

A new general manager, with more than 13 years experience in solid waste management, has been hired by the Lincoln County Solid Waste Authority.

Members said Friday they expect to see improvement within two weeks and solid progress within two months now that Joe Lewandowsky is on board. They fired former manager Gene Green last month.

"I think we're going to see a marked improvement," said authority member Wilton Howell, who also is a county commissioner.

"He's told us it will be running smoothly in 60 days, and that we have sufficient equipment and manpower. He knows the equipment. He started in equipment maintenance."

No help in
sight from
killer road

U.S. Highway 70 has been called a death trap that cries to be widened by nearly every resident from Hondo to Ruidoso.

Head on collisions by trucks versus cars have claimed many lives over the past few years and recently a rash of accidents have prompted citizens to question the state's efforts to correct the situation.

But highway department chiefs indicate U.S. 70's four lane future is so far down the road it should be classified as science fiction.

Clyde Eanes of Ruidoso Downs, who lives near the highway and is a witness to racing trucks, called Tom Dick, District Two engineer of the New Mexico State Highway and Transportation Department.

Eanes wanted to know what's being done about semi speedsters and a rising death toll for that stretch of highway.

Dick, by telephone and letter,

Cremation is considered to cut
costs on indigent burials here

Poor village residents looking forward to a simple pine box for a final resting place in Forest Lawn Cemetery will have to settle for a jar, if left up to village management.

At a village cemetery board meeting last week, new rules were submitted and discussed that included indigent interment and prohibition of pet burials in the cemetery. A dog was buried in a family plot recently.

A pet burial ban gained general approval, but the cemetery board and village staff were at odds on how to handle indigent burials.

Village manager Ron Wicker and village attorney Patricia Ortiz inserted a stipulation that only cremated remains of indigents may be buried at Forest Lawn.

Wicker and Ortiz also wrote that there could be no burial of an indigent until the surviving next of kin, or other persons, provide the village with the indigent's latest federal income tax return.

Cemetery board chairman Danny Sisson questioned if a drifter was going to have a federal income tax on his person. And he said if it was a drifter, chances are no one would know the next of kin.

Sisson said dictating that the impoverished had to be cremated was inflicting personal beliefs on someone, who may not believe that way.

Ortiz said it was a matter of economics.

Sisson asked Ortiz if she also subscribed to multiple burials in a single lot. Ortiz said "Yes, we are saving space."

Cemetery board member Alan Morel asked Ortiz if Bernalillo County recently got into trouble for multiple burials.

Contacted by The Ruidoso News, Bernalillo officials said the incident that occurred was with record keeping from a cemetery that didn't know exactly where remains were located. The cemetery also charged

for burying two persons in one lot without first telling the county. The county was paying for two lots. Of officials at Bernalillo said they stopped doing business with that cemetery.

Ortiz was asked what would happen if the deceased was declared indigent and his family is religious or some other reason didn't want cremation.

They would have to go some where else, Ortiz said.

Sisson said there were other problems with cremating indigents and was attempting to explain to Morel reasons against mandatory cremation when Ortiz interrupted him.

"So, can we just deal with the legal part till we go?" Ortiz asked.

No, Sisson said, "I'm going to."

That's fine, Ortiz interrupted Sisson again, and then walked out of the meeting.

Sisson then told the members no cremation of an indigent would be applied for through LaGrone Funeral Home, where he is director.

"If you have an indigent person cremated and then five years later somebody in the family finds out they were cremated, that puts liability on the funeral home for being sued," he said.

Bernalillo county officials contacted by The News agreed with Sisson.

They said the county would prefer not to cremate indigents, even making it difficult to do so in order to avoid the loss of positive identification. They said legal suits could be avoided in case at some later date the next of kin came to claim the body.

Burying pets in the cemetery was another subject addressed in the new rules and regulations to be adopted at the next village council meeting.

Section "F" reads, in part: "Applications will be approved only for the interment of the remains or the cremated remains of human beings." If passed by the council,

that would not allow any future pet burials.

According to the cemetery board, Forest Lawn Cemetery must always be kept a place of beauty.

The rules and regulations are necessary for the protection of grave space owners to give them assurance that nothing of an unsightly or objectionable nature can ever be placed on grave spaces adjacent to their own and that the cemetery should not become a place of disorder or reproach.

