
In an attempt to curb speeding in their community, members of the Alto Homeowners Association printed flyers warning about the low speed limits and possible high fines.

But over zealous volunteers may have gone a step too far. They have been accused of stopping cars coming into the community to hand out the flyers.

Alan Morel, the attorney who represents the homeowners association, the Lincoln County Sheriff's Department and the county, said misunderstanding and miscommunication are the culprits.

"I don't believe the Sheriff's Department authorized anyone to stop

Realtors may log onto county computer

If everything meshes as planned, access to property records filed at the Lincoln County courthouse will be as simple as dialing a special number and linking computers.

Although county commissioners Friday postponed action on the proposal until their special meeting June 20, the project is nearly an accomplished fact. The county already has spent \$5,022.54 for the necessary equipment and will charge real estate, title and other interested companies a per minute fee as well as a flat user fee for hooking into the records on a "read only" basis.

County finance officer Charlene Schlarb said real estate agent Harvey Foster had been working with former county manager Andy Wynham to come up with an agreement. By the time Wynham resigned, some points still were unresolved, but she has been working with the

county board of Realtors and Leon Eggleston to finalize details.

"We bought the equipment to sign on, the telephone line and the accounting line for billing," she said. "There is a list of items we feel are important to take care of for security so people can only look up records (not alter them)."

Eggleston, former county finance officer and now a real estate agent, said the project has been discussed for 2 1/2 years. Real estate agents call on a daily basis for information such as property taxes and lots sizes. This new arrangement will free the time of county employees, who now look up the records for the people who are not based in Carrizozo, where the courthouse is located.

Although Eggleston said Wynham had stated that the county Multiple Listing Service (MLS) should pay for all the equipment necessary for the hook-up, some commissioners preferred the county

bear that burden to ensure the service could be extended to other segments of the business community that may want to hook up.

"Andy was asking for the cost to be borne by the real estate people," said Commission Chairman Monroy Montes.

"If we could keep the cost at a minimum, it was my understanding, we'd install it," Commissioner Wilton Howell said.

"This was initiated by the MLS and it was going to stand the cost," said Commissioner Stirling Spencer. "I don't know if that's what the commission wants to do today."

"The agreement was when this was started that the MLS would bear the cost and Andy's letter also indicates that," Eggleston said.

"Is it legal for us to provide the service without charging for the equipment?" asked Commissioner L. Ray Nunley.

"This is a service to the people," said county attorney Alan Morel

said. "If the MLS is paying, are we denying access to others like title companies or non-MLS real estate people?"

"We could put the rates high enough to recoup our investment and that way all would have access," Howell suggested.

"I'm worried that if we don't get payment, it sets a precedent," Spencer said.

"This was done not only to accommodate the real estate industry but also to take pressure off county employees," Howell reminded.

Schlarb said she has the capability to bill anyone.

"I suggest we keep it open and we pay for the equipment," she said.

"All someone has to do is call (Schlarb) and be set up as a user," Eggleston agreed.

"Let's keep the 62 cents per minute charge and use that to help

Council deals with motorboat proposal

Motorized boating on Grindstone Lake, chamber of commerce funding and a closer look at special events heads agenda topics Tuesday at the Ruidoso Village Council Meeting.

The council will discuss a request from a citizen for the use of an electric motor on Grindstone Lake.

Under Article 14, known as Grindstone Lake Rules and Regulations, a provision states no motorized vessel may be used on Grindstone Lake.

The small lake's primary use is for drinking water for the village. It recently has gained popularity as a fishing lake and is stocked with trout by the state.

Any vessel on the lake must be permitted by the Ruidoso Parks and Recreation Department.

The council also will discuss its contract with the Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce.

Village manager Gary Jackson, was told by the council at the April 29 meeting to modify the chamber's one-year contract extension.

A committee appointed by Mayor Jerry Shaw, consisting of the mayor, Councilor Robert Donaldson, Councilor Joe Gomez, attorney John Underwood, village clerk Tammie Maddox and Jackson met with representatives of the chamber to negotiate the modifications.

It also was determined at the April meeting, that the council would appoint a Convention and Visitors Bureau (CVB) board. The interim or ad hoc committee was appointed at the last council meeting and the eventual CVB is expected to be appointed later this year.

Jackson said a request for proposals for a CVB will be issued early enough in fiscal year 1994-95 to allow a contract to be executed and the CVB begin operations at the start of the following year, 1995-96.

