### Indian leaders are tired of waiting for compact on gaming

Pueblo leaders want Gov. Bruce King to more quickly negotiate a tribal-state compact on gambling, according to an AP report.

A federal court ruling provides Indians with a clear legal option if the talks stall, continues the report in today's El Paso Times.

Tribal leaders reportedly met with King and complained of "foot dragging" in talks over agreements to legalize and regulate gambling on Indian lands in New Mexico.

In Denver, the U.S. 10th Circuit Court of Appeals issued a ruling that makes it clear that tribes could bring lawsuits in federal court to try to obtain a compact if they believe a state fails to negotiate in good faith.

The appeals court ruling involved a lawsuit brought against the state by Sandia Pueblo and the Mescalero Apache tribe.

## Noblesse Six wins \$1 million

The 2-year-old gelding Noblesse Six ran the fastest 440-yard All American Futurity ever when he blew past his competition to post a 3/4-length victory over Darlin Sixarun in the Grade I \$1.58 million race, Labor Day at Ruidoso Downs.

The 2-year-old colt by Streakin Six broke on the lead and held a head advantage over Darlin Sixarun in the early stages of the world's richest quarter horse race. Under a strong ride by jockey Chris Zamora, Noblesse Six exploded past his lone rival 100 yards from the finish

line and went on to win in a time of :21.35.

The time surpassed the :21.42 clocking of Eastex in 1984 and Mr Trucka Jet in 1985. The race has been run at the 440-yard distance for 20 of the 36 runnings. It runs at 400 yards from 1959 to 1972 and again in 1990.

"We were fortunate to draw the 10-hole and avoid trouble and that's what it takes to win a race like this," said trainer Richard Fry. "This horse always has his best kick at the end and when he broke so good I knew we were in good shape."

"When you start off as a kid you dream of this, it's just like the Kentucky Derby for quarter horses," said Zamora. "God just blessed me this day and it was my turn to win."

"About five or seven jumps out of the gate, I turned my stick over and he exploded. About 90 yards from the wire we got to celebrating a little too much, but he was so far in front it didn't matter," added Zamora.



## Capitan man dies in shooting

A Capitan man is dead and a Ruidoso Downs police officer is on administrative leave following a shooting incident Monday night in the Downs.

Michael Shirley, 45, was transported to Lincoln County Medical Center after being shot, according to District Attorney Bert Atkins.

"I'm told that he was taken to the hospital, that there was a considerable effort made to revive him or to treat him and that he succumbed at the hospital," Atkins said.

Atkins, who is leading the investigation, said he's been told that three shots were fired, but he hasn't yet interviewed witnesses to the incident which took place around 9 p.m. Monday at the Texas Connection restaurant on U.S. Highway 70 in Ruidoso Downs.

Atkins said there were a number of witnesses, including an off-duty state police officer.

According to police call logs, Ruidoso Downs police officer Chris Condon responded to a call from the restaurant at about 9:20 p.m. Monday. Restaurant employees at the scene said they called police because they were concerned about the physical condition of a customer. They said the man got out of a pickup and appeared to have trouble walking into the restaurant.

Witnesses said that Officer Condon entered the restaurant and observed the man, identified after his death as Shirley, who asked the waitress for a cigarette, then left the restaurant and went to his pickup truck which was parked in the front.

When he returned to the restaurant, according to witnesses, he was brandishing a large knife. When Condon asked his intentions, the man reportedly lunged toward the officer who responded by drawing his revolver and ordering him to stop.

Witnesses said that the man continued to threaten Condon by lunging toward him with the knife and the officer fired his weapon.

Witnesses said the man continued to advance, ignored the officer's order to stop and was shot once more.

Witnesses said the officer fired a third time before the man fell to the floor.

Medical personnel transported the Shirley to LCMC.

According to DA Atkins, Condon has been placed on administrative leave pending the outcome of the investigation.

Both Ruidoso and Ruidoso Downs police departments are continuing to investigate the shooting, but neither department was ready to release any further information at press time.

# Running in the All American is a dream come true

The road to the All American Futurity winner's circle is paved with dreams and heartaches.

