Don't use salt on new sidewalks, village officials say

Ruidoso officials are warning downtown businesses not to put deicing salts on new sidewalks. The concrete will take about a year to cure, Deputy Village Manager Alan Briley said, and the sidewalks will rapidly discolor if standard de-icing salts are spread onto the porous walkways. Most exposed concrete surface deterioration is caused by deicing chemicals, Briley said. The only safe material to reduce skidding hazards during the sidewalk's first winter is plain sand. Products containing ammonium sulphate or ammonium nitrate are the worst, Briley said. As the sidewalks enter their second winter, salt-based deicers may be used, but Briley said a periodic application of a surface sealer is recommended. The new sidewalks were long overdue and cost the village more than \$1 million.

Four named to task force

A four-member task force has been appointed by the Lincoln County Commission to gather information about the potential impact of gambling on the county. Members include County Manager Carolin Cooney, Ruidoso Downs Mayor Joe Hayhurst, Commissioner Wilton Howell and Linda Wallace, manager of the county rural events center. The group's mission is to collect data and interview officials from other towns and counties with gambling. The group was told by Commission Chairman Monroy Montes to assemble a report within 60 days.

Apaches open new gambling room

Poker and blackjack tables opened Thursday in a new gambling room in the main building of the Mescalero Apaches' Inn of the Mountain Gods. They're the latest additions to the growing gambling operation at the Inn and Casino Apache near Ruidoso. Mescalero President Wendell Chino said he expects full Las Vegas-type gambling within four to five months. For now, instead of the casino acting as banker, a player takes that role at the tables. The state Supreme Court is set to hear arguments Wednesday in a lawsuit against a constitutional amendment approved by voters Nov. 8. The amendment legalized a state-run lottery and private video gambling throughout the state.

School candidates sign up Tuesday

Tomorrow is the only day candidates for school board seats throughout Lincoln County can register with the county clerk. All five school boards have openings that will be filled in Feb. 7 elections. Three seats with four-year terms are on the Ruidoso School Board ballot. The positions are currently held by Susan Lutterman and Ronnie Hemphill, both who are seeking re-election, and Mike Morris, who is not running. Carrizozo has three board positions to vote on. Two are four-year terms and one is a two-year term. Capitan voters will decide on three four-year positions and Corona will vote on two four-year positions. Hondo Valley will vote on four positions, one with a two-year term and three with four-year terms.

Candidates for school board offices must file a declaration of candidacy with the county clerk at the county courthouse in Carrizozo by 5 p.m. tomorrow, Dec. 20. Candidates need only be registered to vote in New Mexico and a resident of the school district. Deadline to withdraw candidacy, as well as to declare intent to run as a write-in candidate, is 5 p.m. Jan. 3.

Village rec center coming to life

Almager, who holds a minor degree in architectural drafting, sketched the conceptual designs. She was cloistered all day Thursday with the rest of the joint powers planning group, drawing and sketching as coached by Stafford and the others. Stafford will firm up the drawings with greater detail on parking, ball fields and irrigation of the somewhat spongy land before presenting the package to the village council Jan. 10. Thereafter, the proposal will be handed off to State Representative-elect Dub Williams. A rough financial estimate can then be applied to the center so funds can be requested. As pictured, the proposed two-storied building may have an overall square footage between 80,000 and 100,000 sf, Stafford said, placed amid the 17 acres the school district has leased to the village for \$1/year. A full gymnasium is planned for the first floor, which can be divided for simultaneous basketball or volleyball games. That floor also includes a gymnastics room; a multi-purpose room with a partition which can be used for dances; a small theater with stage; an arts and crafts room; video game room, snack bar, and the requisite storage areas, plus offices and restrooms. The second floor is drawn with two racquetball courts; a jogging track overlooking the gymnasium; and a weight room, aerobics room, nursery and projection room. Outside, a high school baseball diamond is planned, beside a regulation-sized soccer field, and four additional soccer fields for the smaller children will be tucked in the far corner of the White Mountain Drive and Hull Road land site.

Almager toured the Santa Fe Community College last weekend with Ruidoso Mayor Jerry Shaw, Ruidoso Schools Superintendent Mike Gladden, School Board President Ronnie Hemphill, Councilor Leon Eggleston, school board member Susan Lutterman, village manager Gary Jackson and Park and Recreation Commission member Jim Stoddard. The tour proved a success, Mayor Shaw said, further inspiring village officials to push for the indefinite legislative funding. Shaw and village councilors have assigned John Underwood, village attorney and out-going state representative, the task of lobbying the Legislature for recreation center funding.

Body of girl finally identified

Convicted murderer leads police to site in county

A convicted killer led law enforcement agents Friday to a spot between Capitan and Roswell where he allegedly dumped the body of a young girl two years ago. The skeletal remains of that body were discovered Sept. 13, 1992 by a hunter about one mile north of State Highway 246 in an isolated patch of scrub in Lincoln County. Police had no clues to the identification of the body until Vernon "Buddy" Lynn Hopper Jr., 34, led them to the general vicinity Friday. Hopper, a resident of Roswell and Tulsa, Okla., already is serving a first-degree murder sentence in a Texas penitentiary, said Detective Rex Berry of the Tulsa Police Department.

Hopper has now been charged with first-degree murder in the 1992 incident.

