Van driver at fault in cycle fatality

Eyewitness accounts indicate that the unknown driver of a 1979 Ford van failed to stop at an intersection July 30 and drove into the path of cyclist David Lucero.

The initial report from the State Police said Lucero attempted a turn and collided with the van filled with about 20 illegal aliens from Mexico. Lucero, 31, was killed in the collision.

State Police Officer Chad Davis said Wednesday that between the time of the accident and the time he turned in his official report, several witnesses to the accident supplied information that differed from the original account released by the agency.

Details also came from some of the 16 illegal aliens captured a few days after the accident, he said.

"The van was coming (south) on U.S. 380 and the driver failed to make a complete stop and drove into the path of the cycle, coming west on U.S. 70," Davis said. "The driver (and a relief driver) have not been caught and we still are investigating, but fault has been placed on the van."

Lucero was from San Patricio.

Police plan DWI blitz statewide

The 11th blitz of Operation DWI (driving while intoxicated) will soon get underway, and once again, Ruidoso, Ruidoso Downs and New Mexico State Police will join in the statewide effort to prevent impaired driving by setting up sobriety checkpoints. The blitz begins Friday, Aug. 11 and continues through Sunday, Aug. 20.

"In the 15 months since Operation DWI first began, we've seen significant results in our fight to stop DWI," said Ruidoso Police Chief Lanny Maddox.

The goal of the program is to prevent DWI by demonstrating that the consequences of driving impaired are swift, certain and severe.

"As always, we encourage motorists not to risk being arrested," Maddox said. "There are plenty of alternatives to driving drunk: moderate your alcohol intake, choose a designated driver, use public transportation, or call the Ruidoso Police at 257-7365 for a safe ride home."

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Gaim-Ko buys Carrizo Lodge

Carrizo Lodge has been sold to Gaim-Ko, Inc., the same company that provides slot machines to the Inn of the Mountain Gods.

James Porter, president of C-NET Resorts, Inc. which owned the Carrizo Lodge, announced yesterday that his company and Gaim-Ko closed the real estate deal Tuesday afternoon.

Negotiations and the purchase of the lodge were handled solely by Gaim-Ko President R.A. Gallegos, Porter said.

While traveling and speaking from a cellular phone yesterday afternoon, Gallegos said he has no

plans for the property.

"I have no plans. I do think it's an investment and that's it," said Gallegos, a Ruidoso resident, who claims not to be a member of the Mescalero Apache Tribe.

Gaim-Ko supplies slot machines for Casino Apache at the Inn of the Mountain Gods. It also provides technical assistance for the machines, Gallegos said.

Gaim-Ko's company offices currently are located above the convention center at the Inn of the Mountain Gods resort.

Porter noted that no one from the tribe was involved in the deal, contrary to rumors.

"We sold them (Gaim-Ko) the commercial part of the property, the restaurant, office and studio buildings," Porter said.

He would not disclose the negotiated purchase price.

The lodge, where the restaurant is located, is about 65-years-old and has an historic designation by the state, he said.

There are seven offices and five large meeting rooms in the office building which was built around 1983, Porter said.

Included in the deal is the sale of 12 condominiums and 24 acres of undeveloped land along the east side of Carrizo Canyon Road.

Convention center needs storage space, says director

(This is fifth in a series of seven about stories about proposed bond issues for the Village of Ruidoso Aug. 22 election.)

During certain functions at Ruidoso's Civic Events and Convention Center, the center's director must walk through a maze to get to her desk.

That's because Kathleen Michelena's office is stacked from ceiling to floor with tables and chairs.

"We move everything in there and leave a path to her desk," office manager Jeneane Taylor said.

Michelena's office becomes a storage area during at least half of the events booked at the center because the center lacks adequate storage.

"We move (furniture) around from room to room depending on the function," she said.

Village officials want to construct a storage room with a \$100,000 bond issue, one of the seven bond issues totalling \$6.65 million on the Aug. 22 bond election ballot.

The convention center addition bond issue can be voted on separately from the other bond issues.

"It may be the least popular

bond issue, but necessary," said Mayor Jerry Shaw.

Passage of the issue will cost property owners with property assessed at \$60,000 about \$3 a year, and those with property assessed at \$90,000 about \$4 a year.

