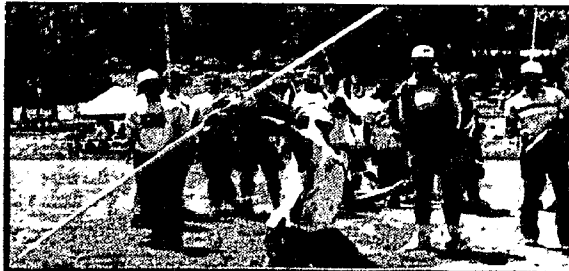

### ON THE SIDE

#### Huge military exercise planned

The largest air defense exercise ever staged on this planet is being prepared in southeastern New Mexico, military officials said.

Exercise Roving Sands '95 will include 20,000 troops from all four branches of the U.S. military, plus German and Dutch troops. It will be the largest German contingent to ever participate in military exercises on U.S. soil.

The exercise runs from April 29 through May 9. Much of the equipment is being shipped by rail to Roswell, then transported over highways to the White Sands Missile Range.

The annual exercise focuses on air defense. Army and Marine air defense units at White Sands will face mock attacks by Navy and Air Force units flying from the Roswell Industrial Air Center and other sites. The only actual firing of weapons will occur on McGregor Range by White Sands, said information officer Major Steve Pantan.

Convoys traveling through Lincoln County will only reach speeds of 45 mph, so civilian motorists may be slowed.

#### Local choirs perform Monday and Sunday

The Eastern New Mexico University of Ruidoso Choir, the Ruidoso High School Choir and ENMU's Mariachi Alma De Ruidoso will join to perform a spring concert Monday in Carrizozo and Sunday in Ruidoso.

The Carrizozo concert begins at 7 p.m. April 17 in the Trinity United Methodist Church. The Ruidoso concert begins at 3 p.m. April 23 at First Christian Church, 1211 Hull Road.

#### Health office to close for training

The Ruidoso Health Office at 105 Kansas City Road will be closed April 20-21 so employees can attend a training session in Roswell.

No services, including Women, Infants and Children, immunization, family planning and prenatal, will be available on those days.

## Bears lose easy free lunches with Upper Canyon's new dumpsters

Heavier garbage containers are headed into the bear-plagued Upper Canyon section of Ruidoso.

One hundred heavier containers will be installed.

"They're not bear proof, but they're better than what we have there now," said Joe Lewandowski, manager of the Lincoln County Solid Waste Authority, which is

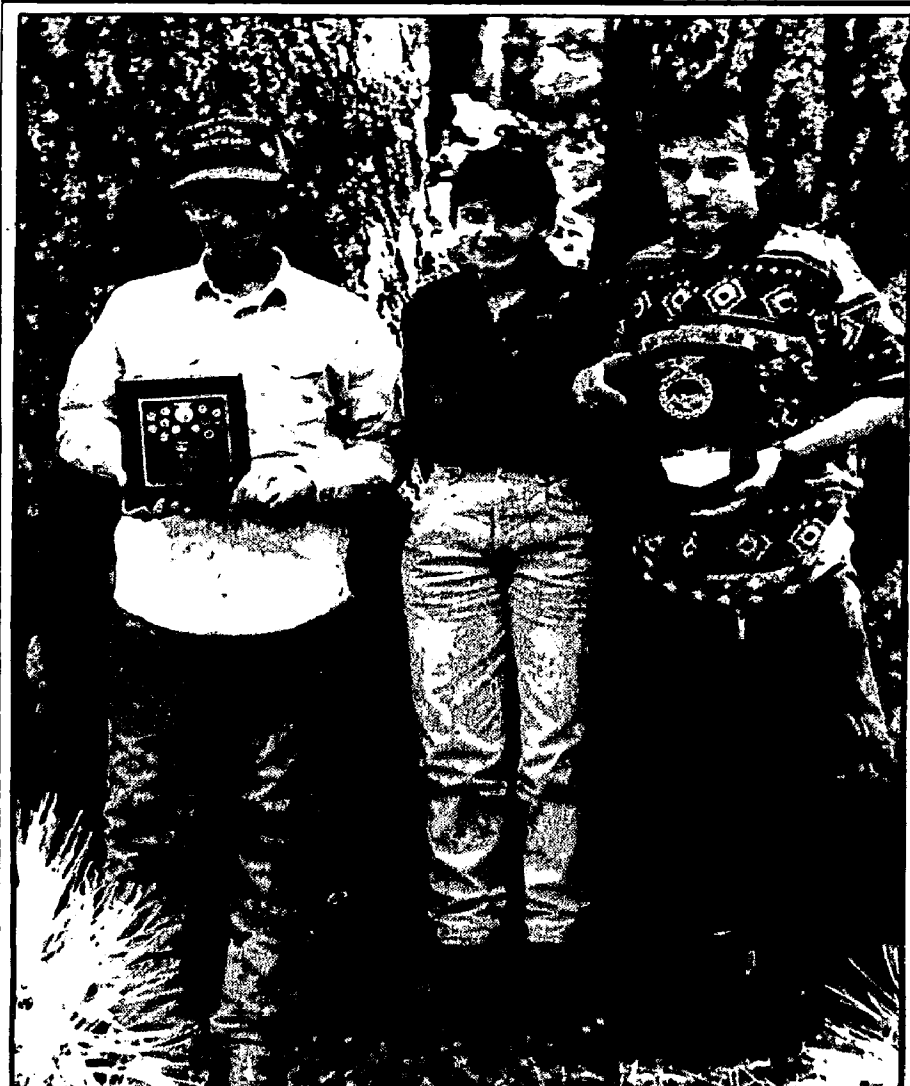
responsible for garbage collection and disposal in most of the county.

