Snow plan takes heat off commission

To take the heat off Lincoln County Commissioners when it's freezing outside, a snow removal policy will dictate what roads will be cleared and when.

On a recommendation by road manager Bill Cupit, the commission last week adopted a list of routes and set some guidelines for helping school buses and emergency vehicles.

"Up until now, we've had no real policy," said Chairman Monroy

Montes, who added that commissioners pestered Cupit when they received calls from residents.

"Everybody felt their road was the most important," he said.

Cupit said he doesn't usually move the heavy equipment out until four inches of snow falls "or we end up cutting into the base course."

His department does salt icy spots. His crews work from 4 a.m. to 8 p.m. After that, the temperature usually drops too low to do any good.

He needs to know if he should interrupt his schedule to serve someone 20 miles back or stay with a pattern, Cupit said.

"At snow time, it's a common thing to get everybody going to the hospital at 8 a.m.," he said.

Commissioners said to stay with the schedule unless he believes it is an emergency situation.

The schedule he presented has worked well with few complaints the past two years, he said.

Cupit asked whether helping a stranded school bus would be a

problem, since private contractors operate the buses.

That would come under the category of the health, safety and welfare of citizens since children are on the buses, said commissioners Stirling Spencer and L. Ray Nunley.

Montes said Cupit should use his own discretion about whether a situation demands immediate attention or could wait until he has completed a section of his schedule.

Nunley pointed out that assistance to other government

entities on a regular basis would require approval by the commission.

"I only did that, because I felt the public should know under what circumstances we would help," Cupit said.

Other portions of the policy specify that no non-public roads will be plowed unless previous commission action has been approved. All designated school bus routes will be plowed, if needed, and any roads needed during emergency

Money talks Sheriff asks county for funds

Money, money and money were the key ingredients in issues between Lincoln County Sheriff James McSwane and the county commission last week.

He wanted money to cover a clothes allowance for drug task force officers. He wanted to split extra money among dispatchers for picking up more duties. And his deputies just want more money.

A chief dispatcher isn't necessary to ensure his communication division will operate smoothly, McSwane said.

He'd like to split between three other dispatchers the \$4,342 additional dollars that were being paid to the man who used to fill that post. Since Dan Dosé died, McSwane has not filled the vacant position, but a part-time employee has been added.

"They're among the lowest paid of all county employees," McSwane said of his dispatchers.

Those currently on staff earn between \$15,319 and \$16,778.

Chairman Monroy Montes said Dosé before he died last month related that he was working 14-hour shifts.

"My concern is that if the position of chief dispatcher is not filled, do the others have to work 14-hour shifts?" Montes asked.

County manager Andy Wynham echoed Montes concern, saying Dosé also detailed to him the extra

work that had to be done.

"Their wage needs to be looked at, but I disagree that he should not hire a chief dispatcher," Wynham said.

"Sounds like we may end up with three chiefs and one Indian," said Commissioner Wilton Howell.

"It will be one chief and four Indians with additional duties," McSwane replied.

"I don't believe anyone will have to spend more time as long as we employ another dispatch officer and keep the part-time person."

The sheriff indicated that Dosé may have spent more time at his post than necessary out of choice.

But if a chief dispatcher is named, that person should be paid more, Montes said.

The person in line to head the department only has five years of experience compared to Dosé's 15 years, the sheriff said. McSwane added that he essentially has supervised the department and will continue to do that.

"Didn't we do the same with the finance officer?" Howell asked. "We had a chief in name only when the department really was supervised by the county manager."

Wynham contended the situation was not the same.

After some discussion by Commissioner L. Ray Nunley and Howell about elevating the rank of the dispatchers, Commissioner Stirling Spencer said the issue should be reviewed at budget time.

His offered a motion to leave the dispatchers at level 9 and set aside the money that would have been paid to Dosé, in case a new chief dispatcher is selected. It died for lack of a second.

Howell then made a motion to accept the recommendation of the sheriff as a one-time shot until its time to review the budget. He also failed to muster a second.

Nunley proposed that the sheriff come back with job descriptions for the commission to consider, but no one picked up on the idea.

Wynham intervened, saying he thought Nunley was going in the right direction. He suggested that he meet with McSwane and come back with a pay proposal.

"The last time you and the sheriff got together, it took six months before work started," Howell said, referring to delays in construction of jail and sheriff's department renovations.

Wynham brushed the remark aside, noting that he could sit there and offer reasons for the jail delay or move ahead on the issue before the commission.

Schwettmann stepped in with a motion to table, but it failed 3-2, Nunley voting with Schwettmann, who then turned to Montes for help.