Gwendolyn Eaves, a horse owner and breeder well-known in Texas and New Mexico horse racing circles, has been dreaming of that once-in-a-lifetime win for more than 20 years.

"A lot of people would have given up, but I just kept plugging," said Mrs. Eaves on Friday.

Delightful Lark, bred and raised by Mrs. Eaves on her Midland, Texas, ranch, raced into the finals for the world's richest quarter horse race, the 1994 All American Futurity, posting the second fastest qualifying time.

Delightful Lark ran a good race Monday, finishing in the middle of the field of the world's fastest quarter horses. Any horse owner would be proud, and Mrs. Eaves and her family, watching the race from the Jockey Club, were pleased with the spunky horse's performance.

Win or lose, by the time a quarter horse makes it into this elite group of 10, that's a dream come true for any horse owner, trainer or jockey.

But hoping and dreaming isn't enough to make it into this prestigious circle of horse owners. It takes a lot of hard work and a major financial investment.

Horse owners don't choose this path for money, but Mrs. Eaves admitted that the All American — win, place or show — will pay for a lot of hay.

"I've been in it for 20 years, and this is the first time it ever happened to me," said Eaves during the Call to Post Brunch Friday at the Turf Club at Ruidoso Downs.

Eaves and her husband, Harry Eaves, waited expectantly with their jockey, Eric Perner, as the positions were drawn for the race of a lifetime.

Tom Dawson of the Breeder's Classic, announcing the posts as they were drawn, said there are no bad positions at Ruidoso Downs Race Track. He recalled, before the major renovations and new track addition, that the post drawings were a different matter — important and emotional enough for tempers to flare.

But this Friday, the Eaves and Perner were happy with the three spot, and owner groups all over the room seemed just as pleased with

their own draws.

The Eaves and Perner were joined at the call to post by Dorothy and Tom Anderson of Ruidoso, who were thrilled to see their friends achieve their goal of running a horse in the All American.

The Andersons weren't surprised.

"Gwen (Eaves) probably knows more about the horse business than any horse owner in New Mexico," said Mrs. Anderson. "And that's putting it mildly," she added.

Although horses from the Eaves stable run at other racetracks, Ruidoso Downs Race Track is the home base — it's where it all started for Gwendolyn Eaves.

She was raised on a ranch, and has always loved horses, but she didn't get into the horse business until one lucky day some 20 years ago at Ruidoso Downs Race Track.

"I won enough money to buy my first mare," said Eaves.

"It would take a book to tell you about that first horse," she added.

"I've had many thrills and heartaches since then," she said.

Making it into the All American is among the nicest things that can happen to a horse owner, she said.

And, making it into the All American with a horse she raised from a foal, doubles the pleasure.

Eaves and trainer Richard Fry are regulars at the Ruidoso Horse Sales, the Super Select and All American, where they purchased a horse this Friday.

But my husband says I raise them better than I buy them," said Mrs. Eaves.

"I own Delightful Lark's mama, Our Third Delight," she said. "It makes it a little more special when you raise them."

When Mrs. Eaves talks about raising horses, she doesn't mean she just writes a check for somebody else to rear her foals.

The well-dressed ranchwoman looks like she just stepped out of

Neiman-Marcus, but she's a hands-on horsewoman.

"In the early days, I heard that wine was good for baby horses," said Mrs. Eaves. "So I put a cup of Mogen David wine in one baby's feed every night."

"He did great — won seven races in a row and set the track record at Sunland on the 440."

When Mrs. Eaves joined forces with trainer Richard Fry eight years ago, they hit on a winning combination.

"We kind of clicked," she said. The pair added jockey Perner to the team four years ago when the 24-year-old rider made his first career race for Mrs. Eaves at the State Fair meet.

Delightful Lark, a bay filly, lost by a neck to All American favorite Major Rime in the trial on Aug. 19, but ran well enough to post the second fastest qualifying time for this year's futurity.

"This little horse came in fourth in the Rainbow," said Mrs. Eaves, who lives in Texas, but has strong roots in New Mexico.

The Eaves lived in New Mexico for 40 years and moved to Texas just five years ago.

"My heart is in New Mexico," said Mrs. Eaves, who is a big supporter of the New Mexico Breeders Association.

