Rep. Williams makes rounds before state legislative session

Newly elected State Rep. Dub Williams will be busy this week finding out what elected boards in Lincoln County want from the state legislature next year. The Ruidoso Republican is scheduled to meet at 6:30 p.m. today with the Capitan School Board and will touch base with Lincoln County Commissioners during their meeting Tuesday in Carrizozo.

Williams already has met privately with Ruidoso Mayor Jerry Shaw and Village Manager Gary Jackson, and privately with some Ruidoso school board members.

Before the legislative session starts Jan. 17, Williams is expected to complete his rounds, visiting the other villages, school districts and groups seeking help with projects.

The county commission meeting will begin at 9 a.m. in the county courthouse. Williams is the fifth item on a 24-item agenda.

Other agenda items include:
 — Valerie Miller, administrator of the Lincoln County Medical Center, will give a report on the center's operation.

— A mutual aid assistance agreement between the village of Ruidoso Downs and the Gileco-Palo Verde Fire Department is scheduled to be discussed.

— Commissioner L. Ray Nunley will talk about needs of the Ruidoso Downs Senior Citizens Center.
 — At 10 a.m., a public hearing will be conducted on a proposed ordinance dealing with collective

bargaining, tied to a request from employees in the sheriff's department for union representation.

— A committee is scheduled to be appointed to research the impact of Amendment 8 on the county and to draft recommendations. The amendment legalizes a state lottery and video gambling. The legislature is charged with writing the regulations and deciding where gambling will be allowed. As a resort community, the village of Ruidoso has been mentioned as a probable site.

— Other appointments to be made include two members to the Southeastern New Mexico Economic Board, one to the Carrizozo Health Center Advisory Board, two to the Extraterritorial Zoning Authority, three to the Extraterritorial Zoning Commission, two to the property tax protest board, one to the Regional Waste Water Joint Use Board and one to the Water Defense Association.

— County Planning Technician Patsy Sanchez also has submitted for commission review some initial suggestions for a zoning ordinance.

The county currently operates only with subdivision regulations. The last attempt to pass a zoning ordinance failed about three years ago. But this time around, the county faces both the impact from gambling and from the Mescalero Apaches' plan to bring nuclear spent fuel rods to their reservation abutting Ruidoso.

Airlines show local interest

Wheels of commercial aircraft may be touching down at Sierra Blanca Regional Airport next summer.

The airport near Ruidoso opened in December of 1987 and has yet to receive continuous air service from major carriers.

Frontier Airlines, American Eagle Airlines, Mesa Airlines, Arizona Airlines and Continental Express have indicated interest in providing air service to the airport, said Frank Potter, project coordinator for Hubbard Enterprises and former Ruidoso Municipal Airport manager from 1967-71.

"The proposed acquisition of air service to Ruidoso is part of the overall development of Ruidoso as a destination resort," Potter said. Hubbard Enterprises owns a golf course, horse racetrack and museum in the Ruidoso area, and the company is planning to build a luxury hotel here. Potter is actively recruiting airlines that could make it easier for tourists to get here.

Potter has submitted presentations for commercial air service to the five airline companies.

Potter hasn't asked Ruidoso officials to subsidize the air service. He does use a statistical analysis prepared by the village staff when he pleads his case before the airlines. The analysis indicates justification of air service to Ruidoso with economic indicators, airport information and an overview of area climate and attractions.

"With the recent passage of Constitutional Amendment # 8 providing for lottery and video gaming, development of a new resort hotel at the Links at Sierra Blanca, the new convention center, Ski Apache, the racetrack and the increase of

tourism, Ruidoso simply must have air service," Potter said.

Current statistics show 69% of visitors who use air travel to arrive in Ruidoso land at the El Paso Airport and 27% land in Albuquerque, then drive the rest of the two to three-hour distance. The study also shows that many southern New Mexico air passengers drive to El Paso or Albuquerque to originate their trips.

Some Ruidoso visitors fly into Alamogordo or Roswell on Mesa Airlines, but the routes are limited, Potter said.