Montes revisited Wynham's suggestion, making a successful motion to deny the request until McSwane comes back with justification and

Trash gurus give pay raises to staff

With finances and efficiency improving, raises were passed out to everybody at the Lincoln County Solid Waste Authority last week.

Sitting in a newly-painted and partitioned meeting room, members of the authority reviewed with general manager Joe Lewandowski last year's budget and the operation this fiscal year since July 1.

They marveled at the number of dumpsters the authority crew had been able to repair and paint since he was hired last June, while employees still completed other regular duties.

"I see a lot of good things," said vice chairman Ron Wicker, Ruidoso village manager. "I was inundated with complaint calls before you came and we hardly get any calls now."

Lewandowski proposed a five percent average raise, noting that the budget figures the board already reviewed contained the extra \$19,000 the raise package would require to cover health insurance, state retirement and other benefits as well as the actual pay increase.

For every 25 cents per hour raise, it costs the authority another 45 to 50 cents in benefits, he said. The authority pays 66 percent of the staff's health insurance premiums.

The board already had budgeted \$12,000 for merit raises. Two of the operations employees are gone, bringing the staff down to 22 people and saving \$40,000.

Some of the workers have gone seven years without raises, Lewandowski said. While he was hesitant when first hired, because some of the staff had been doing the job for as long as 32 years and might be resistant or even try to obstruct attempts to change, that hasn't happened.

"They're working with me," he said.

Looking over the list of employees, chairman Frank Warth, mayor of Capitan, said, "The only thing I see wrong is that Joe left his name off the list."

"I agree," said member Bill Schwettmann, a county commissioner. "We should include Joe."

Member Wilton Howell reminded the others that they had agreed when putting together the budget in June to revisit it in December for possible raises if employees pulled together and Lewandowski could turn around some of the problems then facing the authority.

"I think we've seen the proof," he said. "We may be a couple of months early, but they've done a good job."

His only reservation is that once one set of public employees receives a raise, the rest want the same treatment.

"We just gave raises, I don't feel bad at all (doing it for authority employees)," said member Jerry Shaw, mayor of Ruidoso.

Howell then offered the motion for five percent raises, including Lewandowski. After it passed unanimously, he looked at the manager and said, "You didn't think I'd go for it."

The raise will increase Lewandowski's \$35,000 salary to \$36,750.

On another matter, Alamogordo city manager Bob Stockwell and city engineer Joe Moore brought information about construction bids on the shared regional landfill to be built south of that city.

The Lincoln authority, which is comprised of representatives from the county and its five municipalities, has joined with the Otero authority to create a regional landfill. It will be operated by the city of Alamogordo and all members will pay lower dumping rates than other customers.

The arrangement is a model in the state and other communities are being encouraged by Department of Environment officials to follow Lincoln and Otero's lead.

Moore said the low bidder on the landfill project was Drew Engineering from Ruidoso at \$1,717,760, exclusive of tax. But that figure still was higher than anticipated and he met with company representatives to find possible cuts.

By eliminating initially an asbestos dumping area, dropping asphalt on a section of the access road to the main building, cutting seeding and modifying the water system, \$187,000 can be saved, Moore said. Additional savings on the site clearing portion of the project should amount to another \$48,000 for a total reduction of \$235,000.

"These are all tentative, but I think they are what we will get at worst," Moore said. "At best, we could get more."

The bid was approved by the Lincoln authority at \$1,589,510, exclusive of tax.

Stockwell said since the road will not be paved, a used grader will be needed to maintain it. A grader may run \$25,000, but it still will be less expensive than paving, he said.

"(The road) will have to be watered down and graded every few months," he said. "We don't get much rain."

Because both counties will be using transfer stations, the number

Ruidoso Council takes another look at sign ordinance

Ordinances relating to banners and non-conforming uses of structures are two items in a light Ruidoso Village Council meeting Tuesday.

The planning and zoning department is asking the council to approve a new definition of a banner that may appear tougher to many merchants.

The proposed new definition of a banner is a sign of temporary con-

struction of lightweight, flexible materials such as cloth, canvas, plastic or paper on which letters, numbers, symbols or pictures are printed or painted; with or without frames. Banners are permitted in only a few designated areas.

In the past, framed signs were not considered banners.

The ordinance also outlines regulations concerning code violations, portable signs on vehicles, signs placed on public rights of way and other code changes.

The council will act on an ordinance regarding non conforming use for structures.

According to the ordinance, the village does not currently allow for substitution of non-conforming use, and under certain circumstances, substitution should be permissible.

No other information was entered into the council packet that would indicate what may have prompted this ordinance.

