LCMC finance picture healthy

Another busy month for Lincoln County Medical Center paid off in revenues for the group as it prepares to close out its fiscal year at the end of March.

Before discussing the well-being of the hospital, though, the board welcomed two new members to the family. Sonny Sanchez of San Patricio and Tom Battin of Ruidoso will now be serving on the board to replace Clem Weindorf and Bob Finley.

Sanchez owns and operates a school bus and said he was honored to be selected to be on the board, which his father, Ben, also served on.

Battin is the president of Ruidoso State Bank and he had served on several hospital boards in his hometown of Lubbock, Texas.

Back to business, board members were told February activities were comparable to December and January, which were million dollar months, but with only 28 days the month didn't quite make the mark. Valerie Miller, hospital administrator, reported to LCMC board members Thursday night the month was up \$113,441 from February 1992.


If the county mill levy amount is subtracted from the other revenues the hospital and Carrizozo Health Centers receive, the loss for the month would have been \$6,723.

On a year-to-date basis the excess of revenue over expenses is \$104,620 ahead of last year and \$67,523 under budget. By subtracting the mill levy amount the deficit of revenue over expenses is \$174,457 compared to \$269,735 in 1992.

Miller said the hospital and centers are definitely going in the right direction. So far March has been another good month and she expects to at least hit budget and possibly make \$30,000 to \$50,000 for the fiscal year.

She does expect the volume to drop off in the next few weeks because the high activity period for Ruidoso will be over until closer to summer. Miller said physically the people need a break because they have been going full speed since

Geographically, Ruidoso is about to get bigger.

In a special meeting last Wednesday, the Ruidoso Village Council gave its blessing to annexing both sides of Carrizo Canyon to and including Carrizo Lodge.

Village manager Ron Wicker said that James Porter of C-Net Corporation, owner of some of the Carrizo Lodge condos, had expressed an urgency for the project to be completed by the end of June.

The prime reason for the annexation is to install a water line to the Carrizo Lodge property. "He's (Porter) pushing the project. If it can't happen by the end of June, he basically said, it wouldn't do him any good," Wicker said.

He gave no further explanation to the council.

The council discussed a report prepared by water department head Richard Sanchez that estimated the cost of the new water line to be about \$81,700. That estimate included installation of the line, about 1,400 feet, with fire hydrants, oversizing the six-inch lines with eight-inch lines and picking up the difference in the oversizing. The estimate also included 20 six-inch gate valves, eight eight-inch gate valves, 18 keys, 33-hundred yards of base material for fills and cuts, two road cuts and labor.

Wicker said in a meeting with Porter that they had talked about

MainStreet celebrates

MainStreet Ruidoso members gathered Thursday at Cree Meadows to celebrate the group's fifth anniversary.

"You need to be very proud of yourselves," said Johncox.

Ruidoso's program is through most of the design and planning on a streetscape plan that will go into construction soon, with plans for a river trail not far behind.

Deyo recalled that MainStreet Ruidoso started in 1987 with a University of New Mexico Design team that came back in 1988 with a downtown revitalization plan for the village.

Margaret Lahey was village planner when the program was adopted, and has continued working with MainStreet even though she resigned her municipal job in

December 1987.

Lahey was the first president of the MainStreet board, and she just rejoined the board.


Deyo said the early years were dedicated to organizational work, such as adopting by-laws and gathering committees. After the first two project managers designed, Mary Maul took the reins in October of 1988, and led the group as it planned and carried out many special events.

Maul now is a consultant on the streetscape program, and Don Miller is at the helm.

Miller distributed pie charts showing that MainStreet Ruidoso is supported mainly by the Village of Ruidoso (83.2 percent), with 15.9 percent coming from dues and 0.8 percent from other sources.

He said his goal is to balance that chart, with the public sector providing at least 50 percent of the operational monies.

Also Thursday, certificates of appreciation were handed out to several people and groups in-

strumental in MainStreet's funding and success.

State Representative H. John Underwood and Senator Pete Campos were named, but both were in Santa Fe for the legislative session. Certificates will also be

Council considers annexing Carrizo area

annexing the Carrizo Lodge property by petition or by the initiation of the village. He asked the council to proceed with annexing both sides of Carrizo Canyon up to Carrizo Lodge.

Wicker said the quickest way to expedite the work would be for Carrizo Lodge to initiate a petition for annexation, because it would take the village longer.

The village manager discussed issues of water rights and how that might come into play. He said C-Net feels that its water rights will come into play for \$30,000 to \$40,000.

Porter suggested Carrizo get \$15,000 for the water rights and sewer lines.

