## Warrior stands guard at museum

Dave McGary's newest work, "Iron That Walks," was installed in its new home Saturday at the Museum of the Horse in Ruidoso Downs.

Local artist McGary is known for his attention to detail and ability to bring historic figures to life.

"Iron That Walks," with his bear claw necklace, war club and head-dress, is no exception.

The brilliant and vibrant colors captured within the traditional spiked and pointed geometric designs of the beaded warshirt compete for attention.

"Iron That Walks" is a warrior complete with a split bear jawbone knife. The scalp of an enemy is wrapped with beadwork and decorated with red tail hawk

feathers. The powerful medicine of the Kingfisher hanging from his shield protects him against the danger of the white man's bullets.

Like so many of McGary's creations, "Iron That Walks" is drawn from the history books.

While some accounts claim he was a Hidatsa, others declare him a member of the Gros Ventre tribe. It's certain he came from a nomadic tribe of the upper Missouri River region.

His people were traders and the first to use beads in their adornment. In the tradition of his people, "Iron That Walks" reptiles and birds, mammals, reptiles and amphibians possessed supernatural powers and that these powers could

be communicated to human beings. Men who obtained their powers from these sacred sources formed cults and performed ceremonies honoring their benefactors.

"Iron That Walks" was a member of the "Bear Society" as indicated by his bear claw necklace. Bear power was considered particularly potent in war and in the curing of ills.

These men were thought to be short-tempered and dangerous just like bears.

The very name, "Iron That Walks" suggests the reputation of this warrior. He appeared to be invincible, literally made of iron.

Historical accounts of an uprising at Fort McKenzie mention him repeatedly as a force to be reck-

oned with."

He was very much a man of his times. Faced with the incursion of the white man, he made war to protect his territory and his way of life.

"Iron That Walks" joins another McGary monumental bronze, *Rain In The Face*, at the Museum of the Horse.

The new addition complements the new permanent exhibit, *A Whirlwind of Change: The Horse's Conquest of the American West* which features a wide variety of Native American artifacts.

A *Whirlwind of Change* debuts May 29.

The Museum of the Horse is open from 9 a.m. until 5 p.m. daily.

## Mayor resigns

Mayor Victor Alonso resigned today to devote more time to his family and his business, according to Associated Press reports.

The Ruidoso Village Council will appoint a replacement to fill out Alonso's term which ends in March 1994, according to the AP.

The Ruidoso Village Council was in session for a budget meeting when the report came out on KBUY Radio, and Mayor Pro-tem Barbara Duff confirmed that she knew of the resignation.

All members of the council except Councilor Jerry Shaw had been informed.

Alonso, who was elected to a four-year term in 1990, is the owner of Don Victor's Restaurant on Sudderth Drive.

## Abuse, charges dropped

A recent investigation by state officials yielded no evidence that widespread abuse of developmentally disabled patients was occurring at Fort Stanton Hospital and Training Center.

"We received an allegation of rampant abuse and neglect at Fort Stanton on March 19," Steve Dossey, director of the developmental disabilities division of the Department of Health, told **The Ruidoso News** last week.

The newspaper also had received numerous anonymous calls during the preceding two weeks about problems at the fort.

Dossey said representatives from several agencies, Children, Youth and Families, Adult Protective Services, and the Department of Regulation and Licensing headed to the fort, questioned staff and clients, but found no evidence.

There was no substantiation for that information, Dossey said.

The truth is just the opposite. "As a result of a court order, Fort Stanton in particular has made a tremendous focus on improving its program by looking for much more opportunity for its clients."

In response to some of the concerns mentioned by the anonymous callers, Dossey said as long as individuals are paid for their work, clients may hold jobs on or off campus.

He acknowledged that the option has been discussed of moving some of the clients from the fort to the state hospital in Los Lunas.

"These would be individuals not recommended for community placement," but also not appropriate for the fort's future mission of long term care. The transition in type of care also is tied to the court order that resulted from a suit brought by a protection and advocacy group.