Two other public hearings are expected to generate little opposi-

tion. Ordinance 93-18, regarding the bond issue for the Otero-Lincoln County Landfill and a transfer of ownership and location, dispensers liquor license for the Enchantment Inn.

The council is expected to pass Resolution 93-18, supporting the 1995 Governor's Rural Economic Development Forum.

Under regular items, the council will hear:

—a citizen's complaint, Joe Wheatley, concerning various sub-

jects. —citizen's comments, Rick Whitman, regarding cable television.

—a resolution on budget amendments and first quarter review.

—a cooperative agreement regarding Highway 48 widening project, submitted by village deputy manager Alan Briley.

Consent agenda items that are approved collectively are:

—a special dispensers permit at the Civic Events Center for the Annual Christmas Jubilee.

—to schedule a public hearing for the preliminary plat approval and preliminary PUD (planned unit development) for the Glen Neans subdivision across from Cree Meadows Country Club.

Under village manager reports, deputy manager Briley has arranged a presentation of flood early warning systems for the Rio Ruidoso, conducted by the Army Corps of Engineers.

Police chief Richard Swenor will give an update on the E911 system.

exact figures.

"What kind of justification?" Howell asked, motioning to McSwane. "The supervisor is standing right there."

McSwane had more luck on a request for an \$800 clothing allowance for members of the White Mountain Task Force, assigned by the sheriff's department.

He explained that most of the time the members of the task force work out of uniform. He is requesting the money, because a purchase order for some a suit and couple of pairs of pants was refused by Wynham until he came up with a policy and specific guidelines.

"If we have a policy on it, we will not receive an audit criticism," Wynham said.

All my other deputies get a clothing allowance," McSwane said. "It's a budget line item, but I had no policy governing plain clothes until now. It all comes out of state money."

"Why are we worrying about it, if it doesn't cost us anything?" Schwettmann asked.

"As long as it's not a Cartier suit," Nunley said.

"Not on \$800 a year," McSwane said.

The lone dissenting remark and later vote came from Montes.

"These officers are compensated well," he said. "I can't see why they don't buy the clothes themselves."

The motion to approve the request and accept the policy came from Spencer, who told McSwane, "Don't drop your jaw, sheriff."

Nunley seconded the motion, which passed four to one.

"You only made the motion because it doesn't cost us anything," he added.

McSwane continued on the hot seat as deputy Orlando Montes submitted a proposed new classifi-

cation that would recognize and credit law enforcement experience in any jurisdiction in placing deputies in pay categories.

Wynham explained that Montes approached him the previous week for help in bringing deputies into line with salaries being paid officers in other law enforcement jurisdictions.

"I believe he (Orlando Montes) speaks for the Sheriff's Deputies Association," Wynham said.

Orlando Montes said he has worked with Wynham and association president Paul Wersich to come up with classifications that would give deputies incentives that are lacking in the existing pay scale.

"The one we have today is in the dark ages," he said. "We're way behind every other in this region. We're asking for the base pay to be brought up to par, not a pay increase."

The entry level pay for deputies locally is \$18,758, equal to a level 17 position on the county's pay matrix. Association members are proposing that entry be changed to between levels 19 (\$19,800) and 25 (\$22,926).

"The scale today is not consistent. It takes too long to progress. Some of this stuff I don't believe is fair. Why are we isolated from the rest of county personnel, which advance faster?"

McSwane operates under a slightly different pay matrix. The average annual increase runs between \$2,200 up to \$3,500 a year, according to Wynham.

"I've got a plan that gives incentive to seek more education," he said. "Just because you've been here longer, doesn't mean you're worth more."

The two plans are similar "except this plan (the association's plan) doesn't require you to know anything, just to be here."

The association's plan "only addresses the years of being a policeman. It neglects the education aspect, but I can show you guys just walking around in uniform for 20 years."

"In my department, we call that a failure on the part of management," Wynham shot back.

"It's placing people where they can adequately perform and that may be just walking around in a uniform," McSwane said.

He doesn't want to see the incentive removed for someone to gain more education and to accept more responsibility.

Wynham said the association proposal may attract someone with 10 years of experience to move to Lincoln County because they would come into the classification at a higher grade that recognizes their years elsewhere.

The plan also attempted to compensate employees who choose to stick with Lincoln County and not move around, he said.

Because a deputy is employed in a hazardous career characterized by a high divorce rate and sometimes shorter lifespan, the classification plans needs to allow progress in both directions, education and longevity. He'd like to make the sheriff's department more consistent with the rest of the county, making years of service a factor, while recognizing the uniqueness of the job.

Chairman Montes said he would want to look at the bottom line cost of the proposal for a new classification.

"I don't believe we have to reach a decision today," Chairman Montes said. "We will consider what you all have said and address it at budget time."

