equipment, there just needs to be a note that the local representative who's entitled to a commission is Puckett."

However, Beauvais agreed with Wynham that a way to avoid any problems would be for Puckett not to be involved in gathering price quotes when Becker is competing. The process could be handled by the manager's office.

## PUCKETT'S REACTION

Puckett was exasperated with the reaction of the commissioners and Wynham.

"I tell you quite frankly what it's getting down to is that they probably will have to find themselves a chief," he said. "I'm just tired of this crap, you know. This is a volunteer job and if you've got to put up with this type of harassment from your own county commissioners."

Wilton Howell sells to the county, too. The ambulance just bought four new tires from him and all kinds of things like this. So if there's a question there, it would be one for a commissioner, too."

Wynham confirmed that the county has bought \$2,859.50 in goods from Howell's One Stop Auto business since January.

"I don't know what Wilton has done to declare any potential conflict, but there have been many times he has said 'don't even do business with me' after he came on board," Wynham said. "He did a lot of business with us before (being elected). He generally discourages the business. The difference here is, though, that he's not involved in the purchasing process. And that's the only thing I'm concerned about with Mr. Puckett, that he collected the prices. I don't care if he sells us 100 fire trucks."

Howell said he didn't know that a conflict form would be required in his case since he has never solicited business from the county.

"I told Cupit I would rather not do any business with the road department," Howell said. "The only time One Stop was ever involved, I assume bids were taken. I never signed a check or solicited business."

"If I've done anything wrong, I would sure correct it and challenge anyone else to do the same thing. I will contact the county attorney to find out, and I think we need to come up with a policy on this situation."

## MOREL'S MEMO

In a memorandum to Howell Friday, county attorney Alan Morel said that it is legal for the county to continue to do business with One Stop. He recommended Howell obtain a waiver of conflict from the commission.

Due to the fact that commissioners occasionally do, in the ordinary course of their business, appropriate business, this could be construed as participating directly or indirectly in a procurement and as such, subjecting them to the procurement code's unlawful participation provision, Morel wrote.

It is my understanding that Commissioner Howell's business has in the past provided either services and/or supplies to the county. Due to this fact, I believe that it would be wise to obtain a waiver to avoid even the appearance of impropriety.

The criteria for a waiver includes that the employee already has publicly disclosed the conflict, that he/she can perform without bias and that allowing the employee to continue is in the best interests of the state or local body.

Commissioner Howell's participation in the procurement process is rare and highly unlikely, however, possible, Morel wrote. "Due to this remote possibility, I recommend that a proper waiver be prepared and presented to the commission at its next regular meeting (Tuesday)."

## NO PROBLEM

Puckett said he doesn't see any problem with the procedures he has been following.

"No. They're sort of cutting off their nose to spite their face, because anything that my fire department gets from my company is cost plus shipping. They get it cheaper than anyone else can buy it," Puck-

ett said. "And I don't get commissions on it. Not on my own fire department."

"The only thing I can think of is if they are so concerned, they can just find a new fire chief."

"Really, if they would let the fire departments run the fire departments and kept their nose out of it, this county would get along a lot better, believe me."

"The whole problem stems back to the county doesn't like to be caught making mistakes. That's what I'm constantly doing, and they think I'm a thorn in their side. And I was told that just two weeks ago by the county manager."

No one disputes that Puckett's relationship with Becker could pose a conflict of interest.

## STATE LAW

The state procurement code defines an employee as "an individual receiving a salary, wage or per diem and mileage from a state agency or local public body whether elected or not and any non-compensated individual performing personal services as an elected or appointed official or otherwise for a state agency or a local public body."

That would seem to cover volunteer firefighters and fire chiefs.

Under another subsection entitled "Unlawful employee participation prohibited," the code specifies that it is unlawful for any employee "to participate directly or indirectly in a procurement when the employee knows that the employee or any member of the employee's immediate family has a financial interest in the business seeking or obtaining a contract."

Receiving commissions from a company would seem to constitute a financial interest.

Over the last two years, county records show \$5,447 in sales from Becker and a recent purchase of a \$63,640 fire truck by the Lincoln Fire Department.

State Fire Marshal Bob Baca told The News that he doesn't recall hearing of other arrangements in the state where a fire chief represents an equipment company that may sell to his department or others in the county.

But Puckett said the situation is not unusual. He cited Frank Deuble, owner of Independent Fire Company and a fire chief.

