Flu symptoms could warn of strep throat

Throat feeling rough? Have head and body aches?

Those symptoms could indicate strep throat, a condition that untreated may lead into rheumatic fever, according to Dr. Arlene Brown.

"We're seeing about one-third of the people who come in with complaints of the flu being diagnosed with strep throat," Brown said. "Without antibiotics, that condition could move into a case of rheumatic fever."

Symptoms can include a fever as high as 104, a headache and body aches, but not always a sore throat.

Guv to pick judge

The 12th Judicial District Nominating Commission has submitted two names for Governor Bruce King to consider for the new district court judgeship.

The commission, headed by UNM School of Law Dean Leo Romero, narrowed the list of six applicants to its two recommendations on Monday.

Wayne A. Jordan and Frank K. Wilson, both private practice attorneys, got the nod from the commission.

Governor King will appoint the person to serve the new judgeship for Otero and Lincoln counties, and that appointee will face an election in the June primaries and November general election.

Good Samaritans save injured dog

The eight-month-old blue heeler wandered the Gavilan Trailer Park area for nearly three weeks with only part of his right back leg and the bones exposed.

Finally, late Friday afternoon, some boys called Ruidoso animal control with the hope the dog would get some help.

But the Lincoln County Humane Society animal shelter operates on a tight budget that doesn't cover the normal \$350 veterinary fee that goes with saving or amputating a dog's leg.

Shelter manager Esther Harper figured she didn't have much choice. The dog would have to be destroyed.

But volunteer Joe Scott, who has seen many unhappy stories come through the shelter, decided this was one dog who deserved another chance.

Scott called announcer D. Maury Brown at radio station K-BUY and asked for help. He promised to stay at the shelter no matter

how long it took to collect the money necessary to operate on the heeler, now called Harley by Scott.

He even volunteered to work for the money, if someone needed help around their yard or some other job done.

Brown obliged by telling people Harley's story and about Scott's pledge to wait at the shelter.

"I stayed until 8 p.m., but the people listening to the radio station came through for Harley," Scott said Saturday. "They brought in donations from a few dollars to \$50 from one man to help Harley. And Dr. Willard offered to reduce his fee to \$200 to help."

Harley was scheduled to be on the operating table this morning (Monday). Meanwhile, Harper and Scott tended his leg the best they could over the weekend, fed him an antibiotic prescribed by Willard and gave him a viral distemper shot.

Parents join in the fight against drugs

Parents are being invited to join their children in learning about drug use prevention techniques.

Connie Hopper, the local Drug Free Schools representative and a deputy with the Lincoln County Sheriff's Department, said the primary emphasis of the programs for elementary children is to help students recognize and resist the pressures that influence them to experiment with drugs.

The programs are part of the Drug Abuse Resistance Education (DARE) project financed through a government grant.

A semester course will be given one day each week to fifth grade students at White Mountain Intermediate.

The curriculum was developed by the Los Angeles Unified School District's instructional specialists. It covers how to say no to

peers, building self esteem and alternatives to drug use.

An abbreviated program also will be given to children in kindergarten, second and fourth grades.

Hopper said she will be available to present drug education classes to parent groups and will work in cooperation with parents to ensure that children are well informed regarding the dangers of drug abuse.

A second series, put together for adults, will be offered in four or five, two-hour sessions.

The DARE Parent Program is based on goals similar to those for students and is consistent with the ideals of positive education, Hopper said.

Garbage is the Grinch of holidays

No matter how many garbage trucks rumbled down the road over the Christmas-New Year's holiday, bags of debris seemed to spill out of dumpsters in several areas of the county.

Joe Lewandowski, general manager of the Lincoln County Solid Waste Authority, said Friday that the situation was a combination of weather, holiday timing and having to depend on someone else's landfill.

"The snow shut off some areas," he said. "And in combination with Christmas falling on a Saturday, drew a lot more people into town than in past years."