Meanwhile, McSwane, Wynham and association representatives should try to come up with a mutually agreeable plan.

Ruidoso Downs man arrested, accused of damaging a pickup

Ruidoso Downs resident Jimmy Garcia has been charged with vandalism in connection with an August 16 incident.

Garcia, who is accused of damaging a 1986 Toyota pickup belonging to Maria Faye Randolph of Ruidoso Downs, was indicted on fourth degree felony criminal damage to property charges.

If convicted, Garcia could face 18 months in jail and/or \$3,000 fines. Bond has been set at \$2,500.

Randolph told police she loaned

her vehicle to Veronica Sanchez.

She said a man driving a light blue Chevrolet truck with mag wheels forced the pickup Sanchez was driving off the road.

Witnesses told police that a man dragged Sanchez out of the pickup by her hair and then drove off at a high rate of speed.

The Toyota's seats, headliner and sun visors had been slashed with a sharp object according to the report.

Blood was found in the vehicle, and police officials believe the blood was left by the person or persons

who vandalized the pickup.

When Downs patrol officer Christopher Condon stopped Garcia for questioning later in the day, he noticed that Garcia had injured his hand. When asked how he had cut his hand, Garcia told Condon that he had been cutting meat, according to police reports.

Garcia was released for lack of evidence, but after police determined that fingerprints taken as evidence from the car matched Garcia's, an affidavit was issued for his arrest.

Garcia was arrested October 2.

Downs board dedicates tax for landfill

Everything is ready to go with approval of a bond issue pledging Ruidoso Downs' environmental gross receipts tax for the construction of a new regional landfill.

But The Downs' Board of Trustees will have to wait until the next scheduled meeting on October 25 to approve the bond issue. The action is being repeated by each of the members of the Lincoln County Solid Waste Authority, a coalition of the county and its five municipalities.

Downs attorney J. Robert Beauvais, who also represents the authority, told the trustees Friday during a special meeting that the village had received a good bond rating for the sale and approval from the State Environmental De-

partment.

He said a bond rating of BAA1 for Ordinance 93-10, the sales tax revenue bond, was a critical part of the process.

"It is the very best rating that we can have for the bonds. The (landfill operation) permit is a 20-year permit. The time limit was changed to accommodate this project," Beauvais said.

When the authority first was formed three years ago, the members obligated their environmental gross receipts (sales) tax to buy equipment. They subsequently followed another route for that purchase and now are pledging the money for a landfill to be built south of Alamogordo.

The board decided that to satisfy

the open meetings act a decision on the ordinance must be postponed until the next regularly scheduled council meeting and advertised public hearing for comments.

"Before a commitment is made you must realize you are making an irrevocable first pledge on your gross receipts to the solid waste effort in Lincoln County," Beauvais said.

"What is going to happen is everything has to fall into the right sequence. There are 10 communities involved with the landfill (five from Otero County). The way things fall into place is important so it will work," Beauvais said.

The council also awarded a contract to the lowest bidder for dirt work on the new city hall.

of trucks on the road should be small, Lewandowski said.

Stockwell asked whether it will be necessary for Moore and him to come back to Lincoln when they receive the bids on equipment.

How much are we talking about? Howell asked.

About \$980,000," Stockwell responded.

You better come back and we'll call a special meeting," Warth said.

Stockwell said the equipment will not be needed until January and action probably could be postponed until the next joint meeting of the two authorities.

Lewandowski noted that since two functions originally proposed for the landfill, treatment and burial of asbestos and contaminated soils, have been eliminated, equipment costs should have been reduced.

"I definitely have to look at it," he said. "I've never seen their revised budget."

In other business, the authority: —elected Shaw as the new treasurer, replacing former Ruidoso village councilor Ron Andrews, who resigned from his public position.

—heard a report from Lewandowski that he has not used any environmental gross receipts tax to operate the authority. About

\$66,000 from that source currently is deposited and will build until payments are due on a bond issue. He plans for the money collected prior to that obligation to be used for capital expenses or emergencies.

Starting in November, the checks for those taxes are suppose to go directly to another account.

The authority has about \$100,000 as a cash balance. Several bills, including four big ones, which should have been paid during the 1992-93 fiscal year, had not been handled under the prior manager and will have to come out of revenues for this year, Lewandowski said.

He wants to change the accounting system from actual cash to accrued totals to better reflect the organization's activity.

After hearing Lewandowski's report, Warth said, "So we muddled through despite all our problems and came out all right."

