Vendors impact midtown

Complaints by downtown merchants about a roasted corn stand and vendors wanting a featured spot on Sudderth will be discussed Monday at the Ruidoso Planning and Zoning Commission meeting.

Village planner Cleatus Richards said complaints of corn husks, droppings, papers and littering adjoining businesses have created problems.

Village manager Gary Jackson said Thursday a merchant called to lament that he had not protested the corn stand. He pointed to unforeseen debris.

Richards said the number of requests for vendors the village is receiving this year is going to create more than a carnival atmosphere.

"I have four requests on planning and zoning for next Monday night," Richards said. "I have talked to six other people wanting to go through the vending process. This has an impact on the general appearance of the downtown area where littering already is a problem."

Richards said it also adds to the parking problems.

"People have to man these booths," he said. "Our ordinance requires a minimum of 15 driving spaces for walk up, drive up type food establishment."

"I don't see that a hot dog stand, or corn stand or whatever is any different than any other walk up or drive up business, whether in a permanent or temporary building, they all create traffic."

Jackson said the temporary structures do not possess the amenities to accommodate pedestrian traffic.

Richards said there were no special parking districts for these vendors and indicated they would be a further burden to downtown parking.

Asked if he thought a municipal parking lot could be effective if it was a block away, Richards said comfort walking distance is regarded to be about a quarter of a mile according to planning standards.

Richards said vendors selling New Mexico grown products would not have to have a business registration license to sell within the village, but "the village still has a right to regulate location of any vending within the village."

Richards said the commission allowed the corn stand because they were convinced it was primarily a walking area and none of the downtown merchants responded against it.

He said one case coming up at the Four Seasons Mall contains a hot dog stand and a popcorn stand at the intersection of Eagle Drive and Sudderth Drive.

He said on that request, he has received one complaint signed by three of the merchants and more complaints are expected from those who show up at the hearing.

Richards said food and crafts are permitted under the umbrella of an ordinance for special events.

Richards said the village gave permission for a snow cone concession last year, but the results of that venture are unknown.

One dies in headon crash

A Ruidoso woman was fatally injured late last Friday when the pickup she was driving apparently collided headon with another pickup on Paradise Canyon Road.

According to police reports, Frances Jaramillo, 47, was killed immediately.

Jaramillo was driving south bound on Paradise Canyon Road when her 1993 green ford pickup apparently traveled left of center on a right hand curve and struck a 1990 blue and white Ford pickup driven by Boyd Dooley, 35, of Ruidoso.

Dooley told police officer Robert Achterberg that Jaramillo was going fast and was in his lane. He said he tried to move but was unable to do so.

Dooley suffered multiple injuries and a broken right wrist. He was treated and released from the Lincoln County Medical Clinic.

Damage to both vehicles was

considered a total loss by officer Achterberg.

The accident marks the second recent fatality within the village limits. On May 22, Molly Gayton of Mesalero died in a single car accident on Grindstone Resort Drive.

That accident is still under investigation by Achterberg.

Police chief Dick Swenor said before the Grindstone accident, it had been at least a year since the last fatality within the village.

Swenor said in the Paradise Canyon accident, Jaramillo, who was killed, was not wearing a seat-belt.

Swenor said that although accidents in general have climbed in the past few years, fatalities are relatively rare.

"Most of our drivers in Ruidoso come from the flatlands with few curves and hills. They need to be more cognizant of a new driving environment. Slow down around the curves. Stay in your lane. Drive defensively, that's the key," Swenor said.

EDC folds

The Lincoln County Economic Development Corporation is shutting its doors as of June 30, 1993. The executive board recommended that the corporation either run on a skeleton crew or close down, depending on response to the EDC call for membership.

The EDC newsletter, which circulated throughout the county, drew only 19 new members.

"With such a minimal response and no public funding, the board elected to close down the corporation," said Karen Kopp, executive director. "We just didn't get the community support we needed."

