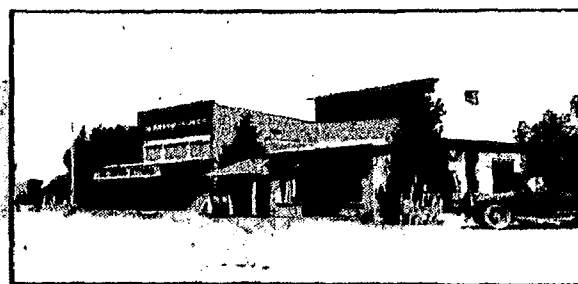

Lightning strikes local care center

The Ruidoso Care Center was hit by lightning during a violent hailstorm Thursday afternoon. There were no injuries and the D Street nursing home did not lose power, maintenance supervisor Kurt Stowell said. The lightning bolt struck the air conditioning unit at the exterior of the building's west wing around 2 p.m., police said. All 34 residents of the wing were temporarily evacuated until the threat of fire passed, Stowell said.

Water system holds on during busy weekend

The Village of Ruidoso reported only one water supply problem the past few days, during its busiest holiday weekend of the year. An eight-inch water line blew out in the Buckner Drive area Friday night. Village officials say 15-20 people were left without water for a day after the line burst, but the problem is not related to pressure concerns. So far, the new Grindstone Treatment Plant has eased pressure problems appearing during holiday weekends. Nevertheless, residents and visitors are asked to use water conservatively during high water use periods: take short showers, use dishwashers for full loads only, and don't hose down driveways or sidewalks.

DWI roadblocks planned in summer

Several DWI (driving while intoxicated) roadblocks are planned for the Ruidoso area this summer. The state police plan to set up evening roadblocks, most on weekends, primarily on U.S. 70. By state law, police must announce the exact dates as they are scheduled. "We'll spread them throughout the whole county, but concentrate on U.S. 70, because of the heavy fatalities on that road," said Officer R.A. Holguin. While sobriety check points will be performed in the evening, daytime roadblocks also may occur to check for expired, suspended or revoked driver's licenses, lack of insurance and/or registration papers. Police are telling residents to be sure to carry proof of those items when on Lincoln County roads.

Hunters, drought reduce local bear numbers

If you're not seeing as many bears this year, there may be several reasons why, said Brian Gleadle, area game manager for the New Mexico Game and Fish Division.

"I would say the population has been lowered considerably from what it was last year," which was a banner year for complaints about nuisance bears around Ruidoso,

Gleadle said. No overall population estimate is available, because the agency does not count black bears, he said.

The fall hunt was partially responsible for reducing the number of bears around Ruidoso, he said. The bears were more accessible to hunters as they moved down into and near the town.

Hunters legally killed and tagged 36 black bears in the Ruidoso area (including the White

Mountain Wilderness and the Bonito, Hale and Grindstone lake areas). Five additional kills were related to illegal activity, three died after being hit by cars and 13 bears were tranquilized and relocated, Gleadle said.

"That means a total of 57 bears actually were removed from that population," Gleadle said.

The number hunted and killed legally the previous year was lower, only 24, but Gleadle didn't have the

number of illegal or other kills.

Taking the Ruidoso and Cloudcroft areas together, 86 bears were killed in the 1994 fall hunt, he said. The Cloudcroft area stretches to the southern end of the Sacramento Mountains. Statewide, the death total jumped from 328 in 1993 to 625 in 1994.

Another factor may be the scarcity of food last year — other than in dumpsters. Sows may not have

been able to bring their fetuses to full term, he said.

"If the sow is in such poor condition that she just can't get off those young ones, she can abort and the body just naturally reabsorbs the fetus (and uses it for survival)," Gleadle said. "Without doing some ground research, to what extent that might have occurred I couldn't say, but it is a process that can happen in bear populations."

Chamber vision changes with new board, CVB contract

New Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce board President Danny Sisson says his major goal is to rejuvenate the chamber's economic development division.

Sisson took over his new duties Saturday.

"Each president has brought in a new direction that they would like to see the chamber take," chamber director Joan Bailey said. "Danny is helping with a real dedication of time and effort to the development and retention of business in the Ruidoso area."

The chamber wants to be identified with the business community so businesses will feel comfortable about requesting information and voicing concerns, she said.

Economic development

The chamber's economic development division is receiving a boost because of Sisson's leadership, Bailey said.

"We've always had the division but it's never been as active or as vital as president Sisson sees it being," she said.

Carl Bartley, another new chamber board member, will chair the economic development division. Former board member Jim Bassett will chair a newly-formed committee dedicated to setting goals and directions.

"In order for economic development to be effective, it has to have attainable goals," Bailey said. "We're real excited about this direction."

Resource book

Development of a resource book is a high priority at the chamber, Bailey said.

The resource book will show businesses where to get business license, gross receipts, insurance and tax information.

"It will also provide information as basic as where to get a window washer," she said. "We are trying to build a data base for every single little thing that a business owner, no matter what the type, would need to operate efficiently in Lincoln County."

The completed chamber resource book should be available next spring, officials said.

Future plans

Plans to double the size of the

present chamber building are in the works, Bailey said.

"Since we have just completed the contract for the convention and visitors bureau (CVB) operation, now we are about to start visitation with the powers that be at village hall to work out new lease negotiations for the land," she said. "The floor plan calls for us to double the size of the existing building."

The scope of work at the chamber has become so large that it needs more efficient working space and a building the village can be proud of, Bailey said.

Part of the CVB contract includes the possibility of satellite visitor centers, to reach people who might otherwise bypass Ruidoso.

