## MainStreet asks \$74,000 question

A cost overrun of more than \$74,000 by the engineers of the MainStreet Ruidoso streetscape improvement project will be investigated by the group.

Recently elected MainStreet president Tom Battin said he, personally, was surprised to hear at the village of Ruidoso council meeting Tuesday that Bohannan-Houston Inc., who did the design and engineering of the project, had overspent by about \$74,000 on its contract.

The company had been corresponding with MainStreet officials and the state highway department, but had not received authorization from the village, the entity the contract was with.

A representative of the firm said during the council meeting that the spending was the result of an expansion in scope in response to available federal funds, Battin said. He said Bohannan-Houston offered to settle for \$48,000, which was a considerable offer.

The village council was also a bit surprised by the price and is now

ing MainStreet to review documentation on the request to expand the scope and make a recommendation to the village, Battin explained to MainStreet board directors at their meeting Thursday.

He said if any of the directors get questions from the membership on this issue it is important to remind them that this amount has not been paid and may not be paid. Battin said he tried to express to the council how helpful Bohannan-Houston has been, but before the council will approve the extra expenditure, MainStreet will have to be able to tell the exact benefits of the expanded project.

Past president Alden Deyo said he remembered that in a past meeting when Mary Maul was serving as project manager, before becoming project consultant, a letter was received by MainStreet on this issue. He said Maul was going to try to get it ironed out with the state highway department but was apparently unsuccessful.

## Spring cleanup campaign offers a chance for action

It's spring cleaning time again. Village of Ruidoso officials have added a new wrinkle to an old problem of unsightly debris and junk.

A Nuisance Report Form is being handed out at the library and chamber of commerce in conjunction with the annual cleanup.

The form is supposed to allow residents to field complaints to the village planning department with the hope that something will be done.

The form helps residents clearly define the problem, recommends action and warns of a citation for non-compliance.

But when the village council has tried to work through its planning department to clean up nuisances, it has experienced little success.

One case in point is the dilapidated buildings and weed filled property across from the village's main post office on Sudderth Drive.

During the November 10, 1992, council meeting, Councilor J.D. James moved to contact the owners

of that property and direct them to clean up the weeds and debris, or the village would clean and bill the owners for the cost. Councilor Jerry Shaw seconded and the motion carried with all ayes.

On February 4, 1993, The Ruidoso News ran a series of pictures, which included the same property showing that no cleanup had been attempted nearly three months later.

During the February 9 council meeting, James requested an update on the directive to clean the property across from the post office.

Planner Cleatus Richards explained that the property owner had been contacted and was seeking bids for the demolition of the building.

Richards stated that the property owner was advised if the property was not cleaned, then the village would proceed with the cleaning and place a lien on the property for the costs incurred.

Last Saturday, April 24, The News again took pictures of the property. No cleanup has occurred since

the November 10, 1992, council directive that ordered the planning department to take action.

In the meantime, new weeds are beginning to sprout through the old weeds and added to the debris are a few more paper cups and a pair of men's underwear.


Some village residents question the effectiveness of the nuisance report form.

If the village council has failed to prompt any action from its planning department in nearly six months on one request, then what can residents expect from sending the planning department a hundred nuisance report forms?

But, the annual cleanup provides residents a chance to get rid of junk around the house at no cost.

The clean-up campaign lasts from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Saturday and Sunday, April 24 and 25, and May 1 and 2.

Lincoln County Solid Waste will have trucks for trash items to be deposited on the "Free Parking" lot on Sudderth in Ruidoso, owned by the Ruidoso State Bank.

# MainStreet directors count on memberships to boost finances

An increase in memberships will boost the income for MainStreet Ruidoso, but it will still be counting on a majority of its funding to come from the village of Ruidoso.

The group will be asking the village for \$43,000 for its service contract agreement with the village for the coming year. The agreement may be renewed for three one-year periods and the organization is receiving \$41,000 for its current fiscal year of service through this contract.

MainStreet's budget for the year was reviewed and approved, with one dissenting vote, at its meeting Thursday before it was due into the village on Friday. The approved budget shows operating expenses of \$46,769 and program costs of \$6,515 for a total expense of \$53,284.

President Tom Battin said they have budgeted membership income at \$11,100, a 45 percent increase from the past fiscal year. That increase would come from the addition of 31 new members to the group's current 38 members.

