Village goes on the roads again

How to stretch tax dollars for the best stretch of road challenged the Ruidoso councilors during a recent workshop meeting.

Deputy manager Alan Briley conducted the work session that focused on:

- striping and sweeping the streets for safety.
- reaching for quality control.
- patches with square cuts and proper compaction.
- best use of state co-op dollars applied to road work.
- a plan, whereby every street should be repaired within seven years.

Mayor Jerry Shaw complimented Briley for pushing the program that painted stripes on Paradise Canyon Road and other streets.

Shaw also thanked street department director Charlie Armstrong for the shoulder work on various arteries and the increased street cleaning program.

"I've had many calls in appreciation for the striping along Paradise Canyon Road," Shaw said. "Residents were pleased that they can drive the road safely at night."

Briley said the three-line striping of major avenues cost the village about \$6,000 as an outside contractual service.

Councilor Frank Potter said he was surprised and pleased that the inexpensive chip and seal type surface proved to be so effective.

Potter spoke of transitional construction of roads, with some roads being paved, some chip and sealed and others base coursed.

Armstrong said the village could only afford a couple of miles of paving a year. He said new construction is about \$10 per foot. He said he chipped and sealed about eight miles of road for the same amount of money.

The council agreed that the roads require special attention, and that the 18 months spent on the Civic Events Center parking lot hurt normal road maintenance, which was ignored during that period.

Briley exhibited a chart that showed how to extend the pavement life of a road. The chart showed the life curve of a road bending from good, to fair, to poor, to unacceptable.

Briley said when a street reaches that point between good and fair, it needs revitalization to prevent costly repairs that would occur if allowed to further deteriorate.

Armstrong said poor is the condition of many Ruidoso streets, and

he has been busy patching problem areas.

The council decided to revamp guidelines on the utilities departments when they cut into roads to lay utility lines.

Briley said Ordinance 71-11, written in 1971, needs updating regarding costs in cutting into village streets.

Briley thought the \$2 per square foot charge to utility companies for excavating in asphalt or cement concrete pavement was not enough. He recommended the council raise the 20-year-old charge to \$100 for the first foot cut in the road, \$200 thereafter.

Briley said a greater emphasis would be put on patching the streets.

"From this day on, our patches have to look right," he said.

The council also wants to look at more modern street lights for the main thoroughfares.

"It's dark down Sudderth Drive and Mechem," said one councilor. "For the money we have paid over the years, our lights could be better and safer."

Potter said it would be wiser to work on streets in several areas of town, rather than concentrating on any one area.

He suggested paving, chip and seal and using base course strategically; starting with a paved entrance, blending into base course and then to dirt. In another year, the base course could be paved in one area, while a paved road could be refurbished through chip and seal in another.

Potter said the council should shoot for five miles of paving, eight miles of chip and seal, and five miles of base course in a year.

Potter cautioned against assessment districts to repair roads. He said cost far exceeds the benefits.

"Not putting in streets until the utilities are in place is a cop out," Potter said. "It sounds great on paper."

The council said ultimately, all the dirt roads would have to be base coursed. Armstrong said to base course a mile of street costs about \$4,000 for a four to five tons of base course 22 feet wide and six inches loose and deep.

Armstrong said in routine maintenance, rough street cuts and deep potholes that can do potential damage to vehicles are given first priority, those reported by the police department or by residents.

After checking, Armstrong said a priority list is written for immediate repair. Streets that can be improved by sand seal or seal coat to extend useful life are given next

LCMC board reviews budget

Hospital administrator Valerie Miller briefed the hospital board of trustees on the upcoming budget and other actions taken at the Lincoln County Medical Center.

The congenial group, made up of people from different walks of life, listened attentively for about 30 minutes Thursday before entering an executive session.

The executive session, closed to the press, included a quality management report, risk management, safety, infection control report and physician problems/actions.

Hospitals, although using taxpayers' dollars, enjoy much more confidentiality than government offices. Although the confidentiality mainly concerns itself with patients, the law says they may or may not reveal other information.

Some states have cost containment boards to allow the consumer to compare hospital costs. New Mexico does not have such a board.

