Downs board meets at 7 p.m. tonight

The regular meeting of the of the Village of Ruidoso Downs Board of Trustees is at 7 p.m. today (Monday), August 8, at the Ruidoso Downs Municipal Building.

On the agenda is a public hearing on raising residential and commercial sanitation rates, a report on the bids for a new village hall refrigerator, the hiring of a full time dispatcher, and lodgers tax requests.

Parks and Rec priorities are aired publicly

How to stretch the tax dollar to accommodate big plans by a small Ruidoso Parks and Recreation staff dominated discussion last week at the first of three parks board public hearings.

According to parks director Debbie Jo Almager, the hearings are scheduled to increase community input for a 10 year master plan now being created.

Almager said park needs would be assessed to find grant money to accomplish priority projects.

Parks commission chairman James Townsend asked that citizens informally direct their wish list to the members of the commission attending the session, Bill Wooley, Rene Bustamante, Jim Stoddard and Jim Hammond.

Almager opened discussion Tuesday, August 2, with a list of priority issues topped by a parks commitment to the Americans with Disability Act (ADA) compliance.

A variety of issues discussed included:

—the sensitivity of not competing with existing merchants selling sports equipment or campground rentals.

Almager provided some statistics from a survey circulated to citizens on various park issues. Nearly 75 percent of the respondents to the survey said that the parks department should not use existing facilities or properties as rental opportunities for concessionaires.

—a Grindstone Lake handicap accessible fishing pier.

—expanding improvements to neighborhood parks.

The majority of citizens on the park survey said that neighborhood parks were needed as long as they were well maintained, adding they would enhance Ruidoso and be good for the children.

Citizens against developing more neighborhood parks said they

County to gain big bucks from novel idea

What was termed "a good business proposal" meant to save Lincoln County money may be dropped, because of government red tape.

And in the process, county road manager Bill Cupit was criticized Tuesday by two commissioners for spending time trying a new approach to save money, instead of following a directive to purchase chip seal equipment to surface roads.

Cupit explained that weather for chip seal won't be appropriate until next spring and he planned in the interim to look carefully for the best deal.

Meanwhile, he was trying to save the county \$210,000 that could be used toward the purchase of six new dump trucks, he said.

"I know what you were trying to do and I don't take it lightly," said Commission Chairman Monroy Montes.

Commissioner Bill Schwetmann added that he'd like to commend Cupit for looking into a new approach and "trying to get the best deal for the county."

Instead of turning used equipment back to the company, Cupit suggested taking advantage of the county's equity in the machinery. To date, the county has paid \$257,697 to the dealer in the form of 209 lease payments.

He proposed buying for \$449,660 six bladders, a bulldozer and a roller that the county has been leasing, then turning around and selling them for about \$660,000. The excess \$210,340 could be used toward the purchase of six newer dump trucks and the county also would

lease eight newer models of the blades, dozer and roller.

He received quotes to purchase the used units from three dealers, Cupit said.

"I'm using all low money figures," he said. "This probably would be one of the first times these have been done in New Mexico."

"These are good deals, but we just can't carry \$600,000 on the (chance the deal will go through)," Schwetmann said. "We just can't accept (Rust Tractor's) deal and then have equipment sit there 30-45 days and the lease price might change."

He questioned whether the county might be left without blades.

Cupit said the county could hang on to its older blades until the purchase of new units is completed. A minimum bid amount could be required by the county for the pur-

Vendor stands future up to village council

Ruidoso vendors and their portable vending stands will see limited action in the future, if an ordinance is passed Tuesday at the village council meeting.

The ordinance up for vote at the public hearing defines portable or mobile vending stands and prohibits their use except when the operation is temporary and in connection with special community or civic events.

The licensed vendor and stand is restricted to location and duration of that civic event.

A second public hearing on the agenda relates to allowable fencing in Ruidoso.

The ordinance as presented would allow use of razor and barbed wire at the top of the fence only by private and public utilities and at industrial developments.

Barbed and razor wire would not

chase of the used equipment. Bids under that amount could be rejected.

"I can see the pitfalls," Commissioner Wilton Howell said. "It could be a lawyer's dream. You can't tie someone to a quote."

He noted that Caterpillar is on strike. "It's dangerous," he said.

But Cupit said a dealer has 15 dump trucks in stock and is holding six for the county, "if we can give commitment."

"How can we do that when we'll have to go out to bid?" Howell asked.

"Seems to be a lot of exposure here," Commissioner L. Ray Nunley agreed.

