Health screenings offered next week

The Second Annual Health Fair in Lincoln County, offering immunizations, free flu shots and health screenings for blood pressure, cholesterol, glucose and HIV is set for Tuesday, Oct. 25 and Friday, Oct. 28.

Youth injured in gun accident

A 17-year-old Ruidoso resident was shot accidentally Sunday evening while handing a rifle back to his cousin.

Jeff Daniels was listed in stable condition Monday at Lincoln County Medical Center, where he underwent surgery for a wound to his right thigh.

Cpl. Wolfgang Born, a Ruidoso Police detective, said about 11 p.m. Sunday Jerry Smith of Ruidoso was showing his new 30/30 caliber rifle to Daniels in a relative's home at 102 Cree Meadows.

"They hadn't been arguing; at this point we consider it an accidental shooting."

Mescalero petition seeks vote 'accuracy' on MRS

A petition drive has been started to ensure accurate results in a referendum on whether spent nuclear fuel rods should be stored on the Mescalero Apache reservation.

Rufina Marie Laws and several other members of the tribe started the petition drive Sunday. They are calling for computerized voting machines to replace traditional paper ballots, pencils and hand counting "in seduction."

They noted that Mescalero President Wendell Chino promised to convert to voting machines, "when the Mescalero Apache people re-

quest the tribal council to use voting machines," in a letter to the editor published in *The Albuquerque Journal* on May 10.

The reforms being requested also call for the elimination of an election board appointed by the tribal president and approved by the tribal council. Laws was a candidate for president in the last tribal election.

Instead, petitioners are asking for supervision by an unbiased, independent third party selected by the use of voting machines "in an effort to establish elections and referendums that are fair and free

of voting contamination activities."

Laws said that the contract between the Mescaleros and a 35-member nuclear utility consortium is to be presented to the entire tribal body for a vote. The nuclear power plants are running out of space to store their own used rods and are attempting to find an interim storage site until a permanent repository in Yucca Mountain, Nevada is ready.

"Due to the outstanding flaws in the current voting methods, which may produce contamination, invalid and biased results, the Nuclear Utility Consortium may unfairly find a favorable vote for its radioactive nuclear waste dumping," Laws said.


In a resolution to the tribal council and Chino, the petitioners noted that the same election process adopted in 1934 is being used today.

They wrote: "Whereas, the Nuclear Waste issue is far too critical a vote to be decided upon using the same method that has been in existence for decades. The old method in using ballot sheets, pencils and the tallying of votes in total seclusion by an election board, which consists of eligible voting members of the tribe is not fair and is not free of voting contamination..."

The resolution also demands voting machines for the referendum, and that the tallying of ballots fall under the supervision of an unbiased election board.

Three months ago, Miller Hudson, a consultant to the tribal council on the spent nuclear fuel storage issue, told members of the MRS (Monitored Retrievable Storage) Information Regional Committee meeting in Ruidoso that the referendum tentatively was scheduled for October.

The population of Mescalero is listed by the state at about 3,000.

Texas fugitive captured

One of the 10 most wanted fugitives in the state of Texas was arrested Thursday morning in Ruidoso by Lincoln County Sheriff James McSwane.

According to a spokesman from McSwane's office, Alfred Wendell Berg, 47, gave up without a struggle when confronted by the sheriff and deputy Angelo Vega at a home in Cedar Creek.

"Angelo was at one door and I was at the other," McSwane said. "When he saw the situation, he just gave up and put his hands together to be cuffed."

Berg was on mandatory supervision release in 1992 as part of a 15

year sentence for aggravated sexual abuse of a child and indecent contact of a child, when he fled, according to Joseph Ober Hauser, program administrator for the Texas Pardons and Parole Board.

That agency issued a warrant for Berg's arrest on July 16, 1992. A warrant subsequently was issued in Wise County, Texas for Berg on a charge of aggravated sexual assault on a child.

By 11 a.m. Thursday, Berg had appeared in court, waived opposition to extradition and was on his way back to the Decatur, Texas jail.