If all seven bond issues pass, it will cost those with property assessed at \$60,000 about \$192 a year, and for those with property assessed at \$90,000 about \$288.

But the cost for all the bond issues will not result in a tax increase, village officials said. Instead, the levies will be replacing taxes that already are being paid by property owners on maturing bond issues.

Village manager Gary Jackson explained the addition of storage in 1995-96 is part of a master improvement plan for the building.

"We can't fully use the building for its intended uses without adequate storage," he said.

The facility, built in 1992, was designed to maximize meeting space. But, for some reason, little thought was given to storage needs, Jackson said.

"We have to have the building at its most functional, and storage is a necessary component of any facility," he said.

The only way to keep offices func-

ly functional during the large conventions is to rent a van to store the extra tables and chairs. But this is "extremely labor intensive and expensive," Jackson said.

Bookings of conventions at the center continue to increase, making storage space an even greater issue.

Noted Shaw, "all the added people in town really turns the dollars."

Shaw said she hopes that with the village's new Convention and Visitors Bureau contract and plans for another new hotel in town, "we'll get even more conventions in Ruidoso."

Booked conventions and events have risen from 27 in 1992 to 122 in 1994. This year's count appears consistent with last year, Jackson said. Through June, 62 conventions

were held at the center with attendance ranging from 100 to 7,000 people.

"People all over the state comment on what a wonderful convention center we have," Shaw said. "But we have to get storage there."

Conventions and resort

Storage space will be even more necessary if a proposed \$15-million resort is built next to the convention center.

Shaw said a hotel near the convention center would increase the number of conventions booked at the center. In turn, the increased number of conventions will help fill the hotel.

Ruidoso Downs Race Track owner R.D. Hubbard and business

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partner Ed Allred entered a 50 year lease agreement with the village last year to build a \$15-million resort hotel next to the convention center and The Links Golf Course.

Terms of the lease require construction to begin within a two year period. The hotel was to be financed and constructed on the village land by Hubbard and Allred.

Construction was put on hold by the business partners after the state legislature failed to approve video gambling at the state's racetracks.

The lease will be voided unless construction begins by next fall, city officials explained.

Hubbard Enterprises, Inc. employee and the resort manager Jon Sherry said yesterday that construction of the hotel is hinging on the success of the racetrack and gaming.

"It's a \$15 million investment and we want to make sure that the potential and return is here in the community in the future," he said. "All things are pointing in the right direction, but we still have the legislature to go through to save the track."

Shaw said she still believes the hotel will be built.

"I can't accept that they won't do it," she said.

Artist's sculpture creates controversy Lodge

As a sculpture by Candyce Garrett is carved into a finer form outside her Sudderth Drive studio, some people in Ruidoso would like to have it censored.

"You don't have to be a genius to figure out what she's chiseling out there," complained Scott Miller, a Planning and Zoning Commissioner at Monday's commission meeting.

He said the sculpture is obviously a "man and a woman in the act," and that it should be screened from public view.

But commission chairman Mike Radziewicz countered, asking, "Should we make farmers put a fence around the barnyard because the animals are copulating?"

Ruidoso's Planning Director Cleatus Richards said there is nothing in the village ordinances to control this particular art "situation."

"She's not in any violation of any rule, code or ordinance in town," he said.

The discussion erupted at the close of the commission meeting after Garrett petitioned the village to vacate (close public access) Pine Street as a city road.

The short street has poor visibility and small children play in the road while waiting for their school buses at the Sudderth Drive intersection, she said.

Commissioners denied her request, but said they would ask the school administration to move the bus stop.

They said the street is the only

downtown connection to Wingfield Street after Center Street. It is used frequently by police and village maintenance crews also.

Traffic counts on the street are high, with about 1,300 cars passing daily, Richards' staff reported.

But Garrett suggested that traffic has only recently increased because people drive by to "look at my artwork."

At that point, Miller sought to comment on Garrett's art piece, but Radziewicz cut him short saying it was not the commission's place to discuss First Amendment rights.

For the past seven weeks, Garrett has been carving the piece from an 11,000-pound hunk of limestone. Since then, the police department has received about seven complaints, said Police Chief Lanny Maddox.

