Planners consider one item

A variance request to approve a 300 square-foot addition to the back of a residence in Ponderosa Heights is the only business on the agenda for today's meeting of the Ruidoso Planning and Zoning Committee.

The property, owned by Von Ray McClure II, has an existing 20-foot setback from the property line.

The proposed addition will bring the setback to about 15 feet from the front property line, and about 18 feet of the proposed addition will extend into the front yard setback area.

Village staff recommends favorable consideration of the variance due to the adverse topography and drainage course crossing the property.

Regular planning and zoning meetings begin at 2 p.m. at village hall the second and fourth Monday of every month.

Meetings are open to the public.

Enchanted Theatre adds new short play to summer season

The Enchanted Theatre recently added a new short, one-act play to its summer lineup.

The new play, "Enchanted Mesa," is a 15 to 20-minute comedy drama that appears in addition to the two plays currently being run, "Mark Twain's The Diary of Adam and Eve," and "Pastoral."

"Enchanted Mesa," a comedic drama, is a story about two people searching for answers to the questions about their marriage demanded by life in the 1990s.

According to a news release, they climb to the top of Enchanted Mesa, a butte outside of Albuquerque, to determine their future.

The play features Roger Sowder, principal at Nob Hill Elementary School, and Sally Sandora, owner of Candle Power, a gift shop in Midtown.

Written by George Maguire, it was a winner of the ninth annual Off Broadway Short Play Festival in New York City.

Paul Adamian, one of the play's two directors, relates that, "This little play tells a story that most couples living in the '90s have lived in one form or another. Roger (Sowder) and Sally (Sandora) have really pierced to the core of the feelings and issues of modern marriage."

According to Adamian and Douglas Webb, the play's co-director, "In our productions we 'dig' into a play to discover what is really going on between the

characters in the play's subtext, the world of feelings and intentions that live underneath the words they speak. We look for the things that are common to real people living in this real world. Then we work hard to find the best ways to tell that story, in this new play's case with a bitter-sweetness that is hard to resist.

"The actors in all of the plays in this summer's production know the stories they are telling and they tell them in beautifully effective ways."

Directors Webb and Adamian have staged "Enchanted Mesa" in the same suggestive style as its two companion plays.

Says Webb, "We like to create sets that require the audience to enter fully into a play, to use its imagination. Rarely will we give the audience a 'realistic' set. They almost always look fake. Sets are supposed to do more than just surround a play."

"Effective set design is intended to evoke in the audience a mood, a feeling that helps to move the dramatic action and subtext of the play at an unconscious level."

Referring to the ENMU-Ruidoso Drama Department's Spring production of "Caulk and Putty" that was written by Adamian and directed by Webb, Adamian says, "We tried to create a jagged and un-

State lawmakers meet in Ruidoso

The legislature's interim Revenue Stabilization and Tax Policy Committee will meet in Ruidoso this week to hear testimony on and discuss issues ranging from horse racing to title insurance and economic development enterprise zones, Rep. H. John Underwood (D-Ruidoso) said.

The committee is scheduled to meet at the Civic Events Center beginning at 10 a.m. today (Monday), August 15 and at 9 a.m. on Tuesday and Wednesday, August 16 and August 17.

The public is invited to attend the meetings, Underwood said.

"The committee's willingness to come to Ruidoso makes it much easier for area residents to raise issues directly with legislators from other parts of the state and to see first-hand at least one part of the legislative process," Underwood

said. Some highlights of the committee's tentative agenda include a presentation at 11:15 a.m. on August 15, on college savings bond and their feasibility in New Mexico, a presentation at 11 a.m. on August 16, on horse racing revenues and other industry issues and a presentation that same day at 1 p.m. on issues surrounding insurance policies that homeowners buy to protect the title to their property.

On August 17, the committee is scheduled to hear an update on the state enterprise program and related economic development tax issues.

"All of these issues are important to New Mexicans. Residents should consider attending the meetings to make their views known on these and other issues facing the state," Underwood said.

Henriette Wyeth honored by Museum of the Horse

Anti-nuke group gets organized

A temporary headquarters will open today in Ruidoso as a rallying point for anti-nuclear fuel storage groups.

Hazel Haynsworth, president of the Ruidoso Upper Canyon Association (RUCA), said the group's campaign against a proposal to build a monitored retrievable storage (MRS) unit on the neighboring Mescalero Apache reservation is off to a rousing start.