"I would not say that we have a conclusive identification (of the body found in Lincoln County)," Berry said. But Hopper has been charged in the disappearance of Roxie Alice Moser, who was 11 years old when she apparently was abducted from a Tulsa grocery store where she had gone with friends June 1, 1992.

"He did take us to a location where he had last left the body of Moser and that is in the same area that the body was found in 1992," Berry said.

More details cannot be released at this time, pending review of the latest case by the Tulsa district at-

orney, he said.

Detective Sgt. Leo Lopez of the Roswell Police Department said Hopper was a long hauler truck driver and is a suspect in several deaths of young girls.

Hopper is now in prison in Huntsville, Texas, on a murder sentence in connection with the disappearance of girl in Arkansas, Berry said.

Lincoln County Sheriff James McSwane said deputies Hal Dew and Ken Jones and Undersheriff Bob Miller conducted the original investigation when the body was discovered. More recently, Deputy Larry Cearley has been in touch with the FBI in Roswell.

The body was badly decomposed and at first was identified as a male by the Office of the Medical Investigator in Albuquerque, McSwane said.

At the time, it appeared the victim had suffered a possible skull fracture, he said.

Lopez said the Roswell department became involved in the Arkansas abduction case when Hopper's pick-up truck with camper shell was found in a barn owned by his father.

"We processed a pick-up that was his at one time, but the FBI was in charge of the case," Lopez said. "They believed the girl in Arkansas had been in the pick-up and that he used a horse tranquilizer on her."

Authorities also are looking into reports that Hopper and Moser spent some time in a Roswell motel.

Grindstone water facilities expanded

Thanks to a comparatively low million-dollar bid for the construction contract of the Grindstone Water Treatment Plant, Ruidoso council members were able to approve additional project designs that keep an eye on the future.

The construction additives tack \$425,575 to the cost of the project bid. More than half the extra cost will go towards relocating an existing water tank.

On Wednesday, a \$1,060,210 base bid from Drew Engineering of Ruidoso was accepted by the council. That bid did not include the extra \$425,575 construction additives (also approved at the meeting) designed by the consulting engineering firm of John Corollo Associates, Village Manager Gary Jackson explained.

Village officials knew funds would be limited for the project, despite the \$670,000 in state appropriations and severance tax bonds issued for the village's top priority. With this budget in mind, the village at first solicited bids for construction of only one water tank, Jackson said.

"We figured if we have the money to do most of the suggested additives we would, but if the bid comes in higher than we'll only be

able to do the bare necessities," he said. With the appropriated additives, the village is able to construct a better project, one that readies the tank for future expansion to two million gallons per day.

"It's planning forethought so we do not have to go back and reinvent the wheel," he said.

Jackson said Drew presented a substantially lower base bid than those of Mesa Verde Enterprises (1,425,324) and Highland Enterprises (\$1,712,000).

Drew is scheduled to begin constructing a water treatment plant at the base of the Grindstone Dam on Jan. 3. The plant will handle up to one million gallons of water per day. The project has been deemed vital to the village's health, as water needs must be augmented to meet increasing demands and seasonal droughts.

The alternative monies, which increase the project's overall cost to \$1,485,785, involve: an accelerated construction schedule, so that the additional water will be available by Memorial Day 1995 if work begins by Jan. 3; relocation of an unused and existing Kingswood water tank; improvements to the water treatment plant building to allow for future expansion; and additions such as an unloading dock, plant

monitoring panel, and laboratory furniture.

The monies funding the bid additives will be appropriated from the utility fund and the water and sewer department accounts, both of which were budgeted for the Grindstone project. Following the appropriation, the water and sewer account (the main fund set aside for the project) has an approximate ending balance of \$439,085, Jackson reported.

Also at Tuesday's meeting, councilors heard Planning and Zoning Commission recommenda-

tions and approved:

— a 20-lot subdivision of Deer Park Woods in Alto. The application — a preliminary and final plat plan — was filed by Myco Industries.

— scheduling an appeal for Jan. 10 on a commercial site development. The request for appeal follows the P&Z commission's rejection of a parking plan for a proposed beauty shop. P&Z approved the change of use, but required compliance with current commercial development standards. They rejected the parking plan Nov. 21 because the parking lot entrance is at the intersection of Mechem Road

and Embdy.

— a P&Z request for a fee reduction for replats. As proposed by the planning director, a reduction of the \$100 fee down to \$25 may encourage property owners to replat property lines when seeking to reconfigure land. The council will review the fee change July 1, 1995.

Councilors also offered information on a notice from Lincoln County Cable Vision that basic programming rates will be increased by four cents beginning in January. The increase reflects the annual cost of regulation.

Correction

State Rep. John Underwood (D-Ruidoso) has served two, two-year terms in the Legislature.

A story in the Dec. 15 *News* said Underwood served two years.

Some of the first words I remember hearing during my 85 years in the Episcopal Church are:


"Remember the words of our Lord Jesus Christ — how he said; "It is more blessed to give than to receive."

Waste collection to be unified

Next year for the first time, all communities in Lincoln County may have their garbage collected by the same agency.

When the Lincoln County Solid Waste Authority (SWA) was formed four years ago, three towns already were under contract with a private collection company. The county and its five municipalities agreed from the start that the goal would be for the SWA to provide collection and disposal to all six members.

