The Ruidoso News brought home four top awards from the New Mexico Press Association's better newspaper contest this weekend in Albuquerque.

Chuck Stallings, for the second year in a row, won the investigative reporting award in the large weekly and semi-weekly newspaper division.

Tamara Montes won first place in color advertising for four-color ads for Enchantment Inn and Cafe Carrizo.

Frankie Jarrell won first place in editorial writing and columns.

The News also won second place for special sections.

The Ruidoso News competes with the Taos News, the Valencia County News Bulletin, the Las Cruces Bulletin, the Rio Rancher Observer and the Santa Fe Reporter.

The Socorro Defensor Chieftain, a member of The Ruidoso News' publishing group, won the general excellence award for smaller weeklies and semi-weeklies.

Other Rajon papers winning awards at the NMPA convention were the Deming Headlight and the Valencia County News Bulletin.

Airlines operators meet with mayor

Peacock Airlines will return to Ruidoso Village Hall Monday morning for another presentation before the village council.

Mayor Jerry Shaw said the airline is interested in a Ruidoso run during the skiing season and would like to start sometime in November.

At the last meeting with the council, Shaw told airline representatives that the village was not interested in subsidizing an airline at this time.

She said she encouraged the airline officials to seek funding from private enterprise.

Shaw said the council will meet at 10 a.m. to hear their presentation.

Capitan trustees try, try again...

Still searching for a police officer to back up their new chief, Capitan trustees are scheduled to interview applicants Monday, October 25, for possible action at their 6:30 p.m. meeting in village hall.

Shawn Menges, who had been selected by Chief Tony Cano and Mayor Frank Warth failed to win confirmation from the majority of the board last week. Two members complained they had been left out of the selection process and said their negative votes had nothing to do with Menges as an officer.

A closed personnel session had been scheduled during a special meeting last Thursday, but was canceled because not enough members were available to interview applicants, Warth said.

Lincoln County's famous cowgirl, Fern Sawyer, dies

Fern Sawyer spent her last hours Saturday doing what she loved most — riding horses.

Lincoln County's most famous cowgirl, Sawyer died Saturday while visiting friends in Texas. She was 76.

Sawyer went riding with long-time friend Chloe Baker near San Antonio, Texas, and then collapsed. Sawyer, who had led the State Fair Parade and the All American Futurity call to the post for 20 years, was first lifted onto a horse when she was just a year old.

Sawyer was born May 17, 1917, in Buchanan, New Mexico, to Uyless Devoe Sawyer and Dessie Lewis Sawyer. She was a member of a well-known New Mexico ranch family and spent her life in this state and Texas.

She made a name for herself as a professional cowgirl and was inducted into the National Cutting Horse Hall of Fame; National Cowboy Hall of Fame and National Cowgirl Hall of Fame.

Before starting her distinguished career on the rodeo circuit, she studied home economics at Texas Tech University.

Sawyer competed as a barrel racer, calf roper and bull rider, and won the title of All-Around World Champion Cowgirl in 1938, at Madison Square Garden. She captured the Cutting Horse World Champion title in 1947 in Fort Worth, Texas, and soon retired from the rodeo circuit, saying she wanted to stop while still on top.

Sawyer was a founder of the Turtles Association, organized in 1936 at Boston Garden. That association was the founding body of the Rodeo Cowboys Association and the Professional Rodeo Cowboy Association.

Sawyer served on the New Mexico State Fair Commission for 15 years and she was named to the New Mexico Racing Commission in 1982.

She was the first woman appointed to the fair board and also the first woman to be appointed a racing commissioner.

Governor Bruce King, who appointed Sawyer to the racing commission in 1981, was shocked to learn of her death.

"She was an outstanding pioneer individual; and she was an advocate for New Mexico, one of the forerunners for women in western activities — rodeo and things," King was quoted as saying.

Sawyer was the Lincoln County Democratic Party chairman for many years, and recently took time to speak to Lincoln County Democrats about the state of the party and the state of the nation.



Sawyer's mother, the late Dessie Sawyer, was a Democratic National Committeewoman.

Sawyer recently served as a judge in the state fair's queen pageant, a contest that places heavy emphasis on candidates' horsemanship and riding skills.

Sawyer, who was admired by professional cowboys for her abilities as a horsewoman, was also known for her colorful western attire. Her sparkly red, white and blue riding outfit, coordinated from her hat to her boots, dazzled the All American Futurity crowd as she led what was to be her last call to the post parade.

The Museum of the Horse honored Sawyer last year for her service to New Mexico, and the Ruidoso Lions had planned a dinner and "roast" in her honor for next month.

Her local friends, including Mayor Jerry Shaw, joined the governor and other state officials in mourning Sawyer.

"It won't be the same without her," said New Mexico State Fair Commissioner Bill McIlhenny.

Survivors include her sister, Myrl Sawyer Good of Roswell; a nephew, T.J. Good III of Chama; a niece, Candace Good Jacobson of Ruidoso; one great-nephew and three great-nieces.

Services are scheduled for 11 a.m. Tuesday, October 19, at St. Andrews Episcopal Church in Roswell. Burial will take place at 1:30 p.m. in the cemetery in Tatum.

A piece of history is returned to Indians

An 1885 Howe army scale, believed to have been used to measure rations for the Indians at Fort Stanton, was donated to the Mescalero Apache Cultural Center Friday.