"It's just being looked at as an option, but not as anything immediate or in response to any allegations of neglect," Dossey said.

When clients were ordered to be removed from the fort and transferred to community programs, the possibility of closing the institution

# Two men injured in separate crashes

A spectacular one car airborne collision with a power pole sent an area resident to the hospital in serious condition early Saturday.

According to Ruidoso police reports, Paul Whipple, 20, of Capitan was a passenger in a 1979 silver Chevrolet pickup, owned by Richard Wolf of Nogal and driven by Dannon L. Sime, 19, also of Capitan.

Police say Sime was headed west on White Mountain Drive at a high rate of speed shortly after midnight when he approached a curve near George McCarty Drive.

According to the report, he lost control and the pickup skidded sideways, left the roadway and headed into a ditch. The pickup then was propelled airborne sideways, colliding into the power pole and snapping it in half. It then spun in the opposite direction, ramming a street sign and stop sign.

Police say the force of the impact caused the tailgate to sail through the air and hit a telephone cable box.

The pickup came to rest facing the east next to the fence of the Palisades Apartments.

Sime was ejected from the vehicle. Whipple was pinned inside and had to be removed by the EMS crew members when they arrived.

Both Whipple and Sime were transported to the Lincoln County Medical Center where Sime was treated for rib fractures, upper vertebrae injuries and a bruised liver. He was released.

Whipple, suffering from massive head injuries, was transferred to the Eastern New Mexico Medical Center in Roswell where doctors performed surgery for more than five hours.

Friends of the family said as of Monday morning Whipple still remains unconscious and in the Intensive Care Unit. The hospital

lists his condition as critical, but stable.

Sime was cited for driving under the influence of liquor and careless driving.

Jim Bassett, manager of Texas-New Mexico Power Co. confirmed that the accident caused power outages for some customers as crews worked four or more hours to replace the pole. Bassett said he hadn't yet checked the report early Monday morning and wasn't sure how many customers were affected.

One resident in the Town and Country area reported electricity was out about five hours.

Bassett said another power pole also was hit this weekend. That pole, in Ruidoso Downs, caused very localized outages for just a handful of customers — about 11.

Ruidoso Downs police chief Will Hoggard said Ernesto Prieto, 18, hit a telephone and power pole at about 3:10 p.m. Sunday at 523 River Lane in Ruidoso Downs.

Hoggard said Prieto was on furlough from the Reintegration Center at Carlsbad for the Mother's Day weekend to visit family in Ruidoso Downs.

A fence was also torn up in the accident, which totaled the vehicle. Hoggard said the power was out for only a short time as crews came to the site immediately.

Prieto, who was the only person in the vehicle, was taken to Lincoln County Medical Center for treatment and then transported to Eastern New Mexico University Medical Center in Roswell by Ruidoso Emergency Medical Services.

Hoggard said Prieto is being charged with driving while under the influence of alcohol, reckless driving, minor allowing self to be served, no insurance, no seat belt and no driver's license.

"The accident just proves again that driving and alcohol don't mix," Hoggard said.

# Ruidoso Council will hear plan to acquire old True Value building

A proposal to make a recreation center out of the old True Value Hardware building and a request from local wrecker service owners for a level playing field are two items to be discussed Tuesday at the Ruidoso Village Council meeting.

Former parks commission chairman Smokey Stover will submit his study at the 6:30 p.m. session. It will be accompanied by two letters concerning the project.

One of the letters is from the owner of True Value that outlines a possible trade of village real estate for the building, possibly some Grindstone property.

Stover said one letter will explain how the building can be used as a recreation mall with support through rentals and user fees.

Currently, Ruidoso school officials rent their buildings for classes and recreation. The village gave property to a gymnastics club for a building. The Ruidoso Athletic Club remains the lone private enterprise maintaining a recreational building.

Stover said time available at the meeting would not permit him to go

over details of the plan.