"For example, we hauled 15 loads to the Roswell landfill on the July Fourth weekend (traditionally the largest for the area). Christmas week we hauled 16 loads and this week, ending last night (Thursday), we had hauled 17 loads."

Lewandowski emphasized that he didn't feel he had to make excuses, but he can provide some rea-

Council returns to airport hangar lease discussions

The fate of the Sierra Blanca Airport hangar will be discussed Tuesday at the first Ruidoso Village Council meeting of the year.

Franklin Aviation conducted a modified fixed base operation from the hangar since 1990, but did not request an extension 90 days before the lease terminated, as the contract specified.

Deputy manager Alan Briley said that the village received only one response after its issuing a request for proposals (RFP) in seeking a new lease for the village airport hangar with mechanic's service. He said that he considered that one request, from Ed's Flying Service out of Alamogordo, unresponsive because it lacked specifics asked for in the RFP.

Briley said that more than 300 announcements had been sent, primarily to the airport's customer list. Briley said it appears to him that no one is interested in leasing the hangar for the purpose of providing the service of mechanic.

The Ruidoso News contacted one pilot from that list. Asked why he hadn't submitted an RFP after he had shown interest in picking

up a copy from village purchasing, Steven Hightower from Mountain Aviation said he didn't like the way the RFP was written.

Briley recommends the council resubmit the RFP, but relax the mechanic requirement and opt for the hangar only.

Some members of the council have expressed a desire to run an aircraft mechanic's operation at the hangar as a municipal function, as the village has in the past.

A third option would be to bid out airport hangar space for lease. Unlike an RFP, a bid has little subjectivity and is primarily concerned with best price.

The airport lease sparked some controversy late last year when Jim Franklin did not request an extension of the hangar lease for aircraft maintenance.

The Franklin lease of the 6,800 square-foot hangar at \$500 per month was a private lease awarded by the council in 1990. The village did not go out for bids or give public notice.

Former village attorney David Thomsen said at the time that the lease of the main hangar and

They set up a bed with a blanket for him in the isolation area and he was eating well.

"Harley had kept the wound pretty clean over the last few weeks," Scott said. "It's amazing he

survived hobbling around like that.

"He's really lovable and friendly and not afraid of anyone. I think he knows we're trying to help him."

While fellow shelter volunteers and workers praised Scott, he praised the radio listeners who cared enough to stop at the shelter

on Gavilan Canyon Road and donate.

Harley will be up for adoption after he returns from the veterinary clinic. He probably would recover faster if he was placed into a home immediately,

where he could receive the attention he may need as he heals.

"The bones were shattered and part of the leg was gone," Scott said. "I think he probably will lose it, but that doesn't stop dogs. They can adjust."

modified fixed base operation was part of the ordinary course of business, therefore bids were not required.

However, some airport pilots point out that according to the minimum standards for fixed base operators and airport tenants at the airport, the council may restrict the commercial use of the airport, or the solicitation of business thereon, based on non-discriminatory standards. They say bids or RFPs would appear to eliminate the appearance of discriminatory practices.

The amount of hangar rent and service at the airport in general, has caused the council concern. At a recent workshop meeting, councilors talked of creating an airport board to tighten control of airport management.

Last November, after airport manager Lloyd Wayne notified his customers that Franklin was leaving, a telephone campaign ensued to keep Franklin's mechanic at the airport. But the mechanic had committed himself to a job in Colorado.

In other business, the construction tab for the MainStreet sidewalk project appears to have been bumped upward by an error in estimated material quantities.

Robert W. Tackett, Sr., superintendent for D&S Contracting, who is handling the MainStreet

construction, warned the village of a considerable overrun in the contract due to quantity increases of bid items.

Tackett said D&S discovered discrepancies in the planned quantities and actual quantities for Subgrade Preparation, Base TY 1 GR B and Cement Treated Base.

Tackett indicated that details on plans with typical sections indicated more materials were needed than bid.

"In preparing our estimate for payment while analyzing the quantities being paid, it became apparent there is an error in estimated quantities as set forth in the various bid items," Tackett wrote deputy manager Briley.