The scale, which was made in Rutland, Vermont, was donated by Harold and Juanez Broughton and Milton Anderson of Big Spring, Texas.

The box-like scale was made to fold up into a compact area with all moving parts locking into place. The design of the scale made it easier to transport in the backs of wagons.

Silas Cochise Sr., great-great-grandson of Cochise and secretary of the Mescalero Apache Tribe, was master of ceremonies at the dedication.

Wendell Chino, president of the Mescalero Apache Tribe, accepted the scale on behalf of the Cultural Center. Members of the Tribal Council were also present.

"This scale is part of our heritage. It is home, where it will be forever and ever," Broughton said.

The scale, which can weigh up to 600 pounds, was discovered in an antique shop in Cimarron, New Mexico. The original army cavalry colors are still visible. Stamped into to top portion of the scale is "Mescalero Apache."

"With great feeling I accept in behalf of the Apache Tribe. It is something that plays a vital part in the history of our people," Chino said.

The scales will be housed in the Cultural Center where they will be included in an exhibit that will play a significant part in helping to show younger generations the history of the Apache Nation, according to Chino.

"The Apache moved with the seasons. When the high country be-

came cold we would move down. We respect the land," Chino said.

"We, today, want to protect the remaining acres we have, when we consider the millions and millions of acres we lost to other cultures," Chino said.

After the land base of the tribe was reduced, gathering and hunting for food became harder and harder. The army at Fort Stanton would provide rations for each family on Saturday.

"When we were reduced to a smaller land base, the food we gathered was scarce," Chino said.

"Our museum does need a lot of donations. Things that will help to enhance our young ones. We're still here and we are still fighting. We try to encourage our children to respect customs, culture and elders. We want to broaden and enlarge the museum, to preserve our history," Ellyn Big Rope Lathan, museum curator, said.

"Our people can count in our native language, but when it comes to identifying the days of the week the Apache language has no words for that," Chino said.

The native language of Apache has no name for days of the week. Saturday was the day of the week supplies were distributed by the army. Sunday was called "The day of no work." The week was measured by saying two days after the day of no work (Tuesday) according to the museum curator.

"But, because of this instrument our people called the day HA DA I GE GU. It means, 'getting supplies,'" Chino said.

Because the rations were given on a certain day the name for Saturday came to be known to the Mescalero Apaches.

"It is a valuable piece you have given us. A piece of our lives. Something the young people may see and realize it is a part of our history," Cochise said.

Village broke the law, says DA

The practice of allowing Ruidoso village employees to trade for surplus property has been strongly condemned as illegal by District Attorney Bert Atkins.

In a strongly worded letter to the village council last week, assistant district attorney William M. Kinsella, Jr. rebuked the council for not following the procurement code and specifically pointed a finger at the New Mexico State Agency for Surplus Property and village attorney David Thomsen.

"It is clear, that under the Procurement Code, village employees should not be trading village property for other village employees' personal property. It is simply against the law and further it is bad for employee morale," Kinsella wrote.

"In this case, the village employees obtained 'legal' (sanctioned, but not truly legal) approval for the trade so the District Attorney's Office will not proceed with any criminal charges or civil actions against these village employees for the trading of this worn out equipment. It must also be stressed that such trades will not be condoned in the future by our office."

Kinsella also had harsh words for the surplus inventory system initiated by village manager Ron Wicker.

"... a stricter inventory control policy and accounting procedure should be used on equipment bought at surplus auctions. An inventory of surplus bought items was conducted by the village that showed that employees sometimes had no idea of what the items on the purchase invoices looked like in order to inventory them since," he wrote.

At a council meeting earlier in the year, then Mayor Victor Alonso and councilors Frank Cummins, Barbara Duff and Ron Andrews were supportive of Wicker and the way he handled auction surplus.

Councilors Jerry Shaw and J. D. James questioned the practices. Cummins, in a show of support, recommended a pay raise for Wicker as a vote of confidence.

Alonso and Andrews have since quit the council.

The selling and trading of junk by employees was first stumbled upon last December by The Ruidoso News during another assignment.

Hundreds, if not thousands, of surplus items from government auctions, were dumped unceremoniously in the muddy backyard of the street department.

Most of the purchases had been made since Wicker became manager and none of the purchases had been inventoried through the purchasing department.

Purchasing agent Fonda Hazel told The News at that time she was instructed by Wicker to pre-sign purchase orders. She said she had nothing to do with viewing or purchasing the equipment since much of it was purchased at auctions. Hazel later resigned in protest over the village's sloppy in-

Tardy, messy, missing RHS students confined to campus

The kids blew it by smattering litter, vandalizing cars, smoking in the parking lot and not returning to school after lunch.

Ruidoso District Superintendent Mike Gladden said the high school campus will be closed for the next three days.

"We'll see how it goes," he told *The Ruidoso News*. "It's up to the kids."

The situation could be reevaluated as early as Thursday, he said. But today through Wednesday, students at the high school will either have to pack their lunches or buy them in the cafeteria, because they will not be allowed to go off campus.

"I hope students will begin to take more pride in the school property and respect other property," Gladden said. "The staff and administration will work together to try and get the message across to students. I hope we'll get the point across."

The high school campus has been open uninterrupted since September of 1984, Gladden said.

The decision to close the campus came as a surprise to members of the student council, according to president Donny Ames.