Wrecker business licensing has been requested by attorney Alan Morel, who represents Sierra Blanca Motor Wrecker Service, Lincoln County Wrecker Service, Dale's Wrecker Service and Sierra Blanca Wrecker Service.

Morel has requested the village council to impose a requirement that all local wrecker businesses within a five-mile radius of the center of the municipality possess a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity.

Morel wrote the council that obtaining the required certificates runs into several thousands of dollars, and there are currently several different individuals within the area who have been operating wreckers within the village limits without any state supervision or regulation.

He said maverick wrecker services are not required by law to maintain liability insurance in the amounts that are necessarily required of the certified wrecker services.

Morel will discuss motor carrier regulations and vehicles for hire.

A chapter regarding a wrecker service code from Pearland, Texas,

also was included in the agenda packet.

The council meeting will begin with Ordinance 93-06, updating the village code to coincide with state law regarding lodger's tax. To be included as qualifiers for lodgers tax are welcome centers, tourist information centers and museums in operation prior to January 1, 1989.

Ralph Gary of United Helicopters, Inc., will ask the council to approve changing the proposed site for his T-hangar building to the extreme northeast corner of the new ramp area.

Gary said he also would like to reduce the size of the building from 5,000 square feet to 3,600 square feet.

The airport improvement bid award was held Wednesday, May 5, and there was only one bidder, D&S Contracting from Santa Teresa.

Their bid, including taxes, was for \$1,131,792.51. The village's consulting engineers estimated the cost should be \$910,501.79.

Village staff and the consultants are discussing options with the Federal Aviation Administration and will present the various options at the council meeting.

The federal government will pick up 90 percent of costs, with the state and village splitting the other 10 percent. Councilors have said much of the village's five percent obligation is to be handled through in-kind services by way through the hot mix plant and one operator.

John Brown is asking for a replat of his 9.5 acre tract located along Gavilan Canyon Road.

Village planner Cleatus Richards said Brown's development requires extension of a 6-inch water line of approximately 2,000 feet and installation of five hydrants to serve the area at an estimated cost of \$28,000.

Richards wrote the council that Brown requested that the village share in this cost without committing to any level of participation.

Planning Commission chairman Robert Donaldson told Richards at the last commission meeting that he thought it was unfair that Brown bear the burden for the entire area. The planning commission then recommended approval of the replat with the condition that the village council determine the amount of cost sharing.

Richards said Brown was requesting rezoning to allow commer-

cial development. Brown's Tract 3 is currently developed as a trailer park. He said water line extensions are required to serve the property and primarily will benefit Brown's property.

He said any financial participation by the village would be outside existing budgets, which are fully committed. However, Brown's request seems similar to that of James Porter who recently received help from the village in installing a water line to Carrizo Lodge.

Richards wrote that subdivision regulations of the village provide that Brown extend or create a water supply system to provide for domestic water use and fire protection, and that Brown must bear costs of improvements and provide a performance bond to guarantee completion. He wrote that cost sharing consideration would be contrary to the sections of the municipal code.

Richards wants the council to direct Brown to provide services as required by municipal code and to provide guarantees specified as a condition of final plat approval.

In other business, Mayor Victor Alonso will consider more annual board appointments.

Consent agenda items include a professional services agreement for the Lodgers Occupancy Tax Audit. Ronnie Hemphill is the auditor of choice.

A public hearing will be scheduled for an amendment to the liquor license fee.

Under reports from municipal officials, two proclamations will be read: Police Week and Police Memorial Day; and Village of Ruidoso Employee Recognition Week.

Civic Events Center director Kathleen Michelena will give a report.

The council will enter into closed session. Any action taken in closed session should be reintroduced into the open meeting with a motion and a vote.

Mayor Alonso, during the last closed meeting, apparently forgot action taken for bridge improvement and failed to adhere to the Open Meetings Law by adjourning the meeting from a closed session.

