Grand jury meets

For the third time this month, a Lincoln County grand jury will convene apparently to continue its consideration of a public corruption case against State Representative H. John Underwood.

Grand jury proceedings are secret, but since Attorney General Tom Udall called for the jury to be formed shortly after Underwood announced he was being investigated, it seems likely his case will be reviewed.

If the jury finds there is probably because that an offense has occurred, members will issue an indictment.

Underwood, a two-term Democrat from Ruidoso, has said he did nothing wrong by calling Ruidoso Downs police chief Will Hoggard on behalf of a client facing an administrative hearing on revocation of his driving license. Both Underwood and Hoggard acknowledged the representative urged Hoggard to ask the arresting officer (on a DWI charge) not to attend the hearing.

Whether Underwood stepped over the line by using his influence as a state representative is one of the key issues. The officer, who had a conflict in scheduling, did not attend the hearing and the client retained his license.

Council faces its longest agenda

Airport fuel competition, septic tank fees, building protests and swimming pool discounts are four of 37 items to be acted upon Tuesday, at the Ruidoso Village Council meeting.

Councilors picked up their 281-page agenda packet last Friday. Village Clerk Tammie Maddox said it was the largest packet ever assembled for a village council meeting.

Ordinance 93-11 would repeal portions of an existing ordinance that deals with base operations and airport tenants at the Sierra Blanca Airport. Approval would open plane fuel to be sold in competition with the village. Fuel is the village's prime source of airport revenue.

The new ordinance would delete minimum standards for fixed base operators and airport tenants.

Village attorney Patricia Ortiz wrote that staff (Ortiz, village manager Ron Wicker, deputy manager Alan Briley and airport manager Lloyd Wayne) requested the repeal of the minimum standards because they "have little relevance in today's economy."

Ortiz drafted the proposed ordinance to read, "the Governing Body finds that said minimum standards are rigid and inflexible, outdated and no longer serving the public good."

However, the existing ordinance allows for flexibility by stating that although rules, regulations and guidelines should be established, "These Minimum Standards are subject to change from time to time as the Village Council may desire and approve."

By repealing this section of the ordinance, activities relative to fixed base operations and airport tenants possibly would fit under routine airport management and may not have to come before the Village Council (and public) for approval and accountability.

The cost to taxpayers could be far reaching since the village subsidizes any loss at the airport. Tuesday's agenda carries several proposed airport leases to be considered including Hido Inc., a fixed base operation that could be affected by the council's action.

Recently, the council voted against requiring septic tank owners to pay a monthly standby fee when sewer line service isn't available adjacent to their home.

Village attorney Ortiz has drafted an ordinance that now proposes to charge an annual fee to all septic tank owners, based on the possibility that a resident with a septic tank may have to dump contents at the village's sewage plant on a yearly basis.

Ortiz said she had gleaned information from a budget workshop to draft the ordinance. On the workshop tapes, it mentions a waiver for septic tank owners, but it was unclear exactly what was meant by the waiver.

Under the proposed amendment, Ortiz wrote, "all septic tank users who also use municipal water services shall pay an annual fee of \$15 for residential water users and \$30

Land commish takes the heat

The public temperature was sizzling for Ray Powell Jr. last week on his first foray outside of the political enclave of Santa Fe.

The newly appointed Commissioner of Public Lands met with oil and gas representatives, cattle and sheep ranchers in southeastern New Mexico to discuss problems facing those industries and future policy on the use of trust land.

During an interview at **The Ruidoso News** Tuesday, Powell described himself as a consensus builder. His background includes working in wildlife rehabilitation as a veterinarian and a strong academic foundation in anthropology, biology and plant economy.

Powell said he relies more on a scientific basis for decisions than his predecessor, Jim Baca.


"It all fits together for me in a manner I feel has given me the groundwork for the job," Powell said.

Working in Governor Bruce King's office for two years and being the son of state Democratic Party Chairman Ray Powell, also has given him the political insight needed to put programs into action, he said.

"I really appreciate the opportunity to do this and am looking forward to working with Jim (Baca) at the Bureau of Land Management (where he now is director)," Powell said.

"We have to work coherently to come up with an overall strategy. I will be looking for sound biological scientific approaches and less as a citizen activist, although the latter is very important."

Powell announced at a meeting of local Democrats in Ruidoso that he plans to run for the lands commissioner office in 1994. One of his opponents may be Lincoln County Commissioner Stirling Spencer, a Republican, a rancher and engineer, who had bid for the lands

commissioner appointment.

Will run in 1994

While Powell used his session with local Democrats to fire off criticisms of the Republican Party, Spencer took aim at Powell after a commission meeting the same day.