Cupit explained that he had the money for the proposal, because he had not moved ahead with the purchase of chip seal equipment.

BLM realignment sought

Lincoln County Commissioners agreed Tuesday to join the Bureau of Land Management in asking for money to pay for the realignment of a road accessing public lands at Fort Stanton.

The road now being used by tourists goes through Camp Sierra Blanca Adult Rehabilitation Center, a minimum security prison.

Sierra Blanca warden Sandra McFadin had complained that tourists are going through camp property to reach BLM land on the Fort Stanton reservation. Leslie Cone, district manager of the bureau (BLM) asked for a letter of support from the commission in her request for \$100,000 to realign the road.

"I felt if Lincoln County agreed with the BLM about something, they'd be so shocked, the project might very well be funded," Commissioner Wilton Howell said.

He was referring to a multi-year battle by the commission to oppose the acquisition of more private land in the county by that agency.

In other action, commissioners approved vacating roads never built in the Jones tract of Nogal

Township.

—approved reimbursing the Lincoln County Fair Association for the \$3,694 cost of liability insurance as provided for in the county's contract with the association for management of the fairground.

—appointed Commissioner Stirling Spencer, who has engineering background, to serve as the commission's representative on the MRS (Monitored Retrievable Storage) Regional Information Committee. The group is comprised of elected officials from entities that might be affected by the Mescalero Apache Tribal Council's plan to store high level nuclear waste on the reservation neighboring Ruidoso.

—stuck an agreement with the Hondo Valley Public School District and the Keesee Ranch for the county road department to restructure a baseball field. The ranch will give the county 8,500 yards of caliche (a road building material) for use in Arabela and 3,200 yards of top soil for the school project.

County attorney Alan Morel said no anti-donation violation is involved, because the county is receiving road building material in exchange work at the school.

Award winning principal pledges safety and quality at RHS

Take 25 years in the New Mexico public and private school systems as a high school principal and superintendent of schools, mix with sociology teaching, stir in football, wrestling, and track coaching experience, and the recipe yields the new principal of Ruidoso High School, Ron Hodges.

Principal Hodges has received numerous awards during his career

including the 1971 New Mexico Teacher of the Year Award, Three New Mexico Coach of the Year Awards, and the 1991 New Mexico Administrator of the Year award.

Along with this wealth of experience Hodges brings a new philosophy to the school system.

"My main objective is that the students at Ruidoso High School receive a quality education," said Hodges, "I decided I wanted to try

something that probably hasn't been done in the state of New Mexico, and that was to take a private school mentality and bring it to a public school environment."

Hodges said he is excited about working with the superintendent and the school board because they want to change direction.

"I felt gratified that they selected me to change that direction because I've had a history in the

state of New Mexico for being able to take schools and change the direction in a hurry."

Hodges emphasizes that students must feel that they can learn in a safe educational setting.

"School should be fun but within a structured environment. We will not tolerate a student or group of students detracting from the education process. I realize I'm very strict, but I'm extremely fair and I

do temper my strictness with total fairness."

Helping students develop a sense of pride in their school which will stop a lot of the other little problems is another of Hodges goals.

"We've been working with the student council," said Hodges "and they're excited about the fact that this is their school and they are going to be proud of their school."

Hodges praised the staff and the student council for helping with the changes taking place at the school. The high school has received new computers for the computer lab, the gymnasium has been redone, and the curriculum has been streamlined.

Hodges, the school staff, and the student council also have developed and re-structured the student handbook which is given out on the first day of school.

"It's a no lose situation, because I won't buy the new until the sale of the used is assured," Cupit said.

"I like the deal," Schwettmann said. "It could be a paper thing, no pay off to Rust (Tractors) until the others are sold."

"What about the chip seal equipment that was voted on by the commission?" Howell asked, adding that a directive by the commission should have been followed.

"I'm disappointed in the whole process," Nunley said. "I have promised several people we'd be in the chip seal business to improve our roads and now I hear you're using this as leverage."

"Chip seal is not a damn bit of good without dump trucks," Cupit said.


manager Carolin Cooney to contract the State Department of Finance and Administration (DFA) to see if officials there approved of the process.

"In private business, I would access this in a New York minute," Schwettmann said. "You can't chip seal until next spring, so you're not hurting anyone now anyway."

"See what DFA would sanction and come back," Montes said. "If we can get beyond that hurdle, the three of you can get together and decide the route to proceed."

Cupit said he will prepare bid document immediately for chip seal equipment and will look for another source of revenue if the commission decides to proceed with the proposal as he outlined.