McSwane said Berg apparently had been in the Ruidoso area several times in the last two years.

Fire destroys rural home

Ted and Lou Poindexter and son John, 16, are starting their lives over following the Tuesday (Oct. 11) loss by fire of their rural Lincoln County home.

The family was left with the clothes they wore, their vehicles and some animals after the fire destroyed their residence just off Highway 37 opposite the Loma Grande Addition.

A pet year-old pot-bellied pig, a male cat and two pet ferrets could not be rescued. Three other cats survived, as did three horses and two dogs on the place.

Lou Poindexter said she found her kitchen in flames when she entered it from a bedroom at about 12:30 p.m. Her husband and son both were away working.

"I ran back in the bedroom and dialed 911 but got no answer, then tried my church and other numbers and got messages the numbers no longer were in service," she said.

She drove off to phone for help from Gady's store, where her daughter worked, at Alto. But smoke had been seen and the alarm given. The Bonito volunteer fire department responded at 1:03 p.m., according to Chris Denne, safety officer, and Nogal firemen also were at the scene.

By the time firemen arrived there was no saving the three-bedroom, two-car-garage home the Poindexters had bought two years ago. "We moved here from Midland (Texas) after my mother died," Lou Poindexter said. "We'd been coming

to Ruidoso for vacations since I was a child; my father built several houses here."

She said she can only guess that the fire might have started from grease around her electric range. "If it had been a gas stove I might not be here," she said. She added that an insurance inspector had estimated the house loss at \$102,000, "not including the furniture."

The pet animals had been in a back bedroom which was last to burn, she said, "but the firemen just couldn't get to them."

The Poindexter family now is staying with a daughter, Jan Millar, in Ruidoso.

Lou Poindexter noted that firemen, neighbors, Gateway Church of Christ members, and many others have helped since the fire.

"A fireman brought clothes for my son that fit perfectly. The church set up an account for us at Wal-Mart. Dr. Jim Miller of ENMU-Ruidoso even replaced son John's books that burned."

"The way everybody has helped, I know why people love Ruidoso. All I can say is thanks to everybody."

Routes vary for Underwood, Williams

They come down on the same side of most issues, so why is retired teacher Dub Williams challenging State Rep. H. John Underwood in his bid for a third term?

"One of the big things is that I think we need a two-party system. We need to give folks a choice," Williams said.

What appears to separate Democrat Underwood from Republican Williams is that while the incumbent has learned how to use the system to benefit District 56, Williams would like to change the system.

"I think my philosophy as to how we need to let people help themselves is different," Williams said. "It seems to me that the person who worked for the money and earned it should have more say over how it should be spent."

"Whether we're getting it back from Santa Fe or from Washington D.C., it really turns out that it's the money of the people to start with. I don't believe there ever has been a government that has created any wealth. The wealth comes from the people. I keep hearing from people that they'd just like to have less government in their lives."



But it's hard to argue with success and Underwood has been successful to the tune of \$4 million for Lincoln County. That money helped pay for a new civic events center in Ruidoso, installation of sidewalks, street lights and trees in the downtown section of the village, is being used to build a water plant at Grindstone reservoir and started an alternative school for troubled teens. It went toward repairs at the Carrizozo community pool, remodeling of the fairground at Capitan and creation of a senior citizens building in Corona.

Underwood lobbied hard to save Fort Stanton Hospital, which was about to be closed. The largest employer in the county, it now has been converted into an essential

Among Underwood's organizational involvements are Rotary, the State Juvenile Justice Advisory Board, the State Bar Association, co-chairman of the Governmental Ethics Oversight Committee, past president of the Lincoln County Bar Association, member of the legislature's Judicial Committee, Voters and Election Committee, Radioactive and Hazardous Waste Committee, and the Courts and Criminal Justice Committee.

Williams cited his past presidencies of the Evening Lions Clubs, the Ruidoso Education Association, the Ruidoso Little League and the Water Defense Association. He is a member of People for the West, the New Mexico Farm Bureau, the National Cattlemen's Association, the Lincoln County Medical Center Board, the American Association of Retired Persons and the County Tax Protest Board.

part of the state's health care system. He helped remove the gross receipts tax from horse care and agricultural products to ensure sales within the state were not harmed.