The corporation's remaining funding will be held in a bank account, along with proceeds from the sale of equipment. Attorney Mike Line is checking on the legality of returning money to the membership. Kopp said the money will probably have to be given to another group with goals of economic development. She was unable to say how much money will be left over after the June 30 dissolution.

Political parties pick nominees

Candidates for county offices will slide through the primaries Tuesday without ruffling a hair.

County commissioners Monroy Montes and L. Ray Nunley are unopposed, candidates for county treasurer face no opposition in the primaries and Commissioner Bill Schwetzmann won't butt heads with Democrat Preston Stone until the November general election.

State Representative H. John Underwood, a Democrat, also will take a walk until the general election, although his two Republican opponents, Dub Williams and Caren Cowan Bremer, are fighting it out in their party's primary.

The governor's race and a few state offices will grab the most attention, but two others with more local impact are the contests for Division II magistrate judge and the new Division IV Twelfth District judge.

Proctor predicted a turnout of about 40 percent.

"The absentee voting has been fairly low, so that generally means a low turnout," she said. "But I feel really good about the election going smoothly."

Voting precincts will be open from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. at the following sites: Precinct 1 at Corona Village Hall, Precinct 2A at the Lincoln County Courthouse in Carrizozo, Precinct 2B at the Nogal Fire Station, Precinct 3 at the fair building in Capitan, Precinct 4 at the Otero Electric Cooperative for the Angus area, Precinct 5 at the Bonito Fire Station for the Alto area, Precincts 6, 7, 8, 9 at the Ruidoso Convention Center, Precincts 10-11 at the Ruidoso Downs Senior Center, Precinct 12A at St. Judes Parish in San Patricio, Precinct 12B at the Hondo School, Precinct 12C at old Capitan City Hall and Precinct 13 at the Carrizozo School.



tennis courts at School House Park on Sudderth. Two-week sessions are scheduled for June 6-17, June 20 - July 1, July 5-14, July 18-29, and August 1-12.

Kids in group one, ages five through seven, pay \$25 and practice from 9 a.m. to 10 a.m. Group two kids, ages eight through thirteen, practice from 10:15 a.m. to 11:45 a.m. and the tuition is \$35.

Aerobics

Elaine Garrity, fitness specialist, will teach a Beginners Step Aerobics Class, 7 p.m. to 7:45 p.m., Mondays and Wednesdays, June 6-30, at the Ruidoso Athletic Club. The class is open to anyone age 18 or older and costs \$25.

Wilderness Camp

Kids ages seven through 12 can sign up for two weeks of traditional summer camp, a chance to learn about nature and to make new friends. Campers are divided into two age groups, seven to nine year olds and 10 to 12 year olds.

During the first week, June 6-10, kids play tennis and swim, go hiking, fishing, play cage ball and do arts and crafts. They'll play Frisbee, squirt guns and table games, watch movies, and learn croquet and archery.

During the second week, June 13-17, campers will play tennis and swim, ride horses, play croquet, miniature golf, volleyball and table games. They'll hike at Fort Stanton, plant a garden, and play cage ball.

The cost is \$35 a week and youth groups are limited to 15.

Gidgets and Gadgets

Gidgets and Gadgets is a beginning printing class that gives youth the opportunity to experience another form of drawing.

Printing requires very little drawing skills. The class encourages the development of a child's imagination and promotes a fascination for the art of printing.

Monday classes start June 13 and end July 15 at the Parks and Recreation Office, 801 Grindstone Drive.

Cost for the program is \$30 payable to the Village of Ruidoso, plus a supplies fee of \$5 payable to Bernadette White on the first day of class.

Class times are: 8-9:30 a.m. for six and seven-year-olds; 9:30-11 a.m. for eight and nine-year-olds; and 11 a.m.-12:30 p.m. for ten and twelve-year-olds. At least 12 students must enroll in the program for the class to be taught.

