

### On the side

#### Negotiations end between Hubbard, Santa Fe Racing

Negotiations between R.D. Hubbard Enterprises and Santa Fe Racing, Inc. about the possible purchase of certain assets of Santa Fe Racing, Inc. have ended, it was announced today.

Negotiations between the two parties and the Resolution Trust Corporation had been ongoing for several months and a deadline of December 22, had been placed on the completion of the deal so that details for the upcoming horse racing season in Albuquerque could be finalized.

However, final agreement could not be reached by the deadline and negotiations have ended.

"We attempted to put together a deal that would be beneficial for all concerned, particularly for racing in New Mexico," R.D. Hubbard said.

"However, after investing many months of time and effort, we have been unable to conclude negotiations in a timely manner that would allow for an orderly transition for racing in January."

#### Streetscape construction takes break

Ruidoso deputy manager Alan Briley said he is suspending MainStreet operations from Friday, Christmas Day, through Sunday, January 2, 1994, with work to start again on January 3.

Briley said merchants are concerned that equipment parked within the construction zone might hinder the important Christmas holiday shopping.

"We thought it would be best to get completely out of the way of the merchant business and not allow the parking between the barrels through that area. By leaving no parking between the barrels, walkers will have better access to the businesses."


He said D&S Construction intends to pour concrete on Thursday and Friday to complete the two driveways located at Mitchells and Casey Cabins.

Briley said the MainStreet program, in its early stages, has encountered several problems including a \$10,000 change order to interconnect electric and water conduits in the area.

He said conduits were designed for under the streets and sidewalks by Bohannon-Huston, but not connected to each other in any way. He said to avoid placement of an excessive number of water meters, he had the conduits interconnected.


Briley said he asked Bohannon-Huston why conduits were left in fragments throughout the project.

#### State says no to extra travel pay

The State Department of Finance and Administration (DFA) disallowed extra pocket change approved by the village council for a law enforcement officer while attending school out of state.

During the last village council meeting, Councilor J.D. James asked the village council to approve \$15 per day for Detective Sergeant Lanny Maddox for incidental expenses during the 85 days he will be gone.

Maddox requested permission to attend the FBI National Academy in Quantico, Virginia, for 10 weeks.

#### Garbage charges characterized as assessments, not as user fees

A unique situation that doesn't fit any easy classification may result in the first exception to regular billing for a customer of the Lincoln County Solid Waste Authority.

Richard Rowley, a board member of the Eagle Creek Summer Home Association, told authority officials Monday that his group's situation was one of a kind in the county.

Previously, the board has refused to grant a variance, except to those who fall within the described parameters, which include owning 300 contiguous acres.

Most of the Eagle Creek homes were built in the late 1920s and early 1930s on U.S. Forest Service land, he said.

"They originally were set up for long term leases on forest service land, but the leases ran out and now we are on five year leases that automatically renew unless the forest service gives notice that it wants us out," Rowley said.

To reach the land, two creeks must be crossed and the canyon is too steep for a truck to service a garbage container, he said.

"Our leases prohibit us from using the cabins more than six months a year," he said. "As a practical matter, they are usable about five months (May to October). None are winterized and the water is

pumped out of Eagle Creek. When the weather is cold, everything is closed down or the pipes would burst.

"If there is a fair amount of moisture, you can't even get in with a big snow. There can be six to seven foot drifts across the road."

When the authority stationed a dumpster in the area, it was used and abused by campers, attracted bears and wasn't needed by the association members, Rowley said.

"I don't think anyone wants one in there, because of the bear problem," he said. "With the little garbage generated, everyone just hauls it out in bags and takes it to the nearest dumpster. There's no need for a container year-around."

He said most cabin lease holders come up seven or eight weekends a year.

"Most just don't generate enough to justify a dumpster," Rowley said. Out of 20 cabins, about 10 are used on a regular basis. Some he has never seen occupied. When one was washed down stream, forestry officials required the lessee to clean up the debris and then would not allow him to rebuild.

"Once they are gone, they're gone," he said.

Authority board member Bill Allen proposed a motion allowing association lease holders to pay for six months of service. He noted the difference from other situations is

that they have no choice on how much the cabins can be used.

"They can't be there more than six months," he said.

Authority member Wilton Howell said he takes care of condominiums and one woman hasn't been in her unit for the past four years, but that doesn't exempt her from paying her share for year-around garbage service.

"Ours is unique, because we're prohibited. It's not by choice," Rowley said.

"We're not collecting enough to cover the service to begin with," Howell said. "You've presented a unique situation, but the economy also presents a unique situation."

Chairman Mayor Frank Warth pointed out the entire collection system and compactor must be maintained year-around.

"We can't stop for six months," he said.

Lewandowski backed Warth's view.

"The way we're structured, we're like the police or fire department," he said. "Even if the service isn't used, we have to keep the equipment and staff."

"The \$5.25 a month is more an assessment against the property to pay for the system than a user fee."

