Prison escape warning system proposed at Blanca

A computerized telephone alert system is being proposed by Warden Sandra McFadin for Camp Sierra Blanca minimum security prison, 18 miles northeast of Ruidoso.

The next step is to compile a list of names and telephone numbers of persons who want to be alerted when an escape occurs.

The demand for some type of early warning system came after six inmates escaped from the prison near Fort Stanton, and one was linked to the murder of an elderly Lincoln resident.

McFadin said she will present the proposal to her bosses at the State Department of Corrections after she has compiled a list of persons who want to receive the computer call.

"It will be a simple message saying an escape has occurred," she said. "It will not contain any particulars or descriptions. But in the past, when people have called here to ask questions, it has tied up our only telephone line."

"I will need a letter with the name and telephone number clearly printed and then signed. No explanation is necessary. We don't need their addresses, but that could be helpful. All they have to say is that they want to be notified."

Only telephone numbers that are local to Fort Stanton can be included on the computer list. That covers Capitan, Lincoln, Alto, Ruidoso (initially 258 prefixes may not be included) and Ruidoso Downs.

The deadline to submit the requests is Nov. 4.

"I need to know how many to determine the expense," McFadin said. "That doesn't mean it will happen overnight."

Controversy part of judge race

Prestige and a tidy \$47,060 annual paycheck translate to big stakes in the race for Ruidoso magistrate judge.

The two candidates running for the office both come from law enforcement backgrounds and have accumulated many hours of specialized training.

Incumbent William R. Butts, a Republican, retired from the New Mexico State Police after 24 years. Challenger Paul Wersich retired from the El Paso Police Department after 23 years, and also worked eight years on the Lincoln County Sheriff's Department. Wersich is a Republican who narrowly missed winning the office in his first attempt four years ago against former judge Jim Wheeler.

Each man also has experienced problems with the system.

Butts sued the State Police after the agency allegedly refused to compensate him for injuries to his legs incurred while trying to complete an arrest. Those injuries later led to his early retirement.

"I sued and they settled," he said.

Twelfth District Judge Richard A. Parsons issued an oral directive 1 1/2 years ago prohibiting Wersich from coming to his court except when subpoenaed as a witness.

Wersich contends the situation amounts to a personal conflict between the two men. But the judge says it goes deeper than that.

"It wasn't a spur of the moment thing," Parsons said. "I had granted a motion to suppress (some evidence) and (Wersich) used foul language toward the court. I could have held him in contempt. I considered it conduct unbecoming a police officer. I also was concerned

about repeated (allegations) of civil rights violations that have cost the county lots of money."

Wersich has been named as a defendant in four civil suits involving criminal cases.

"I don't think there's a police officer alive who's doing his job that hasn't been sued," Wersich said.

In two of the cases, Wersich said he was part of a team and his name

Lincoln voters in the Nov. 8 general election will select a Division 2 magistrate judge for the next four years. Magistrate judges are paid \$47,060 a year. Judge Gerald Dean in District 1 is unopposed for re-election. William R. Butts, a Democrat who was appointed by the governor to serve the unexpired term of former judge Jim Wheeler when he retired in District 2, faces challenger and Republican Paul Wersich, a deputy with the Sheriff's Department and former member of the White Mountain Drug Task Force.

As a freshman at South Plains Junior College, Butts was named to an all conference team, playing with Roger Stauback. In 1978, he received the Outstanding In-Service Student of Law Enforcement Award from the New Mexico Military Institute, with a 4.0 average in the criminal justice program. He is a member of Ruidoso Rotary, the Masonic Lodge and he is a former Elk. He is a member of the New Mexico Sheriff and Police Assn. and the Magistrate Judge Assn.

Wersich graduated from the law enforcement academies in Texas and New Mexico, accumulated more than 1500 hours of advance training and earned college credits at the University of Texas at El Paso and the University of Virginia. He is a past member of the Noon Lions, the El Paso Child Welfare Board, the Police and Fire Pension Board (which handles more than \$47 million) and was past president of the Fraternal Order of Police.

Ruidoso resident charged with heroin sale; assets, property seized

Two Ruidoso residents were arrested early Saturday on drug-related charges as part of an ongoing investigation.

Ruidoso Police Det. Pete Esquibel said his department was assisted in the narcotics operation by the U.S. Border Patrol and an

agent with the Otero County narcotics enforcement unit.

In the first two of what Esquibel said should be several arrests, Kimberly Stange, 28, and Jimmie Ragsdale, 37, were picked up by officers at their residence on Junction Road.