At the 10 a.m. authority meeting today, Lewandowski will report to board members that the authority will begin providing service to Carrizozo Aug. 1. The board meets in the recycling center on Second Street in Ruidoso Downs.

Carts that will be used for door-to-door collection service in the county seat of Carrizozo are scheduled to be delivered July 15. The required dumpsters and roll-off containers already are in stock, Lewandowski wrote in a report to the board. For the authority's 1995-96 budget, \$30,600 should be allotted for the purchase of 600 carts and an additional residential truck, he said.

## Hometown veteran recalls Easter Day battle in Okinawa

Fifty years ago Easter Sunday, Ruidoso Downs resident L.E. Fletcher was manning the guns aboard a naval cruiser anchored off Okinawa's shore.

It was D-day for the U.S. military's Pacific War campaign against Japan, the battle closest to Japan's mainland and the bloodiest encounter of the campaign.

More than 60,000 army and marines went ashore at daybreak that April 1, disembarking from more than 100 American ships ready for battle in the south China Sea. Code name for the landing operation was "Love Day."

Fletcher, an 18-year-old marine who had already engaged in seven sea battles since joining the U.S.S. Minneapolis's crew in November 1943, worked as a captain's orderly and a gunner. He loaded the two to three-foot-long shells into the five-inch batteries that blasted the island's shore.

Fletcher relates his war experience from his book-filled Agua Fria home, which he shares with his high school sweetheart. In his telling, which comes through a characteristic gentle voice, his deep love for the "Minnie" and its crew becomes apparent. So is his pride in being part of a collective effort securing freedom.

"Semper fidelis; Always faithful. That was drilled into you, and the discipline, the esprit de corps — that stays with you," he says. "We were proud to be marines, defending our homeland, defending our country."

The American invasion forces at Okinawa encountered light opposition at first, but over the next two weeks the fighting grew intense.

Land units encountered heavy assaults with the Japanese defenses, who were secretly entrenched in natural and artificial caves throughout the mountainous island.

Meanwhile the naval units, which served as airfields and had to remain off Okinawa as long as necessary to shield the land forces, endured waves of attacks from kamikaze pilots.

The suicide planes, screaming down into ship hulls with vengeance, set off devastating explosions with their cargo of bombs.

The kamikazes damaged more than 300 ships and sank 30 during the three-month war, successfully jarring the nerves of many on

board.

"I thought they had to be drunk or doped or something to do what they were doing," Fletcher recalls. "It was just kind of unbelievable that they'd do that. We were surprised and shocked — it was a new kind of warfare."

His first encounter with the kamikazes was in the battle of Leyte Gulf, in the Philippine Sea. The battle is remembered as the most intense and largest sea battle in naval war history.

During that battle, the cornered American ships bombarded the Japanese fleet in a counter-offensive that lasted four days. Fletcher's cruiser, which held a mere six working guns and four spotter planes, assisted in the sinking of a formidable Japanese battleship, the Yamashiro.