A local minister also has requested the piece be camouflaged, Garrett said Tuesday. Six village councilors have come by her studio to investigate the sculpture, and Councilor J.D. James asked her to screen it from view.

"I think it's obscene," he said. Garrett said she is carving the yet-unnamed piece for some friends in San Antonio, Texas.

The friends requested a "sensuous" piece for their garden, and after she made a clay model of her idea, they commissioned the work from her.

"As far as I'm concerned, it's beautiful — there's nothing bad about it," she said.

Garrett said the piece now weighs between 8,000 and 7,000

pounds. She chose to carve it outdoors because of its size and the large amount of dust created when chiseling with power tools.

"I can't take the risk of moving it because it might break, and I don't want to hide it — I'm not doing anything wrong," she said.

Miller said because small children are waiting outside her studio for their school bus is all the more reason to have the piece covered.

"Personally, I think she needs some self control," he said.

Miller said he understands the legal definition of pornography is

the showing of genitalia, "but I guess it's an opinion."

He added that the public is forced to view it "without any censorship."

When his third and fifth grade children saw the sculpture, Miller said "it opened up the whole discussion of the birds and the bees."

It was not a lesson he was ready to teach his children, and he charged Garrett was making the "moral decision" for people passing the sculpture.

"At least you got it over with," Radziewicz said.

C-NET still owns about 45 condos, but hopes to sell half of them, Porter said.

His company, currently located at the lodge, will move into one of the condos, Porter added.

Village Annexation

The land deal was finalized the same day Ruidoso's ad hoc annexation committee decided to prioritize annexation of land in Carrizo Canyon.

The lodge and land purchased by Gaim-Ko was annexed by the Village of Ruidoso in 1993, Village Planning Director Cleatus Richards said.

Most of that 40 acres of land borders the reservation, he said.

However, more than 300 acres of land between the village's Apache Park subdivision and the lodge is county land.

This winter, committee members prioritized annexation of the Carrizo land tracts, but the area was third on their list behind Lincoln Tower and Sleepy Hollow.

At their meeting Tuesday morning, committee members agreed to pursue annexation of the Carrizo area before Sleepy Hollow.

Committee chairman Robert Donaldson, who is also a village councilor, said the committee should concentrate on Carrizo to "protect the viability of the town."

He said, "We don't want the area to turn into an industrial area."

Annexing Carrizo Canyon has become more important because of "the potential of development and the evolution of the Ruidoso area,"

Donaldson said.

The canyon road has become a busy entrance into Ruidoso, committee member Mike Radziewicz noted.

"If we did a traffic count out there I think it would begin to rival Mechem Drive," he said.

The committee members said upgrading the road may be necessary, and it could be a cooperative project with the county.

Ruidoso has some control over a 3-mile area around the village, and shares a joint jurisdiction with the county over this extra territorial land.

But the village only controls the planning of subdivisions up to a mile outside its boundaries and building permits up to three miles outside city limits, assistant planning director Derrill Bremner said.

The committee's first priority has been to annex Lincoln Tower and the land on Mechem Drive. Richards has contacted various property owners within the approximately 16 acres of Mechem Drive land, and Richards said all but one land owner has responded favorably.

If more than 50% of an area petitions for annexation, the village can force annexation by ordinance on the remaining tracts, Richards explained.

The property owners said they would like to wait on the final annexation proceedings until January, when the new property tax year begins, Richards said.

Committee members agreed actual annexation could wait until then.

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NEA official calls school board's executive session 'prejudiced'

A national teachers bargaining official accused the Ruidoso School Board of prejudice at Tuesday's school board meeting.

New Mexico National Education Association representative Henry Gonzales attempted to speak at the meeting but board president Ronnie Hemphill would not allow it.

The board and Ruidoso Superintendent of Schools Mike Gladden had just returned from executive session when Gonzales made his accusation.

"I would just like to say this," Gonzales said. "Your decision was prejudiced by the fact that one of the parties to the grievance went into the session with you."

Hemphill told Gonzales to sit down.

Gonzales attempted to respond to the board's decision to deny three, level three grievances. Two were filed by Ruidoso High School (RHS) science teacher Rick Overdorf

and one was filed by the Ruidoso Education Association.