The All American is the last leg of the Triple Crown of horse racing, which includes the Rainbow and the Ruidoso futurities. This year, those two stakes winners didn't qualify for the All American, and Delightful Lark was the only qualifier that even raced in the Rainbow.

But on Monday, Mrs. Eaves and her family, just like nine other owners and their entourages, were betting on that million dollar win.

Delightful Lark, raring to go in the paddock on Monday, headed back to the stables after the big race, but the well-bred horse will be back in the winner's circle next year — maybe for the All American Derby.



# Abandoned dog finds summer friend

Only three months old, Jackson was abandoned by his owner and was brought into the Lincoln County Humane Society shelter after being found wandering and hungry.

But lucky for the German shepherd mix (possibly with Doberman) puppy, Douglas Felferman stopped by while staying in Ruidoso.

The 9-year-old San Diego, Calif., boy decided the best way to spend the money his mother gave him for the visit would be to sponsor Jackson for the cost of his neutering.

That sponsorship greatly enhances his chance for adoption, because it covers the major cost, said

shelter manager Esther Harper.

"Douglas comes to see Jackson every few days," Harper said. "He brings him treats and walks him on a leash."

Jackson is dark brown, has a blue fleck in one eye and looks like he will have short hair. He's sweet natured and just waiting for someone to love him.

Another pint-sized charmer, Tippy the terrier, is no bigger than two hands full.

About 1 1/2 years old, she was the featured pet at a recent weekend outing at Wal-Mart, where Lynda Tanner, a long-time supporter of the shelter animals, decided to sponsor her for spaying.

Tippy probably is part Chihuahua and would only need a

little reinforcement for housebreaking once she's out of the kennel environment, Harper said.

"She won't get any larger and would make a great apartment pet. She's a half-lap dog, rides well in a car and gets along with everybody," she said.

Tippy, who is sweet natured and does not nip or yip, was found running loose in Capitan and was not claimed by her former owner.

Although the evenings are turning cool, the days still creep into the 80s around Ruidoso. Leaving pets in the car while shopping, even with the windows cracked, can be a fatal decision for the dogs. The temperature can climb fast and high, dehydrating a dog within a

short period.

Pickup truck owners who enjoy traveling with their animals also need to be aware that Ruidoso's animal control ordinance requires animals in the bed of a truck to be restrained to prevent them from jumping or being thrown from the vehicle. To ensure the animal won't try to jump anyway while tethered (possibly choking itself), control officer Peggy Williams recommends moving them into the cab, especially on hot summer days (when the floor of the bed can be blistering hot).

He attended grade school at Stetson in Ruidoso Downs, Ancho and Carrizozo.


During this time his mother, a pioneer educator, was Lincoln County superintendent of schools.



# Mail Depot keeps the old, but adds new services in new location

What's old, but new; down and up; the same, yet different, and binds the world together like twine binds a package?

The answer to the riddle is the Mail Depot, which for 17 years has been serving Ruidoso with shipping and mail services.

The story begins in 1977, when Roland Tessier opened the first Mail Depot in Ruidoso. The business offered a variety of mail and package services including UPS shipping.

Mike Calaghan purchased the business in 1980, and operated it until 1984, when it sold to Mike and Maxine Seargeant.

The Seargeants ran the company for 10 years.

What's new is current owner Terri Jackson who took over the Mail Depot on June 15, and decided that in addition to the upper location at 2901 Sudderth, she would situate a second Mail Depot down

Sudderth at 143 Highway 70 at the "Y."

Since its inception in 1977, the Mail Depot has been Ruidoso's only authorized UPS shipping outlet.


"A customer can have UPS deliver packages at either of our locations," said Jackson. "And they can also UPS ship from either store."



# RHS Warriors wallop Gadsden 29-6

The Ruidoso Warrior football team got its first win of the season Friday, 29-6, over Anthony Gadsden, on the road.

The win marks the first trip to the winner's circle for the Warriors' new head coach, Les Carter, since moving here from Los Lunas.

Under Carter, the Tigers built a powerful program during the last five years, losing just eight times during the last three seasons including an 11-1 mark in 1992.