Fletcher was honored for his part in the October 23-26 battle just this January when receiving the Philippine Liberation medal and the Philippine Republic Presidential citation.

It was this battle, he relates, which intensely pierced his war memories. Leyte Gulf was where the Japanese first unleashed their secret weapon — the kamikazes — which were piloted by 16 and 17-year-old Japanese boys still in aviation school.

"Sometimes I'd think of those boys in the planes," he said. "They were just kids given some sake and psyched up by the idea of dying for their emperor."

"As the planes came down you could see the pilots in there as clear as anything, red ceremonial sash and all," he recalls.

The kamikazes — meaning "divine wind" — contained only enough fuel for the one-way trip into the naval fleets. Their most concentrated effort was at Okinawa, where they inflicted thousands of casualties on the floating American forces.

During the three-month battle, Fletcher recalls more than 4,000 of the suicide planes were shot down by the naval ships and navy-marine fliers.

Not until June 21 did the organized resistance on Okinawa end. The fighting claimed the lives of approximately 7,000 U.S. soldiers and marines; approximately 5,000 sailors died and more than 5,000 more were wounded.

History books note more than 70,000 Japanese fighters died on

the island, located 350 miles south of Japan. At least 80,000 Okinawans perished, and most were civilians.

The losses far exceeded any previous U.S. naval campaign.

"I never got scared until I got to Okinawa," Fletcher says. "The fear on those ships was fire. When those kamikazes hit, they'd just burn people to a crisp. I felt I'd make it in the water, but I had a fear of being burned."

A couple of men on the ship suffered nervous breakdowns; one or two committed suicide. Little rest and an unending surge of adrenaline caused a couple more to die from fatigue.

But the "Lucky Minnie" never suffered one casualty and only suffered minor damage from a kamikaze, after it blew a hole in the ship's side.

The cruiser on which Fletcher sailed more than 100,000 miles was deemed lucky because it was the only ship in naval war history to be

sunk (after its bow was struck by two torpedoes when near the Solomon Islands in 1942), bandaged with coconut logs and then refloated by its own men, Fletcher recalls.

"I just love that ship," Fletcher says. "Apart from the war, I loved being on that vessel and loved the

men on it. There's something about the sea that gets into your blood, and the steady rock to and fro."

Fletcher first arrived in New Mexico at the age of five, after his father moved the family from Okla-homa with a mere \$12 in his pocket. Fletcher grew up in the high desert of Carlsbad.

"We were real Grapes of Wrath people," he said. "So many people didn't have any work. So when the war broke out, I went into the military."

The opportunity to serve as part of the marine detachment unit at sea appeared exotic; the camaraderie he found on board was gratifying.

"None of us feel that, individual-ly, we accomplished a single big thing," he says. "But as a unit, we feel we did a good job."

Because of its fortitude, the Min-nie's 1,000-man crew was kept at sea for 20 months, enjoying a mere

48 hours off on land.

The battle for Okinawa, which proved to be the largest amphibious operation in war history, was the last of the 1,426-day Pacific War. It was also the last combat Fletcher would see, as his ship retreated April 12. It was the day before President Franklin Roosevelt died and approximately three weeks before V-E Day in Europe.

While he shares his memories, Fletcher remains mindful to the present. He refers to what he sees as a bad chronicle supplanting meaningful history for many youths — the craze for celebrities and sensational murder trials — and says it is imperative kids learn about how the nation got to where it is today.

"I'm concerned about where our country is headed," he sighs. "On the anniversary of the Battle of Okinawa, practically no mention of it was made on national television, yet hours and hours of coverage

were devoted to a California murder trial."

Fletcher's last war mission was in Korea, where he was the member of the honor guard. They secured a formal surrender of the Japanese in Korea on Sept. 9, about a month after the Americans bombed Hiroshima and Nagasaki and finally accepted terms for surrender August 15.

Fletcher returned home to the states that October, eventually setting off on a career as an independent building contractor and raising three children. One of his daughters, inspired by Fletcher's war experience and some of the characters he traveled the Pacific Ocean with, is writing a collective history of the Minnie.

"Young people should be more knowledgeable about how we got to where we are now," he concludes. "I think they'd appreciate our sacrifices more if they knew about them."

## Paving slows cars by post office

## Solid waste manager submits resignation

After two successful years at the helm of the Lincoln County Solid Waste Authority, Joe Lewandowski has submitted his resignation as manager.