Esquibel said Ragsdale will be charged with possession of a controlled substance, heroin; possession of marijuana, under one ounce; and possession of drug paraphernalia. Stange will face charges of trafficking a controlled substance (heroin), and trafficking a controlled substance (heroin) by

possession with intent to distribute.

About one gram of heroin with a street value of \$600 was seized at the residence at 9:30 a.m. Saturday, said Esquibel. Officers and agents were able to locate and seize for forfeiture thousands of dollars in assets derived from the profits of the sale of heroin, Esquibel added.

Items believed to be stolen property also were confiscated by the officers.

Esquibel said Stange is a long-time resident of Ruidoso and was attending college classes. Ragsdale is unemployed.

Huge local building given to university

A Texas businessman's donation could have far-reaching impacts on Ruidoso's educational system.

Dale Walthall has donated a 40,000 square-foot commercial building in Ruidoso, the former True-Value Hardware building, to Eastern New Mexico University (ENMU). The building is located at the Sierra Mall off Mechem Road.

The university's board of regents has authorized university officials to undertake steps to accept the gift. The university will now start considering possible uses for the facility.

One possible use will be to house a new approach to education for rural New Mexico, the University Center. The center concept provides a model for a comprehensive set of educational programs, particularly for smaller, rural communities in New Mexico. The pilot project being considered for Ruidoso would build upon the success of ENMU's long tradition of distance education and

on the success of the ENMU-Ruidoso Off Campus Instructional Center, providing even more educational programs, including vocational courses, two year associate degree courses, master's degrees, licensure/certification and upper division programs.

This gift could be the cornerstone of the new University Center and would include a core staff for advising, financial aid, library services, high technology classrooms and other courses now offered in the Ruidoso Municipal Schools or other community buildings.

Representative John Underwood and James Paxton were instrumental in working with the University and Walthall in arranging the contribution of the building.

"This gift represents a unique opportunity to further Eastern New Mexico University's vision of higher education," said Everett Frost, President of ENMU. "By experimenting with this new model of a University Center, in service to the citizens of New Mexico in the 21st century."

Sacred Run stops here

Ruidoso has been chosen as a stop on the 1994 Good Medicine Sacred Run from Big Mountain, Arizona to Chiapas, Mexico.

The multi-cultural, international relay run started Friday to bring the message that "all life is sacred."

Sacred Run is comprised of Native American runners from the United States and Canada, along with participants from Japan, Australia and Europe. About 30 runners are taking part this year.

Each evening, a cultural presentation is staged by Native American dancers and singers, and other nationalities.

The presentation Tuesday in Ruidoso is open to the public.

The runners will arrive in Ruidoso from their performance on the Navajo Reservation at Alamo for an evening reception and potluck dinner, 5-7 p.m., at the Sacramento Environmental Center, 648 Sudderth Drive.

They will run through Carrizozo, down to Tularosa, then come up U.S. 70 and through the (Mescalero) reservation, said Rufina Marie Laws, who is coordinating the local end of the event. They should enter Ruidoso about 5 p.m. from the highway.

After the reception, about 7 p.m., Native American dancers, drummers and other performers dedicated to the run's theme will perform. Call the Sacramento center at (505) 257-3183 or the Ruidoso Upper Canyon Association (RUCCA) at (505) 378-4854 for the staging site.

Local runners are invited to participate in the running through Ruidoso and are asked to arrange a support vehicle with food and water

to assist them.

Founded in 1978 by Dennis Banks, co-founder of the American Indian Movement (AIM), Sacred Run has traveled more than 43,000 miles across the United States twice, Japan, through 13 countries in Europe, across Canada, from Alaska to New Mexico, and through Australia and New Zealand. It also sponsors annual 500-mile runs in the United States.

Laws, the local organizer, is a member of the Mescalero Apache Tribe, an educator, environmentalist and activist for civil and human rights, especially the rights of Native Americans.

Fugitive captured here

A fugitive wanted in two states on drug-related charges was arrested by Ruidoso police officers Tuesday.

Connie Sharon Caves, 45, wanted on warrants for trafficking of narcotics in Missouri and for violation of probation in Texas, was apprehended by Cpl. Bob Layher, officer Minerva Davalos and Det. Pete Esquibel.

According to Esquibel, Caves had been on the run since early May. She had been living at the Back Forty trailer park east of Ruidoso Downs for several months.

