Dry weather sparks fire ban.

A fire and smoking restriction order went into effect on the Lincoln National Forest Friday.

The Bureau of Land Management, Bureau of Indian Affairs, and the National Park Service also have fire restrictions in place, said Dan Krutina, Lincoln National Forest fire management officer.

Dry conditions coupled with winds have kept timber from recovering from recent droughts.

The following acts are prohibited until further notice.

(1) Building, maintaining, attending or using a grill, campfire, charcoal broiler, fire, or coal or woodstove, except in forest developed camp and picnic grounds.

Petroleum fueled stoves and lanterns or heating devices are not considered fires.

(2) Smoking, except within an enclosed vehicle or building, a developed recreation site, or while stopped in an area at least three feet in diameter that is barren or cleared of all flammable material.

Violation of these prohibitions is punishable by a fine of not more than \$500 or imprisonment for not more than six months or both.

Utility mum on nuclear storage list

The deadline was Friday, but officials with Northern States Utilities in Minnesota aren't talking about the number of other utilities that signed up for the Mescalero spent fuel rod storage project.

A company spokesman Monday said information would be released later in the week.

The deadline has been extended twice, but company officials insisted it was not because they failed to get commitments from enough of the 33 utilities originally interested in the project. Northern and the Mescalero Apache propose to temporarily store up to 40,000 metric tons of nuclear waste at the northwestern corner of the reservation.

Local Memorial Day service set for Saturday at Ft. Stanton

Out of the early dawn on June 6, 1944, some 5,000 vessels of different types and sizes appeared heading toward the beaches of Normandy, France. A lonely enemy lookout on shore could not believe his eyes. This was understandable, since the greatest military invasion in history was underway.

It is also understandable that when the lookout's report was passed to the enemy high command, the figure for the number of ships approaching the coast had grown to 10,000. All concerned in the enemy camp were incredulous because, although an invasion was anticipated, the timing and location were unknown. The "D" in D-Day must have stood for "Deception," which was a vital factor in many of the successful invasions of World War II.

Many people recently saw many film shots of the great D-Day invasion, giving them an idea of the vast expanse of this operation and the horrendous noise and turmoil of 250,000 troops fighting to get ashore and secure the beaches, while about 1,200 battleships off-shore lobbed shells over the troops to soften up the defenses of the coast.

For any such invasion to succeed, there were dangerous behind-the-scenes tasks to be performed. On the afternoon before June 6, General Dwight D. Eisenhower, commander of Allied Forces, was seen shaking hands and seeing off the members of the 82nd and 101st Airborne troops. These paratroopers were to land behind enemy lines in the dead of night to create chaos, havoc and destruction. They were successful, but as General Eisenhower turned away, tears were seen on his face because it had been estimated there would be 75% casualties among these 18,000 troops. Fortunately, there

were many less casualties.

Probably the most famous photo of the war in the Pacific was of the U.S. Marines raising Old Glory on Mount Suribachi, Iwo Jima. Again, this great scene was only possible after many heavy losses of life on the series of island-hopping invasions from Pearl Harbor enroute to Tokyo.

In all this activity, one must not forget the Veteran Marines of the Merchant Marine, The Silent Service. Although they were exposed to the ravages of war, they went about their job of carrying our troops and the materials of war to the various battle zones around the world.

In order to remember the exploits of our veterans and pay them due respect, and also remember the families who lost loved ones in various wars, a special combined Merchant Marine and Military Memorial Service is being held at 10:30 a.m. Saturday, May 27 at Fort Stanton's cemetery. The ser-

vise will last about an hour.

In order to lend official substance to this occasion, a precedent setting proclamation has been issued by all the mayors and councilors of Lincoln County.

There will be an American Flag on each of the 1,612 veteran Graves. In addition, there will be 18 foreign flags displayed on the graves of expatriates of other countries laid to rest in this cemetery.

All veterans, families and the public are cordially invited to attend.

The cemetery is located on the new State Highway 220, which used to be number 214. It now runs from State Highway 380 south past Fort Stanton, where the cemetery is about a half mile south east of the fort. The highway then goes past the Sierra Blanca Regional Airport to State Highway 48, which runs north and south between Capitan and Ruidoso.

History of Merchant Marines at Ft. Stanton

In May 1859, Fort Stanton was established by an act of Congress to protect the country against attacks of the Mescalero Apache Indians.