The authority board will consider action on his resignation today during the 10 a.m. regular monthly meeting at the recycling center in Ruidoso Downs.

Lewandowski said Friday he would stay for a while in the capacity of consultant or part-time manager, if the board wanted the help.

He needs to spend more time on the private garbage collection business he operates in Otero County and in consulting work across the state, he said.

"I've enjoyed being with the authority, but I have a lot of out-

side enterprises and need to get back to that; consulting jobs all over the state," Lewandowski said. "The board had given me some latitude on that (last year when he came close to resigning), but I believe it's grown to the point that the consulting would begin to interfere with my job as manager."

"The authority is the best example of how government entities should and can work together to solve a problem without breaking the taxpayers. All of you should be very proud of what you have built here. You are three years ahead of everyone else in the state."

He proposed phasing out his involvement with the authority, working full time to May 1, then three days a week from May 1-15; and cutting back to two days a week May 16-June 15.

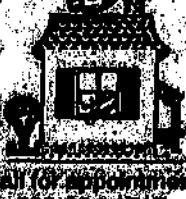

# Funds for BLM plan vetoed

After failing to convince the Bureau of Land Management to extend its comment period on a proposed Southeast New Mexico management plan, U.S. Sen. Pete Domenici has found a different way to delay the plan.

The Senate Appropriations Committee voted for a moratorium on funding for the plan. Domenici serves on the committee. The plan covers BLM lands in the counties of Lincoln, Chaves, Eddy, Lea, Curry, Roosevelt, Quay, DeBaca and

Guadalupe.

The House of Representatives accepted the same request by U.S. Rep. Joe Skeen (R-New Mexico) and put a moratorium on funding.

The funding was removed as part of the 1995 disaster Supplemental Appropriations and Rescissions Bill, which cuts \$13.3 billion in 1995 appropriated funds to provide \$8.7 billion in federal disaster aid. The bill now goes to the full Senate.

"I am hopeful that this time will

be used wisely by the BLM to re-evaluate this plan and resolve issues that make it more acceptable to the residents and businesses of the area," Domenici said.

On Feb. 14, the senator wrote a letter to the BLM asking for the March 1 public comment deadline to be extended on the plan. The agency declined to grant that request, although it did allow supplemental comments by those who had submitted initial comments by the March 1 date.

## POOP SCOOP

Warm weather brings more people outside and more close encounters with stray and neighborhood dogs.

From November through February, no bites were reported in the Ruidoso area, but in March, five dogs were impounded because of biting incidents.

"Most animals seem friendly and harmless, yet every year in the United States, animals bite more than a million people," said Jim Higgins, manager of the Lincoln County Humane Society animal shelter. About 10,000 are serious injuries and about 100 people die.

"Most biting incidents involve dogs, but any animal can be dangerous. Most bites occur either at work or during recreational activity."

Riggins suggested several ways

to protect against bites. They are:

- knowing the signs of aggressive behavior in animals;
- avoiding or preventing the attack;
- defending if attacked.

"In dogs, obvious behavior such as snarling, snapping, bared teeth or curled lips are easy to spot, however, some signs are more contradictory," Riggins said. "A dog who stares straight ahead and appears not to see you is as dangerous as a dog who appears submissive and scared with its tail tucked.

"Similarly, a dog standing rigidly with ears erect and wagging its tail rapidly is also demonstrating aggressive behavior. Most cat bites occur as the animal is attempting to escape when startled or when its temperament is miscalculated."

Riggins also advised not to enter yards or homes until pets have been restrained.

"No one likes to be impolite, but it's wise to not always trust an assurance of safety from an owner," he said. "Few people know they own a biting dog until it is too late."

It's smart to call ahead to warn a pet owner you're going to stop by. When visiting for the first time, check for signs of pets such as feeding dishes or dog houses. Keep away from parked vehicles. Never surprise or startle an animal.

If an animal becomes aggressive, do not turn and run. Look for something to put between yourself and the animal, even circling a car or power pole. Stall the attack. In most cases, the animal will lose interest very quickly, Riggins said.

If no shield is available, use your forearm to keep the animal from vital areas. Though painful, this could end the attack with a single bite or allow you to kick or shove the animal away.



## Records fall at track invitational

Gusting winds and a pair of solid Lovington track teams blew away the competition at the Ruidoso Invitational.