Hershey's Track Meet

Boys and girls who like to run, jump and throw should sign up for

the Hershey's Track Meet. The meet promotes physical fitness and participation for youth. It is not an all-star program for chosen individuals.

Learning, participation, enjoyment and physical exercise are the main elements of this program.

The meet is open to boys and girls ages nine through 14. Events include a 50 meter dash (ages nine and 10), a 100-meter dash, a 200-meter dash, a 400-meter dash, a 800-meter dash (ages 11 and 12), a 1600-meter run (ages 13 and 14), a 4 x 100 meter relay, a standing long jump and a softball throw. Divisions are made by age group.

Awards are given in all age divisions and events, and refreshments are free.

The meet starts at 9 a.m., Saturday, June 18, at the Ruidoso High School Track. There is no entry fee. Qualifying contestants will be eligible for the state meet in Albuquerque on July 16. State qualifiers compete at the national meet August 13 in Hershey, Pennsylvania.

Sewing

Diane Travelstead, owner of Mountaintop Fabrics, will teach Sewing for Kids, Basic Sewing for Adults and Seniors, and Quilting for Adults and Seniors.

Sewing for Kids is open to people ages 10-16, limit eight to a class. Kids will learn basic sewing skills and will come away with a handmade pair of shorts. Starting June 15, the class is scheduled for 9-11 a.m. on Wednesdays at the Parks and Recreation Office, 801 Grindstone Drive. Course fee is \$50 plus fabric.

Apache Trails leader adds to story on meeting

Apache Trails president Kathleen Hellman expressed concern over a report of the group's recent meeting, and wrote to The News to clarify and correct several points.

Hellman also wrote to the New Mexico Department of Tourism to add her views to a Thursday, May 19 article headlined "Tourism department approach spawns doubters."

In a letter to Susan Musgrove at the Department of Tourism Hellman wrote that quotes were taken out of context and attributed to the wrong people.

Lisa Storey, who was most extensively quoted, confirmed with The Ruidoso News that her quotes are correct.

Hellman wrote that paragraph six, where she was directly quoted, was also correct.

Hellman noted that not only had Joan Bailey and Lisa Storey attended a regionalization conference, but she and Dick Beck also were at

the conference.

Hellman stated in her letter that Storey and Bailey did not have reservations about the Department of Tourism's new approach, but that their reservation was about the state's sample brochure promoting this region.

Storey confirmed with The Ruidoso News that she and others are concerned about the regionalization approach, but that they have no problem with the regional marketing board itself.

Hellman wrote, "We have an excellent regional board to work on the actual brochure and feel all areas will be represented."

Hellman also serves on the Lincoln County Regional Economic Development Through Tourism (REDTT) Task Force. The article stated that REDTT left Apache Trails off of a recently published list of promotion agencies. Hellman wrote that REDTT was not mentioned in conjunction with such a list.

"I commented that we had been

disappointed when you [New Mexico Department of Tourism] did not mention Apache Trails along with Turquoise Trail, Old West and other regional associations during the conference on the 4th," Hellman wrote.

The article also stated that REDTT skipped out-of-the-way areas in a recent tour. Hellman wrote that REDTT is planning a fam tour of the county and that neither the date nor the destinations are finalized.

"At the last meeting, I expressed my displeasure at the original proposal, which left out most of the small towns, including Corona, White Oaks and Carrizozo," Hellman wrote.

Hellman pointed out that a quote attributed to Lisa Storey actually reflects comments made by many Apache Trails members, not Lisa alone. The quote reads: "Apache Trails has got to stay strong and cohesive and find a way to operate independently. If we're swallowed into the regional board, the little towns like Corona and

Carrizozo are going to be forgotten."

Hellman wrote, "We believe that we have such a diversity of attractions along the Apache Trails loop through our two counties that those of us who know it best can market it best. The state must focus on the whole and let groups such as ours focus on special areas."