"Henry, we don't run our meetings that way and if you don't sit down, I'll have you removed, by force if I have to," Hemphill said. "Do not interrupt our meeting."

Overdorf filed a grievance because he was transferred and reassigned from full-time science teacher at RHS to half-time science teacher at Ruidoso Middle School and half-time science teacher at RHS.

The second grievance alleged that the transfer and reassignment was a disciplinary action against Overdorf by RHS Principal Ron Hodges.

The third grievance, filed by the Ruidoso Education Association, alleged that the school district had failed to amend its policies regarding article six provisions outlined in the collective bargaining agreement. Article six establishes guidelines for transfers and reassignments.

"The district has not violated

the terms of the collective bargaining agreement," said board member Susan Lutzman. "And the district has not failed to amend its policies to give full force and effect to issues negotiated collectively."

All three grievances were denied by the board.

Hemphill said the board will send a written response to the REA in the next seven days.

"The written response will outline and disclose the thought processes behind this decision and we do not make this decision lightly," he said. "We do not want to discuss the underlying reasons and the thought processes in an open meeting because this is a personnel matter and we do not want to violate employee confidentiality."

On Wednesday, Gonzales said Gladden defended the principal's transfer and reassignment of Overdorf at the initial grievance hearing.

"For the superintendent, who spoke as an opposing party

(against Overdorf) at the initial hearing, to go into executive session is ludicrous," he said.

"If they were going to invite him into the session, they should have invited a representative of the REA," Gonzales said.

Gladden said under state law he had the right to be in the executive session.

"Under state board statutes the superintendent should be in every executive session with the exception of superintendent salary discussions," Gladden said. "I am an extension of the board and I had already given my decision." Gladden added there is "no problem" with his presence in the board's executive session.

"I knew that this would be a question and had it clarified before the meeting," Gladden said.

According to the collective bargaining agreement, the board's decision can be challenged in level four arbitration.

18-year-olds arrested for beating four others

Four Ruidoso 18-year-olds were arrested by warrant Monday for allegedly beating four other Ruidoso residents Friday night, the Lincoln County Sheriff's Office reported.

The victims of the attack had gone to Carrizo Canyon around 11 p.m. with "an agreement to meet behind Rainbow Lake to settle differences" with some other men, Sheriff James McSwane said.

Once they were there, about 30 people affiliated with the suspects appeared and the victims were allegedly attacked with baseball bats and clubs, McSwane said. He added that he believed the fight was "gang related."

Deputies arrested Abselin Chavez, Ricky Davara, Zack Turner and Gabe Aguilar. Each was charged with four third-degree felony counts of aggravated battery and one fourth-degree felony count of conspiracy to commit aggravated battery, McSwane said.

A fifth man was with the victims, but the suspects were not charged with his assault.

McSwane said he expects there will be more arrests in the case.

The four men are being held in lieu of \$10,000 bonds at the Lincoln County jail. The high bonds were set by Ruidoso Magistrate Court Judge William Butts.

"These boys are facing the real world now," Butts said after the arraignments.

Their preliminary hearings will be held at 2:30 p.m., Aug. 17, before Magistrate Judge Gerald Dean at the county court house in Carrizozo.

Victims of the attack included: 21-year-old Shane Eidson, his 14-year-old brother and 15-year-old step-brother, and their friend Mario Sanchez.

Karen Eidson, Shane's step-mother, said the victims suffered minor injuries, and her sons were checked by doctors the next day for possible internal injuries.

McSwane said investigating deputies filed for the arrest warrants after receiving an account of the fight and interviewing witnesses.