"Mr. (Denny) Weems (school principal) has talked to the student council about it. He asked us for suggestions," Ames said. "We felt there was nothing we could do about the tardies after lunch. That was beyond our control. But we could see some action in reference to the way the school looks."

"We suggested (Weems) talk to the four classes individually and tell them that he is concerned about it. He could tell them to lunch that day and then examine the campus and evaluate (if they responded). If it was bad, he could close the campus. That's what we were thinking he was going to do."

"It was a surprise to the council when (the closing) was announced Friday. We felt we could have helped more if we had known in advance. Maybe it will be effective."

Ames said she expects the campus to be reopened by next

Monday because the cafeteria is not equipped to handle 600 students.

"It wouldn't be a good situation," she said. "They'd have to alter schedules to handle all the students."

Gladden said he was aware that the student council has been trying to come up with ways to keep the campus clean.

"But this was my decision (in consultation with Weems)," Gladden said.

"We are trying to get their attention on several things. The campus needs to be cleaned, we have abuses in the parking lot of smoking and more vandalism of cars than I like to think about. There just is no respect for school property and the property of others."

"We all realize it's a small group we're focusing on, yet it will take student pressure to (change the abusive behavior)."

"We'll see by the end of this week what happens. If they are willing to take care of the campus, we will reevaluate it."



New digs

MRS studies stalled by Congress

The debate continues in Washington D.C. over funding to study the development of a high-level nuclear waste disposal site.

Congress, in an amendment to the water and energy appropriations bill, seemed to put a stop to plans by the Department of Energy to allocate \$2.8 million for a study on a Monitored Retrievable Storage (MRS) for the temporary storage of spent fuel rods from the nuclear utility industry.

The amendment, co-sponsored by New Mexico senators Jeff Bingaman (D) and Pete Domenici (R), called for consensus among MRS host sites before more funding could be authorized.

The Mescalero Apache Indian Tribe, which already has received and used two study grants totaling \$300,000, is the only prospective host still in the running for the \$2.8 million grant.

The MRS process, which has

been under the direction of the Nuclear Negotiator's Office, has been stalled since President Bill Clinton was elected, with the Republican Bush appointee asked to step down and no replacement installed as nuclear negotiator.

Clinton's nominee Richard Stallings is up for confirmation hearings this week.

Meanwhile, further funding for studying an MRS site has been stripped from the water and energy bill, according to a spokesperson for Senator Bingaman. The amendment was killed, but funding was cut for any further MRS grants.

Mescalero representatives visited Washington to lobby for continued funds for studies and made an appeal to President Clinton to intervene in the funding dispute.

Fredeso, Mescalero Apache Tribal Council member and MRS project manager wrote to Clinton

asking to have the Bingaman amendment stripped from the bill; and while that was accomplished the end result may not be the one that the Mescaleros were seeking.

Peso called the Bingaman amendment a breach of trust with Indian tribes, saying it was a direct and deliberate affront to Indian tribes.

Peso charged that the amendment was misrepresented in Congress as acceptable when, in fact, the Mescaleros repeatedly registered objections.

The Mescaleros have been encouraging the Congress to get on with the whole process; starting with the confirmation of a new nuclear waste negotiator.

"Richard Stallings deserves the opportunity to pursue the policy of the president and seek a voluntary MRS host agreement," wrote Peso.

Ruidoso Downs man faces assault and battery charges

A \$15,000 cash bond has been set for Ralph Owen Nosker, of San Patricio, who was arrested early Saturday morning and charged with aggravated battery with a deadly weapon.

Nosker also was charged with one count of battery against Melissa LeJeune, criminal trespass, and two counts of battery against Kelly Burrus, according to police reports.

If convicted the penalty for the third-degree felony charges is three years in prison and/or a \$5,000 fine.

Because the incident took place in Ruidoso Downs, but extended into Lincoln County, the sheriff's department became involved in the investigation. The report states the incident took place in Honda.

Nosker reportedly pushed his way into an apartment in Inspiration Heights on October 14. He is accused of hitting LeJeune across the left cheek and demanding to talk to Burrus.

Burrus, who said she agreed to talk to Nosker, told police that since there were small children at the residence she felt it would be better to leave the apartment with Nosker.

The two then left the residence and drove 15 to 17 miles out of Ruidoso Downs and turned onto a dirt road, where they drove another six miles, according to the statement given to the police by Burrus.

According to police, Burrus said Nosker became angry and began hitting her. The report stated he produced a gun and threatened Burrus with it.

"He took his handgun and forced

it into my mouth," Burrus said in the police report.

The report then went on to say Nosker dragged Burrus 70 feet in front of the vehicle and began to hit her in the face and head.

Burrus' statement said Nosker fired a shot into bushes beside where she was standing and Nosker told her, "It could have been you."

Nosker took Burrus back to the apartment. The two women then called the police.

A warrant was issued October 15, and Nosker turned himself into Lincoln County Sheriff's Deputy Orlando Montes on October 16.

Ruidoso Downs Police Chief Will Hoggard and Deputy Montes worked closely together on the investigation, according to the police report.

Commission to talk trash

The Lincoln County Commission Tuesday will carry out a procedure followed by every other member of the Lincoln County Solid Waste Authority and its counterpart in Otero.

Each member of the coalition of counties and their municipalities is adopting a joint power agreement authorizing the issuance of environmental services gross receipt tax revenue bonds.