"Our goal for the satellite centers is to have one on Highway 70

East, another on Highway 70 West, and another on Highway 48 North," Bailey said. "They will be designated areas, within existing businesses, to allow visitors to get initial information when they hit town."

The satellite centers will provide maps and other information and direct visitors to the main visitors center located at the chamber, she said.

"Many people don't realize that there is so much to see and visit in Lincoln County," Bailey said.

CVB duties

Because the chamber was awarded the contract to run the CVB, it is now responsible for the marketing and advertising of the

Roadwork planned near Hwy. 48

State funds to help upgrade Ruidoso streets crossing Highway 48 will be less than expected, but the village will still receive \$40,000 this fiscal year.

Eight roads have been chosen for improvements in 1995-96 with funds from a cooperative state and village program. Village street department officials identified roads expected to receive increased traffic when Highway 48 is overhauled.

Roads pegged for repaving before the end of 1996 are: Heath Drive, Kirkman Drive, Metz Drive, Royal Drive, Buckner Drive, Kyle Drive, MacKenzie Drive, and Wylie

Drive.

The state highway department pays 60% of road improvement costs under the program, said Alan Briley, Ruidoso's assistant manager. The state will put in \$40,000 alongside the village's \$27,000 for a total of \$67,000 in funds.

However, the project's scope may be reduced because of the shortage of money, Briley said.

The village wanted to do \$153,000 worth of improvements.

Still, many other Ruidoso streets will be upgraded during the coming fiscal year. Major road improvements are planned for 26 other streets; they will be paved or regaveled. In fact, the city budget

provides for some form of road improvement to all 136 miles of streets in Ruidoso, Briley said.

The co-op funds actually represent a small portion of the village's proposed 1995-96 street department budget of \$1.2 million.

Work on the state/village road program for 1994-95 will likely take place this summer, Briley said. Streets identified for repaving in this \$109,000 list are Center, El Paso, Rio, Grindstone, Chase, Fern, Eagle, Country Club and Wingfield.

The state will kick in reimbursements of \$67,000 for the 1994-95 road work, and the village will spend \$42,000, Briley said.

BIA leader saddened by tribal council resolution against him

Ed Little has been in political scrapes before, but the Mescalero Apache tribal council's decision to seek his removal as acting Bureau of Indian Affairs superintendent is different.

"This is a little harder, because this is my home and I have a lot of family here," he said last week. Little is a member of the Mescalero tribe.

The council's June 22 decision to ask for a new superintendent is politically motivated, Little contended. The council cited lack of experience, communication and cooperation.

"The problem is that I stepped on a few people's toes in the BIA (Bureau of Indian Affairs) who happened to be (Mescalero President Wendell) Chino's pets," he said.

Chino could not be reached for comment. BIA officials have not yet decided whether to follow through with the tribal council's request.

At the age of 52, with more than two decades as administrator of divisions under the BIA, plus appearances before Congress and work with nationally prominent Native American groups, Little said he has plenty of managerial experience.

He has tried his best to stay in close touch with tribal officials, he said. Sometimes that was difficult, because as acting superintendent, he also continued to carry responsibility for another program in Albuquerque and frequently had to be in that city.

Chino was gone from the reservation quite often, Little added. He found himself interacting with Vice President Fred Peso, who is his cousin, and other council members. He sent memos and letters, Little said.

Just six months earlier in January, the same council headed by Chino passed a resolution supporting Little for the position of superintendent.

Patrick Hayes, area director for the BIA in Albuquerque, said although resolutions from tribes carry a lot of weight, the decision lies with the supervisor.

"Federal officials need not abide by the resolutions," he said. "It is an independent selection."

In the case of Little, Hayes said the situation is confusing, because of the earlier supportive resolution from the council.

More than most Indian groups in New Mexico, the Mescalero council seems to resort to resolutions to prompt the personnel action it seeks, Little said. They have taken similar action against other government officials before, he said.

The vote calling for Little to be removed as acting superintendent split the council 5-2, with one member abstaining.

"We'll probably appoint someone else on a temporary basis again and then readvertise the position,"

Hayes said. "That post has been vacant for quite awhile."

Little said he doesn't intend to ask the council to reconsider. However, he was especially disappointed, because he had always dreamed about coming home in a position where he could help his tribe. With all of the reorganization occurring in the BIA, the timing was right.

"I was born and raised on Mescalero," Little said. "I'm familiar with the land and with problems on the reservation. I know everybody on the council. I left the reservation because there wasn't a whole lot of opportunity and I went to college (University of New Mexico)."

He served as director of the BIA road program for about five years in Mescalero in the 1980s, Little said.

Then in August 1994, the BIA assigned Little to a detail in Mescalero. As acting superintendent, the idea is to keep the status quo. Juggling two positions, a week in Albuquerque, a week in Ruidoso, there was no time to initiate new programs, he said.

"I was there 120 days and they kept extending my time," Little said. "The second time they advertised the position, I applied to be here permanently."

The council's action bothered him, but did not surprise him, Little said. He was out of town on BIA business the week the council twice considered the resolution against him. The first time, it was rejected and Chino talked about resigning, because of the lack of support. Two days later, the resolution passed.

"I'm used to the political dealings of my tribe," Little said. "But through all those years, I supported and admired Chino as a tribal leader."

Ruidoso Internet seekers ponder various ways to get service here

Supporters of the growing movement to bring free Internet access to Ruidoso met at the ENMU-Ruidoso library Friday to take a ride on the "world-wide web."

More than 20 people attended the meeting. Some had been on the Internet before, and many others had not.

"We are trying to get ideas about the best way to get the access here," said Joe Timmons, a local computer store owner. "There are several options that need to be studied."

