AG criticizes state pamphlet on waste

The state may be within its legal rights to mail a pamphlet on nuclear waste to Mescalero residents, but the move was inappropriate, according to Kay Roybal of Attorney General Tom Udall's office.

Fred Peso, vice president of the Mescalero Apache tribal council, contends the pamphlet was politically motivated by a state government opposed to the tribe's plan to bring radioactive waste to the reservation. He condemned the State Health Department for interfering in the internal affairs of the tribe.

Roybal appeared to agree that whatever the motivation, the potential was that the outcome of a tribe referendum on the issue might be influenced. While no law in New Mexico prohibits such intervention, court decisions in other states suggest it is wrong.

Principal promises to pucker up

Motorcycles lost on reservation property

Three motorcyclists who allegedly trespassed on Mescalero Apache land and had to hike out may forfeit their bikes as punishment.

Billy Voges, 24, Thomas Nichols, 19, and Kurt Sarinopoulos, 20, all of Ruidoso, went riding Sept. 17 and followed an unmarked trail that apparently took them onto the reservation.

"We thought we were on national forest land," Voges said during an interview Saturday. "(Nichols) and I had hiked a lot before. When we got stuck, we hiked out. The next weekend we went out again trying to find the bikes."

"As we understand it, they followed an elk trail (on the bikes)," said Melinda Headley, operations officer for White Mountain Search and Rescue. "But the grade became so steep and high, they couldn't turn around and they panicked."

The three left to search for their bikes, worth about \$1,000 each, about 6 a.m. Sept. 25. When they didn't return that night, a search was initiated the next morning at about 7:30 a.m., Headley said.

"The Bureau of Indian Affairs was very helpful. They gave permission for a State Police helicopter to fly over and search the

reservation," she said. But when the helicopter arrived, Nichols had already found a ride into town and learned there was a search. He then came out to the Search & Rescue base camp near Swiss Chalet and talked to field coordinator Dave Travis.

"They had no idea where they really left the bikes and it turned out they were six miles away from where they thought they had been riding. They simply got lost," Headley said.

Voges said the three argued while looking for the motorcycles and that's why they took different routes into town.

"We never did find the bikes," he said. "We're suppose to go up again with the (Bureau of Indian Affairs personnel) to look for them next weekend."

They were told by a Mescalero police official that the bikes may be confiscated and that a fine could be imposed, he said. However, since the trail was unmarked, they may not be prosecuted.

Voges said, "That still hasn't been decided."

Mescalero law enforcement officials could not be reached for comment.

Commissioner seeks early voting in Ruidoso

A Lincoln County commissioner would like to take the concept of early voting one step further and set up a site in Ruidoso.

"It makes sense to me that since people can go in early to vote in the general election, something might be arranged for Ruidoso residents to eliminate that long drive to Carrizozo (to the county clerk's office in the county courthouse)," he said.

His proposal is part of the agenda for the commission meeting, which begins at 9 a.m. Tuesday in the commission room at the courthouse.

Also on the agenda is a request to schedule a public hearing for an ordinance to form a public land use advisory board.

"This ordinance, similar to ordinances adopted by a number of

Village would reap tax money from hotel lease

The Village of Ruidoso could easily rake in a half-million dollars in revenues the first year a hotel on the village property is in operation.

It's no wonder Ruidoso officials say they've come up with a hotel site lease they can live with.

"It'll generate a lot of money," said Village Manager Gary Jackson at last week's council meeting. "We're really on a roll right now here in Ruidoso."

The proposed lease is up for public scrutiny at a village council hearing Tuesday, Oct. 25.

Jackson offered a rough estimate of \$260,000-\$300,000 in village revenues from the hotel the first year, a number he figures will rise in subsequent years. Also, a one-time gross receipts tax on construction of the \$10-\$15 million hotel will rake in \$350,000-\$525,000 for the village.

Village officials have wanted a hotel by the village's golf course for several years. Allhub, whose principals are R.D. Hubbard and Dr. Ed Allred, constructed The Links at Sierra Blanca golf course in Ruidoso, as well as the Ruidoso Downs racetrack. Hubbard always hoped to have a hotel next to the new Ruidoso Convention and Civic Events Center by the golf course, said Jon Sherry, director of local resort development for Allhub.

"This has been a long time coming, and we're very happy to get to this point, at least," Mayor Jerry Shaw said.

Construction is expected to begin as soon as a lease is signed and take a year to complete, Sherry said.