With the budgeted revenues, the group would have a contingency of about \$1,800 for costs that come up in the year.

Director Alden Deyo, who cast the one dissenting vote, pointed out one missing expense that the contingency will have to pay for. He said although the organization is a 501(c)(3), which makes it exempt from federal unemployment tax, it

is not exempt from the state tax. The cost of the tax will be about \$350 for the year.

He said he was also concerned about the amount budgeted for telephone and travel expenses.

"I don't feel this budget is realistic," he said.

Director Bill Carrigan pointed out before the vote that if the village council does the same as it did last year, the group may not get as much as it is requesting. Last year they would not pay for promotional items, such as the banners the group wanted to put up to mark Midtown.

Promotions are a small part of the budget and would be covered with the dues collected, Battin said.

The council will now review the budget and will have a budget hearing for MainStreet in the next few weeks.

Getting committees organized for the new year was also a priority for the group at its meeting. Battin said the committees will be chaired by board directors but they will select committee members from the entire membership.

Bonnie Mattox will chair the membership and organization committee, while Stan Cape will be chairperson of the design group. Battin will head the economic restructuring group and Audean Franklin will lead the promotions committee. Margaret Lahey will be in charge of the strategic planning.

These directors will meet with project manager Don Miller to get guidelines and ideas so they can

give reports at the next board meeting. Miller also handed out a list of projects with possible completion dates for the directors to review.

In his report to the group, Miller said he has received an application from the state economic development department to request matching funds for the coming fiscal year. He said he will meet with Mattox who has helped with these in the past and they will complete the application by the end of April.

He also invited the board to have the May or June meeting at his home for a barbecue. The group was more than happy to accept the invitation for the May meeting.

Miller also handed out training packets to the directors which included the role and responsibility of the board. It has the by-laws and amendments for the organization also for the new board directors. The group should review the information and they will discuss any questions at the next meeting.

New directors are required in the by-laws to receive training on the MainStreet principles.

In other action the board requested Miller look into the current lease for the group's present location and try to find a more accessible, visible location for the office.

"I think it is important to be down where people can see us," Mattox said.

Directors Audean Franklin and Don Dutton and village liaison J.D. James had called in to report they would not be able to attend. Walter Merchant was absent.

and engineering was going to cost more because of environmental studies required to receive federal funding, but no specific amount was mentioned.

The group decided to have Don Miller, current project manager, meet with officials of Bohannon-Huston and work with the executive committee to come back with a recommendation for the village.

Miller said the streetscape project itself is moving along as expected. Six contractors attended a pre-bid conference on Wednesday to have questions answered, but several had not had time to review the plans and specifications.

They will try to contact several

other construction companies to see if there is more interest, but Miller said this is a very specialized project.

The bid opening will be at 2:30 p.m. Monday, April 26, after which the best bid will be taken to Santa Fe for the approval of the state and federal highway departments. Miller said the intention is to let the bid in time for some construction to get underway this spring.

The construction company would begin work at Fern Street on Sudderth Drive on the south lanes and go east to Country Club Drive. They would then turn around and do the north lanes. Construction would end July 1 and then start again following Labor Day.

To keep the businesses and com-

munity informed on what is happening with the construction, MainStreet will have a kick-off coffee and breakfast on the Friday before construction begins, possibly May 14.

Director Bonnie Mattox is organizing the breakfast, and it will be the start of weekly coffees throughout the construction period.

Also at the last village council meeting, councilors approved MainStreet's request to amend its lodgers tax ordinance to match the state ordinance, which allows the tax to be used for welcome or visitor centers. That does not mean that MainStreet is requesting funds from the lodgers tax board at this time, Battin said.

A required public hearing with the council has been scheduled for May.

In other business, Battin said he had received a letter from Julie Johncox, state MainStreet director, after she received two calls from area people concerned that Miller, as project manager, would not be attending the National Main Street Townhall meeting in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, in May.

The group had voted at a special meeting April 1 not to have Miller attend because he will be needed in Ruidoso to help keep the community informed on the start of construction of the streetscape plan. Battin said he had told Johncox

that Miller may not be able to attend when she was in Ruidoso in March for a National Main Street workshop. At that time she gave no response and he took that to mean she understood the situation.