"Their situation is entirely different than condominiums or

and why water was not a part of the project.

How could trees grow and have a year warranty if water wasn't provided by some system?

Briley was told by Bohannon-Huston that the village did not pay to do a full landscape design.

Briley said the need and cost of the water system will be brought before the village council during the first January council meeting.

The village's contract with Bohannon-Huston is about \$67,000, however last year spokesmen for the firm went before the council asking for an additional \$63,000 of work that was completed without first getting council approval.

The council neither confirmed nor denied the request, but members indicated they would look at

the total picture after the project ended.

Another change in the MainStreet plan occurred in front of J. Roberts clothing store where Briley said drawings didn't adequately reflect the entrance, a circular brick step. He said because of additional removal of posts and signs, a new cost will have to be negotiated.

Briley said the removal would be considered a line item change that does not require council approval.

Briley said he has an additional \$67,000 in funding available for contingencies.

He differentiated between line item expenses and change orders. He said time requests and change orders are brought before the council. Line items not exceeding 15 percent over bid, are within his

authority to approve without council action.

Another modification that Briley said may or may not cost more money occurred in front of Trent's Gifts.

He said Bohannon-Huston did not figure in a canopy that hangs over that shop. A ramp for the disabled would have brought the overhang too low. Plans had to be simplified in that area, eliminating the ramp.

Briley said the village may have to order a different type of tree than specified in the landscaping plan.

According to D&S Construction officials, after contacting three nurseries they found the Idaho Inses Locust trees specified by Bohannon-Huston will not grow in this area, Briley said.

He said he was concerned because the plans call for a one-year warranty on the tree.

The project landscaping calls for 40 Idaho Inses Locust trees at a cost of \$10,530 and 47 Bectal Crab trees at a cost of \$10,998.

Months ago, at an earlier MainStreet meeting, several members of the board mentioned they did not like the trees selected, that they may cause a maintenance problem with falling leaves. Board members discussed not changing the trees at that time, until after funding was approved.

A tree farm owner in El Paso contacted by The Ruidoso News said the Idaho Inses Locust tree is a desirable tree, much in demand and very adaptable. He said the 7,000-foot elevation of Ruidoso should pose no problem.

to further his education. Another 15 days was granted in travel time.

It was agreed that Maddox will be paid administrative leave, furnished with a car and gas by the village. The rest of his expenses, room and board and any other necessities are to be covered by the academy.

James wanted to grant an additional \$15 per day for incidental ex-

penses.

According to Phil Roybal, executive budget analyst for the DFA, "the per diem and mileage act governs the compensation that can be given to a public employee for expenses incurred by the employee for lodging, mileage, meals and other actual miscellaneous expenses, up to \$30 per trip, while on official business. Any additional compensation would be in violation of this act."

DFA officials said they considered the 85 days Maddox will be gone as one trip. They said all other allowances approved were legal.

Mayor Jerry Shaw said she was concerned about the legality of the extra expense pay and after the council meeting called village attorney John Underwood to check on the matter.

She said Underwood advised her that since the check had not been

cut, it would not be necessary to go back before the council for another vote.

Shaw said no check will be issued and the matter is closed.

Shaw said she agreed with Ruidoso Police Chief Richard Swenor when he told the council the police department and community will benefit from the experience Maddox will gain from the FBI classes.

others, because of the restrictions, but I have to maintain a system that can take care of them of they all showed up at one time."

Howell added that the lease doesn't specify what six months the cabins may be used. Someone might come up in the winter, even if the cabins aren't winterized.

"I'd hate for someone to show up with an affidavit that they're only here one month a year and then not want to pay."

Continuing to push for his motion, Allen said the roads would prohibit access during some periods, even to the garbage collection truck.

Rowley said the families that rent the cabin pay an annual assessment of \$150 to keep up the

clubhouse and send out a type of newsletter.

Lewandowski suggested changing the group to one commercial account, billing the association for six months (\$5.25 times 20 units times six) and then the association will pay him for every cabin, even if the association doesn't collect the full amount. That would eliminate the cost of 20 billings each quarter and having to follow up on those who don't pay, he said.

Rowley noted that the authority couldn't file liens for any debts, because the land is owned by the federal government.

"So it may solve a lot of problems if, say the owners in California who haven't been (in their cabin) for five years, decide not to pay," he said.

Allen liked the suggestion and withdrew his motion.

Howell proposed putting the item on the agenda for next month, giving Rowley time to contact his members.

In other business, the board: —was cautioned by Howell to check on what obligations the authority may have in reference to withholding taxes on the wages of inmates from the minimum security prison Camp Sierra Blanca. Two are used in the operation.

—noted that board members Ruidoso Councilor J.D. James, Corona Mayor Ernest Lueras and County Commissioner Bill Schwetmann were absent.

—heard from Lewandowski that he is working with Paul Baca of the county assessor's office to determine which of the 359 persons

receiving certified letters for overdue accounts really owes the authority.