"I helped pass a bill that prevents juvenile from taking guns on campus, but I'm not in favor of gun control," he said. "I'm supportive of turning federal lands back into state lands. I have voted a conservative agenda, because I think that's reflective of my constituents."

Underwood said he decided to run for a third term because several projects remain to be completed and he's in a better position to benefit his district.

"I think there's such a learning curve when you first go into a new situation, that it takes at least two years or the first term to figure out where the bathroom is," he said.

His second term, he found the keys to the vault and in a third term, with seniority and prime committee appointments, more good things could happen, such as finding money to improve Ruidoso's sewage system.

To ensure that he is responsive to residents of the district that covers all of Lincoln County and portions of Otero and Chaves counties, Williams said he plans to sit down in a round table with representatives from all aspects of each community and ask what they think he could do to serve them better.

Both candidates favor passage of the amendment to allow a lottery and video gambling.

"We've done exactly what we

should have done. The people will have the say and then the legislature needs to decide how the money will be spent and not put it into the general fund," Williams said. "It should be designated for aging or education or some specific area."

"On the other hand, I think we have to be real careful when we get to point that we are going to fund anything based on gambling, because the amount may fluctuate."

He would favor allowing local option votes for all towns and villages, Williams said. "Certainly the villages around (gambling on Indian reservations) should have that choice."

Underwood said he worked hard to bring the gambling issue before voters as a constitutional amendment Nov. 8.

"With \$20 million going out of state each year, I think the lottery is a given," he said. "The hard sell was the video gaming."

Drafting tough legislation to regulate gambling will be essential and he has the background to do it, he said. "I'm not in favor of having wide open gaming casinos in Ruidoso. I have no desire to repeat the mistakes in Deadwood, S.D., or to see this as little Las Vegas," Underwood said.

"The legislation I've introduced in the past limited it to resort communities. If they then wished to opt out of the right given by the legislation, I'd favor that."

On crime, Underwood said he intends to be active in revising "good time" regulations that allow criminals time off for good behavior. The good time should not be ap-

plied to DWI sentences, he said.

"That means more expense and may mean more jails, not only with DWIs, but with all sentences, good time need to be reviewed and certainly, eliminated for those with violent crime conviction."

"In the same regard, we obviously have problems at (minimum security prison) Camp Sierra Blanca. I will introduce legislation that people sent to honor camps can't be above a certain level of offender."

"I'm also in favor of boot camps and will support or introduce legislation to establish them (for young offenders)."

Williams said he would pursue changing the law to require parents to participate personally, such as painting over graffiti, and financially when their children do damage or steal.

He favors truth in sentencing, even if it means building more jails.

"I think the taxpayers have been telling me, let's get it done no matter what it costs," Williams said. "We want them to serve their sentence. It's going to cost. We need to let those people know what's going to happen to them when they cross the line."

Both candidates would support the repeal of the remaining 4-cents of the 6-cent state gasoline tax enacted last year, but they want customers to see a drop at the gas pump.

Both men oppose the proposal to store nuclear spent fuel rods on the neighboring Mescalero Apache reservation.

Homes needed for big and small

Striking blue eyes follow visitors to the Lincoln County Humane Society shelter as they walk passed the outside kennel of Kodiak, an attractive Samoyed/Husky mix with a thick buff and white coat.

The one-year-old male was found wandering at the chili cook-off during the recent Aspenfest celebration. He wasn't wearing a collar or tags.

"He's very affectionate," said Roberta Cox, a member of the society board who temporarily is managing the shelter until a new director is hired.

"He wants to be hugged. All of his energy is directed toward humans, not away from them. He calms down quickly when he's on a leash and getting some attention, but he's very strong and would need someone who could spend time with him. He also seems fine with children. He's just a big child himself."

A much smaller and more delicately built, possibly a chocolate labrador/retriever mix named Lady is up for adoption for someone who prefers a gentle pet.