The tax will be pledged toward the repayment of more than \$3-million being used to construct a new regional landfill south of Alamogordo. Each county authority is a 50 percent partner, although

Otero will generate a much higher tax return.

However, it's unlikely any of the tax will have to be used to repay the bonds. The members expect the landfill to generate enough revenue from its operation to cover annual costs plus bond repayment.

Exact figures in the ordinance will not be available until Tuesday, because they are tied to the interest rate in effect when Alamogordo officials sign their agreement as the lead agency. The city also will operate the landfill.

The special meeting of the commission will begin at 8 a.m. in the county courthouse in Carrizozo.

Clarification

The news brief in last Monday's edition of *The Ruidoso News* should have identified Jerry Romero and Faustino Miranda Jr. of Ruidoso for an arrest on auto burglary, not theft of an auto.

Deputy sheriff Angelo Vega said a stereo and speakers were stolen from the auto, but the vehicle was not moved.

Vega said the stereo and speakers were recovered from Romero's truck. He said both men were charged with the crime.

County pressures state to use correct property values

It took weeks of demanding action and entreaty state officials to do the right thing.

Finally last week, employees of the state property tax division saw things Lincoln County's way.

According to county manager Andy Wynham, they agreed to use the property values submitted to them by County Assessor Patsy Serna instead of the misaligned figures returned by the State Department of Finance and Administration.

Serna told county commissioners about the problem in early October.

She had submitted values for four school districts in one order, but they came back to her from the state in another order, which would have resulted in two districts collecting more money and two collecting less than needed.

Commissioners certified the misaligned figures for the districts before the error was uncovered by an employee of the assessor's office

during an interview with *The Ruidoso News*.

They will be asked during a special 8 a.m. meeting Tuesday to rescind their previous motion and certify the correct figures.

Unlike last year's giant jump of nearly \$33-million, the increase for taxable property value in 1993 crept up by a meager \$3-million this year and exemptions cut out a big chunk of that gain. As a result, combined with increases in local government budgets, many home owners will see their taxes go up.

In 1992, land owners in the county claimed about \$2.5-million for head of household exemptions, which were \$1,400 each that year.

The exemption increased to \$2,000 this year and the total jumped to \$3,572,843.

Veterans exemptions went up by \$140,000 and other exemptions jumped from \$2.5-million in 1991 to \$3.9-million this year.

As in most past years, residential land owners in Ruidoso will pay the top tax rate in the county at

40.809 figures in 1992 and 38.148 mills in 1991 and 38.148 mills in 1992.

One mill is equal to \$1 per \$1,000 of net taxable value, which is figured on one-third of assessed property value minus all exemptions.

The corresponding property tax value in Ruidoso increased from \$98,191,400 in 1992 to \$99,315,461 this year.

Nonresidential values went down slightly to \$35.8-million from \$35.9-million, but the tax rate went up from 41.946 mills to 44.24 mills.

Breaking down the total tax paid by a Ruidoso home owner, about 1.6 mills goes to state debts, 8.3 mills to the county, 5.949 for the operation of the city, 9.656 for the city's debt service, 11.3 mills to run the school district, 1 mill to the instruction center of Eastern New Mexico University, 2.3 mills to the Lincoln County Medical Center and slightly more than two-thirds of a mill to the Carrizozo Health Center.

A Ruidoso Downs resident pays

similar amounts for all but its municipal operation, which only requires 3.951 mills to pay debts and 7.573 mills for operational costs.

Ruidoso Downs' taxable value was set at \$6,355,285 compared to \$6,336,928 the previous year. The residential tax rate also inched up from 35.75 mills in 1992 to 37.753 mills in 1993. Nonresidential values posted a very small decrease of less than \$30,000 to \$6,969,605 and the tax rate went from 39.741 mills to 41.335 mills.

Outside of Ruidoso and the Downs, residential taxable values hit \$8,755,119 and non-residential were \$9,365,744. The tax rates went up by about two mills each to 25.204 mills and 28.216 mills, respectively.

In Carrizozo, residential taxable value decreased by slightly under \$100,000 to \$2,322,606 and the tax rate went up from 28.569 mills to 29.546 mills. Non residential values also went down by about \$40,000 to \$1.7-million and a tax

rate of 32.95 mills compared to 29.96 last year.

Residential values outside of Carrizozo increased to \$2,539,807, up about \$40,000, and the tax rate slid down from 20.666 mills to 20.925 mills. Nonresidential values stepped down from \$5.65-million to \$5.64-million, as did the tax rate from 23.618 mills to 23.938 mills.

The area outside of Capitan, in which several subdivisions are being developed, saw one of the largest increases in residential value from \$42.7-million to \$44.4-million. The tax rate moved with it from 18.769 mills to 19.744 mills. Non-residential values edged down slightly to \$19.8-million, while the tax levy went up from 21.751 mills to 22.77 mills.

In the village of Capitan, both residential and non-residential values dropped by small amounts: \$2,169,103 to \$3,161,550 and \$2,103,922 to \$2,043,720, respectively. The tax rates in the village were set at 34.493 mills for residential (up from 33.585) and 37.706 for

non-residential (up from 36.797).

Of that amount, 1.596 mills pays state debts, 8.360 mills goes to the county, 6.458 mills to the school district, 1.991 mills to the municipal operation and 13.104 mills to municipal debts.