"In some cases, a trailer has been removed and no one was notified," he said. "We're working our way through the accounts. By next meeting, we probably will be through. Once we get to the bottom line on the old, we'll request a new book from the tax collector to compare."

He doesn't know what percentage of the \$26,000 in overdue accounts is collectible, Lewandowski said.

—heard that Lewandowski refinanced some of the authority's debts down to 8 percent interest from as high as 16 percent. About \$6,000 will be saved over a period of three years.

# School board members explain how they evaluate superintendent

Each year, the Ruidoso School Board casts its collective eye at the district superintendent and conducts a lengthy evaluation of his performance.

Unfortunately for the public, most of that process is conducted behind closed doors.

However, board members are required to follow a basic outline dictated by the State Department of Education.

Besides their own observations, they receive unsigned evaluation surveys from teachers and other administrators in the system.

"The anonymous nature of the comments has been an issue," board member James Paxton told The Ruidoso News.

"Teachers argue both sides. It could allow comments that are outrageous or it could allow a teacher to feel free to comment honestly. And the whole goal is to get the best possible input.

"A lot feel they should identify themselves whether they are saying good or negative things. We've never said they can't sign their names. The goal is for the most credible information."

Paxton, who was elected earlier this year and is going through his first complete round of superintendent evaluation, said he has been impressed with Gladden's ability to handle criticism.

"He's not afraid or shies away from criticism," Paxton said. "His goal is, what can I do to improve."

In Paxton's mind, the evaluations from other administrators are extremely important.

"Remember, this is the formal process, but we are continuously evaluating him year-around."

Communication with board members also is a key element. Gladden calls members every few days about issues, Paxton said.

"The intensity of communication surprised me, but I'm pleased," he said. "Although we know the day-to-day operation is not our job, we make policies that he follows, he lets us know about the administrative process to keep us better informed."

Whether board members are uninformed about an issue in the schools by intent or accident doesn't help them when faced by a crowd of agitated parents, he said.

Board president Ron Hemphill said one of his measurements is whether the district receives a good accreditation report, which outweighs many small complaints.

"Employee morale and acceptance of his leadership and his ability to get things accomplished also are important," Hemphill said.

In the evaluation packet, six broad areas to evaluate or "goals" are established, determined by the board during the summer. For the Ruidoso board they are: board-superintendent relations, educational programs, business and finance, community relations, personnel, professional leadership and development.

Goals are defined as broad statements of intent, which infer expected behaviors, indicating no time limit, and give direction for writing specific objectives.

Each board member is given a worksheet to list up to 10 areas of concern in the school system. After discussing each member's list, the items are ranked from most to least important.

It's up to the superintendent to develop a series of objectives to

achieve those goals and for the board to review and approve them in closed sessions.

Objectives are defined as specific statements that express behaviors the board expects. They detail who is to perform the behavior, what is to be performed, how it will be measured and time constraints.

Monitoring of progress also takes place in two or more closed sessions for a total of about five meetings.

The recommended calendar would be July 1 through August 1, initial goals and objective setting; December, report on progress toward objectives; May, final progress report on objectives.

In evaluating the superintendent's performances, three levels are used. Number one means the superintendent is professionally competent and meets or is above all standards of expectation.

Number two means he/she needs improvements and probably can. Number three means improvement is needed and performance definitely is inadequate.

Under board-superintendent relations, five statements are offered and Gladden is ranked from one to three. They are that he:

- keeps the board informed
- offers professional advice
- does not play board favorites
- restrains from public criticism of board members
- participates in resolving differences of opinion

Four statements are listed under community relations. They are that he:

- accepts input from all groups
- works with the news media effectively
- provides leadership in other

areas of the community

- provides community with parent advisory council

Under personnel, seven objectives are specified. They are that Gladden:

- develops sound personnel practices
- works for good morale
- delegates work properly
- is impartial in personnel matters
- develops excellent in-service programs
- provides the best benefits for district personnel
- evaluates principals effectively

The objectives under business and finance are that Gladden:

- is informed on physical needs of system
- monitors budget and informs board on financial needs
- assists in identifying, planning and implementing capital improvements
- provides adequate food service facilities, food and personnel for students
- provides adequate transportation for the district
- prepares budget and represents the district in Santa Fe

The five objectives under educational programs are that he:

- organizes procedures for evaluation
- participates with community, staff and board in curriculum development
- is informed on all matters of education
- is pursuing board philosophy in athletics
- is pursuing board philosophy in testing

Under personal qualities, six objectives are included. They are that he:

- is respected in the community, school and in education
- has good health and maintains it
- works well with others
- is suitably attired and well-groomed
- writes and speaks clearly and effectively
- is poised in the face of a crisis.

Board Member Susan Lutterman said that she keeps close tabs on the goals set by the board to ensure that the administration is headed in the right direction.

Communication with the community is paramount, she said.

"I try to listen to community people, the kids and teachers, because there always are two sides to this story," Lutterman said. "I always check on things. And then I observe."