One solution would be to pay the price of setting up a local "server" to process the calls to the Internet. That way, access would not cost

any more than a normal local phone call, Timmons said.

ENMU-Ruidoso has a new program available for those who can't wait to access the Internet, librarian Mary Weaver said.

"Residents may purchase an ENMU guest card for \$10 per year," Weaver said. "Then they can come into the university library and use the computers to access the Internet."

Lincoln Cablevision technician Gene McKinley gave a presentation to the group about the role that the cable industry could play in the development of a local Internet site.

Cablevision has the technology to bring access into the area, but that idea would require users to install special modems that cost

about \$500, McKinley said.

"It's going to take a cooperative effort between the schools, the village, businesses and individual users to find the best solution," Timmons said.

Those attending the meeting had the opportunity to "surf" the Internet via ENMU-Ruidoso computers. The university library has access to the net through educational funding.

The next meeting of the Internet group has not yet been scheduled, but those interested in becoming involved may contact Joe Timmons at 257-4466.

Solid Waste Authority plans to close Capitan landfill in one year

Residents along the Capitan landfill road shouldn't have any reason to complain about blowing debris and tire-tearing nails in about 12 months.

The Lincoln County Solid Waste Authority, which operates the construction debris landfill, took steps last week to begin closure of the facility.

Members, who represent the county and its five municipalities, directed manager Joe Lewandowski to begin the procedure with the deadline date of July 1, 1996.

Lewandowski recommended the move, reminding the board they planned to close in two years anyway to avoid financial assurance requirements that would

be imposed in April 1997. The new federal requirements make the landfill operators post significant financial security to ensure that future costs of closing and monitoring the landfills will be covered.

To close in a year, information will be gathered and sent to the state Environment Department for approval. A dumping convenience station must be created and a tub grinder, capable of grinding up construction debris and other pieces too large for a chipper, must be purchased, Lewandowski said.

The situation will be similar to the arrangement at the county seat of Carrizozo, which has used a convenience station without incident since its landfill closed several years ago.

"There's a whole lot of things to

do," Lewandowski said. "We can't just walk away. But we're going to have to close soon anyway, so why mess around?"

Tires and pine needles can be stored at the site until the authority finds a use for them, because the group will own the ground even if the landfill is closed, he said. Most of the discarded large appliances already are recycled, he said.

"We easily can live without the Capitan landfill," Lewandowski concluded.

While the landfill has been open, neighbors have complained that nails dropped from trucks heading to and from the landfill have caused dozens of flats a year and ruined tires.

Manager stays for now

The SWA board asked Lewandowski to stay on as part-time manager of the authority through the summer.

He resigned several months ago to pursue a consulting business and to run a garbage collection company he owns in Otero County. But he agreed to come into the office a few days a week at a reduced salary until a new manager was found.

The batch of applications received for the job didn't contain anyone with the qualifications the board was seeking, SWA members said. Monday they want to try again, advertising through Labor Day in trade journals and municipal publications.

Lewandowski will continue to

come in two days a week.

"We didn't want to upset everything during the middle of the summer," said Frank Cummins, chairman of the authority board and a Ruidoso village councilor. "Everything has been running so well."

Merit increase OK'd

Board members agreed to set aside \$20,000 in the 1995-96 budget that starts July 1 to award merit bonuses or merit pay increases to employees.

The system will be modeled after similar merit programs in the village of Ruidoso and Ruidoso Downs, which are members of SWA along with the county and its three other municipalities.

"One thing I found in 15 years of solid waste is, you can buy the best

equipment, but if you don't have the right employees with the right attitude using the piece of equipment, it will cost you more than any merit program," Lewandowski wrote in his recommendation. "The last two years, these employees have really strived to improve and build an authority to be proud of. So I strongly recommend we give recognition back to them for that service."

In other business, the authority agreed to buy the Texas-New Mexico Power Co. building it has been renting with a purchase option. The SWA has used it as a recycling and administration building since 1992.

The building has been appraised at \$135,000, but the authority will buy it for \$77,200.

Memories of the Fourth of July

Somehow on this day of bright sunshine and pure air, memories seem to come back especially clearly.

The first Fourth of July I remember was in my native city of Valdez, Alaska. There was a flag flying near the door of our house, and out in the street brothers John and I built little "Froggie Houses" out of the moist sand and placed small American Flags on top. I was about three years old at the time. The parade downtown featured gaily decorated dogsleds.

In Denver, Colo., the parades had special meaning to the people because Colorado is "The Centennial State," having been admitted into the Union on July 4, 1876.

Cheering throngs lined the street as marching bands, wagons, buggies, carriages, and bareback riders filed by.

I remember the horse-drawn fire engines. And Grandpa Kennedy drove his automobile — one of the first in Denver — to the curious gazes, laughter, and cheers of the crowd.

Everything, especially the horses, was decorated with red, white and blue colors of every description, including flags of every size,

and flowers.

In Juneau, the capital city of Alaska, a feature of the Fourth of July parades was our fellow townspeople, the Siwash Indians, marching in their native costumes with a few of their dogs.

From the horse-drawn floats were thrown Cracker Jacks, boxes of marshmallows, sacks of candy and oranges for the children.

The Fort Stanton Rodeo

Back in the 1930s Fort Stanton was a tuberculosis hospital for Merchant Seamen from all over the world, and a feature of the year was the Fort Stanton rodeo and barbecue.

People gathered for miles around, a great number on horseback.

As R.C. Lott, who worked at the Wilbur Coe Ranch at that time, said, "Going to Fort Stanton, we rode wilder horses than the ones in the rodeo."