Other open meetings violations by the council have been brought to the attention of the State Attorney General's office with little consequence.

was discussed. But its economic impact on Lincoln County and the need for certain types of professional medical care in the state persuaded the State Legislature and governor to keep the fort going and to phase in a new operation.

Meanwhile, the state has hired consultants to help train its personnel in techniques for investigating possible abuse.

Again as a result of a court order, state and fort officials have been working on areas of the program that need improvement. At the same time, they are implementing a plan to move developmentally disabled clients out of the facility and into community programs, he said.

Jim Jackson, executive director of the protection and advocacy organization that sued the state over

deficiencies at Fort Stanton and Los Lunas, said a week ago and again on Friday that he's not aware of any new allegations of abuse.

The lack of active treatment for some clients still clearly remains an issue, Jackson said. A great deal of monitoring is being done by a third party agency, he said.

Advocacy staff also have been on site as representatives for clients on their court-ordered commitments and staff members were present at an administrative hearing on changes in a transition plan for a client slated to be moved.

"But we are always interested in any possible incidents of abuse," Jackson said. "We will keep our eyes open and we will respond to any indication."

Fort Stanton administrator Ervin Aldaz also confirmed that an allegation of abuse had been received and investigated by officials from the Adult Protective Services unit.

"They not only did not find anything, but complimented us on how professional and open we were," Aldaz said. "One of the reasons we're open is because we don't condone abuse. Our purpose is to give quality care and we have continually improved. As Mr. Dossey said, we've had national experts come in and train us. We've had lot of compliments from them, especially our concerns and efforts toward quality of care."

"One of the things I wanted to stress is our staff has responded tremendously to this litigation, the pressures that come with litigation, to the pressures that come with placing these individuals that are their friends."

"We feel the State of New Mexico needs Fort Stanton and the reason we have been able to survive is not just because of the economic impact it has on the county, but because of

the level of care we give, and the potential care we can give to any new type of service that is needed, especially in the long term care area in which we are headed.

"There always will be allegations. We also invite officials to check them out, but I don't like it because the staff deserves a pat on the back, not a kick in the teeth. But if that's what it takes for us to prove our worth, then our doors are open and those agencies have the obligation to come in and check them."

"Once in a while I would like for some of these very people who seem to spout allegations without any rationale to also come forward and give credit to the staff in all the good areas and changes we're making."

Aldaz said he was pleased that Dossey gave the staff credit for its ability to handle the changes and to continue to improve.

# Board considers Baca for athletic director

A new athletic director may be approved by Ruidoso School Board at its meeting Tuesday.

Juan Baca, who has been with the school district since August 1992, is being recommended for the position vacated by Ronny Maskev.

The recommendation comes from a screening committee after personal interviews with the candidates. It has the backing of superintendent Mike Gladden.

"The thing the athletic coordinator has to do takes a lot of time and a sense of equity among the various sports and the two gen-

ders," Gladden said. "We were looking for someone with excellent people skills when dealing with students, parents, coaches and fellow staff members."

Baca currently teaches high school level world history, United States history, Southwestern history, government, economics and physical education.

He is acting as assistant coach for the tennis team this spring.

He previously taught at Belen High School from August 1976 to May 1992, where he also coached girls basketball, boys/girls tennis and boys soccer. He was assistant coach for volleyball, tennis and

track and field.

Baca graduated from the University of New Mexico with a bachelor of arts degree in 1973 and has earned 45 additional hours of credit. In 1966, he was an honor graduate of Carrizozo High School.

High school principal Don Weems, who served on the selection review committee, could not be reached for comment Friday.

The board meeting will begin at 7 p.m. in the public meeting room of Ruidoso High School on Warrior Drive.

Other items on the agenda include a report by the staff of Ruidoso Middle School on the

transition education program, recognition of ACT scholars Kerris Cubberly and Hemanth K. Pai, an update on the budget process for 1993-94, action on a policy for student detention, suspension and expulsion and discussion of a communicable disease policy for students.