She indicated in the letter that she had been told that construction would not start until October, but Battin advised her it should be in May. Although project managers are generally required to attend the national meeting, Battin said he felt these circumstances should be an exception.

He said it was Johncox' concern that Ruidoso stay in touch with the state and national organizations so it can continue to be educated on the MainStreet principals.

"We will do our best to have Don at the state meetings, but the dates didn't work out for the national meeting this year. Our intent is to be cooperative," Battin said.

Director Bill Carrigan said he did not like the tone of the letter, which several directors agreed with, because he had always felt and heard MainStreet Ruidoso was one of the best in the state.

Battin agreed and said, "It would be disappointing if our star was tarnished by not going to this meeting."

He will now write a letter to Johncox, stating the group's response and also requesting a list of requirements for project managers.

### Kind Words from Friends



## Dwarf mistletoe attacks area's Ponderosa pines

A killer is attacking trees in Lincoln County.

This killer — dwarf mistletoe — begins by feeding off essential nutrients and stealing water and causes what is called a witches broom effect.

Before long, this intruder has worked itself from the inside to the outside, often popping out on limbs. When it hits the trunk it is too late.

Dwarf mistletoe has destroyed another one of your trees.

This enemy is related to the Christmas mistletoe but is smaller, leafless and grows on branches and trunks of cone-bearing trees. Mature plants may vary in color from yellow to green; and on the Ponderosa, it is orange with thick shoots from branches, and near the tree trunk is the flowering part of the plant ready to infect innocent trees nearby.

According to Dave Cummings of the U.S. Forest Service at the Smokey Bear Ranger Station in Ruidoso, the Lincoln National Forest has the highest concentration of mistletoe in the Southwest.

"We are just coming out of a drought which leaves the trees vulnerable and ready to accept the sticky seeds that can be distributed by the wind," he said.

The mistletoe weakens pines by robbing them of both water and food. As lower branches take in more food, the tree slowly dies from the top. Within 10 years, a large Ponderosa can be eaten alive.

Pole trees, those in the five- to 12-inch diameter category, may go much, much quicker.

Ruidoso and its surrounding areas are home to these magnificent Ponderosas, often called Black Jacks and Yellow Pines. All are susceptible to the mistletoe infestation.

If you are going to save your trees, you will need to prune the infected branch back to the trunk and allow a 60- to 100-foot swath around the stand of trees you are trying to save. This will slow down the process.

Although there is a spray called Ethephon Florel, it is usually cost prohibitive to use. Cummings says that usually the forest service does not use the chemicals because of the cost and other problems.

Ted Conley of Conley's Nursery in Ruidoso says with Cummings and says that Ethephon Florel is a growth retardant only, there is little call for it and it is quite expensive.

"One of the best things to do is to keep your trees healthy by water, fertilizer and quick dressing may help to seal the wound after pruning and may prevent the mistletoe from returning."

Emphasis is on the word — though.

**Be on the lookout for spring weather changes**

The sun and snow this week may be a good reminder of how the weather will be changing in the next few months.

To prepare for the peak severe weather season in May and June, Governor Bruce King and the National Weather Service has declared this week to be Severe Weather Awareness Week in New Mexico.

The service states during severe weather people at home should go to the basement or to the center of the house in the smallest room on the lowest floor, stay away from windows, doors and outside walls, crouch down on your knees and protect your head and take cover under a sturdy piece of furniture.

People in schools and offices should follow advance plans to an interior hallway on the lowest floor, stay away from windows, doors and outside walls, crouch down on your knees and protect your head and avoid gymnasiums, auditoriums or other rooms with large free-span roofs.

In mobile homes or cars people should evacuate and seek shelter in a nearby substantial structure. Be prepared before a severe storm strikes by properly tying down your mobile home.

Many people believe tornado damage can be limited by cracking open a window to lessen atmospheric pressure differences. However, current research indicates that most tornado damage occurs

from very strong winds, not from pressure differences between the inside and outside of a structure. The best safety advice is to stay away from windows to avoid getting hurt if the glass breaks.

Words people may hear from the weather service include severe thunderstorm, tornado, funnel cloud, severe thunderstorm or tornado watch and severe thunderstorm or tornado warning. Severe thunderstorm means a thunderstorm with wind gusts of 58 miles per hour or greater or hail three quarters of an inch or more in diameter.