Capitan switched to the SWA more than a year ago. The five-year contracts Corona and Carrizozo have with Southwest Disposal of Alamogordo will expire next year. Authority manager Joe Lewandowski said he wants to convince officials of those towns that the price and service is better at home. He'll discuss putting together a proposal with authority board members at their meeting at 10 a.m. today. They meet in the main office on Second Avenue in Ruidoso Downs.

Lewandowski sat down with Corona representatives three weeks ago and with Carrizozo officials last Tuesday to talk about the authority providing services for those communities. Carrizozo's contract with Southwest runs out in March and Corona's in July. The contracts automatically renew for another five years if the communities do not send the company notice, Lewandowski said Friday.

All members of the authority have the option of contracting with a private company at any time. "I'll be putting together a proposal for each of the two communities as far as what we can do and what the costs will be and how we would do it," Lewandowski said.

Bids are not necessary for the services, because it would be government to government and would not fall under the state procurement code, he said.

"We're allowed to negotiate an agreement under state statutes covering government services like water, sewage and solid waste," he said.

The authority would serve 580 residential accounts and 40 commercial in Carrizozo, which now has the highest residential rates in the county at \$12.50 a month. In Corona, 110 residential and 15 commercial accounts would be handled. Its current residential rate is \$12 a month. The residential rates in authority-served communities vary according to the level of service and are more in the \$6-7 range, but those communities are closer to the base of operations than Carrizozo and Corona. Corona is situated in the far northwest corner of the county.

The authority now serves 12,600 residential accounts and 600 commercial covering the unincorporated portions of the county and the other three villages, Ruidoso, Capitan and Ruidoso Downs.

Carrizozo spends \$72,000 a year on garbage collection and Corona about \$22,000, Lewandowski said. Switching to the authority would keep that money in the county, he said.

Audit comments

Board members also will review the 1993-94 audit today.

Auditor Hemphill & Austin, CPA, of Ruidoso, concluded the authority was operating within acceptable parameters and was in the black for the 12-month period ending June 30, 1994. However, several areas needing correction were cited.

Four of the criticisms listed in the audit last year have been resolved, but noted again this year were the lack of a financial statement and violations of the procurement code.

"The items were not high dollar, but our problem is when I took over, I didn't know that the board had adopted a procurement code in 1992 that was stricter than the state's. We never saw it," Lewandowski said. "We followed the state code. I'm going to ask the board to rescind that policy and follow the state guidelines."

"There were no violations of any

large items. Anything over \$5,000 we hid out with advertising and the whole situation, because that's the state's limit. Anything over \$500 was backed up with telephone quotes."

The stricter board policy requires three telephone quotes for any purchase of more than \$250, but it was never put into writing, Lewandowski said.

Authority Chairman Wilton Howell said he will support adopting the state's code.

"We approve bills each month and they all come with supportive documentation," he said. "I don't see anything wrong following state procedures and I can see how (Lewandowski) would have followed that not knowing about the previous policy."

Like all government entities in the county, which have small financial staffs, the authority does not have an employee prepare financial statements. That's left up to the auditors and is a condition criticized in each annual audit.



Under accounts receivable, the auditors noted an adequate system of internal controls needs to be developed. The lack of documentation of transactions within the system reduces the reliability of the data generated, they wrote.

Lewandowski agrees. "When I first came (in 1993), I told the board this is not a good system," he said. "The auditor says there's not a clear path for each transaction and it takes a lot longer to follow. We needed a change. We just haven't done anything yet."


Lewandowski said he's to blame for a criticism by the auditors of the IRS reporting of employee compensation.

"I came from private industry and before knowing all the rules of government, I was giving out safety bonuses as an incentive program for drivers," he said. "Because of the state law against donations and federal IRS regulations, we can't do that. I hadn't reported it as compensation or taken out the withholding. I only did it for two months and dropped it immediately when I found out."

Centre for the Healing Arts is now open

The Centre for the Healing Arts, a dream and long time in the making for many people, has become reality at 100 Lower Terrace.

The grand opening for the center was Wednesday, Dec. 7. Attendees included patients, friends, local officials, bankers, agents, founders, new residents and the Ruidoso Village Greeters from the Chamber of Trade, flowers and fun ends with a bottle of champagne.

The center is built in a circular fashion with several side branches. It has changed considerably from the time the building housed various restaurants. Contractor Bill Queen worked 12 to 16 hours a day to finish 90% by the grand opening date. The final touch was gracious-

ly provided by local artist Teri Bodd, who chose several beautiful posters for the hallways.

The center is now the home of Dr. Sandra Davis, D.C., chiropractor; Dr. Cheryl Primmore, E.D., counselor; Dr. Rikke Goldfarb, D.D., counselor; Mary Adams, counselor and biofeedback specialist; David Duke, massage therapist; Helen Burnett, reflexologist; Mary Ellen Masters, colon therapist; and Sara Bagby, part-time massage therapist at the center.

The old rock house next door is still under repair. When the center was purchased, the rock house had a major roof leak in the front portion, a minor leak around the sky

lights in the back porch and another leak in the basement. The first two have been repaired, but the last may require some extensive underground excavation. People at the center are looking for someone who may know the age of the rock house.