The board also is scheduled to award, for the second time, a contract for construction of the new elementary school. The project had to be reopened for bids after one of the previous bidders filed a complaint and pointed out a flaw in the previously submitted bids.

# Downs board doles out lodgers taxes

Recommendations from the Ruidoso Downs Lodgers Tax Advisory Board (LTAB) will be under inspection for approval by the Downs board of trustees today (Monday), May 10.

The group will meet at 7 p.m. today (Monday), May 10, at the Downs fire station.

The LTAB is recommending approval of \$1,500 for Art Fest USA, \$1,500 for Bluegrass Festival, \$1,000 for the All American Festival and \$1,000 for Golden Aspen Rally.

Art Fest USA did not get unanimous approval from the board, but members voting for it said they think it will draw people into the area, although it may not be a project they want to fund each year. The Fest will be Thursday through Sunday from July 1 through Labor Day at its location at the former Fantasy Mountain property across from the race track.

LTAB chairman Mike Warren said he voted against the recommendation because the organizers of individual activities should come before the board to get advertising funds for that specific event. He also expressed his concern that it is a regular business.

The owners of Art Fest USA, Pat and Don Breedloves, have scheduled their own events throughout the season but have also allowed other organizations to have activities at the location.

The Bluegrass Festival, which is recommended to receive \$1,500, will be one of the events there. The festival, in its third year, will be June 11-18.

The All American Festival and the Golden Aspen Rally received the same recommendation as last year.

Art Fest USA will also be on the agenda to request approval on a wine tasting festival July 1 through 3. The Breedloves have already been in contact with the state alcohol division and will need approval from both the state and city to have the event.

Other items on the agenda include approval to publish an amendment to the liquor ordinance, approval to publish a \$1 fee for judicial education and adopt a resolution on the retention and destruction of records. The liquor ordinance will be to lower the current village license fee to \$250 from a maximum of \$1,000.

The group is expected to appoint police chief Will Hoggard and village clerk Leann Weibrecht as record retention custodians for the village. They will be authorized to maintain the records management program for the village and apply the retention periods according to a schedule for all records and files of the village.

The board will hear a request for a mobile home variance for Shorty Burgess on Wood Lane. Monthly reports from the village departments will also be reviewed.

In the April 29 issue of The Ruidoso News it was incorrectly stated that the village was planning to increase the commodity charge for water by 55 cents based on a senate bill passed to collect 3 cents per gallon for a conservation fee, but it will be 3 cents per 1,000 gallon.

# Ski Apache ranked tops

Ski Apache in Lincoln County is listed third among 15 dynamically growing winter sports areas in the United States in a study commissioned by Snow Country Magazine.

No New Mexico ski areas were listed among the eight super dynamic counties. Santa Fe was listed as fourteenth in the same classification as Lincoln. They were the only counties in New Mexico mentioned. None were listed in the last "high growth" category containing 17 counties.

According to a study by Oklahoma State University geography professor Dr. John F. Rooney Jr., "many alpine counties and communities have undergone a cultural and economic metamorphosis" due to the sport of skiing.

Dr. Rooney's study, "The Ancillary Economic Impacts of the U.S. Ski Industry 1980-1990," has practical applications for the resort/recreation and travel industry, as well as people interested in moving to mountain communities.

Presented by Dr. Rooney at the National Ski Areas Association 1993 Convention and Trade Show May 4, the study began by examining 170 counties with ski areas.

It narrowed to 40 counties excelling in six criteria: population growth, expansion of retail sales, real estate employment, eating/drinking establishment employment, hotel/motel establishment employment and housing growth. The top 40 growth counties contain almost 40 percent of total U.S. ski lift capacity.

The counties identified as super dynamic primarily are concentrated in the West: four of the eight in California, two in Colorado.

However, it is Summit County, Utah, with Park City and Snowbird ski resorts, which heads the list. The area benefits from its proximity to Salt Lake City.

The population of super-dynamic snow country counties between 1980-90 grew by an average of 77.6 percent, compared with 9.8 percent for the nation. Retail sales in all 40 snow country counties grew by more than 160 percent compared with U.S. Growth of 84.6 percent.