Dave McGary's work well-received in UN exhibit

NYC show honors Earth Day

The international exhibit, "Art and the Earth: A Dialogue with Nature," sponsored by the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP), achieved its objective of heightening environmental awareness through the arts with its presentation of works by award winning bronze sculptor Dave McGary of Ruidoso.

In the first segment of a three part series, "Expressions in Bronze: Images of Native Americans," McGary's sculptures were viewed by more than 12,000 visitors that attended the exhibit at the United Nations Gallery from March 21-28.


McGary exhibited his realistic sculptural images of Native Americans through 26 masterwork and three lifesize bronzes which cap-

tured the spirit, character, history and beauty of a people who lived in harmony with the earth, according to a news release.

McGary's works represent the diversity of indigenous Native American tribes who communicated with the environment through their customs and rituals which McGary uniquely interprets in the portraits, attire and gestures of his bronze sculptures.

Dr. Noel Brown, director of UNEP North America, delivered remarks at the March 21 opening reception, along with Wendell Chino, president of the Mescalero Apache Tribe.

"McGary's works instill a sense of pride and nostalgia for our first Americans who symbolize a perfect

balance between the human and natural worlds," remarked President Chino.

A letter from New Mexico Senator Pete Domenici (R) was read by Dr. Brown.

"The emphasis on the harmony between Native Americans and the earth - which your art conveys wonderfully - is an appropriate subject for the United Nations, which strives for the same harmony between our many nations," wrote Senator Domenici.

The Southern Eagle Dancers of the Mescalero Apache Tribe from Mescalero opened the ceremony by performing various ceremonial dances and songs.

McGary's sculptures have received international recognition, including a commission from the city of Santa Fe for a monumental sculpture titled "The Founding of Santa Fe."

His masterwork sculptures "Rain in the Face" and "Retired

with Honors," were selected for the prestigious Hubbard Art Award for Excellence exhibition. McGary's work has most recently been featured at the Gene Autry Western Heritage Museum and at a one-man show at the Senate Rotunda in July 1993.

The Egyptian government has extended an invitation to McGary to show his work at the Egyptian Modern Museum of Fine Art in Cairo in the fall of 1994.

The most recent honor bestowed upon McGary is a commission from the Museum of the Horse in Ruidoso Downs to sculpt an eight-piece monument which will depict seven breeds of horses.

McGary's works, exhibited widely, are included in museums and both corporate and private collections around the world.

Firefighters respond to brush fire behind RHS

A cigar, cigarette or pipe was listed as the possible source of a fire last Monday in the forested area behind the Ruidoso High School.

The Ruidoso Fire Department, coming off of a brush fire in the

Camelot area, responded immediately to another fire behind the high school about 2 p.m.

Ruidoso police chief Richard Swenor said the probable cause of the Camelot fire was fireworks.

Jessie Reynolds reported that when he arrived at the high school, there was little being done to control the blaze which he said was out of control.

He said he called dispatch to bring the Ruidoso Downs fire

trucks and Bonito units to the area. Bonito responded with three trucks and 12 firefighters. Ruidoso Downs volunteers also responded.

An estimated 4,000 gallons of water was used to contain the fire.

for operating and maintaining a welcome and visitors center, responding to inquiries about the village and providing responses and conducting surveys of potential advertising and publicity markets.

Another \$174,000 goes through the chamber for contracting advertising of the tourist facilities and attractions in Ruidoso as approved by the council upon recommendation of the village lodgers tax advisory board.

The contract provides for \$36,000 to handle chamber's costs in mailing brochures and other information advertising the village Convention and Civic Events Center, tourist facilities and attractions; and to maintain an "800" telephone number for handling inquiries about the center, tourists facilities and attractions.

Joan Bailey, chamber director, will give a quarterly report.

As part of the chamber packet to the council, Bailey submitted an advertising campaign concept that outlines how the chamber will position Ruidoso this year.

In the chamber summary, Ruidoso is:

- a magical mountain escape for families, groups and couples.
- a four season tourist destination (listed as "year 'round mild climate").
- abounding in attractions of interest to every member of the family (attractions again called "year 'round").
- a pine-covered mountain paradise (similar to item one).
- a unique melding of Old V. N. New Mexican and Indian heritage.
- a cosmopolitan village.
- A third item on the agenda could dramatically affect the way the village spends lodgers tax dollars on

special events.

Village manager Jackson noted that in the past, the village provided money for reimbursement of advertising expenses for approved special events from the Lodger's Tax fund.

