Main portion of luxury hotel moves forward

Lincoln County Commissioners will take another look at a law Tuesday that would form a public land use advisory council.

A group of ranchers opposing federal regulation and the recent direction of land management on federal lands has urged the commission to adopt the ordinance.

The ranchers contend the courts will rule that federally managed public lands in New Mexico belong to the state, and that the state government then will turn to counties to provide management. The land use advisory council, appointed by the county commission, would then advise the board on management decisions.

The meeting, the second public hearing on the ordinance, will begin at 9 a.m. in the commission room of the county courthouse in Carrizozo.

County Attorney Alan Morel worked on the ordinance with the local group, which consists mainly of ranchers.

"He's made sure it is written so that we don't find ourselves in the middle of a lawsuit," Nunley said.

"I sat down with members of the county's agriculture and rural affairs committee and we went through the ordinance word by word," Morel said. "I took out some language I couldn't support. I took out the word 'jurisdiction,' because I don't believe the county has jurisdiction. If the lawsuit prevails, the state will have jurisdiction, because it was the one not given equal footing. The state may pass it to the counties."

Morel was referring to the pas-

sage in the state constitution that says New Mexico will be admitted to the union on an equal footing with all of the other states. But unlike the original 13 states, New Mexico was forced to cede all unappropriated land to the federal government, opponents of federal management say. They want a court to decide whether those lands should revert back to the state. The same issue is being pursued in Arizona.

Added to the original draft of the county law is a section referring to fees and payments. It states that no users fees will be paid to the county, because they could result in the loss of lease or permits on federal lands.

"If someone paid the county, it

would jeopardize their lease (of federal land)," Morel said. "They could go to court just asking the question, who should I pay (the county or the federal government). We don't want somebody accidentally paying that to the county."

During the previous commissioner public hearing on the ordinance, another attorney said in order to get court action, a federal land permittee will have to ask a court which government level has jurisdiction.

County Manager Carol Cooney said the rewritten ordinance better defines the authority of the advisory board and leaves it up to the commission whether to approve a budget for its operation.

Federal land issue to county commissioners again

Working plans for the main part of a new 152-room resort hotel complex in Ruidoso could be submitted to the village building department before the state legislature finishes writing gambling regulations, the hotel architect said Monday.

Hotel officials are still unsure whether they'll construct the separate amenities building.

The main hotel plans may hit the village table right after the first of the year, said project architect Gary Lamb of Lamb Architects and Associates Inc. in Phoenix, Ariz. The basic hotel and restaurant are moving ahead without delays, he said. Dirt could start moving by

April, depending on the weather, and a one-year construction period is anticipated, he said.

The future of the separate amenities building hinges on whether gambling is approved by the legislature for Ruidoso and for hotels the size of The Resort at Sierra Blanca. That building, connected to the main hotel, is planned to house a health club, a pro shop, a day spa area and gambling casino.

If the total plans remains as approved by village officials, developers won't have to go back to the planning and zoning board. However, if the size or configuration is changed significantly in response to legislative rules, the project will have to be resubmitted for review.

Ski area opens despite weather

Cold front moves in to help snowmaking efforts

More than 3,000 skiers took to the slopes during Ski Apache's opening weekend over the Thanksgiving holiday.

Ski Apache general manager Roy Parker said total numbers for the weekend were about half of last year's total. The ski area also had twice as many trails open a year ago.

Some uncooperative weather leading up to opening weekend hampered snowmaking efforts.

"We've just been fighting these temperatures," Parker said about last week's weather conditions.

Wind and warmer temperatures prevented snowmaking crews from making snow around the clock last week. But improved conditions and colder temperatures Sunday night have allowed the crews to pick up the slack. The snowmaking crews can make snow on 45 acres.

Parker said the cold temperatures need to continue.

"It would be nice to get help from above, but we're doing all right," he said.

Ski conditions have improved. "They're the best now that they've been since we've opened," Parker said. "Today it's sunny, not windy. The surface is great."

Ski Apache reported varying

base of 15 to 20 inches Monday morning. The middle portions of the mountain are covered with patchy snow.

"The upper trails are covered real well, but we've got a problem with in-between," Parker said. "We're working on it."