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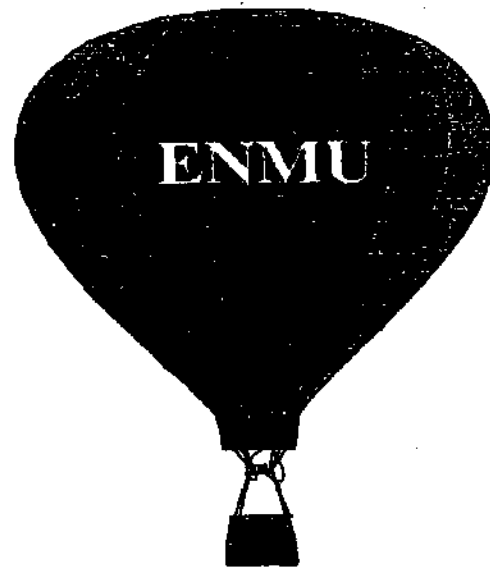

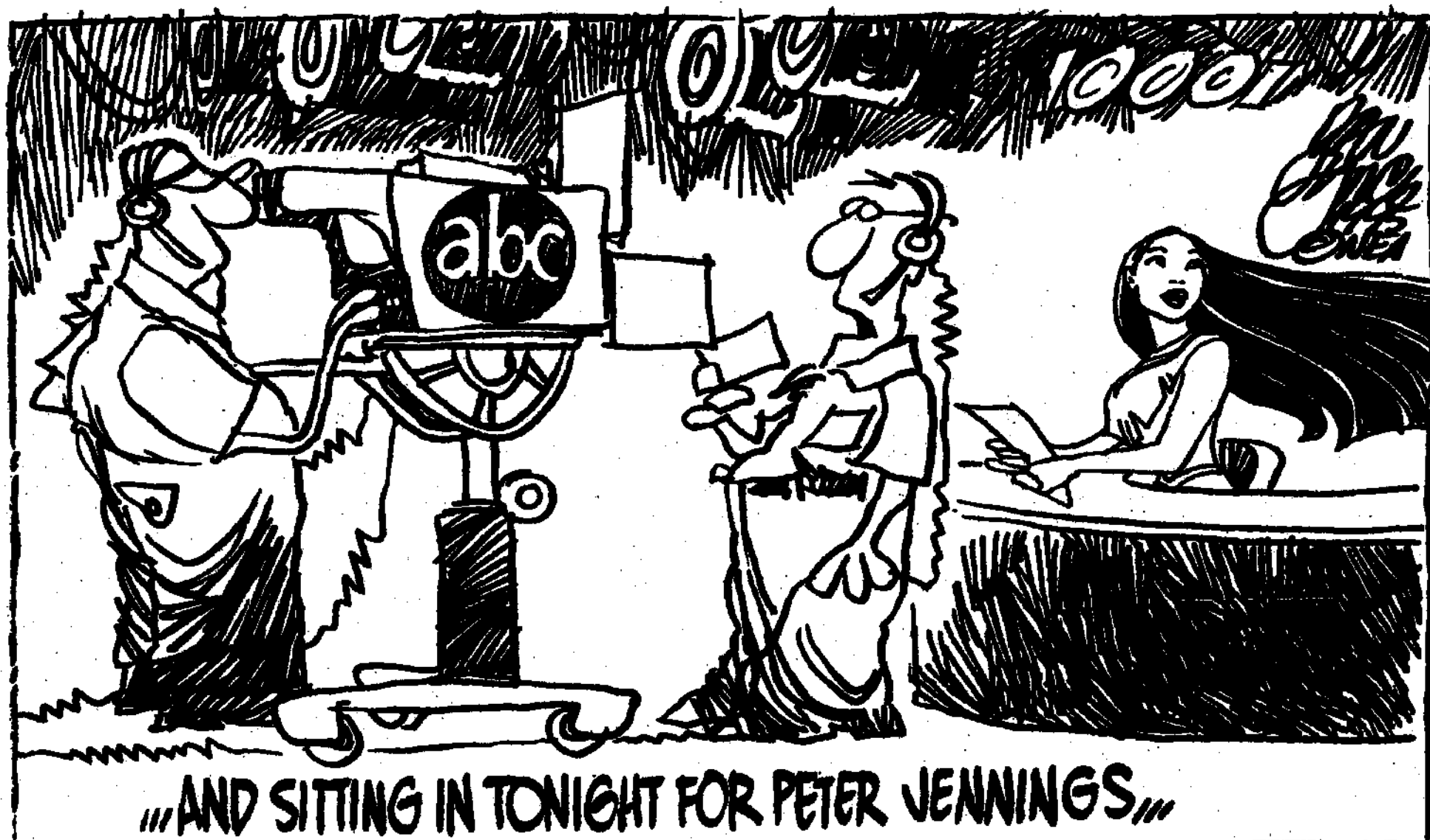

Green Party should keep grassroots focus

It wasn't accidental that representatives of the Green party from 25 states (and not a few foreign countries) chose New Mexico as the site of their recent national convention.