Her coat is reddish with short curls down her spine, but straight and close to her body everywhere else. Lady has golden eyes, a narrow muzzle and lots of love to give.

"She was rescued by someone who saw her on the road between Carrizozo and Capitan," Cox said. "They went back for her, but they couldn't keep her and brought her to the shelter. She's about eight months old and won't get much bigger."

Her size is close to a miniature poodle.

"Unfortunately, she's been here a long time and she needs a home," Cox said. "Three more dogs just came in yesterday and more cats and dogs are coming today. We get crowded very quickly, even with the additional space."

"Lady has never shown any aggression, including toward children. She would need to be spayed and Kodiak has to be neutered. Right now, Lady has some white flecks on her coat, but that's just the paint she brushed against during the renovation of the shelter."

The society still needs some kennel units for space that is ready to hold dogs, except for the framework that fits over the block dividers. Organizations or individuals looking for a cause worthy of their attention are encouraged to visit the shelter. The units cost \$350 and mean one more dog can be helped.

Cox also is asking that owners not wait until after the shelter is closed for the day to drop off their unwanted pets or litters.

"Someone recently dropped off four beautiful and seemingly healthy pups, but put them into one of the outside cages in back with an animal who was in isolation because of an illness," she said. "Now

they must stay isolated for three weeks before they can be put into the general population and up for adoption, and that's time when they could be exposed to other diseases.

"I strongly discourage anyone from just leaving animals at night, but if there is an emergency, there are three cages in front that are empty and can be used, at least until we have our perimeter fence put up."

Another way individuals or groups may help is by dedicating an hour or two a week to walk the dogs

and give them some personal attention. It's good for the animals and for the volunteers.

If time can't be donated, contribution may be mailed to the society at P.O. Box 2832, Ruidoso, NM 88345. Totebags, T-shirts (\$12.50 each by mail) and sweatshirts (\$22.50), bearing the society's "Adopt a Friend" logo in turquoise or hot pink also may be purchased.

At 8 p.m., a costume party to benefit long-time Ruidoso resident and barber Tony Jenkins also is planned at Cree. The Graham Brothers will provide the music and partners will supply the motion.

Dancers will be charged \$2 per person at the door. The proceeds will help defray medical expenses Jenkins has incurred fighting cancer.

One of the goals the council hopes to pursue with the help of the proceeds from the pumpkin sales is to initiate more parenting classes, specifically for young parents.

The only formal parenting skills training in the county is offered by Dr. Birgit LaMothe, held six weeks twice a year under the sponsorship of Head Start, Youth Empowered for Success (YES), Region IX Edu-

cation Cooperative and the Ruidoso School District.

The council consist of 20 members appointed by the County Commission last year and headed by Dr. Arlene Brown. The members are practicing professionals from the fields of health, mental health, education and social services.

Charged with assessing the needs of families in the county and promoting programs and services, the council is working toward implementing several goals contained in a recently completed needs assessment.

Particularly targeted are young parents who may lack skills in nurturing and disciplining their children.

Coe tests vanilla crop in Australia

Local General Contractor Terry Coe believes he has discovered an Aztec treasure in Australia.

Five years ago, Coe, vice-president of T.L.C. Construction in Ruidoso, purchased Keleka Farms, a plantation of 105 acres. It is close to pristine Pacific beaches and the city of Bundaberg, Queensland, which is the fruit and vegetable capital of Australia.

Coe bought the farm to cash in on the vanilla bean business originated with the Aztec Indians in the 16th century.

Vanilla, with its seemingly inedible fruit and beans, was discovered by the Aztecs to make an excellent flavoring for foods and beverages when cured by months of heat and humidity. Until the 19th century, vanilla was also considered an aphrodisiac and to have therapeutic values, good for everything from aiding digestion and preventing headaches to counteracting poisons and bites.

The Aztecs called the brown vanilla beans "tlixochitl," the Aztec word for "black flower," and required the Indians who produced them to give the finest pods to emperor Montezuma as tax payments.