"I'm the one who is accountable to the people. I'm elected to represent them. I have to use common sense and judgment, but if I hear things over and over, that's when I have to be alert."

The superintendent's handling of the budget also is a significant part of his job, but Lutterman said the recent over-projection on enrollment that left the district short on money isn't a particularly damning point.

"It's been a rough semester (with belt tightening)," she said. "I think

people don't understand that's a hard call (enrollment projection), especially for a community where people are moving in and out at such a high rate."

Bottom line, the superintendent is the only person on the staff of more than 200 that the board directly supervises and is

responsible for hiring or firing, she said.

Another newcomer to the board as of last March, Jim Varnadore said he looks for a strong leader in a superintendent. He also wants a person who truly puts the welfare of students at the top of his agenda and is able to communicate that mission to the community at large and parents.

Test scores compared to the rest of the state are another avenue by which he evaluates, in addition to the physical condition of the school facilities and whether the rest of the state looks to the district as a leader in breaking new grounds and coming up with innovative programs.

"The accreditation visit means a lot to me," he said. "If it had been bad, it would reflect on the superintendent."

Varnadore also stressed the need for communication with board members.

"He has to work with the board and let us know day-to-day problems, because all five of us have other jobs," Varnadore said. "He has to let us know the bad as well as the good that we should be looking at. He has to get along with the staff. The evaluations of the teachers and other administrators mean a lot, otherwise, we would be hearing only from the parents, and then usually only when there is a problem."

"He also needs to keep the community informed and respond when they are not satisfied, as he did with the discipline policy."

"Through all these things, we should get a pretty good picture."

Board member Mike Morris could not be reached for comment.

# Susan Lutterman elected state school board group's secretary

The first big snow storm of the season hit late Tuesday night to prevent a rare shutout by Christmas. Residents say the last time the Ruidoso area was without a major snow storm before Christmas occurred eight years ago.

Ruidoso police reported a lot of slipping and sliding by motorists, but no major accidents.

Local businesses, particularly motel owners, are hoping the word spreads to the tourist communities.

# Planners grant variances on Monday

Frank Richardson was granted a five-foot side yard variance Monday for his open carport by the Ruidoso Planning and Zoning Department. He requested to go within two feet of his property line.

The pattern by the planning commission appears not to allow variances to encroach nearer than five feet of the lot line, and to insure carports that close are never to be enclosed.

The lot has frontage on Ruidoso River with the majority of the lot area above the elevation of 6,940. The lot is pie shaped with point fronting only on Main Road.

Access to the lot is by way of private roadway easement and was established by the original subdivision plat.

The lot area is approximately 20,000 square foot. Existing residence meets all setback requirements.

The planning staff noted that alternate locations were limited on the Richardson property and an area between the guest house or residence would require removal of

six trees. But the planning department proposed eliminating a tree or shifting the carport rather than allowing the setback to breach the five foot mark.

In other business, the commission approved:

—a replat for John and Sandra Ann Clemmons of Ponderosa Heights. The Clemmons want to consolidate two lots that house their mobile home and cure an existing encroachment.

The Clemmons property is zoned M-1 low density mobile home requiring minimum lot sizes of 8,000 square feet and a minimum frontage of 60 feet.

The Clemmons mobile home is placed on a lot that crosses the existing lot line dividing Lots 12 and 13 and was red tagged for failure to obtain site development approval.

The replat cured the side yard encroachments and the site development application has been filed.

—a replat of three lots in Ponderosa Heights subdivision for Ronnie Morgan. The property is zoned M-1 low density mobile

home.

Morgan requested the replat to consolidate one lot with another containing 20,000 square feet with a 240-foot frontage on Spruce Drive and 43 feet frontage on Juniper Road.

Morgan is also shifting a utility easement along the property line dividing the existing two lots to the south property line of Lot 18.

The replat corrects the line and easement through an existing home.

—a replat and vacation of right-of-way was granted for Chuck Boblasky of Lookout Drive.

Boblasky declared that Lookout Drive is not where is was originally planned. He said the property was straight and not curved as the plat shows.

Since the property has been maintained for many years along the current roadway, the Boblaskys contended it was only fair that they, the new owners, be allowed to pay for ownership.

A fence running on public right of way will have to be removed according to the commission, but they

approved the purchase of the right of way property at 50 cents per square foot.

Final approval of any right of way agreement will be subject to the village council's approval.

—a side yard variance for George G. Mairs of Navajo Subdivision.


Mairs property contains approximately 17,600 square feet and has a 70-foot frontage on Roswell Street. The property is zoned R-1, single family residential requiring minimum lot areas of 10,000 square feet and 70-foot frontage. Setbacks required are 10 foot for each side and 20 feet for front and rear setbacks.

Alternate location is possible within the existing driveway area that would not require a variance.

The planning department said Mairs must address the need to use proposed location versus suggested alternate, and before the meeting hardship had not been provided.

The commission approved the variance to within five feet of the property line and the carport must never be enclosed.