The Wildcats boys team defeated second-place Ruidoso by 45 points, and their girls team was 36 points better than runner-up Artesia.

However, it was a good Friday for several Warrior performers, including David Hufstetler and Kyle Humphreys, who both broke school records. And as a whole, Ruidoso coach Ronny Maskew was encouraged by his team's overall performance.

"I thought the boys made a tremendous amount of improvement," Maskew said. "The relays made a lot of improvement. We still have to come a little bit in the field events."

Maskew said the girls team has improved in the last couple weeks too.

"We've had some bad things happen - missing the handoff on the relay and a girl falling in the hurdles - but other than that they made a tremendous amount of improvement," Maskew said. "We think their effort is improving a great deal from week to week."

Hufstetler eclipsed Rusty Shelton's 1988 mark of 40.2 in the 300-meter intermediate hurdles. Hufstetler ran a 40.09 Friday and won the event. He also took the

110-meter high hurdles for the sweep.

Hufstetler, a senior, attributes his success this weekend to experience.

"It's a matter of five years of running and just really wanting it this year," Hufstetler said. "We've all had to improve and we've all been working pretty hard. We have an excellent chance of winning the district meet. It's just been a combination of everyone working hard, and we've still got a ways to improve."

Hufstetler said he's been chasing Shelton's record ever since he started running for the Warriors, and he's already aiming for Eric Evans' record in the 110-meter hurdles. The Ruidoso senior thinks he can set that record too.

"That race was kind of sloppy (Friday)," Hufstetler said. "I've got some stuff I can still work on. I've got a lot of arm work I can work on."

Hufstetler qualified for the state meet last year in the 300-meter hurdles. He admits that he was "blown away" by competition, yet that has served to motivate the Warrior hurdler.

"I know what to expect this year," Hufstetler said.

Humphreys broke his own long jump record set last year with a leap of 22-2 1/4 - that bettered his previous mark by two inches.

Maskew said the Warriors are

slowed in the field events by injuries to John Echols in the pole vault and Earl Holstein in the javelin, high jump and pole vaults.

"Both of them have cleared higher than what the winning height was today (in the pole vault)," Maskew said. Both Echols and Holstein might compete this coming weekend at Artesia.

The girls team's Bridget Tam continues to run well, Maskew said, but the standout freshman wasn't feeling well Friday. She took third in the 1600-meter run (8:10.17), but came back to easily win the 3200-meter run (13:07.49).

The Warriors posted strong showings in the field events. Melissa Miller won the high jump competition, clearing 4-8. Angelica Figueroa took the discus with a throw of 116-8 1/2. Monique Ramos was third (99-8 3/4) in the discus and sixth in the shot put (29-8).

Up next for Ruidoso are two state qualifying meets and the district meet. Competitors can qualify for the state meet if they meet certain time, distance or height standards at the state qualifying meets.

Their last chance to make the state meet is at the district meet. If competitors finish first or second at the district meet, they also qualify for the state meet.

"It takes a lot of pressure off you if you can qualify at this first one," Maskew said. The Warriors com-

pete at their first state qualifying meet hosted by Artesia Friday, April 21.

But coach Dave Anderson's teams bounced back against Santa Teresa the next day, and defeated the Desert Warriors in Ruidoso's first home match of the season.

Ruidoso's girls beat Santa Teresa, 6-3, while the boys edged their counterparts, 6-4. Overall, the girls are 2-2 and the boys are 1-3.

The Warriors will have a chance to redeem themselves when they play Lovington again Tuesday.

Anderson's girls team was coming off a victory over Santa Teresa when they met Lovington the first time.

"We were overconfident," Anderson admitted. Anderson hopes history won't repeat itself.

Against the Desert Warriors, Ruidoso senior Audra Allison lost a tough three-set match to Alexis Mulhauser, 3-6, 7-6, 4-8. But Ruidoso's eighth-graders responded to the challenge of playing varsity tennis and accounted for one of the Warriors' wins.

"A lot of the eighth-graders shined," Anderson said.

The boys team took advantage of a short-handed Desert Warrior team. Santa Teresa won the four contested matches, but had to default the remaining five matches.

Anderson and the Warriors have reset their sights on Lovington.

"We're going to target Lovington," Anderson said. "We should have played them better than we did."

Ruidoso has a busy week: After playing the Wildcats Tuesday, the Warriors travel to Artesia Thursday. The week ends Saturday when Ruidoso hosts Portales.