Perhaps the proudest moment in the life of my brother Mark was the day he won the bronc riding at the Fort Stanton rodeo. I forgot now which year.

Rodeo and Dinner on the Ground

You have perhaps heard of the pioneer religious services called "All-Day Singing, and Dinner on the Ground."

Years ago before the Bonito Dam was built, on the land now covered by the waters of the reservoir, there used to be a little village called Bonito City.

The city had faded away with not much trace left but a long level stretch that used to be the Main Street.

In 1926 or 1927, I now forget which, there was a combination Fourth of July picnic and rodeo on the site of old Bonito City. On the level stretch that used to be the main street, they had horse racing, foot racing, bronc riding, wild horse racing, and wild cow milking.

On the gentle, sloping hillside next to the level stretch, the women folks of the surrounding neighborhoods placed tablecloths end to end. And here was the most wonderful collection of homemade vittles I have ever seen: pies and cakes of every kind, home-cooked vegetables of every description, biscuits and corn bread, wild raspberry and wild cherry jam, and apple cider. Nearby was barbecued beef cooked by Cap Henley.

In the foot racing, the men took off their boots and ran in the stocking feet. Montey Gardenheir was the champion foot racer of the day.

There was nothing like a corral or a chute for the rodeo. The horses were chased down and caught after each event. The wild cow milking drew many a laugh from the crowd.

Once in a while the hat was passed after a good rodeo performance. Otherwise everything was free. Some of the oldtimers at the celebration were Ed Peters, Tom Bragg and Red Burnett, who did a trick on a red mule.

The Spirit of the Fourth

The Depression was well under way, and yet the spirit of good will, community pride, laughter, and the joy of living were at high tide.

This same Fourth of July spirit which abided at the Bonito City location was begun at the first Fourth of July, and is still with us today.

Have a safe and happy Fourth, and may God bless us all.

BLM, others honor fallen firefighters

The Bureau of Land Management will host a remembrance Thursday of the 14 firefighters who were killed July 6, 1994 on Storm King Mountain near Grand Junction, Colo.

The ceremony will be held at BLM's Roswell Air Tanker Base at 9 a.m. The Air Tanker base is located at Gate 13 of the Roswell Industrial Air Center. Gate 13 is south of the intersection of Jennifer Lane and Will Rogers Road.

BLM State Director Bill Calkins will lead the ceremony remembering the 14 BLM and U.S. Forest Service employees killed while battling the South Canyon fire. BLM will also dedicate the Air Tanker Base to the memory of David Boehler, who played a key role in the construction of the facility.

Representatives from the Roswell Fire Department, the surrounding volunteer departments, the New Mexico Division of Forestry, the U.S. Forest Service and the National Park Service will attend the ceremony and display some of their firefighting equipment. Demonstrations of the equipment will take place after the ceremony.

Completed in 1992, the Roswell Air Tanker Base was built as a result of the fires that scorched 48,000 acres in southeast New Mexico in 1989. The Air Tanker Base serves the firefighting needs of southeast New Mexico and is designed to mix and load 25,000 gallons of fire retardant at a time. Once mixed, retardant can be loaded onto airplanes at the rate of one plane every 10 minutes.

Son Of Sol hangs on for wire-to-wire win

Richard Parrish's Son Of Sol jumped out to an early lead then desperately held off a furious late charge from longshot Selzway for a neck victory in the \$10,000 Jockey Club Handicap, Saturday at Ruidoso Downs.

Son Of Sol, a son of 1982 Kentucky Derby winner Gato Del Sol, was sent off the 5-2 favorite in the field of 10 three-year-olds and battled for the early lead with second choice Roythelittleone at the start of the 7 1/2 furlong contest. Down the backstretch, Son Of Sol had a head lead over Roythelittleone and maintained that margin as the field entered the top of the lane. Under constant urging by jockey Gilbert Villegas, the gray gelding dug in near the wire to narrowly preserve the win.

The time was 1:34.4 over a fast track.

"Usually this horse grabs hold of the bit and wants to go on with it, but today he didn't," Villegas said. "He was real tired at the end, and so was I. When I saw the other horse coming (Selzway), I asked him for a little more and was hoping the wire would get there. The only reason he won was he was the better horse."

The victory was worth \$6,000 to owner Parrish, who resides in the Lubbock suburb of Meadow, Texas.

Parrish purchased Son Of Sol for \$3,600 as a yearling and now the gelding has earned \$57,000. It was the second stakes win in nine starts this year for Son Of Sol.

So far this holiday weekend, Parrish has been virtually unbeatable. He owns the thoroughbred Full Connection, who qualified to the Rio Grande Futurity yesterday. He also has the quarter horse First Mystery, who will start in Sunday's Rainbow Derby Consolation, and Gliding Bunny, who is the early favorite to win the Grade I Rainbow Derby Monday.

Roy "Cotton" Barrington trains all of Parrish's horses. Paradise Stranger, recent winner of the Norgor Derby, finished third.