The Lincoln County Assessor's office lists the rock house's age as 1950s, but some think it is older. It is a unique display of rock, coral, petrified wood, quartz, crystal, fool's gold, lava and other geological entities in the area. The exterior portion of the fireplace is compiled

of huge chunks of petrified wood staked to look like a pine tree. The fireplace had been completely covered by a giant ivy (which may

have caused the roof leak). When this was removed, the pine tree of petrified pieces appeared.

Ideas for the rock house include a health food restaurant with juices, fresh ribs and raw selections, whole grains, organic produce, vegetarian and limited selections of cold eggs and cheeses.

Another idea is an energy store specializing in air purifiers, water purifiers, humidifiers, shower filters, water restrictors to save the village's limited water supply, energy efficient fireplace and heating systems, and photovoltaic cells to provide cheap solar energy.



Cap wears out rival 'Zozo

It took Capitan and Carrizozo two quarters of basketball before Friday night's contest had that "bitter-rivals-at-each-others'-throat" feeling. For the second time this season, the Tigers prevailed, 62-53.

The slow start by both teams made for a terrific second half, but fans might have wondered where the intensity and enthusiasm was in the first half. The players probably wondered where the fans were.

Credit the referees for keeping the players under control and Capitan's defense for keeping the 'Zozo home crowd quiet.

The men in stripes called a tight and consistent game. Both teams were in the one-and-one bonus with 7:32 left in the second quarter.

"They were calling cheap fouls," Carrizozo senior guard Billy Sheehan said of the officials. The two teams combined for 10 one-and-one attempts in the second quarter.

The Tigers kept the Grizzlies' dazzling backcourt duo of Sheehan and Willie "Quick As" Silva in check with a full-court trap in the first half. Capitan started quickly and opened up a 10-2 lead four minutes into the ballgame.

'Zozo played catch-up the rest of the half, but the Grizzlies eventually caught the Tigers with eight seconds left in the half. Sheehan rebounded his own miss from 3-point land, scored and drew the foul. His free throw tied the game at 29.

The crowd woke up and the Grizzlies were back in the game. Capitan junior John Ugalano countered with a 3-pointer at the buzzer to give the visitors a 32-29 lead at the half.

Sheehan got the Grizzlies going. The senior guard nailed three 3-pointers in the third quarter. His second one gave 'Zozo its first lead of the game, 35-34.

Suddenly, both teams started playing like this was another important battle in a long war.

Two fastbreak buckets by Silva and a deuce by Sheehan gave the Grizzlies a 47-40 lead with under two minutes in the third period. Capitan went on a 6-0 run to end the quarter and cut the 'Zozo lead to 47-46.

Two adjustments accounted for the Grizzlies' success in the third. First, Capitan pulled its trap back to half-court. Sheehan, relieved of having to help bring the ball up the

court, could spot up in the front court and get a good look at the basket.

And defensively, 'Zozo coach Rob Hollis put Silva on Capitan's Michael Fish in the second half, instead of Sheehan. It helped for awhile, but fatigue hurt the Grizzly cause.

"When we got up by seven we shot our whole deal to get that lead," Hollis said.

Josh Peralta gave Capitan the lead for good at the 6:05 mark of the fourth period. Tiger coach Ron Becker singled out Nathan Longboham's play as critical.

"Nathan in the fourth quarter —

he sparked us. I thought he was the difference. He gutted it out," Becker said. "We were more determined at the start of the fourth quarter."

Hollis said the Grizzlies need to work on their conditioning.

"We have to get better by Jan. 14 when we play district games," he said.

Sheehan led all scorers with 27 points. Silva added 11 for the Grizzlies. Carrizozo is 3-5 overall.

Ugalano paced the victors with 15 points. Peralta scored 10 points for the Capitan players, who improved to 3-5.

New family planning program sought by state

State Human Services Department administrators have asked the federal government to approve a new family planning program.

The request for a five-year research and demonstration waiver would make more women eligible for Medicaid-funded family planning services by raising the income limit for eligibility.

The request also calls for research into why more New Mexico women don't use family planning services, and for the development of programs that address those issues.

The number of New Mexico women having unplanned pregnancies doubled between 1988 and 1990, from 25 percent of live births to 50 percent," said Bruce Weydemeyer, HSD medical assistance division director.

Because half of the births in New Mexico are covered by Medicaid, the state's taxpayers often pay for the high cost of complicated deliveries.

Currently, a woman is ineligible for Medicaid-funded family planning services if her family's income is higher than about a third of the poverty level (\$5,496 for a family of four). Under the proposal, which would go into effect April 1, the limit for a family of four would be \$27,380 a year, or 185 percent of the federal poverty level.

The expansion of family planning services would be covered by a \$400,000 appropriation from the 1994 legislature.

In 1992, the legislature funded an expansion in Medicaid services for pregnant women living in households with incomes at 185 percent of poverty and an additional 4,000 women a year began receiving services. Currently, those women drop out of the system 60 days after they give birth, but under the new proposal they and any other woman seeking family planning help would be eligible for services for two years.

Even women who have access to family planning services often have unplanned pregnancies, Weydemeyer said. Part of the expansion proposal is to research the reasons and develop enhanced services for four pilot communities.

"Simply eliminating the financial barriers is not enough," Weydemeyer said.