Mesa Airlines provided service to the Sierra Blanca Regional Airport for a short time during the summer of 1990, but ceased operations after three months because they were only running at 24 percent.

Peacock Air of Albuquerque proposed service with local subsidies to the airport in October of 1993, but Potter said the proposal was rejected because of high costs.

"We are working to make sure the fares are affordable," said Potter. "We want an airline with stability, in for the long haul. We want it to be good for the airline and good for Ruidoso."

Ruidoso Deputy Manager Alan Briley said the village would be pleased to see air service for the area.

"We hope we can get an airline to come in," he said, "but we want to stay away from the idea of subsidies."

Potter said that the airlines he has been talking with all provide service on commuter airplanes, ranging in size from 19 to 72 passengers.

Service could start as early as summer 1995 if details can be finalized, said Potter.

Apaches close in on final nuke agreement

Mescalero Apache tribe officials and 33 nuclear power companies met last week in Florida to finetune an agreement for storage of spent nuclear fuel rods.

In previous statements, Mescalero spokesmen have said negotiations were down to the last details and an agreement could be signed at any time.

Mescalero President Wendell Chino said Monday morning he had no comment on the agreement or the Florida meeting.

"This is not a public thing," he said from his home in Mescalero.

Although Southern Nuclear Operating Corp. of St. Petersburg, Fla. is listed by opposition groups as one of the possible sources of spent fuel rods for Mescalero, the choice of meeting place was related to weather conditions, said Miller Hudson, tribal consultant on the nuclear storage project.

The lead entity in the partnership of utilities has been Northern States Utilities in Minnesota.

About four years ago, the Mescalero Tribal Council applied for a grant from the federal nuclear negotiator to study the possibility of siting a monitored retrievable

storage unit on the reservation that abuts Ruidoso.

The federal government was trying to meet a commitment to establish a central storage site for the spent fuel rods by 1998. The Nuclear Waste Policy Act of 1982 required owners and generators of spent nuclear fuel and high level radioactive waste to pay fees into the Nuclear Waste Fund to finance the recovery program. However, a permanent repository planned for Yucca Mountain, Nevada is significantly behind schedule and the federal nuclear negotiator was trying to establish temporary storage sites on a voluntary basis.

After the Mescaleros worked their way through several stages and received more than \$300,000 in federal money, the U.S. Congress cut off study money.

Chino and the council then turned their attention to the private sector for money to pursue a federal permit for a storage facility.

The Mescaleros announced plans to bring the fuel rods to the reservation by rail. The favored site sits near the bottom of the west side of Sacramento Mountains. It faces the

storage, told state legislators in late September that the government must approve a transportation cash design before the material could be moved across states to New Mexico.

Recollections of past Christmas traditions

December First Brings a Joyful Spirit Into the Mountain Land

This is being sent to you an hour after high noon of the first day of December, the Sacred Month.

The vale is warm and sunny under a sky of deepest pure blue, clearly outlining the evergreens bringing the hilltops in every direction along the mountain horizon.

Robins have moved in from the north, joining the pinon jays, scrub jays, stellar jays, snow birds and house finches in celebrating this special day. And Mother Earth is rejoicing throughout our mountain land.

The Christmas Season In New Mexico

Here in New Mexico the customs of the early Spanish pioneers have left us a colorful legacy, which makes Christmas in our state something all our own.

"Lighters of the Way" or Luminarios

One of these features of the Christmas Season are the "luminarios" or "Lighters of the Way."

These would take several forms, including fires on tops of hills, pine torches along the pathway to the church and all around the church, or lanterns placed along the roads and trails leading to the church.

In the early days a large fire was built on the top of the high hill just north of the village of San Patricio, bringing the news to travelers that midnight mass would be held at the church of San Patricio.

Folks would take turns tending the fire until a little after midnight.

Sticks of pitch pine would be sharpened and driven into the ground along the pathway to the church. Here some lanterns would be used for this purpose in later years.