Contacted by The News, Deuble said his title of chief is only honorary.

"I'm really public information officer," he said. "I have no decision making powers. In fact, I stepped down years ago when I became a businessman. But there's still a perception of conflict from time to time."

In reference to changing the way bids are collected when Becker is involved in Lincoln County purchases, Deuble said, "I think that's the way it ought to be when you're ordering something for your department."

Baca said the situation is a close call.

"That's a thin line," he said. "A man has a right to earn a living, but where there may be a conflict is when he purchases for his department and it doesn't follow purchasing procedure. But the county is the fiscal agent and I cautioned them to determine if he is following county procedures and the procurement code."

"He shouldn't be going out buying stuff," Baca added.

## COMPLETE CONTROL

He doesn't understand why county officials were confused about their jurisdiction over volunteer fire departments.

"They are in complete control of fire departments, the governing agency," Baca said. "They created them by law. The fire marshal can't create them. The law says the districts will be governed by the county commissions that created them."

Specifically, the statute states that districts will be recognized and funded by the fire marshal after, "the county fire district has maintained an official fire department for a period of at least one year, established and governed by appropriate resolution of the board of commissioners of the county...."

"So a fire department is just as much a department of county government as the road depart-

ment," Baca said. "The fire departments don't receive funding from us. The county receives it."

Baca said commissioners can adopt their own policy to cover the situation.

"They can make their policy more restrictive than state requirements, if they choose," he said.

Howell said even if Puckett's actions have been legal, "in my opinion, they're not right."

Initially, he was under the impression that since volunteer firemen are considered employees of the county, existing county policy already would prohibit conflicts of interest.

"We don't allow our road manager to represent a fire company and handle the bids for tires on our trucks," he said. "I don't think he should be handled any differently than any other department. The problem in the past has been that we didn't know the nature of the relationship between the commission and the volunteer fire departments."

But after researching the county purchasing policy, Wynham said it makes no reference to conflicts, "so state law would rule" unless the commission approves a new procedure.

## RECENT DISCUSSION

Wynham said the subject of the relationship between the county and the volunteer departments came up during a recent meeting with Puckett and other fire personnel.

The fire chiefs were surprised to hear of the county's jurisdiction and challenged his statement, saying "that can't be right," Wynham told The News.

"I told them look, don't argue with me. Call the state fire marshal. You have that argument at that level. I'm telling you he says we have the authority. He believes we govern the fire departments. That was the statement he made. I didn't go looking for it. The county commissioners aren't trying to find some new thing to control."

"We don't want any of the fire departments when this gets into the paper to misread that intent. We never asked for it. It came out as the result of the actions of one fire chief. The thing gets looked at and the next thing you know, you've got the fire marshal saying hey, you commissioners have responsibility for this."

Wynham said county officials have wondered in the past why the county was liable if a fire department was sued, yet they had no authority.

"I'm not suggesting that anything has been done that was wrong, but it's not enough to be above board," Wynham said. "Public employees or those connected with local government have to avoid the appearance of impropriety."

"For instance, if I was a gun dealer, I'd stay away from any sales to the county sheriff's department. It wouldn't be worth it."

Filing a statement of potential conflict of interest with the state doesn't change that situation, Wynham said.

## PRIOR QUESTIONS

This isn't the first time someone has questioned the propriety of Puckett's dual roles and relationship with Becker.

Fonda Hazel, former purchasing agent for the Village of Ruidoso, raised questions when Puckett represented the company in a successful bid to sell the village a mid-size pumper truck. Apparently, the specifications had been drawn with input from Puckett and Becker officials, she said.

District Attorney Bert Atkins ultimately referred the question to then village attorney Dave Thomssen, who noted that Puckett was not a paid employee and that it was not necessarily unlawful for a prospective bidder to participate in drawing up bid specifications.

Atkins said some suggestions by Thomssen about how to avoid impropriety included conducting pre-bid conferences with all prospective bidders participating and to include language allowing different, but equal features in the equipment.

"When I read about the situation with the city, I thought that if there is a conflict, the county was the place," Wynham said. "It was dis-

cussed and the commissioners raised the question to the attorney, nothing formal in writing, who said the guy is allowed to do business. Our policy is so open ended. Perhaps a simply modification of the policy in general would be that when it gets to written quotes, they all be sent directly to the finance department."