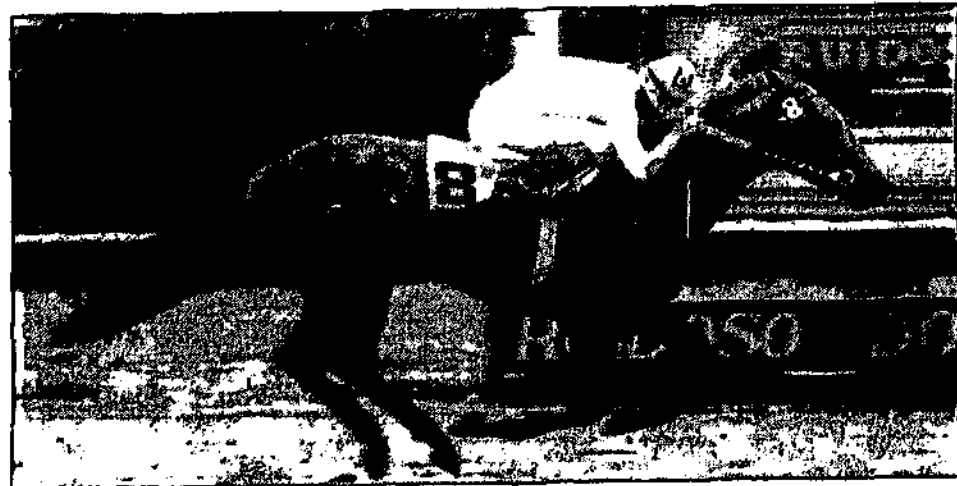

Warriors sparkle in All Stars

The West All-Stars, powered by a 15-4-1 record from four of Ruidoso's recently-graduated seniors, cruised to its third straight win in the East-West New Mexico High School All-Stars Golf tournament Wednesday.

The tournament, which brought the state's top prep golfers to Ruidoso, was played at all four of Ruidoso's area golf courses and spanned 99 holes. The competition began Monday.

The Warriors' 15 points over the three days, with the East gaining 18.5 points in the Ryder Cup-type match play event.

The Warriors' 15 points accounted for more than half of the 16-man West team's point total, a school record for the All-Stars.

Former Warriors Scott Christensen (5-0), Paxton Wright (4-0-1), Chad Collins (4-1) and Eric Stephens (2-3) played their final high school tournament in the All-Stars and again demonstrated that Ruidoso is one of the most dominant golf powers in the state's AAA ranks.

Christensen, playing perhaps his best golf of the year, bested Albuquerque Academy's top player, Asa Tyselling, in Wednesday's singles match, 3-2.

Prior to that, the UNM-bound bomber paired up with Warrior teammate Chad Collins to beat Tyselling and Lovington's John Lambert in a low-total match on Monday, his closest match of the tournament.

Collins, like Christensen, was an All-District selection this season, and had just one blemish on his record for the All-Stars. Albuquerque's Eldorado's top man, Matt Hale, was Collins' victim in the singles.

The Warriors' Paxton Wright didn't suffer one "defeat" in the tournament with his almost-perfect 4-0-1 record. Wright fought back brilliantly in the singles matches to

The Warriors' other college golf-bound player, Eric Stephens, managed just two wins in the tournament, but performed very well in Monday's stroke play. Stephens, who will become a Barton County (Kansas) Cougar this fall, fired an

excellent 72 Monday at Cree Meadows followed by 37 in the rain-shortened second round at Alto.

Both Stephens and Wright qualified for Wednesday's shootout at Cree Meadows, but suffered early departures.

Alamogordo's Dianne Overstreet, the only female golfer in the field, showed the boys how the game is played by becoming the second girl to win the shootout in the last four years. Overstreet beat Shiprock's Kevin Price in a chip-off on the ninth hole.

Victory for First Down Laveaux

Charles Patterson's First Down Laveaux notched his second career victory when he romped by a length in the \$3,200 allowance feature, Thursday at Ruidoso Downs.

The 3-year-old colt, by the nation's leading sire First Down Dash, broke third from the gate in the 400-yard dash, but quickly hit full stride to breeze past early leader Western Magic, who held on for second. The time was :19.94 over a wet and fast track.

Conditioned by two-time All American Futurity winning trainer James McArthur, First Down Laveaux scored his only other win in last year's Rainbow Futurity Trials before finishing sixth in the Grade I race last July. The win was worth \$1,920 to Patterson, who resides in Wimberley, Texas. Chris Zamora was the winning rider.

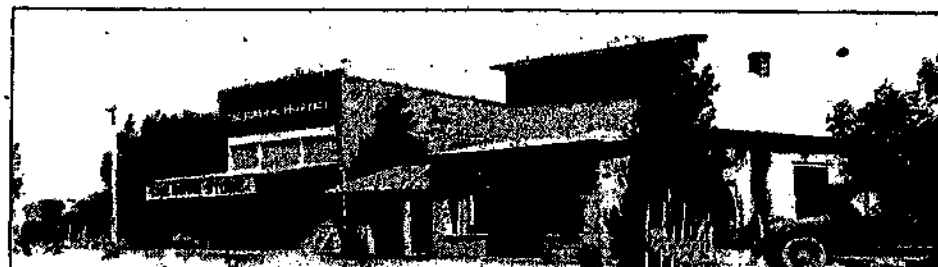
LINCOLN COUNTY SCRAPBOOK

A glimpse into Lincoln County's past, compiled by Polly E. Chavez with excerpts from "A History of Lincoln County Post Offices."

Capitan

Before Capitan acquired its name in 1900, the town was called Gray. It was named for Seaborn T. Gray, who owned most of the land in the area and who also was the only postmaster while the town was called Gray. He served from August 20, 1894, when the post of-

fice was first established, until October 11, 1900, when the town was renamed Capitan. In about 1899, 1.5 miles to the northwest of Capitan the bustling coal mining town of Coalora existed. Later, houses were built by the Phelps Dodge Coal Company, which at that time operated the coal mines. About a year later, the railroad was built to Capitan and was used principally to haul coal to Carrizozo. The records show that there were three post offices north of Capitan: Encinoso, Richardson and Spindle.

