When autumn colors of gold and crimson erupt throughout the forest landscape surrounding Ruidoso, thousands of visitors begin the pigrimage to view
natural glory of the season

The yearly transformation
The yearly transformation of lea colors, plus annual Aspen
fest, Cowboy Symposium and Oktoberfest celebrations, could bring as many as 40,000 people to the region during October, Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Com merce officials predict.
Leaves shifting from green to golden are triggered by the change in the weather. Colder nights and shorter days cause trees to cease manufacturi
chlorophyll, the sunlightchlorophyll, the sunlightgathering pigment that gives
leaves their greanish color This leaves their greenish color. This lack of chlorophyll soon causes the reds, yellows and golds asso ciated with autumn.
Along with oak and maple aspens are among the most prominent of the trees that change color. Aspen trees are the most videly distributed native tree in North America, and besides boing beautiful, they are a critical part of plant and animal cammaid

During the winter, aspen groves and forests provide food for rabbits, deer, elk and birds buds, twige and bark of the

- Monjeau Lookout: This site can be reached by traveling north off Ski Run Road on a fiveme, bumpy gravel road leading to an old fire lookout station. Visitors can walk among the aspens and others are visible

bring as many as 40.000 people to the region.

## Reaping the harvest

Fall is a time to celebrate the summer's harvest and marvel at the golden colors in the mountains.
While surrounding valteys still celebrate the traditional harvest of frit and grains, we in Ruidoso look back at a different kind of havest: tourists.
A tourism-based economy is great as long as we keep in mind that even this clean economy has its inherent problems to keep in check (such as an unstable tax base, a need for an oversized utility infrastructure, and low-income jobs in the service industry). Like farmers and ranchers, the tourism industry depends on the weather, but to a lesser extent. And we sometimes want different weather than what's good for the fields. This weekend we're hoping the aspens are in their prime.
Judging from the latest gross revenue tax statistics (a $4 \%$ increase for January through July vs. 1994), Ruidoso has seen a modest increase in tourism. The gross recelpts tax is similar to a sales tax. June was gross recelpis tax
These statistics may be indicators of where the community needs to add events, as officials start to plan now projects with the help of a newly hired special events coordinator.
October seems to have plenty of events already, and they are some of the locals' favorites: Aspenfest, the Lincoln County Cowboy Symposium and Oktoberthe Lit
The first two celebrate some of this county's inherent attractions: nature and the West. That's the angle officials need to keep as they think about new ovents. They should seek plenty of public input, too, since this kind of planning would attract some fun deas.
This weekend features Aspenfest, part of which can be interpreted as a celebration of the chile harvest. If you want to clear your sinuses and smell that fall in the air, the state Chill Cookoff and roasted chiles are the ticket.
The parade, crafts fair and hot rod display are friendly, laid-back ways to welcome fall. We hope you all enjoy the weekend - and take time out to see nature's contribution to Aspenfest in the surrounding forest.

# Taste the Southwest at the chili cookoff \&fos

 Ruldoso Nows Staff WriterGyes will water and tongues will bum in Ruidoso this weekend as vats of red chili and savory meat are served up during the 14th annual New Mexico State Open Chili Cookoff.

The cookoff will be at the Tall Pines Trailer Park on Sudderth Drive. It runs 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. Saturday, Oct. 7, and 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. Sunday, Oct. 8. Visitor entry cost is \$2.

Chili cookoff chairman Paul Crown expects to get about 100 entries in the contest, alonggide as many as 3,500 visitors.
"This is a prestigious cookoff," Crown said. "lt's where a lot of chiliheads come."
The cookoff follows guidelines prepared by the Chili Appreciation Society International (CASD). Participants must use red chiles, and no fillers - rice, beans or macaroni - are allowed.

Cooks use most every type of meat to make their dish stand out, Crown said.
"Tve seen elk, deer, beef, pork, armadillo, and snake," he said. "Theyll cook about anything that will cook in a pot:"
Teams from as far away as Washing: ton, Arkansas, Arizona, Texas and California are expected to pay the $\$ 20$
cookoff fee, Crown said. Entries will be accepted right up to the start of the cooks' meeting at 9 a.m. on Oct. 7 .
The championship's top three winners will immediately qualify for the World Championship next November in Terlingua, Texas.
This year's Ruidoso contest is dedicated to Tex Scofield, CASP's official "Mouth of the Chili World," who died four months ago, Crown said.
All proceeds from the event will go to the Ruidoso Rotary Scholarghip Fund. Last year's contest raised about \$2,600 for the fund, Crown said.
Cooking teams prepare 2.3 gallons of chili, so there's plenty to go around.
Although visitors won't be able to taste the stews until $2: 15 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{m}$. (about two hours after cooking teams tum in samples for judging), a concession stand will sell "festival food," sodas and beer all day.

Also, music by Lone Star Express vill begin after the parade and continue until 5 p.m. Saturday, except for a break during chili showmanship judging from noon to 2 p.m.
Chili tasting will cost a quarter a spoonful and will last until 3:30 p.m.