Ski Apache continues to attract skiers from its traditional base.

The ski area is open daily at 8:30 a.m. Lift tickets are \$25 until more trails and lifts open. For ski conditions, call the ski report line at 257-4001, or call Ski Apache at 336-4356.

Adult literacy

In another matter, Gloria Pafford is on the agenda seeking support from the commission to continue an adult literacy program.

Cooney said Pafford received a grant to fight local illiteracy last year, but not this year. Commissioner Wilton Howell wants to see if the commission can keep the program going in combination with money from the Lions Club, she said.

Howell also has placed a discussion item on the agenda dealing with the impact of Amendment 8 on the county.

The amendment to the state constitution allows a lottery and video

"(Howell) really wants commissioners to get focused on what is going to do to our area," Cooney said. "He wants me to talk to people who have gotten gambling so we'll know what to ask for when we go to Santa Fe." The legislature will convene early next year in Santa Fe, and sometime during its session it must write gambling regulations and decide where gambling will be allowed."

leading up to voter passage Nov. 8 of Amendment 8 to the state constitution, allowing a state lottery and video gaming.

The amendment has been challenged in court by opponents, who contend voters didn't realize what the amendment really meant, because it referred to two separate issues.

If more than 150 rooms are required by the state, the decision on whether to change some part of the design to meet that requirement will be up to corporate heads, Sherry said.

"But 150 is right for this community and for most resorts," he said. "You only find the 400-room type hotels in major cities."

Christmas trees ready for cutting in forest

Haul out the shovels and bundle up. It's time to trek into the forest to dig up the family Christmas tree.

But before heading into the woods, state and federal forest officials want to remind enthusiastic holiday helpers that a few regulations must be followed. The rules apply for commercial vendors and private individuals.

In the Lincoln National Forest around Ruidoso, permits to cut Christmas trees can be picked up at the Smokey Bear District office on Mechem Drive, said forester Dave Cummings.

Permits cost \$5, or \$10 by mail. People can cut trees this Thursday, Nov. 24 through Dec. 24.

Maps are available designating areas where cutting is permitted.

"People should always carry their paperwork with them in case they are stopped and they should attach the tree tag as soon as it is cut so can be transported," he said. Trees can be up to 10 feet in height.

That doesn't mean they can cut off the top 10 feet of a 20-foot tree, Cummings said. Trees should be cut close to their base.

Mostly piñon pine and juniper are for sale, and the limit is one tree per family.

The permits are handled the same for individuals who want to dig up and transplant a living tree for personal use only, he said.

Bill Duemling, forester for the State Forestry and Resources Conservation Division, said other rules

apply for trees cut on private or state lands.

"Every cut Christmas tree offered for sale in New Mexico this year must have a goldenrod-colored tag attached to it," Duemling said. "This includes cut trees that are shipped in from out of state, commercial growers, trees cut by commercial permits on federal lands, and those sold by private woodland owners."

The tags are issued by the state forestry division. They can be purchased by Christmas tree vendors for 10 cents per tree.

"There is a good reason for all of the regulations," Duemling said. "Theft of woody materials is a big problem on both public and private lands throughout the West. Keeping track of honest, responsible users of natural resources makes it easier to catch and prosecute those who cheat the system, and protects private landowners."

Living Christmas trees do not need a state forestry tag. However, balled and burlap, potted and other containerized stock are regulated by the New Mexico Department of Agriculture, which monitors transplanted material to prevent the spread of contagious insect and disease pests.

Airport board postpones special airport zoning rules

Board members for the Sierra Blanca Regional Airport postponed any decision about planning and zoning at their Nov. 23 meeting.

The board will wait until a new airport manager is hired before going ahead with plans to develop a set of design and planning and zoning regulations separate from those of the village.

Applications for the airport manager position will be accepted until Nov. 30. A job review board will rate the applications prior to sending them to the airport board.

Assistant Village Manager Alan Briley said that Under present guidelines for the airport, anyone who wants to build a hanger must conform with village regulations for buildings. Those regulations in-

clude such items as landscaping, fences, retaining walls, parking, noise abatement restrictions and setback and height encroachments.

"Most of the regulations simply don't apply to the airport situation," said Briley. "The airport board needs to develop their own set of standards."