If New Mexico's voters approve gambling this fall, the estimated half-million dollars in village revenues from the hotel would be even higher.

"The fiscal impact (on the village's coffers) will be tremendous," Jackson predicted. Village officials hope to come up with some projected numbers (without gambling revenues) this week.

Sherry said Allhub will add gambling and square footage if the state's voters say yes to gambling - even if gambling is opened up to all communities in the state.

Allhub has a "plan A" and "plan B" for the hotel's size and design, depending on how the election concerning gambling turns out. That accounts for the \$10-15 million cost range.

Voters will decide this November if the state should legalize a state-operated lottery as well as wagering on video machine games of chance.

When the legislature meets early next year, it will decide if gambling will be limited to resort towns as some have proposed.

"I think a lot of people are real confused about what (the ballot wording) might mean," Jackson said. Therefore, officials thought it best to wait and see what happens.

Besides the new possibility of gambling, the basic economics of constructing the hotel have changed a lot in recent years, Sherry said.

"Five years ago, the hotel industry was just at the bottom," Sherry said. "So many banks owned hotels, it was foolish (to build one)."

But R.D. Hubbard bided his time.

"Mr. Hubbard always had a very substantial personal interest in Ruidoso," Sherry confirmed. "This is where he comes to relax. And he has a major (financial) interest in this project."

Village government revenues from a 3 1/2% gross receipts tax on the construction of the \$10-15 million hotel will create a large windfall in the first year.

The gross receipts tax will be levied without the need of a lease to use city property. The village receives about half of the total 6.8% gross receipts tax, while the state receives the rest.

Other taxes levied outside of the lease agreement include a 4% lodging tax placed on short-term room rentals, and an ad valorem (property) tax which fluctuates annually.

The lease allows for a gross room rent tax to be placed individually on the motel (please see accompanying list of lease requirements). This is nearly identical to a former lease between Allhub and the village that expired.

New to this lease is a 1% tax on the hotel restaurant's gross earnings.

Best hotel in state promised

Developers of a hotel by Ruidoso's new civic center say it will be the best in New Mexico.

With 157,000 square-feet and 150 hotel rooms, it also be among the largest in Ruidoso.

The Resort at Sierra Blanca, as Allhub's hotel is being called on a preliminary basis, will have what Sherry describes as a "European Mission" flavor.

"It will be a cross between a southwestern or California mission and a Mediterranean European look thrown together," Sherry said. It will have archways, colonnades (series of columns), rock and pop-outs.

"It won't look like one building when you're looking at it," Sherry added. The hotel will look as if it's in a different building than the restaurant.

Allhub expects to have architec-

"I think it's fair all the way around," Sherry said of the lease.

Sherry noted other benefits he believes the hotel's construction will bring to the community, such as the employment of 150-200 people, and the advertising the hotel will conduct regionally.

"Getting out there and selling Ruidoso is going to be part of the project," Sherry said. "We have to sell the destination first, then we have to sell the product."

Both the village and the product need to be sold to airlines as well, city and Allhub officials agree. Currently, no commercial airline serves the local airport. Jackson noted how Ruidoso is rated #8 in Ski Magazine's list of top resorts, but the village's major downfall is listed as, "Can't get there from here."

Sherry doesn't agree with detractors that the hotel will take away business from other lodging owners.

"There are people that want to stay in a cabin," Sherry observed. "But then there will be those people that have really got to have a hair-dryer mounted on the wall, and a mini-bar. This will be a boost for all lodging facilities, really."

The hotel will include three meeting rooms that can be combined into one room seating 1,000 people.

Another spur will be the entertainment area — a health club, pro shop, 19th hole grill and locker rooms.

A day spa will include areas for massage, mud packs, hairstyling and nail jobs.

Rooms will have amenities such as mini bars, two sinks, hair dryers and, of course, fabulous views.

Art will play a major role throughout the hotel, Sherry said.

"I'm sure it will be a grande dame — it's destined to be," Sherry said.

All the better for the village government, which will take over ownership in a half-century.