According to Coe, about 90 percent of all vanilla in the world is produced in Madagascar, where it is hand pollinated, a very labor in-

tensive and expensive procedure.

Keleka Farms is the first and only farm in Australia to grow Planiflora Vanilla Orchids, producing an annual crop of vanilla beans which sell for up to \$150 per kilo on the world market, Coe said. The area was chosen to grow vanilla because of the perfect climate and the Native Melliflora Bee, which pollinates the vanilla flowers.

"This indigenous bee has pollinated our vanilla vines, and we are producing vanilla beans at present," Coe said. "We are now in a position to compete in the world vanilla market as the low cost producer."

At Keleka Farms, vanilla vines are grown on tropical fruit trees because vanilla contains a natural insect repellent which helps keep fruit flies and other insects off of the host tree along with the vines.

Gravity flowdrip irrigation systems from large water storage tanks, coupled with a pressure system, waters the entire orchard in about three hours.

"By companion planting, both tree and vanilla vines benefit from the same water system," Coe said.

Coe hopes Keleka Farms production will be around 10,000 kilos of vanilla beans by 1999.

Ancient Aztecs may have discovered vanilla, but Coe is determined to have a g'day in Australia by cashing in on the crop.





On a sunny afternoon on October twelve with the October sky the bluest of the blues, Russell Dorsey took his grandfather, C.R. Hicks and myself on a ride over Lincoln County in his Cessna airplane.

From the airport we circled down around Riverside and came up the valley.

It was like looking down on what you might call a "Toy World" with the houses, fields and orchards looking like picture in a children's book.

Still, small as they seemed from the height, all the details of the moving landscape below were very plain to see, in the clear air with the bright sun shining down. You could recognize all the landmarks along the shining, winding river bordered by the light gold of the Autumn leaves on the river trees.

You could look down on Hondo High School, San Patricio Churches of St. Jude and San Patricio.

Farther along was the Glencoe Sales Barn and then Saint Anna's Chapel. It gave me a special feeling to look down on the Storm Ranch with Mark's new house, the old corral, with Storm Mountain and the Knoll close by.

On up the way Ruidoso Downs and the Race Track came into view, and then the shining little city at the foot of the mountain, Ruidoso.

Heading for the mountain you could see White Sands shining in the distance.

Circling the mountain we looked out at the groves of aspen, like patches of pure gold on the steep mountain sides. It looked as if pure gold dust had been poured into the deep ravines and valleys mid-way up the mountain.

Here and there you could see a grove of Mountain Maple shining in pure crimson.

From the mountain we whirled over Carrizozo all by itself on the plain, with the Mal Pais lava bed extending away to the south.

"Where the Deer and Antelope Play"

We circled around the west end of the Capitan Mountains and flew over the plains

and prairie country on the north side.

A band of antelope, fifteen or twenty in the herd, appeared below us running all in formation, like cavalry, with their tan and white colors shining. A little later another band appeared also running all together, with some young ones seeming to have no trouble keeping up with the grown folks.

On the way back to the airport we looked down upon the historic little city of Capitan, with the green football field shining next to the high school.

Remembering that it was Columbus Day, I could not help but think back to Christopher Columbus and his courageous sailors in their three ships, Nina, Pinta, and Santa Maria, and the long journey to reach our shores, five hundred and two years ago.

This journey which took more than a month, would only take hours today by plane.

It was a special pleasure to be a passenger in a plane so skillfully landed by a man who loves flying and who says: "God is truly my copilot."

I thank Russell Dorsey for taking his grand-dad and me for this trip over Lincoln County in the glorious October weather on Columbus Day, 1994.

This is something I will remember always.



Colts romp as Ruidoso slips in district play

The Ruidoso Warrior football team lost its fifth game of the season and its third to a top-ten school Friday night as the Silver Colts handed the Warriors a 26-0 whipping in Silver City.

The loss put Silver atop the district standings with a 2-0 record in 3-A play. Socorro also is undefeated in the district.

Santa Theresa, which lost to Cobre on Friday, is 1-1, as is Cobre.

Hot Springs and Ruidoso have yet to win a district game.