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

## Ruidoso school sports earn mixed reviews

At the end of the first nine weeks period, I gave grades to the various aspects of the football team. As the season progressed some of those grades were right on the mark and some changed dramatically.

Now, with half the school year over, I thought it might be fun to take a look at all of the sports programs at the high school.

Remember, this is just my opinion, so no eggs at the Mazda or toilet paper around the trees at Casita de Beatty.

THE SCALE - "A" — Excellent; "B" — Above Average; "C" — Average; "D" — Below Average; "F" — Bad.

Most of the grades issued will be "C's". Please bear in mind that a "C" is average — that is to say just like 80 percent of all other AAA schools in New Mexico.

### Overall grade for all sports - C

We're pretty good at some stuff and not too hot at others.

### Football - C

The end of the season was a disappointment in that Ruidoso lost four straight ball games after two big wins against Fabens, Texas, and Deming.

Ironically, the offense looked good in the beginning of the season and a little dull in late season. On the other hand, the defense that was porous at the beginning, played very well at the season's conclusion.

Special teams were not good for most of the season, but the coaching staff, who I would give an "B" to, has a long winter to iron those things out.

Next year, the Warriors will lose its best football player in Anthony Torres and defensive anchor David Eisenbrown among other talents, but the crop of returnees is exceptional. I look for a good season next year.

Kent's quick fix — an additional staff member that is a true offensive specialist. Not necessarily a coordinator (mainly because I'm a big Rodney Webb fan), but someone with fresh thoughts and a mind that lives for imaginative, go-for-broke plays.

### Volleyball - A

This fall sport for girls is one of three sports at the high school that offers an honest to goodness "program." The girls play in the offseason, they travel and are very competitive.

Shorter on talent this year than most, the Lady Warrior spikers did not like not being the team to beat this year in District 3-AAA. That was apparent in the district playoffs, where they won their first round game against Socorro on heart, not ability.

Coach Jody Blanton, who guided the Lady Warriors to the State Championship in 1990, will return a good group, but will be hurt a little by graduation. Thank goodness for a program (and an eighth-grade team that went undefeated).

### Soccer - A

The soccer team will own more victories than any other Warrior team at the end of the year. The job that Coach Dean Hood has done in starting a new program has been nothing short of miraculous.

The Warriors finished the season at 12-4, and closed with seven

straight wins. Next year Ruidoso moves into district play for the first time and its still unclear who their opponents will be — although Portales, NMMI, Silver appear to be likely.

Hood's kickers would have won the district this year if they had been eligible for the championship (Soccer will not officially be adopted as an official sport until next year).

The Warriors lose Matt Harshey to graduation, and his cleats will be difficult to fill as he was one of the top goalies in the state last year. That's the bad news. The good news is that Ruidoso returns key players like Cory Hood, Daniel Espinosa, Danny Schrader and Leaf Anderson.

Whether the Warriors can repeat their 12-4 mark is unknown, but it's pretty likely that the team has a good chance to bring home a district banner. The schedule for 1994 might include AAAA schools like Clovis, Roswell and Carlsbad, so the wins will be a little tougher, but the Warriors should be a little better.

### Cross country - B

This program has accounted for numerous successes over the past five or six years. In fact, cross country has become Ruidoso's most successful sport, year-in-and-year out.

Only participation hurts the team. This year's numbers were down a bit, but that's likely since soccer has come on to the scene.

Still, head coach Ronny Maskew is a master at getting underclassmen to participate. He is also a prolific fundraiser, so the kids in cross country do without very little. As long as Maskew is involved, the cross country team will be good.

### Boys basketball - D

Just four games and one win

have moved this grade up from a solid "F" last year.

New head coach Paul Kirkwood has 18 chances to double the number of wins that the Warriors accounted for last year.

Actually, Ruidoso plays in a very tough district and league play begins in three weeks.

How many wins will make the season a success? Only Kirkwood can answer that question — but coming from a guy who's seen 80 percent of the basketball games that the boys have played over the past 10 years or so, it won't be many.

In fact, I've seen such an improvement so far this year, that I'm almost ready to call it a success. I said almost.

Realistically, a district win or two might be nice while the talented sophomores and freshmen are learning Kirkwood's running-fastbreaking style of play. This grade will probably be a "B" this time next year.

### Girls basketball - C

Another grade that slides up a notch from last year. The problem seems to me that too many girls play basketball as their "second sport."

Coach Dennis Davis has the girls off to a fairly good start this season with wins over AAA schools Portales and Lovington as well as a sweep of the Tularosa Wildcats.

At 4-4, the Lady Warriors boast some very good basketball players in Sarah Dix and Brandi Pfeffer. Those two are capable of scoring 20 points per game, provided that the guards can find them.

The addition of Sergio Castañon as Davis' assistant will surely help the program, almost as much a couple of girls along the way falling in love with the game of basketball.