Modern "Luminarios"

A luminario has been handed down to us that is very popular in Mexico today.

This is made by filling a paper grocery sack half full of sand and placing a candle inside. Shining through the brown paper of the sack, the candle flame sends out a golden light into the darkness of night.

These are placed along the walk-ways of homes, places of business and churches. Sometimes they are seen brightly shining through the night along the edges of roofs, or in windows.

The colored electric lights on Christmas trees, outside on buildings and decorating streets — these are the modern "luminarios."

The "Nacimiento" or "Nativity Scene"

One other early Spanish feature of Christmas celebration is the Nacimiento, or Nativity Scene, depicting the Christ Child, the Virgin Mary and Joseph and the stable animals.

Sometimes they take the form of live figures, under a shelter with torches or small fires nearby for light.

Along with the human figures the animals of the stable were featured — burro, cow, sheep and rooster.

At other times a cave was cut out of a clay bank, and inside were placed the figures carved out of wood, or made of clay.

Oftentimes you would see the sacred assemblage in a small cave on the side of a cliff, lighted by a candle.

Later on we will have a little more on early New Mexico Christmas customs handed down to us today.

Meanwhile let us rejoice and thank the Lord for the beginning of December, the Sacred Month.

Gun death ruled suicide

The death of an 81-year-old Ruidoso man, whose body was found in the field a few yards off Cedar Creek Drive, has been ruled a suicide by the assistant state medical investigator.

Lincoln County Sheriff James McSwane said the body of Forrest Currell, 81, was found about noon, on Nov. 28 across from the U.S. Forest Service exercise track by Ruidoso. He had been shot once in

the roof of his mouth. A 32-caliber pistol was found at the scene.

Currell had been dead 1-12 hours before his body was discovered by a passerby, the sheriff said. He had not been reported missing. His wallet and other personal effects were found in his clothing.

"There was no evidence of foul play," McSwane said.

Sanchez, who recently attended a zoning ordinance seminar, suggested that zones be established for potential environmental hazards and other unique situations.

She also proposed a zone for mining activity, requiring companies to post performance bonds to cover the cost of reclamation when mining is finished.

Possible historic sites, including all property on the National Registry, should be zoned for protection, she recommended.

Agriculture and special uses should be zoned, she wrote in her memo.

"Make rules for all special permits," Sanchez wrote. "Provide for no inconsistent interpretations of rules."

A plan for placement of public utilities is an important element of the process, she noted.

She estimated the cost of notifying every property owner in the county about the commission's consideration of zoning would be \$10,627.

Restructuring delays ASC elections

This year's election for positions on the Lincoln County Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation (ASC) Committee, which were to be held in December, are being rescheduled.

The rescheduling is taking place to accommodate last month's reorganization of the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA).

The change in the election schedule is nationwide and authorized under regulations issued by

USDA, said Ronald Merritt, chairperson of the Lincoln County ASC Committee. Current members of ASC committees will continue in their posts until the new elections are held next fall.

The reorganization law created a new agency — the Farm Service Agency — which encompasses all of the commodity support and basic conservation programs of the former Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service (ASCS), and the farm lending activities of the

Farmers Home Administration (FmHA).

Merritt said the new committee system, when fully implemented, will have increased responsibilities due to its enlarged role.

"Rescheduling the elections on a nationwide basis avoids confusion which could occur from hastily drawn rules and regulations," Merritt said. Money saved by delaying elections will be used to train committees.

Each year, hundreds of dogs in the Ruidoso area fall ill with Parvo or distemper. Many die.

With the proper attention and care from owners, that number could drop near zero, local veterinarians say.

Parvo is caused by a virus and is very prevalent in Lincoln County, veterinarians Lynn Willard and Mary Jane Ferguson of The Ruidoso Animal Clinic said. Symptoms include lethargy, refusal to eat or drink and vomit containing mucus. As the illness progresses quickly, a distinctive and strong smelling diarrhea with blood will be produced.