Miller said Monday no action was taken in the closed meeting.

During regular session, the members are handed their large white looseleaf folders that contains meeting notes.

Miller read financial reports, monthly and year-to-date, Carizozo health center statements, ambulance statements and the budget year, which she said has been changed from a fiscal year to a calendar year.

Miller told the board in general terms the budget assumes no rate increase. Adjustments were not discussed.

Miller said she has asked the staff to assume a three to four percent rate of inflation and absorb that into their expenses.

"Expenses were increased on a volume basis and not inflation," Miller said. "We spent a lot of time on contractual discounts and allowances this year, and studied carefully Medicare and Medicaid, and the charity of bad debt."

Alcohol damages unborn children

The line reaches out and grabs the reader.

"Five thousand babies had their first drink before they were born."

A message to pregnant women that they never drink alone. A reminder that anything harmful they do to their bodies, they do to their unborn children.

Kathy Echols, who coordinates community efforts in Lincoln County to prevent substance abuse under Region IX Cooperative Education, translated the words to a highway billboard earlier this month in Ruidoso Downs to bring the potential tragedy home to expectant mothers.

The message about Fetal Alcohol Syndrome (FAS) will be there for about 30 days.

According to physicians, no safe level of alcohol exists during pregnancy, Echols said.

Drinking alcoholic beverages while pregnant can cause FAS, in which infants are born with below-normal weight and size that is never compensated. FAS in an baby is characterized by facial abnormalities such as a small head, narrow eyes, flat nose and thin up-

Miller asked the board to turn to a page that had predictions and assumptions for the coming year and asked if there were any questions. There were none.

"I would urge you to understand that I don't understand what reform will do," Miller said, apparently bracing the board for any changes from the Clinton health plan.

The board passed the budget as written.

"I think that's a good budget, and I think you have pretty good reason to be proud," Miller said.

Miller read reports on the Health Fiesta, which she said went well without major disasters.

Miller explained a Joint Commission on Accreditation of Hospitals which she said went "probably pretty well," and that the hospital received a three-year accreditation.

She said the level of findings was minimal. She explained the

per lip, according to literature provided by Echols.

Alcohol also can lead to defects of the heart, kidneys, muscles, joints and sex organs. It can cause mental retardation as well as learning disorders, hyperactivity, poor coordination and sleep disturbances.

Full blown FAS defects are seen most often in offspring of women who have more than five drinks per day.

However, as little as one or two drinks a week, considered social drinking, can cause miscarriages and stillbirths. One or two drinks a day can result in low birth weights and depressed intelligence. No safe level of consumption has been established by researchers.

Doctors are advising women and men to stop drinking three to six months before conception to avoid potential problems, Echols said.

About 5,000 babies a year are born in the United States with FAS, which was identified in 1973 as a birth defect. Another 10,000 to 20,000 have Fetal Alcohol Effect (FAE), a lesser form.

The national average is 2.2 FAS babies for every 1,000 births, even with what experts believe is widespread under-recognition of the newly diagnosed birth defect.

Some experts believe that between one-third and two-thirds of all special education children have been irreversibly affected by alcohol in some way, according to the National Organization on Fetal Alcohol Syndrome.

New Mexico's rate is higher than the national average, about 2.5 FAS babies per 1,000 births.

A diagnosis of FAS in this state is more likely than in other states, because local doctors know more about FAS as a result of research conducted in New Mexico. State

public health officials estimate that at least 36 babies are born with FAS each year in New Mexico, with 72 more diagnosed as FAE.

According to the Information Center for New Mexicans with Developmental Disabilities, although FAS occurs in all levels of society, a higher incidence is seen among lower socio-economic groups. In New Mexico, combined FAS rates from all Indian tribes are from two to five times higher than the national average. However, rates vary widely from tribe to tribe, with several groups falling well below the national average. The condition is widespread and is not solely a Native American problem in New Mexico.

A complete diagnosis of FAS in children involves the identification of as many as 38 characteristics. Besides those already mentioned, brain damage may result with a smaller and abnormally developed brain. The average FAS child's intelligence quotient (IQ) is in the low 70s and they may exhibit behavioral problems.