### Wrestling - C

Coach Gerald Ames has the dis-

tinct disadvantage of having to participate in District 3-AAA. Ofate, Deming and Cobre, as well as Silver, have given Ames nightmares throughout a career that has spanned over ten years.

Oh, there have been some exceptional athletes that were very successful for Ames and the Warriors, but there have been some disappointments.

In the past, Ames seemed to get a lot of sophomores, juniors and seniors that came out for wrestling for the first time. That's great, but to be good a kid has to start young ... very young.

Now, we see a legitimate program at the eighth grade level, and we're seeing some results from that effort.

Ruidoso has some young grapplers that are going to put Ames and the Warriors back on the wrestling map.

### Track - B

This is another area that the competition is intense. This is evident when you look back at the number of district championships good players the past couple of that football won from 1984-90, and years, Cicelee Makowski and Aaron yet track, with virtually the same athletes, has managed just two district championships for boys.

Rebecca Durham, the cheerleader all five starters. With 50 kids involved from grades eight to 12; the Warriors will good for a long time.

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



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# Questions continue over nuclear waste

While the United States government may be rethinking its nuclear waste policies, at least two Indian nations, including the Mescalero Apache Indian Tribe, are moving forward with studies of storing high level nuclear waste.

Senator Jeff Bingaman announced last week that he has asked President Bill Clinton to convene a commission to review nuclear waste disposal policy and to ensure that the U.S. government has a realistic plan for both temporary and permanent disposal of high-level commercial nuclear waste.

In a letter to the President, Senator Bingaman reiterated the concerns he had earlier this year when he moved to limit Phase IIB funding for a Monitored Retrievable Storage (MRS) facility.

"As I stated on the floor of the Senate, I believe that there are some significant questions surrounding the MRS process," Bingaman wrote.

"The program as it is unfolding is quite different from what was originally envisioned. Further, no contingency plans exist in the event of a failure to certify a permanent facility at Yucca Mountain, Nevada," said Bingaman.

"This could result in a temporary facility becoming a de facto permanent facility."

Senator Bingaman urged the President to convene technical experts, citizens, utilities and tribal, state and local governments to meet with Department of Energy and other federal officials.

The commission would meet to determine whether the current disposal plans are realistic and sensible.

Meanwhile, the Mescalero Apache Indian Tribe is going forward with studies, that could lead to developing a private high level nuclear storage facility.

The tribe, which was further along than any other applicant for MRS study funds, was stalled only temporarily when an amendment to

the Energy Bill cut off funds for studies.

Indian leaders believe Bingaman's opposition go behind nuclear waste to the issue of Indian sovereignty.

"Senator Jeff Bingaman of New Mexico continues to attack the sovereignty of the Mescalero Tribal Council," said Mescalero council member Silas Cochise speaking during the first meeting of the National Tribal Environmental Council (NTEC).

Cochise read a written statement during the meeting. His words were reprinted in the MRS Newsletter. Cochise, noting that a representative of his tribe was invited only as an afterthought, was critical of the new environmental organization and also called for working to unseat Bingaman.

"Our heritage and our way of life — our sovereign right to self governance is just as endangered as the plants and animals we all hold sacred," said Cochise.

"Only Indian solidarity can protect our right, as Indian peoples, to choose our separate paths to the future."

"Whenever tribal sovereignty is threatened, our tribal environments are threatened as well."

"The Mescalero Apaches did not fight the armies of five nations only to destroy our homelands at this late date."

"We are being cautious. We are being careful. We can be trusted to protect our blood rights," said Cochise.

He said that Fred Peso, MRS project manager and tribal council member, was in San Francisco, California meeting with the new nuclear waste negotiator, Richard Stallings.

"He will be laying down our demands," said Cochise.

Peso was an invited guest when the American Nuclear Society and the U.S. Council of Energy Awareness met recently in San Francisco.

Nuclear waste negotiator

Richard Stallings was a panelist for one of the sessions.

"Stallings discussed his hopes for revitalizing the voluntary MRS siting process," according to the MRS Newsletter for December.

Stallings indicated his office will submit a revised MRS grant procedure before the end of 1993, will replace the 2B grant process that was canceled by Congress. His proposal will require the approval of the Department of Energy.

Stallings reportedly outlined three possible solutions to the MRS siting dilemma facing the nation. After explaining his personal belief that an MRS is needed, he identified three options for reaching a siting decision:

(1) a negotiated agreement with a volunteer applicant like the Mescaleros;

(2) a guaranteed co-location of another federal project (like the Space Port being sought by New Mexico at White Sands); or

(3) a forced Congressional siting at an existing federal facility (such as WIPP or Los Alamos).

Stallings reportedly favors the first two options.

During a question and answer period following the negotiator's remarks, Peso asserted that Mescalero participation in the MRS study process was premised on the tribe's inalienable sovereignty over its lands.

He went on to explain that MRS opposition in New Mexico has been as much a NIMBY (not in my backyard) reaction, as a case of NIM-TOO (not in my term of office) panic on the part of the state's non-Indian politician.