Terms of hotel lease outlined

Terms of the proposed lease between the Village of Ruidoso (property owner) and Allhub (hotel constructor and owner) include:

— a lease term of 50 years, after which the village will take over ownership of the hotel

— a minimum of 150 hotel rooms, plus a restaurant and in-house meeting rooms and related facilities

— a minimum guaranteed rental of \$5,000 per year

— during years 1-10, Allhub will pay the village 2% of the gross room rent, provided the hotel occupancy rate is 65% or higher (the old lease was the same for the first five years, but at 2% and 55% respectively for years 6-10)

— during years 11-30, a 2.5% gross room rent provided the occupancy rate is 60% (3% and 55% in the old lease)

— during years 31-50, a 3% gross room rent without any mini-

mum occupancy rate (4% in the old lease)

— during all years, Allhub gives the village 1% of its gross restaurant revenues

— Allhub has the right to conduct gambling if approved by the state's voters this fall; the lease calls for negotiations concerning gaming taxes after the election, with a provision for arbitration if necessary

— Allhub has the right to priority booking over other tentative events at the village's civic events center, excepting certain unnamed community events


— construction must commence within two years after the lease is signed

— the adjoining parking lot will be maintained jointly by Allhub, the village and the golf course

— provisions for Allhub's insurance coverage

— a right for Allhub to assign the lease to another party

Some Ruidoso residents still oppose Highway 48 expansion

Two designs and a dozen public hearings later, some residents of Ruidoso still are unhappy with the proposed expansion of State Highway 48.

They voiced their objections during an information session last week with the State Department of Highways and Transportation.

Construction on the long-debated Mechem Drive project could start in the spring of 1996 if a full-blown Environmental Impact Statement isn't required, said project engineer David Whitesel.

If his department can show that no significant environmental impact is likely to occur, acquisition of rights of way can begin, he said.

One of the 70 attending the Highway 48 session, Larry Mortero, criticized sidewalks planned in the first phase.

"I could kick myself for not keeping up," he said. "I thought the sidewalks were eliminated to reduce the cost and now they're

back in," he said, noting that extra land will have to be sliced from owners along the route to provide space.

Mike Steed, who owns a ski sports shop, said the project will rob him of valuable parking space required by the village.

"When you put a business in this town, you have to put in a certain number of parking spaces," he said.

"The highway department then says well they're gone. We're trying to be legal, but maybe you won't let us."

Phil Davis said, "I don't think I'm in a minority of people who think this still is overbuilt and should be redesigned. A lot of the people wanted it scaled down and I don't think they should have to come to meeting after meeting. It's still five lanes for half the project."

He said he's been told the state has spent too much money redesigning already.

"That's not our fault," Davis said. "We were speaking our minds and you all weren't listening.

You're changing the whole look and feel of the village."

Create any difficulty for people to visit and they'll go somewhere else and tell their friends, he said; three lanes are enough. He added that he was suppose to serve on the citizens' advisory meeting, but has never been called to attend a meeting.

Galen Farrington said many other resort communities realize the economic benefits from the cycling industry and have created special bike lanes, which improve safety. He noted that sidewalks cannot be used legally for bike riding. He objected to a five lane highway, saying it will disrupt the natural beauty of the area and will encourage faster speeds.

Robert Donaldson, a village councilor and ski business owner, asked state officials to consider scheduling construction around the ski season, and possibly the summer season.

"Part of the contract will be to keep access open at all times to

businesses," Whitesel said. "But it's not realistic all the time."

"The north side grade and alignment will be changed considerably in some places and there will be some blasting. During those times, no traffic will be allowed at all. We may restrict it to one lane with a pilot car at times."

The revision reduced the number of proposed lanes from four with a turn lane throughout the project to two driving lanes and a continuous left-turn lane from 1,000 north of Sudderth Drive to Buckner, and from Sierra Blanca Drive to White Mountain. But from Buckner to Sierra Blanca, four driving lanes with a left-turn lane

are part of the new design. From White Mountain to NM 532 (the ski area turnoff), a left or right climbing lane would be added to the two-lane road where warranted.

Although the scope decreased to three lanes on two thirds of the project, delays have resulted in an increase in material costs. The total project's estimated price tag stands at slightly under \$14 million, compared to about \$12.8 million four years ago for a larger, all five-lane design.

As now submitted, the project would cover reconstruction of New Mexico 48, primarily a two-lane road, from Sudderth Drive north

5.2 miles to Ski Run Road (NM632). Financed with federal money, two phases are planned; the first from Sudderth Drive to White Mountain Road and the second, to start about 1 1/2 years later, from White Mountain to Ski Run Road.

Whitesel defended the design, saying the road has become increasingly congested, leading to the design addition of signal lights at three intersections: Sudderth Drive (modernized), Cree Meadows and White Mountain. Street lighting also is under discussion for the full length of the project.