"I was quite alarmed that he had no background in the grazing fee issue and even less in oil and gas industry, which pumps about 80 percent of the revenue into the state's permanent fund for the operation of schools," Spencer said.

"Under the enabling act and the State Constitution, it's his job to maximize the revenues off the state lands from the various user entities under a long term program and the only way to do that is to have the background and knowledge of those uses."

Powell acknowledged that initially he will be relying substantially on the expertise of his veteran staff.

"We have 138 extremely capable professionals in the state lands office," he said.

In his new capacity, Powell is responsible for the management of 9.5 million acres of surface land and 13.4 million mineral acres. Those state lands are held in trust in 32 of New Mexico's 33 counties. Two years ago, the land office

for commercial water users. The annual fee shall be added to the water bill. An annual permit shall be issued by the Village of Ruidoso to the septic tank user and said permit shall be presented to the Wastewater Treatment Plant by the tank truck driver before any discharge shall be allowed. Discharge at the Wastewater Treatment Plant shall be allowed only during the year for which a permit was issued to the septic tank user."

It is estimated that 70 percent of the water customers in Ruidoso are on septic tanks.

Residents, especially seasonal, may only need to dump once every 10 to 15 years.

In addition to the \$15 annual permit, a monthly standby charge of \$9 shall be assessed against each unit where a village sewer line is available except for motel and condo owners.

For unknown reasons, sewer charges for motel and condo owners are treated as one unit, with a slightly higher minimum rate than residential and the same commodity charge of 60 cents per 1,000 gallons of water used in excess of 4,000 gallons.

According to discussions taped at the budget hearings, local dumpers pay \$5 per load to dump the raw sewage into designated manholes.

Other towns like Artesia and Roswell charge dumpers \$30. Councilors expressed fear that if that charge was raised, dumpers may dump illegally.

In another matter, the village council will hear an appeal by Charles Rennie appealing Planning Commission approval of a

commercial site development to allow a public service building to handle welfare recipients in the downtown area.

Rennie's basis of appeal is that the public interest has been affected by the applicant's failure to conform to the Ruidoso Zoning Code, and by the Planning and Zoning Commission's failure to adhere to that code in its approval of the site plan.

The building is to be constructed near the intersection of 5th Street and Sudderth Drive.

Rennie lists various points where code errors were committed.

Planning director Cleatus Richards refutes Rennie's objections, stating that they "appear to be an attempt ... to substitute his personal judgment for that of the Planning Commission."

Apparently, Rennie and neighbors in the area are concerned that the government building is too large for the area, would not blend in well with Main Street business and would remove too many tall pines.

Richards justified pine removal because of dwarf mistletoe infestation in all areas of the property. The parasitic mistletoe already has invaded thousands of acres of pines in the Ruidoso area.

Richards recommends the commission's action be upheld and appeal denied.

Rennie and neighbors would like more time to study the proposal.

In one of the more unusual requests on the agenda, Councilor Bill Karn is asking for discussion and possible action to allow the children of Village of Ruidoso employees to swim at the village pool

at a discounted fee.

Karn, apparently, will explain to the council how children of village employees deserve special consideration over other taxpayers' children and why this would not be considered discrimination.

Karn also asked that AllHub lease negotiations (hotel and golf course) be put on the agenda for the meeting.

In other business, the council will conduct public hearings regarding:

—a new restaurant liquor license, beer and wine only, for Riverside Ruidoso located at 203 S. Eagle Drive.

—a continuation of public hearing Ordinance 93-09, creating provisions for requiring a State of New Mexico Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity for all towing businesses.

—Ordinance 93-12 concerning the sale or service of alcoholic liquor outside the building on licensed premises.

—a consideration of airport lease with Ruidoso Connection, Inc. (Withdrawn by request).

—a consideration of airport lease with United Helicopter, Inc., Ralph Gary's company.

—a consideration of an airport lease with HIDO Enterprises, Inc. Clifton Hicks is president, notices sent to Russell Dorsey of Alto. Steve Hightower first approached the council regarding the lease.

On the regular agenda, the council will hear:

—a report on the lodgers tax audits.

—proposed rules and regulations concerning Forest Lawn Cemetery.

—an Arts and Film Commission request for money for a Fourth of

July celebration.

—a chamber of commerce proposed advertising plan for 1993-94.

—an airport improvement project matching funds.

—a bid award and change order on airport improvements project.

Under consent agent items, to be voted on collectively, the council will approve:

—a replat of lots 33A, 46A and 47A in Navajo Subdivision

—a replat of J.B. Close tracts.