County history column highlights post offices

The designation of a post office in the community meant a lot to early-day Lincoln County settlers. Still, mail delivery was slow; not until 1912 or 1913 was any mail transported by automobile.

Many of the communities featured in the columns no longer ex-

ist. Others are in different counties today.

John A. Haley notes in his 1913 Lincoln County Yearbook that this county originally covered all the southeastern part of the territory. Three entire counties — Chavez, Eddy and Roosevelt — have been carved out of its former territory, and four other counties — Curry, Guadalupe, Otero and Torrance — contain a portion of this first area.

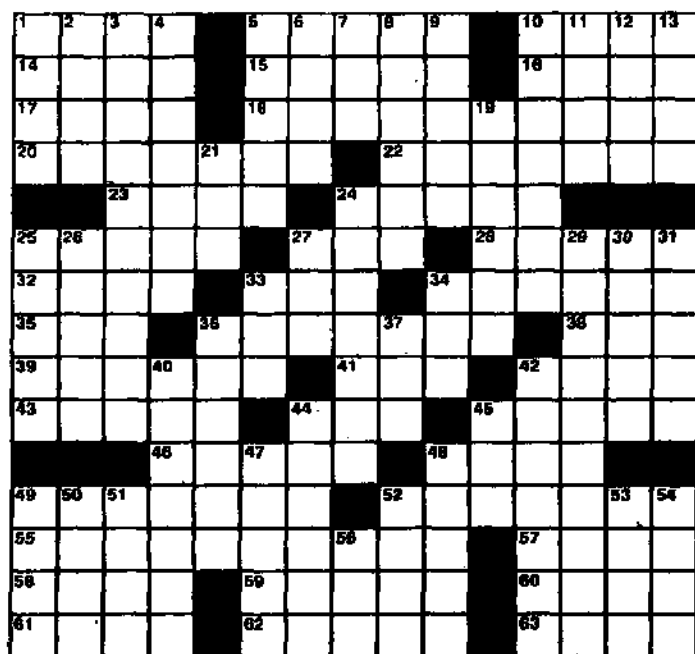

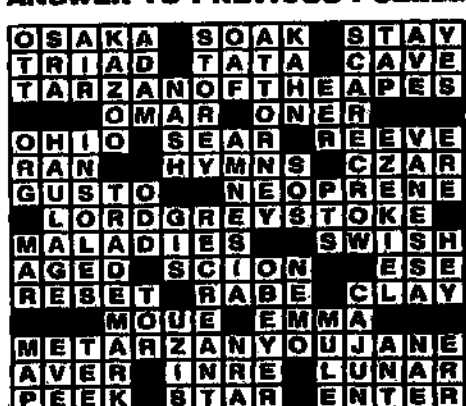

Ruidoso Downs man charged with sexually assaulting granddaughter released on bond

A Ruidoso Downs man arrested June 23 for allegedly sexually assaulting his granddaughter 12 times has been released on a reduced bond, and his case has been bound over to district court.

The 51-year-old man appeared before Magistrate Court Judge William Butts Friday morning. He waived his right to a preliminary hearing on the 12 counts of criminal sexual contact of a minor.

The defendant's attorney, Bob Beauvais, argued that bond is not to be used as a punishment, but to assure that the accused appears in court. His client has no criminal record and is not a flight risk, Beauvais argued.

Butts agreed with the attorney and reduced the \$60,000 bond that had kept the defendant behind bars for seven days to a \$10,000 unsecured bond. However, Butts noted that a high bond can also keep suspects behind bars and

therefore protect an alleged victim from further endangerment.

The mother of the alleged victim was at the hearing and said she did not want her father in jail, and neither did her daughter.

According to court papers, the man allegedly admitted to the investigating state police officer that he had touched his 12-year-old granddaughter's lower genital area at least 12 times.

The unsecured bond release carried three restrictions: the

defendant cannot see or contact his granddaughter or be in the presence of any other minors without supervision. He was also ordered to seek counseling immediately.

The date of his district court appearance has not yet been set.

The Ruidoso News and other WorldWest newspapers do not print the names of people arrested for sexual crimes, unless or until they are convicted.

Ruidosoan escapes jail time for stabbing dad

A Ruidoso man charged with aggravated battery for allegedly stabbing his father in the shoulder June 22 was sentenced Friday to a year of probation and fined \$131.

Chris Apachito, 18, pleaded no contest before Magistrate Judge William Butts after the felony charge against him was reduced to

misdeemeanor aggravated battery in a plea agreement between Assistant District Attorney Viola Rhodes and Apachito's attorney, Noel Orquiza.

Apachito had been arrested after allegedly engaging in a drunken brawl with his father outside their Carrizo Canyon Road home. The

fight had concluded when Apachito allegedly grabbed a kitchen knife and plunged it into his 41-year-old father's shoulder.

He is on probation for an official conviction, and corrections officials will determine whether he will go back to prison to serve the remainder of that sentence.

Apachito's 24-year-old cousin, Shone, was arrested on similar charges after the fight. A plea bargain was also made on his behalf, reducing his charges to misdeemeanor aggravated battery. He pleaded no contest and Butts sentenced him to a year of probation and to court fines of \$131.