—heard a report from Lewandowski on the new receiving sites for large residential items at the transfer station on Gavilan Canyon Road, at the recycling center on Second Street in Ruidoso Downs, and at the group container site on U.S. Highway 70 in Hondo on the first Saturday of each month. Commercial debris will be accepted at the last two areas for the regular charge imposed at

Capitan construction debris landfill.

Stickers listing material prohibited at dumpsters and the telephone number to call for more information are being attached to trash containers, he said.

"The flatbed here filled up in three days so we're already getting a real good response," Lewandowski said. "After the article in *The Ruidoso News* (about violators and where to take large items), we got lots of telephone calls."

He already has contacted several violators who were identified and intends to press for those caught and charged to be fined up to \$500 an incident.

"Down the road with commercial accounts, they will have to show proof of how they are disposing of their debris and that they are not using someone else's dumpster," he told the board.

"This is a habit that has been going on for years and we have to break them. I'm also trying to protect some business containers by putting locks on them."

If a violation does occur and someone puts a couch next to a dumpster on the day after it has been serviced, it may sit there for five more days unless someone calls and notifies his office at 378-4697.

situations declared by the sheriff's department, ambulance or fire department, or by the road manager.

Anyone requesting snow removal on a private drive will be sent a road review form and advised to go through the commission. Any vehicle blocking the roadway shall be pulled out of the way for safety purposes only.

Check your road

Under the schedule, his four snow plows cover about 280 miles. The first blade starts in the Ruidoso district at West Cedar, then moves to Raven Ridge, Middle Cedar, Ronald Smith, Western Hills, Red Cedar, Alpine Village, Tall Pines, Allan Aschoff, B Luck Jr., D005, Eagle Estates, Gavilan Acres, Robolito Ridge, Gavilan Hills, Fawn Ridge, Homestead Acres, Valley East Estates, Paradise Canyon, Hutson-Carrizo, Twin Mountain, Agua Fria, Palo Verde Slopes, E001, E002, Apple Blossom and White Angel Mountain.

Blade two begins at Villa Madonna and Pine Cone Valley in the Alto district and moves to Sierra Vista, Enchanted Mesa, Sun Valley, La Junta, Little Creek Estates, Alto North, High Sierra Estates, Enchanted Forest, Woodlands, Shauna Downs, Coyote Mesa, Buck Mountain, Peebles, Woodland Heights, Valley Heights, Clara Skinner, Angus Townsite, Mountain Lakes, Rancho Ruidoso, Little Creek Hills and D004 Airport to State Road 214.

The third blade starts at "C" Hills and County Road 22 in the Nogal district, then moves on to Fort Stanton Ranchettes, CO28, CO24, CO17, CO16, CO25, Loma Grande, Magado Creek, CO18, Lamay Estates, Wolf Springs, CO19, Forest Road 107, A.N. Runnels, FS 9012A, CO15, Sweetwater Hills, Basin Valley and A010.

The fourth blade heads out to Mountain Views and Highland

View in the Capitan district, then covers North Ridge, Capitan North, Holiday Hills, Timberline Hills, Long View, Mesa Verde Acres, County Road 08-14, CO07, CO06, CO03, CO01, CO02, and CO05.

One salt truck begins on Gavilan Canyon, Lower Eagle Creek and Pine Meadows, and continues to Shangra La, Fawn Ridge, Cedar Creek, Agua Fria and Palo Verde Slopes.

The second salt truck heads to High Mesa Road in Alto Village, Deer Park Drive, Airport Road, D003, D004, Alto Lakes, Deer Park Woods, Lakeside Estates, High Mesa subdivision and ES 107 Bonito Lake Road.

A pickup snow plow covers the county sub office in Ruidoso and then does portions of Sierra Blanca subdivision, Alto Lakes, Lakeside Estates, Deer Park Woods and High Mesa subdivision.

Extended 911

In another matter, volunteer county chairman of the Extended 911 committee, Dr. Bernie Reimann, was congratulated for his hard work in bringing the system to fruition.

County manager Andy Wynham said through Reimann's diligence, the county was able to secure \$105,000 in grants to pay for dual dispatch stations at two sites with updated equipment.

"I can't tell you what a bonus that was," Wynham said.

"I commend the diligence and perseverance of bringing this to a conclusion," Nunley said. "We might consider naming this the Reimann-Bohks (for emergency services director Maggie Bohks) E911 system."

Five telephone companies that serve different parts of the county had to be coordinated. When installed, a computer system will trace the origin of calls and record them. Even now, the basic 911 system is functioning, Reimann said. Bids were opened last week on

consoles for the systems. Commissioners voted to authorize Wynham to enter into a contract with the low bidder after negotiations.

The exact figures were not revealed, but the rating numbers were released.