"When they get to that stage, death follows quickly," said Jim Higgins, manager of the Lincoln County Humane Society animal shelter. "They look dehydrated and sunken."

"We see several cases every month and almost all puppies less than four months of age without a series of vaccinations will become infected," Ferguson said.

Knowing whether the mother dog has been vaccinated can help a

vet assess the potential for a puppy to form immunity to the Parvo virus. It's important to keep records.

Climate has nothing to do with vaccination schedule, Willard said. "Our schedule is to begin vaccination in six to eight weeks, then vaccinate at least once every three weeks until the complete series is finished," he said. The vaccine used is irrelevant as long as the animal is vaccinated on schedule, he said. Not completing the series leaves the animal at risk.

Animals should receive boosters at one year of age.

The two vets said vaccination for Corona disease is not part of their routine. "Only dogs in contact with potential carriers are vaccinated, such as dogs going to dog shows or traveling a lot," Willard said.

Corona virus infection does not seem to be prevalent in our practice. But veterinarian Warren Franklin in Glenoco recommends spending the extra \$3 to include a Corona vaccine each year.

The Corona disease's symptoms are similar to Parvo and vets can

spend time and money treating Corona (not usually fatal), thinking it's the early stage of Parvo, he said.

Distemper, a viral infection contracted through the digestive or respiratory tracts, is common in all practices. Symptoms include tremors, listlessness, red eyes, coughing and a high temperature.

"It continues to plague the Humane Society to this day," Willard said. "We see several cases a year and it is cyclic in nature. Some years it is more common than others."

Vaccinations are effective. Opinions vary among the vets about heartworm prevention medicine.

Dr. Earl Leslie of Mountain View Clinic recommends a six-month course of pills from April through September, or year-around if an owner is traveling with a pet or lives near a lake. A test for heartworms should be conducted first.

Franklin recommends the same approach, with the exception of when Lincoln County experiences a warm winter. Then, the pills are advised for year-around.

Although not a frequent complaint at the Willard/Ferguson practice, a few heartworm cases are seen each year.

"Most are from the river area where mosquitoes are a pest," Willard said. "We recommend heartworm preventative to all of our patients even though heartworms are seen less than in most high humidity river areas."

More on kennel cough
Dr. Franklin said he received several calls from people after the column on kennel cough, an upper

respiratory viral infection that usually runs its course in 21 days. No "cure" exists, but symptoms can be treated.

To avoid putting a pet through that ordeal, Franklin said a \$7.50 bordetella vaccine will provide immunity against the viral infection within 24 hours.

"There are two known causes of the cough, the bordetella virus and para-influenza bacteria," Franklin said. "The latter is covered in the regular annual vaccinations a dog receives."

Warriors overcome slow start and Tularosa, 82-70

After a sluggish first quarter that saw Tularosa jump to a 28-15 lead, Ruidoso turned up the defensive pressure and its fast-break and rallied for a 82-70 victory in boys basketball action Friday night.

The Wildcats sprinted to an early lead by not only breaking the Ruidoso press but also by burning it as well. Tularosa passed through the Warriors' pressure and converted easy buckets.

Tulie outscored Ruidoso 10-4 over a three-and-a-half minute span to take a 20-9 lead. Martin Munoz' shot at the buzzer gave the Wildcats a 13-point cushion after one period.

But Ruidoso owned the second quarter much in the same way the Wildcats did the first. The Warriors staged their rally behind the rebounding of senior Malik Waters and better defensive pressure.

Ruidoso outscored Tularosa 16-7 in the second period — 10 of RHS's 16 came from the free-throw line.

The Wildcats turned cold from the field and Waters started cleaning up the boards. Three times Tulie fouled Waters when he was grabbing a board. The third time resulted in two Waters' FTs and cut the Tulie lead to 31-27 with 3:22 left in the half.

On the ensuing play, Waters snagged another Wildcat miss and then fired a long pass to a streaking Cory Hood for an easy layup. Todd Young knotted the game with 2:22 left when he rebounded a teammate's miss.