—Annexation tracts 1,2 and 3, and Phase 1,2 and 3, of Carrizo Lodge.

—an agreement extension for the Emergency Medical Services.

—an agreement extension with Ruidoso Downs for adult detention facilities.

—applications for special dispensers permits for special events to be held at the Civic Events Center.

—scheduling a public hearing to consider Ordinance 93-13 concerning the revisions in the correction fees and judicial education fees mandated by state law.

Under reports from municipal officials, Councilor J.D. James will discuss fireworks.

Under village manager reports, deputy manager Alan Briley will update the council on the Two Rivers Park survey, the Carrizo Canyon project, and the Main Street Redevelopment project.

Village manager Ron Wicker will report on Water Plant No. 1.

Attorney Patricia Ortiz will report on a resolution regarding the water production tax and a resolution of the proposed energy tax.

The council will enter closed session to discuss matters under threatened or pending litigation.

Leaders scramble to regain resort hotel & name a mayor

Business leaders and government officials, perceiving that three councilors recently declared themselves lame ducks by voting against a hotel lease extension, are scrambling to line up the next mayor and council.

Although community leaders, speaking before the village council, proclaimed a critical community need to allow a hotel lease extension for racetrack owner R.D. Hubbard's AllHub, it was denied. Mayor Pro tem Barbara Duff and councilors Ron Andrews and Bill Karn voted against the extension.

After that special public meeting, political power plays, like charged electricity, have lightened the dark skies over Ruidoso.

Meetings soliciting Hubbard for new hotel negotiations, meetings recommending a new mayor, meetings to oust the three village councilors, all have been conducted on the Q-T.

Apparently, it's deal cutting time and every player wants in on the action.

Even an anonymous poison pen letter has been sent to the community leaders who spoke out in favor of the hotel, chastising them for speaking against the three councilors who killed the hotel chances with their vote.

There has been other hate mail sent to letter writers who supported The Ruidoso News in its stand for the hotel.

Although Bill Karn has told several businessmen he now wants to change his vote, Hubbard has said it's too late.

Karn has asked to speak Tuesday during the council meeting on AllHub (Hubbard's and Ed Allred's company name) regarding negotiations. With the hotel clearly a dead issue, it is unclear why Karn chose to put the item back on the agenda.

Downs board to meet tonight

The Ruidoso Downs Board of Trustees will meet at 7 p.m. today (Monday) at the Ruidoso Downs Volunteer Fire Department.

On the agenda for the meeting will be the raising of the commodity rates for the village. This will consist of a 55 cent increase for sewage and a 50 cent increase for water.

The board is also scheduled to talk to an official from Lincoln County regarding the opening of a senior citizens center.

Fundraiser isn't representing local or state search & rescue

Funds and/or food are being solicited from local businesses by individuals who allegedly represent "The New Mexico Search and Rescue Journal" with an address in Albuquerque.

"To set the record straight, no one in a recognized search and rescue team in the state knows of or has heard of 'The New Mexico Search and Rescue Journal,'" announced a spokesperson for the White Mountain Search and Rescue.

The organization representing SAR teams in the state is "The New Mexico Emergency Services Council (NMESC)." The NMESC's official publication is "The New Mexico SAR News" which is a quarterly publication edited in Ruidoso by David H. Travis and Melinda Headley, continues the release.

"They do not solicit funds for any team in the state or for themselves."

White Mountain Search and Rescue does not and has not in the past solicited funds from individuals or businesses. Should WMSAR ever solicit funds from individuals or businesses, WMSAR members will be identified by their ID badges which bears a photo of themselves, their name and the name "White Mountain SAR Ruidoso, New Mexico" on it.

Firefighters battle brushfire

A fire of unknown origin burned a brush pile at Bonito Lake late Thursday night.

Firefighters from Bonito Fire Department and the New Mexico State Forestry confined the damage within minutes to a small area on the bank just north of the dam, approximately a hundred square feet.

Fire began in a pile of dead trees and brush cleared from a soil stabilization project area, said a spokesman for the City of Alamogordo, owner of the property.

At press time, firefighters had not pinpointed the cause of the fire which began about 9 p.m.; but because of the fire's location, it was suspected to be human-caused.

earned \$150.5-million from the use of the land. That same year, the public school system received \$213.1-million from the state's permanent fund earnings, of which land office revenues comprise 96 percent.

Coyote concerns

One of the major items on the minds of the ranchers he met in Roswell was the future of the animal damage control program, Powell said.

"It's an issue that only can be resolved if we bring everybody back to the table," he said. "It's been a very emotional issue with large sheep ranches."

While the ranchers have a big stake in the outcome, so do the animals, he said.