Other questions were raised at that time, such as whether the fact that Puckett eventually will receive state retirement could be considered compensation. However, even that point appears moot in light of the state statute that stretches the definition of employee to cover non-compensated or per diem persons.

## MONTES COMMENTS

"Puckett already had this problem with Ruidoso about a year ago," Montes said. "The former commission discussed it and we thought there was a problem then. I think the legal opinion we got at the time was that he was not violating anything. He was using poor judgment and continues to do so and now we are going to have to do some judgments for him."

## DEBT TO VOLUNTEERS

Wynham said the county owes its volunteers a debt of gratitude.

"We need them. I don't argue that at all," he said. "But now that we know we have more authority over their operations, the commission should set a policy on this."

"I know the kinds of restrictions that need to be placed, which will allow him to continue in his position as fire chief and with Becker. They will protect him and us in light of what could be done."

"Usually the policies that deal with conflict seldom preclude a person from doing business, but they simply make sure that he discloses that he has that conflict,"

## THE ISSUE

"The issue here ... I don't think this is so much an issue of a law being broken or a policy ignored ... I think it's an issue of good judgment."

"Good judgment says that if I want to participate in the process and I represent a bidder, that I create some system so that I'm not the one collecting the bid prices. I think that's where the question comes up, especially if I have a chance of winning that bid, especially by \$1.

"I want to make sure my hands are clean. Let someone else collect the other prices and we give all of them to the county manager and let him find the best."

Although his role came under scrutiny with the village bid, until last week Puckett had never been questioned by county officials, Wynham said.

"In all fairness to Mr. Puckett, no one has called him in and said stop doing this, don't do this, until my meeting with him last week," he said. "It just came up in discussion with him and some of his fire department members about what I thought my authorities were and I said well, let's talk about purchases."

"That's the first time I've ever expressed to them that there are some things they need to think about."

## STRUCTURE POLICY

Wynham said he will be structuring a proposed policy or amendment to cover the situation.

"One on one, the various commissioners have given me the authority to try to come up with something to cover this one incident," he said. "You can't build a policy that will cover everything, but I feel I have the latitude to come up with something after talking to Mr. Puckett."

"It may be a simple matter of asking Mr. Puckett in the future with fire department purchases to allow us to collect the prices."

Atkins said Puckett could request a waiver of unlawful employee participation from the commission as provided in the state procurement code.

He concluded, "There are ways to utilize Mr. Puckett's knowledge to the benefit of the county, if done appropriately."

benefits from his city's campground because visitors shop here.

But Howell disagreed. He contended most people buy their supplies in Alamogordo and then come to the mountains. They camp out in sleeping bags and they drain the county's services, he said.

"That's one of the hottest spots in the summer for calls to the sheriff's department," Montes said.

Stockwell said the county should put a toll booth at the entrance to the road and charge all users.

"We'd be happy to pay," he said. "Either that, or we could put up a sign that says travel at your own risk," Howell retorted.

In a more serious vein, Stockwell offered \$200,000 toward the \$600,000 cost estimate offered by Cupit for work needed on the road. The road manager said the route is not on the county's maintenance list now, but as a courtesy, he plows the road to keep it open in the winter.

Forest service officials said they could put the road on their five-year forest highway plan, but they don't have money for maintenance work.

"I'm not willing to take over that road unless we have some type of agreement where you each put something in the pot each year, so in 20 years we don't have big problem," Howell said to Stockwell and Poague.

"If the long term objective is to try to get Lincoln County to take over long term maintenance, then I would think rather than the right of way going from the city to the forest service to the county, it should go directly from the city to the county," Rivers said.

"The forest highway program requires that it be a public agency jurisdiction."

"We keep talking a long term solution, but if we get down the road 20-30 years after this is paved, I'd only agree to a long term proposition like this if we had some assistance," Howell said.

"I agree with you and I would share your concern in your seat, but I don't think we've ever had that option. I don't think we could get away with that," Poague said.

But Rivers didn't rule out such an arrangement.

She said she would look into the possibility of contributing toward maintenance on a continuing basis.

"One of the reasons this road has been a maintenance problem, at least the portion by the lake, is that the grade on that thing is virtually flat, zero to two percent," Rivers said. "There's no crown, there's no water runoff. That's part of the reason that road won't hold up and water is the biggest problem."

If the road was rebuilt, it should be done to a standard the county could maintain, Wynham said. For instance, the road to Sierra Blanca Regional airport from State Highway 37 is great, but to fog seal it once is equal to about one tenth of the county's annual road budget.