"We will assume that all further pay estimates will be submitted in accordance with measurements and payment as set forth in referenced specifications as we are proceeding as per plans and specifications," he wrote.

In other MainStreet project news, Briley will ask the council for a change order that would extend the D&S contract by 14 days.

The extra days are the collective amount from delays due to weather, field changes, or increase in quantities (laying 1,700 feet of pipe.)

Two public hearings are on the council agenda, beginning at 6:30 p.m.

Ordinance 94-1 revises an exist-

ing ordinance dealing with utility companies and contractors that cut into village streets.

According to village deputy manager Briley, companies dig a trench across the road, complete their job, but leave the village to fix their patch.

He said this ordinance, discussed at a previous council workshop, will force the companies to do their own backfill and compaction, with the village doing the monitoring, testing and asphalt patching.

A second public hearing deals with a \$750,000 loan agreement with the New Mexico Health and Environment Department for wastewater improvements.

The purpose of the loan is to defray costs of extending, enlarging, bettering, repairing and otherwise improving the Regional Wastewater Plant.

According to LeeAnn Nichols, finance supervisor, the loan repayment will come solely from sewer revenues.

Nichols said sewer revenues currently do not cover the sewer expenses. Commitment for repayment also is needed from the Village of Ruidoso Downs.

The annual loan payment is estimated at \$97,239, according to Nichols. She said calculation of the repayment for the villages should be determined by the Regional Waste Water Board.

She said if the board determines

that the payment will be based on usage and infiltration flow from both entities, Ruidoso averages 91 percent, making the annual payment an estimated \$88,488, and Ruidoso Downs averages nine percent, making their payment \$8,752.

Nichols said there are approximately 5,157 sewer customers (residential and commercial). She estimates it would take a rate increase of \$1.43 per month per customer to reach Ruidoso's share.

The improvements being made from this loan are only a portion of what is needed to bring the system to an efficient operation, Nichols said.

The council will vote on Resolution 94-2, consenting to the assignment and transfer of CATV franchise from Rifkin Cable Income Partners, L.P., to Alert Cable T.V., Inc., doing business as CVI Cablevision Industries.

Alert Cable is a Georgia corporation with home offices in Deland, Florida, near Orlando.

The transfer will not effect service or cost to the community at this time.

In other business, the council will act on the village's Planning and Zoning Commission recommendation to approve or deny a Lookout Drive right of way vacation amounting to 2,135 square feet. The agreement would be conditional in that applicant Chuck Boblasky would pay 50 cents per

It is intended for interested adults and families of children who are or have been in the DARE program or for concerned adults at large.

"The focus will be on developing better skills, to interact with children, to learn about peer pressures and to identify signs of potential substance abuse," Hopper said.

Throughout the year, the series will be offered in each school district, starting with Carrizozo. The dates for other districts will be released later.

The first session, entitled Effective Communication, is set for 7 to 9 p.m. Thursday, February 10, in the multi-purpose room at the Carrizozo School. Hopper will emphasize how to use communication effectively to develop a strong family foundation.

"This has been determined to be an essential element of prevention," Hopper said. "Characteristics of self-esteem also will be covered."

Session 2A, February 15, is designed for parents of children ages one to eight to provide an awareness of safety measures that can be used in the home to reduce the likelihood of dangerous exposure to drugs. Strategies parents can use to reduce the risk of drug abuse when their children are older

also will be reviewed. Session 2B, February 17, entitled Drug Abuse Prevention and Intervention, is aimed at parents of children age nine to adolescence. It deals with the risk factors for substance abuse in early adolescent and introduces parents to information on drug identification, availability and effects.

Session three, February 22, will cover youth pressures and resistance skills.

Understanding and awareness of how the media and peer pressures affect daily decisions, will be reviewed. Important requirements of prevention include choosing the proper role model and learning good life skills, as well as resistance skills. A video covering current trends in music and how they may affect a child's choice of whether to use drugs, will be shown and discussed.