A tornado is a violently rotating column of air that is in contact with the ground and is the most destructive of all weather events. A funnel

cloud is similar to a tornado, however, it does not touch the ground.

Severe thunderstorm or tornado watches mean that weather conditions are favorable for these to develop. The weather service suggests people be alert and stay informed of the latest weather developments.

A severe thunderstorm or tornado warning means these are occurring or are imminent and people should take necessary precautions immediately.

If anyone would like a class in this area, people can contact the NWS and they will try to arrange a class to fit their needs. People may write the National Weather Service, Albuquerque Forecast Office, P.O. Box 9025, Albuquerque 87119-9025.

# Lady Warriors capture second place in home meet

With sunny skies and a continuous breeze, the Warriors home track meet turned out to be a great meet for several individuals who broke records earned top spots in events.

The team prizes for both boys and girls, though, went to Lovington, with a large number of talented athletes. The Lady Warriors earned second place in the girls division, while Artesia captured second in the boys.

Warrior Jason Dix shattered the school record for the long jump with a distance of 21 feet, three and three quarters inches, which also earned him first place in the meet. He broke a record set just last year by Louis Jimenez who had a distance of 20-10 at districts. It also beat the meet record of 20-8 1/4 set in 1986 by a Deming competitor.

Freshman Kyle Humphreys also made his way into the Warriors top 10 performances list in the long

jump. A leap of 20-7 earned him a second place finish at the meet and in a tie for third place on the Warrior list along with Tracy Gann who hit that mark in 1985.

Dix and Humphreys also took two places in the 110-meter hurdles. Dix took third place with a time of 15.97 seconds, just one one-hundredths of a second behind the second place runner. Humphreys finished the race in 17.32 seconds for sixth place.

Dix earned second place in the 300-meter hurdles with a time of 41.43 seconds.

Jackie Lynn kicked into high gear in the home stretch of the 800-meter dash to capture first place in the race with a time of 2:05.81. Although it was a little slow compared to his previous performances this season, he came close to beating the meet record of 2:05.09 set in 1986.

Gilbert Kayitah also turned in a good performance in the 800 meter for third place. His time was 2:12.64.

Kayitah moved up one spot in the 3200-meter run to take second place with a time of 11:02.28. Teammate Josh Norbury followed up by finishing third in a time of 11:26.85, while Faustino Miranda earned fourth place in a time of 11:46.58.

Miranda also finished third in the 1600-meter run with a time of

5:04.03, while Norbury took fifth in 5:12.28.

Anthony Torres was back in action this week for the Warriors after sitting out several meets with his arm in a cast. He made it to the finals in the 200-meter dash where he took third place in a time of 23.58.

In other field events Jeff Cox earned second place in the shot put with a throw of 43-10 1/2 behind Chris Gonzalez of Lovington who broke the meet record by five inches with a throw of 60-7 1/2. Cox also took sixth in the discus with a throw of 109-5.

Earl Holstein took fourth place in the javelin with a distance of 127-8, just two inches behind third place. John Echols finished in sixth place in the pole vault with a height of 10-6.

In relays the 1600-meter relay team of Anthony Torres, Jackie Lynn, Jason Dix and Kyle Humphreys tied for second in a dramatic finish with Artesia in a time of 3:38.38. The 800-meter relay also earned third place with a time of 1:37.47, while the medley relay was third with a time of 4:12.51.

A duo on the girls side also kept the points rolling for the second place team finish. Sarah Dix and Kristie Ryan started the day with first and third place finishes in the long jump and continued to do well

from there. Dix had a distance of 17-1 1/3, while Ryan made 15-7 1/3. Dani Brammer also took sixth in the event at 13-10 3/4.

Dix then collected a fourth place in the 100-meter hurdles in a time of 17.66. Ryan later edged Dix out in the finals of the 200-meter dash with a time of 29.49 for second place with Dix in third at 28.72.


Ryan also edged past Lindsay Willard in the 100-meter dash with a time of 13.72 for fourth place. Willard had a time of 13.78.

Stephanie Haas earned first place in the 3200-meter run with a time of 14:28.40, while teammate Michelle Gabaldon finished fifth at

# County commissioners consider, weigh budget requests

It's that time of year again when local governments weigh requests for financial help from community service groups, set aside enough money to operate essential services and try not to raise taxes doing it.