The MRS Newsletter also included a report that the Meadow Lake Cree Tribal Council of Canada has gone a step further than the Mescaleros by commissioning a feasibility study for siting a permanent geological repository for the disposal of spent nuclear fuel from nuclear power reactors.

The Meadow Lake Tribal Council

is composed of the chiefs from nine Cree bands located on millions of acres of indigenous lands in northern Saskatchewan.

The Cree reportedly are Athabaskan speaking Indians, many of whom have worked in the Uranium City mining district at 60 degrees north latitude. The Uranium City fields are the major source of uranium in the western world's nuclear field.

"Many scientists believe that the granite 'shield' underlying northern Canada is the best location for the permanent disposal of nuclear wastes," reads the report in the MRS Newsletter.

"The Meadow Lake Tribal Council pointed out that this is only a study to determine whether or not the overall commercial viability warrants further investigation."

The Cree, much like the Mescaleros, have laid out a list of requirements that must be met before the council will take the next step toward project implementation.

Among the requirements is one that the storage technology must be sound and pass an independent Canadian environmental assessment review. The council said the repository must be acceptable to the public, particularly to the native population of northern Saskatchewan.

The Cree said the council must identify economic benefits such as opportunities for education, training, direct and indirect employment and purchases of local goods.

Members of the Meadow Lake Tribal Council and its repository project staff plan to meet with their Mescalero counterparts in the near future, according to the newsletter.

In other nuclear waste news, the U.S. Nuclear Waste Technical Review Board met recently in Dallas, Texas, to discuss on-site, at-reactor, centralized and monitored retrievable storage.

One speaker chastised the DOE for its "policy of the month" approach to nuclear waste disposal.

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# Is Legislature's coverage biased?

Is Legislature Coverage Biased? Not Really, Says Survey

New Mexico lawmakers may feel they're the targets of negative reporting, but news consumers don't see it that way.

In a recent poll by the University of New Mexico's Institute for Public Policy, respondents agree that reporting is biased, especially in newspaper coverage of the legislature, but the particular tilt of that bias will probably surprise the state's politicians.

When respondents were asked if their preferred news source "presents a biased or ideologically slanted view" of the legislature, many said yes — 46 percent of newspaper readers, 36 percent of television viewers and 31 percent of radio listeners.

Radio and television are apparently perceived as most fair: More than 65 percent said radio coverage is not biased, compared with 51 percent for television and 39 percent for newspapers.

The institute conducted telephone interviews with 578 New Mexican adults selected randomly by computer. Results have a five percent margin of error.

Asked how they perceived the ideological bias, the lion's share (85 percent of readers, 80 percent of viewers and 77 percent of listeners) thought coverage was moderate. Small percentages, from five to 15 percent, thought the bias was either liberal or conservative.

Another question focused on whether news coverage is biased for or against the legislature. Surprisingly, most respondents (52 percent for newspaper, 55 percent for television and 62 percent for radio) believe coverage is neutral.

Just 16 percent of readers, five percent of viewers and 11 percent of listeners thought coverage was

biased against the legislature.

"Naturally, the nature of journalistic coverage of state legislatures has changed dramatically since the early 1970s," says David Scherr-Hadwiger, an assistant professor of political science who teaches American politics and New Mexico government.

"Prior to that time legislators and journalists enjoyed congenial relationships in most states.

"In the wake of Watergate, the profession of journalism shifted from an emphasis on covering the day's events to an emphasis on investigative reporting.



In this era of Woodward and Bernstein emulators, it is not surprising that legislators feel under siege by the media.

"This change is evident in New Mexico. Recent legislative sessions have been punctuated by legislators' accusations of unfair coverage by the media. Despite occasional bad blood, the survey indicates that respondents tended to believe that news coverage of the legislature is either neutral or biased in favor of the legislature."

Some lawmakers claimed in 1993 that media attacks reflected an ethnic bias, and the survey found that Hispanic survey respondents were much more likely than non-Hispanic respondents — 53 percent compared to 36 percent of non-Hispanic whites — to believe that newspaper and television coverage of the legislature is biased in some way.

And yet, just 11 percent of Hispanic respondents thought coverage was unfavorable, compared with 39 percent who thought it was favorable.

Finally, about half of survey respondents believe the media provide sufficient legislative coverage, while many want even more — 39 percent of readers, 35 percent of viewers and 64 percent of listeners.

## Mayor announces he'll run again

He's ready to stick his neck out one more time.

Capitan Mayor Frank Warth has decided to run for another four-year term in office.

"I feel my first term accomplishments have significantly improved the quality of life in the village," Warth said in a news release about his candidacy in the March election.

He cited some of those accomplishments as:

—street signs and house numbers were updated

—the E911 system was put into operation

—a wetlands sewage treatment project was installed and is operational

—forty new fire hydrants were installed

—most home insurance rates were lowered

—a street improvement program was started

—improvements on the Eagle Creek pipeline

—a regional landfill, which will be used to dispose of Capital garbage and is shared with communities in the counties of Lincoln and Otero, will be opened in January south of Alamogordo.