Session four, February 24, will consist of a panel discussion with members of the community involved in prevention. They will go over resources available to lend support, offer services and answer specific questions regarding the abuse of chemical substances.

Registration forms, which are available through the sheriff's department, the schools and Region IX Cooperative Education, also will be sent home. They must be returned by February 8.

sons for the problems experienced or perceived by residents.

"Christmas is the one day a year that everyone puts out their garbage on the same day. The landfill was closed Sunday. Our trucks were filled, our trough and our trailer and the landfill didn't open until Monday," he said.

Christmas waste tends to take up a great deal of space in a dumpster, because of the boxes and wrapping paper, he said.

"It would help a lot if people would break down their boxes," Lewandowski said. "Two or three big boxes will take up most of a dumpster. The best would be to take them to the recycling center or recycling dumpster."

The Upper Canyon area was the biggest headache, he said. Some roads were too snow and ice covered for the large trucks to attempt.

"I went up personally with a four-wheel drive pickup and hand loaded garbage from dumpsters to the back of the truck," he said.

"It's very dangerous for those big trucks on dead ends when there isn't enough room to turn around. They have to back in. Going up may not be as bad as trying to come back down with 6,000 pounds of truck. If you slide, in one place, the truck wouldn't stop until it was in the front room of a home. I told my

driver he made the right decision not trying to pick up there."

The full staff was on hand for the holiday weeks, he said. Quite a bit of overtime also was paid.

"We tried to take care of it as fast as we could," Lewandowski said. He has four garbage trucks to serve 2,500 dumpsters countywide.

"We never went off our collection schedule, although some people called and tried to make us change," he said. "It seemed everyone wanted their garbage picked up at the same time and wanted us to go off schedule to accommodate them. Some whose normal pickup day was Wednesday, started to complain on Monday, so we did our normal route and then had crews out serving 'hot spots' until as late as 7:30 p.m."

"Several people said they hadn't had a pickup in two weeks. I went out personally in many cases to see if any Christmas debris was mixed in," Lewandowski said. "That would tell me the driver had missed it. But mostly it was food and household garbage. I knew my drivers had been there."

"One mistake did occur on a few dead end roads where normally the houses are empty in the winter," Lewandowski said. "My drivers assumed that no one was there. I realized after three or four days what the drivers were doing trying to save some time. I told them they

have to go back, because everybody was in town."

By January 17, the county will be a partner in a regional landfill operating south of Alamogordo and will be able to arrange for it to stay open over large holiday weekends, Lewandowski pointed out.

The Otero-Lincoln County Regional Landfill was dedicated last Thursday, drawing 100 officials from the eight municipalities and two counties that are partners in the new enterprise, from the state, from agencies involved in the project and from the public.

Judy Espinosa, Secretary of the State Environment Department, offered congratulations. The state would like to see more regional-type landfills.

Former Ruidoso mayor Victor Alonso was there as was former authority manager Gene Green.

One criticism laid at the authority's feet over the holidays had nothing to do with the agency, Lewandowski said.

He received reports of garbage bags lying up and down Mechem Drive. After checking, he found they were left there by State Highway Department crews cleaning the road shoulders. Lewandowski said he told his driver to check in the evening and pick them up if the state hadn't hauled them away, but the bags were gone.

Feisty dog survives rejection to wait for new home

Abandoned with two other dogs by his owner, Bandit arrived at the Lincoln County Humane Society animals shelter frightened and defensive.
"He was tasty with us at first, really just afraid, but he has turned out to be the most lovable dog," said office manager Kathy Tetreault.

He's also been the luckiest of the three dogs left to fend for themselves. A black terri-poo, apparently never inoculated with protective shots by the negligent owner, died, most probably from Parvo. Another white terri-poo either got loose or was stolen from a foster home.
But big, sweet-natured Bandit, with his dark muzzle and buff-color

thick coat, has survived. However, he needs some individual attention and some affection, a real home where he is appreciated and a part of the family.