Honda's residential values went down slightly from \$4,097,365 to \$4,039,272. The tax rate was also decreased from 19.17 mills to 15.636 mills. Its nonresidential values went up from \$6.8-million to \$7.3-million and the tax rate went down from 22.29 mills to 18.514 mills.

Corona's figures were: \$361,748 residential value in the village in 1992, \$343,613 in 1993, tax rate 20.76 mills to 21.983 mills; non-residential from \$499,240 to \$528,676 and rate from 24.305 mills to 25.04 mills; residential values outside of Corona, \$1,034,370 to \$1,094,429 and tax rate from 16.866 to 17.804 mills; non-residential from \$1.1-million to \$1.17-million and tax rate from 18.15 mills to 21.076 mills.

"It's really disheartening to

think anyone could just let their family pet go like that," said shelter manager Esther Harper.

Dickens, named for the saying "cute as the dickens," was picked up in early October on Country Club Drive. The low-slung dachshund mix appears to be about one year old.

Brown, with a white blaze on his nose, Dickens loves attention, said shelter secretary Kathy Tetreault.

"He's sweet and would be a great family dog," she said. "He gets along with other animals, even the big ones."

Sterling, a striking silver and black husky/shepherd mix, was found on Roswell Street in late September.

He appears to be about six months old and already presents a regal picture.

"He still has some of the playful pup in him," Tetreault said. "But being a husky/shepherd mix, he will learn quickly. I can see him conforming. He knows the routine here."

Sander, who appears to be a border terrier, is another small dog with reddish blonde hair or typical terrier texture.

He arrived at the shelter in late August as a stray.

"He's very good with people and other small to medium dogs," Tetreault said. "For some reason, he will be aggressive with big dogs, so he would need to be in a secure yard for his own safety."

All three males need to be neutered in line with the society's commitment to reduce the population of unwanted and abused pets.

Society members want to see the day when only the sick, severely injured or very old animals will be euthanized. They do not consider euthanasia a humane answer to the

problem of pet over population when it could be controlled by keeping dogs in their yards or in their homes, and by spaying or neutering them.

State law, effective last July, also requires that all animals adopted from shelters across the state be altered to prevent reproduction. Ruidoso passed a mandatory spay and neuter law more than a year ago. Lincoln County and all of its villages have leash laws.

Dan and Kim Mills of Pampered Pets grooming service off Mechem Drive, loyal supporters of the

shelter, have pledged to put aside \$5 for the society out of every grooming fee this week. It would be a good time to spruce up a pet and help the abandoned animals.

Don't forget, persons interested in the shelter and society are invited to attend the monthly meeting at noon Wednesday at the Texas Club. Volunteers always are needed, especially for the thrift shop.

Crash leads to charges

A Ruidoso woman was charged with driving while intoxicated, following an October 14, incident.

Police reports indicate an accident took place at 10:09 p.m., when a vehicle Susie Gober was driving struck a traffic light at the intersection of Sudderth Drive and U.S. Highway 70.

According to police reports, Gober, whose address is listed as Palo Verde Slopes, continued to drive the vehicle two miles before coming to a stop.

Patrolman David Hightower was advised that a red vehicle was involved in the accident and had left the scene.

Police reports stated that the vehicle Gober was driving had hit the pole before she reportedly left the scene. The vehicle was reported to be at D&S Salvage.

As Hightower approached the car he heard someone say, "she has a gun," according to the investigative report.

Hightower drew his gun and approached the vehicle. The car was sprayed the woman in the report was hysterical. Hightower asked her to remove the keys, to which she reportedly was unable to do.

The officer then asked her to show her license, which she was unable to do, according to police.

The windshield of the vehicle was broken and the officer noticed Gober's left hand was bleeding. An ambulance was called to the scene.

Hightower's report stated Gober refused medical treatment and refused to sign a medical treatment release form.

Gober's son arrived and talked Gober into signing the release form, according to the report.

Hightower's report also stated that as Gober was being transported, she lay down in the back seat of the patrol car and began kicking the window on the driver's side.

Two blood alcohol content (BAC) tests were given to Gober, with the results of both tests showing a .18 BAC, said police.

In the state of New Mexico a blood alcohol level of .08 or higher is considered legally intoxicated.

Bond was set at \$487, and the vehicle was impounded, according to police reports.







Oñate big plays defeat Warriors

The Ruidoso Warrior football team could not overcome their own mistakes and offensive ineffectiveness as they fell 28-13 to Las Cruces Oñate Friday night at NMSU's Aggie Memorial Stadium.

The Warriors fell to 4-4 overall and 1-1 in District 3-AAA. The Knights' season record remained perfect at 7-0 and they joined Silver atop the district race at 2-0.

It didn't take long into the game for the powerful Knights to take control. The Warriors received the opening kickoff but could not move the ball with any effectiveness.

The Warriors were forced to punt the ball away from deep in their own territory. David LaMay's kick never had a chance however as the Knights lined up 10 men on the line of scrimmage and poured through the confused Warrior line to block the punt and score.

The Knights owned a 7-0 lead and their high-powered offense hadn't been on the field yet. When it did arrive on the perfect surface of Memorial stadium, the Warrior defense did the job — at least for a while.

The Warriors forced a punt from the Knights and were again unsuccessful on offense, having to punt the ball away again themselves.

At this point, the Warriors got their first real break of the game. Oñate fumbled in their own territory and the Warriors were able to recover.