As mayor, Warth has actively sought government grants to improve and repair the city infrastructure. He credits his success in part to his past business experience dealing with government agencies, lobbyists and elected officials at the federal, state and municipal levels.

Since moving to Capitan, he has attended all but two village council meetings, starting before he ran for office. He previously served as chairman of the village's planning and zoning commission.

Warth and Jo Warth, his wife of 49 years, have owned property in Capitan since 1980. They moved to the village permanently in February 1987 after Warth retired from LTV Aerospace, where he served for 38 years in a series of management positions. His last post was as design-to-cost manager in the Army tactical missile system.

His educational credentials consist of a bachelor's degree in mechanical engineering in 1947 and a master's of business administration from the University of Texas at Arlington in 1971. He piloted the B-17 as a member of the Eighth Air Force in Europe.

The Warths have been active in the Capitan Chamber of Commerce and with The Friends of Smokey in preparation for the Fiftieth Birthday of Smokey Bear as the symbol of forest fire prevention. Warth has served as chairman of the annual Fourth of July Parade for the past three years and Mrs. Warth has helped judge parade float entries.

Other civic involvement includes serving as chairman of the Lincoln County Solid Waste Authority, serving as president and vice president of the Eagle Creek Water Association and as a member of that group's board of directors.

He is treasurer of the Smokey Bear Lions Club and a member of the Capitan American Legion Post 57.

## Capitan School calls on artists to compete for art project

A touch of art appreciation may be added to the Capitan school campus.

The Capitan School Board plans to apply to the New Mexico Arts Division Public Art Special Projects Program for money to install a sculpture at the new middle school.

Meanwhile the board is inviting sculptors to send proposals on working with the community to develop a project idea and an applica-

finalist review on February 10, application development from November 1 through February 15, notification of funding from the state by June 1 and artwork completed and installed by June 30.



It is plain to see that these men put their heart into their work.

St. Anne's Chapel has been since its beginning in 1934 a landmark from coast to coast; and it is known in many countries across the water. People from all over the country and the world, come in to say a prayer and sign the

register.

When the Reverend Bob Batton was down at the church two weeks ago, two ladies who were visiting the church asked if they could go into the tower and ring the bells. # Firefighters called to scene of structure fire

The Ruidoso Fire Department was called at 7:30 p.m. Tuesday, December 21, to a structure fire at 110 Paradise Canyon. Two big trucks and 14 firefighters responded to the scene of a chimney fire at the home of Ron Weathers.

Hall said the fire apparently started in the chimney, came out of the flue pipe and ignited the fireplace chase (the wooden box around the round pipe) and basically burned that out.

Damage was limited to the living room and about six feet of the attic. But even smoke and water damage was minimal because the smoke vented out the chimney, and firefighters covered the interior

with tarps to protect the home from water damage.

The annual rash of dumpster fires that comes with the advent of "fireplace" season has begun.

The fire department was called to five dumpster fires this week.

Hot ashes should never be placed in a dumpster, and the village has affixed reminders to that effect on most dumpsters.

Hall reminds residents and visitors that hot ashes stay very hot

in the middle for many hours, sometimes even a couple of days, after a flame is out.

When cleaning a fireplace, put the hot and/or cooled down ashes in a metal container and pour water over them. Leave them in the metal container for several days before disposal to avoid starting a fire.

The emergency 911 system is now operating throughout Lincoln County, so in case of a fire or other emergency, call 911.

## Phony credit offers resurface this season

Because many families need credit before the holidays, consumers can expect an upswing in the advertisements for "guaranteed" loans for an advance fee, Attorney General Tom Udall said.

"Essentially these con artists run advertisements which guarantee the extension of unsecured loans up to a million dollars, even for people with bad credit," Udall explained. "Advance fee loan schemes involve the payment of a fee, usually ranging from \$50 to \$1,000 for credit or loans which never materialize."

Promoters of the credit offers refer to the up-front fee as application fees or first month's installment payment.

"Regardless of what they call it, it is money thrown away because usually all the consumer gets for his money, if any, is a list of financial institutions that issue secured credit cards," Udall said.

"A secured credit card is one issued with a limit which is identical to your deposit in a savings account so that, in effect, you have to put up the money which you will

then borrow by using the credit card, which you must pay to use."

New Mexico law allows private citizens to sue the advance fee loan broker and the Attorney General can seek injunctive relief and civil penalties under the Unfair Trade Practices Act.

"The problem, of course, is the fact that the person who cannot borrow from their own bank or credit union probably doesn't have the money to sue anybody for taking money fraudulently," Udall said.

"That means that it is up to the state to pursue the con artists who frequently make a clean getaway before legal action can be taken."

Many advance fee operations disguise what they are doing by claiming to be "consultants" or "advisers" or something else which doesn't warn consumers or the media that they are charging advance fees for mythical loans.