Sidewalks in the first phase should enhance pedestrian safety.

of the same shall remain subject to the disposition and under absolute jurisdiction and control of the congress of the United States."

In response to a follow-up letter sent by the commission in September, Calkins wrote that the county is arguing that the enabling act is invalid and that the United States holds no title to public lands in New Mexico.

"This is an argument, not a request for a record," he wrote. "The Aug. 26 letter to the board in reply to your Aug. 22 request was responsive as the Freedom of Information Act only requires an agency to respond to requests for records versus requests for information."

The commission contended in its letter to Calkins that the enabling act is invalid due to the "equal footing doctrine" established in law. Since the federal government was holding the lands in trust, they should have been turned over to the

New Mexico when it became a state.

"Also Territorial Legislatures do not have the power to enact laws that will encumber the evolving state, as this can only be done by the newly created state legislature and only according to Constitutional Law then prevailing," commissioners contended in their letter.

Other items on the meeting agenda Tuesday include a quarterly report from Valerie Miller, administrator of the Lincoln County Medical Center; David Vigil speaking about the county's historic preservation ordinance; appointments to the county loggers tax committee; and a report from Road Manager Bill Cupit on an inspection of roads in Rancho Ruidoso Valley Estates subdivision.

Counties in New Mexico and other western states, is being offered in anticipation of the success of a growing movement by western

states to reclaim public lands from federal management as provided by the United States Constitution," according to a news release from the commission office. "The proposed ordinance would empower the council to develop public lands management processes and oversee the management of public lands in the county."

The commission joined other counties earlier in the year asking the federal government to prove its ownership of lands in the state.

In response to the letter sent by the county Aug. 22, William C. Calkins, state director of the Bureau of Land Management, mailed a copy of the Enabling Act for New Mexico.

He specifically cited a paragraph that read "that the people inhabiting said proposed state do agree and declare that they forever disclaim all right and title to the unappropriated and ungranted lands lying within the boundaries there-

Picture perfect pets up for adoption at shelter

A picture-perfect dog, with fluffy white hair surrounding a terrier/poodle body, Meeker would make a great companion for someone looking for a small pet.

She's five years old and was brought to the Lincoln County Humane Society shelter by her owner, who said she could no longer keep the dog. But she gave her pet all high marks on behavior, including being housebroken, not a barker and affectionate with people.

Robert Cox, a society member who is sitting in as manager until a new person is hired, said Meeker loves to be carried and rides well in a car.

"She's also spayed, which lowers the cost of her adoption," Cox said. "She's a dog who's real easy to handle, is very sweet natured and ready for a new home."

In the new cat section of the remodeled and enlarged shelter, Frauline, a gray domestic short hair with a luxurious thick coat, also is up for adoption.

"She's about four to five months old and came in as a stray," Cox said. "She's also more than ready to go home with someone."

When she does find a home, the humane society urges that cats be outdoor pets.

Studies have shown that a cat that lives inside has an average life expectancy of 13 years. The number

drops to seven years for one that lives inside and outside. A totally outdoor cat's average lifespan is the lowest at three years.

Newcomers to the area may not realize that coyotes and foxes don't distinguish between rabbits and cats when it's time to eat. Both may constitute a good meal to a hungry predator.

Although much of the county may be considered rural, many wandering pets are killed each year on local streets and highways.

The county and its municipalities have adopted leash laws, which set fines for failure to keep a pet confined in a house, behind a fence, on a chain or on a leash when off personal private property.

Ruidoso's law goes further. It requires the spaying or neutering of pets over the age of six months. Those who have chosen not to spay their females and pay the higher annual license fee as well as buy a breeder's license, also are responsible for keeping the female dog or cat inside a safe enclosure during times of heat.

It's difficult for shelter workers to understand owners who allow their pets to breed when they see many spectacular animals, some with papers, destroyed for lack of homes.

For every new human, 14 dogs and 46 cats are born. Each year, 14 million pets, some just kittens and puppies, are killed in shelters

across the nation. Many more die from disease or because they are abandoned.

"To us, every death is a tragedy," Cox said. "We can't understand how some people treat animals like furniture, something to be discarded when they move or the pet becomes an inconvenience. They are living and loving companions."

"I see dogs come in that have been treated miserably, yet they long for human affection and even

wag their tails as we try to mend a wound or, if there is no other alternative, put them down.