"He literally prances when he walks on a leash, he's very light on his feet," said shelter manager Bether Harper. "He carries himself well and is not a big eater for his size. He could stand to put on some weight, but I think he needs to be settled into a home, maybe with some companion females like he was used to, before he will gain weight."

Bandit shows the usual aggressive response to another aggressive male dog, but generally gets along well with other animals. Being in an outside cage, he has several small wounds from other dogs in adjoining cages, but with the free grooming offered to shelter adoptees and some attention, his coat will be extremely attractive.

Bandit appears to be a shepherd mix, possibly with some Leonberger lines.

Another stray, who looks like he may have Australian kelpie blood, also is waiting for adoption in an outside pen.

With gold eyes, a reddish blonde short coat and large ears, Blazer presents a striking picture.

"He just has a different look," Tetreault said. "He's energetic and craves attention. He can't wait to be let out in the morning, loves to be taken for a walk and is good with all people."

Harper and Tetreault also are very anxious to find a home for Brandy, a previously featured fe-

male with bronze eyes and a red short-hair coat.

Brandy recently became the victim of a fight instigated by one of the more aggressive females. Unfortunately, in the artificial atmosphere of a shelter, the pack mentality sometimes takes over in that type of situation. Once a weak member is identified, the whole group descends.

Brandy was bitten and bruised, but is recovering with extra attention from shelter workers and veterinarian Lynn Willard. But Harper can't return Brandy to the community outdoor pen and that means Brandy doesn't get a chance to be outside much.

"Although we try not to play favorites, she's a really special dog we have hoped to place for quite a while," Tetreault said. "She's not flashy like some of the breeds that go right away, but she's sweet natured and would become a loyal companion."

When the shelter is expanded in the spring, each larger dog will have a separate outdoor run, which should prevent many of the problems experienced now. But until then, shelter workers have to rotate the more aggressive dogs.

"Life here just isn't natural," Harper said. "A dog who may have been with the pack attacking Brandy, may be totally passive in a home environment."

If you have a few idle hours each week and want to feel good about helping the abandoned animals in the county, volunteers urgently are needed at the society's thrift shop next to Arby's. The thrift shop is a

major source of support for the shelter and for the money needed to expand the facility.

Animals in other sections of the county are kept in more primitive facilities and routinely are destroyed after three days unless claimed. Unfortunately, many owners don't check with the pounds in Carrizozo, Ruidoso Downs and the sheriff's department holding area at Fort Stanton when their dogs are missing.

The hope of society members is that eventually all animals picked up running loose countywide will

come to the humane society shelter, where they will have a better chance to be reclaimed or adopted.

Volunteers also are welcomed to play with the cats in the cattery or to walk the dogs. A walk not only gives the dogs needed exercise and training on a leash, it also provides the interaction with humans needed to keep them socialized and adoptable.



Flores wins the 103-pound championship

Junior Julian Flores made the record books in the Carlsbad Invitational wrestling tournament Friday and Saturday as he upset heavily-favored John Tapia, Santa Fe High School's top-dog, to take the 103-pound championship trophy.

Flores, who lost nine pounds to compete at 103, led the Warriors to their best team finish in Carlsbad since 1986.

Facing the likes of Carlsbad, Santa Fe, Albuquerque High, Rio Grande, El Paso Coronado, El Paso Hanks, El Paso Irvin, Belen, Roswell, Goddard and NMMI, the Warriors got off to a slow start, but closed like thoroughbreds.

The first round saw Jose Prieto injure his elbow and had to default for the rest of the tournament. From there it got worse as Gunner Johnson, Matt Poncho, Victor Cochola and Sergio Guerrero lost their matches.

Only Beau Jarvis managed a win in the first round when he

turned the trick against Deming's Jose Madrid (7-3).

The Warriors saw a little light at the end of the tunnel during the second round as 112-pound James Flores pinned Mike Baca of Goddard.

Julian Flores and Beau Jarvis advanced to the third-round championships with victories.