Brilliant paint johs, rejuvenated engines and plenty of chrome roll into town Aspenfest weekend for the "Run to Ruidoso Rod Run Saturday at School House Park.
More than 300 customized classic cars and hot rods are expected to participate in the eighth annual Ruidoso rod run, which is co-sponsored by Early Time Street Rod Association of EI Paso and the Southern New Merico Street Rod Association of Las Cruces.
"We will draw cars out of Texas, New Merico, Arizona, Colorado, Oklahoma, and we might even get a car out of California," said Ron Duschay, a member and director of the Early Time club.
Only cars built in 1969 or earlier are allowed to participate in the rod run. Owners of the vehicles will vie for up to 25 trophies in a variety of categories.
The Ruidoso rod run competition won't be judged like a typical car show which judges vehicles by classes, Duschay said. Club members will make trophies and decide the winners. For erample, a club member might decide to give a trophy for the "Best Flames" painted on a vehicle. That member will make the trophy and choose the winner.
Duschay expects $15-20$ clubs from around the Southwest to attend.
"The people scem to like it up there (Ruidoso), and they always look forward to coming to the mountaing," Duschay said of the rod run's participants.

Owners of the street rodders spend from $\$ 10,000$ to $\$ 40,000$ rebuilding and painting the vehicles, said Duschay, who has a 1947 Chevrolet pickup under construction.

Car enthusiasts can catch their first glimpse of the fancy vehicles starting Friday. Registration begins at $2 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{m}$. at the Inn at Pine Springs, located on U.S. Highway 70 in Ruidoso Downs. Registration continues from 8 a.m. to noon Saturday at the School House Park on Sudderth Drive near the Ruidoso library and pool. All the souped-up sets of wheels will be parked at School House Park Saturday.

At 1 p.m. Saturday, participants will drive to five locations for a "Poker Run" around Ruidoso. At each stop, drivers draw a playing card. When they return, whoever has the best poker hand wins. Trophics will he given out sometime between 4:30 and 5 p.m., Duschay said, and then the gathering ends.
"We really encourage members to drive up there (to Ruidoes) and drive around town. That's what we feel like rodding is all about - driving your car," Duschay said.

Cookoff winners will be announced by Crown between 4 p.m. and 5 p.m.
Anyone interested in being a contest judge is welcome to show up at the rock house at the trailer park around 2 pm. Saturday, Crown said.

About 80 judges are needed for the contest, because different groups are used for the preliminary, semi-final, and final judging.

Eighty artisans will be showcased during the 10th Annual Ruidoso Arts and Craftis Fair, part of the town's colorfill Aspenfeat.
The calchration of nature's gilding of the agpans draws thousands of people to the mountain village each year. Pair chairperton Bonnic Richardson expects about 5,000 people to pay the $\$ 1$ admission foe and pass through the arts and crafts fair entrance.
Staged under the pines along Sudderth Drive across from the Gazebo Shopping Center, the fair will run from 9 a.m. to $5: 30$ p.m. Saturday, Oct. 7, and from 9:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. Sunday, Oct. 8.
Each artist has paid a fee to erhibit. The profits will be donated for equipment and to pay off the building owned by the Ruidoso Gymnastics. Association, a non-profit group.
All items displayed must be handcrafted, Richardson said.
The booths will feature furniture, woodwork, caramics, pottery, painted clothing, charcoal drawings and watercolors, Christmas pieces, Southwestern bowls and trunks, dolls, llowers, quilts, quilted pillows, polished rock pieces and many more categories.
Some of the most unusual items will
be found in the booth of Earl Lusk of Roswell.
The contractor trumed artisan creates intriguing woodan jowedry bores shaped like trees with compartmonts, drawars and traye in overy nook.

What started as a hobby led to Lusk's participation in arts and crafts fairs 12.13 years ago, he said from his office in Roswell, where he works for the Roswell School District.
The tree bores came later.
"I had a nightmare one night" he said. "I was lying there in the middle of the night thinking about problems and I thought, You know, it would be real cute.'
"We made the first one seven or eight years ago to test the water. It sold the first day. I talked the guy into letting me keep it through the weekend so 1 could show other people, and it's just kind of taken of from there.".

The boxes are made of exotic woods such as purple heart and zebra, he said.
"They're very popular," Lusk said, "They range from our small box in the $\$ 15$ range as high as $\$ 500-\$ 600$, depending on the complerity.
"We also do the usual things, the cutting boards, reindeer and such."
His first involvement with an arts and cratts fair was on the promotional end with the Roswell Jaycees (Junior

Chamber of Commerco).
"Then I got too old for Jaycees and startod participating as an artist," Lusk said. "Sinco then, we've taken over two shows in Roswell and promote those down here, as well as participate in other fairs."

Ruidoso is one of Lusk's favorite stops and produces appreciative crowds each year, he said.

Dina Ortega of San Patricio will be a
now exhibitor this year with dried Iorals, pillows and dolls, Richardson said.
Faye Nowberry of Alamogordo will return with her outstanding Indian dolle, clothing and parcelain. Another familiar name, Vichi Conley, will show off her distinct signature pottery.

Refreshments will be on sale by the gymnastic boosters at the entrance to the fair.