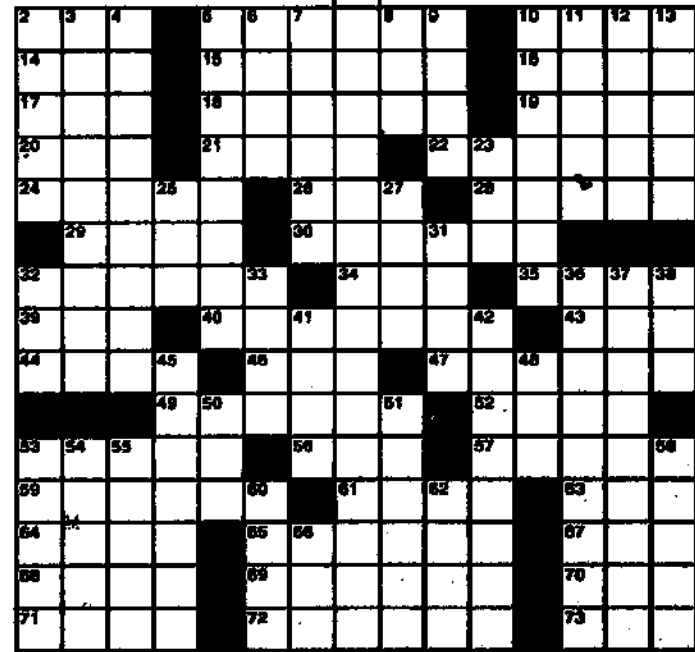

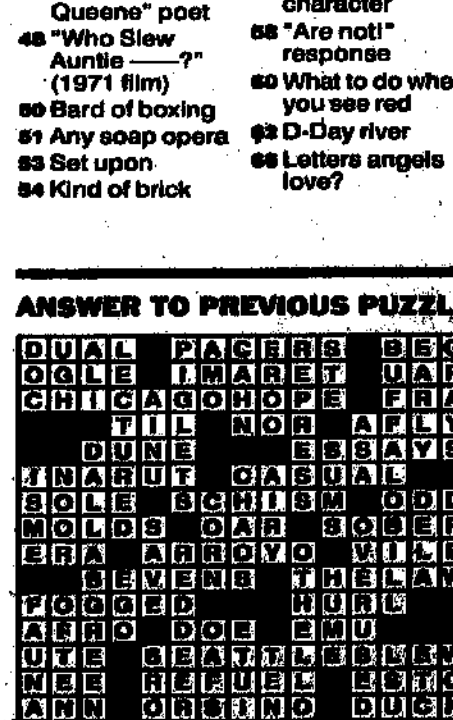

# Grant will help pay for new downtown parking signs

Bright new signs will direct downtown motorists to three municipal parking areas with the help of a \$2,500 state grant.

The Ruidoso Village Council accepted the New Mexico MainStreet Program grant, and matched it with \$2,500 from village funds, at its Tuesday meeting.

The match assures that all 16 directional signs will be purchased. Councilors praised the new wooden signs' design, crafted by Candyce Garrett. They are painted turquoise, yellow and red.

"These will really give a finishing touch to the downtown," Mayor Jerry Shaw said.

The current directional signs have been easy for motorists to

overlook, Village Manager Gary Jackson noted, leaving the municipal lots underused.

"Those little green peas are hard to see," he said.

Also at the meeting, councilors:

— received an update on Lincoln County Cablevision from Paul Crown. Crown said the recent 7% rate increase of \$1.50 was the first in 19 months and presented a company profit of 75 cents. The rest of the monies will be used to pay for new channels added to the system. Four new channels are part of the basic package — H&G, Sci-Fi channel, f/x and Nickelodeon. New premium pay channels — HBO, Cinemax and Showtime — will be available this week.

— awarded a bid for three police department 4x4 utility vehicles to

Sierra Blanca Motors, at \$20,873 each, and to Bos Sand Company for 150 tons of washed sand for the regional wastewater treatment plant at \$40 per ton.

— received an update from Sandee Jordan on the Retired Senior Volunteer Program, which is applying for a continuing grant of \$26,000 from the state and \$11,229 from the village.

— received an update from Debbie Jo Almager, director of the Park and Rec Department, on a state grant of \$84,000 for work at School House Park. The grant, which the state has approved, will fund work to the parking area, relocation of the pavilion, bathroom work, and playground equipment.