When driving away from the fort, to the east, along a narrow dirt country road in the foothills of the Capitan Mountains, one comes upon an unusual cemetery. It is different from the usual country burial site; it gives the appearance of a military cemetery, with row upon row of little white crosses. At the center

of the approximately 10-acre field is a tall white monument with the inscription, "In Memory of the Men and Women of the American Merchant Marine!"

After a survey of the Southwestern United States, in 1899, the fort was set aside by presidential executive order. The first U.S. Public Health Service Hospital of its kind was established for merchant seamen suffering from tuberculosis. The location was chosen for its dry, healthful

Most of Ruidoso council supports August election

Most Ruidoso councilors say they support an August vote on \$6.55 million worth of capital projects.

Proposed projects include \$1 million for new soccer fields, a baseball diamond and jogging track; \$350,000 for the expansion of city hall (officials say some employees work in the attic); \$1.6 million for a new library complex and an expanded, remodeled senior center; and \$100,000 for storage at the Civic Events Center.

The village also may sell general obligation revenue bonds for \$1.5 million in wastewater line repairs, \$1.2 million for water line upgrades and \$800,000 to expand tank capacity of the Grindstone Treatment Plant from one million gallons a day to two million. Village Manager Gary Jackson said general obligation revenue bonds don't count against bonding capacity.

Bonding considerations were reviewed at a village council budget workshop May 11 and 12, and will be discussed at a 6:30 p.m. public hearing tomorrow at city hall.

With a vital need for major infrastructure improvements and the imminent payoff of past debt, no time could be better for new bond debt, Jackson said.

The village's current \$1.15 million in bonded debt will retire in June of 1997, and with it a tax of 9.619 mills. If new bonds are issued by next winter, the village's rate of tax would stay constant.

The entire \$17.5 million Village of Ruidoso budget package for 1995-96, including the bonding issues, will have a final council vote at a May 30 meeting.

Councilors are considering writing a resolution in early June and scheduling a public election in August on the new projects. The bonds would be issued between 1997 and 1998.

Councilors who expressed favor towards the proposal said they did not want taxes to go up, so using

the taxes residents are already paying is a palatable way of getting projects initiated.

"The main selling point is that we're not raising taxes," said Mayor Jerry Shaw after the workshop. "We have so many infrastructure needs and this is an opportunity to use our bonding capacity to do the things we have to get done."

Her sentiments are shared by the majority of her fellow councilors. J.D. James said he is still considering the proposal and was not ready to discuss it.

Ruidosoans have already issued strong support for new soccer fields, Shaw said.

"They've said they'd like to see something for our kids," Shaw said. "I wish we could do the whole thing (build the estimated \$12 million recreational complex), but we can't."

Councilor Frank Potter noted that while the village is in need of the proposed projects, "any kind of property tax increase will have to be put to vote by the public."

And there could be no better way, commented Councilor Robert Donaldson.

"The people get to choose the ones they want, all, some or none," Donaldson said.

Donaldson warned, however, that if water and sewer repairs are voted down, "We could be looking at some real tough times." Without bonding, user rates may rise, he said.

Councilor Joe Gomez said he would not be in favor of raising any taxes, "but based on the way it was presented, we will not be raising any taxes; we'll be using the taxes we're paying now to continue use of our bonding capacity."

Frank Cummings could not be reached for comment.

Keeping a consistent debt rate is a practice of several school districts in the state, Jackson added.

The village's total debt capacity (based on 4% of the village's assessed property valuation) is \$6.3 million.

County resident fees up for debate

Village of Ruidoso councilors plan to grapple with fee schedules for Lincoln County residents who live outside town, following tomorrow's public hearing on the village's proposed 1995-96 budget of \$17.5 million.

Before tinkering with fees, however, a local county commissioner will discuss county and village government relations with the councilors.

Commissioner Wilton Howell asked Wednesday for the discussion to be placed on tomorrow night's council agenda. The special meeting is at 6:30 p.m. at city hall.

"I'd like to talk about what kind of role they think the county should

play in their government and vice versa," Commissioner Howell, a Ruidoso resident, said Friday.

Howell declined to elaborate except to say, "I'd like to see more municipalities and government entities down scale their ambitions and leave more money at home in the taxpayer's pocket."

Howell's meeting request follows the council's May 19 decision to consider fee increases for non-Ruidoso, Lincoln County residents utilizing village services.