The article stated that Apache Trails members are trying to update and improve a Lincoln County area attractions map. Hellman's correction states that the REDTT Task Force is working on that map.

The article stated that the group is planning a membership drive and that annual dues are \$50. Hellman clarified that by stating that their membership drive is on-going and that the \$50 annual dues is for businesses. Apache Trails membership fees are on a sliding scale.

Lastly, the article states that the Mescalero Apache Indian Tribe has never allotted funds to support Apache Trails. Hellman wrote, "Mr. Chino supports the group and we have received dues from the Tribe."

Sassy enjoys being outside, and gets along well with dogs of all sizes.

"She's playful, but not aggressive," Harper said. "She seems equally well adjusted with people of all ages."

Another endearing resident of the shelter is Ginger, a long hair dachshund found wandering loose without tags on Mechem Drive.

"The U.S. Forest Service people found her and named her Ginger," Harper said. "A couple kept her for a while in case the owners were visitors and were looking for her.

"But no one called to claim her, so they brought her down when they also brought back another dog the woman had been fostering."

Ginger is small, energetic and would be a good inside watchdog. She has brown and black markings and a friendly face.

An expansion of the shelter is about half complete. It will add more pens, some with separate outside runs, isolation areas for pups and kittens and create a healthier environment for the four-legged residents.


The world held its breath as in England, the English Channel, and the coast of France, the Normandy Invasion was under way.


MacDonald recently arrived in Ruidoso after completing a 12-year career as a fashion model for both the Elite and Ford agencies in New York.



WAYNE A. JORDON
JUDICIAL PHILOSOPHY

I wanted to start by thanking all of you who have expressed an interest in my columns by phone or while I was walking. I enjoyed meeting many of you in person during this campaign and wish I could have met you all. An active practice and busy family schedule have kept me from seeing everyone, but I certainly intend to meet more of you and address more of your concerns and questions in these columns in the next few months.



The topic of the week is judicial philosophy...the role of a judge in our system of government. A judge is not allowed to say how he would rule in any particular case, but he can and should discuss his own personal judicial philosophy.

For the past seventeen years I have been a conservative judge, and I intend to continue that on the district bench. By conservative I mean that I am a firm believer in the system of checks and balances crafted by our forefathers in our Constitution. Judges are hired to apply the law, not to make it. Our job is to know the law as written by the legislature, limited by the Constitutions of the United States and of New Mexico, and developed through precedent, and then to apply it to the facts in a particular case and come to a decision.

It is very tempting at times for some judges to go about a case backwards: first, they decide what would be fair and then they bend the law to fit the circumstances of the case and the individual will of the judge. I have been very careful not to do this. Robert H.ork, an undeniably brilliant legal scholar and Reagan's unsuccessful nominee to the U.S. Supreme Court, has written a book on the subject entitled *The Tempting of America: The Political Seduction of the Law*. George Will called it "...a sobering account of the extent to which judicial willfulness has degraded the elegant constitutional system we were given." I highly recommend it if you are interested in reading further on the subject. If you're like me and your only spare time is when you're driving, it even comes on cassette tape.

Although a strict constructionist when it comes to interpreting constitutions or statutes, I also believe that judges are frequently called upon to do something more positive than just decision-making. District judges can and should be problem solvers - or at least have the ability to help people in appropriate cases come up with their own decisions.

More and more people are recognizing that some disputes only get worse when exposed to traditional lawyers and judges. Cases between people who will have a continued relationship such as parents, neighbors and local businessmen particularly are suited to methods of dispute resolution that keep them out of court battles that will result in everyone losing but the lawyers. I am trained in mediation, have been employed by fellow attorneys to arbitrate and mediate cases, and have found it extremely satisfying to help people come up with their own solutions instead of having one forced upon them.

Thank you again for your comments on these columns - please keep them coming and please don't forget to vote on Tuesday. Democracy is the life; it only works if you do.