"It becomes too burdensome to the county," Wynham said.

Rivers said she doesn't see a super highway in the area, just better design, construction and shoulders.

"Because the existing road is not constructed right definitely has contributed to the high cost of maintenance," Rivers said.

"I will look into the possibility of what type of long term commitment we could make, if any, as far as maintenance and annual cost," she said.

Poague asked if the service had any flexibility to help out with the potholes.

"That might be a possibility," Rivers responded. "I could check that out, what we've got in there. It's not a lot."

Rivers said she's responsible for 2,000 miles in Lincoln forest's system of roads. The service receives \$400,000 for all work and personnel.

"We have one blade, one dozer, one back hoe, one truck for roads that go from Carlsbad to Ancho," she said.

In the last few years, the service tried to bolster some crumbling road edges around Bonito, she said.

Poague encouraged both city and county officials to lobby state and federal agencies. Bonito Lake's status as a municipal watershed should enhance chances to snag some money, he said.

"It looks to me under our budget, we can't come up with the big bucks and the city can't come up with big bucks and Lincoln County can't come up with big bucks," he said.

"If we're really going to do a thorough job all the way through, I think the forest highway approach is the way to go in the long run. Some of these other things could be done in the interim."

"It's been mentioned that some of the land along the road (owned by the city) may be coming up for sale. It makes sense that the more of the road (owned by the forest service), the more it's going to stack up in priorities for the big bucks, won't stack up if there's that piece of ground in the middle breaking up this multi-million dollar project."

"If we had the right of way all the way through or the county did, then you could really compete, because it's recreation, a lake, a municipal watershed, which carries a hell of a lot of weight with everybody nowadays," Poague said.

The lack of controversy and competing interest in the Timberon area was a factor that help the service secure the money for road and other improvements there, he said.

Wynham said while he appreciated Stockwell's commitment from the city for \$200,000, "I notice that we got the proposal and didn't make a commitment back."

"I want to be real clear on that. I have to give these ideas to the county commission in terms of what direction we could go."

It's difficult when a project demands coordination with other government entities, especially the federal government and the multitude of studies it requires, he said.

"As an administrator, at least have some direction to shoot for," Wynham said. "I'm still not real clear on your funding process (by forest service representatives). I understand the city's and the county's."

He told Stockwell the county isn't ready for the city to begin getting the right of way ready for a transfer to the county.

"We're not ready to commit that we'll take that right of way," he said.

To illustrate his point that the county is not responsible for the road, Wynham said if he sent a crew out tomorrow to rip up the asphalt, would anybody stop him?

"In terms of assigning responsibility, you've got to understand that's very important. If we don't have the authority to do what we want on the road, it's not our road," he said.

"It's not our road. We recognize that you (the city) control certain things up there and you (the forest service) control certain things up there. It's not like a county road where we can just go and do."

"We hear the county ought to do this, the city ought to do that, the forest service ought to do that. The county couldn't do anything, because another entity controls that road."

Rivers said the forest service has an easement "which means we have the right to control and maintain our investment. And so if you were to come in and tear it up, we'd object."

"We have the right to maintain that road, but don't have the responsibility," Poague said.

"Do we have the right to maintain that road," Wynham pressed.

"It's still the city's," Poague replied. "We just have an easement."

"There is a clear definition that the entities here today have control of portions of that road and the county has none. That's why we haven't participated in the maintenance of that road," Wynham.

"What do you think the chances are that the state might add the road to its system?" Rivers asked. "Absolutely none," Wynham said.

"They're trying to give us 14 miles right now on State Highway 214 and Devil's Canyon Road," Schwetzmann said.

Rivers said she will check her budget to see if the service can help with any maintenance work this year and look at a long term commitment and required environmental studies.

The drawback to the forest highway program is that it would be five years before the road would receive attention, Howell said.

"Maybe even longer," he added.



## Commissioners set for long day

Pack a lunch, maybe a dinner, for the Lincoln County Commission meeting Tuesday.

The agenda is packed with items that promise to be interesting and, at times, exciting. The meeting will begin at 9 a.m. in the commission room of the county courthouse in Carrizozo.

Leslie Cone, Roswell district manager for the Bureau of Land Management, is scheduled to be on hand for an update on the Rio Bonito transfer that raised commission blood pressures last month.