Johnny Flores lost a controversial decision (4-6) to Coronado's 119-pounder, but came back to pin his Carlsbad opponent, to advance — as did Gunner Johnson with a win over his man from Deming.

Billy Austin, Matt Poncho, Eustace Gallerito and Sergio Guerrero were also eliminated by their second round losses.

In the third round championships, Julian Flores smashed Coronado's second-seeded wrestler 17-3 at 119 pounds.

James Flores was defeated by the first seed from Rio Grande in a war; and Beau Jarvis lost a heart-breaker to Hank's James

Hernandez — after leading 18-4 with less than a minute left in the match.

But like most sports, in wrestling a little mistake can have huge repercussions, and Jarvis made one. He was pinned after totally dominating his match with just seconds left.

That left Julian Flores in the championship, facing an opponent that had proved himself over and over as one of the top wrestlers in the State in John Tapia.

At the start of the first period, Flores shot a low single, capturing Tapia's ankle. Flores then stepped across his opponent's body and scored a big two-point takedown and three-point near fall.

Flores then let Tapia up to score his only point of the match with an escape. Julian took Tapia down again and put him on his back to score five more points. Tapia worked his way off his back and Flores tilted his opponent for another near fall to end the first period.

The second quarter saw Flores

only to his 18-point margin, needing only two points for a technical fall, which he immediately scored.

In just over three minutes, Julian Flores became the first Warrior ever to win a championship in the AAAA-laden Carlsbad Invitational.

The performance at Carlsbad was an important one after the Warriors were crushed by Oñate at a dual match last Wednesday.

The locals suffered a 49-15 thrashing, despite wins from Julian and Johnny Flores, plus heavyweight Eustace Gallerito.

Jose Prieto, Michael Smart and Gunner Johnson wrestled well in losing efforts.

The Warrior junior varsity won four of five matches, highlighted by eighth-grader Jake Gray's victory over sophomore Ruben Serna.

The Warriors host Goddard in a dual match on January 12 at 6 p.m. and then travel to El Paso, Texas, for to compete in the area's largest wrestling tournament at Bowie High School on January 14-15.

The Ruidoso High School boys basketball team's three-game win streak is over.

Just one night after upsetting the Clovis Wildcats 48-47, the hot-shooting Portales Rams crushed the Warriors 101-61 Friday in Portales.

The loss moved the Warriors record to 4-5 for the season, while Portales improved to 4-8.

The game with Warriors marked just the second time this season that Portales played a AAA school. All of their other opponents have been much larger schools.

In addition to the Warriors, the Rams have also beaten Roswell High, Clovis and Bloomfield.

The Warriors used sharp three-point shooting to take a 18-16 lead over the Rams after one quarter. But when Portales moved out of their zone defense and into a man-to-man, the shots stopped falling for the Warriors and the Rams took control of the game.

Portales shot almost 70 percent from the field for the game including an amazing 14-for-20 from the three-point arc.

The befuddled Warrior defense spent the final three quarters looking at Portales either making a three, or shooting a layup.

Actually, the game was well within reach for the first half but the Warriors pressed ineffectively in the second half and a 10-point halftime lead for Portales stretched out to a 24-point advantage after the third quarter. In fact, the Warriors' "matador" defense gave up 61 second-half points.

Senior J.R. Chino led the Warriors with 16 points on the night followed by Raul Davis with 15 and Casey Kearns with 11. Other scorers included Rex Comanche, 7; Jeff Chapman, 6; Cory Hood, 4; and Daniel Espinosa, 2.

This was Ruidoso's worst effort of the season and probably Portales' best. The Rams have played a killer pre-district schedule and will move into a very competitive District 4-AAA as probably the second-best team.

Lovington, with help of 6-9 Taymon Domzalski, should be the favorites — but the Rams will be tough if they shoot the ball like they did against the Warriors.

Warrior head coach Paul Kirkwood wasn't happy with his team's performance.