While the Warriors got off to a slow start against Gadsden, the team finished like thoroughbreds, scoring 19 points in the second quarter and 10 more in the final stanza.

The Warriors took the opening kickoff to their own 23 yard line, but on the first play from scrimmage quarterback John Echols' arm was hit while attempting a pass to Byron Soules. The Gadsden secondary picked it off and gave its offense great field position, setting up shop on the Warrior 38.

A 10-yard run on first down and a five-yard penalty on the Warriors gave the ball to the Panthers on the Warrior 23.

Gadsden's tailback Anthony

Segura got eight more yards on the next play and Ruidoso's defense found itself defending less than 15 yards to the endzone.

Then, as if someone turned on a light, the Warrior defense stiffened and did not allow the Panthers inside the nine-yard line. Gadsden ran three plays from the nine, resulting in two incomplete passes and one run with no gain.

The defense had held and avoided the back-breaking quick-start they had given Artesia in the season opener.

Starting from deep in their own territory, the offense returned to field to re-establish the game plan that was never untracked because of the interception on the first play.

It was a great scenario, but it just didn't work that way.

Two gives to Kyle Humphreys netted one yard and one more try to Rex Comanche got an additional yard, but the three lackluster plays still meant punt, which was not good news.

The beleaguered punt team averaged 18 yards per kick last week — and new punter Jackie Roe, standing in his own endzone, was not a comforting sight.

The Warriors' bad luck continued as Gadsden's Joquin Holguin broke through the line and blocked Roe's punt into the endzone. The Panthers recovered and the Warriors found themselves in familiar territory — trailing.

The extra point failed. After the ensuing kickoff, the Warriors started their third possession on their own 30. Humphreys got gains of nine and four yards, giving the locals their initial first down of the game.

The Warriors advanced the ball out to the 45, but two-straight in-

complete passes meant another punt — and more nail-biting.

This time, Roe got the kick under way, but the only managed 20 yards and the Panthers' Juan Lopez returned the ball to the Gadsden 31.

A 15-yard penalty backed the Panthers up even farther, and a loss of two yards and two incomplete passes forced a Gadsden punt from in their own territory. The tables had turned, finally, for the Warrior defense.

Getting the ball at the Gadsden 42, Ruidoso got gains from Rex Comanche and Kyle Humphreys of one, three and four yards — and the offense faced fourth-and-two from the Gadsden 34-yard line.

Then, for perhaps the first time of the season, halfback Kyle Humphreys displayed the burst of speed that had the coaches wide-eyed in the pre-season.

Humphreys got around the right end and turned on the afterburners, outrunning Gadsden's secondary, giving the Warriors their first touchdown of the year.

Byron Soules added the extra point, and Ruidoso took the lead for the rest of the game.

Gadsden fumbled the ball on their next possession, and Kevin Pellman's recovery gave the offense a short field for their next drive.

Starting from the Panther 33, John Echols went to work.

The senior quarterback threw to Byron Soules for five yards, and then ran for nine more. From the 20-yardline, Humphreys got three and lost two yards on successive plays.

Facing third-and-nine, Echols went back to the air.

Rolling right and looking right, Echols looked back to his left and

found an open Brandon Emello. Firing the football across the field, Emello made a beautiful adjustment, a great catch, and dove for the endzone. Touchdown.

Soules missed the PAT and the Warriors were in front 13-6.

The Panthers' misfortune continued with another fumble.

This time, it was Jesse Fromknecht that handed the ball back to the offensive unit.

From the Panther 24, Humphreys reeled off runs of seven, 11, three and two yards. Facing fourth-and-goal from the one yardline, Coach Carter called Rex Comanche's number and the fullback steamed into the endzone to give the Warriors their third score of the second quarter.

Soules missed the extra point, but nonetheless, Ruidoso was taking a 19-6 lead into the halftime locker room.

Gadsden received the kickoff to start the third quarter and with some good halftime adjustments, moved the football very well after an excellent kickoff return.

The Panthers started at their own 47 and marched the ball to the Warrior 11 before stalling out. Fourth down brought a 27-yard field goal attempt, which was missed.

Ruidoso, starting from its own nine, could do no better than six yards in three plays and was forced to — gulp — punt.

