Police look to curfew to curb youth crime

A recent sting operation involving the sale of alcohol to minors and a series of graffiti incidents have prompted discussion by village officials about a little used Ruidoso curfew law.

Mayor Jerry Shaw said Sunday that maybe it's time to enforce the curfew and bring the responsibility back to the parents.

"First of all, I would like to view the records to see if juvenile crime is up," she said.

Shaw said she intends to talk to Ruidoso Police Chief Lanny Maddox early this week regarding the matter. She said she also is concerned about the length of time it takes to clean up graffiti vandalism.

Chief Maddox said incidents of graffiti have been costly to the village.

"When it starts within the town it jeopardizes real estate values," he said.

Maddox said a curfew is an excellent idea.

"If parents were aware of where their children were, it certainly would be a deterrent," he said.

Maddox said there were six juvenile arrests last month, down from 10 during the same time period last year.

According to a village ordinance created in 1988, it is unlawful for "any parent, guardian or person having custody of a minor under the age of 18 to permit or allow such a minor to be upon any public thoroughfare or any public place, or other place, at any time between the hours of 10 p.m. and 5 a.m., Sunday through Thursday, and the hours of midnight and 5 a.m. on Friday and Saturday of each week, unless accompanied by a parent or guardian."

The ordinance excludes a minor accompanied by a parent, guardian or adult acting with the authority of the parent or any minor upon an errand of necessity, or attending religious services, or any legitimate show or athletic event.

The parent or guardian will be held liable.

According to the ordinance, "It shall be the duty of any peace officer to apprehend and take into custody any minor, under the age of 18, found in violation of the curfew."

Council considers garbage rate hike

Ruidoso's 12-year span without a sanitation rate increase may be ending. The village council is expected Tuesday to schedule a public hearing.

According to Gary Jackson, village manager, the Lincoln County Solid Waste Authority (LCSWA) recommended at its last meeting that Ruidoso, Ruidoso Downs, Capitan and the County of Lincoln approve rate increases for residential and commercial garbage collection and disposal.

Robert Beauvais, attorney for LCSWA, reminded the board that it does not have rate making authority, that member entities are responsible for setting rates.

LCSWA manager Joe Lewandowski explained that the "special pick-ups" are the main reason for the need for the residential rate increase in Ruidoso.

Special services are identified as work not part of the regular refuse removal routes. This includes litter control, bear clean-ups, illegal collection and disposal.

Village renegotiates legal services fees

Ruidoso village attorney John Underwood will ask the council Tuesday to renegotiate and renew his legal service contract before the August 9 expiration date.

Underwood is seeking an increase to \$4,000 per month from \$3,200 a month.

"I believe it is imperative to renegotiate and renew prior to the expiration of the current agreement," Underwood wrote village manager Gary Jackson.

"I have contacted Judith Olin, attorney for the Municipal League, for her opinion as to whether this matter has to go out for rebid or can simply be renegotiated based upon change in circumstance, cost of living increase, and/or expanded scope of services, and it is her opinion that the current contract may be renegotiated based upon any or all of the above reasons," he said.

Underwood intends to expand the scope of services from 624 hours

per year to 780 hours per year, providing at least 15 hours of legal counsel for the village per week.

"As you may know, I was told there would be little if any Municipal Court work in relation to this contract," he wrote. "To the contrary, Municipal Court is an important part of this position. For example, I have seven trials scheduled within the next three weeks in Municipal Court."

"In order to do a good job, which I like to do, it is imperative to be prepared for each of those trials, and the additional time allowed under this expanded scope of services would allow for this. Likewise, the village is entering into a very aggressive capital improvement plan, all of which increases the legal work."

Underwood noted that Mike Line, former backup attorney, is now the Municipal Judge, and the

BLM sells land to rancher

In what Lincoln County Commissioners hope is the first of many such actions, a local tract of public land has been transferred to a private owner.

The Bureau of Land Management (BLM) on July 19, transferred 160 acres of public land in Arabela to George S. Sisneros for \$8,800. The transfer is the first sale of public land in the BLM's Roswell Resource Area since 1986.