To coordinate the work, an office opened in the Plaza D'Oros building at 301 U.S. Highway 70 West. A telephone number, 378-4854, will be installed within the next week and be listed under RUCA Anti-MRS.

Haynsworth explained to a packed room of supporters that the movement would be two pronged with "grass root" efforts as well as political pressures that will be applied to targeted officials.

Nuclear energy expert visits Ruidoso, says DOE leader may favor private MRS

A factor that may work in favor of a plan to store spent nuclear fuel rods on the Mescalero Apache reservation is Energy Secretary Hazel O'Leary's past association with one of the lead players in the proposal, a Cornell University professor says.

During an interview last week, Duane Chapman, a professor of resource and environmental economics, said that O'Leary formerly served in several capacities with Northern States Power in Minnesota, one of the private partners working with the Mescalero tribe.

Wendy Butler, a public affairs official with Department of Energy confirmed that O'Leary worked for Northern States from 1989 until 1993. She was executive vice president overseeing the general counsel and vice presidents for human resources, public and government affairs and the environment.

Immediately before her appointment to the energy department, she served as president of the natural gas subsidiary of Northern States.

Chapman met last Monday with Ruidoso Mayor Jerry Shaw, who will pass along some of his data to the MRS Regional Information Committee when it meets at 2 p.m. Wednesday, Aug. 17, in village hall. Chapman of Ithaca, N.Y., said he has worked in different aspects of nuclear power for 29 years, and presented a list of credentials that included published articles in *The American Indian Law Review*.

"I'm amazed that any group would want to associate themselves with nuclear fuel," Chapman said.

"My wife and I decided to come out and see what's wrong with the

people here. There seems to be a serious deficiency of logic."

Transporting high level radioactive spent fuel to an area lacking in expertise to handle the hazardous material "creates the biggest chance for accidents happening," he said.

Chapman said he has worked as a consultant to Sandia Laboratories in Albuquerque and at Oak Ridge National Laboratories in Tennessee.

"The least costly approach for the country is to store the spent fuel at safe reactor sites," he said, adding that recently, the New York Power Authority reached the same conclusion.

"The authority has decided to endorse this point of view," Chapman said. "That in terms of economics and safety, it's best to look for multiple sites in (local) rural areas and defense sites that have been operated safely."

"They want sites where the fuel can be looked after by competent people and stored in areas already committed to nuclear material and power, not be transported thousands of miles. Eighty percent of the spent fuel is generated in the eastern United States."

Fear that Third World groups might obtain fuel for bombs already has caused the government to cancel plans for re-processing spent fuel for plutonium and other material.

"In view of that, why would (the government) approve Mescalero over a military site that has tighter security and is under the government's direct control?" he asked.

Chapman explained that as much as 50 percent of the radioactivity of the waste is gone in 10

years or less and then it levels off. Store 80 kilograms of waste and 72,000 years down the line, enough potency would be left for a nuclear bomb. In 250,000 years, the material would be comparable to uranium tailings.

The first 10 years, casks with spent rods are kept in cool storage. After that, cool storage no longer is needed, Chapman said. Dry storage is relatively safe and most utilities are in the process of moving their spent fuel into dry storage now, he said.

"Economics favors keeping it on site," Chapman said.

But several factors seem to push the spent fuel toward New Mexico.

"People in the eastern United States generally have a higher level of knowledge about the hazards of nuclear fuel," Chapman said. "In the West, they tend to be less knowledgeable. It's a political situation. If our utilities say they are moving the material to Mescalero, they receive a good political reaction."

Another factor that may give a slight edge to Mescalero and its private utility partners pushing for an MRS is O'Leary's past relationship with Northern States Power, he said.

"The utilities also remove their liability for the fuel by shifting it to the Mescalero shipping and storage company. Being a sovereign nation, it's doubtful whether someone could sue the Mescalero, even if an accident occurred."

Chapman said he has a difficult time understanding how the Mescaleros can accept federal help in so many forms, but invoke sovereignty in the case of the high level radioactive fuel, bypassing state oversight. "Spent fuel is second to the top

of the hazardous fuel list," he said. "Only a bomb itself is more hazardous."

"We should want the spent rods in New York where competent and experienced people will be looking after it, not people interested in a (money), whether they are white, black, Asian, Brazilian or Native American."