This time, backup punter Jackie Roe got off a 35-yarder, which at least gave the defense a little room to work.

After a 13-yard return, Gadsden's drive began at the Warrior 37. Unfortunately for them, however, the Panthers went three-up-and-three down, and were forced

to punt the ball to the sky-high Warriors.

A terrific 38-yard punt pinned the locals back to their own nine-yard line.

At that point, Echols orchestrated a beautiful, 16-play, clock-chomping drive.

Humphreys accounted for 30 yards on five plays and Echols ran for 20 more on three tries. Receptions by Emello and Comanche gave the locals 20 more yards of offense, and suddenly, Ruidoso was down to the Gadsden nine.

Echols and Emello missed connections on third-down, and Coach Carter sent out Byron Soules to try a 26-yard field goal.

Soules has been erratic while kicking this year, but this attempt was true and the Warriors went ahead of Gadsden 22-6 with just over seven minutes to play.

Two penalties killed the Panthers next drive and Ruidoso would have one last chance to add to their 22-point tally.

Starting from their own 40, Echols found his favorite receiver

Brandon Emello for 35-yard strike, putting the ball on Gadsden's 25.

An attempt to Soules fell incomplete and second down saw Humphreys gain six yards. Echols ran for 16 yards on the option on third down, and Humphreys went in from the three to get the Warriors fourth touchdown of the night on the next play.

Soules PAT made the final score 29-6.

It was an impressive effort — one that the Warriors needed after the Artesia game.

"I'm really happy for these kids," said head coach Les Carter. "We played well ... the defense did a great job, especially in the first half. We had a chance to let the game get away, and didn't."

"We're still learning, but we played more like a team tonight and it showed," said Carter.

The Warriors will hit the road again next week with a long trip to Las Vegas for a meeting with the Cardinals.

Game time Friday is 7:30 pm.

Last Tuesday, the Warriors beat Goddard in Roswell, 2-1, and dismantled Socorro on Thursday.


In an impressive effort, the Warriors were much the best as Socorro proved to be no threat.

# I Hear A Symphony upsets Heza Fast Man

10-1 longshot I Hear A Symphony broke on top, pulled clear in the final 100 yards, then held off a late charge from 4-5 favorite Heza Fast Man for a dramatic half-length victory in the Grade I \$178,963 All American Derby, Sunday at Ruidoso Downs.

The Kenneth Roberts-trained filly broke sharply from the ten post and led by a half-length over First To Score in the early stages of the 440-yard dash. The 3-year-old filly by Ronas Ryon continued to lead at the halfway mark under constant urging by jockey Charles McMahon, while Heza A Fast Man was sixth after a slow start.

With 100 yards to go, I Hear A Symphony had a commanding lead and was too far in front for Heza Fast Man to catch her at the wire. The time was :21.52 over a sloppy track.

"She was about a half-length off at the start, but when she kicked in she really took off," said McMahon. "I was a little concerned about the

track before the race because as a 2-year-old she didn't handle it too well, but she handled it well today."

Roberts and McMahon were among the top jockey-trainer combinations at Delta Downs in Vinton, La. before relocating to Sam Houston Race Park this summer.

Roberts said I Hear A Symphony has been in Ruidoso for two months and is lightly raced this year which made a difference in her performance.

"This is only her fourth start of the year and she's maturing a whole lot. She's a good filly," said Roberts. "She left (the gate) like she's supposed to and on the end she really got away from them," added Roberts.

I Hear A Symphony nearly doubled her career earnings with the \$73,864 winner's share of the purse for owner Tommy Bass of Lake View, S.C. the filly has now earned \$169,718. She has had suc-

cess here throughout her career with a runner-up performance in the Grade I Rainbow Derby in July and a win in the Rainbow Futurity Consolation as a 2-year-old.

Heza Fast Man clocked the fastest qualifying time in the Aug. 18 trials, but broke poorly and could not repeat his effort today.

"I felt he was ready and thought it was a cinch, but he broke slow and couldn't get ahold of the race track," said Heza Fast Man's rider Henry Garcia.

The runner-up earned \$33,766 for his efforts. The John Bassett-trained colt is owned by San Tan Tillage, Mike Hastings et al from the Phoenix suburb of Queen Creek, Ariz.