The baby also may have abnormal ears with "railroad track" ridges, a poorly developed nasal bridge, a small nose with nostrils often aimed forward, small eye openings, joint abnormalities and be a high risk for congenital heart disease, cleft lip, cleft palate and seizures.

As they grow, other difficulties may become apparent, including delayed toilet training, poor coordination, irritability, attention deficits, hyperactivity, poor judgment and difficulty understanding consequences of their actions, easily manipulated and some antisocial behavior.

Abuse of other substances also can have severe negative ramifications for a woman's offspring.

Cocaine use can lead to retarded

fetal growth and head size, malformed kidneys and genitals, increased risk of sudden infant death syndrome, premature separation of the placenta with resulting hemorrhage and shock.

Babies exposed to cocaine in the womb do not nurse well or cuddle, can be irritable and unresponsive. Many babies born to cocaine-using mothers are born in withdrawal and suffer seizures.

Using marijuana during pregnancy can result in low birth weight and features similar to FAS, can cause tremors at birth, neurological problems, seizures, abnormal visual responses.

Tobacco smoke contains more than 2,000 different chemicals that cross the placenta and end up in the fetal bloodstream. The amount of oxygen available to the fetus is reduced, the risk of miscarriage increased. The chance of death within one year also increases.

Babies born to mothers who smoke suffer from higher levels of infant heart and lung disease, growth retardation and low birth weight.

Pregnant women who smoke two or more packs per day risk FAS-type problems in the fetus. Tobacco is the most damaging in the last six months of pregnancy.

Echols hopes to impress upon pregnant women or those who are considering having children that FAS is preventable, if they stop consuming alcohol before they conceive and throughout their pregnancies.

"A woman who uses alcohol or any other drugs should avoid pregnancy until she is certain she can abstain for the entire time, from conception to birth," Echols said.

"She is her baby's only protection and she should be able to provide a safe environment as it develops in her womb."

Cave vandals are convicted, ordered to repair damages

Six Roswell residents and two juveniles were required to pay \$4,345 in fines and court costs for destruction of cave formations on their outing to Fort Stanton Cave last August.

U.S. Magistrate Wayne Jordon sentenced the eight on November 17, and also required them to perform community service work.

Rangers from the Bureau of Land Management, which supervises the cave, were called by Lincoln County Sheriff's Department officials. They had been alerted by members of the Cave Resources Foundation, who were at the cave performing research studies.

The rangers, with the help of deputies, confiscated illegal drugs and mineral formations from the intruders.

In four of the cases, the community service work will cover the

restoration of mineral formations in Fort Stanton. This is the first time restoration has been ordered by any court in the United States for vandalism in a protected cave, according to BLM officials.

Those sentenced were: Lawrence R. Cain, Mark Cole and Duane K. Dahse for possession of illegal drugs and failure to obtain a recreation permit; Benjamin D. Lane for possession of illegal drugs, removing cave formations and failure to obtain a recreation permit; Joe Olivares for removing cave formations and failure to obtain a recreation permit; and Jeremy L. Perkins for failure to obtain a recreation permit.

Two juvenile males were ordered to perform community service for removing cave formations and failure to obtain a recreation permit.

With the passage of the Federal

Cave Resources Protection Act, significant caves are protected from improper use to preserve them for the enjoyment and benefit of all people, according to BLM officials.

One of the most important aspects of caves is hydrology, the relationship with groundwater for recharge. Caves also provide roosting areas for bats, contain historical or prehistoric artifacts, as well as fossils and mineral formations.

Penalties for persons who destroy, disturb, mar, alter, remove or harm a significant cave or alter the free movement of animals or plants locate in caves on federal land will be subject to fines in excess of \$100,000 or up to one year in prison under federal law.

Persons who possess, consume, sell, barter or exchange any cave resource from federal lands are subject to the same penalties.



procedure to the board so that the board could understand the smallness of the problem.

One elderly board member said people have told her this is one of the best equipped hospital and wanted that reported to the board. Many of the major capital equipment purchases have been possible because of money raised by a special property tax through the county.

Miller said Presbyterian Hospital Service in Albuquerque has decided to close its hospital in that city as an inpatient facility and make it an outpatient facility and office support.