She is scheduled to appear before Twelfth Judicial District Judge Richard A. Parsons for extradition proceedings.

Esquibel declined to give details of how Caves was traced to the trailer park.

was included as a defendant, even though he had little or no direct interaction with the person who sued. On another, his advice as chief investigator not to pursue a case was ignored, he said. In the fourth suit, a defendant found guilty in a criminal trial sued and the insurance company decided it was less expensive to settle, he said.

Butts applied for the Division 2 magistrate judgeship in 1993 when his father-in-law, Jim Wheeler, decided to retire with 1 1/2 years left in his term.

Butts knew Gov. Bruce King from his years of providing security for the top official of the state.

King selected him "due to my criminal justice career, unquestionable integrity and my honesty," Butts said. In his years with the state, he said he was never disciplined and he attained the rank of captain and district commander.

Wersich advocates a night court.

"Working people are faced with a real problem. Eight to five, that's it folks," he said. Not only would Wersich pursue evening hours, he'd also like to move around the physical location of the court. One stop would be in the historic settlement of Lincoln, where Wersich would like to set up in the old courthouse for an occasional trial.

His accessibility by living in Ruidoso also would be an asset compared to Butts, who lives in Capitan, Wersich said.

Butts says night court probably wouldn't be permitted by the supervising court and would be expensive with extra hours for clerks.

"There isn't a magistrate judge anywhere in the state I know of who holds night court," he said.

Since Wheeler retired, the magistrate caseload has increased 35 percent, hitting 2,003 cases at the end of the fiscal year.

"Police officers are working harder," Butts said. "I feel the officers have faith in me as a judge."

"I am not a wishy washy judge, but I'm not a hanging judge," he said. "If the crime deserves a harsh penalty and lengthy jail time, that's what a person gets. When I put somebody on probation and they violate it, they are immediately incarcerated without bond. I do not tolerate repeat offenders."

Butts' areas of special interest are DWI and domestic violence cases.

"I would say that 90-95 percent of all DWIs in the 1 1/2 years I've

been judge have gone to jail whether it's two days or a year.

"But I don't put a person in jail and forget about them. I will immediately call the counseling center. If you don't get them treatment and try to help them solve their problem, when they get out of jail, they'll be right back in the system."

Butts was instrumental in organizing a committee to seek out grants for a DWI counselor and probation officer.

He sees domestic violence cases every week.

"Usually, I'll set a bond high enough to protect the victim until Judge Parsons can issue a restraining order in district court," he said.

Another concern is hunters who fire high powered rifles near the village, Butts said. He wants to change the law that now prohibits shooting from a public road or within 100 yards of a residence dur-

ing hunting season, to read within half a mile any time.

Wersich said instead of passing new laws, the ones already on the books need to be followed. He'd like to see a tougher attitude toward illegal dumping and would like to see the names of DWI offenders published.

"I hear from voters that they want tough enforcement and truth in sentencing," he said. "They don't want those charged with drug offenses to be let out (without bond) while waiting for trial."

It won't take long to feel at home in judge's robes, he said, adding, "I'm already familiar with the criminal justice system. I think my police background would be a plus. I've got hundreds of hours testifying. As a law enforcement officer, I like to look at both sides of the story, just as a judge would do. I feel I can make fair decisions."

New rules govern home building

New requirements for increased energy efficiency in new residential construction took effect in New Mexico Oct. 1.

New Mexico is now one of 15

states meeting specifications of the National Energy Act of 1992, which required that states meet national energy code requirements adopted that year.

"I am pleased that New Mexico is able to comply with the National Energy Act by implementing these updated requirements," said Governor Bruce King. "This action will enable New Mexico to play our part in promoting energy efficiency throughout our state and nation."

The new building code requires that a new home be energy efficient, with increased levels of insulation and energy efficient windows, furnaces and water heating appliances. The weather zone in which a home is constructed determines the minimum levels of insulation and the type of windows required.

The Construction Industries Commission formally adopted the 1992 Model Energy Code in their July 1994 meeting after extensive reviews by a technical advisory

group and public hearings held throughout the state. The New Mexico Home Builders Association served on the advisory committee and assisted in customizing the code to meet state requirements. Engineers with the Energy Conservation and Management Division provided technical assistance in adoption of the code.

The State of New Mexico is also in the process of adopting new requirements for increased energy efficiency in commercial buildings. The Construction Industries Commission is conducting technical reviews and will hold public hearings over the next ten months on adoption of the American Society of Heating, Refrigeration and Air Conditioning Engineers "Energy Code for Commercial Buildings."