It was a quick death for the Warriors, as the Colts struck early with quarterback Leo Trujillo going 42 yards on Silver's fourth play from scrimmage.

The PAT gave Silver the lead 7-0, with just 1:38 elapsed from the clock.

Ruidoso's frustration continued as John Echols' first pass of the night was picked off by Trujillo and returned to three yard line. Silver went in two plays later. The extra

point was missed and the Warriors trailed by 13, and hadn't broke a sweat yet.

The next play was pivotal for the Warriors. On the kick off, sophomore Billy Rogge returned Silver's missile all the way to the eleven on a beautiful blast up the middle. The Warrior kick return team, which has had a rather lack luster year thus far, opened a hole for Rogge that you could drive a Mack Truck through.

On first down, the Warriors

were penalized five yards for illegal equipment. Apparently, one of the Warriors forgot to put his mouth piece in. The penalty was a killer. Now the Blue faced first and fifteen, against the best defense the team had played all year.

The Warriors got 11 yards, but couldn't score. An Echols' pass on fourth down didn't find its mark and the Warriors would leave the red zone empty handed.

The Lady Warriors tramped to Silver City on Oct. 8, and were run over the galloping Colts in three straight games.

The Warriors could not get untracked in game one; playing without two varsity regulars did not help. Lacking confidence, the Lady Warriors were no match for the tall and talented Lady Colts. The score in Game 1 was 6-15. In Game 2 the coaches made some changes in the line-up and the Warriors should have won the game, before losing 14-16. Play was inspired but the players were still not playing up to their potential as a team.

Game 3 was a total blow-out 0-15. No one played well and the team was humiliated in the Lady Colt gym.

The loss dropped the district record to 2 and 3.

Tuesday, Oct. 11 the Lady Warriors (alias Dr. Jeckyl and Mr. Hyde) came to play. With the return of Marissa Martinez and Jessica Dixon to the line-up the Warriors played with a vengeance.



Editorial

A story of destruction and what might happen

Not a pretty story: Four Ruidoso youths were apprehended on Oct. 8 and charged with burglarizing and vandalizing upwards of 19 summer homes.

More than \$50,000 in damage was done. Thousands of dollars worth of items apparently stolen from the homes have been recovered. That's big-time crime anywhere, and if there were indications of major fencing of merchandise we'd think a well-organized theft ring was at work.

But the suspects are one 15-year-old girl and three boys aged 14, 15, and 16. Most apparently had not been living with their parents for several days, and one reportedly was a runaway. All are being held pending prosecution for a variety of crimes, including residential burglary, criminal damage to property and larceny.

Police investigators had some apt words for what was done to the homes: "Wanton destruction...the damage just sickens you."

With evidence gathered and a case prepared, the kids, collectively or individually, at some point will stand before a juvenile court judge and a verdict will be rendered. In the worst (or best, depending on your point of view) instance, one or all of the boys will be sent to the state boys' correctional school at Springer, an institution sometimes called a preparatory school for those bound for the state penitentiary. A similar school for girls is in Albuquerque.

If most Ruidoso vacation home owners had a say, upon conviction the parents of these kids would be required to make restitution, and the kids themselves would be sent away for a long, long time.

But based on long practice in New Mexico it's likely that little will happen to the kids if they are found guilty, and nothing to the parents, and various insurance companies will pick up the tab for the homeowners.

Parents must be responsible for the actions of their minor children — and the state should be sure they do.

Village's water supply under control

TO THE EDITOR:

The Village of Ruidoso has projected future water rights needs, historical projected diversion of water, usage, and quality of water.

The village owns and/or co-owns 7,944 acre feet of water rights. We have 1,600 acre-feet of raw water in Grindstone Dam, 240 acre-feet storage in Alto Lake, and 18 million gallons of treated storage in various locations throughout the village.

The village diversion for the year 1993-94 was 2,078 acre-feet; 920 acre-feet from Alto, 662 acre-feet from the Eagle Creek wells, and 496 acre-feet from the Rio Ruidoso. The historical and projected rate of growth diversion is

100 acre-feet per year.