Popular services and facilities offered without county subsidy include the Ruidoso Public Library and pool. Village police and firefighters respond to county emergencies. And the Regional

Wastewater Treatment Plant, which is jointly funded by Ruidoso and Ruidoso Downs, receives a significant amount of septic sewage from other county areas.

The animal shelter in Ruidoso receives animals from the county and was a point of discussion at the May 18 and 19 village budget workshops. The county did approve \$6,500 in funding for the shelter when commissioners voted on the final county budget last Monday.

During earlier reviews of proposed department budgets, Ruidoso councilors voiced a string of objections to the lack of county contributions. The budget does meet the needs of residents, Village Manager Gary Jackson said, but it is a tight one. Meanwhile, several of the

funded departments are in need of capital improvements, he added.

Councilors also expressed indignation for the commissioners' rejection of a joint meeting on these issues.

Also at tomorrow's special meeting, councilors will consider approval of two state grants:

— \$80,820 for renovation of the senior center's kitchen facilities;
— and \$26,500 for nutrition services for Ruidoso senior citizens.

Prior to the budget hearing, councilors will hold a 5 p.m. workshop to review municipal codes pertaining to business registration licenses, use of public property, streets, parks, sidewalks and special dispensers permits for alcohol. Officials say some of the codes have duplicated and invalid sections.

Wildfire concerns topic of meeting here Wednesday

Guidelines for a holistic approach to integrating fire and the ecosystem will be the topic of a public discussion at 1:30 p.m. Wednesday in Ruidoso.

The meeting will be held at Smokey Bear Ranger Station on Mechem Drive.

Gene Dowdy of the U.S. Forest Service will incorporate various forest health issues faced by the Ruidoso area during the two-hour discussion. Those issues include

fire, disease, and watershed protection.

Dowdy will also present strategies for addressing fire and ecosystem concerns.

The village government has been invited to the seminar, says Bill Duemling of the state forestry, and local Realtors are encouraged to attend. Representatives of the state forestry and the Natural Resource Conservation Service are expected to attend. The public is welcome.

year-round mild climate.

Since that time, particularly during World War II, merchant Mariners of many different countries have been laid to rest in this cemetery, together with members of the various branches of our military forces and the armed services personnel of other countries. Consequently, it is now a veritable league of nations memorial.

One of its distinctive claims to history stems from its service as the first U.S. internment camp of World War II. Before America's entry into the war, the German luxury liner Columbus was shelled by the British off Cuba in December, 1939. Rather than have the ship taken by the British, the vessel was scuttled and it sank. The crew was picked up by Americans and they were confined as guests of the U.S. government for the duration of the war at the new Fort Stanton camp. Four of the crew did

not survive the war and are also buried in the cemetery.

The year 1962 was another key time in the history of Fort Stanton. That year, drugs for the treatment of tuberculosis were developed. They provided such widespread success that within a year, the U.S. government determined it was no longer feasible to keep this facility as a public health sanitarium. In 1963, the property was turned over to the State of New Mexico.

Over the past several years, the memorial and cemetery has been undergoing complete restoration and improvement. This has included removal of vast amounts of brush and weeds, mowing and trimming the entire area, bringing in many loads of dirt to level graves that had settled over the years, and establishment of a garden in the shape of a ship's hull around the 25-foot tall monument and flagpole. About 500 new white crosses have been installed to replace those broken or missing.

All county towns under same group for trash service

The communities of Carrizozo and Corona have accepted a service contract bid award from the Lincoln County Solid Waste Authority.

With the bid award, every community in this county is now under contract with the authority, which is a consortium of local government agencies.

Servicing the two communities will generate \$80,000 in revenues for the authority, said LCSWA manager Joe Lewandowski.

"They'll come on board August 1," Lewandowski said. The bid award was discussed at the LCSWA's May 15 meeting.

The additional revenues will help the authority widen the gap between projected revenues and expenditures for the next fiscal year, Lewandowski added.

Total revenues, including those from Carrizozo and Corona, are

anticipated to be in the \$1.68 million range, he said, while expenditures may be as high as \$1.6 million.

"It's tight," Lewandowski commented. "We're looking to where we can cut a little and bring in more revenues."

The budget will be reviewed in more detail at the authority's meeting today. Final adoption of the budget is scheduled for June 19.

Also at the meeting, the authority discussed an appraisal performed by the Pete Thompson Land Company on a building it has been using as a headquarters for more than two years. The authority had been leasing it with an option to buy.