According to BLM real estate specialist John Rakowski, the tract has been used only by Sisneros in his ranching operation. Extensive private improvements, dating from the 1980s, are located on the parcel. They include a water well, tanks, corral and sheep pens.

Sisneros received the patent to the parcel from acting Roswell Resource Area manager Tim Kreager in a simple ceremony at Timmie Kreager said it made sense for the BLM to sell to Sisneros, because the parcel is surrounded by Sisneros' private land, has no public access and is not easily managed by the BLM.

UNM med students train with local doctors

Two university students spent the summer fine tuning their medical skills while cooling off in mountainous Ruidoso.

Dorsey Clement, 24, and Rachel Hess, 22, of Albuquerque, after completing their freshman year at the University of New Mexico School of Medicine, chose Ruidoso for interning this summer.

The two students completed a 12-week session with Dr. Arlene Brown and Dr. Steven Frey at Family Practice Associates on Sudderth Drive.

Clement said her future goal is in the medical field of pediatrics and Hess in women's health.

Both women selected Ruidoso to witness a rural family doctor's practice and because they found the area attractive.

Clement said one of her more valuable experiences over the session was a research project on domestic violence and Ruidoso's solution to the problem.

She and Hess worked on the project together.

She said Ruidoso's trends track with national averages, no more no less. But a heightened awareness of the problem exists in this community and an active method for solving problems with a crisis center, community-wide support among merchants to help house and feed the victims and very rigid restrictions by District Judge Richard Parsons.

Ruidoso Downs Police Chief David Hightower helps by educating his own officers and the public about domestic violence.

Ruidoso assistant police chief Michael Lovelace provided statistics for the project.

Hess said her house calls with the home health nurses gave her an insight into ways of helping people to become self sufficient as long as possible, and the ability to stay at

home and care for themselves instead of moving into a dependent environment.

"What was really interesting was the diversity of the people we saw, especially diverse in economics," Hess said. "I saw one woman who had hired a cook to help her with her situation and another family used Meals on Wheels so that they could continue their independence.

"Some families had more of a family support, others relied on a variety of contractual services to get the job done. It was just a very broad spectrum of situations from personal caretakers to families joining together to keep the relative at home."

The interns said they would return to their sophomore year at the end of August and perhaps, visit Ruidoso again in another year.

Commercial rate comparisons include: Hobbs, \$54; Otero County, \$52; Alamogordo, \$49; Dona Ana County, \$50; Las Cruces, \$47; Lincoln County, \$45; Roswell, \$41.50; Silver City, \$67 (mandatory six times pickup); Carrizozo, \$39; Tularosa, \$37; Santa Fe, \$36; Cloudercroft, \$31; Socorro, \$30; Capitan, \$29; Deming, \$27; Carlsbad, \$24; Ruidoso Downs, \$18; Artesia, \$12; and Ruidoso, \$9.

Lewandowski said special services has little-to-no revenue return and is high in labor and cost.

The proposed residential rate for Ruidoso customers is \$7.50 per month, \$1.50 over the current rate. The proposed commercial rate is \$29 per month, an increase of \$20 per month.

Lewandowski submitted cost comparisons to the LCSWA board that showed commercial and residential rates to be among the lowest in the state.

He said comparisons should be based on service for the dollar.

Residential rate comparisons include: Carrizozo, \$12.96; Silver City, \$9; Hobbs, \$8.75; Roswell, \$8.30; Ruidoso Downs, \$8; Alamogordo, \$7.80; Santa Fe, \$7.69; Las Cruces, \$7.50; Artesia, \$7.50; Capitan, \$7.50; Cloudercroft, \$7.50; Carlsbad, \$7; Socorro, \$7; Ruidoso, \$6; Deming, \$5.85; and Lincoln County, \$5.25.

In other business, the council will:

—act on a preliminary and final plat request for a minor subdivision of 3.549 acre tract owned by Donald Andrews, owner. Andrews is dividing the acreage into three lots with at least one acre in each lot.