35-1 outsider Honkin Harry held on along the rail to secure the show position, a neck behind Heza Fast Man. The Martin Ireland-trained gelding was ridden by Larry Layton. Third place was worth \$17,305 to owner Joleta Kay Ingersoll of Inola, Okla.

# Femmes Frolic gains nose win over Yawls Rabbit in All American Gold

1992 Champion 3-year-old gelding Femmes Frolic won his first graded stakes in two years when he outbattled game competitor Yawls Rabbit at the wire for a nose victory in the Grade I \$83,428 All American Gold Cup, Saturday at Ruidoso Downs.

Femmes Frolic, a 5-year-old son of Beduino, broke right with the pack in the 440-yard dash and held a half-length lead over Yawls Rabbit early on.

At the halfway mark, Femmes Frolic maintained his slight advantage over Yawls Rabbit, with 3-2 favorite Specially Fast only a head back in third.

With 100 yards to go, Yawls Rabbit looked as if he would steal the lead, but Femmes Frolic would not give in to win by the narrowest of margins. The time was :21.68.

"He's just a hard trying horse and he dug in every step of the way," said veteran rider Luke

Myles. "Usually he's real explosive out of there (the gate), but he slipped a little. He was right there on the front end all the way and he's smart horse because he knows where that wire is and he just tried to get there first."

Femmes Frolic earned champion honors as a sophomore for winning the Grade I World's Championship Classic and All American Derby, but had only two wins since then. Earlier this year, owner Roger Knight Jr. put Femmes Frolic under the care of trainer Bobby Merchant and the gelding has suddenly returned to form. First place was worth \$18,852 to Knight of Madisonville, Texas, located north of Houston.

The gelding has now earned \$419,861 in his brilliant career.

Yawls Rabbit performed brilliantly in his final career start for owner James Lewter of Clovis.

The 4-year-old son of By Yawl was rewarded with a check of

\$5,785 for second. The colt is trained by Tim Cross. Jerry Rodriguez was the rider.

Specially Fast, ridden by Bruce Pilkenton, had won three straight stakes prior today's race. The 4-year-old gelding by Dash For Cash resides in the Dwayne "Sleepy" Gilbreath shedrow and is owned by Six G's Stables Inc., David Gibson and James Helzer. Third place was worth \$3,437.

The veteran campaigner Leger Cat, sent off as the overwhelming 1-5 favorite, was down a few closer Opening Remark in deep stretch for a neck win in the \$20,000 Ruidoso Mile Handicap, Saturday.

The 8-year-old Argentine-bred horse by Logical broke well, but was content to stay well off the quick early pace of :23.1 and :46.3 set by Gee Ryder.

Along the backstretch Leger Cat moved into fourth position under a

Owner Steve Chavez of Albuquerque banked \$1 million for the victory which raised the gelding's earnings to the \$1,021,599. Noblesse Six was gelded in late June and is undefeated in four starts since then.

Prior to the Aug. 19 All American Trials, Noblesse Six captured the La Chiripada Stakes in Santa Fe. In the trials, the gelding beat his foes by a half-length and clocked the fifth fastest qualifying time of the 16 trials.

Runner-up Darlin Sixarun was one of two Grade I winners in the field and earned \$201,712 for his efforts. The gelded son of Sixarun won the Grade I Remington Park Futurity in June and was sent off

the 4-1 second choice in the field of ten.

"He left there on the lead and halfway down there (the track) he threw his head up," said jockey Nicky Wilson who rode Darlin Sixarun. "I think he's just tired because he didn't have his usual kick and didn't run on the end like he usually does."

Fastest qualifier and 2-1 favorite Major Rime was undefeated going into today's race, but tired late to finish third, 1/4-lengths behind Darlin Sixarun.

"He just got outrun today," said Major Rime's rider Bobby Don Harmon. "He was on the lead until the last 150 yards or so and they just run by me."

Major Rime, owned and trained by Robert Driggers of Clovis, failed in his attempt to become the second

New Mexico-bred to win the futurity. Real Wind accomplished the feat in 1976. Third place was worth \$90,423.