Chapman said he is optimistic that the government will react once the country fully understands the risks of transporting and of creating a new site storage.

"I think it will die," he said. "I don't think they actually will go ahead with something so illogical or dangerous."

Initially, a few dozen tribes signed up for MRS studies, referendums were conducted and for other reasons, all but four withdrew, he said.

"A lot were involved with changing leadership," Chapman said. "What's left are the Tomkawa in Oklahoma, the McDermott Paiute in Nevada and Oregon, the Skull Valley Goshute in Utah and, in the lead, the Mescaleros."

"I've been a liberal my whole life," he said. "The problem is (liberals) assume (Native Americans and other groups closely identified with the land) are incapable of doing serious wrong and that blind side is standing in the way of objective analysis."

"It's romanticism."

Fred Peso, vice president of the Mescalero Tribe, contends an MRS would bring economic benefits to the reservation and could become a safe new industry. The tribe already has studied the feasibility for three years. A referendum of tribal members is to be scheduled sometime this year.

School prepares book to raise cultural awareness

To increase cultural sensitivity in the classroom during the 1994-95, Ruidoso teachers will be able to refer to a booklet on Mescalero Apache tradition.

Last year, a coach ran into objections from some tribal members when he ordered a football player to trim his hair. The player let his hair grow as part of his preparation for dancing in tribal ceremonies.

Paul Wirth, director of support services, told school board members Tuesday that advisers from Mescalero met with district staff on weekends to put the guide together and will review it with teachers.

The subject of hair length is determined by individual family values and beliefs, according to the booklet.

"Some tribal traditions connect hair style and length to individual power and strength of purpose."

The guide specifically advises not to use actual arrowheads, eagle feathers and some other Native American items for exhibition, because they should be treated with respect and used only for the purpose they were intended. It notes that there are tribal and federal laws regarding the excavation and removal of certain artifacts.

It also advises against using snakes or lizards in classroom displays, because of prohibitions in the Mescalero culture against bothering them.

In another matter, Patricia Bednorz, a biology student at Eastern New Mexico University, reported on the results of a sex education survey conducted with a portion of the tenth grade high school class in Ruidoso.

The survey was distributed in

April. Of 53 (out of a full class of 152) sophomores who received the survey, all responded.

Bednorz said she found most students who answered said they get information on sex from their parents and as early as when they are eight years old.

"Although some students reported receiving this information at an older age, there are others who are misinformed or who have never received any information on this subject," she said. "This was proven when I interviewed (the head school nurse) who stated that there were several sixth grade girls who have had pregnancy tests in the past year."

Bednorz said she also found several students who had misinformation about Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome (AIDS) and how it is transmitted.

"Some students stated that (students) should be taught sex education at an earlier age, because kids are becoming sexually active at a younger age," she said.

"Another concern that was voiced by a student was the fact that there are not any books used in conjunction with the sex education classes that are offered by the school district."

She added that students expressed concern that questions are not being answered fully by their teachers.

The majority of students also said they would not feel comfortable with their parents sitting in on a sex education class.

Bednorz concluded, "If a student does not feel comfortable (in that situation), then they will not feel comfortable asking parents any questions about sex they may have."


Fluffy, another lonesome animal looking for a new home, is about

five months old. A border collie mix, his former owner said she didn't have time for Fluffy, who spent most of his life in a fenced yard.


He walks well on a leash and enjoys riding in a car. He likes chew toys and is a good watch dog, Harper said.

"We've had a very good response so far," said Gray.


The Clothes Horse is open from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Saturday.

With the help of local labor and friends, Jim removed the old carpeting to discover a well-kept oak floor that light sanding has brought back to a natural finish. They also built clothing cases which blend with the surroundings, removed a thousand nails from the walls and restored each individual log.

Marilyn was born in the city and says "in my younger days, I designed clothing for Evelyn Picone in New York." Taking this talent, she and her husband of 41 years, developed a leather wholesale business in California. In 1989, they fell in love with New Mexico and four years ago they opened a shop in Corrales, north of Albuquerque. They supply goods to businesses in

Aspen, Conrads in Scotsdale, Nordstrom and Stewarts in Durango.

Currently, the vests, sweaters and collars are the number one choices.

Wanda Millar, who was the manager of the Medicine Man for several years, brings her expertise as store manager.