"We decided we should wait until a new airport manager was hired before making these kind of decisions," said board member Ralph Gary. "We felt it would be better to first get input from an expert so we tabled it for now."

Sierra Blanca Regional Airport board members are Roy Parker, David Noltensmeyer, Ralph Gary, Ted Conley, Tim Morris, James Paxton and Russell Dorsey.

Zim's Cafe features a colorful menu including soups, pasta, salads and sandwiches with Middle Eastern, Southwestern and American flavor.



New style, transfers should improve RHS cager hopes

Like the food at some local restaurants, Ruidoso boys basketball will have a Texas flavor this year.

First-year Warriors coach Sid Wright brings his pressure defense and high octane offense to what has been an anemic basketball program for the last several years. Ruidoso was 6-17 last year.

Wright returns to the coaching ranks after a 10-year hiatus. He coached high school basketball in Texas for eight years. His last year

of coaching was as a graduate assistant at Texas Tech University. Disenchanted with the atmosphere of college coaching, Wright left the profession and became an asset manager.

When the opportunity to return to prep coaching presented itself, Wright took the offer. "The door just opened up," Wright said of the chance to coach Ruidoso.

Wright takes over from Paul Kirkwood, who left to coach at Artesia High School. His basketball philosophy is rooted in the style of play he saw while in college at

North Texas State University.

The Warriors play high pressure defense and push the ball up the court whenever they have the opportunity.

"We would press them (an opponent) coming out of the dressing room if we could," Wright said. "We double team any chance we get. We run on any chance we get."

The first-year coach said he will platoon a number of players during the game. "I try to get units that work together," he said.

Ruidoso has 64 players battling for spots on the varsity, junior varsity and freshmen teams. Wright and assistant coach Ben Sanchez have good numbers to choose from.

"The toughest part of our job will be having to cut some kids," Wright said.

Sanchez comes to Ruidoso from Menaul High School where he was the head coach. It just so happens that three new Warriors also come from Menaul. They are Ryan Trout, Joshua Hodges and the highly-regarded college prospect Malik Waters.

In addition to those three, Ruidoso has a number of returning players with talent. Senior Cory Hood is back. He is joined by Paxton Wright, Gabe Aguilar and Rex Commanche in the back court. In the post, seniors Todd Young and Scott Christianson anchor the Warriors.


Senior Aaron Byers and juniors Zach Turner and Jackie Roe figure in Wright's plans as well.

"The thing that excites us is that we're defensive-minded even though it seems like we're offensive-minded because we run out of everything we do," Wright said.

"Something I told the boys when I first came here was, one of the things we're going to do is carry the good Lord with us all season long."

He may not shoot any 3-pointers, but he might tip one in for us," Wright said.

"We're going to bring basketball here to Ruidoso. These kids have gotten kicked pretty hard over the last few years," he said. And, in a preseason meeting of coaches, district opponents picked Ruidoso to finish fourth or fifth.

If the Warriors' performance in its preseason scrimmages are any indication, that trend is about to end.

Straight Talk from the Roundhouse

A majority of our citizens voted "yes" on gambling.

By that vote, they signified their desire for the state to go into the gambling business by instructing and operating a lottery. They also told the state to license and regulate the use of certain specific types of gambling equipment (not the old-fashioned slot machines, or roulette tables, or blackjack or craps; just electronic gaming machines.

Now the state has to figure out what to do next.

There are those who say it shouldn't do anything. These are those anti-gambling citizens who have filed a suit asking that New Mexico be enjoined from proceeding with what the voters say they favored, on the grounds that the act was contrary to our constitution.

This is the language in the constitution on which they base their case: "If two or more amendments are proposed, they shall be so proposed as to enable the voters to vote on each of them separately." That's in Article XIX of the state's basic document.

Those who argue against this move to quash the expression of the people's will on election day will say this was not two amendments; it was, they will claim, simply two ideas, two concepts, packed into a single amendment, and the constitution doesn't say that is forbidden.

Proponents, of course, will claim we should have had one choice to vote on a lottery and one to vote on gaming machines, since these represent two separate decisions on our part.