Commissioners said bureau officials had changed the stakes after agreeing to a settlement of a dispute over the bureau acquisition of four privately-owned parcels along the Rio Bonito.

A discussion is scheduled concerning the county's responsibility

for volunteer fire departments.

Commissioners recently learned they are responsible for governing the departments (see related story on page 1A).

A connected issue of how to handle bids on equipment when conflicts of interest are involved will be reviewed in connection with Bonito volunteer fire chief Howard Packett. Commissioner Wilton Howell also is scheduled to ask the commission for a waiver of conflict of interest in cases where equipment may be purchased from his business, One Stop Auto.

A report is scheduled on the county's attempt to file a quiet title action on the county fairground in Capitan. No chain of ownership could be found in county land records.

An update on the latest attempt to find money to install sidewalks in the settlement of Lincoln will be

given by county manager Andy Wynham.

Other items on the agenda include:

—a public hearing on a proposed ordinance that would amend the county's subdivision regulations, especially in connection to construction of roads and other improvements by developers.

—a public hearing on proposed Community Development Block Grant programs.

—a protest by Commissioner Stirling Spencer of the plan to reintroduce the Mexican gray wolf.

—comments by Noel Kallett on the mandatory waste collection fees charged by the Lincoln County Solid Waste Authority.

—a salary increase request for employees by the county assessor, clerk, sheriff and treasurer.

—a discussion about the pay matrix for sheriff's deputies.



# Lights prepare the way for worshippers

**Early Spanish Christmas customs**  
 This is being sent to you in mid-morning of the second day of December, the sacred month. And as I look out at the piñon, cedar and all the other of Mother Nature's Christmas decorations, my thoughts go back to the Christmas customs of the early Spanish pioneers.  
 Outstanding among these Christmas features were the "luminarios" or lighters of the way and to the "naciemientos" or nativity scenes.  
 Let us go over something about the luminarios; on Christmas Eve travelers and wanderers through the land were lighted to the way to the church for midnight mass. One method was to sharpen sticks of pitched pine and drive them into the ground all around the church and along the pathway leading to the door; then these were lighted rustic torches blazing in the night.  
 Another method was to build a fire on a hill

or the highest point near the church. Old-timers use to tell me of building a fire on the high hill just north of San Patricio on Christmas Eve, lighting the way to travelers that midnight Mass was to be held at the church of San Patricio.

**Modern day luminario**

One type of luminario handed down from old traditions is popular today in the Southwest especially in New Mexico.  
 A paper bag is filled half full of sand, and a lighted candle placed inside. The sand holds the candle upright and the bag open. These are placed along walks to doorways and on edges of roofs.  
 The electrical Christmas lights of today are modern lighters of the way announcing the approach of the birth of our infant, Lord and Savior.

**Naciemientos the manger scene**

The Nativity scene handed down from pioneer times takes many forms in which the gift of the Spanish for making good use of the material at hand, shows forth.

In one form, live human figures and stable animals appear on the roofs with fires nearby. This scene was usually in a settled community or on the roadside nearby. Another form featured figures carved out of wood about half life size. Sometimes a small cavern was hollowed out of a clay bank by the roadside and figures placed inside. So the sacred assemblage of Joseph, Mary and the Christ child could be seen in a small cave up on the side of a cliff lighted by a candle.

Some of the most original are made from evergreen branches fashioned into rustic shelters representing the stable and manger. I will tell you about one of these later on.

Let us thank the Lord for the reminder of December, the sacred month, and let us count all of our blessings.

Mrs. Keeler had lived in Ruidoso for 20 years after moving here from Waco, Texas.


She married Gordon Keeler on August 8, 1938, in Corsicana.

# Warrior boys foul out in Tulie

The Ruidoso Warriors boys basketball team lost a heartbreaker in the season opener Friday, 71-60, at Tularosa.

The Wildcats improved to 1-1 on the season while the Warriors are 0-1.

The start of the game saw the Wildcats move out to a 10-0 lead before the Warriors broke the ice with two free throws from senior Jeff Chapman.

Turnovers plagued the Warriors for the first four minutes of the game — in fact, Ruidoso got off just three shots at the goal during that span.

But with the departure of the first-game jitters, Ruidoso ended the quarter trailing 13-9 and went into the intermission leading the Wildcats by one, 26-25.

Both teams battled fairly evenly in the third quarter with Tularosa taking a one-point advantage into the final stanza, 47-46.