The property has been appraised at \$135,000, Lewandowski said, and can be purchased by the LCSWA for \$77,800.

Mescalero hospital receives high rating

The Mescalero Public Health Service Indian Hospital has received high marks from the Joint Commission of Accreditation of Health Care Organizations (JCAHO), the most common accreditation agency in the country.

The staff of 64 was recommended for full accreditation by the agency.

The hospital was further complimented in a JCAHO written recommendation that the hospital become a model resource for other small rural hospitals, said Joe Wahnee Jr., the hospital director.

The agency requested numerous copies of the hospital's policies and procedures to use as positive examples for other hospitals across the country, Wahnee said.

The hospital was also cited for outstanding performance in improving the quality of patient care and maintaining continuous care for patients, he said.

"I'm really proud of the hospital

staff for doing such an outstanding job," Wahnee said, attributing the accreditation success to their "active involvement in improving the care of our patients."

"They really deserve the recognition," he said.

The 25-year-old hospital, staffed by Indian Health Service employees, has five doctors and 13 beds for inpatients, Wahnee said.

The JCAHO is a nation wide organization which reviews the organization, functioning and quality of hospitals across the country, Wahnee said. Hospitals are required to undergo an intensive survey every three years to maintain certification by JCAHO.

The accreditation enables hospitals to continue to collect Medicare, Medicaid and private insurance funding, Wahnee said.

More than 200 standards, each receiving a score for compliance, are graded in the survey.

Fire dept. loan fund may start

An eighth of one mill of property tax may be dedicated to buying equipment for Lincoln County's volunteer fire departments.

County Manager Carolin Cooney wants to create a revolving fund for fire departments to purchase fire equipment or buy insurance. The county would charge a low rate of interest or no interest while the money is being repaid. Property taxes would not rise.

The one-eighth of a mill would generate \$36,500 this year.

Chairman Monroy Montes said the idea sounded good, because the departments have requested equipment several times but the county didn't have the money.

The only commissioner who expressed opposition was Stirling Spencer, who said he would prefer designating the additional millage to the road department.





White Oaks Eagle May 21, 1903

Tuesday at 10 a.m. the preliminary trial of the case of Bruce Jones for the killing of Ernest Sowell on the 7th was opened in Justice O'Reilly's court, Col. W.H.H. Llewellyn representing the defendant. Bruce Jones stated before the coroner's jury that he and Ennis Hilburn were preparing to close up the saloon for the night at about 4 o'clock when someone

knocked at the back door, Hilburn going to the door and on opening it a man presented himself with a gun. Hilburn turned to Jones and said, "Look out, Bruce, here is a man with a gun." Jones had a sack of money in one hand and a six-shooter in the other and as Hilburn shut the door Jones fired. The prosecution produced testimony showing that four of Sowell's friends were with him about an hour before the killing and had searched him and found no gun and he (Sowell) was very drunk. These two bits of testimony were the most important brought out during the trial.

Full Connection finished the five-furlong trial in 1:00 2/5, the fastest of the three divisions for the \$63,000 Kindergarten Futurity which will be run Monday, May 29.

Fincher also won the first division of the Futurity aboard Id's Fizz. Id's Fizz, who is owned by R. A. Canning of Ruidoso, was clocked a fifth of a second slower than Full Connection.

Easy Street won the second division under Kenny Roller in 1:01 2/5.

In all, nine racehorses have qualified for the Rio Grande Kindergarten Futurity. A shake in the racing office at 8 a.m. Saturday will determine the 10th spot in the finals among Kelli Reed, Chokum Dan and Wampuscat.

Another shake will determine the third and fourth also eligibles. Vying for those spots are Five R Firststen, Dixie's Drone, and Creative Native.

The Rio Grande Kindergarten will pay a purse of more than

\$63,000. The winner will receive \$31,702.95.

Longshot scores stunning win in Fine Loom

Diablos Fortune may have disappointed his connections in the past, but he made amends in a dramatic way with a front-running upset in Sunday's \$10,000 Guaranteed Fine Loom Handicap at Ruidoso Downs.

At odds of 46-1, Diablos Fortune was the longest shot in the field of eight quarter horses and Thoroughbreds in the Fine Loom Handicap. But the 6-year-old ignored the tote board, and after taking the lead out of the gate hung on through the 870-yard sprint to hold off Stamen by a half length.