"While many people can spend an intermittent weekend in snow country, many more dream of living and working there full time," said magazine editor John Fry.

# Warrior tracksters dash for state

For most Warrior track members the season is over, but a handful of boys and girls will have one final week of preparation for the biggest event of the year, the state track meet.

In the boys division Jackie Lynn, Jason Dix, Jeff Cox and Kyle Humphreys will be competing in individual events in Albuquerque on Friday and Saturday. Jody Randle, Sarah Dix, Monica Martinez and Stephanie Haas will represent the Warriors in the girls division.

The teams had a disappointing finish to the season on Saturday at the district meet in Las Cruces, where the girls took fourth and the boys were fifth.

Coach Ronny Maskew said they had some kids do well, but there were other areas that they need points from and didn't get them.

"Everything had to happen just right and it didn't. We were pretty disappointed," Maskew said.

Maskew is optimistic that those competitors going to state will have a good chance of placing. Lynn, who has finished first all season in the 800-meter run, probably has the most realistic chance of taking first, but all have potential to do well at the state meet.

At the district meet on Saturday, Haas earned second place in the 3200-meter run in a time of 13:28.46 to qualify for state in that event. She also took third in the 1600-meter run in a time of 6:11.78.

Randle qualified for state in the high jump by earning first place at four feet, 10 inches, although at past meets she had cleared 5-2. Sarah Dix, who went to state last year in the long jump, took third at

districts with a leap of 16-10, but she had already crossed the qualifying mark of 17 feet at a previous meet.

Dix also earned fifth place in the 100-meter hurdles with a time of 17.11 seconds. Lindsay Willard was right behind her in sixth place with a time of 18:09. Dani Branger was fifth in the 300-meter hurdles in a time of 55.62.

Martinez, who is suffering from back problems, took third place in the discus with a throw of 105-6, after earning the state title in that event last year. Kristie Ryan earned fifth place in the 400-meter dash with a time of 1:04.68.

The boys team picked up two first place finishes from its members going to state. Lynn was first across the finish line in the 800-meter run with a time of 2:02.82.

Cox also took a district title in the discus with a throw of 134-8. Cox picked up a second place finish in the shot put, for a state berth, with a throw of 42-11.

Saul Mendez took fourth place in the 800-meter with a time of 2:18.41. Josh Norbury also finished fourth in the 3200-meter run with a time of 11:25.25. Anthony Torres picked up a fifth in the 400-meter dash in a time of 54.81.

Dix captured second place in the long jump with a distance of 20-2 3/4. He also took fifth in the 300-meter hurdles in a time of 42.74.

Earl Holstein, who has improved throughout the season on his events, took fourth place in the pole vault by clearing 9-6, and fifth place in the javelin with a throw of 136 feet.

# Sign request causes commission to take a closer look at signs in public right of way

A request to put a promotional business sign on county right of way will impact many more people than just the petitioner.

Owners of all signs in county rights of way soon will be asked to remove them, even if they've been there for years.

The Lincoln County Commission last week denied a request by Phil Jones to temporarily put a sign in a county road right of way for his new family dinner theater business.

Jones said he eventually hopes to put up an old western town facade. His theater will accommodate 300 people, he said. Until he can arrange placement on private property and not to lose out on the heavy tourist summer season, he wanted to use county land for his sign indicating where to turn. He offered to pay rent.

"I think it's a dangerous precedent to allow a sign to be placed on county property or right of way," said Chairman Monroy Montes.

"This sounds a lot like the Flying J Ranch," Commissioner Stirling Spencer said. "If we do something for one, why not the other?"

"I agree," said Commissioner Wilton Howell. "There's probably a problem with the anti-donation clause, too."

"I'm not anti-business," Montes said. "This county can use all the business it can get, but to allow something like this would not be in the best interests of the county."

Road manager Bill Cupit stepped forward after the unani-

mous vote to deny and asked commissioners a question.