Regular family planning services would include medical examinations, patient education, training in natural family planning and medical or pharmaceutical contraception. Enhanced services could include intensive communication with patients, transportation to appointments and community education projects.

Mine bureau offers free magazine about geology

The new Mexico Bureau of Mines and Mineral Resources (NMBMMR) recently released its latest issue of *Life Geology*, a free quarterly magazine showcasing contemporary geological topics, issues, and events in a fun-to-read format.

Life Geology is designed to be less technical than most of the NMBMMR's other publications and is primarily directed toward educators and other members of the public who have an interest in earth science.

Subscriptions to the magazine are available free of charge for New Mexico residents. Out-of-state subscribers are asked to contact the

NMBMMR for further subscription information.

Two of the articles in the latest issue of *Life Geology* are dedicated to earthquakes, covering such topics as the relationship between seismic events and the behavior of geysers and how earthquakes are measured. The issue also includes studies on ancient lakes and origins of those stones that seem to "grow" out of everyone's gardens, as well as several whimsical cartoons and illustrations.

Escape To Serenity

Far from the bustle of hotels and the isolation of motels, guests of Lincoln County's bed and breakfast inns are treated to meals around a family table, plenty of personal attention and sometimes a large dose of local history.

Unlike cookie cutter chains, each bed and breakfast revels in its unique personality and architectural design. From early adobe to replica Victorian on the outside, room themes often vary even more.

Spruced up with boughs, bows and bells for the holidays, most of the inns also are booked up well in advance.

Kirsten Mooney of the Scandia Chalet, located on State Highway 37/48 between Ruidoso and the turnoff to Carrizozo, said she's added a few special holiday touches from Denmark.

"We're totally decorated for the holidays...We still have some space around New Year's, but Christmas is completely booked."

East and West Coast, Mooney said it only seemed natural to turn her home into an inn when she moved to Lincoln County a year ago.

Only a shell at the time, the main house and its three bedrooms now serve as the bed and breakfast. A separate entrance leads to the upstairs room, which features a double jacuzzi. Mooney is converting one unfinished section off the bottom floor into a glass-enclosed atrium dining room with a fireplace.

A two-bedroom cottage in back will be ready for guests in May.

"I think people like this, because it's something different, but refined and personal," Mooney said. "I like it because I like people."

Jane Kretchman of Paz de Nogal came from an entirely different background. She worked with computers in Cambridge, Mass., before taking an impulsive plunge into the bed and breakfast business after visiting relatives in Ruidoso.

Kretchman was smitten with an 1856 adobe structure in the settlement of Nogal, a former gold mining community near Carrizozo that

now consists of a post office and a couple dozen homes sprinkled on either side of State Highway 37.

For a 20-year period, the structure was converted into a tennis camp for promising athletes and 10 courts were built. It had been vacant for four years when Kretchman bought it in May 1993 over the protests of her sister, who visualized the work ahead.

The finished product mixes Southwest appeal with comfort. Large exposed beams, a 30-degree slope in one bedroom and an old footed tub Kretchman rescued from the courtyard and rehabilitated, all add to the authenticity. Five fireplaces offer atmosphere and warmth.

Since she opened the b&b in August, Kretchman handles the entire operation herself. Most of her business comes through referrals from lodgers in Ruidoso and from word of mouth. Weekend stops by visitors from Albuquerque are a mainstay, she said.

"The fun part is the breakfast, because I love to cook," she said. "In good weather, we eat in the courtyard. I try to be sensitive to how much privacy or how much involvement my guests want. Some want to be in the kitchen with you and some you can sense want space."

Kretchman said she will be offering a special 10% discount deal after the holidays as a get-away for locals trying to recuperate. But that doesn't mean 10% less service, she said. No matter where guests come

from, they receive a full dinner and breakfast.

"It's thrilling to bring life back into the house," she said. "I want this to be a comfortable place. Pets and children are welcome."

Gourmet meals heavily flavored with the history of the old west are offered at The Ellis Store, one of the county's original way stations for travelers. It is found in the settlement of Lincoln about 10 miles northwest of Hondo Valley and U.S. 70.

Period furniture (one set is 120 years old) blends with the 1850 structure to create a step back into time for guests staying in this inn owned by David and Virginia Vigil. Four bedrooms in the main house and four in the mill house allow for family reunions and other small groups.

The Vigils will be serving Christmas and New Year's Eve dinners to pre-booked groups from out-of-state.

Across the street and west from

the store is Casa de Patron, owned by Jerry and Cleis Jordan.

The adobe hacienda once shielded the outlaw Billy the Kid, who gained infamy in the Lincoln County War. Juan Patron, county clerk and the youngest speaker of the Territorial Government State House at 21, offered hospitality to the young gunfighter while he waited for an interview with Gov. Lew Wallace to plea bargain for his life.

Built in 1860, the chalet is included in the National Historic Register of Historic Places.

The couple hit on the idea of a bed and breakfast while traveling in Scotland and staying at similar businesses.

"We were looking for something we could do here and there was a real need for accommodations," Mrs. Jordan said. "We've been renovating since 1983."

It's not difficult having strangers stay in their home, she said.

"We never consider anyone a stranger. We always consider them an opportunity," she said. "They're wonderful guests and some turn into lifelong friends. The best part is that they come back every year like family."