"We are so lucky to have her," Marilyn proclaims, "because we want to stay here forever."



Lincoln County senior athletes strike it rich in Las Vegas

Lincoln County players struck it rich in Las Vegas last week, but they weren't gambling.

Instead, these senior athletes won more than 20 sports awards at the 16th annual New Mexico Senior Olympic (NMSO) games August 3-7 at Las Vegas, N.M.

Additionally, three Lincoln County athletes qualified to represent New Mexico at the National Senior Sports Classic (formerly National Senior Olympics) to be take place in San Antonio, Texas in 1995.

More senior athletes will compete in September in Albuquerque at the NMSO Bowling Tournament, also a national qualifying event.

Large turnout

Thirty-seven area athletes qualified in local tourneys to go to NMSO, joining more than 1,500 New Mexico athletes aged 55 and over.

"This is the largest number of state athletes ever," said Cecilia Acosta, NMSO executive director, attributing the large turnout to the qualifying year.

NMSO offers competition in 22

sporting, talent and fun events, some of which are contested at nationals. Men and women compete in age divisions of 55-59, 60-64, 65-69, 70-74, 75-79, 80-84, 85-89, 90-94, 95-99 and 100+.

Lincoln County results follow.

Golden girl

To no one's surprise, Dorothy Payne of Carrizozo won the gold medal in women's horseshoe pitching with her usual barrage of ringers. She allowed no opponent to score more than three points in any match, even shutting out one opponent 21-0.

Payne will represent New Mexico at the national games where she has consistently won gold and silver medals since competition began in 1987.

Silver shooters

Capitan's Virginia Danielson and Mollie Mason shot hot games of eight-ball pool to a silver medal each. Both competed in their first NMSO pool match, although Danielson is a veteran NMSO and national bowler and medalist.

S.M. "Mac" McDougal of Ruidoso also claimed a silver medal in the 800-meter estimated event. HE predicted his time at 3:57.7 and finished in 3:21 flat.

Neither pool nor the 800-meter are contested at nationals.

McDougal also placed seventh in both the 5K and 1500-meter races.

Bronze bombers

Bessie Jones, Floyd Danielson, Lester "Rusty" Lanelli, Lewis Duncan and Windsor Lacewell shot for the bronze in their sports.

Jones and Danielson, both of Capitan, won their medals in eight-ball pool. Jones is a consistent medal winner of many state games; Danielson was playing his first NMSO pool game. Like his wife, Virginia, he is a bowling veteran of both state and national tourneys.

Veteran Lanelli of Alto and newcomer Duncan of Ruidoso each faced tough competition in table tennis singles in their respective age groups. Their bronze medal fin-

ishes earned them each a berth at next year's National games.

Finishing fourth and fifth

Capitan's Wayne Mason won a fourth place rosette in eight-ball pool, while Ruidoso's Bart Young won his fifth place rosette in shot-put.

Talent and fun events

While much of NMSO focuses on serious competition, talent and fun events draw a large number of participants.

These include vocal, dance and instrumental performances, as well as frisbee accuracy and distance, basketball and softball throws and others.

Bart Young and Floyd Danielson blew away the competition in frisbee accuracy and distance events. Both sharp-eyed men won golds in frisbee accuracy and distance events. Both sharp-eyed men won golds in frisbee accuracy in their age groups.

In frisbee distance, Danielson achieved the longest distance in his age group, winning another gold, and Young the second farthest for his age group for a silver.

Lincoln County's oldest athlete, Bessie Jones, added to her medal collection by winning a silver in basketball throw and a bronze in basketball free throw. Bart Young placed fifth in both basketball and softball throw. Mac McDougal placed sixth in softball throw.

In the talent show that con-

cluded the four-day event, the team of Jesus Cervantes and Marcus Villescas of Carrizozo sang their way to a silver medal in the vocal division.

No talent or fun events are contested at national.

They came and played well

"We're already training for next year," said Glen Ellison of Carrizozo who competed in shot put, discus and javelin. He echoed the thoughts of other Lincoln County teammates who played well and hard, but did not place.

These included pool player Vernabelle Pease of Capitan, horseshoe pitchers Bud Payne of Carrizozo and Windsor Lacewell, discus and javelin thrower Bart Young, golfers, Watt Wilkinson, Bob Walter, Henry Ernest and Windsor Lacewell and the instrumental duo of Lena White and Lucy Saavedra of Capitan.

