business. They don't make a plan to consider all times of the year.

Rypkema said they can approach the problem of keeping businesses open in one of several ways. One is to not see it as a problem, just let

them go. The second is to recognize it as a problem but don't do anything to stop it. The third is to see it as a problem and ask what can be done about it.

Margaret Lahey, incoming board member and former president of the organization, said at one time at village hall the staff had made packets for people who came in for business licenses. It had brochures on all the organizations and what they could do, but they don't necessarily come in before they open the business.

One place they might be able to put the information is in area banks and also give it to property owners who are selling their property.

Rypkema asked how the community can guarantee quality of future building and improvements. All agreed MainStreet can be the example for the community, but it takes planning too.

"Most planning we do now is three or four inches at a time but we should be looking at the next mile," said Jerry Mattox, business owner.

for statutory authority from Congress to take title to nuclear waste in 1998, and store it at a federal site as recommended by Watkins.

Another option is to step up funding for a universal container system, and the third option is the volunteer hosts for an MRS.

Office of Civilian Radioactive Waste Management staffers reportedly are "cautiously optimistic" a non-federal MRS site can still be found.


They also are exploring new technologies at the Los Alamos and

Argonne National Laboratories for handling waste by transmuting it into smaller mass or less toxic forms of radioactivity," according to "The Energy Daily."


Meanwhile, the Mescalero Apache Indian Tribe is working on its second phase grant.

And the Village of Ruidoso, through its MRS Advisory Committee, is continuing to fight the placement of high-level nuclear waste in this area.

Also on record opposing the MRS proposal are Governor Bruce King and the entire New Mexico congressional delegation.

Flecks and Tingler are waiting for new homes

Ice blue eyes mask a warm and tender heart in Flecks, a blue heeler mix with a gentle soul. "She'd be a good working dog, ideal for a ranch or farm, or a great companion for someone who likes to take long jogs and is active," said

Bandy Basch, manager of the Lincoln County Humane Society shelter.

White with a spray of small black dots, Flecks is about two years old. She was brought to the shelter by her owner, who said she didn't get along with other dogs. "But she does fine here and

there always are other dogs around," Basch said. "To keep her happy and out of mischief, Flecks would need room and plenty of exercise."

"She appears to have received some training, because she walks well on a leash and obeys some commands."

Flecks would require spaying, but Basch said for the right home, a sponsor probably could be found willing to bear that expense.

Flecks has short hair and would require little upkeep.

For feline fanciers, the cattery next door to the main shelter is temporary home to some interesting residents, including a black-cat sister duo, who give a great show playing in their shared cage. They would provide hours of entertainment for a new owner.

Tingler, the featured feline this week, emits a deep purr and gives a great massage. Very out-going, she came to the shelter as a stray and appears to be a Siamese mix with blue eyes and a short tail, which could indicate some Manx.

She's about two to three years old (no kitten-type problems) and would need to be spayed.

Great news from the State Legislature. With little opposition (one vote), the proposal to require that all animals adopted from New Mexico shelters be spayed or neutered was approved by the House Tuesday. It already was approved in the Senate. Now it's up to Governor Bruce King to sign the measure into law.

Supporter Shirley Hendrixson

from the Humane Association of Albuquerque said she doesn't expect any problem in the governor's office.

A provision was inserted to give shelter manager's some leeway in unusual circumstances. But the passage is a big boost in New Mexico toward lowering the population of unwanted pets who end up being abandoned by uncaring owners and destroyed at the expense, emotional and financial, of animal group members and taxpayers.

The goal of these groups is to lower the rate of reproduction to decrease the number of cats and dogs put to death each year, as many as 200,000 in New Mexico and 14-million nationwide.

Although the number varies each month, about 1,200 animals are destroyed each year locally. Even though the Lincoln County shelter cannot operate on a "no kill" basis, Basch's humane philosophy aims at giving every adoptable candidate the maximum chance.

Unlike many government or other society operated shelters, the Lincoln County society under Basch's management holds animals for months, if possible. Only when the shelter begins to fill, does Basch resort to euthanasia.