The chalet offers three rooms in the main building and two self-contained casitas in separate structures. Mrs. Jordan adds special homemade candies and soaps in each room.

Getting started wasn't too difficult from a regulatory angle, they said. The county doesn't require a business license. All lodgers in the county pay a tax for each room rented, but if they have less than six rooms they are exempt from federal standards required to accommodate the handicapped.

"We had to go to the state environmental division to get a restaurant license, but it's only for our guests. We're not a public restaurant," Jordan said.

He boasts that his bed and

breakfast is one of only two in the county that are members of the Professional Association of Innskeepers International and the New Mexico Bed and Breakfast Association. Both groups require high standards of cleanliness and safety, including smoke alarms.

Sierra Mesa Lodge probably has operated the longest in the county.

"I started eight years ago looking for a business to keep me busy, but where I wouldn't have to work hard," said Larry Goodman, who with wife Lila owns Sierra Mesa in Old Fort Stanton Road near Alto. "I originally thought of operating a hotel, but there were too many problems. Our place has five guest rooms with private baths. We appeal to the romantic market, with breakfast served in bed if requested and lots of pampering. There's a hot tub spa and full gourmet breakfast, including homemade pastries."

Room themes vary from Victorian to Oriental. No children under 14 or pets are allowed. Guests can roam the 3 1/2 acres and enjoy a spectacular view of Sierra Blanca.

"We've definitely enjoyed it," Goodman said. "The only thing, like any business, we're tied down to it. We've never had any problems with guests. At least 50% are either repeats or referrals. We book up well in advance."

The quiet time usually falls in the spring, while weekends always are the busiest, he said.

J.R. and Kay Newton of Lubbock, Texas own Monjeau Shadows Bed and Breakfast, but Billie and Gilbert Reidland handle the operation, which is for adults only.

"I've just loved it," Mrs. Reidland said. "Marvelous people come here, the cream of the crop. They come from all over the country, a lot from Albuquerque, Lubbock, Amarillo, El Paso and one couple from England."

The four-story, seven-bedroom Victorian styled house was built 11 years ago on eight acres south of the road between Bonito and Nogal.

"We have a game room with full size pool table and plenty of walking trails where guests are bound to see deer and hear coyotes," Mrs. Reidland said. "In the summers, the fields are full of flowers."

Other bed and breakfasts listed in the county are K.R. & K. (Kearneys Rest and Relaxation) at 404 Main Street in Ruidoso, and Catherine Kelly's Bed and Breakfast in Capitan, which has temporarily closed but may reopen again this summer.

First, be sure the intended new owner is ready to commit to a long-term relationship. Contrary to popular impression, cats aren't "no maintenance" pets, said Jim Riggins, manager of the Lincoln County Humane Society animal shelter.

Things to be considered include what a new owner may be looking for by choosing a cat. Companionship should top the list, Riggins said.

"It's really the only choice that will satisfy your expectations," he said. "A cat should not be acquired for pest control or showing, and definitely not for breeding. We get fantastic looking cats turned into the shelter, so there are plenty around."

The average lifespan of an indoor cat is 14 years. A prospective owner should be sure he or she is willing to provide a home and care for that length of time.

The care includes feeding, grooming (especially for long haired cats that may require grooming daily), housing (life indoors is the safest and healthiest), veterinarian care and human contact.

"Although cats have a high feral survival rate, they are domesticated animals," Riggins said. "They rely on human affection and interaction for happiness, perhaps even more than other species, although their requests and body language are often more subtle."

If a family decides to adopt or buy a cat, parents need to think about their particular situation.

"Families with children could benefit from the playful antics of a kitten, where adult cats may be overwhelmed by children's concentrated attention," Riggins said.

Personal expectations also should be reflected in the breed selected. Siamese cats are very vocal and assertive, even demanding for attention. On the other hand, Abyssinians are gentle, affectionate and quiet.

When choosing a cat or kitten, inspect the prospective new pet to ensure they are active, alert and friendly. Check the eyes for dis-

charge or redness and be sure none of the "third eye" membrane is exposed.

Other things to watch out for are:

- that there is no nasal discharge
- that the inside of the ears are clean and dry, not red or waxy
- that the front teeth of upper jaw meets front teeth of lower jaw,

so there is no over or under bite — that the fur is clean, soft and shiny

— that the rear end and back of legs are free of waste and matting.

Amendment 8 should stand as approved

The Supreme Court is scheduled to hear arguments Wednesday about the legality of Amendment 8. If the court has any faith in the intelligence of voters, it should uphold the amendment.

An anti-gambling group and two legislators filed a lawsuit seeking to invalidate the voter-approved amendment, saying it goes against state law because it "logrolls" two questions into one amendment. State Attorney General Tom Udall has joined the lawsuit.

One wonders about Udall's motives. Is this a move for publicity because he has his sights on a higher office? If so, it's not the kind of publicity he should be seeking, considering a solid majority of voters approved Amendment 8. Maybe it's his and King's last-ditch effort to stop gambling, something they can't do anyway.


Some who advocate overturning the amendment say it confused voters to have the lottery and "certain games of chance" combined. We should give the voters more credit than that.