—vote on a resolution authorizing a joint powers agreement with the New Mexico Environment Department for the Grindstone Water Treatment Facility.

—consider a draft proposal for the creation of an Arts and Film Board.

—consider whether to reschedule or cancel the regular meeting of August 30. The New Mexico Municipal League's annual conference is scheduled to begin on August 31, in Carlsbad.

Consent agenda items to be approved collectively by the council are:

—a recommendation from the Lodgers Tax Committee for special events receiving lodgers tax.

—a recommendation from the Utility Dispute Board regarding a bill for water leak adjustment.

—a contract with the state on aging for the Retired Services Volunteer Program (RSVP) Program.

—out-of-state travel for Parks and Recreation employees to Phoenix, Arizona, to the regional tennis tournament.

Village manager reports will include the MainStreet project, airport project and the legislative interim Capital Outlay Committee Hearings.

Upper Canyon group opposes MRS

As the Mescalero Apache Tribe moves ahead on its plans to develop a storage facility for radioactive waste on its reservation, a local property owner vowed last week to fight the proposal.

More than 50 members of the Ruidoso Upper Canyon Association met Saturday to hear an update by State Representative H. John Underwood (D-Ruidoso) on the Mescalero proposal and to map a strategy to block it.

Underwood, continuing a theme established during previous meetings of other groups that are opposed to the idea of spent nuclear fuel rods for neighbors, said the proposal "is not a done deal."

The tribe, a sovereign nation based in adjoining Otero County, has been joined by 33 nuclear power companies and three nuclear industry companies in its pursuit of a storage facility. The companies are running out of space on site to store their spent nuclear fuel rods.

Underwood pointed out that as part of the 1982 Nuclear Waste Policy Act, the government Department of Energy has collected \$8 billion to come up with a solution to the problem. Efforts of a federal nuclear negotiator to arrange voluntary siting of a facility have failed to yield results.

However, the voluntary siting

program attracted the attention of Mescalero leaders and financed the first two studies they undertook.

The government and utilities are attracted to the possibility of building an Indian reservation because tribes are considered sovereign nations and do not fall under state, county or city jurisdiction. That would eliminate many obstacles and delays.

In Minnesota, Northern States Power, which has taken the lead in trying to develop a private facility on the reservation, faces a possible shutdown in a few years, if it cannot come up with additional space.

Underwood said 25,000 metric tons of radioactive waste already have been generated and are being stored at more than 70 nuclear sites in the United States.

Mescalero tribal vice president Fred Peso and other tribal leaders contend the storage complex will bring great economic growth and independence to tribe members.

They consider it one more profitable private enterprise that can be managed safely to the benefit of the reservation. And they have pointed out that collision-resistant canisters have been designed to encase the rods while being transported.

Underwood reviewed the chronological schedule prepared by tribal officials, noting that from Oc-

tober 1994, through June 1996, the tribe and its 33 nuclear power company partners will be working on preparation of a Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) license application and will be developing transportation plans.

Within the last week, tribal consultant Miller Hudson has indicated existing railroad routes, plus a new spur to the proposed Mescalero storage site, will be used.

Peso has said that at some point, a referendum of tribal members will be conducted on whether to proceed with the storage project.

An additional \$8 million will have to be raised by the tribe and partners, Underwood said.

From June 1996 to September 2001, hearings must be conducted before the NRC, he said. If the Mescalero tribal leaders are successful, construction could begin in 1999 with the opening set for 2001.

Underwood encouraged opponents to stay aggressively active and to develop a list of the appropriate persons to call or write about different aspects of the project.

"Be pro-active, not re-active," he said.

He also warned against emotional outbursts.

"They're not as effective as logical, educated, but firm appeals," he said.

village will need another backup attorney, primarily to be used when he is in Santa Fe at the State Legislature. Underwood is a state representative.

He said he had a discussion with Charles Rennick who is willing to be on board to act as backup counsel in his absence. He said he is prepared to enter into a contract with him should the renegotiation be successful.

The new contract would account

for the expanded time commitment and raise Underwood's hourly fee from \$56 per hour to \$66 per hour, which he considers more realistic. He said his standard hourly fee is \$125.