A New Mexico-bred son of Six Fortune, Diablos Fortune was clocked in 46.55, and returned the meeting's highest \$2 winning mutuals with payoffs of \$87.80, \$34.00 and \$10.80.

Runner-up Stamen was a neck in front of Tollaginn. Favored Streakin Victory was fifth, breaking his two-race win streak.

Jockey Martin Valdez rode the winner for trainer Rafael Valdez and owner Umberto Belloc, a farmer from Deming.

Belloc, who is a vegetable producer with farms in Arizona, New Mexico and Colorado, began racing horses three years ago. He admitted that he considered selling his crop of so-so performers.

"This horse wasn't running too well at Sunland Park," Belloc said. "Someone offered to buy him from me for \$650, but I turned him down. I sold some of my horses, but kept this one and Twelve O Six, another quarter horse that won his first race for us here on Friday."

Both Diablos Fortune and Twelve O Six started from the No. 4 post position.

"I think that must be our lucky number," said jockey Martin Valdez, who piloted both winners.

Diablos Fortune had gone winless in nine starts since taking an allowance race at Ruidoso Downs last August. Sunday's upset in the Fine Loom Handicap gave the veteran performer his ninth career victory.







There seems to be a growing sentiment around the country to enact harsher punishments against juveniles who break the law. The movement includes a push to publicize the juveniles' names.


A majority of states now allow police departments to release the names of juveniles charged with crimes. New Mexico is among them.

This newspaper has a policy of withholding the names of juveniles charged with crimes in most cases. Exceptions include particularly serious crimes such as murder, and crimes committed with deadly weapons.

Some argue that it is best to withhold names, so juveniles can have a chance to be rehabilitated and return to society without a stigma against their names.

Others argue that citizens have a right to know the juveniles' names, especially if they want to be able to protect themselves against a particular juvenile when released. Some also see the publishing of names as a deterrent.

Because of man's continuous greed for the land, advancement and arrogance of the earth's natural resources, all mankind will soon find that there is no place safe enough to live. The land, water and sky will be so polluted that it will be too late to try to save them, and ourselves.

Every morning and evening, my yard is full of elk coming across the road to graze in the pastures. They come with sundown and leave with sunrise. I stand outside by my fence just to watch them and they know I will not hurt them or chase them away, so they eat with peace. I have raccoons who come in my yard to wash in the watering bins I have for my dogs; skunks and porcupines cross my yard without fear of me. Some ways to stop dwarf mistletoe

TO THE EDITOR:

In this time of dire bad news and disaster, I would like to inject a note of hope against a monstrous parasite infection of our beautiful conifer forests.

The villain is the "Dwarf Mistletoe" which selectively infects Western Pines — principally the Ponderosa. It can be conquered by persistence — and hard work. What follows is the result of a lot of personal research from many resources, and the inevitably required work and experimentation over a six-year period.

The life cycle of the Dwarf Mistletoe plant begins with a seed which dries in the latter half of July (usually) and the first half of August. Blue green in color and about the size of a kitchen match head, it is one of a cluster of hundreds produced by the female plant which had been successfully pollinated in May by the male plant flowers. The seed kernel is surrounded by a sticky gelatin and contained in the outer covering which shrinks as it dries in the summer heat. This produces an internal hydrostatic pressure which propels the kernel about 20 feet (in still air) when the hull finally splits. However, the more likely timing for the take-off is during a hot, dry, high wind. Then the trajectory can carry the new seed as much as 200 feet, with the probable average distance more like 30 to 50 feet. Most seeds, of course, are going to miss their desired marks — branches and twigs of the host trees — however enough are going to hit to spread their infectious onslaught.

The sticky mucilage makes them stay where they land, and they begin sending a tendril through the bark down into the cambium layer (the living layer of the tree) where they will grow and live for the next two years.

In the third year the mistletoe (if it is now healthy enough) puts out foliage and produces either male or female flowers, but not both. If the plant under the bark is not healthy enough, it can remain dormant, but living, for as long as 10 years, before finally producing external foli-

age. The external foliage is an old mustard greenish color and can be spotted fairly well in the brighter, green pines.

The treatment I have found best is to cut off infected twigs and medium branches about a foot from the plant in May after the weather has warmed. On the large branches and trunks, I scrape off the mistletoe very persistently whenever it shows, which usually lasts only about four years.

Heavily infected trees, and those with the grotesque "Witches Brooms," might best be cut down and disposed of.