"We're tremendously proud of the number we got together this year," said Ellison, a Lincoln County Senior Olympics board member.

Elegiac rallies late in stretch

The word "elegiac" is defined in the dictionary as expressing sorrow and that is exactly what the competition in the \$20,000 Ruidoso Thoroughbred Derby felt after 6-1 outsider Elegiac overcame a troubled trip to rally from far back to win the 1 1/16th-mile race, Sunday.

The Kentucky-bred colt by Nepal was making only his third career start in the Derby and drew the undesirable twelve post which had not produced a winner all summer long.

Elegiac broke awkwardly from the gate and once jockey Ron Keckler got control of him, he had only one horse beaten and was nearly ten lengths behind Set Records who led the group of 3-year-olds early on. The colt continued to trail down the backstretch, but steadily made up ground nearing the turn for home.

Down the lane, Elegiac blew by the tiring pacesetters and just got up at the wire to nip 34-1 longshot Pattonmedicineman by a head. The time was 1:47.3.

"He broke out a bit, but I took hold of him and went to the rail because I knew there was a lot of

speed and I knew I had a horse that comes from off the pace," said Keckler.

"Down the backside I knew I was sitting pretty good and I asked him to move a bit and he responded real well. At the eighth (mile) pole I got behind the eleven horse (3-1 favorite Acrylic) and he (Acrylic) slowed down a lot faster than I thought and I had to pull him (Elegiac) up and it broke all our momentum. Once I found room, he started picking it up and started to roll for me and as soon as I turned for home I knew I was going to catch them."

Keckler who rides first call for trainer Jon Zimmerman, chose Elegiac over stablemate Irascible whom he rode to a second place finish in the Derby Prep Handicap two weeks ago.

"Jon set him up well for this race and he ran so good going a mile the first time and I didn't even ask him (to run)," added Keckler. The jockey was speaking of Elegiac's 11 3/4-length maiden win at Santa Fe on July 31.

"Obviously the other horse was touted better," said Zimmerman because Elegiac was a 20-1 morning

line choice, with Irascible at 15-1. "Ron chose this one and he's definitely on the upswing. I entered him partially as a gamble and partially as a gut feeling and it paid off." In fact, the horse was originally on the also eligible list, but made it into the body of the race after two scratches. Irascible finished tenth.

The Arizona-based jockey-trainer duo have now won two stakes in their first summer at Ruidoso. They previously captured the First Lady Handicap with the mare My Rachel.

The win was worth \$12,000 to owners Mandysland Farm, Laura Cotter et al.

Pattonmedicineman, ridden by Carlos Rivas, banked \$4,400 as runner-up. The California-bred gelding by Debonair Roger is trained by La Rae Sumpter for Norris and Jo Anne Patton of Pala, Calif.

Larys Tab, another longshot at 18-1, rounded out the trifecta by finishing a length back in third. David Mitchell guided the New Mexico-bred son of Pass The Tab for trainer A.I. Mathiasen and owner Harry Schofield of Albuquerque.

Bandit Commander, Roythelittleone take Ruidoso Futurity trials Friday

Norgor Futurity winner Bandit Commander broke out of a two-race losing streak when he staved off a late rally from Mambo Prince to prevail by a head in the first trial division for the \$76,300 Ruidoso Thoroughbred Futurity, Friday.

The undefeated juvenile Roythelittleone came from off the pace to win the second trial by a half-length over Flying Mambo.

Bandit Commander and Roythelittleone should be among the favorites in the futurity which will be contested Aug. 27. The first six finishers in each trial division advanced to the six furlong final.

Bandit Commander, owned by James Lewter of Clovis, took the lead a few strides out of the gate and battled with longshot Silent At-

ack down the backstretch. Nearing the turn, Bandit Commander briefly surrendered the lead to Silent Attack, but the Sky Command gelding fought back courageously to move in front by three lengths at the top of the lane.

The gelding pulled away in the stretch under a hand ride by jockey Jerry Rodriguez and held on for the victory over a late closing Mambo Prince who nearly caught him at the wire. The time for the six furlongs was 1:13.4.

Tim Cross trains Bandit Commander who finished eighth in the July 16 Rio Grande Futurity in his last outing.