Cloudcroft 'rail-trail' project a big winner

The New Mexico Rails-to-Trails Association received the Governor's Tourism award at the 1994 New Mexico Governor's Conference on Tourism held in Farmington in late September.

The category was "Destination Event," and the award was presented to Rails-to-Trails by The Lodge at Cloudcroft on Oct. 15 at the Lodge Pavilion.

The New Mexico Rails-to-Trails Association was formed last February and has already begun work on the first segment of the Cloud-Climbing Rail-Trail in Cloudcroft. The organization has created an ongoing partnership among government agencies, local business, and volunteers in surrounding communities.

The goal of the association over the next few years is to clear the entire rail grade of the Alamogordo and Sacramento Mountain Railroad as much as possible in order to create a trail that will extend from Alamogordo to Cloudcroft, a distance of 25 miles. The trail will be used by hikers, horseback riders, mountain bikers and cross country skiers, with some limited motorized use.

The long-term goal of the Association is to develop rail trails to and from other points in New Mexico and to connect these to other existing trails and create a unique, nationally recognized trail system.

It's time for annual flu shot

Each year millions of Americans are afflicted with influenza and pneumonia. Those most at risk are the very young, the very old, those suffering from chronic lung or heart disease and those with weakened immune systems.

The American Lung Association of New Mexico urges all who are considered high risk to get a flu shot. You are at high risk if you are over age 65, have chronic lung, heart, kidney disease, reside in a nursing home or other chronic care facility or if you have other chronic diseases.

In addition, health care workers should be immunized to reduce the chances of spreading this to high

risk people. This shot is recommended every year because the influenza virus strain changes annually. The ideal time to receive flu vaccine is between Oct. 15 and Nov. 15.

According to the Lung Association, both influenza and pneumonia are deadly. "Influenza is a highly contagious, potentially life-threatening lung disease," said Peg Matthews, president of the New Mexico association. "Since 1960, pneumonia has been the leading killer by infectious disease in the U.S. It is both the most common and most deadly complication arising from influenza," she explained.

Indian Summer Arrives in the High Country


This is being sent to you just after high noon, on a day of bright sunshine and October blue sky, and will reach you on Oct. 21.

For amateur and professional photographers, a benefit enjoyed

during the festival is having access to areas in the 57,000 acre refuge that are usually closed to the public. There are also 11 guided tours.

In addition to wildlife and conservation-related activities the festival will spotlight the Socorro area's environmental diversity, geology and history, with guided tours. Destinations will include the Kelly ghost town and Waldo mine, the Chihuahuan desert terrain of Quebradas, bird-rich Water Canyon, and Spanish and Native American ruins of El Camino Real.

Theme T-shirts for this year's festival will feature sandhill cranes in a marsh setting designed and rendered by artist Vivian Olsen. An alternate, humorous "pop" T-shirt design also will be available.





Warriors' first district win at Socorro

The Ruidoso Warrior football team got a quarterhorse start and finished like thoroughbreds Friday night as the team beat Socorro, 31-6 at W.D. Horton Stadium.

The win gives Ruidoso its first win in District 3-AAA play, with two games to go. It was Socorro's first loss in league play, but they must now face powerful Silver and Santa Teresa in the next two weeks.

Silver remained perfect with a win over Santa Teresa, while Cobre lost to Hot Springs in other district action.

The Warriors need two more wins, coupled with a Santa Teresa loss in the next two weeks, to seal their first trip to the playoffs since the 1989 season, when the Warriors were the district champions.

The Warriors played their most complete game of the season against Socorro, as the locals controlled the contest from the outset. Ruidoso held the ball almost 10 minutes of the first quarter.

The night looked like something good was going to happen for the locals as they won their first coin toss of the year. Remarkably, Ruidoso had gone 0-8 thus far before Friday's contest.

While the Warriors' first possession wasn't impressive (three plays and out), their second trip on offense was a 82-yard, 14-play monster that consumed seven minutes. The drive was kept alive with a 10-yard pass to Brandon Eamello on third down and a 35-yard strike to Byron Soules.

Kyle Humphreys got the touchdown on a one-yard run and Eamello added the extra point.

The Warriors and Socorro traded possessions at the beginning of the second quarter before the adrenaline-laden Warriors went back to work.

Beginning at their own 35, quarterback John Echols orchestrated another impressive drive with a beautiful mix of running and passing plays. Initially, things looked bleak as the Warriors were hit with two penalties on the first two plays.