"That was another issue, the sewer lines, that they had paid for several years ago," Wicker said. "The owners, then, had paid for it, which we never owned. We have maintained it over the years, but we do not own it. What they want is \$15,000 credit for the water rights and the sewer line."

Wicker said the village's annexation ordinance requires the person annexed donate the water rights.

"That's not a bargaining issue," he said. "But the sewer line is

something that we need in our possession."

Wicker said Porter had come up with a proposal whereby neither party would put in the fire hydrants, which would save about \$10,800.

The best estimates that we have at this time on the base material, instead of \$16,000, would be split at \$8,000 each. They would assume the cost of half of the eight-inch gate valves and the price of the six-inch line which is \$15,000," Wicker said.

He estimated Carrizo's commitment at this time to be \$27,900 and the village's commitment to be \$32,400 plus labor. He stressed the project had to be accomplished no later than the end of June.

My concern is, this is a 1,400-foot pipe, more or less, and will require three to four weeks construction time. It's a necessary utility that needs to be put in, if we intend to annex Carrizo Canyon up to and including Carrizo Lodge," Wicker said.

The village manager said by oversizing to eight-inches and putting in the T's for the fire hydrant, the village can go back after it's annexed to put in those fire hydrants

"They (fire hydrants) really wouldn't serve Carrizo Lodge at this time," Wicker said.

Councilor Barbara Duff asked if the utilities would be tied into the Camelot subdivision.

Wicker said at the place where Camelot touches Carrizo property, it could be annexed from that point, rather than extending any annexation up Carrizo Canyon.

Mayor Victor Alonso clarified that such an annexation where Camelot touches Carrizo property wouldn't have any difference in the utilities or the costs.

Councilor J. D. James asked about the advantages of annexation.

Wicker said he didn't have the figures village planner Cleatus Richards had submitted. He said it would take about five or six years to pay back the village's initial investment with ad valorem taxes.

"We're not talking about a lot of money as far as being able to recoup it. Five or six years is not a long time," he said.

Alonso said if the estimate was reduced from \$87,000 to \$32,000 plus labor, that should increase the payback.

Wicker said labor was estimated

at \$8,600. He said Porter was more than happy to go out and purchase the necessary pipe, gate valves and feeds.

"He can do it without going out for bids," Wicker said. "He said we can just give him credit on water for a year or two until the credit was eaten up."

Wicker said he had already given Porter a list of specifications.

Alonso asked how soon after annexation of the Carrizo area can the village start charging the residents access fees to the sewer?

"I don't know whether we're charging them access fees or not," Alonso said.

Wicker said the last time he checked with water department supervisor Mary Wimberly, the village was charging them twice the regular rate.

Councilor James and Mayor Alonso both said they were surprised at the charge since they don't own the sewer and it's in the county, not within the village limits.

Wicker said the council adopted an ordinance last year that anyone outside the corporate limits would be charged twice the rate as those inside the corporate limits for any utilities.

"That still doesn't answer the question of whether or not we have the right to charge them for the line being in close proximity to their lot like we can here in the village. You

Blaze destroys cabin

A fire of unknown origin destroyed an apparently unoccupied cabin in the Bonito area last night.

At 7 p.m. Sunday evening, passersby on the road near Runnels Stables noticed flames and drove to a nearby residence to report it.

Bonito Volunteer Fire Department (BVFD) and the U.S. Forest Service (USFS) arrived to find the one-bedroom residence destroyed. The fire, however, had not spread to nearby buildings or vegetation.

Within minutes, firefighters had contained the blaze. Unable to determine its origin, they called the arson investigation team from Santa Fe.

Firefighters and Lincoln County Sheriff's Officers (LCSO) could not locate the owners of the property at press time. The property is located at the end of the Bonito Road at the entrance to Big Bear Canyon. Neighbors, however, believed the

property belongs to out-of-towners and had been rented or loaned this week. The property adjoins the Lincoln National Forest.

Wednesday morning are firefighters fought a five-acre grass fire on an Alto ranch.

Witnesses said Marshall Peebles of Shamada Ranch on Fort Stanton Road had been cutting fence cable with a torch when the hot end of the cable recoiled, starting fires in the dry grass.

When fire crews arrived, they found heavy smoke and fire fanned by winds rapidly spreading into trees. Wind was blowing away from the house and stables, said a BVFD spokesperson.

Firefighters from Nogal and Fort Stanton volunteer fire departments as well as the USFS and New Mexico State Forestry assisted BVFD,

Death experience makes local man really appreciate life

Marked across the February 11, 1993, date on Barbara and Mike Miller's kitchen calendar are the words, "I Love Life." That is the day family and friends say Mike came back to life.

The ordeal began February 7 when Miller, manager of the Yogi Bear's Twin spruce Jellystone Camp Resort, suffered an intense migraine headache.