"I wish more people could understand by working here. Then maybe, they would go home with a different point of view."

Volunteers always are needed and may help at the thriftshop near Arby's on Sudderth, can walk the dogs at the shelter (older teens or adults only), play with the cats, become a sponsor or provide a foster home.

University gains access to Internet

Eastern New Mexico University has obtained a grant worth \$96,571 to aid its branch campuses and three other schools in gaining Internet access. The schools to reap the benefits of the information highway are Clovis Community College, New Mexico Junior College, New Mexico Military Institute, and the Roswell and Ruidoso branches of ENMU.

David McClary, ENMU instructor of Computer Information Systems and former director of Computer Services, applied for the grant to hook the Portales campus to Internet as well as the grant to help the five other institutions.

Internet is a communications system run through computers that was developed by the military. It uses phone lines to transmit information from large databases cover such topics as library periodical deposits, law libraries, medical data, scientific research, job listings, and many others. McClary estimated that there are close to two million services available on line.

Access to this wide variety of current information is available to today's student. No longer will the student be limited by the strained budgets of libraries when it comes time to do research. According to McClary, by the year 2000, technology should allow film quality images to be transmitted across the Internet. This would enable students to take classes through the Internet and still have the ability to interact with the professor and class.







Ruidoso Warriors back on winning track with Wildcat wins

The Ruidoso Warrior Football team bounced back to the win column Friday, Oct. 30, with a road victory over Fabens, Texas, 21-0.

The first shutout for the Warriors in recent memory saw Ruidoso's offense, defense and special teams perform very well, dominating in every statistical category.

The Wildcats got the opening possession (Ruidoso is 0-6 in coin tosses this season), but could do no better than their own 40-yardline. Three incomplete passes during the drive didn't help the Wildcats' cause.

The Warriors' first possession started on their own 18 yardline after a 42-yard Fabens punt. It was just two plays before the locals netted their initial first down, but the 18-play drive stalled at the Fabens' 41.

The Warriors proved that they could move the ball, but the passing game that had really begun to click in previous weeks was not in sync, which eventually made the drive sputter.

Jackie Roe got away a nice punt (36 yards) but the Wildcats managed a 24-yard return, so Fabens escaped the situation with fairly good field position. Starting at their own 29, the Wildcats pattered along until halfback Fernando Hernandez broke through the secondary for a 41-yard gain.

Suddenly, the Wildcats were op-

erating at the Warrior nine yardline, and the quick start that Ruidoso was hoping for was in danger of going down the tubes. A repeat of last week's Portales nightmare was waiting in the wings. It didn't happen.

The Warrior defense, just as they had done in the Tularosa game, stuffed the Wildcats on three successive plays while the Fabens drive ended on a missed 27-yard field goal.

It was three-and-out for the Warrior offense on their next possession, but at least the scoreboard still showed all zeros. Again, the defense had to take the field.

A Fabens 34-yard pass got the ball back into Warrior territory, to the Warrior 33. Facing the same situation as the last drive, the Warrior defense dug in and gave the ball back to the offense on downs.

Fabens had left Ruidoso territory empty handed on two possessions and Warrior offense seemed energized by the defense's stubborn play.

John Echols ripped for nine yards on the first play of the drive and called Kyle Humphreys' num-

ber on the second play for another seven yards. Humphreys rolled for 14 more yards a play later and the Warriors were near mid-field - for a second.

A holding penalty backed the locals to their own 36, but a facemask penalty on Fabens gave it all back on the next play.

It was at that point that Echols found his passing touch again. The senior quarterback found Brandon Eamello for nine yards and Byron Soules for 11 in successive plays. Ruidoso was now on the Fabens' 12.

Echols ran for three yards on first down and completed the drive with a perfect spiral to Eamello in the left corner of the end zone for the Warriors' first TD of the night. The extra point was no good.

The half ended with Ruidoso up by six, but more importantly, the Warriors had seized the momentum and control of the game.

Ruidoso struck again in the third quarter on their second possession. Starting at their own 17, the Warriors put together a seven minute, 17-play drive that culminated with another Echols-to-Eamello pass. The 13-yard TD

strike was followed by Jackie Roe's reception of another Echols toss for the two-point conversion.

The Wildcats got the ball on the kickoff and with a return to their own 40, their passing attack offered up another gift. Robert Guardiola, who splits his time at monster or defensive end, was at the right place at the right time and got his first interception of the year, returning the ball to the Fabens' 45.