Facing first and 20 from their own 22, Echols called for a screen pass to Rex Comanche. Socorro went for the bait like a pack of baracudas, and Echols' lob was perfect. Comanche gained 13 yards, leaving the Warriors with second and seven.

It was an exceptional effort for the Warriors, arguably the team's best performance since the 1990 season.

Echols fired the cannon again on the next play and found Soules for a 16-yard strike. Kyle Humphreys rambled for 28 yards on the next play over the right side of the line, and suddenly the Warriors were in striking distance again.

David LaMay and Humphreys combined for 15 yards before Comanche took the Warriors' second TD of the night in from the seven. Eamello's extra point made the score 14-0.

The game was essentially over for Socorro after the kickoff as the Warriors' Jose Prieto recovered a fumble on Socorro's five yardline. David LaMay went in for Ruidoso two plays later and the Warriors led 21-0 with the extra point.

The first half saw Ruidoso rip Socorro with both strategy and execution. It was an impressive sight.

After Socorro went three-up-and-three down on its first possession of the third quarter, the Warrior offense went to work again after a poor Socorro punt.

Operating from the Socorro 46, Humphreys got nine on first down and Jackie Roe got the first down with a four-yard possession the next play. Methodically, as in the first half, Head Coach Les Carter sent in plays that kept Socorro off balance and guessing.

Every play in the drive gained more than four yards and the Warriors got their fourth touchdown of the night as Roe nabbed an Echols dart from four yards out.

Eamello kept his perfect night perfect with the extra point.

It looked like Socorro might mount a rally as Fred Mata hit a 28-yard pass on first down, which got the ball into Warrior territory, but the stubborn Warrior defense ended the drive as sticky-fingered safety John Echols picked off Mata at the 38.

The Warriors returned the favor

just two plays later, fumbling at their own 20, giving Socorro their only touchdown six plays later.

The Warrior scoring in the fourth quarter ended with a Brandon Eamello 25-yard field goal, which capped a 14-play, 56-yard drive. Byron Soules got over half of the yardage of the possession on the first play with a 25-yard jaunt from an Echols pass.

It was an exceptional effort for the Warriors, arguably the team's best performance since the 1990 season.

A hard-hitting defense and masterful job of play calling kept Socorro, which had lost just once this season, on the ropes all night.

Ruidoso will make the long, cold trip to Bayard next week for a game with Cobre. The Indians' playoff hopes were dashed last week as they lost to Hot Springs after having a two-touchdown lead at the half.





No place for hard-timers at Camp Sierra Blanca

Problems surrounding Camp Sierra Blanca, the state's minimum-security prison in Lincoln County, seems to have dropped from public view recently...at least until last week.

Then a letter arrived from an inmate offering himself as a candidate for a newspaper job under the camp's work-release program. The letter was well-written, candid and persuasive — but not one we could answer promptly, considering the controversy surrounding the camp and its inmates over the last year.

Consider: A murder, six escapes, confrontations between camp administrators and county officials.


Camp Sierra Blanca, it seems to us, is a facility that should serve a good purpose, and unfenced final stop for non-violent prisoners — generally young — who have paid their debt for wrong deeds and are waiting to step back into society. A place for "trustys" who really could be trusted.

But something happened along that happy forest trail. People left. Violent things happened. An innocent man was killed, with a camp escapee the prime suspect. It appears that these non-violent, near-release prisoners weren't so peaceful. Work-release was becoming a gateway out...

County commissioners objected, and stated their objections to the governor. The governor's spokesman said he's working on it, but it's not surprising that nobody expects anything in the way of change at Camp Sierra Blanca until after the Nov. 8 general election. Prison problems are downright unexciting and embarrassing for a governor seeking reelection.

But we do suggest it wouldn't be awfully difficult for the governor to simply put out an order that prisoners with a hint of violence in their record not be sent to Camp Sierra Blanca.

Meanwhile, we're considering that work-release candidate's application.



Upon Reflection

Confusion reigns in minds of all the voters

"Do we know what we want?" What is going on here? We are stumbling toward the November election through the miasma of some of the strangest political atmospheres to engulf our political recent memory.

Nationally, President Clinton's popularity is so low that his fellow Democrats shun him as they would the kiss of death.

Yet, in key respects, he has delivered on much of what he promised. He pledged to revive the economy, and, by every measure, it is stronger today than at anytime in the past half decade.