Jackson said in accordance with a recent attorney general's opinion dated April 22, the following is clear:

- expenditures of lodgers' tax money, as other public money, must be made in compliance with the anti-donation clause.
- appropriations from governmental units of something of value to a private person or organization without "consideration" is prohibited.
- grants, without a contract for services, are not permissible.

"Therefore, it is the staff's determination that effective immediately, any expenditures from lodgers' tax funds or special events shall only be allowed pursuant to the above stipulations," Jackson wrote the council. "It would appear that until an eventual CVB is created that the Lodger's Tax Advisory Committee should review request for lodgers' tax money for special events in accordance with the above stipulations and recommend approval of contracts for same to the village council."

The evening's agenda, 6:30 p.m., will begin with a public hearing for a new restaurant beer and wine only license for Che Bella, Inc. for a restaurant at 2823 Suddarth Drive, formerly occupied by Arturos.

Regular items will follow and include two appeals by William Blaney.

Blaney claims that the village planning and zoning commission erred in denying his request to vacate a 30-foot utility easement and allowing a 10-foot easement over a

reduced area.

He contends that the proposed 10 feet would be more than enough.

Village staff contends the 10-foot easement proposed does not extend to Lots 93 and 45.

Also Richard Sanchez, village water and sewer superintendent, recommends that the full 30 feet of utility easement be retained due to unknown conditions of development of the Grindstone properties.

Sanchez said with treatment plant to be developed at Grindstone Lake, engineering studies will be conducted regarding plant design and locations, reservoir location and transmission distribution lines. He said until the study is complete and the manner of development of Grindstone properties is known, there should be no reduction in available utility easements.

Blaney told the commission that he was concerned that development of roadway to access his tract would be disrupted by utility installations.

Planner Richards agrees, but said this appears unavoidable, but necessary. He said any damage to the roadway would be repaired by the village.

Richards said he strongly recommends that the commission action be upheld and the appeal denied.

Blaney's other appeal is regarding a replat of Tract B of an amended plat of Blaney Land Co. Tract. He is appealing the planning commission requirements on an approval of the replat.

The commission required that sewer service be extended to Lot 2B. Blaney requested septic tank use.

Richards said connection to a sewer line is mandatory where service is available.

Richards also questioned the

propriety of allowing a subdivision which does not meet village requirements for frontage on streets improved to village standards.

He said access to the lots being subdivided is by private roadway with an excessive grade, 25 to 27 percent. Village maximum grade is 12 percent. He said additionally the roadway is improved for single lane only.

The council will consider a request by Jackson to schedule a public hearing to reconsider portions of an zoning amendment ordinance.

The sections to be reconsidered are parking space and driveway surfacing; and lighting of parking lots and pedestrian ways.

Village manager Jackson will also give a report on annexation.

In other business, the council will:

- act on bid awards presented by village purchasing agent Terri Ward for computer and printers; wastewater system improvements and infiltration repairs; and aggregate.
- Consent agenda items to be approved are:
 - amendment to the joint powers agreement between the village and the Department of Public Safety for the receptionist position at the courts complex.
 - contract renewal for janitorial services.
 - Sierra Blanca Regional Airport improvements, authorizing Leeds Hill Herkenhoff to proceed with a project.
 - Resolution 94-15, final amendment of the 1993-94 fiscal year budget.
- After the unfinished business of a labor Relations Board appointment, the council will enter a closed to the public session to discuss the purchase, acquisition or disposal of real property by the village council.

offset the equipment cost," Nunley said. "The heaviest users will pay the most and the 62-cents could include (repair and replacement) on equipment."

Eggleston said he and Schlarb devised a simpler method of billing, instead of a previously proposed system with many different levels, which would be difficult to track. He anticipates about 26 offices using the service, representing 136 associates. The charge would be \$25 an office, \$3 per associate, plus 62 cents a minute.

"If the password is lost, they would have to pay for the research to find it again," Eggleston said.

If a local access number is used, the county would pay the bill, and 62-cents a minute as a charge to use the computer wouldn't be too high, Eggleston said.

"But if we (users) pay the long distance cost, too, then 62 cents a minute is too much," he said. He pays from 26 to 36 cents a minute for long distance access to other records, he said.

Eggleston also pointed out that the draft agreement contains a provision to renegotiate after 90 days, if the county determines it is losing money or the MLS sees problems.

"The county shouldn't have to absorb any cost," Eggleston said. "You're accommodating the multiple listing service."