### We welcome improvements at Casino Apache

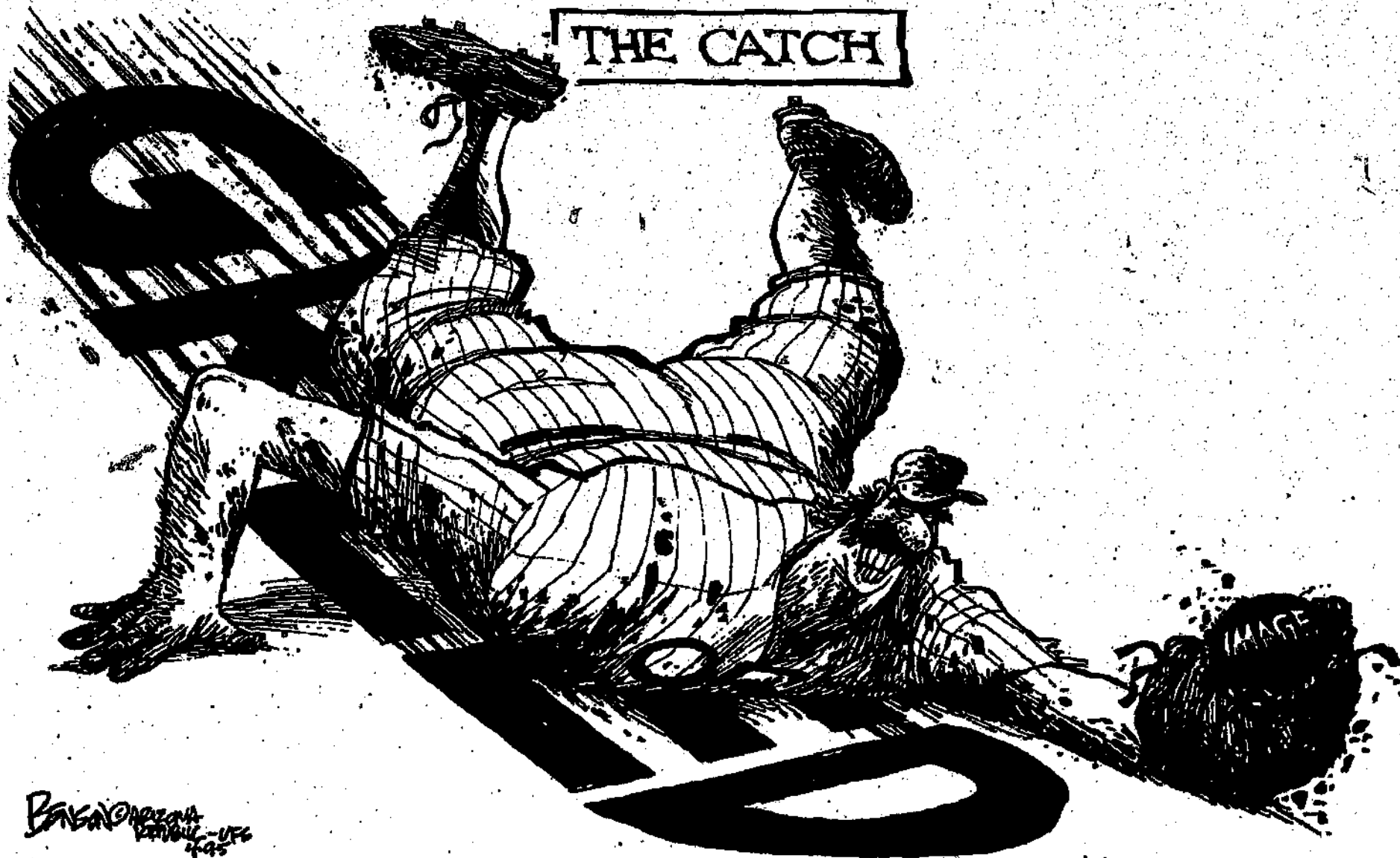

### Thanks to Coach Roland's efforts

TO THE EDITOR:

I would like to share parts of an article found in a family magazine written by David Laakin. It really highlights some very important statements about being a sports parent.

I'll hit the basics of Mr. Laakin's article. First he quotes Michael Pfah, executive director of National Youth Sports Coaches Association. "A lot of parents want their kids to be the athlete they were — or never were. When the child makes a mistake, then we have failed, the family has failed. It's difficult for parents to separate the child's performance in sports from their own identity."