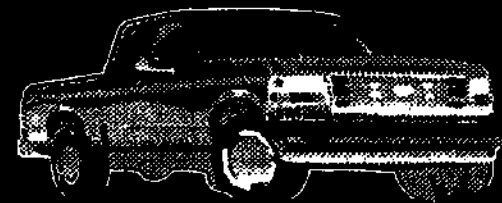

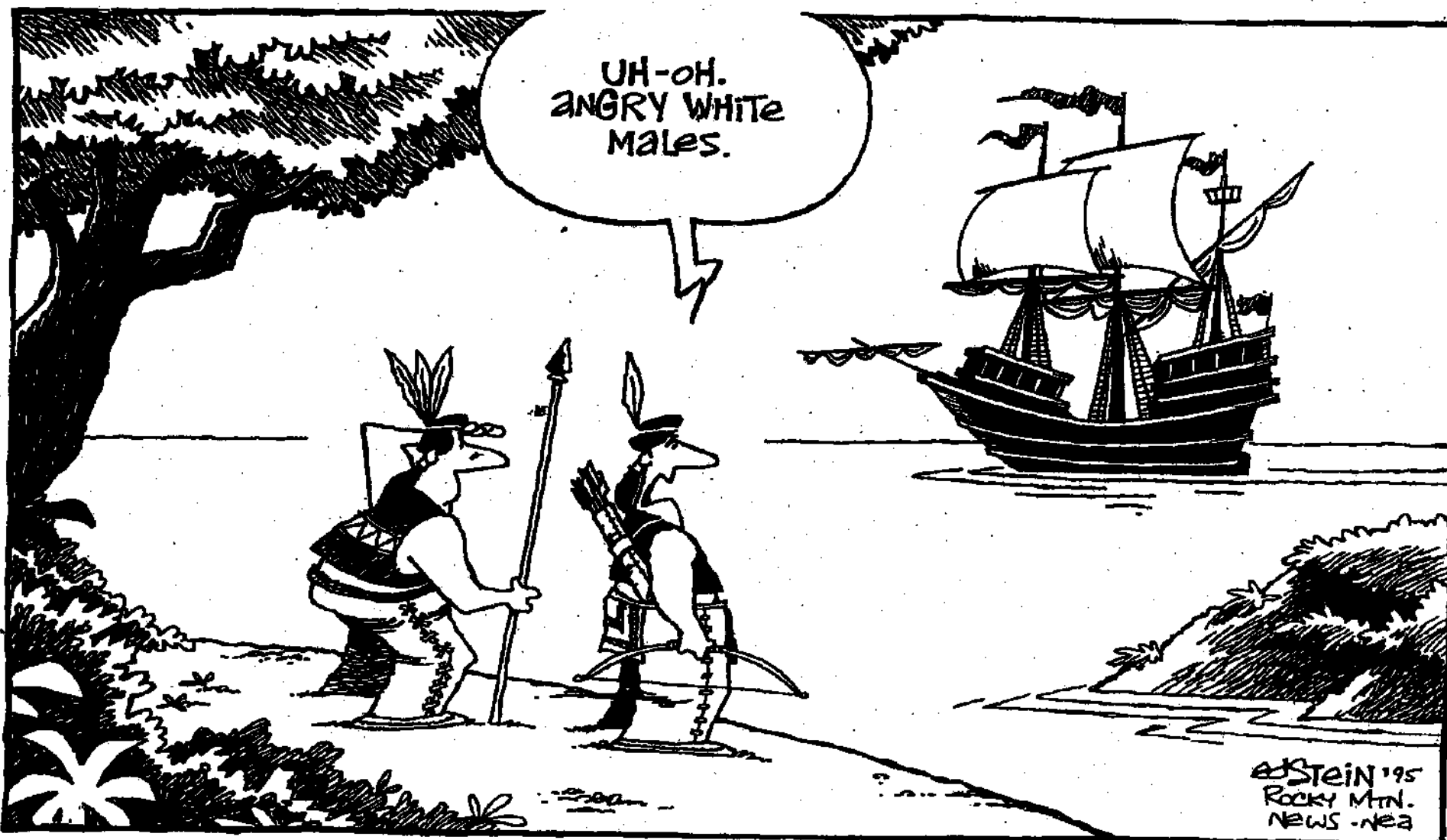

Montessori can't be labeled child care facility

TO THE EDITOR:

(The following letter was sent to Heather Wilson, Secretary of Children, Youth and Families Bureau.)

Dear Ms. Wilson:

It truly is an honor to be writing to you and we are certain that you can be of help to us.

We have lived in Ruidoso for almost 25 years, raised four children here, been in business for ourselves, taught in both the public and Christian School systems, as well as starting the Montessori Preschool 13 years ago.

At that time, we saw our community's need for a quality preschool program accommodating children who could not attend kindergarten. We received our Montessori accreditation from the Rocky Mountain Montessori Teacher Training Program in Boulder, Colorado, and the American Montessori Society.

We were disturbed and shocked when Mr. Charles Patrick and two of his associates appeared one day last November informing us that since we "cared for" children under the age of five years, we were not considered a school and were expected to comply to all Children, Youth, and Family Licensing Bureau regulations or be closed for business.

We tried to explain that we were (are) a Montessori SCHOOL and

not a child care facility. Neither Mr. Patrick or his associates were interested in learning anything about the Montessori method and/or philosophy. We thought it best to have a parent meeting informing everyone as to what was going on. Upon doing so, we immediately realized that this issue was going to be of grave concern for our community, and both the present and former parents of our school, due to the fact that in today's times ordinary citizens of the United States are feeling very put upon by various government bureaucracies!

We have had to obtain an attorney and have met with our state representative, Mr. Dub Williams. Dub has known us for many years. He knows our educational backgrounds, has taught our own children, realizes our values and standard of living, and knows many of the more than 200 youngsters we have worked with in Montessori over the years. He recently visited our school (now closed for the summer months), and agrees with us that something MUST be done to keep our facility open until the appropriate action can be taken by you or the New Mexico State Legislature to re-evaluate the outdated and unreasonable Children, Youth, and Families regulation pertaining to private schools and age restrictions.