"I think the most important part

is that this is a 90-day trial and we can fix it so all are satisfied," Montes said.

Information on a similar service in Santa Fe is being sent to Morel, who said he only saw the draft agreement Friday morning and needed more time to review it.

Howell proposed tabling the issue until June 20 for the fee structure to be completed, and to give Morel time to review the agreement.

In a related item, Schlarb noted that the new access would put an even heavier burden on the county's already overtaxed computer system.

"Putting this on now would greatly decrease the county use of the computer (system), which is at 89.9 percent capacity now," she said.

She asked for approval to proceed with the purchase of a \$46,000 larger and more technologically modern computer system.

"We authorized \$51,000 for a new system," Commissioner Bill Schwettmann said, trying to figure a legitimate way to handle the item Friday.

But Howell pointed out that although he was in favor of the purchase, the item was not on the agenda and is part of the 1994-95 fiscal year budget.

Morel agreed, suggesting commissioners handle it during their next meeting.

anyone. Even deputies can't do that unless they're at a road block checking for something specific or it's for a law violation," Morel said.

"The people in Alto have a valid concern about speeders with the golf carts, kids and joggers on the streets, but if they were stopping drivers, they shouldn't have and will not do it any more."

Handing out flyers at a stop sign when a car already has come to a halt is permissible, he said.

Morel said someone came to his office to complain about being stopped as he was driving into the community.

"I told him I would take care of it immediately and I did," he said. "They can hand out flyers, but they can't force cars to stop."

A representative of the homeowners association said the group was trying to be helpful by printing the flyers.

The sheet states that the roads in Alto Village are neighborhood streets, not highways. Noting that some vehicles have been clocked at 60 to 70 mph, the flyers state that

the association has received the cooperation of Sheriff's office, "and the sheriff has said the speeding in Alto is going to stop."

The sheet lists the progressive fines for speeding that range from \$32 for 10 mph in excess of the speed limit to \$217 for more than 35 mph over the limit. The prevailing speed limit in Alto is 25 mph.

"The Alto Homeowners Association will be watching for repeat speeders, and will report their license numbers to the sheriff for action," the flyer states. "Some of the vehicles have company names on the doors and are easy to identify."

"Summer is here, and there are children on bikes, walkers, residents walking pets, etc., so please slow down for safety's sake!"

Part of Sheriff James McSwane's attempt to slow drivers has been to station one of his older patrol cars on a main street.

A dummy (the stuffed type) sits at the wheel most of the time, although the sheriff has said occasionally, a real deputy will be there to ensure drivers don't begin to ignore the reminder.

According to the sponsor, Susie



McMahon's features fine art

The McMahon Gallery is one of the few places in Ruidoso that sells only original works of art.

Formerly known as Canyon Gallery, when it was located at Carrizo Lodge, McMahon's new gallery is in Jira Plaza on Mechem.

"I don't carry prints," said Tom McMahon, gallery owner. "All the art work is original media, whether it's watercolor, pastels, oils, bronze."

A stroll through McMahon's Gallery can be a lesson in art appreciation. McMahon is happy to explain the significance of a painting or an artist. He has an extensive research library useful in appraising works of art.

McMahon is not snobbish about art. He believes an appreciation of fine art is accessible to everyone, and in the end, it's what appeals to the individual that matters.

"The final litmus test for any piece of art is that you the collector enjoy it," he said.

Contemporary art, McMahon said, should always be purchased

based on a personal reaction to the work, not on an estimation of its future value. Art work with an historical significance makes a better investment.

"Some works see dramatic increases year after year as the museums continue to purchase these works and less and less become available to private collectors," McMahon said.

McMahon's collection encompasses a broad range of tastes and styles, from Impressionist landscapes to Native American motifs. He holds the works of Emil Bistram and B.J.O. Nordfeldt.

He particularly likes to collect the works of New Mexican artists, in many cases artists who have a national following. Fremont Ellis, Dole Reed and Peter Hurd rank among his prominent historical New Mexican artists.

The gallery also features artists such as Carlos Hall, William Schumpert and Tom Knapp. McMahon has collected works by

Ann Templeton, Dorothy Bell Knapp, Martha Keller, Ray Vinella, Wes Smith and Francis deBuda.

McMahon considers himself an art dealer, which he defines as simply a link between the artist and the person viewing the work.

"I do not in the traditional sense sell works of art to people," he said. "For a true work of art, one does not need a salesperson."