A & B Electronics, a New Mexico firm that does business with the Village of Ruidoso, rated the most preferred. Durham Communications of Mesa, Arizona was rated 20 or more points under A & B.

In other business, the commission:

—appointed LeRoy Zamora to fill a vacancy on the county personnel board, representing staff.

—proclaimed the week of October 17-23 Lincoln County School Bus Safety Week.

—passed an ordinance requiring tax bills of \$10 or less to be paid in one payment. Treasurer Janice Ware said that she had been following that procedure as an office policy, but it should be officially adopted by the commission.

—under the consent agenda approved the replat of two lots into one (30-31) on block 14 of Paradise Canyon Subdivision requested by Henry Scott, and approved a replat of Tracts A-1 and A-2 in Loma Grande Acres (near Nogal) by Sandra Stevens-Miller. The latter action cut two acres out of the corner of a 13 acres tract. Both requests were recommended by the county planning and zoning board.

—approved the emergency management budget put together by Bohks for submission to the State Emergency Management Assistance Program totalling \$33,653. The federal share would be \$16,927.

—approved 20 miles of bus routes to be improved, eight in the Capitan district, six in Carrizozo, three in Corona and three in Hondo. The districts must provide the county with a consent and hold harmless form from any land owners where private roads are involved.

A newcomer in one of the outside cages is Zack, a magnificent two-year-old Doberman, who was released by his owners because he is so powerful.

Harper said Zack is gentle and obedient. He knows basic commands and already is neutered.

Big dog lovers, this one is a gem and so is Sugar, a previously featured adult golden Labrador mix with clipped ears, who still at the shelter.

Linda Turck, a trainer of champion Golden Retrievers, recently worked with several dogs at the shelter and was extremely impressed with Sugar. She responded well to commands. Turck said Sugar would be a terrific companion, who would learn very quickly and is eager to please.

Another adorable young female called Panda, who has medium length hair, delicate legs, a dark face with brown eyebrows and a narrow muzzle, also is a survivor. She's affectionate, attractive, gets along well with all other dogs, but needs to find a home soon.

If walking through the shelter bothers a prospective owner, employees will bring dogs out to them.

No matter where a pet has been lost in the county, owners should check with the shelter.

Often, someone will see a dog wandering and bring it to the

shelter from Capitan, Carrizozo or Hondo. Take the example of Jake, who recently was reunited with his owner.

The attractive merle-coated Australian shepherd mix was brought in as a stray. With an affectionate disposition, he quickly won special attention from shelter workers and was featured for adoption in The Ruidoso News under the name of Marley.

What no one at the shelter knew was that Jake had been lost in Capitan and his owner, who worked in Roswell, asked his friends to watch for the dog. Apparently, no one called the shelter, because it was miles away.

When the article appeared after Marley had been gone nearly a month, one of the owner's friends thought the dog might be Jake. The owner drove into town from Roswell and stopped at the shelter.

"Marley was sitting in his cage kind of moping," Harper said. "His owner just said 'Well Jake, what in the world are you doing here,' and the dog just went wild with excitement. It was great to see them together."

Once you earn a reputation for the best hospitality and the best food in the Southwest, what do you do for an encore?

If you're Katherine and Robert Finley of La Junta Guest Ranch, you celebrate your 30th anniversary with a party, of course! 

Heelloo Eamello! RHS Warriors take district opener!

The Ruidoso Warrior Football team did something that it hasn't been able to do in two years — the team won a district game.

With the help of three circus catches by sophomore Brandon Eamello, the Warriors defeated the Deming Wildcats 20-15, Friday night in Deming.

The win puts Ruidoso 4-3 on the season and 1-0 in district 3-AAA. The Wildcats fell to 3-4 and 0-1.

Elsewhere in the district on opening weekend, Silver defeated arch-rival Cobre, 7-6; and Onate beat Socorro 14-0.

While the score for the Warrior-Wildcat game looked close, it wasn't — until the fourth quarter.

Ruidoso kicked off to Deming to start the game and the Wildcats looked enthused. They moved the ball from their own 35 yardline to the Warrior 49 before 10-yard loss forced a punt.

The Warriors' first drive started at their 15 yardline and netted a three-yard loss against Deming's swarming, fired-up defense.

The Warriors' J.R. Chino stood on his own goal line and got away a high spiral to midfield, where the Wildcats fumbled and Ruidoso got another chance on offense — with a little breathing room at the Wildcat 43 yardline.

With no luck in the running game, Ruidoso went to a passing attack that was almost flawless against Fabens, last week. On second down, quarterback John Echols completed an 11-yarder to Ricky Devara for the Warriors' initial

first down of the night.