"Portales played a great game because they shot ball so well ... but I'm not sure our defense didn't make them look better than they are. We can't guard anybody ... and it will be a long season if we play defense like that.

"Even in the games we've won, we haven't played good defense. Other teams shoot way too many shots under the basket. Our kids need to know that you play defense with heart and desire ... you have to want to play defense ... we just don't ... our kids want to score points ... if they score 16 points and give up 20 that's OK, just as long they get in double figures. I guess that just comes from losing ... but it's gonna change, if it kills me its gonna change," said Kirkwood.

The junior varsity team also fell to the Rams, 55-42, again because of Portales' ability to hit outside shots. The JV'ers went to sleep in the second and third quarters and were outscored 32-17 during that span.

In Saturday's rematch at the Warrior gym, the Lady Warriors played an overall better game, but still with the same result.


"We had a lot better game Saturday, at least as far as handling

P&Z peruses variance requests

Two variances capture a brief spotlight in a six item agenda scheduled for 2 p.m. today (Monday) at the Ruidoso Planning and Zoning Commission in village hall.

Glen Holt, of Black Forest Subdivision, requests a two-foot variance to allow construction of a 26 by 32 feet garage addition.

The variance would be two feet over allowed limits. According to village planner Cleatus Richards, access to the garage will require construction of a new driveway crossing a natural drainage course.

The size of culvert would require evaluation of drainage area which exceeds 800 acres. Also, the driveway and addition will require tree removal and the driveway as proposed will require fill within the drainage course.

Richards suggest that the applicant provide runoff data to support any change in the natural drainage course. Richards notes that restrictive covenants for Black Forest Subdivision do not contain any provisions regarding setback from property line. He said site conditions of the property warrant variance consideration.

A second variance by applicant

Dorothy Holt Kimsey has been of White Fir Subdivision, granted returned to the commission by the village, were in Block G.

In other business, the commission will:

—hear a request to vacate a right of way in Black Forest for five-foot side yard variance on Kimberly Land and Juanita Sparks Garaman.

The applicants are owners of Lots 56 and 57 and are jointly requesting the vacation to cure an encroachment of a structure and deck.

Planner Richards notes that Lot 57 is extremely steep, rising 50 feet over an average distance of 120 feet. He said the structure placement appears to have resulted from plat amendment and erroneous site staking. He recommends favorable consideration with the conditions that the applicant pay 50 cents per square foot of vacated area (\$750), complete and file a replat consolidating the two lots 56 and 57 and that all utilities sign the replat approving those conditions.

—will consider a replat for David Warner and Debra Gonzales of Ponderosa Heights.

Warner and Gonzales are requesting a replat to consolidate Lots 22, 23 and vacated right-of-way area into one lot designed Lot 22A, containing over 12,000 square feet.

Security lights are set to be installed on top of the Ruidoso High School gymnasium in an effort to illuminate the school's parking lot, which can be dangerously dark at night.

Although the main beneficiaries of the move will be students attending night classes at Eastern New Mexico University-Ruidoso, school district superintendent Mike Gladden said the lighting system also will improve the safety of athletes, who stay late for practices.

"I hope they are installed by Tuesday," he said, which would be good timing for the monthly meeting of the Ruidoso School Board.

The subject of security lights is on the agenda for the meeting January 11. It will begin at 7 p.m. in the board room of the administration office.

Gladden said Friday that the lights were ordered the previous

Monday, adding that "they were supposed to be in the next day."

District maintenance personnel will handle the installation of the \$150 worth of lights.

"We'll start with three and hope that works," Gladden said. "I'd rather have them on top of the gym than have poles in the parking lot. If three aren't sufficient, we'll add more."

Heat tape also will be added to a new continuous gutter that should make the approach to the school building safer, Gladden said.

"That's a building used practically around the clock and for many functions involving the public," he said. "It's our responsibility to keep it safe."


Rudy Chanez read from the Book of Isaiah, "Lo, This is our God we have waited for him and he will save us. We will be glad and rejoice in his salvation."