Village management was tightly criticized earlier in the year for letting the cemetery grounds deteriorate into a state of disrepair with weeds, broken shelter doors, dumpsters that weren't picked up, unsightly opening and closing of graves, dirt mounded too high on graves, excess dirt poured over older graves, sunken graves not filled, broken glass, heavy equipment tire marks running over grave sites, fallen markers, potholes on cemetery streets, damaged streets by heavy equipment and lack of a routine maintenance plan.

Prisoners were called from Camp Sierra Blanca to clean up the mess.

The village council during budget sessions, recommended little change in the maintenance program. Former village councilor Al Junge accused the council of management by crises. He insisted the council provide a written plan.

The cemetery board will recommend a more comprehensive maintenance plan on paper to the council that will include:

- temporary markers to be removed when permanent markers are placed.
- flowers to be removed three days after interment.
- excess dirt to be removed within three months.
- sunken graves to be filled immediately,
- pine needles to be removed in December and February.

Last dog burial at Forest Lawn
Cemetery raises some hackles

Recently and with little fanfare, a dog was buried in Ruidoso's Forest Lawn Cemetery among the human remains.

Then someone let the cat out of the bag.

Ruidoso residents called The Ruidoso News shocked and outraged that an animal was buried in the village cemetery.

The others defended the action by

saying dead remains are dead remains — that what is important is what people feel for those dead remains — and it's nobody else's business.

The village council will rule on the issue at its next meeting when councilors examine a proposed policy submitted by the cemetery board. If passed, the policy would ban further animal burials in the village cemetery.

"I assured him that in 60 days if things aren't running smoothly, I would move for private enterprise to take over."

Howell said four of the five finalists were interviewed. Eleven applications were received. Lewandowsky was the only person with practical experience in garbage collection, having worked for more than two years with Southwest Disposal, which still collects in portions of the county.

Prior to that, he operated his own collection companies for about 10 years and served Lincoln County under the name of Alamo Waste.

He knows the territory. "My first efforts will be focused on routing and actual service," Lewandowsky told **The Ruidoso News**. "That's the real key. Once that's in shape, the rest falls in place. In my own business, I made sure a complaint was taken care of within 24 hours and that will be my goal here, too."

"I feel we've got the equipment and the people we need. Eventually, there should be enough for back-up and dumpster replacement. The number of employees is not the problem."

In hiring him, Lewandowsky said authority members were aware that as a private contractor previously, he was in the business of looking for more efficient approaches.

"They have been moving so fast on so many issues," he said. "The revenues are close, but I don't see a problem, although I need to sit down and take a closer look."

Lewandowsky said he may advocate contracting with a private company for service in those areas in the county that strain the authority, because they are isolated.

He hopes the drivers can identify with his leadership, because he has driven collection trucks and he knows the situation.

A past division between employees and management has been obvious, he said.

One of the first issues he will sit down and talk about to drivers is accepting gratuities in any form from customers.

"During the holidays, it's understandable, but during the regular course of business, that shouldn't be, especially in government, no matter how innocent the intent," he said.

Patriotic dumpsters?

Last Friday, Howell and Commission Chairman Monroy Montes witnesses a driver accept a watermelon from someone at Frank's Fruit Market, Howell told **The Ruidoso News**.

The two commissioners were at the market on U.S. 70 to discuss with owner Frank Cox dumpsters he has painted red, white and blue.

"They want to paint my dumpsters so they look like the rest," Cox told a reporter. "Those trash cans have been painted like that for four years. Two I paid for. They belong to me. They brought two more and I think I paid for them, too."

"I've been here 24 seasons and I've never mixed into politics. I've gone along with some silly old things, but this time, they went too far."

"I think they look good painted, a whole lot better than the others that look alike and sit there for years and get rusty."

"I paint them every year."

Cox took his dissatisfaction to the public by placing a series of radio advertisements urging people to call the county commissioners.

Howell said he received many calls, but most were supportive of the authority's position that the dumpsters should look alike and that people should not be allowed to paint them. That would create a nightmare for maintenance, he said.

He also was disturbed by Cox's approach to the situation, Howell said.

"He called me (Wednesday) and starts off real abusive, saying he pays a lot of taxes and that he owns the dumpsters," Howell said. "I told him that our policy is not to pick up trash out of privately-owned dumpsters. I asked him to wait until we hired the new manager (Thursday) and then we would see if we could

work out something. He agreed and then jumped the gun with this ad where he talks about being a veteran and urges Texans to call the commissioners. I did get 15-20 calls and not one was negative."