The water quality meets the U.S. E.P.A. water quality standards, with quality changing depending on usage and source of supply. The implementation of Grindstone Water Treatment Plant will enhance the availability and quality of water.

The village recently adopted a water contingency plan for conservation. We prioritized Grindstone Water Treatment Plant as the No. 1 capital improvement project and are currently fast-tracking the project for completion in 1995. When completed this will enable the village to balance the water system through diversion and production.

Ruidoso has worked diligently, in spite of continuous objections, to develop rights and water for the future. In review of the Land Use Plan for the village, it appears that the diminution of land will dictate the rate of growth for Ruidoso.

Rebecca Dempsey, representing the State Engineer's Office, recently mailed notices containing show-cause orders to the village of Ruidoso and Eagle Creek Inter-Community Water Users Association. It appears that the show-cause order is in conflict of state statutes that provide for water right holders to simultaneously transfer all or any part of the right without losing priority of right,

therefore established. The majority of our rights are located upstream from previous points of diversion and contribute to the supply of the source.

The State Legislature has appropriated funds for the purchase and retirement of some 18,000 acre-feet of water rights. This, along with funds paid to Texas, has created a credit. This move by the State Engineer's Office has benefited the cities tremendously.

Water in the Southwest is a valued commodity. Speculation, innuendoes and criticism will not solve anything.

Major step for county envisioned on Nov. 10

TO THE EDITOR:

Alexander Hamilton wrote, "If the federal government should overpass the just bounds of its authority and make a tyrannical use of its powers, the people...must appeal to the standard they have formed, and take such measures to redress the injury done to the Constitution..."

Those words are just as applicable today as they were in 1787 when they were written. Today's federal government writes 90,000-plus pages of proposed regulations, most of which have no constitutional authority, i.e. Rangeland Reform '94; National Biological Survey, Endangered Species Act, wetlands designation under the Clean Water Act, the Brady bill, Crime bill, etc.

Article 1, Section 8, Clauses 1-18 of the U.S. Constitution lists all the powers that Congress was granted. Article 6, Section 2 state that "This

Constitution, and the laws of the United States which shall be made in pursuance thereof...shall be the Supreme law of the land..." Any legislation that Congress passes that was not empowered to it by Article 1.8.1-18 or made in pursuance to the Constitution is a usurpation of its power. Article 10 states "The power not delegated to the United States by the Constitution...are reserved to the States respectively, or to the people."

On Nov. 10 the people of Lincoln County have an opportunity to take "measures to redress the injury done to the Constitution." The Lincoln County commissioners will hold a public hearing to consider an ordinance which recognizes that the State of New Mexico owns all public lands within the State and that Lincoln County has the duty and jurisdiction to manage these lands; to protect private rights held on these lands; and preserve the lo-

cal customs, culture, economy, and environment of Lincoln County.

A Public Land Use Advisory Council (PLUAC) will be formed which will have a fact-finding mission to develop a public land management process and determine user fees, land uses, etc. subject to approval and oversight by the County Commission. This means that instead of having public land regulated and administered by a disaffected federal bureaucracy that is not held accountable for its actions, which cause tremendous socioeconomic impacts on western communities, we can now have public lands administered locally by our elected representatives who will be held accountable for their actions thereby resulting in socioeconomic stability in Lincoln County.

State ownership of the public lands would also mean that instead of \$250 million in public land use

fees leaving New Mexico for the federal black hole in Washington D.C., of which approximately \$48 million returns to N.M. as PILT payments, the user fees would remain in N.M. to be used for public land administration and improvements, highways, schools, etc. This could also result in a decrease in state income taxes. N.M. has a constitutional right to own the public land within its borders. N.M. also has a constitutional right to be on an equal footing with the original states and other eastern states who own the land within their borders. The people of Lincoln County have an opportunity to begin the process of reclaiming their constitutional rights on Nov. 10 by attending the public hearing and encouraging and supporting the county commissioners to approve this ordinance.

If you witnessed this accident or possibly have any information that might help this family get the truth, please contact the police department.