Ruidoso already has a mandatory spay and neuter ordinance in place, the second in the nation. The city council, at the urging of Basch and society members, became one of the leaders in the humane movement last year with its passage. They also acknowledged that thrusting the re-

sponsibility on the irresponsible pet owner, lessens the long term cost to the taxpayers they represent.

With warmer weather, the dogs at the shelter are getting restless and would welcome a walk by a friendly visitor. Some people put off coming out to the shelter because they don't like seeing the abandoned animals, knowing their possible fate, or because they cannot adopt.

But Basch advised that those people instead should think of the happiness a brisk walk, some play and a dog treat brings to the animal.

For those unable to adopt, spending some time with a dog or cat is relaxing and good therapy for stress. The cattery has a separate playroom where a visitor can sit down and get to know a new friend.

After a few encounters, a visitor may decide to become a sponsor for one of the abandoned pets, greatly improving their chances for survival and a new home.

The employment network even offers a 30-day "hot leads" service for hard-to-fill or time-sensitive jobs.



Properties redeemed before '93 tax auction

Originally 98 parcels were to be on the block earlier this month for non-payment of delinquent property taxes.

But by the time of the sale March 4, only 16 were available, said Lincoln County Treasurer Janice Ware. Fifteen parcels sold. One received no bids and will be offered again next year by the state.

Ware said the amount of tax due on the 16 parcels was \$13,625, but the sale total went higher, to \$14,275, because some of the bids were higher than the tax amount due.

"The state only remits to the county what is due for taxes," she said. "Any excess reverts back to the property owner."

When the delinquent list first was published, 23 parcels contained houses, but by the time of the sale, only one left was a lot in Carrizozo with a house. The rest were vacant lots, Ware said.

"My office collected \$52,232.15 from the items on the tax sale list prior to the sale through the concerted efforts of the office staff with personal phone calls and letters," Ware said. "The state only is required to send certified notices to delinquent property owners, along with any others who may have an interest in the property, such as a lien holder."

"But they send the notices to the last address they have on file. They do not make personal calls or contact directory assistance."

Accidental discovery may end obesity

WASHINGTON—Researchers may have discovered a way to end obesity—by accident!

In a study with a potential cholesterol lowering agent, scientists noted an unusual side effect. Instead of lower cholesterol levels, patients receiving a natural plant colloid lost weight while body weight in a control group remained constant.

The scientists say the mechanism behind the weight loss is not clear, but suggest it is partially due to a decrease in the intestinal absorption of calories. Scientists in another study published in the *British Journal of Nutrition*, found that patients consuming the same colloid lost weight in spite of being instructed not to alter normal eating patterns. Despite this evidence, other scientists may not agree on the weight loss benefits of colloids. Someday, pending further study, there could be universal agreement that colloids are helpful in confronting the problem of obesity.

National Dietary Research, whose research topics have been the subject of articles published in recent medical and nutritional journals, has successfully incorporated a series of colloids into a chewable food tablet called FS-1. When used as directed, FS-1 replaces high calorie fats with lower calorie nutrients, thus providing optimum nutrition with a minimum number of fat calories. According to an article published in the *American Journal of Clinical Nutrition*, consciously limiting the amount of food one consumes is not necessary to lose weight, provided you limit the fat.

ENMU athletic director resigns after 18 years

B.B. Lees, the director of athletics at Eastern New Mexico University since 1975 and a member of the university faculty and staff for 37 years, has announced his retirement effective July 1.

Lees has served as head coach of several sports at ENMU and coached the golf team to twelve consecutive NAA District VII championships. He received bachelor's and master's degrees in physical education at Eastern and is an associate professor in health and physical education.

Lees joined the athletic staff in 1956 after four years as a coach and physical education instructor in Portales and Clovis public schools.

During his campus career, he served as head coach of football, baseball, tennis, track and golf. He

was also chairman of the department of Physical Education and Recreation.