She said changes in Albuquerque have resulted in the identification of about 325 person reduction in staff. She said the company is offering early retirement as an option, or they can quit. She said Albuquerque had more than 2,000 acute inpatient beds and by the year 2000, they will need about 600.

"That is dramatically being seen in Albuquerque ahead of many parts of the country," the effect of managed care and managed competition," Miller said.

In other business, Miller said LCMC is aggressively recruiting an orthopedic surgeon.

"She's about six months old and won't get very big," said shelter manager Esther Harper. "She's been here two months and was found wandering with her brother when they both were pups."

"They appear to be shepherds, possibly with some Rhodesian ridgeback blood, judging by the way the hair sits on her spine. She has brown eyes and a predomi-

nantly black coat."

Shelter secretary Kathy Tetreault named Angel because she is obedient and gets along well with everybody, although she has learned to be aggressive at feeding time.

"But when other dogs are being aggressive, she stays away," Tetreault said. "She'll just sit to the side. She and Panda (a long-haired, small shepherd mix, also with brown brows, who has been in the shelter since she was a pup and is sponsored) and great friends."

Angel's brother still is a shelter resident.

A big friendly black Labrador/retriever mix is housed in one of the outside kennels.

Fred is about one and a half years old and already is neutered. He was released by his owner, who said Fred needs a yard with a secure fence, because he likes to roam.

"He has lots of energy and is very playful," Harper said. "He's very lovable and would be a great dog with a little obedience training. He's good with kids, but because of his size would do better with older children. He's eager for a family."

The shelter also is temporary home for a female black lab and her two daughters.

Five former featured pets still waiting for someone to love and care for them are Moe, an Australian shepherd mix with a big smile; Brandy, a shepherd mix with a striking red coat and bronze eyes; Sandy, a lively and sweet collie mix; Sander, a buff-color terrier

who's all heart; and Bravo, a good-looking and intelligent cattle dog mix with one blue and one brown eye.

Donated coffee and pastries will be served, special gifts from area merchants will go along with each adoption that day.



State official issues permit for landfill

Environment Secretary Judith Espinosa has issued a Solid Waste Facility Permit for a regional landfill to serve Otero and Lincoln counties. The landfill will be located west of U.S. Highway 54, approximately 24 miles south of Alamogordo, and will occupy ap-

proximately 92 acres. A public hearing on the proposed landfill was conducted August 13, in Alamogordo. The facility design incorporates a state-of-the-art pollution control system including a composite liner and leachate collection system, as well as stormwater retention ponds to prevent runoff

from the landfill areas. The expected life of the facility is 50 years. The permit was issued to the Otero/Lincoln County Solid Waste Authority for 20 years, with review of the facility and its operation by the Department at least every ten years.

Several members of the Warriors gained recognition in the district, with Byron Soules making the first team in all-district; and Kevin Pellman and Rex Comanche making the second team.

John Echols, David Eisenbrown, Sergio Guerrero, Terry Brandon and Jimmy Varnadore gained honorable mention for the all-district team.

Torres was named to the New Mexico All Stars team.

Gaston, with the help of coaches Donny Wylie and Bryan Tarvin, presented certificates to the members of the varsity team and the team managers and filmers.

Dathan Hull, who films games for the Warriors, was presented a special award by Ruidoso Middle School coaches Borde Williams and Herman Fox, who praised him for his commitment and dedication in serving as a team manager since the eighth grade.

Kent Beatty, golf coach, was master of ceremonies for the evening which also honored the members of the freshman (JV-B) team and the eighth grade team.

In the beginning of the evening, Gaston had a list of people to thank. He turned the program over to guest speaker, Jim Bradley, head football coach at Roswell High School.

Bradley spoke to the football players, their friends and families about the winning attitude that has helped his teams win 200 games during his 10 years in Roswell.

"I'm a survivor," said Bradley, who was fired at NMSU, left coaching for a time and then went to Roswell in 1980. Since then he's racked

up a record of 200 wins, 95 losses and nine ties.

"That's a lot of kickoffs," said Bradley, who stressed attitude and discipline throughout his 10-minute talk.