Seemingly, things were going Ruidoso's way until midway through the fourth quarter. At that point, Murphy's Law took over — big time.

With first-year head coach Paul Kirkwood's first running, pressing man-to-man style of basketball going in high gear, the Warriors new-found aggressiveness took its toll, as five players fouled out during the final four minutes of the game.

Senior post-man Casey Kearns was the first to go. Kearns hadn't been the offensive spark that he will be later in the season, but his defense and hard work on the press was spectacular.

Two first-quarter fouls had Kearns in foul trouble early, and number five came at a time when

the Warriors had taken the momentum away from the Wildcats.

Nonetheless, Kearns had to sit down for the rest of the game.

Corvin Lester, another senior, was next. Like Kearns, Lester's best effort had come in the backcourt. Things were getting serious, the Warriors were in the lead, but two starters were now on the bench.

Despite those losses, Kirkwood and the young Warriors were still confident. The Warriors were nursing a four-point lead with 3:30 left in the game — everything was going to be OK.

Then the Warriors suffered the crushing blow that would eventually cause their demise. When sophomore Cory Hood fouled on two absolutely, positively, terrible calls — followed shortly thereafter by junior Daniel Espinosa — it was "good night sweet prince" for the Warriors.

Senior J.R. Chino followed his teammates to the bench with a minute or so left, but by that time the game was out of reach.

Hood, Espinosa and Chino had played their best-ever games for the Warriors. All had contributed in an effort that saw the Warriors trail, and come back to take the lead, in dramatic fashion.

But the bottom line was that Ruidoso put Tularosa on the free throw line more than 50 times in the game. The Wildcats didn't shoot well from the line in the early going, but they did when the game was on the line, eventually converting on more than 30 attempts — almost half of their points.

Seniors Jeff Chapman and J.R. Chino led the way for the Warriors in scoring with 12 points each.

Sophomores Cory Hood and Rex Comanche each scored 11 points; followed by Daniel Espinosa and Casey Kearns with six. Corvin Lester scored two points in his first varsity game.

While the loss was tough to take, it was certainly obvious that the Warriors have made a real turnaround.

Considering that four of the five starters fouled out; that last year's leading scorer Raul Davis did not play for disciplinary reasons; and that the Warriors shot a dismal 18-35 from the free throw line — things should get better.

From the tipoff to the final buzzer, the Ruidoso kids were a blur. Of course there were plenty of fouls, but by far the majority of those were good, hustling fouls.

The Warriors honestly played their hearts out.

Ruidoso lost the game but won a big battle — with themselves. They were competitive and they never gave up. It was a refreshing sight.

The JV team dropped its first non-tournament game of the year to the Wildcats 55-35.

Again, Byron Soules led the way in the scoring department with a 12-point effort for three quarters. Matt Norbury riddled in 10 points followed by Randy Randolph, 6; Erik Kakuska, 4; Danny Schrader, 2; and John Montero, 1.

The Varsity must now prepare for two December tournaments before returning to the regular season in January.

The team will travel to Moriarty for the Bruce King Classic next weekend and will again go to the Lovington Invitational after Christmas.

The JV gets the rest of the month to practice for a rematch with Tularosa on January 4.

"We held services at a local retirement home for two years in a ministry to the elderly, taking no offerings," said Whitlock, who filled that position for a year and a half.

Meanwhile, he has continued his voice training, including three and a half years with a former professional opera singer.

"I had four years experience leading worship, two years of full-time preaching, and did special singing at various churches," said Whitlock.

The Whitlocks have two sons, Caleb, born November 1989, and Jordan, July 1992.

"I have felt God's call to serve in

an evangelistic singing ministry," says Whitlock, adding that this has been confirmed by many ministers, professionals, and encouraged by his family and friends.

"It is my heart to share the Word in song. I strive to be a man everywhere to appropriate faith through the salvation offered through the blood of Jesus," Whitlock.

"I speak to all Christians about their continual need for the Savior."

# Recurring problems are reviewed in annual meeting

## School reps meet with Indian parents

More counseling services topped the list of needs compiled during an annual meeting of Ruidoso school officials with Mescalero parents, educators and liaison staff.

"We think of different federal programs, we will try to meet this list, starting with the number one priority," district superintendent Mike Gladden told school board members and the 16 people assembled at the meeting Thursday.

