A fire and smoking restriction order went into effect on the coln National Forest Friday.

(2) Smoking, except within an enclosed vehicle or building, a developed recreation site, or while

## Local Memorial Day service set for Saturday at Ft. Stanton

Out of the early dawn on June 6, 944, some 5,000 vessels of dif ferent types and sizes appeared Nortnandy, France. A lonely enemy lookout on shore could not believe his eyes. This was understandable, since the greatest military invasion in history was underway.
It is also understandable that when the lookout's report was command, the figure for the num ber of ships approaching the coast had grown to 10,000 . All concerned in the enemy camp were in credulous because, although an invasion was anticipated, the timing and location were unknown. The D" in D-Day must have stood for Deception, which was a vital facsions of World War II.

Many people recently saw many film shots of the great D-Day inva sion, giving them an idea of the vast expanse of this operation and the horrendous noise and turmoil of 250,000 troops fighting to get ashore and secure the beaches, shore lobbed shells over the troops to soften up the defenses of the coast.

For any such invasion to succeed, there were dangerous behind-the-scenes tasks to be performed. On the afternoon before June 6, General Dwight D. Eisenhower, commander of Allied Forces, was seen shaking hands and seeing off the members of the 82nd and 101 st Airborne troops. These paratroopers were to land behind enemy lines in the dead of night to tion. They were successful, but as General Eisenhower turned away, tears were seen on his face because it had been estimated there would be $75 \%$ casualties among these 18,000 troops. Fortunately, there

## Should names of juveniles charged with crimes be published?

There seems to be a growing sentiment around the country to enact harsher punishments against jubeniles who break the law. The movement includes a push to publicize the juveniles' names.
A majority of states now allow police departments to release the names of juveniles charged with crimes. New Mexico is among them.
This newspaper has a policy of withholding the names of juveniles charged with crimes in most cases. Exceptions include particularly serious crimes
such as murder, and crimes committed with deadly such as
weapons.

Some argue that it is best to withhold names, so juveniles can have a chance to be rehabilitated and return to society without a stigma against their names.
Others argue that citizens have a right to know the juveniles' names, especially if they want to be able to protect themselves against a particular juvenile when
released. Some also see the publishing of names as a deterrent.

## TO THE EDITOR:

In this time of dire bad news and disaster, I would like to inject a note of hope against a monstrous parasite infect
The villain is the "Dwarf MistThe villain is the "Dwarf Mistlate which selectively infects
Western Pines - principally the Western Pines - principally the
Ponderosa. It can be conquered by persistence - and hard work. What follows is the result of a lot of personal research from many resources, and the inevitably required work and experimentation The life aye period.
The life cycle of the Dwarf Mistletoe plant begins with a seed July (usually) and the first half of August. Blue green in color and about the size of a kitchen match head, it is one of a cluster of hundreds produced by the female plant which had been successfully pollinated in May by the male plant flowers. The seed kernel is surrounded by a sticky gelatin and contained in the outer covering which shrinks as it dries in the summer heat. This produces an invernal hydrostatic pressure which propels air) when the hull finally

splits. However, the more likely spits. However, the more likely hot, dry, high wind. Then the trajectory can carry the new seed as much as 200 feet, with the probable average distance more like 30 to 50 leet. The treatment I have found best is to cut off infected twigs and medim branches about a foot from has warmed. On the large branches and trunks, I scrape off the mistleto very persistently whenever it shows, which usually lasts only about four years.
Heavily infected trees, and those with the grotesque "Witches Brooms," might hest be cut down nd disposed of.
Caution: Note however that we vive in a national forest, and their regulations require permission beaches in diameter. In the village of Ruidoso this is controlled by the building inspector.
Though I live in one heavily in fected area to the northeast of the old airport (now the village owned Links Golf Course), I am very fortunate that the acre of property one of the infected huge old forest monarchs. Thus I can control reinfection by assiduously examining trees in the area toward the prevailing up-wind section. This constant surveillance has reduced the infection in six years to much less than $1 \%$ of the apparently hopeless situation existing when I began. The decrease is apparently
about a $90 \%$ reduction each year of about a $90 \%$ reduction each year of the prior year's infection.
The local Forest Service office is the main source of my research incopies of articles which were very helpful, but did not contain an outline of the complete life cycle of the plant. Further inquiry gained reprints from six of their reference tomes, careful reading and cross referencing of all the available literature, plus outside works, has produced the above condensed information. The worst aspect of this parasite is that while it uses the pine's nutrients and weakens the tree, it primarily furnishes an easy entrance to the tree's living cambim layer to the "Western Pine Bark Beetle. This small creature is about the size of a pin head. It
bores tunnels under the bark and bores tunnels under the bark and
its galleries (usually) eventually girdling the tree and killing it.
So the scenario is: the mistletoe seldom kills the tree, but weakens it and furnishes easy entrance to the beetle which finishes off the massacre.

Once that answer has been examined, the cause for the digging usually becomes clear and corrective action may be planned, according to literature from the Mile High Humane Society in Denver.
Some dogs dig from example, the experts contend.
Owners who spend the day gardening often complain that their handiwork has been maliciously destroyed by their pet the minute their backs are turned.

Although deliberate, the pet's digging probably was not done with malice. Corrective action should involve the best remedy - prevention. The dog should be kept out of sight of the gardening: no stimulus, no response.

The smapping of the traps frightens the $d o g$ and often deters future digging.
Simple boredom is a wellknown tension producing agent for dogs:

Experts have found that a program of intensive interaction between dog and owner, such as playing fetch with a ball in the areas of the digging for no longer than 15 minutes daily, often results in correction. Teaching the dog to come, sit, stay and lie down on command in the area also is beneficial in preventing tension buildup because of boredom.

Another cause may be peculiar to northern breeds such as huskies, malamutes and even German shepherds. They dig cooling holes and lie in them. These domestic dogs' ancestors were burrowing, den-living animals. Many species of wild dogs still follow that lifestyle.