After all, New Mexico voters gave the Greens one of their most impressive showings anywhere in the nation in last year's elections.

The Green party candidate for governor, former Democratic Lt. Gov. Roberto Mondragon, chalked up a respectable 10% of the vote. Even now, some political observers persist in believing that had it not been for Mondragon's presence on the ballot, Bruce King, not Gary Johnson, might still be governor.

It was not Mondragon who proved to be the Greens' star New Mexico vote getter in 1994, however. That distinction belongs to Pat Wolf, one of the state's more level-headed environmental leaders, who picked up a striking 12% in her bid for state land commissioner.

Appropriately, therefore, Wolf was one of the featured speakers at the Green's July 29th conclave in Albuquerque, where party leaders pondered strategies for the upcoming 1996 elections.

Afterward, Wolf explained that "I was asked to discuss some of the problems I encountered in my campaign." To no one's surprise, "money" and "press coverage" were at the top of her list.

The victorious Ray Powell, Jr., she noted, spent some \$200,000 to keep the land office in Democratic hands. "I, on the other hand, had less than \$6,000 to spend on my campaign."

Not that Wolf wouldn't have liked a larger

campaign war chest. "But my problem is that I'm not independently wealthy, don't have wealthy friends, and I didn't accept money from any of the big special interests who customarily finance land office candidates."

Wolf also told Green conventioners that "my second big problem was the lack of attention we got from the state's major news media."

"The Albuquerque Journal and the Associated Press," she later explained to this reporter, "basically ignored my campaign altogether, even though I regularly sent out prepared press releases alerting them to what my campaign was doing and explaining my positions on the major issues in the campaign."

Indeed, said Wolf, "the smaller local newspapers around the state were much more fair in covering my campaign than the mainstream press was. The bigger (media outlets) just write off third-party candidates as unelectable. It becomes a self-fulfilling prophecy."

Money and media attention are the historic bugaboos of third-party candidates, of course. And Wolf knows they will remain major hurdles for the Greens as they gear up for next year's campaigns.

For that reason, Wolf says that she does not support the view, widely held by some top Green party strategists, that "Greens should run somebody for president next year."

Rather, says Wolf, "I told (party leaders) that they should focus on local elections — state legislative races and county commission races — where they have a better chance of actually winning."

As existing state law is written, Wolf notes, New Mexico's Green party, having broken into the double digits with their 1994 votes is now officially defined as a "major party." Some argue that this definition of what constitutes a "major party" in New Mexico says more about the generosity of state law than it does about the future of the Greens in the Land of Enchantment.

Nonetheless in order to retain their official designation as a "major party" in New Mexico, Greens next year must run a candidate of the U.S. Senate and a candidate for state Corporation Commission.

"And under state law, they'll have to do that if they want to keep what they gained last year," Wolf acknowledges.

Still, operating on the theory that success in small ventures eventually adds up to more than defeat in big undertakings, Pat Wolf has given Green party leaders some sage advice.

When the Greens began their 1994 campaign, only some 800 New Mexicans were registered as affiliated with the party. Today, that number stands at more than 2,200. By "major party" standards that's still not many voters.

But Pat Wolf is right when she says, "In continuing to grow, the Green party must play to its local strengths."

In short, the future of the Green party in New Mexico depends upon focus — in where it recruits candidates, spends its scarce campaign dollars and generates attention for its larger cause.

Rules, laws, regulations, etc. are designed, in part, to protect the public from itself. They are also designed to make management of institutions more uniform. That's all well and good but this instance and any instance like this needs to be made an exception.

There is nothing wrong in

making a decision that this school is a benefit to the community and the children/families it serves.

It is honorable and valuable and it, to me, would be an act of outrageous abuse and discomposure (sic) to force a valuable community asset like Starlite Montessori into changing and bending to comply with rules simply because the rules exist.