"I had migraines when I was a kid," says the 37-year-old. "But glasses stopped them, and this one was different."

It would not let up, and over-the-counter medications were useless. The next day saw no relief either.

"By 8 a.m. Tuesday morning I knew something was wrong," wife Barbara says. "He was pale and not acting right."

Even answers to her questions were "off the wall," she states with certainty. She called Miller's dad, Dr. Joe Miller, a retired veterinarian now living in Ruidoso who once served this area, and the two of them took Miller to Lincoln County Medical Center (LCMC) somewhere around 9 a.m.

We think sometime between the time he entered and before noon Miller died, Barbara says softly. Dr. Gary Jackson was on call.

"I was given Mike's rings, asked about organ donations and where did he want to be buried," Barbara adds quietly. Miller was a victim of a massive stroke that pushed him into a coma.

The next few hours are pretty hazy for Barbara, but she credits Dr. Jackson and the LCMC staff for pulling Miller through thus far.

"Next, the talk centered about if and everyone said it was a big 'if

— he came through, he would probably be paralyzed on his right side but more than likely it would be his entire body," remembers Barbara.

She adds that she knew Miller would not want to be a vegetable, preferring quality over quantity of life. But what does one do?

That dark Tuesday became Wednesday, and quickly spread among family and friends. Prayer chains were activated and prayers went up all across the United States.

Love and support began to work, emphasizes Barbara. Friends Tom and Linda Billingsly, who run the Bradley Fruit Stand in Hondo, shut it down and came to be with Barbara.

Believing that Miller would be back to normal soon and knowing that like so many Americans the Millers did not have health insurance, the Billingslys established a medical fund at the First National Bank in Ruidoso with Don Swalander, the pharmacist, as trustee.

The posted flyers simply stated that the man who has given so much to others needs your help now. Miller, however, was getting help from another source.

Sometime during Miller's "death," Jim Myers, a close family friend of many years, says he will swear that he saw Miller's mom, who has been dead since '88, walk down the hospital corridor heading for Mike's room.

Miller has no problem with that statement because he saw his mom wearing her usual attire, a gray, flowing muumuu.

"Her hair was pulled back like she always wore it, and she looked healthy ... even though she died of cancer that had wasted her away," Miller says as a matter of fact. "She

was looking at me and being very supportive," he adds.

Barbara recalls that Miller and his mom were very close.

"Then I saw Grandma, who died three months after Mom, and she encouraged me, too. Last, I saw Grandpa, who has been dead for 25 years, and he was adding his support," Miller happily recalls.

He emphasized that there was a feeling of love and support that surrounded him all the time. It was the same feeling of love and support that surrounded him all the time. It was the same feeling he experienced when family and friends came to visit while he was in the deep recesses of the coma.

"I had read that people in a coma could hear even though they couldn't communicate ... so I rubbed his arms and spoke of our future. I knew his friends loved him, too, so I invited them to come and visit him," Barbara relates.

Barbara says he must have wanted to be a part of all of those good feelings because he tried to sit up twice. There were no bright lights or a tunnel, just love.

Thursday morning, February 11, Barbara placed a call to the hospital to see if he had been medicated yet. (He was given a mild sedative for his brain seizures.)

She was informed that he had not been given any medication as he was up writing notes and more notes.

"I don't know how fast I got to the hospital," Barbara says.

The first thing he asked for was his wife; the next was a racing form.

"I've been reading those forms for years, and I'm just like my mom ... it sure gives me real enjoyment,"

Miller jokingly says.

He had some difficulty in speaking at first because his mouth was so dry, but by the end of the day he was walking and talking. Later on the nurse came to change the sheets, and Miller volunteered to help!

Mike's like that, friends will say. He will give you the shirt off his back. Big, lovable Mike, the guy who will dress up again as Yogi Bear at Jellystone Park, now knows he is not immortal.

"I just didn't think that it would happen to me. I should have realized that a two-pack-a-day smoker for the past 22 years, burning the candle at both ends, being overweight and having high blood pressure would make me a candidate for a stroke, even though I am only 37," Miller says as he shakes his head.

He knows that if he is going to again give wagon rides and open up the pool and Jacuzzi this next season, he will have to change his lifestyle. His brother, Jim, is keeping things going at the RV park while Mike is recuperating.

Giving up smoking is the hardest. Then there is the 1,800-calorie-a-day diet he is experiencing and the reduced work load.

He is now under the care of family physician, Dr. R.L. Annala, and he hopes for a quick, full recovery; but he is not "out of the woods" yet, says Barbara.

The latest CAT-SCAN revealed that there are still spots on the left side of the brain, and he still has some headaches and nausea.