Another quote by Thomas Tutko, Ph.D., professor of psychology at San Jose State University. "Parents don't plan to be malicious or overbearing. They don't do this intentionally. But what happens is that they get caught up in the hoopla, and they begin to apply professional standards with their kids. We cease to see where kids are coming from. When parents care exclusively about winning, they undermine all the positive things that kids get out of their games. The game becomes our contest — and our children end up feeling pressured, bruised, scared and embarrassed. Parental pressure is only one of the problems."

In putting the fun back on youth sports as a parent you do have some influence. At the very least you can help foster the right atmosphere, going with a positive attitude.

Take the pressure off your child. Try to put yourself in your child's sneakers. Remember that your child is out there to have fun.

Watch what you say. No matter how your child played, try to find something to praise. Praise costs nothing, so why not spread it around to the opposing team as well when they make out a good play? When you applaud when a kid strikes out or misses a basket, swear at the umpire or referee or second-guess the coach, remember that your own child is listening. She had plans to work with all age children.

But we refused to welcome someone like that here. She has way over 25 years of experience behind her. She's been where lots of us never have been and never will be, when it comes to basketball.

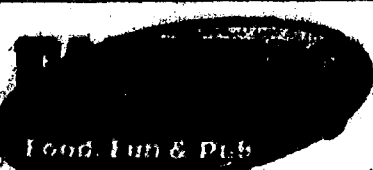

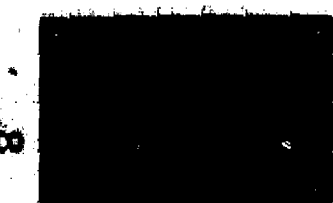

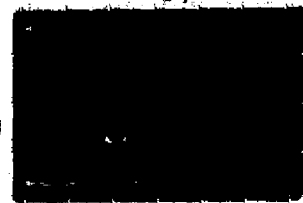

## The Nobel Legacy

### Travels from Cambridge, England, to Carlsbad, New Mexico

Although the last 100 years have been a time of intense scientific discovery, most people still don't know much about science. New insights into genetics and atomic physics continue to surface — yet few scientists are able to explain to the layperson what these discoveries mean or how they affect society. The Nobel Legacy, a three-part series, looks squarely at science and its impact on the human condition. The programs take viewers around the world on a visually rich tour of critical scientific developments using metaphors from art, music, and literature.

The hosts of The Nobel Legacy are Dr. J. Michael Bishop, 1989 Nobel laureate in medicine/physiology, who discovered the cellular basis of cancer; Dr. Leon Lederman, 1988 Nobel laureate in physics, who unveiled a sub-atomic particle; and Dr. Dudley Herschbach, 1986 Nobel winner in chemistry, who used molecular beams to study chemical reactions. Dr. Anne Carson, a poet, essayist, and classic scholar, brings humanist sensibility to each program.

"How Do You Feel, Mr. Jacobs?" the medicine program, filmed in Venice, Florence, and Cambridge, England, sets the promise of genetics and medical technology against the question, "Why does medicine have to lose the person to cure the body?" The program tells of 16th-century anatomist Andreas Vesalius, whose book, *The Composition of the Human Body*, revolutionized medicine; Mary Shelley's dream of Frankenstein as it embodies the ancient myth of forbidden knowledge; and the genetic revolution's Nobel laureates James Watson and Francis Crick, who likely began their probe of the architecture of DNA over sausages and beer at Cambridge's Eagle Pub.

"Why Bother?" the physics program, filmed in Hawaii, Death Valley, and Denmark, tackles the possibility of complete understanding of the universe. While physicists race headlong toward this goal, humanists wonder whether physics is "the only truth." The program uses sophisticated animation and striking photography to examine particle physics and tell the story of Werner Heisenberg, the 1933 Nobel winner whose work dramatically altered how atomic physics is viewed.

"Stop Forward Movement?" the chemistry program, takes viewers to Paris, Sweden; Cambridge, Massachusetts; and New Mexico's subterranean cathedral of limestone, the Carlsbad Caverns, to examine the power of chemical synthesis through metaphors in art and architecture.

The Nobel Legacy airs Saturdays at 10:00 p.m. beginning April 22nd on KENW-TV. The series repeats Sundays at 3:00 p.m.