Tulie scored the final four points of the half to take a 35-31 lead into the locker room, but it was apparent that Ruidoso's comeback hurt the Wildcats mentally.

Ruidoso picked up where it left off in the third quarter. Joshua Hodges nailed a 3-pointer to open the half and the Warriors were off

to the races.

Ruidoso immediately began running its break more effectively. Daniel Espinosa put the home team up for good with an offensive rebound putback at the 5:59 mark of the third quarter. Tulie would never recover.

"We talked about going back and doing things we didn't do in the first half," Ruidoso head coach Sid Wright said. In the first half, "We didn't have any pressure on the ball, we didn't double-team the ball in the corners at all and we didn't run out of any break."

"When that happens, we're mediocre. We're just an average basketball team."

"In the first half we never looked deep. We were just standing underneath the basket. We just did things we worked on in practice and it took over," he said.

It seemed everyone on the Ruidoso team caught the fever-pitch, defensively and offensively. Warriors were diving everywhere for loose balls, pushing the ball up court and corraling most of the rebounds.

Waters led the Warriors' charge. He rebounded, passed the ball to teammates, scored when needed and took a charge. In the second half, the 6-2 senior guard proved why he is worthy of college scouts' attention.

Ruidoso took a 60-52 lead after three quarters and used a 10-3 run at the start of the fourth quarter to push it to double digits. The Warriors extended the lead to as much as 17 points in the fourth quarter.

Still, Wright is concerned about Ruidoso's sluggish beginning.

"We talked about getting on them and getting this game over by halftime and letting people get some minutes," he said. "There's a lot of kids who need some more minutes right now early in the season."

Wright added that when the

Warriors press and run their fast-break, they're tough to stop. Ruidoso also gets that intangible force on its side: momentum.

"Tularosa knew they were in trouble," Wright said about the start of the second half. "Momentum, if we could bottle it and drink it when we wanted, oh what an easy game this would be."

"I hope we start playing at that level early, where we put people away we should put away," he said. "Tularosa's a good basketball team, but in the middle of the third quarter we should have been having some other things to do."

Waters led all scorers with 23 points. Four other Warriors scored in double figures also. Hood and Zach Turner each scored 12 points. Hodges and Espinosa pitched in 10 points apiece.

Tularosa was led by Raul Davis' 14 points. Robert Gonzalez had 12 and Eddie Sanchez chipped in 10 points.

"We're going to get better every time we take the floor. No question about it," Wright said of the Warriors' progress. "We played probably a quarter at Capitan. We played two quarters tonight. So maybe next time, against NMMI (New Mexico Military Institute) we're going to need four, but maybe we'll get three."

When asked about the Ruidoso's next opponent, the state-ranked NMMI Colts, Wright said, "I just don't want to think about them yet. I'll tell you this, if we play just like we did tonight early, NMMI will put us away and we won't be able to run back on them because they're smart and they'll slow it down."

Wright said the Warriors will have to rely on their speed to get by the Colts, who are known for their size. Ruidoso (2-0) hosts NMMI Tuesday, Dec. 6, at the high school. Freshmen teams play at 4 p.m. followed by the junior varsity and varsity contests.

A pair of juniors led the Ruidoso wrestling team to a "pleasing" performance at the 16-team Las Cruces Tournament Saturday.

Beau Jarvis was the highest Warrior finisher. Ruidoso's 134-pound entry took fourth place in a tough weight division. Cobre's Lewis Alvarado downed Jarvis in a hard-fought third-place match, 3-1.

Jarvis finished the day with a 5-2 overall mark and recorded his first pin of the young season.

Teammate Matt Bates took sixth in the 172-pound division. Bates started the tourney with a loss to a No. 2-seeded wrestler from Roswell. He rallied to win his next three matches before being pinned in the fifth-place match.

Bates also recorded his first pin of the season. "He (Bates) just went out and cut him (his opponent) to pieces," Warrior wrestling coach Gerald Ames said.