But for a guy who to all intents and purposes was dead, that's not bad.

Downs doles out lodgers tax funds

Two requests from the Ruidoso Downs Lodgers Tax Advisory Board may be at the bottom of the list but will likely be the biggest item on the agenda of the Downs trustees board meeting at 7 p.m. today.

The lodgers board will be recommending that \$5,000 go to the Museum of the Horse and \$5,000 to the Lincoln County Cowboy Symposium. It is the same amount the two groups received last year.

The tax fund has a balance of a little more than \$41,000 at this time.

The mayor had approached the

advisory group earlier this year about setting a cap on the total for allocations, similar to Ruidoso's board has done, which is at \$1,500. The Downs board, though, decided not to because the members wanted to be able to be flexible for groups with a worthy cause. The group also pointed out that Ruidoso is using much of its money for an advertising program through the chamber of commerce.

Also on the agenda for the meeting will be a request tabled from last meeting to possibly trade land with a Downs resident Robert Beavers. Beavers has a piece of

land near the village's dirt pit, while the village owns a piece of property that runs through Beavers' roping arena.

Maintenance supervisor Dennis Riddle had suggested at the last trustees meeting it may be beneficial to talk to Beavers about the trade.

Other agenda items are appointment of trustee Margie Morales to represent the village in the Economic Development Corporation of Lincoln County, the resignation of police officer Bobby Angermiller and a proclamation for Small Business Week.

November.

The Carrizozo Health Centers have a year-to-date gain of \$16,533 with mill levy funding of \$174,247. The amount puts them \$1,790 ahead of budget.

Ruidoso Emergency Medical Service had a small gain for the month and is ahead of budget by \$68,564 because it had been expected to lose about \$50,000.

The board received a written request from Jim Stover, EMS director, for a tariff increase for the service. The EMS has not had an increase in three years, while inflation has increased by 13 percent. Stover proposed a tariff increase that will generate about seven percent more revenue. They would then increase tariffs again in 1994 or 1995 to catch up with increased costs.

The service has experienced increased costs in salaries by \$60,519, in medical supplies by \$3,855 and in insurance by \$8,280. They would also like to expand to one more crew, for a total of four, to provide the coverage that is in demand.

The increase would not result in an across-the-board increase but in the adjustment of its varying rates.

The Ruidoso Village Council has already given approval for the increase, and with the board's approval Stover will now go before the State Corporation Commission.

Even with the approval and if the state commission OKs it, the service may have to stay where it is at because of the national proposal by Hillary Clinton and her task force on national health-care.

Miller said the task force is proposing a freeze on costs for hospitals, physicians, long-term care units, pharmaceutical companies, medical suppliers and health-care insurance premiums for a two-year period to be able to develop a plan.

"I am really disappointed with this proposal. We did this in 1974, and although there may be slight relief because insurance premiums will be frozen, it won't freeze utilities or food prices," she said. "It was touted as the brainchild of America and I could have come up with this proposal without going to Washington. It's not very brilliant," Miller said.

Board president W.C. "Dub" Williams said another problem is that they did not get the input of those involved, such as the American Medical Association, American Hospital Association or the insurance companies representatives.

Miller said a member of the 1974 hospital price freeze committee, which was a part of the Economic Stabilization Act, is again on this task force. The result of the freeze at that time was that many hospitals got into severe financial trouble, and many went out of business.

"LCMC has not had a rate increase since 1990. If this goes through as long as we can maintain and increase volume we will be all right," she said.

Miller said in her opinion there are a couple of simple steps they should have taken. Mandating a single way that all insurance claims are filed and paid would save \$56 million, according to reports she has heard. At LCMC 90 percent of the work load is figuring out patients' insurance plans and how they are to be filed.

Tort reform is also necessary. Miller said 90 percent of Congress is lawyers and until then doctors will be practicing defensive medicine. Doctors are frightened of lawsuits and it removes their willingness to rely on their abilities, she said.

Miller said she also believes they need to employ an independent firm to run a cost analysis on all the legislative mandates the medical profession must comply and have the analysis published nationwide. Two examples are the Americans with Disabilities Act and the family leave bill.

Costs to comply with legislation went up by \$100,000 last year, she said, and that cost just had to be absorbed. Miller said she is not anti-handicap access and the hospital has been remodeled for handicap access but it would have to be updated to meet the new requirements of the ADA.

"In many cases we spend a lot of money and it doesn't make us any better. It's a bureaucratic nightmare," she said.

Williams said the state and federal authorities mandate these changes. To deal with it they have to increase costs but then the authorities point the finger at hos-

pitals for raising costs. The board also reviewed and approved a draft of a letter to the county commission requesting \$1.2 million from the county mill levy funds. The amount requested for operational costs is the same amount, \$390,000, as it has been since April 1990.