"Athletics is the last place you can still discipline players ... and they'll say they like it ... they want it," said Bradley.

He said he has a friend who coaches the Lubbock Estacado team, and their two teams scrimmage each year.

"Playing that team is a real pleasure ... he's developed good people," said Bradley, commenting that Estacado is a mostly-black school. He noted that "those people," apparently speaking of African-Americans, are great athletes and good runners, probably because of their hamstringing.

Bradley went on to talk about the many benefits of playing football, including learning how to be a team player.

On teamwork, Bradley said football is the greatest team game. Noting that the soccer team was

having its award banquet elsewhere on Thursday, Bradley indicated that soccer just doesn't measure up to his sport.

Another sports banquet, honoring the volleyball team, reportedly took place sometime last week, but The News wasn't notified.

Their work was selected from among hundreds sent in by teachers whose classes were participating in the Very Special Arts New Mexico program.









New Mexico Portfolio Writing Assessment


Percent of Students at Each Holistic Score


New Mexico Portfolio Writing Assessment


MEAN ACT COMPOSITE SCORES BY YEAR College Bound Students

1992-93 Iowa Test of Basic Skills


National Percentile Scores By Test Area


National Percentile Scores By Test Area

Lawmakers' motto: spend now, save later


Some state lawmakers are scrambling for an excuse to keep that six-cent gasoline tax that took effect July 1. Turns out the state didn't really NEED the new tax, which will bring about \$50 million into the general fund and \$8 million to road construction.

Why give back a tax increase that's already been enacted? After all, state government desperately needs money in some areas — like Social Services. That money could be used by Health and Human Services for a wide range of programs, such as child care, abuse prevention, nutrition, substance abuse treatment, domestic violence shelters and family counseling. Sounds good. An Albuquerque lawmaker said: "If we catch a lot of problems we have ... we'll save money in the future."

But, the way the state spends money, it's doubtful any of that money would ever reach the state's needy people who need those services. Human Services is often in a money crunch, and it's no wonder. It's the agency that just entered into a lease for a brand new building here in Ruidoso. With state funds, to help the poorest of the poor, Human Services budgeted to increase its annual rent from the current level of \$13,000 to \$37,800; then: requested proposals for a building, turned down the lower bid and opted for a 10-year lease that will cost taxpayers \$700,000. Immediately, when Human Services moves from the Stroud Building into its brand new building, the rent will go from \$13,000 to \$61,000. It takes some pretty deep pockets to triple office rent, and then go over budget by almost half again. It's going to take a lot of gasoline tax to make up that increase in rent!

State officials in Ruidoso a few weeks ago were proud of their record of renegotiating hundreds of state leases. All the leases that were reviewed by a reporter showed big increases in costs to taxpayers — none reflected decreases. The huge hit taxpayers are taking here in Ruidoso may be only the tip of the iceberg.

So, when elected officials claim they're taking this new tax to HELP the needy of this state, it's beyond belief. It may be time for "New Mexico Proposition Six" as the voters way of persuading state lawmakers to give back that six-cent tax!

One of them is the fact that we in Capitan and you in Ruidoso have to pay long distance rates to be able to talk to one another. One does not even need to go to Otero County to realize the injustice imposed by the phone company; you can communicate with Mescalero, crossing county lines without a toll call. Mescalero is farther away from Ruidoso than Alto from Capitan. When State Corporation Com-

missioner Louis Gallegos visited Ruidoso last August, I brought the matter to his attention. After this discussion, I believe that it will take a community effort in Lincoln County — the portions served by GTE — to get something done in this respect; perhaps the collection of signatures or a letter writing project. The persons to address are: Commissioner Louis E. Gallegos, 1-800-244-6702 or 827-4531; or Telecommunications Director Joan Ellis, 827-4496.

Both are at the State Corporation Commission, PO Drawer 1269, Santa Fe NM 87504-1269. The matter of the prizing of in-state long distance calls is in the same category and should be addressed to the same commission. Both issues, however, may be expensive to handle since telephone company lawyers are usually well paid. There may be other issues that have to be channeled into the same direction. **Bernhard E. F.