The Warriors returned the favor on the next play as the Wildcats recovered a fumble and went back to work on offense.

Three straight incomplete passes and a 35-yard punt gave the Warriors the ball back in just 26 seconds, however.

Starting from their own 25, the Warriors ran the football and clock very impressively on their last scor-

ing drive. Echols scampered for 24 yards on the second play of the drive, while Rex Comanche and David LaMay added seven and three yards respectively.

From mid-field Echols fired his last pass of the night and it was a beauty. Byron Soules ran under the perfect strike for a 49-yard gain, just one yard shy of paydirt.

That's when the Warrior fans and coaching staff felt a lump in their throats. Echols was hit after the pass, and was down on the field for several minutes with an injured right knee. Hopping off under his own power, Echols gave way to sophomore back-up QB Billy Rogge.

Rogge called David LaMay's number to run the ball in and Soules added the PAT. Ruidoso led the Wildcats 21-0, which was the final score.

Soules intercepted a Fabens pass and returned the ball to the Fabens' 11, but the Warriors could not muster another first down, and Soules misfired on a 27-yard field goal attempt.

Echols' status for this week's district opener with Santa Teresa will not be fully known until later in the week, but the senior QB pronounced himself ready in the locker room after the game.

If he was overly optimistic with his prediction, Rogge stands ready in the wings. While the younger quarterback lacks Echols laser-guided arm, he is an exceptional runner and the Desert Warriors will have their hands full trying to stop the Warrior option attack.

Santa Teresa is 5-1 on the season, including four straight. The game, which is slated for W.D. Horton Stadium, starts at 7:30 p.m.

The Ruidoso Warrior Soccer team got its third straight win Saturday with a 10-0 smashing of District 3-AAA rival Portales. The Warriors also swept Roswell High in a two-game home-and-home series with AAA power Roswell High, last week.

An exhibition golf clinic for girls will take place at 8:30 a.m. For more information, call The Links at 258-5330, or 1-800-8-LINKS-1.



Editorial

'If you'll just listen, I'll try to explain it...'

You don't have to look far to see examples of the trouble people can get into when they don't communicate. A minor classic movie called "Cool Hand Luke" comes to mind ("What we have here is a failure to communicate"), but there are many more immediate examples, positive and otherwise.

It took a good shot of one-on-one two weeks ago between Jimmy Carter and Haitian Gen. Raul Cedras to avoid what might have been one bloody invasion of a troubled Caribbean island.

Fine — but now the U.S. presence is growing by the thousands because the pro and con reform factions choose not to listen: "Don't confuse me with reason when I want my revenge."

In New Mexico, gubernatorial campaign spin-doctors presumably are trying to communicate with the voters in every village and television station, but the pollsters see little evidence that they are succeeding. Republican challenger Gary Johnson still is slightly ahead, Democrat Gov. Bruce King trails a bit, and the Green Party's Roberto Mondragon continues as a marginal spoiler.

The Mescalero tribe has been trying to communicate its position on economic development for years, exhibiting considerably more patience in the process than those other New Mexicans whose minds also are made up.

Life would be much simpler, of course, if everybody had the capacity to separate reason and emotion. When the issue is gambling, self-interest generates emotions of fear and envy. If it's a question of temporary storage of spent nuclear power plant fuel, a whole generation steeped in fear of atomic war automatically conjures up images of Hiroshima's children.

Communication is an active verb; it demands speakers and listeners. And an emotional commitment to try to understand, which can be defined simply as patience.



Why all those admission fees for school events?

TO THE EDITOR:

This letter is concerning the 8th grade volleyball game that my family attended Saturday... I was rather surprised to see that they were charging \$2 for adults and \$1 for students, especially since they did not charge for the first game that my family attended. I inquired as to what the fee was to be applied toward and was informed that the money went for uniforms, referees, and to the High School.

First of all, if they are going to charge admittance, I personally think that it should be applied directly to the school that the athletes are representing! Second of all, shouldn't our school board allow for these expenses in their budget and school taxes levied since they are bound to be anticipated before

the school year begins?

I was also informed it was only a \$6 fee for my family to be admitted. Wanting to support my daughter from the stands, I paid the fee, and can assure you that the \$6 was not the issue. But I informed the volunteer (a capacity in which we have also served and could not do without these individuals) that I was concerned for the families of athletes that are on very limited budgets and have several children participating in school athletics.