"There have been signs in the right of way for years and we've never taken any action. Should I handle it or the sheriff's department?" he asked.

"It's one of those situations where had Mr. Jones just gone out and placed the sign there, no one would have noticed," county manager Andy Wynham said. "But he did it the right way and came to ask. We can't allow him. We have no alternative."

"Then we have no alternative but to enforce (against other signs)," said Howell.

"Now that we know, I have no choice but to ask them to remove the signs," Wynham agreed.

When the Jones request came up on the agenda, Commissioner Bill Schwetzmann declared a potential conflict of interest. He said he may have some connection to future work on the water system of the new business and excused himself from the discussion and vote.

In other action, the commission: —approved a request for help from the Hondo Valley school board in developing a multi-use recreation field.

The road department will assist in excavating dirt from the area designated for the field. Road manager Bill Cupit estimated three pieces of equipment and three employees will be needed for about three to four weeks of work. Based on what the county would charge the state for an equal commitment, the cost (in labor and equipment) would be \$14,000 to \$18,000, he said.

—appointed members to the new planning and zoning board, downsized from nine to seven. Nancy Dooly was reappointed by Spencer. Karon Petty was chosen by Commissioner L. Ray Nunley. Jerry Wright was Howell's choice. David Cummins was named by Schwetzmann and Buddy Guthrie was reappointed by Montes. The members at large will be Wayne Negley, suggested by Howell; and Ralph Romero, who is on the board and was suggested by Spencer. Commissioners drew lots to decide which member would receive the longer terms of two years and those who would serve until the end of February 1994.

"So some of them may only be serving nine to 10 months," Schwetzmann noted.

"That may be longer than some want to serve," Howell responded.

—adopted without increase the current liquor license fees. Last year, the county issued 12 dispenser licenses and two pub licenses. One license is slated to be transferred to Alto and commissioners agreed to conduct a special meeting at 9 a.m. May 18 in the county suboffice in Ruidoso to facilitate the transfer. Spencer voted against the motion.

County Clerk Martha Proctor said she did a study last year and the rates were in line with counties of similar size.

Montes said the fees should be kept at a reasonable level because the establishments outside the municipalities were not as plush.

—accepted a \$6,157 sole bid from Jerry Morris Construction of Hobbs on a metal building for the Glenoas 'Palo Verde' Fire Department.

—on the recommendation of the planning and zoning board, denied a request to vacate a fire easement in Deer Park Woods subdivision. Wynham pointed out that the road was nearly impassable in some places.

"I know the road and the people around it," Schwetzmann said. "They still want it as a fire escape even if they have to crawl on their bellies (to go down). We have a moral right to keep it open."

—denied a request by Leo Villaral to replat several lots in the Fox Run subdivision. The request would have created more lots.

—asked Wynham to come up with a simple plan on allocating space in the county's suboffice between the health department and the sheriff's department. The proposal then should be given to an architect to translate to construction plans.

Wynham said only simple modifications are needed at the sub-office, but the jail/sheriff's department expansion is a major project.

Montes asked Wynham to come back by June 1 with a plan that blends the needs of the jail, the sheriff and the ability to implement and operate the emergency 911 service.

Dr. Bernie Reimann, E911 coordinator, said he has been working on the plan for the service for six months and knows what is needed.

# Merry May ushers in Queen of Seasons

True Spring Days in Early May

April is the morning of the spring season, the first awakening of new life — the first fruit blooms, the early favorite song birds and, this year, the arrival of the first little calves.

May is spring time at high noon, "The Queen of the Season" at the beginning of full tide which begins in June.

So, on the first of May a favorite cow named Gentle Annie showed up on The Knoll followed by a little heifer, prancing and dancing across the meadow — the sixth calf of the year, little "May Flower."

On the second of May, a warm and sunny day, my pet lizard "Oswald" came out of his winter home under the concrete door step, blinking at the unaccustomed light, calm and unafraid — glad to be basking in the sun, his green and gray colors shining.