Quarterback John Echols and the offensive unit would have a chance to start a possession on Oñate's end of the field, at the 13 yard line.

The first play saw a Oñate jump into the neutral zone — a five-yard penalty. With the ball at the eight, Ruidoso (three yards), J.R. Chino on the sweep (three yards), J.R. Chino on the trap (three yards) and then Chino went in untouched on third down. Byron Soules extra point tied the score at seven each.

Through most of the first half, the Warrior defense kept Oñate's double-barreled scoring machine off the field. All-State fullback James Jackson rushed for less than 40 yards and the Warriors led in every statistical category.

With less than four minutes to go in the second quarter, the Knights were faced with second down and 20 yards to go from their own 17. At this point Oñate coach Tom Essex called a simple running play up the middle.

The Knights left guard noticeably was in motion on the play, perhaps temporarily freezing the Warrior defense. But no yellow flags came out and the running back broke through a shocked Ruidoso secondary for a 40-yard gain.

Suddenly, Oñate was in scoring position, just seconds after they

were trying to run out the clock in the half.

Mixing their plays with precision, the Knights moved down the field in impressive fashion.

It all came down to fourth-and-goal from the three yard line. If Ruidoso held, it would be a tremendous moral victory heading into the locker room. If not, Oñate would have a 14-point lead, without moving the football effectively for the opening 24 minutes. A real back-breaker for the young Warriors.

Oñate scored. A quick-pass to the tight-end fooled everyone in the house, including the Warriors.

Oñate led 14-7 at the half despite the Warriors out-playing the heavily favored hosts.

The second half was a different story. Oñate totally dominated the Warriors on both sides of the ball. The Ruidoso offense, that had played so well during the preceding weeks, was confused and ineffective.

Oñate didn't really have long time-consuming drives as you would expect from an offense that features a fullback as its best player. On the contrary, the Warriors gave up just a few big plays — enough to keep the offense off the field and ultimately, to give them a chance to win the game.

The Knights scored twice in the second half off big plays; one, a 10-yard pass play that went 50 yards and the other was a 20-yard fade route.

Ruidoso's final score was a brilliant 51-yard scamper from sophomore Jackie Roe. The extra point was missed.

This was a game of big plays that Ruidoso couldn't stop, and unfortunately officiating also came into play. Of course in the first half, the big run with the guard in motion was not called back. But then, the play in the second-half that gave Oñate their two-touchdown lead had the Knights tight end inadvertently lining up on the wrong side of the formation, — thus making him an ineligible receiver. Because there was a split end out that side, when the tight end went out into the pass pattern, he was ineligible.

Next week's opponent, Silver, smashed Deming 34-6 after a very quick start, while Socorro defeated a hapless Cobre team 28-0.

It will be a war Friday night at W.D. Horton stadium between two teams that used to be the powers of the district, that now are fighting to get back to their earlier form. The winner will get to the playoffs for the first time in a while.

If you have a couple of extra bucks and are free Friday night, come on out — this will be a while of a ball game.

Is Warrior football making the grade?

On The Sideline

A couple of years ago the El Paso Times ran a weekly "Report Card" on the UTEP Miner and the New Mexico State Aggies during the football season.

The Times graded everything from the quarterback to the cheerleaders.

It always amazed me that a sports editor had the power to wield his pen (or computer nowadays) and sway public opinion in a field that he is no more a capable judge than the next person. But that's just the way it is.

No matter what you think, people tend to believe what they read or see on television as the absolute, positive truth.

"They can't print stuff that's not true, they'll get sued," the public cries.

That's true ... to a point. Newspapers (and television and radio stations) are entitled to wonder aloud just like everyone else. That's what keeps our country the best place in the world to live ... everyone, including newspapers, is entitled to an opinion.

Where would we be if there were no George Wills or Jack Andersons, or Rush Limbaughs to challenge the system ... to shake things up ... to make people say hummm?

All of this is leading to my own personal Report Card for the Warriors. It is strictly my OPINION.

1993 Ruidoso Warrior Report Card:

The Scale: A-Very Good, B-Good, C-Average, D-Poor, F-Really Bad.

- Overall Warrior football grade — B
- Overall offense — B+
- Running Game — B
- Passing Game — A
- Offensive Line — B

I divide the offense into two sections. The running game and the passing game. I give the running game a B.

Raul Davis, Ricky Devara and Rex Comanche have done a very good job running the Wing-T.

Comanche is a pure hard-nosed football straight-ahead football player. Davis, in his first season playing football has made good progress. He is a very talented athlete who will continue to improve throughout the year and into next year.

Devara, the Wing-back, has the big play knack, which is necessary to play that position.

Their backups, Anthony Torres, David LaMay and Jackie Roe are the best in the state. No AAA team is deeper at running back than the Warriors.

The passing game gets an A.

While it was a slow-starter, the Warriors made big plays throwing the football from game one. Now that consistency has arrived, opponents have to worry about the pass which opens up the running game.

Quarterback John Echols is not a Jeff Wiltingham or a Russell Easter or a Manny Guardiola. However, what he lacks in size and athletic ability, he makes up in game savvy and desire.

Last week he made a key block 40 yards down the field that ultimately gave the Warriors the winning touchdown. You don't see many quarterbacks do that.

Echols has thrown the football very accurately and through seven games, he hasn't been intercepted.