Underwood said he would like to continue to represent the village for the next year, if the terms for renewal and renegotiation of the contract as he proposes are agreed upon by the council.

Village manager Gary Jackson noted in meeting packets sent to

councilors that the current legal services contract states that the initial term is one year with a provision to be annually renewable for three additional one-year terms, unless terminated by either party giving 30 days written notice.

Jackson said Underwood, in order to avoid a conflict of interest, contacted Judy Olin, legal counsel for the New Mexico Municipal League for independent advice. Underwood reported to Jackson that Olin found the proposed arrangement acceptable.

The parcel was appraised by the BLM and sold at fair market value for \$56 an acre, he said.

To purchase an easement for public access to the parcel and road construction would have cost the BLM an estimated \$18,000, Rakowski said.

A news release on the transfer noted that other transfers of public land to private ownership are expected when the Roswell Resource Management Plan is finished in late 1995.

A large part of the acreage identified in the plan for possible disposal is located in Lincoln County, Kreager said. Eventually, many thousands of acres of small, hard-to-manage public land parcels could be transferred to private ownership, he said.

Lincoln County commissioners have called for the BLM to sell public parcels to compensate for additional land in the county the agency is acquiring along the Rio Bonito near the historic settlement of Lincoln.

Hearing about the Sisneros transfer, Commissioner Bill Schwetmann told The Ruidoso News Sunday that he's pleased to see one parcel placed back on the county's property tax rolls.

"That's the beauty of it," he said. "I haven't seen the transaction, but this is a first for the BLM doing anything except outlandish (land) trades. I would say this is a step forward and I hope, not a token deal just to appease us or others who are objecting to everything they are doing."

Although the juvenile is taken into custody of a peace officer, the action would not be termed an arrest.

"The peace officer or juvenile authority shall, at the earliest possible time, notify such parent or

guardian and on conviction, the parent or guardian would be deemed guilty for violating the ordinance for permitting the violation."

According to the ordinance, in the event that the parent or guardian cannot be located within a rea-

sonable time, the minor will be remanded to the custody of the proper juvenile authority. In no event shall such a minor at any time be unduly detained in any lockup or jail except as provided by the Children's Code of the State of New Mexico.

Judge Parsons' court tapped for pilot project for automated records system

The Twelfth Judicial District Court in Carrizozo has been selected as part of a pilot group of courts to receive personal computer and office support software.

The project represents a portion of a statewide program to automate magistrate and district courts.

Many New Mexico courts currently have no automation at all, while others operate with outdated computer systems, according to information from the Judicial Information Systems Council.

Automation will improve efficiency of court operations, improve services to citizens and improve the quality of court records, especially in tracking DWI (drunk

drinking) violations and violators, a council news release stated.

District Judge Richard A. Parsons, 12 Judicial District, appointed site coordinator Eugenia Vega to be responsible for installation and support of computers in the local office. She recently attended five days of intensive training in the technology.

The computers were shipped to Carrizozo following that session and are being installed.

The first office application will be a package that assists court personnel in generating court forms. Other office software may be shipped to pilot courts over the next few months, depending on the initial experience.

The effort to install personal computers for office automation in selected courts is one part of a two-prong program to build and implement a statewide computer system to manage court cases and court records.

A contract has been signed with National Systems Research to design and create the computer programs for a statewide court system. The goal is to have a prototype system up and running in early 1995 and to install the system in most district and magistrate courts in the fall of 1995.

The State Legislature has allocated money to the Supreme Court for the upgrade of the computer systems.

"He's more of a domestic pet," Harper said. "He does fine with other dogs, and he's housebroken. He bumps the door when he wants to go outside. He rides well in a car, and he knows the sit, stay, come and heel commands."

Harry also enjoys playing with a ball, and is good with children of all ages.

"He'd be a good watchdog," Harper said.

An attractive buff color chow mix, Dusty, is about three years old, and was found wandering in the White Mountain Meadows subdivision. He was wearing a black studded collar, but no tags.