As a matter of fact, that the rules exist does not make them good, fair, just, intelligent or desirable. And I feel that an exception to the rules is well within your jurisdiction and that you are able to make a favorable decision regarding this issue.

You may claim that there is little you can do and I would reject that claim point blank: You CAN make a difference and you CAN be fair to our school.

I hope you choose to exercise that option and allow this school, which has operated without incident for 12 years, to continue serv-

ing our community.

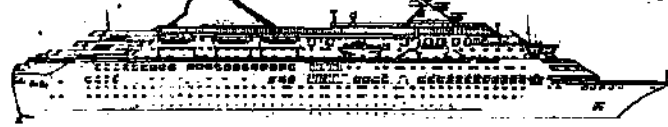

A glimpse into Lincoln County's past, compiled by Polly E. Chavez with excerpts from "A History of Lincoln County Post Offices."

Corona

In 1888, the people of the Corona community had to go to Pinos Welle or White Oaks for their mail. A stagecoach carried mail from Las Vegas to White Oaks coming through the mountains west of Corona to Pinos Welle.

Oftentimes a patron would board the hack at Corona with writing materials, ride the 20

miles northwest to Pinos Welle, call for their mail, answer it, and then ride the stage back home.

This route was known locally as the "Gringo Mail." In 1902 the Corona Post Office was established in the front of a store owned by Frank A. Dubois, who was the first postmaster.

The village hall now stands on the site of the first post office.

On Sept. 20 1864, the office was moved into a new building about one block north of the old one. This office now serves some 500 patrons and is the northernmost office in Lincoln County.

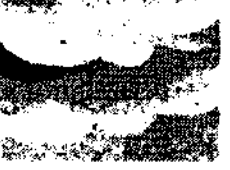

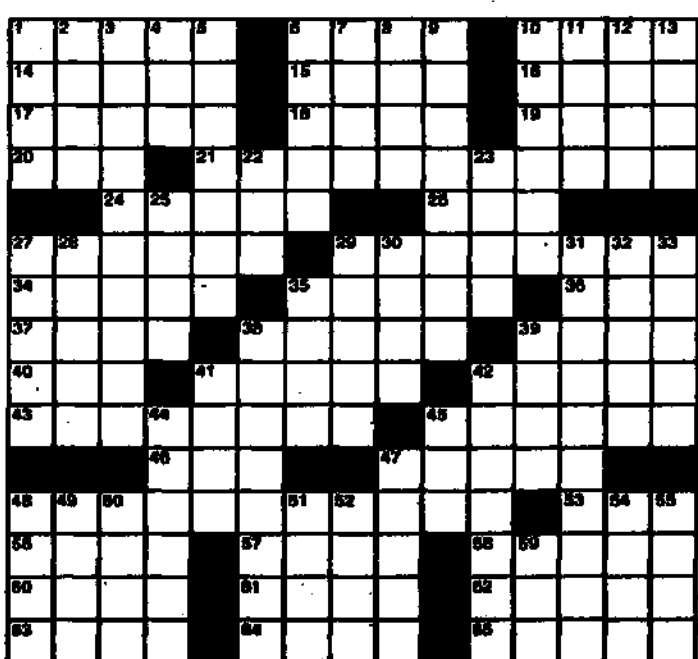

School bells ring Wednesday

Capitan students will see some new faces and other changes when they report to school Wednesday.

Lunch and breakfast prices have gone up. High school classes will start 15 minutes earlier, at 8 a.m.

"Becca Ferguson is our new elementary principal," said Supt. Diana Sonnamaker Billingsley. She replaces Jerry Newsom, who retired. Although Ferguson has been on staff at the elementary school as a teacher, this will be her first year in the principal's chair.

Two popular teacher/coaches, Pam Allen and Ron Becker, have moved to different school districts.

Rick Berglund, who previously taught in Ruidoso, will be taking over Becker's gifted program duties and Gerald Montes, high school counselor, will handle his job as boys head basketball coach.

Bryan Masse from Lovington High will replace Allen as head volleyball and girls track coach. He also will teach health and physical education.

Other new teachers include:

— Buddy Little from Tatum will teach high school math and biology, and coach junior high football and junior high basketball.