Lees said that retirement was an extremely difficult decision for him to make as the University had been a large part of his life since 1948 when he enrolled as a freshman after graduating from Big Spring, Texas, High School. During his undergraduate years, he lettered in several sports.

"I've been fortunate to have been part of many exciting and successful things at Eastern over the past years," said Lees. "The University won many NAA national titles and we've had excellent success in the Lone Star Conference."

The 1992-93 Zia basketball team won the conference championship

and the 1991 Greyhounds won the conference football championship.

"Probably the most significant thing that has happened during my time at Eastern has been my joining the Lone Star Conference," said Lees. "It has helped our university, allowed us to set good schedules for our teams and increased our ability to recruit good athletes because of the strength of the conference."

Lees is a former president of the NAA Golf Coaches Association and has served on several NCAA committees. He is currently a member of the NCAA Division II men's basketball committee.

University President Everett Frost said that Lees' contributions to ENMU and the athletic program were immeasurable.

"He has played a valuable role

not only as a former coach and member of the physical education faculty but also as the director of the athletic program for the past 18 years," said Dr. Frost.

"In recent years he has guided the University into the Lone Star Conference and Division II of the NCAA and through his leadership the University has been very competitive," he said. "Under B.B.'s guidance, the coaches have also been concerned about the athletes as successful students."

"He has always had a tremendous loyalty to Eastern and is a master of interpreting the many complex NCAA rules."

Dr. Frost said that a search would be initiated immediately for Lees' successor as athletic director.

Bald eagle numbers soar across New Mexico

The annual survey of wintering bald eagles in New Mexico shows a 58 percent increase over the 1992 count, said Bill Montoya, director of the Department of Game and Fish.

Montoya said the count is second only to the 1990 record of 512 bald eagles. The total represents a 120 percent increase over averages in the early 1980s and a 61 percent increase over averages in the late 1980s.

"In general, over the past dozen

years, the number of bald eagles counted in aerial surveys has increased on the average of about 100 birds every four years," Montoya said.

The New Mexico surveys were flown January 12-15 in conjunction with the National Wildlife Federation's annual census of bald eagles in the lower 48 states. The Department of Game and Fish has participated in the studies since 1979. The agency's Endangered Species Pro-

ject biologists conduct the counts.

High water at Ute Lake was attributed with the high count of bald eagles there. Sixty-six eagles were counted at Ute Lake, an increase from the count of 32 in 1992. Other notable concentrations included 56 eagles at Conchas Reservoir and 41 at Santa Rosa.


In the southern part of the state, Elephant Butte and Caballo reservoirs had 85 wintering eagles, with

the majority of those found in the upper portion of Elephant Butte.

The Chama River in the north continues to be an important wintering area for bald eagles, Montoya said. Fifty-one bald eagles were counted between Espanola and Heron Reservoir. In the northeast part of the state, 75 bald eagles were counted from Las Vegas to Maxwell, up from 50 in 1992 and 28 in 1991.


Saint Patrick's Day

ENMU guitar prof stays in tune with his students

Learn to play the guitar from one of the best players and teachers in the state, C.K. Stribling.

The class, offered through the Ruidoso branch of Eastern New Mexico University, will be from 7-8 p.m. Monday and will continue through May 8 in the band room at Ruidoso High School.

The class will begin with the very basics and will include tuning, chords, accompaniment and solo playing. Stribling said the lessons will be structured for the individuals in the class.

"We want everyone to be comfortable and have a good time," he said.

Students will learn country or western, pop rock, folk and classical. The cost of the course will be \$80, plus the cost of the book, which will be about \$10, he said. The books are now available at the university office.

To register for the course, people should call the college office at 257-2120. Stribling will be able to teach about 20 students.

Beginning in June the college will offer a music degree with a major in applied guitar as a four-year program. Stribling said they will offer individual guitar lessons

for credit as well as guitar ensemble classes.

As the talent in these classes is developed they will be able to do concerts for the community, he said.

Stribling said some of the classes will have to be integrated with classes at the main campus in Portales. He said that may mean an instructor from Portales may come here for a semester, but it will be scheduled in a way to complete the degree here.