He's taken a drubbing over his foreign policy. However, the center piece of that policy—stabilizing relations with Russia and shoring up the country's frail democracy—has been successful, something even his detractors reluctantly acknowledge.

Beyond that, little thanks to his political opponents and press critics, his Haitian policy has proved remarkably adroit. Without the loss of a single American life (at this

writing at least), the Haitian thugs have been driven into exile and their elected democratic president to Port-au-Prince.

When Iraqi strongman Sadaam Hussein marched thousands upon thousands of his best troops up to the border with Kuwait, the President stood firm and Hussein blinked...for the nonce at least.

Meanwhile, according to a recent *New York Times* poll, a huge majority of New York voters believe their governor, Mario Cuomo, "has strong leadership qualities" and "the honesty and integrity" they seek in their governors. Only 41% are presently prepared to reelect him, however.

Up in Massachusetts something equally odd is going on. almost 60% of the Bay State's residents tell pollsters they "have a favorable opinion" of U.S. Sen. Edward Kennedy. Nonetheless, the last remaining Kennedy brother is running neck-and-neck with a little known general election opponent.

Over in the Lone Star state, where crime is done, Gov. Ann Richards could fall next month to

former-President George Bush's son who has made crime one of his top issues.

Much the same is happening here in New Mexico.

From the outset, most polls — private as well as public — have shown Gov. Bruce King enjoys a solid reservoir of goodwill among New Mexico voters. If he wins reelection, however, it will now have to be counted as a come-from-behind-upset.

Even U.S. Sen. Jeff Bingaman who, according to reliable polling information, most New Mexicans regard to be "a man of honesty and integrity" is in the fight of his life against an opponent some surveys reveal to be "perceived as too political" and "too negative."

For pundits and politicians it is quite baffling, and the body politic's seeming conflicted state of mind has led most to conclude that to be a Democrat and an incumbent in 1994 is to be endangered.

And there is warrant for that conclusion. Certainly Republicans are busy counting eggs they believe will hatch into substantial gains in

next month's elections, here and elsewhere.

Still, this whole line of analysis leaves much to be explained.

If, for example, gridlock is as deeply detested by most Americans as virtually all polls would lead us to believe, why are we apparently poised to give control of the U.S. Senate to the GOP? After all for two years now Republican senators have used the filibuster more often than anytime in history for the express purpose of fostering gridlock? And they admit as much.

Democrats were destined to lose more than their share of elections this year. Whichever party controls the White House always does in non-presidential election years.

But there's more going on here than that.

And it just may be that awful lot of us, confused and riled, simply don't know what we want.

Feeling thus, it's out-with-the-rascals time. Even if some of them may not be rascals at all.

The improvements downtown don't mean anything if there is trash everywhere. We hope with an emphasis on Respect Ruidoso that we can reach more people.

My plan with Respect Ruidoso is that it would be a campaign for our

town that would invoke many to make a dramatic change. And perhaps we could be the first small town to start with ourselves.

We can't change the world but we can change where we live. Ruidoso isn't so large that we can't

The New Militant Center

In the spring of 1992, Ross Perot unleashed a flood of voter energy and frustration when he announced on "Larry King Live" that he would run for president if Americans got him on the ballot in all 50 states. Two million people called his 800 number urging him to run and offering assistance. By mid-June, polls showed 40 million people said they would vote for Ross Perot for president of the United States.

Though only 20 million people actually voted for Perot on election day, his supporters have joined with other like-minded centrists to form a new militant center that is electrifying American politics. The New Militant Center examines this significant political front and its impact on legislatures and elections around the country.

The New Militant Center chronicles the efforts of socially tolerant, fiscally conservative citizens in several states who are determined to overhaul a system they believe is badly in need of financial and moral change. Taped across the United

States, the one-hour program follows people inspired by Perot to become involved in politics and looks at what these activists are doing to change laws, unseat incumbents, and force budgetary and ethical reforms.

"In Montana, members of the new militant center have gathered enough signatures to put an initiative on the ballot that, if passed by voters in November, will dissolve the legislature's authority to tax citizens.

"In 11 of the other 23 states that allow citizens to amend the state constitution or pass statutes through the initiative process, efforts are under way requiring state governments to submit tax increases to a vote of the people.

"Incensed by their legislature's refusal two years ago to place a constitutional amendment imposing term limits before voters, residents of Massachusetts have gathered enough signatures to put to a vote this fall a law that denies eight-year legislative incumbents a place on the ballot.