"We've asked him for receipts to prove he owns them. If they are authority property, they will be painted the same. If they are private, they will not be picked up."

Howell said he's confused by Cox's statements.

"On one hand, he says he wants to be left alone and doesn't want any special treatment and on the other, he's handing out watermelons to our driver for better service," he said.

John Howden, who said he is a member of the American Legion, said he was offended by Cox's advertisement.

"A lot of us are patriotic and proud of the flag, but a dumpster is no place for the flag. The rules say they should be brown and he's breaking the rules," Howden said.

"I'm a business man and also pay taxes, but I don't break the law and I certainly don't go around telling people I spent three years in the paratroopers."

"He shouldn't bring veterans and patriotism into it or try to promote his business with it."

"After all, he comes in when the racetrack opens and leaves when it closes, taking the money with him. It's not like (supermarkets that are open) here year around."

cemetery.

The dog, name and species unavailable, was buried last week by village employees, arranged by LaGrone Funeral Home, on the lots of D.E. and Peg Noltensmeyer from Tularosa.

"The dog, a female of medium size, was buried in the middle of three lots, so when the Noltensmeyers lie in state, the dog will be between them," said Paula Giarrantano, village sexton for the cemetery.

Giarrantano said the dog was buried in a small casket, 52 inches long, 24 inches wide and 18 inches high.

"Mrs. Noltensmeyer appeared devastated when the dog became gravely ill about two weeks ago,"

Giarrantano said. "They called the village at that time with the request to bury the dog in one of their four Forest Lawn plots purchased around 1988."

"Danny (Sisson of LaGrone) called me last Saturday to tell me the dog died. Both Mr. and Mrs. Noltensmeyer were there when they laid the dog to rest."

Giarrantano said when she was first contacted about the plot, she was under the impression the dog had already died.

"It wasn't until the next day, that they called to tell me they didn't expect the dog to make it," she said. An Alamogordo veterinarian put the dog down. Giarrantano said no cause of illness had been identified to the village.

According to the sexton, there

are other pets buried at Forest Lawn.

Humane Society vice president Earline Phillips buried her dog SuSu in the cemetery around 1980, and was the cause of some controversy with the village council at the time.

Phillips said SuSu was the first dog buried in Forest Lawn. She said her dog also had her own bank account and was a stockholder in the Ruidoso State Bank.

"I have the cutest shots of SuSu making her deposits," Phillips said. She said she has saved all of SuSu's invitations to bank parties.

According to Phillips, her dog wrote her own check for the lot about two years before she died at 16 years of age.

"She (SuSu) donated her bank

account to the humane society," said Phillips. "That's what got me started."

Giarrantano said unless the council adopts a rule prohibiting the burial of animals at the cemetery, she can't refuse such a request.

"There are other dogs buried up there, setting precedent," she said. "That's why I agreed to this. I don't think legally I could tell them no."

Giarrantano said the village street department, as in all grave sites, used a back hoe.

The Noltensmeyers paid \$175 to the village to open and close the grave.

"Anytime we open a grave, except for infants, it's \$175. It will be going to \$200 (under the proposed policy)," Giarrantano said.

said his department is aware of the concerns Eanes and other citizens have expressed on U.S. 70. Dick said they are the same concerns he hears on other routes in New Mexico.

"You expressed your concern over the speeds which trucks are traveling through this area. As I told you, our department is not an enforcement agency," Dick wrote.

Dick wrote that some sections of

U.S. 70 are included in plans to be four-laned, but those are in flat, less encumbered areas between Roswell and Portales.

Apparently, how dangerous the road may be has nothing to do with the projected plans.

"I am sure you can understand it is less expensive to construct roadways on the flatlands versus the mountains," wrote Dick.

Dick wrote Eanes that to date highway improvement in this area is merely a thought, not a plan.

"Based on discussions within the department," he wrote, "I believe projects west of Roswell will start to be planned."

In any event, Dick said four-laning all of U.S. 70 is a commitment that will not be achieved overnight.

In fact, he indicates the project may well be beyond another 20 years.