Roythelittleone won his second race in as many starts when he squeezed through along the rail to overtake pacesetter Bold Connection at the sixteenth pole and went

on to win handily under jockey Kenny Roller. His time was 1:12.2, considerably faster than that of Bandit Commander.

The Kentucky-bred colt by the Alydar stud Talinum, won his career debut by 3 3/4-lengths in a quick time of :59.1 and seems to be improving every start.

Roythelittleone resides in the Paul Smith barn and is owned by Roy Davis of McAllen, Texas.

Yawls Rabbit impressive victor in Grade III Higheasterjet 'cap

4-5 favorite Yawls Rabbit did not disappoint his backers in the the Grade III \$10,000 Higheasterjet Handicap when he broke perfectly from the gate and was never seriously threatened en route to an impressive one length victory, Saturday at Ruidoso Downs.

Yawls Rabbit, a 4-year-old Texas-bred son of By Yawl, had a length lead early on in the 350-yard dash, then maintained that margin as he neared halfway point in the race. With 100 yards to go, jockey Jerry Rodriguez still had not used his stick as the colt cruised home under wraps in a time of :17.45.

The clocking was the fastest of the meet for the distance.

"He broke so good I was just hanging on for the ride," said Rodriguez who chalked up his third stakes triumph of the summer.

"This (race) was perfect for this colt because I think he's one of the best horses going 350 or 400 (yards)."

Trainer Tim Cross and owner James Lewter of Clovis, said that today's race was used to prepare Yawls Rabbit for the 440-yard All American Gold Cup Trials on Aug. 25.

"He's a hard horse to train because he's really nervous. But he needed a work and we wanted to keep him fit for his next start," said Cross.

The win was worth \$6,000 to Lewter and raised Yawls Rabbit's career bankroll to \$130,000 from nine wins in 28 starts. The Higheasterjet was the second stakes win of the meet for Yawls Rabbit who also captured the Grade III Mr Jet Moore Stakes on opening

weekend. The colt finished a close fourth in the Grade I World's Championship Classic in his last start.

Racin Vike who won the Higheasterjet in both 1991 and 1993, broke a step slowly and couldn't catch the winner. The Blane Schvaneveldt-trained earned \$2,200 for second. Racin Vike, a 8-year-old gelding by Racin Free, is owned by Charles Forbes of Freer, Texas and was ridden by Todd Fincher.

Kid Creole, with Darrell Blevins aboard, was a neck back in third. The 4-year-old Creole Dancer gelding earned \$1,000 for his efforts. Kid Creole is trained by Johnnie Goodman and owned by the Smith Children Trust, Leonard Ray Smith et al.

Bluebirds light up mountain land


A joyful day in midsummer in the mountain land. This is being sent to you in midmorning on Aug. 11, a day of quiet, peaceful happiness in the Mountain Land.

After a cool night the temperature is 85, the coolest in many a day. The American flag is gently floating in a light breeze straight out of the east. Beyond the flag, the bluebird family are flying to and from the bluebird trees; the young birds easily recognized by a flash of light blue as the sun shines through their small wings in flight.

They keep up a chorus of tiny, chirping bird songs as they fly to the drinking rock and back to the tree, and then over to the piñon and cedar at the foot of the hill.

There is a spirit of deep contentment and thankfulness in the air as Mother Earth rejoices all throughout our Mountain Land.

The message of the sunflower. This morning, Aug. 11, out of the woodpile was a sunflower blossom shining right at the top of the stack of firewood.

The sunflower seed had sprouted and then

worked its way up through the cedar and juniper and piñon woodpile for about six feet. You had to admire the determination of this plant to bring a blossom to cheer the world.

Every year, the sunflowers bring us special cheer with their golden faces smiling at us as we drive by on the highway, from the lower country all the way to the foot of the mountains.

Here in the midvalley of the Ruidoso, they are just now beginning to bloom, a little early, I think. If memory serves me right, the time for the sunflowers to begin blooming in this section, is mid-September. Then they join with the New England fall daisies to present the gold and purple of early fall.

The stalks are unusually tall this year, giving promise of an especially colorful display through the days ahead.

This may be a sign of an early touch of fall here in midsummer. Just the same, all signs point to a long and pleasant summer with the weather growing cooler by the day and an especially enjoyable fall, autumn and Indian summer.

Let us keep smiling and be grateful for all our many blessings, showered upon us by our good Lord.