The number of parents attending was lower than last year, validating the eighth-ranked need for better communication between school staff and Native Americans about meetings and other significant events.

Assistant high school principal

Danny Flores said the meeting was announced, but notes were not sent home with the older students, because they seldom are delivered.

Officials said notices were posted in the Mescalero community, but one woman said she called several parents and they were not aware of the session.

Paul Wirth, director of support services for the district, reported on some of the actions taken since last year's meeting.

"A needs assessment is wonderful, but without implementation has no impact, he said.

The number one priority last year, promotion of the Mescalero culture using tribal elders in the schools, occurs at several schools during Native American week.

Another accomplishment since

last year has been the compilation of a multi-cultural resource directory, which covers 24 different topics such as Mescalero Apache food, history, arts and crafts.

About half of the directory is complete, the rest of the topics should be finished by next summer, he said.

Two open houses were conducted in Mescalero by school officials this past year, which was the third priority last year and again this year, with an emphasis on improving attendance.

A problem with transportation, number six last year, moved up to number four this year.

Transportation of some students who technically live in the Tularosa school district, but are driven into Ruidoso by their parents, remains a

split into three groups to come up with priorities, then voted to rank the issues they want to see the administration focus on over the next year. The need for more counseling led the list.

problem that needs to be resolved, parents said. Often, families are split, with some children going to Tularosa and others to Ruidoso.

A need for more emphasis on career planning and school class choices, on the priority list last year, reappeared this year.

Better communication between the high school staff and Native Americans about the opportunity for training, summer school and other programs was ranked in seventh place.

Second on the list was to encourage more Native American leadership programs.

Fifth ranked was the need for more parental support for students.

Improving the study skills of some Native American students was at number six.

Other priorities in descending order of ranking included:

- developing long and short range plans for students
- promoting mutual respect among the entire school community.
- developing an Apache-related center.
- incorporating the cultural history of Native American into the curriculum.
- raising the level of cultural awareness, encouraging respect for cultural diversity.

Although some parents wanted to see more emphasis on the Mescalero Apache language, Chris Apache pointed out that would ignore Navajo and other types of Apaches.

Consultant Karen Tillman said since the Apache and Navajo languages are similar, a course could include all of them. The Native American media center also will cover different cultures, she said.

Wirth also handed out copies of a synopsis report on the Title V and Title VII programs dealing with the Mescalero, which was part of the accreditation review.

The accreditation official noted that members of the Indian Parent Committee and parents are concerned that their involvement and input is limited to the federal supplemental programs serving Native American students and not to the basic instructional program and operations.

They also wanted school officials not to interpret as a lack of parental involvement what they contended were barriers to participation, such as the lack of transportation and problems with language, empowerment, articulation and sophistication.





A stone's throw from the rippling dunes of White Sands National Monument, Ruidoso is just over a couple of hours from El Paso, Texas, as the crow flies. Rambunctious Billy the Kid used to roam this territory, and there's no doubt that the Old West is still alive and kicking here. In fact, the largest landholder is the Mescalero Apache tribe. Regarded as the richest Native American tribe in the country, the Mescaleros own the ski area and one of America's top-rated luxury golf resorts, the Inn of the Mountain Gods Resort.

Ruidoso's central business district has none of the trademark adobe buildings typical of Santa Fe and Taos; instead, it's a hodgepodge of restored wood-frame buildings. Tourism is not just big business

here, it's about the only business. Days are spent on the golf course, at the ski area or at the race track. A night out might mean a stage show at the Flying J Ranch or a boot-scootin' boogie at The Bull Ring.

But what draws most residents is, according to realtor Pete Thompson, "The cool, dry air—plain and simple." Thompson moved here from Colorado in 1979 and has seen the dollar volume of home sales double in the past two years. Selling houses here is easy, he says: "All I have to do is tell people there's no heat, no humidity and no chiggers—and they move here."



### Christmas time brings family memories

#### A CHRISTMAS TALE

My evil grandfather's name was Joe Nix. Nix is German for nothing, but he was anything but nothing in the small town of Poseyville, Indiana.

The townspeople recognized him as the richest man in Posey County. He was a very hard man to deal with, but when you needed money or advice, you talked to Joe Nix first.

A modern day Scrooge, his blessing could assure or kill a loan or a job. And he would never let you or anybody else within listening distance forget it.