"I was real pleased with the kids. They did a good job," Ames said of the Warriors' performance. "We hadn't wrestled yet and we were pretty tight. But we got those jitters out of the way and wrestled better as the day went on," he said.

Ruidoso took eight wrestlers to Las Cruces. The Warriors' numbers are hurt by the flu bug and academic ineligibility. But-once Ruidoso overcomes these setbacks, Ames said his team has potential to do well.

"This tournament was a good indication that we're going to be OK," Ames said, adding that wrestlers who place at the Las Cruces Tournament usually do well at the state competition at the end of the year.

The Las Cruces Tournament features mostly AAAA and AAAAA sized schools from Las Cruces and El Paso. The competition is tough, Ames said.

Ruidoso also got a strong performance out of heavyweight

Eustace Gallerito and a gutsy performance from Jose Prieto, Ames said.

Gallerito, who joined the team late because of football, was 2-2. He pinned his opponents in both wins, but was eliminated by a Cobre wrestler, 4-0.

Prieto was battling more than his foe Saturday. The 126-pounder fought off the flu and still managed to go 2-2. After losing in the eventual second-place finisher in the opening round, Prieto posted narrow wins over Las Cruces Hernandez, 5-4, and Roswell's Ponce, 5-3. He was then dismissed in the next round by a Bowie wrestler.

Billy Garcia picked up his first varsity win by pinning Austin's Lopez in the first period. Garcia ended with a 1-2 record wrestling at 142 pounds.

Rob Richardson, 106 pounds, lost both of his fight matches in overtime. Sean Cobb, in the 150-pound division, and Craig Baldrige, in the 160-pound class, also lost in two. Both wrestled at weights below their weight limit, Ames said. Cobb's and Baldrige's opponents had size and experience on their side.

The team now gears up for Saturday's Belen Tournament. Ames said the competition will be challenging.

Plenty of game still out there

With the rifle deer seasons ending, a lot of sportsmen think outdoor opportunities are over for the year and it's time to put up the hunting and fishing gear until next year.

Nothing could be further from the truth. Actually, many hunting and fishing seasons are just getting started. Some waterfowl and upland bird seasons are underway, while others will be starting soon, and anglers can look forward to the winter trout season. The next few months are definitely a busy time of year for an outdoorsman.

Waterfowl hunters can try for both dark and light geese. The season on dark geese (canada or white-fronted) runs through Jan. 29 with a bag limit of three per day and six in possession. The season on light geese extends through Feb. 28 with a bag limit of five per day and 10 in possession. Waterfowl hunters can also look forward to the opening of seasons on ducks, coots, moorhens, rail and snipe.

For years, the bag limit on ducks has been based on a point system, but this has changed. The bag limit is three ducks per day, but there are some excep-

tions listed in the waterfowl proclamation. All waterfowl hunters will also need a state and federal duck stamp along with a small game or general hunting license.

For upland bird hunters, probably the most popular season is for quail, which runs through Feb. 12. Quail numbers appear to be down in south-eastern New Mexico, so quail hunters may have their work cut out for them. The bag limit on quail is 15 per day and 30 in possession. Next month's season will be held for prairie chicken and pheasant. Wing shooters can go after the difficult to hit prairie chicken from Dec. 3 to 11 with a bag limit of three per day and six in possession. Pheasant season opens Dec. 18 and ends Dec. 18 with a bag limit of three roosters per day and six in possession.

Other bird hunting opportunities include sandhill crane and dove. Sandhills may be hunted until Jan. 15 with a bag limit of three per day and six in possession. Crane hunters will need to have a sandhill crane permit, available free-of-charge at game department offices. The season on doves reopens in December and ends Dec. 30 with a bag limit of 15 per day and 30 in possession.

Don't forget about fishing, either. The winter trout season opened Nov. 1 and will continue until March 31, 1995. Stocking trucks have already made their rounds with the first trout of the year, so it might be a good time to get out and wet a line. Rainbow trout will be stocked about every two weeks, depending on the number available from our hatcheries. Remember, those fishing in all winter trout waters will need a trout stamp or validation along with a regular fishing license and only one pole may be used. Anglers can take six rainbows per day.