After an unsuccessful run and pass to Rex Comanche, head coach Mike Gaston uncorked a play to his new-found sophomore sensation Brandon Eamello.

The result was a perfect 33-yard strike from Echols that saw Eamello run under the ball and take it away from the Deming defender in a circus catch. Ahh, but the night was young.

The pass play got the ball to the Wildcat 19 yardline. A Raul Davis run went nowhere as the Deming was stacking eight players on the line of scrimmage. Gaston called another pass play on second down.

In a similar effort, Echols again found Eamello down sideline against single coverage. This time Brandon's sticky fingers got the Warriors to the one yardline. J.R. Chino punched it in and Byron Soules' PAT gave the Warriors the lead, 7-0.

After the Ruidoso kicked-off to the Wildcats, Deming marched the ball down the field with authority. Starting from their own 27 yardline, Deming's drive finally stalled on the

Warrior seventeen. Thirty yards of the drive came via two penalties against the Warrior defense. But like most of the season for the Wildcats, they came away from plus territory empty handed. A 36-yard field goal attempt was blocked and the Warrior defense would turn away the Wildcats again.

The first quarter ended with Ruidoso on top 7-0 and the score remained that way until shortly be-

fore halftime.

After a Warrior fumble at the Deming 26 yardline, it appeared that the Wildcats would tie the game up, as they drove to the Warrior nine with relative ease. However, the Warrior secondary stiffed and produced a key interception with 5:27 left in the half, again sending a frustrated Deming offense off the field, with no points.

Ruidoso's Wing-T offense got its hands on the ball at its own seven, and began one of the best drives of the season. Raul Davis swept around right end for the first first down of the series, and Ricky Devara added nineteen more for the second.

Now operating from the Warrior 45, Echols found Eamello streaking down the sideline. Brandon was covered pretty well but a size mismatch and an amazing knack for coming down with the ball gave the Warriors a 26-yard gain as Eamello hauled in another Echols beauty.

The score came from 13 yards out as Echols hooked up with Devara, who has evolved as a threat in both the running and passing game. Soules extra point was missed, but nonetheless, the Warriors brought a two-touchdown advantage to the locker room at halftime.

The Warriors' first possession in the third quarter resulted in a punt, as did Deming's.

After receiving the ball at the Wildcat 14 yardline, Ruidoso would start the drive that would ultimately win the game.

A clipping penalty on second down would bring the ball back to

the Warrior eight. Devara got seven yards and brought the ball up to the fifteen. Then Devara would make a run that will forever be on the Warrior highlight films.

A simple sweep left, and a quick cut-back, would get Ricky into the Wildcat secondary. Another good move would spring the senior wing-back down the sideline. A heads-up block 40 yards down the field by the quarterback, Echols, would send Ricky to the five before being knocked out of bounds.

Chino would add two yards on first down and then go in untouched on the next play. Byron Soules PAT gave the Warriors an almost insurmountable lead, 20-0.

At this point, Deming shelved the running game and went to the run-and-shoot. Moving from their own 12 yardline, it wasn't until they reached the 42 that the Warrior defense forced a punt. That play will probably always be on the Warrior blooper films.

After a mishandled snap, Deming punter Reggie Rios looked up and found no Warriors applying pressure on him, he thought about it, thought about it some more, and finally chose to run ball. After a 23-yard gain and a critical first down, Deming had a chance.

The third quarter ended 20-0, but the momentum of the game made it seem that it was 7-7 with a minute left.

Deming quarterback Wesley Hooper dropped back time and time again to find his receivers covered. With no options, he scrambled into the pocket and scrambled well. A 30-yard run by Hooper gave the

Wildcats their first score of the game and a broken play on the extra point netted two points and the Wildcats trailed 20-8.

The Wildcat defense held Ruidoso to nine yards on their next possession and forced a punt.

Standing on his own 15 yardline, the snap from center was high and punter Chino was forced to chase down the loose ball. In a remarkable effort J.R. got off a low 28-yarder and it was returned to the Warrior twenty.

Suddenly, the Warrior defense, who had played so well for the first three quarters, was looking to be victimized for the second time in two minutes.

It took Deming four plays to score. Now Ruidoso led 20-15 and was fighting for its life with 7:07 to go in the game.

Again deep in their own territory, the Warrior offense didn't have to score — they had to get some first downs — and run some time off the clock.

That's when J.R. Chino did his best work. One of a handful of seniors on the team, J.R. almost single handedly moved the football from the Warrior twenty to midfield. Two first downs along the way had shrunk the clock to 3:39 left in the game.

Chino had to punt the ball away to the fired-up Deming Wildcats.