Receivers Byron Soules (tight end) and Brandon Eamello are both sophomores that if you saw on film you would swear are All-State senior players.

Both have demonstrated their ability to catch the ball in pressure situations, in a crowd. Soules knock is to get open (sometimes wide open) and Eamello makes catches that would make Lynn Swann say "this kid is a sophomore in high school?"

Throw in Ricky Devara and the passing game is good ... really good.

The offensive line is a group of over-achievers. Zack Turner, Kevin Pellman, Adam Chavez, Freddy Sanchez, Sergio Guerrero and Soules are the oil that make the machine work. No blocking equals no run, no pass and no kick ... no football. Weekly, these guys face opponents that are bigger, stronger and faster, and yet we've won four ball games.

Early in the year, their pass protection was not adequate that problem has certainly been resolved and the results are obvious. Ruidoso has moved the ball consistently against every opponent, and the line is reason.

At the beginning of the year, when the coaching staff assigns positions, it was the defense that got the best football players. But today it's the offensive group that has made the biggest strides over last year's team.

- Line — C
- Linebackers — C
- Secondary — B+

This grade would have been higher, but someone put Portales on the schedule and an F in every department tends to bring the ol' average down.

In addition, Ruidoso misses far too many tackles. Our opponents have on many occasions made big plays after the initial hit. For us to beat the really good football teams, that has to stop.

The defensive line is anchored by future All-Stater David Eisenbrown. A tackle, Eisenbrown brings an impressive resume to Ruidoso. The senior was a part of the Texas AA State Champions last year.

Teammates Jesse Fromknecht, Robert Guardiola, Amador Martinez, J.R. Chino and Billy Austin have, at times, looked very good, despite not doing a good job of stopping scrambling quarterbacks.

That of course is not just the line's problem, it's the whole defense's problem.

Linebackers David LaMay and Byron Soules make a lot of tackles. They are supposed to; it comes with the opinion.

The Warriors don't pursue down the line of scrimmage as well as they should so sweeps have been a problem. Most of our opponents big gains have come from outside the tackles. This means that the linebackers are getting blocked too much or they don't have the speed to make the plays. I don't think that speed is the problem.

The secondary is anchored by another probable All-State player, Anthony Torres. A

senior, Torres has been a starter for three years for the Warriors and he shows it.

Always in the right place at the right time, Anthony's speed has been a key for a secondary that is forced to make far too many tackles.

Cornerbacks Kyle Humphreys and Jimmy Varnadore along with safety Johnny Flores have been very good in obvious passing situations. Varnadore's key interception at the five yardline turned away the Wildcats in an almost sure scoring drive. That play turned around the game for the Warriors.

Flores also has a couple of interceptions. Humphreys strong-suit is his speed. On more than one occasion, the sophomore has had to use that talent to run-down break away runners from behind. His coverage is improving, as is all of the secondary's.

I will be a little happier when the secondary learns to knock the ball down instead of going for the interception. Those unsuccessful attempts have also cost the Warriors some big plays.

This grade is pretty common for high school teams. Usually, there is not a lot a practice time devoted to this area. This is a venue for kids who don't play as much on offense and defense to hit the grid iron, so realistically, not many high school teams would grade out very well.

The kickoff and receiving teams both received a D.

Neither team has produced the fireworks of Warriors past.

This year, Coach Gaston brought back the "Starburst" return and I was happy to see that. It's unique and has produced a lot of touchdowns and long returns for the Warriors.

But not this year. In the Deming game, the starburst was a disaster and one of the reasons that Ruidoso was pinned against its goal line much of the night. It's a great play that works and we should keep it, but we need to improve the way we run it.

The kickoff team is average. We've seen a few big returns from the opposing teams and we've seen some good coverage by the Warriors. Actually the kickoff team set the stage in the Fabens game as they recovered the opening kickoff on the one yardline. The Warriors went in two plays later and the romp was on.

Brandon Eamello is the place kicker and he's doing OK, but it seems he was a little better during the first part of the season.

The punt team has done a very good job of coverage despite having had to work with three different punters.

David LaMay has the most powerful leg of the group but is injured and finds it painful to kick. Ricky Devara punts the ball higher than anyone but is susceptible to an occasional short kick.

J.R. Chino kicks the ball long and low.

However you look at it and whom ever is punting, opponents have not made many yards in transition.







Sign regs revisited

Signs — how big, where to put them and every other detail about signage — just keep popping up to confound the Ruidoso Village Council.

The problems that began under the previous administration's lack of enforcement and disregard for sign rules and regs just won't go away. This mayor and council took a big step by announcing a return to enforcement of the sign ordinance, and they backed that up by designating additional code enforcement staff. Most of the banners that flapped haphazardly in the wind have come down, and that's good.

Now, the council is back to the drawing board studying its ordinance again. The ordinance is a good one, and it fits this community. If the council makes any changes, perhaps those changes will tighten up the ordinance and take out any loopholes.

Since signs are back up for study, here are some areas that might need additional consideration:


—Business owners who opt to paint scenes on their buildings should have to obtain a sign permit and count that scenery into their sign percentage. Pictures, since they make a statement, are signage.

—Open and closed signs should also count in the overall percentage, with the ban on banners to be imposed on banners with the "open" and "closed" designation.

—Signs placed in the beds of pickups should be controlled somehow, and certainly should count in a business's allowed percentage.