Sportsmen don't have to look too far to find something to do. Hunting and fishing opportunities are abundant.

Both the girls and boys basketball teams from Capitan finished seventh of eight teams at the Roadrunner Tournament held this past Thursday through Saturday.

Hospital's top 100 honor important to community

Five people have just called the Lincoln County Medical Center to say they'll start looking for a home here. They called after reading in The News the hospital has been named one of the top 100 in the nation by a reputable outside firm, as reported in Thursday's edition of The News.

That is solid testimony to the importance of a local hospital for residents. So is the fact that Realtors commonly call the hospital for updates on services.

A local hospital is especially important to retirees considering a relocation to this area. Studies show a hospital is of top importance to people more than 50 years of age, versus schooling for the younger set. If we didn't have a hospital in Ruidoso, people would have to travel 45 miles to Alamogordo for treatment. A delay like this would cause concern not only to senior citizens, but also to the rest of us in need of emergency treatment.

About 33,000 people use the Lincoln County Medical Center each year, hospital administrator Valerie Miller said. The figure may include some repeat visits, but it's still quite surprising how high that figure is, especially when you note the county's population is only 12,219 (based on the 1990 census).

The hospital asks patients to fill out questionnaires to help gauge patient satisfaction. Miller recalls a recent incident where a Dallas resident came in with a perforated ulcer. Her friend, a Humana Hospital board member in Dallas, was concerned because the hospital is small (38 beds). The woman filled out a questionnaire after returning home, and said if she's ever ill again, she hopes she's ill in Ruidoso.

The honor of being one of the top hospitals in the nation is testimony that the size of the hospital does not directly relate to the quality. It helps that this is a beautiful resort community. Like many others, some doctors are willing to exchange the big bucks for the quality of life in this mountain haven.


The hospital's newest brochure mentions the honor of being one of the top 100 in the nation. Pick up a copy and see what this important asset has to offer.

Election results weren't signal of revolution

So you think this year's election was a great political revolution, do you?

The way you see it, the common people of America rose up in their wrath and threw the rascals out?

It's a healthy belief. Too bad it isn't true. For one thing, there wasn't any popular uprising.

To accomplish what took place on Nov. 8 — the transfer of power in the U.S. Congress from the political party that has the most members to the political party that has the second-most members — it was only necessary for 2% of the voters to shift their allegiance.

Two percent. That's two out of every 100 of those who bothered to go to the polls.

Hardly constitutes a "revolution," does it? (For those of you who do not go to the polls because you claim your vote doesn't count for anything, this should at least suggest to you that statement isn't true. Maybe if a few more of you had showed up this year, things would

have come out very differently.)

But if you still want to see this year as the one when the common people rose up, that's probably not accurate either.

Who was it who won the Congress?

Why, the Republicans, of course.

And what did it cost them? Millions of dollars.

Surely you don't believe all of those came from "the little people" of our land. They didn't.

During this campaign year, the Republicans got \$11.5 million in soft money from American corporations, of the kind that could never be conceived of as speaking for "the little people."

The most generous was the massive brokerage firm named Merrill Lynch. Is it your belief that they made such generous contributions because they want from the government the same things you want from it?

And the cigarette interests — they poured in what one commentator calls "a ton of soft money." Philip Morris gave \$190,750, the To-

bacco Institute gave \$171,027 and RJR Nabisco gave \$140,252.

Those are not widow's mites, you know.

And while you may not ask for anything back from whatever contributions you may have made this year to the political party of your choice, do you think those guys won't want anything back?

That Merrill Lynch contribution, for instance — do you suppose that has anything to do with the Republicans' announced aim of reducing the capital gains tax?

To whom do you think the new leaders in the Congress will show first gratitude — those who want prayer in the schools, or those who put their money on the drum when the party needed to get itself back into power?