— Dionne Lewis from Clovis will teach middle school English and coach junior varsity volleyball, girls basketball and girls track.

— Dale Jackson from Hobbs will

take over middle school social studies, high school government and will coach middle school football, basketball and track.

— Cindy Jackson, Dale's wife, will teach first grade.

— Gretchen Guitard will teach fifth grade.

"We still haven't hired a band and music director," said high school Principal Darrel Stierwalt. "We're still interviewing and we're looking for a middle school special education teacher."

Despite new people in the classroom and a tight budget, the number and types of classes offered will stay about the same, Sonnamaker said.

The district lost enrollment because Fort Stanton state hospital closed last March and many families were forced to relocate for new jobs.

District officials expect to see about 530 students push through the school doors the first day.

"We budgeted on an enrollment of 531, but we probably will have more," Billingsley said. "We have 551 on our books now, but we don't know how many of those may have left the area. Most of our students report before Labor Day."

Billingsley wants students to watch where they're walking when they arrive.

"We're landscaping around the middle school and students need to stay off that area and give it a

chance to grow," she said.

The prices for breakfast and lunch went up by different amounts, depending on grade level.

Everyone will pay 75 cents for breakfast. Elementary students will pay \$1.25 for lunch and secondary students, \$1.50.

The increase in meal prices will reduce an estimated \$15,000 subsidy of the cafeteria from general operating money.

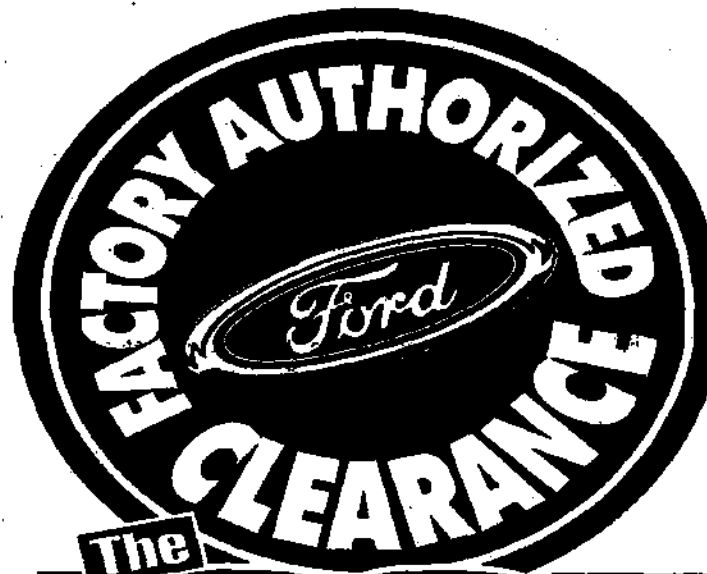
Free and reduced-price lunches are available for qualifying families. The program reduces the price to 30 cents for breakfast and 40 cents for lunch.

Eligibility for the reduced meal price program is based on the number of people in a household. An eligibility breakdown is available at all of the schools. Applications should be submitted to the food service director.

The first class at Capitan Middle School will start at 8:05 a.m. Sixth period will end at 2:20 p.m. A study hall/activity period is scheduled from 2:25-3:15 p.m.

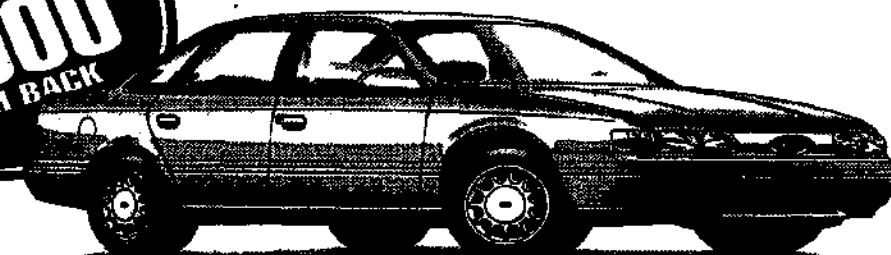
Elementary classes begin at 8 a.m., with breakfast served from 8:15 a.m. Students will be dismissed at 3:10 p.m.