Montes directed Cupit, county attorney Alan Morel and county



—creating additional areas for softball and soccer. The Ruidoso school district is bringing soccer into the sports system.

be permitted in any residential area.

Planning commission approval would be required for all use of barbed and razor wire, showing a necessity to gain approval.

A resident's nightmare utility bill will more than likely end Tuesday with the council.

Jerry Windham walked into Ruidoso Village Hall on May 20 to dispute his March water bill for \$3,486. Windham had used 786,340 gallons of water, according to village records.

In research, the utility staff found that the meter leaked on the customer's side and that a hole pierced the meter can.

Village manager Gary Jackson authorized a credit of \$1,717.99,

about one half of the bill, but Windham politely disagreed and requested a hearing before the Utility Dispute Board.

That board recommended the council relieve Windham of the amount over and above the minimum usage, due to the broken meter can top.

Windham's new balance is \$19.44, the average minimum per month for a customer. The council will rule on the recommendation.

In other business, the council will:

—vote to amend the master plan for a tract in Airport West from a high density residential area to low density residential.

Planner Cleatus Richards said seven nearby owners responded fa-

vorably to the rezoning and one responded against. He said the objector's property is high density and the objector was concerned about the possible effect on his ability to obtain commercial zoning.

—vote to allow a private septic system in Middle Cedar Subdivision, where public sewer is not available.

The New Mexico Environmental Department has approved the private septic use.

—hear a request from Chris Weatherford, coordinator for the Lincoln County Mothers Against Drunk Driving (MADD).

—Consent agenda items, to be approved collectively, include:

—a bid award on the aviation gas and jet fuel to Avfuel Corporation for the airport.

—out of state travel expense for the parks and recreation department director to attend the National Recreation and Parks Association Annual National Conference.

—scheduling a public hearing on September 13, regarding noise regulations.

—scheduling a public hearing on September 13, relating to the uniform fire code.

Village manager Jackson will report on the New Mexico Finance Authority Equipment Loan Program and update Environmental Protection Agency penalties for the polymer spill at Water Treatment Plant No. 1.

Jackson also will report on the New Mexico Municipal League resolutions committee meeting and present a Main Street update.

Taking care of patients is the name of the business

Keith Thomas and long-time friend and partner, Steve Wright, will celebrate Ruidoso Medical Supply's first year anniversary in early September.

With a 20-year career in public safety that encompasses being a paramedic, ambulance driver and firefighter, Thomas thought it was a natural to open a business that serves people with medical needs.

It isn't just providing the wheelchairs, crutches, walkers, hospital beds, portable commodes and other hospital items as well as home oxygen, it is in the service.

"This is a people business and these people have real needs and concerns. They know they can talk to me, an owner of this business, 24 hours a day," Thomas stresses.

There isn't a charge for calling after hours.

"The name of this business is taking care of patients and doing what they want," he adds.

The largest portion of his business is providing concentrated home oxygen machines which takes oxygen out of the air and filters it to about 95 to 96 percent pure oxygen. It is pumped to an outlet that goes into a nasal cannula and is easy for patients to use. In addition to this machine, there is also a liquid oxygen system in a lightweight portable canister.

Oxygen is stored at 285 degrees below zero and when it warms up to around 274 degrees below zero it turns into a gas. Filled from a base tank, it has the advantage of allowing the user to be away from the concentrated tank for as many as eight hours.

Thomas notes that even though it is much more expensive, it makes life so much easier for the patient.

"We work with our patients to try to help them enjoy life. I don't believe I have a patient who isn't my friend," he adds quietly.

Ruidoso Medical Supply has a full-time registered respiratory therapist who does home respiratory care and a certified respiratory therapist on staff. Each employee takes part in regular training sessions to keep abreast of the latest in home health care.

One of the newest types of oxygen therapy is the trans-tracheal approach. Those who are a candidate for this surgical procedure are those who need a lot more oxygen than they can get from their nasal cannula. An incision is made in the trachea, then the catheter is discreetly attached and can be placed inside clothing before connecting to the canister.

"Women like this because if they button a high-necked blouse, the incision is hidden and people will think that the portable they are carrying is a large handbag," Thomas remarks.

The disadvantage is that the incision must be cleaned twice daily, although there isn't usually any discomfort attached to the process.

Thomas smiles happily when he cites the relationship between him and his partner believing they are one of the few partnerships where the parties have remained friends.

Wright is the in-house medical director and owns the Clovis store. On or about August 1, a satellite operation will go into effect in Alamogordo.