Until the courts rule on which of those two views shall prevail, we aren't allowed to do anything substantial toward bringing about what the citizens say they want. You may ask, "Can the courts do that, after the voters have spoken?" Sure. That's one of the things courts do.

But even if the courts rule we may do what the voters said they want done, there are still a lot of steps to be taken.

The amendment merely instructed the legislature on what it should do. It said nothing about how that was to be accomplished.

If we have a lottery, should it be a simple, not very dramatic one, or should it be one with lots of pizzazz and bells and whistles? Where will we buy tickets to it — only in specified locations, or in every drug

and grocery store? Where will the electronic games operate — everywhere the state licenses bingo; in every bar, grill and restaurant; or only in country clubs, where the rich can enjoy them? How about fines for those who defy the rules the legislature sets? And who's in charge of enforcing all this, and where is the money for that to come from?

Don't forget, this is a more than ordinarily controversial subject. No matter what the voters said, many who believe gambling is immoral will still try to prevent any of that sort of thing from coming into being. They will be on the fringes of the legislature, making an effort to make all this as difficult as they can.

That's why some lawmakers say all this will have to be handled in a special session.

On state control of federal lands

To The Editor:

Since we've had one hearing on the proposed land use ordinance in Lincoln County, which certainly was well attended Nov. 10, thought you might like to publish the letter from John Howard, lawyer for Individual Rights Foundation. John spoke at our public hearing in Carrizozo. Otero County, of course, has already passed the ordinance.

Lee and Dolly Onsrud Carrizozo
(Following is a speech by John Wayne Howard, attorney for the Individual Rights Foundation based in Los Angeles. The speech was given to the Otero County Cattleman's Association meeting held Aug. 27 in Weed.)

"I didn't know I was going to be speaking tonight so I got a speech as we were having dinner. I just want to tell you I'm really honored that you asked me here. As many of you know I live in the People's Republic of California and so it's real refreshing to get to this part of New Mexico, where there are a lot of things that seem to have been forgotten in California and New York and a lot of other places.

"I came here looking for Oliver Lee but what I found was America. It was an America that somehow we tend to forget existed on the West Coast. I want to tell you how grateful I am and how much I feel I owe you, all of you, because what you've done for me is you've restored my faith in the American people. You've shown me that there are people who are willing still to fight for themselves, for their families, for their communities, for their rights, the same way that our founding fathers fought, the same way that generations of Americans have fought.

"I admire your courage because it takes a lot of courage to do what you've done. While we're talking about courage...the county commissioners deserve another big round of applause because what they've done has been a real gutsy thing. It's gutsy for a lot of reasons but part of the proof is, there are an awful lot of people who have this alternative but haven't taken it - who also have that step to take and are still spending a lot of time debating it. Your county commissioners took the bull by the horns, looked at the problem, debated it, and said, 'Look, the time has come to do what is right for our people, for our constituents, for our country.'

"Make no mistake. This is a huge step because if we are victorious it's really going to mean nothing less than a complete change in the relationship between the states and the federal government, between federal power and state power.

"There's an awful lot more to do, however. We have to meet with a number of more counties. We're going to be meeting with counties in New Mexico and Nevada over the next several weeks and I think we're going to get them on board. We're also beginning to make inroads in Wyoming and Montana. We're trying to get an entire group of people together and also starting to talk to officials in various states, hoping that we get their states involved.

"There's a lot more to do. There's also a large educational process. I've got to tell you something. I grew up in cities and suburbs and until I started coming out here I didn't understand what this was all about. There is a fundamental misunderstanding on the part of most people in cities about what this way of life is all about, and how it works.

Sometimes there is a difference

in the relationships of the land between the people who think in terms of sections and people who think in terms of square feet. You want to buy land in Los Angeles, you buy it by the foot. That's about \$200 a foot and I understand there are some places you can actually get four acres for \$200 in New Mexico. It is completely incomprehensible and what I have been saying to a lot of people is, 'You understand what a section is? Do you know how much land that is?' They say, 'I don't know what a section is. I've never heard the term.' We're looking at a high rise and you say, 'What is a section? Show me what you think 640 acres is.' Usually what they show you is something about 10 acres. They don't understand but they also in a larger sense, don't understand your way of life.