"He's very obedient," Harper said. "He will stay in the pen until we are ready for him to move. He's even tempered, but craves attention. He would thrive as the only pet in a family."

Volunteers are needed in many

capacities for the society, including helping out a few weeks at the thrift shop, exercising the shelter dogs, playing with the cats or fostering litters until they have received all of their protective shots. Donations to sponsor an animal for neutering or to pay for new pens needed in the expanded shelter also are appreciated.

The Saturday visits to Wal-Mart, where volunteers take a puppy and kitten to meet the public, also are under way again and help would be welcome. Last Saturday, Winnie, an adorable fluffy shepherd/chow/Bernese mountain dog puppy was a big hit, but failed to find a home.

Farmers' group says "don't shoot!"

The board of directors of the state's largest agricultural organization voted to admonish the officials in charge of Bandelier National Monument for shooting cattle on the park and ignoring state law in regard to disposition of stray cattle. John Van Sweden, president of the New Mexico Farm and Livestock Bureau (NMF&LB), said the board was concerned about the recent shooting of 18 head of cattle on the park, because such unbranded animals are the property of the state and should be remanded to the State Livestock Board.

If the cattle are branded, every effort to find the rightful owners should be made. "Federal employees are killing cattle at Bandelier and we're asking Governor King to stop this practice until these bureaucrats understand their obligations under state law. We feel the Livestock Board should also be given at least ten days notice if they plan on killing any more cattle," he said. In a statement released from its quarterly board meeting in Ruidoso, the NMF&LB board said the organization is exploring its legal options in the matter.

"We feel that the officials at Bandelier should abide by the same laws that any citizen of the state is required to follow in regard to handling branding or unbranded stray livestock. In addition, there are some possible precedents being set here that our members are very concerned about," Van Sweden said. The NMF&LB will contact the Department of Interior and the Governor's office. The NMF&LB is the state's largest agricultural organization representing more than 11,000 families, businesses, associations and commodity groups.

Saddle up for the Pony Express

Time to saddle up the fastest horses in your corral and head to White Oaks for the Twenty-sixth Annual Pony Express Race. This year's event, Saturday, August 6, is dedicated to the late Fern Sawyer, a well-known local rancher who was elected to both the Cowboy and Cowgirl halls of fame. A plaque will be presented to Sawyer's family after the annual 35-mile race from the Capitan Gap road to White Oaks. The horses and riders will break for the trail at 8 a.m. and will finish about 9:30 a.m.

Other teams that have signed up are headed by Dennis Moquino of Zia Pueblo in Bernalillo; David Weirito from Dulce; Jamie Hindi from Duran, a frequent winner in Lincoln County; Susie and Jabe Kester of New Reyer, Colorado; Preston DeJesus of Dulce; and the Gutierrez and Perea Riding Teams from Dulce. Race organizer Lisa Annala said many of the Dulce teams just finished their own race, the Little Beaver Pony Express Race, July 15, which runs over the Jicarilla Apache territory. Prizes for the White Oaks race this year include a cash award that still is growing as each new team pays its entry fee, and as more money is donated or comes from fund-raising events. Other items include a scabbard donated by Isidro Peralta of Capitan, that will be tooled with

the horse, rider, event and date. First, second and third place inscribed buckles also will be awarded. Annala said the Sheriff's Department will provide more of a presence this year, regulating the start and finish, as well as keeping traffic to a minimum on the race route following county road 139 between Capitan and White Oaks. The 5.7 miles of pavement between Encinoza and road 139 will be roadside cut to allow horse room on the dirt beside the surface. Maggie Bohks, emergency services coordinator for the county, will provide coverage for human injuries. Veterinarian Becky Washburn will serve as a consultant for the four-legged contestants. A Frito pie sale at Fort Stanton fire hall, a tour of the race route and a barbecue and team meeting at the arena at 6 p.m. round out the activities on Friday, August 5, leading up to the race. 