After a perfect snap, J.R.'s high spiral gave the Wildcats the ball at their own 20 yardline, 80 yards away from a brilliant come-from-behind victory.

It didn't happen.

Deming did get the ball to the Warrior 45 before Byron Soules ended their comeback hopes with a monster sack of Wesley Hooper.

The Warriors ran out the clock and ran up one of the most impressive wins in many years.

For most of the game, Ruidoso was pinned deep in their own territory, forced to use conservative running plays to move the ball. When they did get acceptable field position, the Warrior offense opened up and scored.

Just like in the past couple of close games, Ruidoso found a way to win instead of lose.

We're on our way back.

Next week, Ruidoso faces the pre-season district 3-AAA favorite, Las Cruces Onate. The Knights are undefeated this year and will be another tough test for the Warriors.

Game time from New Mexico State University's Aggie Memorial Stadium is 7:30 p.m.

RHS teachers learn new technology

Seventeen Ruidoso teachers spent a week learning an exciting new approach of applying technology to education called "Image Processing."

According to a news release, Image Processing allows teachers to acquire images from many different sources including CCD cameras, video cameras, VCRs, microscopes, using a powerful public domain software program called NIH Image.

The teachers were trained by a three-instructor team from the Center for Image Processing in Education, Tucson, Arizona.

All of the teachers felt that this was well worth their time, according to the release.

"This was truly one of the most useful workshops I have attended

in my 14 years of teaching," said one teacher. "Wonderful, eye opening and exciting!" said another.

"I didn't know teachers got as excited as students about computers," commented a passing student.

Until recently, the techniques of Image Processing have been used primarily in the medical and astronomy fields but the Department of Processing in Education through a National Science Foundation grant have developed methods of incorporating this technology into the public school curriculum.

This project is the first of its kind in the nation. No other district has had a coordinator and trained teachers from all grade levels kindergarten through twelfth.

The salary for the coordinator, Jim Dickinson, was donated to the schools by the R.D. and Joan Dale Hubbard Foundation.

Dickinson was one of 80 teachers from throughout the nation trained in Image Processing in a National Science Foundation program called "Image Processing for Teaching" at the Department of Planetary Science of the University of Arizona.

"I'm very excited about this project," said Jim Dickinson. This is my last semester prior to retirement and I had been wondering if I had really made a difference in this world with all my efforts. This project is allowing me to feel that I have made a difference in education."

Though Ruidoso is the first district to incorporate image processing on this scale, research has shown that this incorporation will help reach the at risk, minority and accelerated students alike.

According to Mike Gladden, superintendent of schools, this is part of a five-year project to implement Image Processing throughout the district.

The teachers participating in the project were Teri Hardeman, Debbie Porter and Lara Tarvin from Nob Hill; LeeAnn Longbotham and Susie Rhodes from White Mountain Elementary School; Barbara

Avalos, Susan Keeton, Dixie McGinty and Lisa Seigmann from White Mountain Intermediate; and Ric Berglund, Leigh Carter, Page Hubbard, Becky Pursler and Terry Wharton from Ruidoso Middle School.

Carol Hubbard, Dan McNulty and Yelena Temple attended from Ruidoso High School.







Get back to basics for safer schools

When violence takes center stage in public schools, it's time to double and then redouble efforts to provide students with basic skills — that means a return to the basics of reading, writing and arithmetic.

Some schools — faced with the reality of students toting guns to school and threatening teachers, administrators and each other — are responding with armed guards, metal detectors and part-time police officers spending time on campus. Yes, the schools have to take extreme measures to keep students and teachers safe, but those kinds of symptom-driven actions could be missing the point.

The truth is that a huge proportion of those who end up in jail cannot read. According to statistics provided by the U.S. Department of Education 85 percent of juvenile offenders have trouble reading and 60 percent of adult prison inmates are illiterate.

Gang members and violent teens profess a bravado and arrogance that belies the hopelessness and despair that comes through in their behavior. And, what more hopeless feeling than to look into a future where you're unable to compete in a highly-technical world. Just learning how to read will provide a foundation for stepping bravely into that world without a gun and without the security of wearing a gang's colors.

"The bottom line is that our schools need to teach youngsters all the skills they need to participate effectively and honestly in our society," reads information provided by Applied Scholastics, an organization dedicated to improving the quality of education using philosophies borrowed from author L. Ron Hubbard. The group concentrates on tutoring juvenile offenders, and has statistics to show the successes they've recorded with jailed youths. Applied Scholastics suggests that the same methods used in jails would work in schools to improve educational levels and reduce violence and crime among children who have not yet gone over the edge.

"Forget increasing the number of armed guards in schools," reads information provided by Applied Scholastics. "Let's get education back on track instead."