He said he hopes the students in the program will also be able to make contributions to the area's future fine arts center.

Stribling said there is an excellent market out there for people with this degree. The emphasis will be on teaching because the main openings are in public schools and universities.

Students could also become performers, but Stribling said that is a less stable position.

Stribling, who is a native of Taos, began studying classical guitar at the age of seven with Ramon Hernandez, concert guitarist-in-residence with the Wurlitzer Foundation in Taos.

He received the Wurlitzer

scholarships in 1956 and 1957 to study guitar. He then began his professional career as recitalist and accompanist for flamenco dancers in northern New Mexico.

Stribling also helped organize the Classical Guitar Society of New Mexico and had served as its president.

Part of the terms of receiving the Wurlitzer scholarship required Stribling to use his efforts to get guitar accredited at the university level. He has taught programs at the University of New Mexico at Albuquerque, New Mexico State University at Las Cruces and University of Texas at El Paso.

"I primarily started as a performer, but teaching is just as enjoyable. Teaching is more rewarding," Stribling said.

Court orders counties to protect environment

A federal judge in the District of Oregon has ruled that county governments have an obligation to protect the environment and the people within their boundaries, according to an attorney for a Western states coalition.

In the case of Douglas County vs. Lujan, decided in December, the court found that in designating critical habitat for the Northern Spotted Owl, the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service failed to consider the socioeconomic and environmental consequence under National Environmental Policy Act requirements.

Karen Budd, attorney for the Coalition of Arizona/New Mexico Counties for Stable Economic Growth, said the Douglas County attorney argued that county residents suffered some actual or threatened injury to proprietary, environmental, economic and procedural interests as a result of the

service's failure to comply with the requirements.

In his ruling, the judge stated that the information that results from compliance has a valuable function in informing the U.S. Congress, the Executive branch, local governments and the public about the environmental consequences of agency actions.

Budd called it a significant victory for local governments. "This will allow for a much higher degree of participation in critical habitat designations than previously possible," she said.

The critical habitat designations for the owl were suspended by the judge until the service completed an Environmental Impact Statement. The service subsequently requested that the designations be allowed to stand until the statement is completed.

The coalition members are united in the concept that pro-

tection of the environment does not require the destruction of the cultural and economic activities of humans, Budd said.

The 14 county representatives and general members from both states will attend a public meeting at 9 a.m. March 20 at the Capps Elementary Gymnasium on Highway 260 and Buckskin Road in Heber, Arizona. The Douglas County case will be updated, along with other ongoing coalition projects.

Dangerous highway should be redesigned

The state may be rebuilding the wrong road.

For years now the State Highway and Transportation Department has planned to improve and widen Mechem Drive (a state highway) from the corner of Sudderth all the way out to Ski Run Road.

The department has designed, conducted public hearings, redesigned, gathered citizen input and gone back to the drawing board on the project. The final design could be as ambitious as a five- or six-lane divided freeway-style highway or as simple as resurfacing and improving the present roadway.

Meanwhile, despite some congestion during ski season and a good many potholes, traffic continues to roll down Mechem with very few accidents and minimal delays. The vehicle crashes that occur on that street are usually fender benders, with the only serious accidents on a steep stretch outside the heavily populated business district.

On the other hand, on the other side of town, travelers to Ruidoso take their lives in their hands on a stretch of U.S. Highway 70 from Ruidoso Downs through the Valley. That highway, a speedway for 18-wheelers — some of them pulling two trailers, has been the site of more than a dozen fatalities over the past few years. That narrow and curvy road carries a heavy load of business and recreational travelers, and it needs to be divided for the safety of travelers.

Let's ask the State Highway Department to work with the federal government and take whatever steps necessary to place that dangerous stretch of U.S. Highway 70 at the top of its priority list. State and federal agencies should find the funds to divide Highway 70 through the Valley. Too many lives have been lost there.

That dangerous highway must be rebuilt, even if it means delaying the much-debated State Highway 48 project.