"I've treated animals caught in traps," Powell said. "When you see one there six days dehydrated and untreated, it leaves an impression. Some are attacked by feral animals."

"I'm trying to determine what we can do that makes biological sense. I want to do it as humanely as possible, as specifically as possible and do it in a manner that allows (livestock) production to stay."

"I think grave errors occurred in the past animal control approaches. Eradication of predators could be

one of reasons for the excessive rodent population problem in northern New Mexico. Predators have a distinct role."

Powell said he intends to ask the Secretary of Agriculture in Washington D.C., to try a pilot program in New Mexico since existing approaches are not working.

"I would like to get rid of a blanket policy and develop approaches tailored to particular areas," he said.

"We keep demanding more and more in production, but we need to retain a healthy ecological system."

"My real worry is if we lose animal damage control, individual producers will be forced to go out and do it themselves using poison and other methods potential dangerous. We could really devastate the eco system if it is not regulated."

Spencer said he has no argument with Powell's long range approach, but something definitive is needed in the short term while other details are being hashed out.

Not providing animal damage control could negatively impact wildlife as well as livestock, he said.

"Being a veterinarian, he should know that animal populations run in cycles," Spencer said. "There are plenty of predatory animals to control rodents. The imbalance in wildlife species has been caused by the

push of mankind.

"He's not there for political expedience and perception issues," Spencer said. "He's there almost as a dictator to do as the Constitution says or he's in breach of trust."

If production in oil, gas and livestock decreases, the burden to support schools may fall more directly on shoulders of state taxpayers, he said.

"Many people are vacating state lands and New Mexico is losing revenue, because of the inability of the lands office to understand their value."

Incentive program

A relatively new approach called the Range Stewardship Incentive Program (RSIP) was the brainchild of deputy commissioner Bob Langenskamp.

"He recognized the need quite a while ago and brought it to Baca's attention," Powell said. "It's particularly important with the federal government talking about raising grazing fees (the charge per animal unit based on consumption of vegetation)."

"Anything that happens there affects us since in New Mexico we have a checkerboard system of land use."

One rancher may use state land, forestry land and Bureau of Land Management property, along with

his private land, he explained.

The RSIP is a volunteer program, said Langenskamp, who accompanied Powell on the interview. Those lessees who sign up receive a 25 percent discount on grazing fees.

Landfill site help

Recently, his office scored some local points by cooperating with the solid waste authorities in Lincoln and Otero counties on the purchase of a regional landfill site south of Alamogordo.

Powell said his staff's effort was in line with the governor's commitment to innovative and regional approaches to garbage disposal.

While the staff was required constitutionally to obtain fair market value for any public trust land, they also were ready to work with the two counties to ensure the money invested for testing at the site was not wasted.

Selecting appropriate sites for garbage disposal could lessen illegal dumping and inappropriate use of state trust lands elsewhere, Powell said.

"It was a good way to use the resource and to remove Otero County from (the) Dog Canyon (landfill)," he said. "The land next to the canyon has great potential and we wanted them out of there."

The state permit for the canyon landfill expires in January.

Dumped there with several siblings by an owner who failed to spay his pet and then didn't want to care for the offspring, she thrived

on the slightest bit of affection.

She survived when the shelter became over-crowded and some of her siblings were destroyed.

"There's just something about Kiko and those big brown eyes, the eagerness to please in her face," said shelter director Esther Harper.

Now six months old, it's important that she be placed in a real home where she has a chance for a normal life, Harper said.

The shepherd mix may have some border collie blood, but her hair is short. She would have to be spayed, but shelter workers are hoping someone will step forward to sponsor Kiko for that part of the adoption charge.

All animals adopted from the shelter must be spayed or neutered at the appropriate age. The adoption fee covers that expense in addition to the cost of a rabies shot and a village license, if necessary.

A sponsor pays the cost of sterilization, greatly improving an animal's chances for adoption and helping out the adopting family, who will face future financial responsibilities with annual protective immunizations.

Several animals at the shelter, female and male, already are sterilized and their adoption cost would be lower. They include Tracker, who appears to have some Bernese Mountain dog blood, although he's smaller with shorter hair; and a new female golden retriever mix who is housebroken.

Another great candidate for adoption at the shelter is Sugar, a golden Labrador with cropped ears.

"She's a big dog with a heart of gold," Harper said. "She came in as a stray and is about 1 1/2 years old."

"She's gentle and good with other animals and children." Sugar will need to be spayed.

The shelter also is home to a blue heeler named Cisco and a red heeler called Red Rider, a black Labrador named Greta, a six-toed smooth collie mix called Chickums (who is sponsored), and a border collie mix called Sweetie, who's true to her name.