Miller said they are keeping the same amount despite an increase by \$100,000 in free cars provided. With this increase the total amount of free care equals about \$1.12-million.

She said she had to include any items that were approved for this year and didn't purchase. They had encumbered \$200,000 for possible remodeling for the Carrizozo Health Center. The parking lot has been redone along with some other minor changes, but it isn't likely they will remodel at this time, she said.

A strategic planning committee may be weighing these concerns when it makes its long-term goals during the next few months. Miller announced the committee, which is made up of board members, staff members, physicians and community members, will have its first meeting next week and should complete the process in three to four months.

She said they will be retaining a firm that did a market analysis for them in 1990 to help determine how far LCMC has come and what still needs work. They need to determine what else can be done to provide health-care to Lincoln County residents.

In other business Miller announced the LCMC scholarship application deadline is April 15 and counselors at all Lincoln County have the applications available. Seniors planning to go into a health-care career are eligible for the scholarship.

Nellie Ruth Jones reported the LCMC Auxiliary has been working on "dressing up" the rooms at the hospital. They have purchased tables, over-the-bed tables, drapes, valances and chairs to spruce up the rooms.

Jones said a new member, Dorothy King, really got behind this project and made it a success.

Miller said she is really excited about the rooms because they were so dreary before and the over-the-bed tables were also inconvenient because they didn't have rollers.

know the 100-foot rule. Over there, there's probably some residences or a ... will be within 100 feet. Yet, you're charging them twice when they hook on, if they hook on," Alonso said.

Wicker said the village doesn't charge for a proximity fee in that area.

"If they were in the village, yes, we would," Wicker said.

"That should increase our income as well, if they go for it," Alonso said.

Wicker said unless the newly annexed were forced to tie on, they would claim they have their own well and would want to remain on that well.

"But when that well goes bad, and it's going to cost them \$4,000 to \$6,000 to fix it, then it's very attractive for them to want to tie on. It takes time. That's one of the things the council will have to make a decision on at the time of annexation," Wicker said.

Alonso said recent village ac-

quisitions by the village were done for growth.

"It wouldn't be consistent in my thinking to develop these over time and then not take steps to go in and get more customers. Because that's what I think we are really talking about," Alonso said.

Councilor Ron Andrews asked Wicker if the village committee talked with Porter about the new water charges. He said Carrizo's condos are now going to be charged \$26.80 or whatever the minimum charge is per unit, as opposed to having a single water bill for the lodge.

"In other words, we have an ordinance set up that you can't have multiple living units on a single meter," Andrews said. "Even if you do, we still bill \$26.80 per unit per month."

Wicker indicated the committee had not discussed that with James. "I think he may be aware of it," he said.

Andrews said water costs would jump significantly, but the cost will be borne by the individual owners. "We don't want it to be a sur-

prise when they start receiving these \$26 bills," Andrews said.

Wicker told the council that C-Net was in a hurry to start negotiations.

Wicker said first they needed to proceed with annexation by C-Net's request. He said all the rest of the annexation from Carrizo Lodge property, up Carrizo Canyon to the present city limit sign needs to be done by the initiation of the council.

Wicker said the village could come up with the money out of the budget for the project, but labor would be a problem, committing a crew to stay and get it installed.

The mayor recommended the council proceed with the annexation and asked for a motion.

Duff made the motion and Andrews seconded. It passed with all eyes. Councilor Bill Karn was absent.

A second motion passed to proceed with negotiations with Carrizo Lodge for the costs discussed and water and sewer credit, to be brought back at the next council meeting.

mailed to Lou Medrano and Tom Dick of the State Highway Department.

Brothers need new home

Two young Bernese Mountain Dogs were discovered wandering in a remote area around Capitan about two weeks ago.

Brought to the Lincoln County Humane Society Animal Shelter, the cute duo, dubbed Trekker and Tracker, by the shelter staff, are now available for adoption since no one has called to claim them. They arrived without licenses or rabies tags.

"Tracker is a neutered male and, I believe, Trekker has been spayed. There appears to be a scar," Basch said. "I'm almost positive they're brother and sister. They're about eight months old and well suited for our climate. They have heavy coats for the winter."

Bernese Mountain Dogs are adaptable animals, fitting into many situations well, because of their even disposition.

"They're good working with cattle, they're excellent watch dogs, do well on farms and ranches, and they're affectionate. Great with kids," Basch said. "They also can be trained to leave poultry and other barnyard animals alone."

The siblings are brown and black and are just beginning to obtain their longer coat of hair.