Thomas attributes the "patient comes first" motto to their rapid growth.

"In fact, if I have three sustained and documented complaints against an employee, they're out of here," he states.

Fortunately, Murphy's Law is seldom in effect since only one in about 1,000 machines fails to operate properly, but when that occurs someone is always available to switch out the machine.

"We go through a monthly maintenance check to make certain that the machine is fully operational. Interestingly, Medicare says if a machine is putting out 85 percent oxygen, it is OK, but we replace or repair equipment if it isn't putting out at least 95 percent. We can make only small repairs, major

ones require factory service," Thomas comments.

Ruidoso can have minor power outages due to lightning strikes. A very brief outage usually doesn't affect the equipment, but should it be a sustained problem, there is back-up equipment. These compressed gas oxygen cylinders hold up to five hours of oxygen plus there are conserving cannulas which reduces oxygen flow when it isn't needed, namely when breath is exhaled. Additionally, there are larger cylinders that can last for seven days or more.

Thomas recounts that in an emergency situation, concerns are evaluated and steps are taken to remedy the situation.

"We didn't start this business to hurt others' business, because we know there is enough business for all of us. In fact, I try always to know what other local businesses carry so if I am asked about an item that I don't carry, I can refer the people to them," Thomas affirms.

With this type of attitude, it isn't surprising that patient and physician referrals have helped this business to grow.



Missed meeting draws official apology

Alamogordo city officials have apologized by letter for missing a meeting last week with Lincoln County commissioners and U.S. Forest Service representatives.

"We apologize for any misunderstanding that may have occurred and look forward to working with the commission and forest service on this important project."

Commission Chairman Monroy Montes and Commissioner Wilton Howell arrived at the meeting August 1, with county manager Carolina Cooney and road manager Bill

Cupit. The purpose was to discuss a road reconstruction project leading to Bonito Lake as a mutual project with the service and Alamogordo handling the financial end, and the county accepting maintenance.

After waiting about 20 minutes, forest service engineer Geri Rivers called Alamogordo and was told that neither Stockwell nor Moore were in their offices. Thinking the two men were on their way to Ruidoso, the group waited another 20 minutes, then the meeting broke up and Lincoln officials left.

Vaden and Grace now live in Santa Cruz, California. They have happy memories of Lincoln County and they are kindly remembered by all of us.



The 5-year-old gray gelding by Pyromantic popped the gates in the 400-yard dash and never looked back as he cruised home much the best under jockey Kenneth Hart. The time was :20.03.

2-1 second choice Merry Ego was second with fellow longshot Sitting On A Native a half-length back in third.

3-5 favorite Six To Five had not started since breaking the 370-yard track record in Albuquerque in January, but broke tardily from the gate and never hit full stride to finish fourth.

"I just loved him once and sat on him once in the gates this week and that's all I knew about him," said Hart. "He has the ability to get away quick from there (the gate)

when they said go. The nine horse (Merry Ego) made a big move with 100 yards to go, but he just pulled away from him at the wire."

Trainer Jimmy Jones did not make the trip down from Albuquerque so local conditioner Tim Cross saddled Designs By Pyro in the Zia.

Ken Newton's Sitting On A Native garnered \$1,910 for his efforts. The six-year-old gelding by Sitting On Go is trained by Jack Henby and owned by Newton of Artesia. Jerry Rodriguez rode.

Driving drunk is a poor choice with or without new state laws

Lawmakers meeting during this year's legislative session set out to get drunk drivers off the streets once and for all. The task turned out to be even harder than expected.

The new law and stepped up enforcement are credited with decreasing alcohol related traffic deaths state-wide and in Bernalillo County, the state's biggest population center. The verdict is still out on some facets of the new DWI package, and the State Legislature can be expected to fine tune the laws next year.

A public outcry following a tragic fatal crash that nearly wiped out an entire family on Christmas Eve, prompted legislators to upgrade some drunk driving charges to a felony, to create a new category of aggravated DWI and mandate public education for drivers. At the same time, the legislature gave jail directors the authority to cut jail terms for inmates by up to two-thirds. Jailers can dole out two days of credit for every one day served when the inmate performs community service or other chores within the jail. The saying, "do the crime, you serve the time," is only a third true in most cases.

But, getting drunk drivers off the streets is too important to leave in the hands of politicians and jailers. Educational programs should be started in the schools in the lower grades. It's never too early to learn not to drink and drive.