If the amendment was confusing, it wasn't because it had two issues on it. The voters approved a state-run lottery and "certain games of chance." All are gambling. It seems incongruous to separate the lottery from "certain games of chance" when that's really what a lottery is, too.

It's going to be time-consuming enough for the Legislature to enact enabling legislation for Amendment 8. If the amendment is overturned, it's likely the Legislature will approve gambling through a bill, anyway, since King won't be around to veto it anymore. Let's allow our elected officials to get a head start on this thing and let the voice of the voters stand.

Johnson 'hit list' and 'raid' rile Legislature

So governor-elect Gary Johnson's making himself a "hit list." By golly, the fella's up and decided he's gonna try his hand at heavy-duty power politics now that he's Numero Uno at the Roundhouse.

It's been twenty years since another prominent Republican politician kept a roster of those who got on his bad side. Only unlike Richard Nixon, who tried to keep his a secret, Johnson wants his enemies list tacked right up there on the wall for everybody to see from the git go.

The governor-elect's announcement that he intends to keep a "hit list" of lawmakers who cross him on repeal of the four cents which remain of that 1993 six-cent-a-gallon gasoline tax was made at a Dec. 3, Republican conclave in Albuquerque where it was gleefully received by his partisan audience.

Democratic legislators were less charmed by the news, however, particularly when they discovered that the bludgeon Johnson intends to use to back up his "hit list" is the threat to actively campaign against those who buck him on the tax issue when they seek re-election two years from now.

"Immature political rhetoric," Democratic House Speaker Raymond Sanchez archly

responded upon learning of the incoming governor's remarks.

And the speaker may have a point, especially if Gary Johnson hopes to have a honeymoon with his natural political adversaries in the upcoming 1995 Democratic-controlled Legislature.

Even before his "hit list" pronouncement, Johnson had engaged in create tensions between his administration-in-waiting and the Democratic Legislature by appointing the respected Legislative finance committee director, David Harris, to head his Department of Finance and Administration.

The LFC is the Legislature's brain trust on matters of state taxation and fiscal policy. Next to the Legislative Council Service, which drafts proposed legislation and provides technical and legal advice to lawmakers, it is the Legislature's most critical staff operation.

And to make matters worse, not only will Harris be leaving the employ of the Legislature to become Johnson's finance secretary, he's taking his entire LFC staff with him. This, at a time when the Legislature will need it most and with no time at all to replace it.

It is, clearly, a coup for the inexperienced incoming governor. But Democratic lawmakers in both houses are stunned by the loss and steam-

ing mad about what one top Senate Democrat has characterized as "an unethical raid."

Ironically, at the same time Johnson was throwing down the gauntlet before the Legislature with "raids" on its LFC staff and threats of "hit lists," legislative Democrats were caucusing to develop their strategies for the upcoming session—including what kind of honeymoon they are prepared to extend the new governor.

And, although Johnson has said he intends to keep his requests of the Legislature modest this year, he will nonetheless need a honeymoon if his administration is to get off to a promising start.

This will definitely be the case when it comes to fleshing out his administration with the hundreds of appointments all new governors must make, including top cabinet-level appointments; appointments, it should be remembered, that will require confirmation by a Senate controlled by Democrats.

Johnson and his GOP advisors are entitled to feel elated over their newly-acquired clout at the Roundhouse. Their recent forays into the heavy-duty world of power politics in Santa Fe carries risks, however, particularly since "the other party" (as Republicans sometimes like to put it) still controls both houses of the Legislature.

Warriors' challenge: blend new with old

If Ruidoso head coach Sid Wright had it his way, the Warriors would run and press its way to the Class AAA boys state tournament this March. He's no stranger to state tournaments. In Texas, Wright's teams — boys and girls — won nearly 80 percent of their games in eight years. His McMullen County boys team won the state title in 1980.

He wants to bring that type of success to Ruidoso. And he expects it as well.

"I'll be very disappointed if we're not going into the state tournament with the varsity," he said at the beginning of the season.

When the Warriors play Wright's brand of basketball — press on defense, fastbreak on offense — Ruidoso can be a state-caliber team, he said. "When we don't play our style we're just a mediocre team," Wright said.

Ruidoso opened the season with a pair of wins over Capitan and Tularosa. But the Warriors have fallen to 2-4 since then. Most recently, Ruidoso lost three games at the Bruce King Tournament in Moriarty, marking the first time Wright has lost four in row as a coach in long time.

The first-year coach says the Warriors have worked out the troubles they encountered at Moriarty. Only time will tell.

Wright has more than just the challenge of turning around a program that was 6-17 a year ago. He has to blend the



veteran Ruidoso players with three transfers from Menaul High School and convince all the players to believe in his system.

The Warriors are blessed with upper-class talent. Menaul-transfer Malik Waters leads the charge. Waters is a 6-2 senior guard. He's a major-college talent who is tough in the open court.

Also battling for minutes in the back-court are: 6-5 junior Josh Hodges, 6-0 junior Cory Hood, 5-10 senior Gabe Aguilar, 6-0 senior Paxton Wright, 5-11 senior Daniel Espinosa and 5-11 junior Rex Commanche.

Anchoring the Warriors in the post are: 6-2 senior Zack Turner, 5-11 senior Aaron Beyer, 6-4 senior Scott Christensen, 6-2 senior Jackie Roe and 6-3 senior Todd Young.