Another resident looking for a new owner is Beau Noir, who was written about before, but not pictured.

An owner-release, Beau Noir came from a home where the children tormented the dog, Basch said. For that reason, he may do better in a household without chil-

dren or with older, gentler children. Two-years-old, he may be unsure with new people and experiences, but once he's warmed up, Beau Noir is extremely affectionate and he's very bright.

"When I bring the dogs into the kennels in the afternoon, he runs to where the leashes are hanging and pulls on one until I come and put it on and take him for a walk," Basch said.

The big plus in adopting Beau Noir, besides getting a playful and loyal companion, is that he already is neutered and housebroken.

It may be too soon to judge, but Basch is cautiously optimistic that the passage of a spay and neuter ordinance in Ruidoso and increased public awareness has contributed to a decrease in the number of animals being destroyed at the shelter.

"We had 98 this year to date compared to 300 last year at this time," Basch said. "That's one-third what it was last year."

"I'd like to believe public awareness is the reason, but my practical side keeps thinking, it's just a late season (for heavy influx of abandoned animals)."

"Realistically, it should take from three to five years before you see results from a mandatory spay and neuter ordinance."

However, because the ordinance was talked about months before being passed and has received a great deal of publicity, it may be that owners are keeping their animals confined so they don't fall under the enforcement thrust of the ordinance.

It's the dogs and cats that are picked up running loose or cause problems in a neighborhood who end up at the shelter, he said. The owners would then be required to comply with the sterilization mandate for pets.

It also may be that people adopting pets from the shelter are being more conscientious and are following through on spaying and neutering.

Basch said he would welcome the day when the pet population is sufficiently under control that animals would not have to be destroyed. But under the current situation, the death of one dog that otherwise would run loose, could prevent hundreds of its possible offsprings from being killed in the future, he said.

While the number of animals being destroyed locally is down, the

number being returned to owners or adopted has remained about the same, Basch said.

As the summer season approaches and the number of abandoned litters increases, the shelter would welcome volunteers who would act as foster homes for the young pups or kittens.

Without foster homes, the chances of young animals surviving in the kennel is very low. Even though Basch gives protective shots, they take 10 days to two weeks to become effective. Staying in a home atmosphere for a few weeks also tends to make the puppies more socialized and happy, creating better candidates for adoption.



Economic development group celebrates past, plans future Teams forming to solicit private funds

Awards for the past and prospects for the future highlighted the annual membership meeting for the Economic Development Corporation of Lincoln County.

The group met on March 11 for its regular meeting and its annual review.

The first award went to Pat Huey of Capitan, whose term expired this year. Huey has served on the board four years and missed just two meetings in those years. The group thanked him for his time and effort, which shows a major commitment to the organization.

Huey will be replaced by George Schultz of Capitan. Also new on the board will be Frank Potter, who will take current president Ronnie Paulger's place on the board. Dr. Jim Miller, whose term expired this year, was re-elected to serve another term as well.

Lincoln County commissioner Wilton Howell had also been named to serve on the board to represent the commission.

The commission had not shown an interest in participating on the board for more than a year after the county decided not to fund the

group any longer.

Vice president Scott Shafer presented Paulger a plaque for his service as president and his years as a member of the EDCLC. Paulger said he will still be active in helping the group with its fundraising project. The project, which is based on the United Way formula, is just now getting started.

The EDCLC has been recruiting captains for teams representing different industries. The captains and their teams will then go out to meet with businesses within their industry to let them know about the ED-

CLC.

The goal of the project is to get long-term financial commitments from these businesses.

The project will help the group not be 100 percent dependent on public funding, said Karen Kopp, executive director of the group. Currently it gets most of its funds from the Village of Ruidoso.

Kopp updated the group on her recent activities which included helping an area business market its product in Japan and submitting a proposal to state and federal de-

partments for money for a training program for new employees for businesses in the area.

for prospective properties in the area.

Special speaker for the meeting was Aubrey Dunn, former state legislator from Alamogordo. Dunn spoke to the group about economic development in the aspect of retired people traveling in recreation vehicles. These people need RV parks and the related services used by RVs.

Dunn's biggest attempt to draw RV people into the area is the Sun Bird Treasure Fest this past fall.

The event enticed people to tour the entire region by giving each a passport to be stamped by participating attractions.

Women's conference stresses engineering

Why choose a career in science or engineering?

Yelena Temple, a ninth grade teacher at Ruidoso High School, and 17 local students were part of a group of 350 students on hand when George A. Orlicki, technical director and chief scientist at White Sands Missile Range (WSMR), posed that question.

Orlicki was featured speaker for the annual "Expanding Your Horizons" career conference at WSMR March 5.