Caution: Note however that we live in a national forest, and their regulations require permission before cutting any tree over five inches in diameter. In the village of Ruidoso this is controlled by the building inspector.

Though I live in one heavily infected area to the northeast of the old airport (now the village owned Links Golf Course), I am very fortunate that the acre of property is not closely in the wind shadow of one of the infected huge old forest monarchs. Thus I can control re-infection by assiduously examining trees in the area toward the prevailing up-wind section. This constant surveillance has reduced the infection in six years to much less than 1% of the apparently hopeless situation existing when I began. The decrease is apparently about a 90% reduction each year of the prior year's infection.

The local Forest Service office is the main source of my research information. I received three different copies of articles which were very helpful, but did not contain an outline of the complete life cycle of the plant. Further inquiry gained reprints from six of their reference tomes, careful reading and cross referencing of all the available literature, plus outside works, has produced the above condensed information. I must apologize to the Forest Service people for not remembering and thanking the individuals involved, but wish to thank all of them for their great work. The Ruidoso Library also furnished additional information.

A number of questions remain unanswered:

1. What is the lifespan of a single healthy Dwarf Mistletoe (DM)?
2. What is the maximum extension of a plant under the bark of the host tree? (One or two feet?)
3. Is the DM 100% parasitic? (Get all of its food from the host tree?)
4. Does the bilious green color

indicate some chlorophyll?

5. Does a single plant remain one sex, or does it change sex at some time in its lifespan?

6. Being familiar with the partial success of the discontinued herbicide "Floral," and having talked to the chemical giants (Dow, Monsanto, Exxon, etc.), is the Forest Service doing any specific research, or otherwise underwriting a better control of this lecherous parasite?

7. Since I can apparently kill the mistletoe by scraping off the external foliage for three or four years, does this plant require or lose something from outside the bark?

This mustard green parasite plant is not woody at all, and is amazingly tender and brittle. Hence it breaks off easily and can simply be scraped off of trunks and large limbs.

The worst aspect of this parasite is that while it uses the pine's nutrients and weakens the tree, it primarily furnishes an easy entrance to the tree's living cambium layer to the "Western Pine Bark Beetle." This small creature is about the size of a pin head. It bores tunnels under the bark and its galleries (usually) eventually girdling the tree and killing it.

So the scenario is: the mistletoe seldom kills the tree, but weakens it and furnishes easy entrance to the beetle which finishes off the massacre.

P.S. 1. Unusual swellings of small branches typically indicates dormant mistletoe. 2. A pole saw with a rope operated branch clipper and long extensions is all the tooling necessary for normal maintenance — after excessively diseased tree removal. 3. When called, the trash people will grind up and remove brush piles adjacent to paved roads.

POOP SCOOP

An owner whose dog is a problem digger should pinpoint when the digging occurs.

Once that answer has been examined, the cause for the digging usually becomes clear and corrective action may be planned, according to literature from the Mile High Humane Society in Denver.

Some dogs dig from example, the experts contend.

Owners who spend the day gardening often complain that their handiwork has been maliciously destroyed by their pet the minute their backs are turned.

Although deliberate, the pet's digging probably was not done with malice. Corrective action should involve the best remedy - prevention. The dog should be kept out of sight of the gardening: no stimulus, no response.

Digging for freedom from a yard usually is caused by some stimulus beyond a fence or gate. If the stimulus can't be removed, the dog should be kept in another area, preferably inside the house.

Many dogs will dig after gophers or prairie dogs. The correction is to get rid of the rodents. Mouse traps could be

placed in the digging areas. The snapping of the traps frightens the dog and often deters future digging.

Simple boredom is a well-known tension producing agent for dogs.

Experts have found that a program of intensive interaction between dog and owner, such as playing fetch with a ball in the areas of the digging for no longer than 15 minutes daily, often results in correction. Teaching the dog to come, sit, stay and lie down on command in the area also is beneficial in preventing tension buildup because of boredom.

Another cause may be peculiar to northern breeds such as huskies, malamutes and even German shepherds. They dig cooling holes and lie in them. These domestic dogs' ancestors were burrowing, den-living animals. Many species of wild dogs still follow that lifestyle.

Most digging is goal-directed and reflects the target of the dog's frustration. Once the causes are clearly defined by asking when and where, corrective action can start.

Although traditional punishment sometimes is successful, more often its negative effects on the pet/owner relationship makes such steps inadvisable.