Grandpa made his money as a Chevrolet car dealer during the black market years of World War II. People would line up to pay for a new car. The car was essential and Grandpa was the final word of approval. He relished the power and he took advantage.

His family was unique. Envy replaced love. Deviousness became an artform. Money was always the measure of success. Joe wanted it that way. He insisted.

His life was business, even to his children. If a son or daughter needed money, he would hold their note for a small interest, but first they had to convince him they needed the loan. Often, he said no.

His favorite family discussion would be to tell his children what child owed him the most, the basis for loaning the money, and who was late paying him back.

He could be cruel and heartless, pretty much like a bank.

His fondest memories were of how he closed a deal with cunning to get the best price possible. Today, he would be considered a ripoff artist.

Joe was from the old school when sons got the business and daughters got the shaft.

His sons, my Uncle Carroll and Uncle Bee, were top salesmen, trained in his ethics and who eventually would run the business. His daughters, my Aunt Dereatha and Aunt Sue, would be their secretaries.

Joe had two other children, the oldest daughter was Pauline, my mom, who was a housewife married to an oil refinery superintendent.

The last of the children was my Uncle Dick. He was the youngest, born after the stillborn birth of another son, Dick was retarded.

Grandpa thought this was a sign from God



to stop having children. For Joe believed in God and never missed Sunday mass at St. Joseph's Church. Besides, it was good for business.

To his children, he was an awesome figure to deal with, who some day would die and leave them money. He had instilled that belief in them from the moment they could understand, and the anticipation of splitting all of his wealth both excited them and filled them with worry.

Would there be equal shares? Who would take care of the person who had to take care of Dick? It's the only thing they ever talked about, Joe's money. And they waited patiently all their lives, until they, too, became very old.

There was one more special person in the Nix family. She was the special glue that bonded the family personality in a way that could stir emotions to new depths of despair.

She was the drive that made Joe Nix evil. She was my grandmother, Loretta. And she turned evil into her own special holiday.

My favorite Christmas story is about my evil grandmother; but first you should know that she also was cheap. Because of that, perhaps she should be forgiven.

How cheap? Every year she would send my mother a birthday gift. A piece of jewelry that would have a set missing, stockings would have runs, a vase would have a chip. Never did she send a gift to anybody that wasn't flawed.

My mom and dad bought a farm. Dad liked to garden and was especially proud of his tomatoes, but someone kept swiping them, raiding his garden of all vegetables.

A neighbor described the culprits. It turned out to be my grandmother and Aunt Dereatha. They would wait till Mom and Dad would go to church and then drive to the farm and help themselves.

What I'm about to tell you happened during

the Christmas holiday season of 1955, and it is absolutely true.

Uncle Frank and Uncle Gus were old and not in very good health. Both had been widowed for a number of years.

Sometime in December, Grandma got the call that Gus was on his deathbed, and Frank wasn't feeling all that well.

The family had traveled to Grandma's for the holidays. Some had driven from several states away. We sat around Gus's deathbed, praying the rosary.

Some family member had brought in a small plastic Christmas tree and set it on the table beside Gus's bed. I remember seeing no ornaments, but a get well card was placed underneath to give it life.

That night Gus died. All that was left was the trip to the cemetery. But wait!

Grandma Nix was convinced that Frank was going to die within a few days. The family was all together, food was on the table, so it made no sense to bury Gus right away, only to have another funeral a few days later with Frank.

So Grandma told the funeral home to hold up any further funeral arrangements on Gus. It would be cheaper and more practical to bury them both at the same time.

Well, Frank didn't die right away, and that made Grandma angry. Some of the family didn't think it was proper for Grandma to hold up Gus's burial, but she didn't care. It was Frank's fault, she said. He wouldn't die.

Finally, when three more days passed and Frank still wasn't dead, they buried Gus.

Grandma never forgave Uncle Frank for not dying sooner. When Frank died a year later, she didn't even attend his funeral.

As for the inheritance, Grandpa died first, then Grandma a few years later. The children were overjoyed, but over the hill.

Mom and Sue are healthy, but Sue's husband is dying of a congenital heart disease; Dereatha is an Alzheimer victim and her husband, Ralph, is paralyzed from a stroke. Uncle Carroll died of cancer and Uncle Bee is in remission from prostate cancer. Uncle Dick is severely ill and confined to a mental institution.

Dianne, that's my wife, said she knew that story was true, but vowed no one would believe it.

I don't know. What family doesn't have its ups and downs?