Mothers Against Drunk Driving (MADD) and Students Against Driving Drunk (SADD) are two local organizations affiliated with national groups who advocate for better education, better driver training and more peer pressure not to drive drunk. Join them.

Friends and families, too, should get involved and see that the people you love aren't driving drunk. Take the keys, offer to drive, agree to be the designated driver — whatever you do, don't let your friends and family drive drunk.

The laws and enforcement really aren't the point. Drunk driving kills, and whether the police arrest every drunk driver or not, reasonable people don't want to endanger themselves, their friends and family — if they're thinking clearly. But, sometimes people who drink put their brain on vacation, so the people who care for them must intervene.

Before you get behind the wheel, put your brain in gear. Driving drunk is a poor choice with or without new laws and tougher sentencing. You've got more to lose than your driver's license — you could die or kill someone else. Friends don't let friends drive drunk, so why not take care of yourself?



Upon Reflection

Bruce King: Lots of advice, less money, down in the polls

Bruce King is getting lots of campaign advice these days. Some of it is conflicting. Much turns on money. A good bit depends upon the vagaries of Republican Gary Johnson and the Green party's Robert Mondragon. None of it can be guaranteed to work.


The Albuquerque Journal's recent poll showing the governor trailing Johnson by eight points was not the first to reveal the troubles facing the embattled King in his bid for reelection. Earlier private post-primary polls told much the same tale.

But the Journal poll, simply by being out there for all to ponder, has sharpened pressures on King to do something, quickly, to reverse his reduced fortunes. Virtually all King campaign intimates agree that Johnson and Mondragon, perhaps more than King himself, are key to the governor's ability to run things around.

King, they point out, is a known quantity, an unenviable status in this era of anti-incumbent sentiments. Newcomer Johnson, on the other hand, is a blank screen upon which voters can project whatever their hopes and dreams. As a consequence, argues longtime King adviser John Pound, "We have got to educate the public about Mr. Johnson, what he stands for."

Pound thinks Johnson particularly vulnerable for having "taken the position that government has no role whatever in health care... For promising to cut state government by one-third without saying whose ox will be gored... And for supporting, a couple of weeks ago, a proposal to create a 'citizen militia,' vigilantes really, to combat crime."

So strong are Pound's feelings that he "predicts" you'll see the governor aggressively go after (Johnson) on these issues much sooner than you'd expect, perhaps even through an



early media blitz.

A strategy of an immediate preemptory strike of King television commercials, conceivably negative, designed to discredit Johnson's sundry controversial but under-reported pronouncements appeals to some King supporters. It is a prospect which leaves others uneasy.

"The governor feels very strongly that negative campaigns are not helpful to public confidence in government and ultimately hurts those who do them," cautions King spokesman John McKean.

No less an impediment to an early King media blitz—negative or not—is money. It's no secret that the governor's costly battle for renomination has left his campaign warchest drained. Thus, says McKean, "Fund-raising will determine when the paid media campaign begins."

Meanwhile, McKean reports, "You can expect to see the governor make better use of his Bully Pulpit, in Teddy Roosevelt's words, to explain the successes of state government under his administration."

Democratic party stalwart and longtime King fund-raiser Ed Romero sees some wisdom in McKean's counsel. According to Romero, however, Mr. King must do more than tout his administration's successes. He

has to "let people see that he is really the governor to become much more visible in face-to-face debates and public forums with Johnson (and, presumably, Mondragon)." Romero says, "Because I have absolute confidence that those types of encounters, lots of them, will show Bruce King's superior experience and ability."

Romero's counsel is understandable. Whatever else bedevils him, Governor King is doubtless better versed in the affairs of state government today than either of his opponents.

The hitch is: What is in it for Gary Johnson? So far the GOP nominee's low-profile post-primary campaign has worked well for him. Why, under these circumstances, should he expose himself to the risk of widespread public debate with the governor?

Then there is the Mondragon factor to be calculated. King supporters admit they were relieved when the Journal poll showed Mondragon with only nine percent of the vote at this stage and trailing in northern New Mexico where he was expected to be strong. "I had feared much worse," John Pound confesses.

Which underscores the potential frailty in Ed Romero's advice to his old friend. Frequent face-to-face public debates conceivably could harm the inexperienced Johnson. But they would almost certainly increase Roberto Mondragon's visibility in the campaign, and, for that reason, just possible his standing in the polls as well.

And that is hardly what Bruce King needs, now or at any point in the weeks ahead.

It ain't easy being an incumbent governor in New Mexico these days, awash in advice, down in the polls, short on money and up for reelection.