"So that's one of the big obstacles we have to overcome — educating people who are a little too influential in the legislatures in the land. It becomes very clear to me when I became aware, for example, that New Mexico has three congressmen. For years I lived in San Diego. We have five congressmen in San Diego County so cities have huge concentrations of power. As a result you can't beat that power. You have to educate that power. You have to get people to understand.

"So one of the things we are doing at the Individual Rights Foundation is sponsoring a conference in January just before the legislative business session on this issue. We're bringing in people from all over the country, intellectuals, the people from universities, people from Think Tanks — all of whom agreed to help sell the idea that there is a way of life that needs preserving. We also want to sell the idea that the land which is found here doesn't belong to the federal government and shouldn't belong to

the federal government. It belongs to you.

Before that happens, in December we'll be filing suit in federal district court, in Albuquerque representing summary action in what's called an "Interpleader Action." Our client will be going to court saying, 'Judge, I owe grazing fees to somebody and I don't know who. My county is telling me I owe it to them, but the feds are telling me I owe it to them and I don't want to not pay. I'm perfectly willing to pay but I want to pay the right person so I'm going to give it to you and let you decide.' Then we at the Individual Rights Foundation will be stepping in to represent Otero County against the federal government to prove, in fact, the land here belongs to the state and not to the federal government.

"We are in this. The Individual Rights Foundation is a non-profit public-interest law firm located in Los Angeles and we have attorneys in about 28 cities across the country and another 24 or so are in formation. We have over 200 affiliate lawyers who do work for us for free. We will be representing Otero County for free and any other county that wants to jump in and any other state that wants to jump in. We are determined to bring this issue to a head and to get it resolved once and for all.

"For us, it's a matter of principle. For you, it's a matter of way of life. I believe that it is no less than a question of freedom or slavery. It's as important a question as that.

"For us, the magnitude of the effort needed to enter the fray of this problem so we are in it for the duration. With your help and God willing, we'll bring it back. We will be victorious because when Americans combine together for the cause of freedom, they never lose. This time we will emerge victorious.






Will Rogers: An American Masters Special

H.L. Mencken called him "the most dangerous writer alive." Damon Runyon dubbed him "America's most complete document." And Franklin D. Roosevelt credited him with bringing his fellow Americans "back to a sense of proportion." It seems everyone had an opinion about Will Rogers in his various roles: ranch hand, vaudeville performer, film star, columnist and author, radio personality, aviation pioneer, tireless master of ceremonies, friend to presidents, and unofficial ambassador of good will under three administrations.

During his lifetime, Will Rogers was the single most popular man in America. Since then, generations have known him only as an abstracted icon, the lanky, homely fellow who twirled a larlet and said, "I never met a man I didn't like." Will Rogers: An American Masters Special revives the legend that is Will Rogers and explores how he invented and reinvented himself, just as America was reinventing herself.

How First Flake Fest formulated

In 1992, I approached Patricia Morrison, marketing director at Ski Apache, to have a "Meet the Mountain" day at Ski Apache. The concept was to have local business owners set aside a weekday to have lunch at Ski Apache, ride the Gondola or ski.

During lunch, a Ski Apache representative would give an informative speech. For example, he or she could talk about what business owners and staff could say when asked, "How's the snow?" I had been at *The Ruidoso News* three years by then and during sales calls to businesses a frequent response that I had witnessed was, "I can't see any snow from here so it must be awful."

Skiing, being our major winter tourist attraction, would never benefit from this type of response.

After visiting with Patricia and Roy Parker, we set a date for the following year. When approached in 1993, the new day lodge was under construction and Meet the Mountain was postponed until 1994.

In August 1994, we set up a meeting at the Texas Club. During the time span of dinner, the Meet the Mountain concept went from a one-day event to a three-day festival. Patricia Morrison stressed her concern that the event didn't need to just benefit the ski area, but the whole town.

Through three months of hard work and planning, we have scheduled three days of fun family events.

Alongside Meet the Mountain, events include:

— Christmas in the Park: we can't take credit for this. The Village of Ruidoso Parks and Recreation department does a wonderful job on its tree lighting ceremony. Debbie Jo Almager was gracious to allow us to incorporate this.