"The department has estimated a shortfall of \$2.6 billion over the

next 20 years. This shortfall is based on maintaining the system we now have and enhancing ... four-lane routes which are ... similar to U.S. 70." He didn't say including all of U.S. 70.

"...hopefully, I have been able to give you useful information on New Mexico's transportation system," wrote Dick. The letter also was sent to Governor Bruce King and highway department Secretary Louis Medrano.

Dusty roads take Ruidosoans home

Where is all the dust coming from?

The answer, my friend, is blowing in the wind — along Hull Road and Cree Meadows Drive where the village, financed in part by a state grant, is completing road maintenance.

Village deputy manager Alan Briley said there is no further overlay of oil to cover the chips now coughing dust by passing motorists, but he said in a short time the dust will subside and the roads will be striped and return to normal.

Briley said the street department intends to sweep the roads this week in an effort to recapture much of the loose chips that didn't adhere to the oil spray.

He said the roads have been rolled and with further traffic, the chips would imbed more smoothly in the oil.

Briley said that the chip and spray was chosen because it is less expensive, didn't require sophisti-

cated road equipment and demanded less time to complete.

Briley said the total 6.5 miles of road maintenance, estimated at about \$90,000, should not take

more than a week or two to complete. He said the state highway department is paying about 60 percent of the tab.

Briley said the other roads to be

repaired are Paradise Canyon Road from Sudderth to Hull; a stretch of Country Club Road; Cree Meadows Drive from Mechem to Hull; and all of Hull, which has been completed.

Council convenes Tuesday to reconsider the hotel lease

A special public meeting regarding plans for a future convention hotel has been called by the village council at the urging of Councilor J.D. James. The meeting is scheduled for 6 p.m. Tuesday, June 15, in council chambers at Ruidoso Municipal Administrative Center.

Councilor James said he was not satisfied that a discussion of such importance was held in closed session during the last council meeting. He said the impact of a convention hotel is of vital economic interest to the community and the county. He said that business persons and residents, pro and con to the issue, should have a chance for input.

James said the vote came as no surprise because the councilors voting against the extension were part of the same slate that petitioned against Hubbard's original package integrating hotel, golf course and civic events center. Voting for extending the lease were James and councilors Jerry Shaw and Frank Cummins. Against the motions were Mayor Pro-tem Barbara Duff and councilors Ron Andrews and Bill Karn.

Downs reviews lodgers tax laws

The Ruidoso Downs Board of Trustees will have its bi-monthly meeting at 7 p.m. today (Monday), June 14, in the Volunteer Fire Station.

On the agenda is the approval of an amendment to the Ruidoso Downs Lodgers Tax Ordinance.

The amendment, required by the state according to village clerk Leann Weibrecht, will add four parts to the ordinance.

The first part of the amendment will require the Downs Board of Trustees to randomly select a lodger for an audit. The audit will be to verify whether the amount of Lodgers Tax that is owed and if that amount has been paid.

Another part of the amendment will make it possible for the village to audit any lodger to verify compliance to the Lodgers Tax.

The last two parts of the amend-

ment require that the audits be submitted to the local government division of the state Department of Finance and Administration, and that the specifications for the audits be determined and approved by the village board of trustees.

Also on the agenda will be the approval of the Ruidoso Downs monthly reports from the police department, fire department, the court, the maintenance department, the animal control department and the code enforcement division.

Under general business, the board will discuss the adoption of its budget resolution, PERA tax resolution adoption and the purchase of the Agua Fria Water System. The board is also scheduled to adopt a wage and salary schedule for 1994.

Also on the agenda is an closed session to discuss personnel matters.

Orphan puppies turn up on shelter doorstep

Just five weeks old, the trio of wiggling gray pups was left on the porch of the cattery at the Lincoln County Humane Society shelter.

"They had barely been weaned when we found them in the box," said shelter secretary Kathy Tetreault.

The three gray pups appear to be Weimaraners, but at this stage it's difficult to tell. They also may be a Shar-pei mix.

Caesar is the largest of the three, Callie is the only female and Capone is the most pugnacious. After a week of observation, they appear to be healthy and at six weeks old, ready to be adopted.

An attractive Boston terrier mix named Lady was released to the shelter by her owner, who no longer had a home where he could keep the dog.

"He almost had tears in his eyes

and said she's good with children and is a sweet dog with lots of energy," Tetreault said.