Elections bogged down by confusion

New Mexico's Supreme Court stood firmly in favor of an open ballot in its decision Thursday to allow the Green Party slate on the November ballot. In a 4-to-1 decision, the court agreed with Secretary of State Stephanie Gonzales that gubernatorial candidate Roberto Mondragon and the entire Green slate have a right to be on the ballot.

While the Green Party may well have been playing politics by sitting back and waiting to see who won the Democratic and Republican parties' nominations, the court agreed that doesn't mean its candidates can't join in the race after the primaries.

Challengers to allowing the Greens on the ballot contend that a state law requires party members to be registered as Greens by the date of the election proclamation, January 31. None of the Green candidates registered as Greens until after the June 7 primary.

Assistant Attorney General Robert Booms contends that the election code is structured so that minor parties can wait and see, but the candidates who follow the system by going through the primary system say it's not fair to have "sour grapes" candidates jump in at the last minute.

Open access to the ballot is a concept that is hard to fault, but election laws are drafted to provide some framework and order for the process of selecting leaders at every level. Even the Greens would agree that there's a point of no return when it is just too late to be added to a ballot; but, on the other hand, even the Democrats and Republicans would admit that we have a multi-party system, not just a two-party one. That means those minor parties, which don't necessarily need to conduct a primary, do need a simple process to join in the general election ballot. That process needs to be simple.

Attorneys on both sides agree that the election code is confusing. Legislators should take a close look at this whole scenario with a view toward simplifying the election code before the next general election.

Upon Reflection

Campaign finance reform could start with fewer elections

Is there a way to curb the costs of modern political campaigns? There have been all kinds of proposals to do something about it — everything short of burning political action committees at the stake.


Little has come of those proposals, of course, although some see President Clinton's campaign reform initiatives as a step in the right direction.

Still vast and unseemly sums of money are laid out every election year as candidates scramble to devise ever more effective (and ever more expensive) high profile media campaigns engineered by sophisticated and costly consultants.

Democrat Bruce King dropped more than a half million dollars in his bid for renomination at the June 7 primary. Gary Johnson doled out nearly as much in his quest for the Republican gubernatorial nomination. This on top of the hundreds of thousands of dollars drained from the campaign kitties of runner-up would-be governors like Democrat Cassy Luna and Republican Dick Cheney.

Meanwhile, GOP Senate hopeful Colin McMillan spent a big wad to pull off an easy primary victory. Even U.S. Senator Jeff Bingaman, who had no opposition for renomination by the Democrats, thought it prudent to up his visibility with a well-done but hardly inexpensive series of pre-primary television advertisements.

No doubt all this money created jobs and kept some people working. Critics of the cur-

rent campaign finance system don't seem much interested in creating jobs, however. They're too disturbed by the smell of big money they detect around these high priced campaign extravaganzas to give that much thought.

Yet in this highly partisan political environment we have contrived for ourselves today, where all attempts at reform are instantly checked upon early detection, not even the best efforts have changed anything. In fact the situation may have worsened.

When the bills are all finally tallied and the totals are in, it is almost certain that this year's major primary campaigns in New Mexico will have proved the most expensive in state history.

It may be, of course, that we are asking the wrong questions here. The issue may not be "how costly are our campaigns?" but "how many of them must we force upon ourselves?"

Lyndon Johnson once proposed that we could dramatically cut the costs of our pricey

presidential campaigns if we were to reduce their number by limiting our presidents to a single six-year term. Elect them, let them to do their job, and then see them gracefully into retirement, he urged.

He may have been right. He also may have been onto something when he called for lengthening the terms of members of the U.S. House of Representatives from two to four years. In most states, New Mexico included, no major office appears more frequently on the ballot than elections to the lower house of Congress. Perpetual campaigns, they have become.

And they cost a bundle. New Mexico's Joe Skeen, Bill Richardson and Steve Schiff may well spend as much time raising money for their next campaign as they do on the floor of Congress. Those who would challenge them in an election have an even harder time of it, much more so.

Of course, none of this would satisfy die-hard campaign finance reformers who want to drive the money changers from the temple, once and for all. Neither would it appease those who have come to regard across-the-board term limits as they key to a rascal free paradise.

But old Lyndon's suggestions might have at least one welcome product. They just might cut the maddening din of what has become one high eternal political campaign season in an America where the next election begins on the very night of the last.

Which is not, at all, a bad idea.