Wright platoons his troops so everyone sees time on the courts.

"We've got some talent and the other thing we've got is we've got the kids who want to play. And when you've got that combination you've got the chance to win more than you lose," he said.

Capitan aims to get a grip on the season

Ron Becker's Capitan boys basketball team has found the handle to its first challenge of the season. Now the Tigers need to get a grip on the basketball if they are to improve upon last year's 17-10 mark and return to the state tournament.

Becker, in his third year at CHS, introduced a new concept to his team. The Tigers substitute themselves and rotate in the game as they see necessary. Becker is trying the concept in hopes each player will learn to evaluate himself. He also hopes the players learn honesty and responsibility.

"Like any experiment, it may fail for awhile," Becker said at the start of the season.

Becker hasn't had to tinker with senior Michael Fish's play thus far. The 5-9 guard leads the team in nearly every category.

"Michael is without a doubt playing the hardest and playing well. He's the one that's been our most consistent player. I'm real pleased with what he's doing," Becker said.

Fish is joined by senior teammates J. P. Whipple, a 5-11 forward, and Rodney Sedillo, a 5-11 forward. Capitan's height is in its junior class. Forwards Keith Cox and Jeremy McGarvey and guard Josh Peralta are all 6-2. Junior Neil Montes directs the Tiger offense. Rounding out the squad are sophomores Trey Allen and Cody Turnbow.

Capitan moved up to Class AA competition this year. The Tigers will play in District 6-AA against Cloudcroft, Dexter and Tularosa. Becker hasn't lowered his expectations with the move up.

"If we had a goal for this, it would be for us to be the first team in Capitan's history to go back to the final eight, two years in a row," he said.

Grizzlies girls basketball coach Kim Gremillion didn't fully realize what she was getting into when she accepted a teaching and coaching job at Carrizozo. Gremillion coaches volleyball, basketball and track for 'Zozo and teaches science and physical education. She's also had to direct the junior high volleyball and basketball programs.

Sound crazy? You bet. But Gremillion has the youthful energy to handle it. In August, the Eastern New Mexico University graduate was finishing up her last college final as quickly as she could.

"I had to get to Carrizozo for volleyball practice," Gremillion said, recalling her hectic first week in Carrizozo.

She has since completed a successful volleyball season -- the Grizzlies finished 11-8 -- and now has embarked on the basketball season. Gremillion's Carrizozo team is 2-6 and getting better. They recently downed Hondo, 44-41, Thursday, Dec. 15, for their second win.

"We improve with every game and as long as we keep improving, I'll be happy," she said.

bouncer and strong inside post player.

This is Shafer's first year playing hoops and Gremillion expects her to improve as she learns the game. Hightower orchestrates the Grizzly offense and defense. Adding depth to the team are Sarah Funk, Debbie Bond, Lynette Hernandez, Natalie Chavez and Michelle Barela.

Gremillion's girls play a variety of pressure defenses and run a motion offense. She wants them to eventually play full-court man-to-man denial.

Defense is definitely a strength, Gremillion said, but the team needs to take care of the ball better.

"We were just scared to death (at the first game)," she said. "The more we play, the better we get."

"We have the speed and the talent. We just have to put it all together."

The Missouri native might, at times, wonder how she ended up in south central New Mexico, but she doesn't question her timing. Gremillion's eyes light up when she talks about the future of the young Grizzlies.

"We could be tough," Gremillion said, noting she has strong players in the junior high as well. "I think my eighth-graders are tougher than my sophomores."

Cardinals playing as a team this year

A little teamwork has gone a long way for the 1994-95 Corona boys basketball team. The Cardinals, who finished last year with a dismal 1-18 mark, have put their bickering of the past behind them.

"They're playing real well," said third-year coach Gid Allen. "They're just playing together this year."

Allen said last year's team had more height, but lacked chemistry. "They lost a couple games early and they started fighting with each other. This year they're doing real well."

The Cardinals opened the 1994-95 season by winning the Hondo Tournament. Corona defeated Hondo and Vaughn for the title. They then beat Estancia's junior varsity team before losing to House in the championship game of their own tournament. They slipped to 3-2 after a 50-49 loss to Hondo. Brown is a quick leaper and slashes around defensive players for his points. Brown is averaging 22 points and 11 rebounds a game.

Russell Lueras, a 6-0 senior, directs the Cardinal offense. Corona's biggest outside threat and second leading scorer is 6-1 guard Juan Gonzales. Gonzales can bomb away from 3-point range and keep defenses honest outside the paint. He's averaging 16 points a game. Sophomore Leonardo Gonzales rounds out Corona's starting five.

The team's lack of depth concerns Allen. Substitutes off the bench are sophomore Chris Daniel and a pair of eighth-graders, Rocky Bagley and Daniel Smith. Allen said team defense and speed are other Cardinal weaknesses.

But, Corona's 3-2 start has Allen optimistic about this season and the future of Cardinal basketball. With his two leading scorers only juniors, Allen wants to build on the Cardinals' early-season successes.

Allen, who coached previously in Texas, is a Capitan alum glad to be back in the Land of Enchantment. "It was just too flat over there (Texas)," he said.


Hondo has shown flashes of brilliance this year. But that has been offset by flashes of incompetence.