We are not willing to continue operating under a Child Care License when, by definition, we are a nationally recognized Montessori School. The public school system now takes three-year-olds in the Headstart program. But, as you know, only low income and/or developmentally disabled children are eligible. As child advocates, we strongly feel that all other parents with children under the age of five have the right to choose private education over child care. We do not want to see the youngsters under the age of five of our community discriminated against solely on the basis of age or income.

We are so appreciative and have been overwhelmed by the total support of our community in their unity and concern over this vital matter. Therefore, we are writing to you and thanking you in advance for any additional help and support you can give us!

Again, thank you for your time and interest.

When Saleena was a little girl, she concluded she had been given a special gift.

"I would have vivid dreams," said Saleena, who goes only by her first name. "Then the dreams would come true a week or two later."

Saleena recently opened her "Psychic Readings by Saleena" business at Timbers Mall in Ruidoso. She offers psychic and facial readings at the shop, and also reads tarot cards and crystals.

"My mother had the gift," Saleena said. "Then when I was about nine years old, I discovered that I had a strong attraction to the tarot cards."

Saleena said other indications of her psychic gift began cropping up when she was a child attending school.

"If I would be with my friends at school, I would feel something might happen," she said. "I'd tell

them to be careful and sure enough, something would happen."

Saleena said her uncanny childhood predictions eventually led her to seek development of her gift at The Psychic Eye, a school in Los Angeles that teaches tarot card and other psychic techniques.

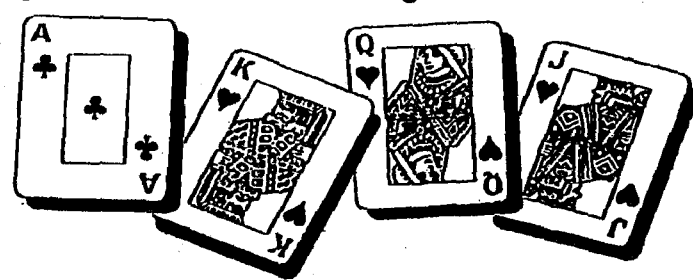

Five years ago, Laura Evans of Sun Valley, Idaho, was diagnosed with rapidly advancing breast cancer. Evans was told she had a fifteen percent chance of surviving the disease. Despite several different treatments, including a bone marrow transplant as primary therapy, the disease almost killed her — but not quite. In January of 1995, Evans went on to lead sixteen other breast cancer survivors on the second biggest challenge of their lives — to climb the highest mountain in the Western Hemisphere.

The New Explorers joins these brave women for every step of their 22,834 foot journey in "Expedition Inspiration."

With the help of internationally-known mountaineer, Peter Whittaker, Laura Evans decided to give other breast cancer survivors the sense of achievement and empowerment that challenging a mountain like Anconagua could instill.

Based on each individual's mountaineering experience, the team is divided into two groups. Six breast cancer survivors attempt the summit while the remaining eleven follow in support of their teammates to base camp at 14,000 feet. The New Explorers follows every rugged step of the climb, as rivers and gorges are crossed, and vast mountainscapes challenge each woman to achieve her personal goal in much the same way she confronted cancer.

Along the way, "Expedition Inspiration" looks at the epidemic of breast cancer, a disease that will attack one in eight American women. As the women progress along the steep trail, several are turned back by the extremes of the high altitude environment. But through it all, "Expedition Inspiration" is a tale of hope — a story of seventeen strong women who, having looked unflinchingly at the face of death, have empowered themselves for new, previously unimagined challenges. The journey is more than a mountain climb. It is an inspiration for all who suffer — or will suffer — a life-threatening disease.

POOP SCOOP

National Dog Bite Prevention Week was observed last month. Unfortunately, it's not a high profile event even though more than two million dog bites are reported each year in the United States.

Letter carriers account for 2,700 of those bitten.

In Ruidoso, if a dog or more exotic pet is picked up because it has bitten someone, the owner faces some expensive options and tough decisions.

Depending on the circumstances and judgment of the village impounding officer, the animal is quarantined in the owner's home or at the Lincoln County Humane Society's animal shelter.

The charge for quarantine at the shelter is \$5 per day if the animal is taken from the home. However, if it was running loose, a \$25 impound fee also is charged.

"Whether the animal has its rabies shots or not, it must be quarantined," said Ruidoso Animal Control Officer Peggy Williams. "No vaccine is 100% certain. But if it has shots and is not in any violation of the law, the control officer will opt to allow home quarantine. That means the owner pays nothing, except any civil liability from the bite incident itself."

At the end of the 10-day quarantine period and before an animal is released from the shelter, it must be brought into

compliance with village and state laws. It must have a city license if its home is within the city limits, it must have rabies shots, and it must be neutered if it is more than six months of age.

Most wild animals that are kept as pets, such as raccoons, foxes and even wolf hybrids, would have to be destroyed immediately if they have bitten someone, because no rabies vaccine has been approved as effective for them, Williams said.

An approved vaccine now is available for ferrets, she said.

"Lots of times the owners will release the dogs to us to be destroyed," said Sandra Ford, assistant director of the shelter.

That's a tragic end for a pet, who may have just been protecting his home and family.

The Humane Society of the United States put out tips on how to avoid being bitten. The society advised:

— don't run past a dog. The dog's natural instinct is to chase and catch prey.

— if a dog threatens you, don't scream. Avoid eye contact, try to remain motionless until the dog leaves, then back away slowly until the dog is out of sight.

— don't approach a strange dog, especially one that's tied or confined.

— always let a dog see and sniff you before attempting to pet it.