For the past two weeks, Lincoln County manager Andy Wynham has been wrestling with budgets submitted by elected officials and department heads, emergency services, counseling groups, senior

citizens and a plethora of other special interests.

At 8 a.m. Tuesday, it's the commissioners' turn. They will meet in the county courthouse in Carrizozo for what could be an all-day budget work session.

Commission chairman Morroy Montes said Wynham and he spent part of Friday and Saturday going over the requests.

"I don't feel there are any surprises, but you never know," Montes said Sunday. "I think Andy

will spend the first part of the morning giving commissioners an overview to make sure the budget he has put together is in line with our ideas."

Replenishing county emergency vehicles and setting up a regular schedule of replacement for the future probably will be one of the focuses, he said.

"Two years ago, (Emergency Services Director) Maggie Bohles asked us to look at the deteriorating condition of some of the ambulances

and we didn't do anything at that time," Montes said.

Now the one at Fort Stanton is in really bad shape and there are others. They're big ticket items, \$65,000 each and now we have to start looking at replacing all of them over a four to six year period and then keep a revolving schedule so we never run into this problem again.

"The sheriff also is asking for five vehicles. We gave him four last year, I think; it makes sense to buy



some." The town of Carrizozo has come to the county asking for some help rehabilitating its pool, he said. For the first time in his memory, the town of Ruidoso Downs also has approached the county to ask for money for its recreation area.

Officials from The Counseling Center, who tried unsuccessfully earlier in the year to increase its allocation for the current budget period, again are asking for \$20,000 in annual support, instead of \$10,000.

"And several employees want to be reclassified, raise or not," Montes said. "I think all of this talk of the county having a surplus may have sparked some of these requests."

The public hearing on the preliminary budget is scheduled for May 4. From there, the budget will be sent to the State Department of Finance and Administration (DFA). If it passes DFA officials' scrutiny, the budget will be sent back for a final public hearing and approval July 6.



"A Falling In" opens this Friday

Theater buffs can experience a visually new approach to staging for the upcoming play, "A Falling In," written and directed by Paul Adamian, theater instructor for Eastern New Mexico University.

The 50-minute one-act play is an adaptation from a short story, "God's Flashlight," written by Arthur Pike, and reflects on a young hold-out from the revolutionary youth movement of the '60s. Placed in the middle of nowhere, the set design demands a feeling of vastness and distance.

To accommodate this challenge, Adamian has conceived a unique four-stage setting.

Unlike the stacked, multiple staging of an amphitheater with an invisible fourth wall, Adamian positions his stages within the audience, typical of theater in the round.

By combining the two techniques, the cast literally moves through the audience from one stage to the next, creating an intimacy, yet establishing space.

At various times during the play, members of the cast will be no farther than a heart beat away from the audience. Adamian is hopeful that this experimental con-

cept will better integrate the audience with the struggle of the players and the conflict of the play.

"A Falling In" is a comedy-drama that examines the remnants of the '60s youth movement and its idealism.

Clyde, a young leftover draft dodger, shuns his country's post-war offer of clemency to make a point and is hiding out in a gas station somewhere in New Mexico. Joy, a believer, follows him to the middle of nowhere because, "he says all the right things." The year is 1974.

Adamian said it's a story of love, frustration, disillusionment and peace. Through this introspection, Adamian said the play was filled with humor.

The cast includes Jay Chase as Clyde. Chase has performed with

the New Mexico State University Theater and is manager of the museum shop at the Museum of the Horse.

Tara Pena plays Joy. Pena played "Truvy" in the Ruidoso Little Theatre production of "Steel Magnolias" last year.

Roger Sowder is Mister Crockett. Sowder has extensive Ruidoso Little Theatre experience. He was an audience favorite in last year's production of the "Greater Tuna."



# P&Z commission meets today to hear requests

Ruidoso Planning and Zoning Commission will hear a request from Leah Jones who asked to put a HUD-II mobile home on her property in Hamilton Terrace Subdivision.

Jones had requested a conditional use application during the last P&Z meeting, but the commission failed to obtain a required two-thirds vote to approve or deny and tabled the matter until this meeting.

Although the HUD-II double wide is not to be a consideration in the commission's decision, village planners said there were other problems with the replat.

Planner Cleatus Richards said access to a commercial lot shall be from a collector street. The proposed replat places lots on frontage that is not on a collector street.