The complete order of finish for the 36th All American Futurity follows: Noblesse Six, Darlin Sixarun, Major Rime, Bullderdash, The Fling King, Delightful Lark, Good Legacy, Daring Difference, Ghost Witha Most and Doo Dominate.

Monday's race was marred by the worst accident in its history, according to an AP report.

Doo Dominate, a brown colt owned by Osvaldo B. Rodriguez of Anthony, broke both front legs 100 yards from the finish and had to be destroyed, according to the report.

Ghost Witha Most, had a compound fracture of the right foreleg about 200 yards into the race, and was treated by a veterinarian.

# ZV Silver Bullet pulls upset in Ruidoso 550

The powerful gray gelding ZV Silver Bullet remained undefeated in four career starts at the 550-yard distance as he coasted home under jockey Teresa Briggs for a 3/4-length victory over Lawyersgunsandmoney in the Grade I \$10,000 Ruidoso 550 Championship, Monday.

The 4-year-old son of Zevi ran

the distance in a quick :26.67, only 3/100ths of a second off the track record set by Six To Five in 1992.

ZV Silver Bullet, who resides in the Joel Marr barn, had a one-length lead over Lawyersgunsandmoney at the break and continued to hold that advantage at the halfway mark.

Under constant urging by jockey Teresa Briggs, ZV Silver Bullet was well clear of his competition nearing the wire to win in fine fashion.

The win was worth \$6,000 to owner Bill Voss of Snyder, Texas.

Lawyersgunsandmoney finished a half-length in front of even-money favorite Ed Grimley who was third.

# Elegant Roman rallies to win Brigand Handicap

Raymond Johnston's Elegant Roman made a sweeping move in the turn for home and blew by the tiring pacesetters for an easy 4 1/2-length victory in the \$10,176 Brigand Handicap for quarter horses and thoroughbreds, Sunday.

The 5-year-old thoroughbred gelding by Elegant Life was fourth at the start of the 1000-yard dash and had to travel four-wide down the backstretch. At the top of the lane jockey Carlos Rivas had moved his mount to the front and he drew

off for the win in a time of :53.31.

First place was worth \$6,106 to owner Raymond Johnston of Asteac.

2-1 favorite Stamen was second and Streakin Victory a half-length back in third.

# Jalapeño pizza fuels plucky All American duck

Number 97 was nervous. The little blue plastic duck had trained long and hard for the moment when he would merge with the rushing waters of Two Rivers Park during the All American Duck Race sponsored by the Ruidoso Ski Team.

Manuel Martinez, Number 97's owner/trainer and manager of Pizza Hut, recalled the early days of training for the race.

On the day of the race, banners fluttered gently in the breeze, children laughed and played in the crisp morning air and spectators lined the banks of the Two Rivers Park anxiously waiting for the starting signal.

The big moment had finally arrived and Number 97 felt himself being dumped from a large cardboard box into the surging waters below.

At first Number 97 felt a twang of fear as he hurtled headlong over waterfalls and rocks, but the plucky

little duck regained his composure and began to paddle down river.

The river was a throng of pink and blue ducks, all determined to be the first across the finish line, as Number 97 found a strong eddy running close to the bank, and with all the will power at his command, leapt into the lead.

Now the river's twists and turns sped by at dizzying speed. Glancing nervously behind him Number 97 noticed pink duck Number 1,020 close behind.

He must have lost his concentration for only a moment, because just when he was wondering if he could hold his place against the challenger, disaster struck.

He found himself stuck on a small sand bar. With a mighty effort, the little blue duck rocked himself back and forth and finally pushed himself off of the obstacle and back into the lead.

Number 97 knew he had victory at last! He could see it in the awed

faces of the spectators he passed as he drew ever closer to the end of the race, and even though he was only a plastic duck, he held his head high and attempted a smile.

Number 97 was still smiling as he crossed the finish line and was plucked from the water by Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce director Joan Bailey.

Coming in second with a valiant effort was pink duck Number 1,020 which netted a weekend package from Best Western Swiss Chalet valued at \$250 for owner Danny Taylor.

Third place of \$100 went to Mike Plass, owner of Number 2,044 which was the "Poke Paddler," the last duck to finish.