"It teaches you a way to think, how to reason. Engineering and science are going to teach you something you can use," he said.

"You are at the age you can still make decisions. At your age you have unlimited horizons. You can have it all. You can have a family, you can have a career and you can be a technical person. You have role models here. You need to learn from them."

The role models he referred to are members of the New Mexico Network for Women in Science and Engineering (NMNWSE), some two dozen women from WSMR, New Mexico State University (NMSU) and the southern New Mexico community who present the "Expanding Your Horizons" conference each year during Women's History Month, either at WSMR or at NMSU.

Students from 14 high schools in southern New Mexico and west Texas attended the day-long event, which offered career exploration workshops in biology, computer music and computer graphics, engineering, mathematics, medicine and physics.

Self-development workshops in team building/leadership, self-esteem, memory techniques, positive self-talk and career planning complemented the technical activities.

In addition, tours to WSMR work sites gave the students opportunity to observe and ask questions of people at work in technical vocations.

Network activities are designed to encourage women to enter and to succeed in nontraditional careers (in particular in science and engineering) and include annual statewide career conferences directed toward women in grades 8 through 12, but open to male students and students of any age as well.

The Network also creates career-related literature for students, such as *Surveying Your Future: Non-traditional Careers for Young Women*, published by the Network in 1981. It describes 24 career fields and included tips on making a career choice, choosing and paying for an education, writing a resume, applying for a job and preparing for the interview. The 89-page booklet was included in take-home packets furnished to "Expanding Your Horizons" conference participants.

"Kids in small towns are not aware of the opportunities that are out there," said Temple, who sponsored the local group who attended the conference.



Warriors capture third at Rose Relays

Although the team isn't quite at full speed yet, the Warrior boys track squad earned a third place finish at the Rose Relays in Tularosa Saturday.

The event came at the tail-end of spring break when many athletes were still on vacation, but those that went gave some outstanding performances. The boys only participated in individual events, no relays, and still scored 48 points, just three behind Cobre. First place went to Silver City, who had a full squad, with 79 points.

Jackie Lynn once again proved his abilities in the 800 meter with a first place spot in a time of 2:07.4. Lynn also received first place in the event at the West Texas Relays the weekend before with a quicker time of 2:01.84.

His teammate Faustino Miranda was close behind him in third place in a time of 2:15.1.

Lynn also captured second place in the 400 meter dash in a time of 52.3, and sixth in the 200 meter dash in a time of 24.9.

Jason Dix earned well in several events too, and took home three second place medals. He improved on his previous meet's long jump mark by almost a foot for a distance of 19 feet, six inches. In the 110 meter hurdles Dix finished

the race in 17.2 seconds. He then completed the 300 meter hurdles in 42.9 seconds.

In the 1600 meter run Gilbert Kayitah finished the course in 5:10 to take fourth place. He also earned a third place finish in the 3200 meter in a time of 11:05.5. Miranda took fourth place in that event with a time of 11:35.2.

Jeff Cox earned fourth place in the shot put with a throw of 43-8.

Only two out of about a half dozen girls placed at the meet. Sarah Dix leaped to first place in the long jump with a distance of 15-8 1/2, while Cristy Jacobs finished third in the 800 meter with a time of 2:47.7.

Program strives for a perfect performance by Warrior boys

A new program at Ruidoso High School has many of its athletes striving for perfection.

The "Warrior Maker" is a program that 73 male athletes are currently going through in head football coach Mike Gaston's first hour class at RHS. The "Warrior Maker" is a boot camp designed to teach the Warriors the intangibles for a successful life, such as self-confidence, responsibility, commitment, teamwork and pride, paying attention to detail and following directions, great effort, goal setting, priorities, performing under pressure and caring and respecting each other with positive peer pressure.

The program begins with the young men receiving classroom instruction on the rules of the program and what is expected of them, goal setting, leadership training and successful attitude development. They must then pass a written test to advance to the boot camp phase.

The "Warrior Maker" consists of three 12-minute stations in weights, under the direction of coach Don Wiley, agility with Gaston and jump ropes with coach Eddie Hedin. The athletes started the program just before spring break and will pick it up again today.

Gaston said the idea of the program is to get all 73 athletes to have a perfect day. A perfect day would consist of everyone being present and on time, everyone giving a great effort, every partner encouraging each other and each station being done correctly and with enthusiasm, he said.

The program will end as soon as the Warriors make the perfect day, which could take three days or three months, depending on when they make the perfect day. The Warriors have their first attempt at a perfect day on Wednesday.

Fishermen prepare for new year April 1

It may not be considered a new year by lots of folks but here in New Mexico April 1 is a new year for sportsmen. April 1 marks a new license year for hunters, anglers and trappers. Not only is it a new license year, but new regulations for fishing also take effect and there have been lots of changes.