Lady is about two years old and has been at the shelter for more than one month. She would have to be sterilized to ensure she does not produce any litters. The pups, when they are six months old, also would have to be altered.

The society welcomes the generosity of sponsors who donate money to cover the cost of sterilization. When a pet is sponsored, it greatly enhances the chance for adoption, since the required procedure is the major cost. No only does the adoption contract require that all pets from the shelter be neutered, Ruidoso has a mandatory spay/neuter law and a new state law will take effect July 3.

Three dogs and two cats at the shelter already are altered and their adoption fee would be less.

Adobe, a blonde Akita Inu mix

with good-looking conformation, a curled tail and erect ears, was sponsored by the woman who found her wandering hungry and wary months ago. She has warmed up to shelter workers and would be a good and loyal companion.

Trekker and Tracker also were found wandering. They both were altered and they have great personalities. Shelter workers have begun to call Trekker, the female, by the nickname of Patience, because she appears to have become resigned to life in a kennel.

They desperately want to find a home for her. She's gentle and appreciates any show of affection, but she's not a showy dog that attracts the attention of strangers.

Her traveling companion, Tracker, has shorter hair and is more aggressive. They get along well together and would be a good team.

Several Labrador pups and adults, both black and golden, are

available for adoption. Litters that are three months and younger include several very attractive and fluffy golden retrievers, three Australian shepherd mixes, a Husky, a shepherd, and spaniel mixes.

The society needs to the support of residents and visitors to provide a safe and caring environment for abandoned pets, and to give them chances for new homes.

To accommodate more animals from across the county, the society has plans to expand the shelter and would appreciate support for the project. Currently, some animals picked up outside of the village limits end up in an unheated and isolated facility where they are kept only three days before being destroyed.

Latest in technology shrinks TV satellites

Penasco Telecom Systems of Artesia has entered into an exclusive contract to provide Direct Broadcast Satellite (DBS) television programming/service to the rural households in Eddy, Chaves, Lincoln and Otero counties.

Penasco Telecom Systems is a subsidiary of Penasco Valley Telephone Cooperative, Inc.

According to a news release, this service will be provided through a joint venture of Penasco Telecom Systems, National Rural Telecommunications Cooperative (NRTC) and Hughes Communications, the largest operators of satellites in the world.

The new satellite television service is to be offered starting in early 1994.

The DBS service will unite new state-of-the-art technology incorporating the Unites States' first "high power" (120 Watt) direct-to-home satellite service.

The two Hughes Communications satellites will operate in the "KuBand" in a "stationary" orbit at 101 degrees west longitude.

This will allow consumer homes to use a small 18-inch satellite dish which is mounted in a permanent position on the consumer's residence, continues the release.

Information provided by the company indicates that once the dish is locked in place, consumers will never need to adjust it.

The DBS service will be capable of carrying approximately 150 channels of high quality cable programming, pay-per-view movies, sports and other information/entertainment/education channels. The high powered satellites will incorporate digital compression which significantly increases the channel capacity of the service. The digital signalling will allow Penasco Telecom Systems to provide high-

definition television (HDTV) video quality and compact disk (CD) quality audio/sound.

The entire digital home receiving system consisting of an 18-inch satellite dish, addressable decoder box and universal remote control unit, will be available for about \$700, according to the news release.

The simplicity of the components will allow many consumers to install the equipment themselves.

The home receiving system will be available through direct purchase, monthly lease or lease purchase. The home receiving system, being manufactured in association with RCA, will be available from Penasco Telecom Systems at various selected area outlets.

Penasco Telecom Systems will provide a complete installation and repair service to interested customers.

The basic programming package will offer "Best of Cable" channels including premium choices such as HBO, Cinemax, Showtime, TBS, etc. It is anticipated the basic package will include a full range of programming choices plus the major networks. In addition to the basic "cable type" programming, there will be a very wide range of pay-per-view movie selections, sports events, major attractions (concerts, etc.) and special interest channels such as educational, vocational and entertainment included in the programming line-up for viewer selection.

Penasco Telecom Systems will be the exclusive provider of this programming package in the rural areas of the four counties mentioned previously.

The first Hughes DBS will launch in December of this year and service will be available from Penasco Telecom Systems in April of 1994.

"The scouts are working on their World of Well-being badges," explained Jamie Gieb, service unit manager for Lincoln County, Zia Council.

"This visit counts for any of three badges in that World."