Whether you are interested in buying or not, McMahon welcomes you to wander slowly through the gallery, ask questions, absorb the beauty. He especially encourages parents to spend time with their children in art galleries, showing their kids the enjoyment of art.

"When I see a small child in the gallery, I take that child over to some of the pieces of bronze and tell that child he can touch and feel it and have something more than a visual impact," he said.

McMahon believes in the quote, "Fine art is not a luxury. It is a necessity."

Jim Mangas is an award-winning chef. He was executive chef at the Hilton in Dallas, Texas and pastry chef at Inn of the Mountain Gods.

The Myers own two businesses in Seminole, Texas, a grocery store and a barbecue restaurant. They bought a home here in Ruidoso a year ago.

"Whispering Pines had a very good reputation," said Betty Myers. "We wanted to bring back the original."


State drops "Big Cats" in seven lakes

The Department of Game and Fish is adding something new for anglers around the state. This summer, catfish will be stocked at seven lakes in New Mexico.

"What do you mean new, the department has been stocking catfish for years, hasn't it?" No, stocking catfish isn't new, but stocking "Big Cats" is.

In the past, the Department of Game and Fish has stocked catfish, but only when they were available from federal hatcheries. Then, the catfish were small, normally averaging about six inches in length. The catfish being stocked now are being purchased from private sources and will weigh about one and one-fourth pounds. They will range from 14 to 16 inches in length.

Lakes chosen for the new catfish stocking program include Lake Van at Dexter, Green Meadow Lake at Hobbs, Eunice Lake, Jal Lake, Oasis Lake at Portales, Burn Lake at Las Cruces and Tingley Beach in Albuquerque. These lakes are stocked with catchable-size rainbow trout in the winter months and provide lots of fishing pleasure. But when the

water warms up in the summer and no trout can be stocked they have few prospects for the angler, at least until now.

These lakes were also chosen because all tend to be shallow and broad with limited water sources. They constantly recycle nutrients and are potentially productive for fish, however they really aren't adequate for reproduction. That's why a stocking program makes sense at these small lakes and also why the department is not stocking large catfish in waters that are capable of producing big catfish without help.

Plans call for stocking catchable-size catfish

three times a year, in June, July and September. At each stocking, Tingley Beach, Burn Lake and Lake Van will receive almost 700 catfish, Green Meadow and Oasis will get 500 and Eunice and Jal Lakes will get about 175. More than 10,000 catfish will be stocked this year.

In 1994, the Department of Game and Fish will spend about \$19,000 for the catfish stocking program. That turns out to be almost \$1.50 per fish. In order to make the fish available to more anglers the State Game Commission tightened the bag limits on the big catfish waters. The daily bag limit is now two catfish and the possession limit is four in waters stocked with catchable-size catfish.

The program is being patterned after similar programs in other states. Arizona, for example, stocks big catfish in the Phoenix area. The program has become very popular there, and hopefully that will be true in New Mexico. The program will be monitored and, if successful, may be continued in future years to provide added angling opportunities in our state.

Eddie Adams from the Gulf Coast Eatery and Jazz Club, with the assistance of Lincoln Carter provided a mouth watering catfish





"This is not Kansas, Toto!"
Now I know how Dorothy must have felt when she landed in Oz.
When Bud and I got off the train in Los Angeles a few weeks ago, I felt like I'd landed on another planet.
"This is sure not New Mexico, Bud — and it's not even Oklahoma!"
Did you ever wonder what happened to all the Okies who headed west in the Depression? They must have started out as regular folks, looking for opportunity when they loaded up their old pickups with all their worldly possessions and all their kinfolks.
I'm an Okie myself, so I know what to expect from Sooners — there was no evidence in LA that most of the people there had ever set foot in Oklahoma.
They must have shot all the Okies as soon as they hit California, because there are very few normal, middle America people left in that state. I know of just two for sure.

But, back to California ...
In case you're wondering why I'm writing about California, there are two reasons: first, I spent a week there when my boy Chuck graduated from USC Law School, and I've got California on my mind; and second, lots of Californians are moving to New Mexico, and I think we need to be prepared.

Boots, Wranglers and cowboy hats — a different world altogether from Venice Beach, Beverly Hills, Hollywood and LA.
This could be Texas — or New Mexico — or even Kansas, Toto!
So, California people, come on out, but take a deep breath first and be ready to slow down and smell the cactus.
"This is not California, Toto."

Dear Friends,


America's national parks are a fundamental part of our heritage. These wild and unbuilt places have been set aside as a legacy for generations, so that our children may experience them as we did.