Let's trade a look at changes in fishing regulations that begin on April 1. The most sweeping changes have been in the bag limits placed on different waters around the state.

Let's start with trout. In most waters, the bag limit on rainbow, brook and brown trout along with kokanee salmon is six per day and six in possession for any combination of these species. There are also some special waters that have daily bag and possession limits of 10 rainbow, brook, brown and kokanee. These waters are Bluewater, Heron, Navajo, Eagle Nest, Abiquiu, Charette, McAllister, Quemado and Bonito lakes.

In addition, at Bluewater Lake there is a minimum size limit of 10 inches on trout. The bag and possession limit is two in all waters for cutthroat and lake trout. During the special kokanee season, the bag limit has been

liberalized so anglers may take 12 kokanee per day with a possession limit of 24. Be sure to check the regulations for "special trout waters" that have further restrictions on bag limits and angling methods.

There have also been some major changes in regulations for warm water anglers. In the past these folks have been able to use two poles, but that is no longer the case. All anglers in the state are restricted to using only one pole at a time anywhere in the state.

In addition, bag limits have been changed for most species. The limit for black bass (largemouth, smallmouth and spotted) is five per day with a 12-inch minimum size limit at Brantley, Caballo, Chochiti, Conchas, Clayton,

Roberts, Springer, Santa Rosa, Sumner and Ute Lakes. At Elephant Butte lake the minimum size limit on black bass is 14 inches and at Bill Evans Lake black bass kept must be less than 12 inches or greater than 16 inches in length. The daily bag limit for walleye is 10, crappie 20, white bass 25, striped bass 2, and for northern pike 10.

The daily bag limit for catfish is 15 except at Tingley Beach, Lake Van, Oasis State Park, Burn Lake, Green Meadows Lake, Eunice Lake and Jal Lake where the daily bag limit will be two catfish. In these lakes, the Department of Game and Fish will be stocking large catfish (average of about two pounds each). The possession limit for all species of warm water fish is double the daily bag limit.

Young anglers, those under 12 years of age, that do not have to purchase a license will have the same daily bag and possession limits as licensed fishermen for all species of fish.

All of these changes take effect on April 1 and don't forget to get a new fishing license before heading to the lake. Last year's license expires on March 31. Have fun fishing and good luck!

Summer retreat is new home to ENMU prof

Dr. Louise Russell joins Eastern New Mexico University-Ruidoso this spring semester after teaching one course here during the 1992 summer session.

Before coming to ENMU, she taught for several years with Northland Pioneer College, a decentralized community college in Arizona. She said the school had 11 locations and she sometimes had to drive 60 miles for a departmental meeting.

"There was such a small population in the area so they (the college) solved it by having the instructors travel," she said.

The school also had two interactive video and audio set-ups to allow a teacher in one place to broadcast to students in classes in all 10 other locations.

It was during her years in Arizona that Russell chose Ruidoso as

a summer retreat, initially because of its similarity to Colorado where she taught in secondary schools for most of her career.

She has also taught in other areas including Venezuela and a Haida village in southeast Alaska where she also collected traditional narratives. Her Ph.D. from Indiana University is in folklore.

This semester, she is teaching College Success, English 100, Reading 100 and Interpersonal Communications.

She said she is especially pleased to be teaching the Reading 100 course, which is tuition free for open enrollment and new this semester. It is for people who need a remedial or reading improvement course. The fact that it is being offered free by Eastern is a plus, she said.

College Success is a study skills

course which will help adults returning to school to ease back into taking classes, Russell said it refreshes people on note taking, outlining and reading so they can feel more comfortable in classes.

English 100 is a basic review course preparing students for English 102. Both are required classes for degrees.

Interpersonal Communications will help students communicate as well as listen better with individuals and groups. Russell said they also do a brief section on conflict management. This summer the college plans to follow up on this course with a small group communications course.

Russell said students can expect a somewhat informal approach, but with the required courses she can't be quite as flexible. She said it is her responsibility to see the stu-

dents are prepared in basic skills they will need in other classes.

Whatever students study it should be enjoyable and Russell said she tries to help them relax.

"Every teacher should have a sense of humor," she said.

Students can always contact her at home to ask any questions. She said the closer contact with students is one advantage of a smaller campus and college.

Russell said she is enthusiastic about the challenges of a new situation and the potential for ENMU-Ruidoso.

"It is delightful to no longer have to leave here at the end of the summer," she said.

Russell said as soon as she gets settled in to her new home and schedule she has a couple of books on folklore and folk music that are out of print and she wants to get