—Banners, in the four designated areas, should not be left more than a day after an event. Those banners should be neat and should hang tightly between the posts. (The banner in front of the Civic Events Center looks so bedraggled it should be taken down. A highway department directional sign will lead visitors to the center.)

Has anybody thought about asking some neat, clean villages for copies of their sign ordinances? Maybe we don't need to reinvent the wheel.



AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE ADOPTION AND EXECUTION OF A JOINT POWERS AGREEMENT, THE RATIFICATION OF AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF ALAMOGORDO, NEW MEXICO, AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF THE CITY OF ALAMOGORDO OTERO/LINCOLN COUNTY JPA ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES GROSS RECEIPTS TAX REVENUE BONDS, SERIES 1993 B, IN THE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF \$ _____ FOR THE PURPOSE OF ACQUIRING, CONSTRUCTING, EXTENDING, ENLARGING, BETTERING, REPAIRING OR OTHERWISE IMPROVING OR MAINTAINING SOLID WASTE DISPOSAL EQUIPMENT, OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE OF SANITARY LANDFILLS, SANITARY LANDFILLS, SOLID WASTE FACILITIES OR ANY COMBINATION OF THE FOREGOING, ALL AT THE OTERO/LINCOLN COUNTY REGIONAL LANDFILL LOCATED NEAR ORO GRANDE IN OTERO COUNTY, NEW MEXICO, PLEDGING THE LINCOLN COUNTY ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES GROSS RECEIPTS TAX DISTRIBUTED TO THE COUNTY OF LINCOLN AS AUTHORIZED BY SECTIONS 7-20B-1 THROUGH 7-20B-7 NMSA 1978, PROVIDING FOR THE DISPOSITION OF THE REVENUE DERIVED FROM SAID TAXES; PRESCRIBING OTHER DETAILS CONCERNING SAID JOINT POWERS AGREEMENT, SAID BOND ORDINANCE AND SAID TAXES; RATIFYING ACTION PREVIOUSLY TAKEN IN CONNECTION THEREWITH; AND REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HERewith.

The following is a general summary of the subject matter contained in such Ordinance. The preambles recite that Lincoln County (the "County") is a municipal corporation of the State of New Mexico; that the City of Alamogordo, the Village of Tularosa, the Town of Cloudcroft, the Village of Carrizozo, the Village of Capitan, the Village of Corona, the Village of Ruidoso, and the Village of Ruidoso Downs, (collectively, the "Municipalities") currently impose an environmental gross receipts tax of 1/16th of 1%; that Lincoln County and Otero County (the Counties) currently impose an environmental gross receipts tax of 1/8th of 1%; and that such environmental gross receipts tax has been dedicated to the acquisition, construction, operation and maintenance of solid waste facilities and related facilities; that the Municipalities and the Counties (together, the "Participants") will enter into a "Joint Powers Agreement for the Financing and Establishment of the Otero/Lincoln County Regional Landfill" to exercise common solid waste disposal powers pursuant to Sections 11-1-1 through 11-1-7, NMSA 1878; that the City of Alamogordo, New Mexico ("Alamogordo") will acquire a solid waste

facility (including facilities already acquired by Alamogordo) to be known as the Otero/Lincoln County Regional Landfill (the "Facility") on behalf of the Participants by issuing the "City of Alamogordo Otero/Lincoln County JPA Environmental Services Gross Receipts Tax Revenue Bonds, Series 1993B (the "Bonds"); that each Participant will pledge the revenues received from its environmental gross receipts tax (the "Pledged Tax Revenues") to the payment of the Bonds; that Alamogordo also will pledge the Net Revenues from operation of the Facility to payment of the Bonds; that the Bonds constitute a first lien on the Pledge Tax Revenues and the Net Revenues; that the Participants, acting through the existing Otero or Lincoln County Solid Waste Authorities, will have joint ownership of the Facility; and declares an emergency.

Sections 1 through 4 ratify previous action by the Board and officers of the County; authorize the Facility; ratify the Joint Powers Agreement previously approved and executed by the County and ratify the Bond Ordinance previously adopted by Alamogordo to authorize issuance of the Bonds.

Sections 5 sets forth the pledge by the County of its 1/8th of 1% environmental service gross receipts tax (the "GRT Tax"), requires that the County make monthly deposits of the GRT Tax, immediately upon receipt, into a separate fund of the County designated as the "City of Alamogordo Otero/Lincoln County JPA Environmental Services Gross Receipts Tax, Lincoln County Income Fund," and requires the County to transfer all amounts in such fund monthly to Alamogordo for deposit into a separate fund to be used as described in the Bond Ordinance.

Sections 6 and 7 ratify Alamogordo's pledge of the Net Revenues of the Facility to the payment of the Bonds and acknowledge that the Bonds constitute an irrevocable and first lien (but not necessarily an exclusively first lien) on the County's Pledge Tax Revenues.

Section 8 and 9 acknowledge that the term of the Joint Powers Agreement is perpetual and

that any withdrawal from the Joint Powers Agreement by the County does not affect the County's obligations, financial or otherwise, under the Joint Powers Agreement and provide for the exclusion of the County from participation and ownership of the Facility if the County fails to approve the Ordinance by the majority required for adoption of emergency ordinances.

Section 10 through 15 delegate certain powers to County officers, provide separability and repealer clauses, provide an irrevocability clause, provide for an effective date and provide a summary for publication.