On the third, our father's birthday, here was the orange and black gross beak, joining the earlier birds, the finch, jays, phoebes and robins out on the feeding post where he feeds all summer.

He sent his serenade of May echoing through the glen, gladdening the hearts of all who listened. It is the very voice of spring itself, with clear ringing flute notes and chimes sounding like chords strummed on a tiny guitar or mandolin.

On the fourth, the parade of little calves continued with the seventh calf, a little heifer

who came down from the mountain leaning close beside her mother, Line Back Jr., a very gentle and tame little calf child, greatly admired by her brothers and sisters here in the vale.

### The Robin's Song

On the fifth here came a great flock of robins, chirping and warbling, all down among the river trees and up among the cedars and pines on the hillsides, singing their nesting time lullabies, rejoicing in the warm, dry air, secure in the evergreen foliage and the high branches of the oak and walnut trees.

### The Leaf Procession

Earlier we had the fruit blossom parade beginning with the apricot and followed by the higher reaches of the mountain land like the upper Bonito.

Now we are in the full swing of the leaf pageant, begun by the weeping willow, early plum, peach, pear and finally the apple. There are still a few apple trees blooming in

Chinese elm, box elder, wild cherry, oak, walnut, giant willow, Lombardy poplar and cottonwood. In all stages of leafing out from mature leaves of the cottonwood to the new leaves, with the sun shining through on the walnut trees. The river is a long winding spectacle of close-growing trees full of leaves of every shade of green.

### Little "Cinco"

On the fifth, a little calf who had gotten separated from his mother for a day finally showed up after his mother's repeated calling. This was on the Mexican National Holiday, Cinco de Mayo (fifth of May, so we will call him "Cinco."

### Cinco de Mayo

On May 5, 1862, a decisive battle was fought between Mexican and French forces at Puebla, Mexico, which led to the independence of Mexico from France and the establishment of the illustrious Mexican patriot, Benito Juárez, a pure-blooded Zapotec Indian, as Mexico's first President.

The fortunes of the United States and Mexico have always been closely entwined and in the years ahead will be even more close.

We wish our good neighbors to the south all congratulations during the season of their special day "El Cinco de Mayo."

Let us thank God for the arrival of the month of May and all its charms and our other many blessings.



Mine Eyes Have Seen the Glory  
3-Part Profile of American Evangelicalism

The popular stereotype of the American evangelical leader is of a teary-eyed demagogue whose religious preachings mask a dark underside — an Elmer Gantry of the airwaves. His followers are portrayed as gullible, Bible-thumping bores. *Mine Eyes Have Seen the Glory*, a three-part series, presents a portrait of American evangelicalism that refutes these stereotypes and demonstrates that the movement is as diverse as the country in which it prospers (40 percent of Americans now claim to be "born again").

In the first episode, Randall Balmer, professor of American religious history at Columbia University and author of *Mine Eyes Have Seen the Glory*, profiles four different congregations — a modern "mega-church" outside Chicago; a black Pentecostal church in Mississippi whose impoverished members are guided by a pastor who accepts no money from them; a large, fundamentalist church in Orange County, California; and an old-fashioned camp meeting in rural West Virginia, where evangelicalism retains its purest form.

In the second program, *Mine Eyes Have Seen the Glory* looks at the origins and tenets of American evangelicalism and shows how both are intertwined with the history of the United States.

Often ridiculed for their beliefs, especially since the Scopes monkey trial in 1925, evangelicals have developed their own subculture, with magazines, publishing houses, Bible colleges, and, currently, even rock festivals.

The third episode highlights the numerical — and economic — strength of American evangelicalism. The market for books and music today is worth nearly \$3 billion a year and televangelism is a major, though sometimes controversial, television industry.

*Mine Eyes Have Seen the Glory* airs Tuesdays at 10:00 p.m. beginning May 11th. The series repeats Sundays at 4:00 p.m. beginning May 16th.