Care Inc. raises funds for area meals program

Ruidoso Care, Inc. kicked off "Campaign Ruidoso Cares" on Monday at the Ruidoso Senior Citizens Center.

Ruidoso Care, Inc., a non-profit charitable organization, provides need-based home meals for qualified elderly, handicapped and shut-ins in the Ruidoso Valley area at least three days each week.

With 100 percent participation from the board itself, and a variety of generous individual and group contributions, the campaign begins with a total of about \$4,500 in cash and pledges, according to Scott Roser.

"As a wonderful surprise, the Lincoln County Motorcycle Association provided a huge boost to the campaign by promising proceeds from the raffle of a Porsche-powered Maxi Taxi Kit Car," said Roser. He said the drawing will take place during the 1993 Golden Aspen Motorcycle Rally.

In addition, the Ruidoso Board of Realtors announced that half the proceeds from the group's golf scramble on June 22 will be donated to the meals program.

"This is the kind of concern and generosity which shows the spirit of the Ruidoso Valley and helps keep alive the idea of caring for our own," said the ad hoc campaign chairman Chris Denne.

Achieving the campaign goal of \$40,000 will fund the meal program through July 1996, and ensure that 40 to 50 needy people receive the supplementary nutrition essential

to their health, well being and quality of life, said Roser in a news release.

Unlike many supplementary feeding programs, this one has been funded exclusively through contributions of individuals and local organizations.

In order to continue the Ruidoso Care Program, those kind and generous contributions must continue, and in the short-term, increase, said Don Zick, president of the board of directors.

"At the beginning of May, the program had less than \$250 in assets and only a few regular contributors," said Zick.

"But already, this campaign has begun to challenge the community to help meet future needs, and the community is responding," he added.

The volunteers who manage the program and distribute the food now have the means to continue this vital program, at least for the immediate future.

For the long haul, Campaign Ruidoso Cares will provide those necessary resources.

The campaign runs through July 31, with volunteers distributing additional information through the Ruidoso Valley.

Afterwards, a visit to Dr. Woods museum, staffed by Lincoln County Historical Society members presented an excellent opportunity for the class to appreciate the life of a late 1800s doctor and family.

Instructor Sanchez also showed students the "backside" of Lincoln — that is, places most tourists never see. Some of these sites are more interesting than the usual.

Especially colorful are the phlox, shining in crimson, scarlet, pink and maroon. There are tiger lilies, daisies and purple bells.



Lobbying is lucrative for retired officials

Former elected officials are turning more and more to lobbying in their retirement years. These people, who are used to wielding power through their high offices, now translate that clout into big bucks as they lobby for all kinds of industries, issues and even foreign governments. It's a national disgrace.

A good example of this power brokering is the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA). On May 20, The Wall Street Journal reported Mexico's annual spending to negotiate and sell NAFTA was \$15,950,000. Two former New Mexico governors are among the beneficiaries of all that foreign lobbying money. Governors Toney Anaya and Jerry Apodaca reportedly were paid \$260,000 and \$170,000 (respectively) last year. Unsuccessful congressional candidate Dan Sosa is a part of former governor Apodaca's lobbying firm.

After representing U.S. taxpayers in various capacities, these political types seem to be changing their allegiance as they advocate for other countries. We elected them, paid them, trained them and basically gave them the power and credibility that made them desirable as lobbyists. And now they're cashing in on our investment.

This practice may not be illegal, but it has at the very least the appearance of impropriety — we believe it is unethical.

"Come to the tent show!" "Come all!"

Shouted noisily through the streets, the above "convite" (invitation) is announced to the townspeople to come and see the "carpa" performed on a makeshift stage beneath a small tent. In the first half of this century, "carpa" troupes roamed the U.S. Southwest, stopping in small towns to perform vaudeville acts for Mexican and Chicano laborers and their families. The family-run "carpas" offered colorful entertainment along with traditional songs and poetry, weaving these together around the "pelado" character, a Chicano/Mexican everyman similar to Charlie Chaplin's tramp.

But even more important, the "carpas" provided a unique medium for exploring the political and social problems experienced by the local community. The "carpas" crafted a bicultural, bilingual sensibility that celebrated the ethnic diversity of the U.S. Southwest.

Set in 1938, the film explores racial tensions in the Southwest, while it reveals the mediating role of the "carpa."