— Downtown Events: Includes Santa, winter theme costume contest, Christmas caroling and late shopping hours. In the Thursday, Dec. 1 paper, *The Ruidoso News* will publish a map of the downtown area, to let readers know where to park and where the events will take place. Also, notice the snowflakes in the windows downtown. They were contributed to the festival by Nob Hill kindergarten classes and Sierra Vista Primary's first and second graders.

— The Apache Snowflake Ball: Patricia Morrison and Jo Kazhe put together an incredible night out at The Inn of the Mountain Gods.

I haven't yet mentioned the Ski Apache Handicapped Skiers Association. Proceeds from the festival will go to benefit them.

Together, they are capable of answering most any question about Ski Apache.


Business people will also get information about recent improvements to

Children can mingle with Santa's elves, who will help decorate their special ornaments in the shapes of bells, balls, reindeer and other holiday symbols.


Sleigh rides will run from 7 p.m. to 8 p.m., taking off from Santa's workshop. Visitors will be asked to





"Dressing for the slopes is in," added Patricia Morrison, Ski Apache's public information officer and ball coordinator. She cited beige and ecru as other hot colors.


As for the preferred style at the ball, there won't be any. In keeping with the laid-back attitude of Ruidoso, ballgoers are welcome to wear whatever they choose.

Physically, mentally disabled love to ski, too

Hillary McKenna is a dark-haired pixie who loves to ski. Every Thursday this 12-year-old and her special education classmates

from Capitan Elementary School enjoy a day of fun with the Ski Apache Handicapped Skiers Association (SAHSA). But for this little girl, skiing has be-

come more than just fun. Skiing with SAHSA dramatically improved Hillary's young life, strengthening her physically and mentally.

16 of the 18 ski area charges, who were competing took home a gold medal, said program director Lisa Maue.

"It's one activity they can do as well — and sometimes better — than their friends," Maue observes.

While some readers may gasp in fear at the thought of trying to ski with a physical or mental disadvantage, many of the children, especially the developmentally disabled, have no fear of the slopes.

Most of us ski with two legs, two arms, sight and hearing. As we struggle to remain upright, we can't imagine how someone who is blind, deaf or lacks limbs can ski. Yet many do because of SAHSA's talents.

"We use guides and adaptive equipment," explains Lisa Maue, executive director of SAHSA. Maue heads a staff of seven full and part-time instructors augmented by 100 volunteers. They teach one-to-one. This association leads to student progress, teacher satisfaction and mutual respect, Maue says.

Although SAHSA provides instruction, it is not traditional ski school, Maue stresses.

"Our instructors and volunteers are specially trained to work with the disabled and their equipment," Maue says.

Hillary is but one of the thousands of mentally or physically challenged individuals of all ages who've benefited from SAHSA's eight years of existence. All have achieved either physical or emotional growth through ski therapy.

Proceeds from the First Flake Fest will go towards this special program. Last year alone, 68 children from Ruidoso, Capitan, Roswell and the New Mexico School for the Visually Handicapped in Alamogordo took advantage of the program.

The program needs 50 volunteer adults to help. Skiers with experience in handicapped assistance are not required; the ski area offers free training adults to have the desire to help the program.

Adults are trained the first and third weekends in January, and the children start skiing the fourth week of the month.

A testament to the success of the Ski Apache program comes from the results of the state Special Olympics: last year,

And what equipment. Maue enthusiastically gestures to SAHSA's specialized gear mounted on the wall of their headquarters at Ski Apache. There are braces that mount on ski tips to keep them from crossing or splaying. Those with strength and motion in the lower body use a walker mounted on skis. Then there are outriggers, short forearm crutches with small skis attached on the bottom, used for balance by those who ski on one ski.

And those with little or no strength or motion in the lower body find freedom in either the mono-ski, bi-ski or sit-ski, all different but essentially similar devices for sitting while skiing.

Who uses this innovative hardware? "The blind, deaf, amputee, developmentally disabled, those with cerebral palsy, multiple sclerosis, brain or spine injuries...the list is endless," Maue answers. "We work with people's abilities, with what they can do, not what they can't."

Although the disabled skier's technique may differ from that of some skiers, the never-stop grins, whoops of laughter and apres-ski camaraderie remain exactly the same.