This could be very costly for these families and they might not be financially able to attend and support all their children's activities as they would like to. (People with large families and two or three children participating in sports could very easily spend \$100

a month!)

I was then informed that these individuals would be allowed to enter the gymnasium without an admittance fee just for the asking. I don't think that these people should have to risk the embarrassment of having to ask to be admitted free! Don't the junior high schools want to encourage all the support in the form of attendance from the community that they can get? They might not be accomplishing that with an entrance fee.

These admittance fees are also in addition to the \$10 activity fees that I paid when school started for each one of my children in addition to another \$15 fee charge by FFA. Shouldn't these fees collected from all students be enough to help cover expenses that the school tax and

school budget should have allowed for in the first place? I admit that I am not well-informed on the school budget, but this seems like poor planning to me.

I appeal to the school board to at least repeal this junior high sports event admittance fee so that financially limited families wanting to attend can do so without having to prior examine their financial situation.

If the school district needs the income to help cover expenses, then why don't they just set up a donation box at the door. I will be happy to contribute. But at least everyone wanting to attend can do so, while giving our teams the support that they deserve.

Upon Reflection

King's campaign style doesn't impress Gary

ALBUQUERQUE—You enter Republican gubernatorial nominee Gary Johnson's statewide headquarters off one of the state's most heavily traveled thoroughfares, just a few blocks east of Albuquerque's huge and notoriously congested Coronado shopping complex. Once inside, however, visitors are likely to encounter a cheerfully energized cadre of campaign workers and volunteers busy at tasks they are convinced will help make the 41 year old amateur triathlete New Mexico's next governor.

Their candidate is less outgoing, particularly around journalists whom he may blame for having reported a string of charges of unscrupulous business practices he and his company, Big J Enterprises, have been hit with during the campaign. Nonetheless, he is cordial. At least he was when I called upon him recently, circumspect but cordial.

Perhaps because he is new to politics and inexperienced in public

policy parley, he is cautious in discussing what are called "the issues." He has been burned more than

once, after all, for what one state political commentator has called his "goofy" proposals.

That, along with some of his business affairs and his admitted past use of cocaine and marijuana, have possibly caused him the greatest grief in his run for the state's top job. Particularly the part about cocaine seems increasingly to fester in some quarters, Republican included, where more and more one is apt to hear it uncomfortably mentioned.

Johnson has no hesitation in discussing his athletic activities, however. "My day starts at 4:45 in the morning and I work out until 7:00," he reports.

He'll tell you more than once that he's a "competitor" and "disciplined." All totaled, he goes on to say, "I've entered three triathlons since the campaign began, including the Municipal League 5-K race in Carlsbad, coming in first in all three."

During the GOP gubernatorial primary campaign, some of his three opponents were known to joke among themselves about Johnson's frequent references to his athletic experiences, and the comparison he often drew between those experiences and the affairs of state government. Notwithstanding the jokes, athletics have left the trim and graceful candidate with the kind of focused energy which doubtless comes in handy in dealing with the rigors of a campaign trail reaching into every corner of one of the nation's largest states.

Johnson hesitates when asked his impressions of Green party candidate for governor, Roberto Mondragon. Possibly because Mondragon has also suffered occasional foot-in-mouth disease when marching through the underbrush of issues which concern various blocs of voters the Republican candidate will only say, "I guess he's doing alright."

After moments of reflection, however, he thinks it important to add that "At this point there is no question that he's hitting me more than King. Our polls show that two out of every three voters who go to Mondragon would (otherwise) be mine."

Johnson is less reluctant to discuss Democratic Gov. Bruce King

the incumbent he is confident he will defeat in November. All of King's former Republican opponents have been fascinated by

the governor's campaign style. King's 1990 GOP rival, Frank Bond, characterized it as "formidable."

Gary Johnson seems not to be impressed, however. "I think he's got a good heart and is a nice guy," he explains. "But if you notice, when he and I enter the same room, he'll rush around and shake everybody's hand, saying 'hi ya' the way he always does. I will probably only shake a quarter of the hands of people there, but when I shake those hands I talk to the people, give them some attention, which King doesn't really do."

Mr. Johnson, in other words, is observant.

More still, that daily work-out of which he speaks with satisfaction seemingly has, indeed, left him "centered."

Asked what, as a newcomer, he makes of the rough and tumble of a political campaign, he responds: "I discount the worst things that are said about me because I know they are untrue. I also discount the best things said about me for the same reason."