Unfortunately during the summer, many litters of young pups and kittens are dropped at the shelter. Although they immediately are given protective shots, it takes 10 days for the immunizations to take effect. A great way for seasonal residents, who can't adopt, to enjoy having animals around the house is to become a foster family.

Poster homes provide a disease-free environment for the young pups for about two weeks.

Widely known as the bird of happiness, the blue bird is welcome throughout our nation and also across the water. There are three main kinds of blue birds in America: the eastern blue bird, the western blue bird and the mountain blue bird.

The eastern and western blue birds look very much alike with dark blue back, red breast and white abdomen. The mountain blue bird is all light blue; and he is rightly named, for he loves the mountains and can be seen in the forests and meadows around Sierra Blanca and the Capitans.

For years the mountain blue birds nested in the blue bird trees and often came to the cedar tree in the yard and perched on the nearby power lines and sang their little chirping songs; our mother answered these songs saying, "Mother's Darlings."

And years ago when I first came back from World War II, there was a pair of mountain blue birds who were almost like members of the family, always close around the house drinking from the rain barrel and feeding at the door step.

For several years now there have been no mountain blue birds in the blue bird trees or in the cedar tree in the yard; and I wondered what had happened to them and when they would return.

No mountain blue bird has been here in the yard since that very tame and gentle pair 40 years ago.

So now the mountain blue bird has returned after all these years; and right now just after high noon, he is out on the REA power line singing his chirping little song, a message from our mother in heaven. Mother's birthday is on July 2, and today I feel our mother's spirit very fondly close and near on the approach of her birthday.

Let us thank God for birds and other of God's creatures, our loved ones and all our other many blessings.

Artists recapture travels in work

An exhibit featuring a collection of new works by three of Lincoln County's most prestigious artists is set to open July 2 at the Canyon Art Gallery in Carrizo Lodge. The paintings and pastels are the products of an extended visit to San Miguel, Mexico, by Ann Templeton, Dorothy Bell Knapp and Ted Robertson.

"Ann and I decided a long time ago to go, and then we talked Ted into joining us," said Knapp, who owns the Buckhorn Gallery in Glencos with her husband, sculptor Tom Knapp.

"I've been going for five years and Ann conducted three classes there before. We both had tried to get Ted to go down. It's a great painting spot and now he believes it."

"There's a quaintness and primitiveness that you don't find in the States," said Templeton, who has earned a reputation not only for her original works, but for her teaching techniques.

"It's a national monument that's historically intact from the seventeenth century of Spanish colonialism," said Canyon Gallery owner Tom McMahon. "It's been an inspiration for artists for years."

Robertson, whose richly sensuous pastels have garnered a loyal following of collectors, said soon after he arrived, he realized

the area provided the subject matter that had been in the back of his mind for years.

"There's so much variety, color and contrast," he said.

Templeton said during her month there, many other artists came to stay and all seemed to experience major breakthroughs in their work.

"I think it was a combination of the camaraderie, the exchange of information and the new subject matter," Templeton said.

She found herself switching to work involving figures, "not something I normally do," Templeton said. "It's all I want to do now, a little more abstract than my previous work."

Knapp, who used a friend's studio during her stay, said her breakthrough involved her approach to color.

"I gathered lots of material there in photographs that I can use for years, but it's different working on the spot," she said. "It was the first time I had all my materials and painting equipment right there in the environment."

"The cobblestone streets and special light" captured her brush, Knapp said.

Robertson said while he always has been attracted to Latin American textures, stonework and filigree, the character of people fascinated him even more.

"I was set up to paint in the field since I do mostly landscapes," Templeton said. "But people were everywhere. They're part of the land. You can't paint a scene without them."

"You can hire a model or dress up an old woman (in Mexican garb), it's not the same as the people on the street," Robertson said.

"There's a sensitivity and directness, a naturalness with the real people of the village," Templeton agreed. "I guess another reason we loved the area is that we were well accepted there and that made for a nicer atmosphere."

Knapp said she created 40 new paintings in six weeks, and about 21 have been framed. Templeton said she produced about the same number.

Robertson, who was not in San Miguel as long, turned out about a dozen pieces.

"I'm still working on material I got down there and I've been back there since I came home," Robertson said.

"I'm going back in September and both Ann and I plan to go down in February," Knapp said.

McMahon said he anticipates showing 45 to 60 of the trio's pieces in the exhibit, which will occupy a separate room in the gallery at Carrizo Lodge.

The artists' reception will be from 6 p.m. to 9 p.m. Friday, July 2. The show will continue for 30 days.