At the graveside, the Reverend Cockrell thanked God for the beautiful day, with flowers and soft music in the tall evergreens overhead, and said that Roy's life was like a beautiful song. Pallbearers were Steve Lare, Greg Lare, Kelsey Lare, Monte Lare, Brandon Lare, Aaron Lare and Barry Miller. During the 30 years that Maurine and Roy have lived here among us, they have brought much happiness into our lives. A few years ago, when I had my Monday morning radio program, I used to stop by Roy's garage where he would play a few of his favorite songs on my tenor banjo. It made you happy to be in the company of Roy Lare. He was a true Christian gentleman



7-1 longshot Dash Its Couper wins the Futurity by a neck over 8-5 favorite Melt-down, Sunday at Ruidoso Downs Race track, the Grade I \$538,000 Rainbow Track.

Triple Crown hopes dashed!

Liz Brown's Dash Its Couper denied Melt-down a shot at the quarter horse triple crown when she beat the Ruidoso Futurity winner by a neck in the Grade I \$538,000 Rainbow Futurity, Sunday at Ruidoso Downs.

The Larry Keiter-trained filly was making only her second career start in the 400-yard race after winning her debut in the July 7 trials where she clocked the sixth fastest qualifying time.

Dash Its Couper, a 7-1 longshot, broke second from the gate and trailed 8-5 favorite Melt-down in the early stages of the race.

Midway down the racing strip, it became a three-horse race with Melt-down holding a half-length lead over Dash Its Couper on the inside and Blinded By The Light on the outside.

With less than 100 yards to go,

Dash Its Couper took control under strong urging by veteran jockey Larry Layton and then held on for the win. The time was :20.01 over a fast track.

"She broke just a little tardy from a lack of experience and it took her awhile just to get her footing, but when she got it together she just went to runnin' by 'em and didn't have any trouble at all," said Layton who had never won a futurity at Ruidoso in his three decades of riding at the mountaintop racetrack.

Trainer Larry Keiter was the only conditioner to qualify two horses to the rich futurity when both Dash Its Couper and Six Cantu ran fast enough in the trials to earn a berth in today's race.

Six Cantu was never a factor and ran seventh, but Keiter's other runner came through to give the

trainer his second Rainbow win. He also captured the race in 1987 with the filly Dash For Speed.

"She broke better today than she's ever broke and I'm awful proud of her," said Keiter.

Retired rancher Brown, 76, of Andrews, Texas, has owned horses for more than 20 years and like his jockey and trainer, notched his first Rainbow win.

"I've been real close, but I always caught a bad wind, rain or missed it by 1/100ths of a second," said Brown who purchased Dash Its Couper for \$18,000 at last year's Ruidoso Horse Sales.

The filly earned \$222,234 for her efforts today. Dash Its Couper is nominated to the Grade I \$3 million All American Futurity and is expected to make her next start in the August 19 trials for the third triple crown jewel.



Curfews: a help to police, but a hassle to some teens

Curfews may or may not be the answer to curbing Albuquerque's juvenile crime wave, but they've been in effect here in Ruidoso for many years, and they're an important ingredient in deterring crime.

The Ruidoso ordinance requires youth under 17 to be off the streets from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. on weekdays and midnight to 5 a.m. on weekends. Exceptions are made for emergencies and work schedules.

Opponents of youth curfews say they single out one entire age group of citizens — teenagers — as potential troublemakers. Some young people believe their rights are violated when they can't come and go as they please.

Proponents wonder why young people need to be out on the street in the middle of the night, anyway; adding that teens should be home in bed, not driving around or "hanging out" in parking lots. Public safety considerations override any perceived right to be out and about at all hours, is the contention of people who favor a curfew.

One local teen, who also works nights at a recreation spot, thinks the curfew is a good thing, but it's not enforced. She said it's a good deterrent to help keep kids out of trouble. Older folks wonder why families aren't taking responsibility for their own children, making sure they're home on time.

Keeping a curfew hasn't caused any hardship among Ruidoso young people, and it may be a good start for our bigger neighbor up north in its efforts to cut down on the rising number of violent crimes committed by teens.

That Can't Be Wood! with Mike Kent will be broadcast Saturdays, at 8:30 a.m. beginning July 30th.