Richards indicated a revision in the master plan would be necessary.

The planning staff said the development pattern in this area is mixed with commercial and residential; the predominate use of developed lots being commercial. They say split zoning of adjoining lots would not be feasible and recommend denial of conditional use and proposed replat.

In new business, Lyle and Wanda Hosmer are asking to replat Lots 974 through 980, and 989 through 996 of Skyland addition.

The Hosmers are requesting to replat the properties into two lots that would exceed the 10,000 square feet minimum of R-1 properties.

Planning staff recommends approval.

Robert Lee Smith is applying for a replat for Track K, Eagle Creek Acres and Lot 1, Block 1 in the Pine Meadows Subdivision.

Smith wants to adjust his lotline and allow additional area around

his existing house to about seven acres.

Planning staff recommends approval.

Paul McClendon is requesting a replat of his Lots 6 and 7, Block 2,

of Lakeside Estates; Alto Lakes Golf and Country Club.

McClendon's property is in the county area within one mile of the Extraterritorial Zoning District (ETZ). He wants to replat to establish a 0.75-acre lot for an existing residence.

ETZ has rescinded approval of the proposed replat.

Village planning staff recommends approval of the replat subject to required county approvals and approval of the New Mexico Environmental Improvements Division. Also utilities are to sign plat approval.

Jim Clark is requesting an amended commercial site develop-

ment for Tracts A and B in the Riverside Addition.

Clark is requesting approval to enclose the porch area on one of the A-frame units.

Village planners said that Clark needs to address parking deficiency and should be made aware that floor area increase will not be granted if overall development plan and parking plan are not included with future expansion requirements.

John Brown owns about 10 acres of commercial property known as the John Brown tracts.

Brown is requesting rezoning of 3.3 acres of land from C-1 to C-2.

A Tract 3 contains about 4 acres no proposed for rezoning and is to remain C-1 Neighborhood Commercial. The remaining 2.5 acres are dedicated to Gavilan Canyon road.

The property is contiguous to Ruidoso only at Meander Drive.







## Liberating America's Schools

The 1983 report, "A Nation at Risk," warned Americans of a rising tide of mediocrity in our public schools. The decade since then has seen many attempts at reform but none that overhauled our failing educational system. Today, a growing number of citizens are rallying behind one response that does: School Choice, which empowers parents to select those schools best suited to their children's needs — schools given the freedom to innovate and the responsibility to perform.

Clarence E. Page, Pulitzer Prize-winning syndicated columnist for the *Chicago Tribune*, examines this controversial grassroots movement and the debate surrounding it in *Liberating America's Schools*. Says Page, "Choice advocates say they want to encourage competition among schools — public and private, not to tear the public schools down, but to shake them up and, ultimately, make them better or force them out of business."

The program profiles successful choice programs in Minnesota, New York City, and Milwaukee. Interviews with parents, teachers, students, administrators, activists, and scholars provide personal perspectives on the movement's grassroots origins and real-life accomplishments.

Milwaukee, Wisconsin's private school voucher program offers an alternative to dysfunctional public schools and challenges them to improve. State-funded vouchers (currently \$2,745 per student) are provided to about 1,000 low-income families whose children move from the public school system into participating inner-city private schools.

One state trying new ideas is Minnesota, where students and their families may choose among various types of public schools and alternative programs. Up to 100,000 students enroll yearly, and over 10,000 former drop-outs have re-enrolled since the choice programs started. Options include state-wide Open Enrollment, which lets students apply to districts outside their own; Area Learning Centers, which provide varied services for at-risk students; Contract Schools, run by non-profit agencies like the Urban League, under contract to local districts; and the Post-Secondary Option program, which lets juniors and seniors finish high school at colleges and universities.

Another idea being tried in Minnesota is the Charter School, where many regulations are waived and public funding is tied directly to student performance. Chartered jointly by local school districts and the state board of education, these non-profit, public entities embody the strategy of using market-type competition to improve the public schools. As Joe Nathan, director of the Center for School Change of the University of Minnesota explains, "The key idea of charter schools is to test the notion: will schools improve, will students learn more, if the continued existence of the school depends on what happens to students." The charter school concept is being adopted or proposed in other states, including California, Tennessee, Michigan, Florida, and Arizona.
