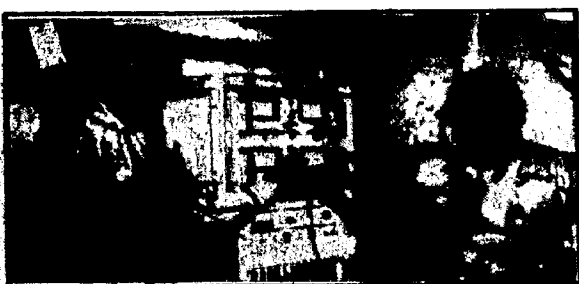


Officials ask residents to conserve water during Alto Lake repairs.

Inmates nix paying for ankle monitors

Lincoln County jail inmates aren't interested in the opportunity to stay at home wearing ankle monitors, because they have to pay for the cost of joining the pilot program, County Manager Carolin Cooney told commissioner last week.

Commissioners hoped the program would reduce the jail's population. About three months ago, they authorized detention center administrator Wayland Hill to try it and see if it worked.

The county has the option to pay for the program, Cooney said. But commissioners stuck to their contention the inmates should pay, in exchange for more freedom.

Chairman Monroy Montes told Cooney to check on the system used in Otero County, because it seems to be working there.

Woman survives wilderness ordeal

Survival techniques taught by her boyfriend helped a lost Rio Rancho woman survive a frigid night in the White Mountain Wilderness over the weekend.

Charlene Romero was found about 10 a.m. Saturday in the Nogal Canyon area by members of the Lincoln County Sheriff's Posse, said Dave Travis, a field coordinator for White Mountain Search and Rescue.

Romero became separated from her boyfriend, Mike Brown of Los Lunas, about 10:30 a.m. Friday as he was hunting. Brown reported the woman missing to the State Police after searching for her unsuccessfully for more than four hours.

"Fortunately, Ms. Romero was dressed warmly for the ordeal and spent the night covered with leaves and limbs in a shallow depression she had scraped out in line with survival instructions taught by her boyfriend," Travis said. "She was carrying a few candy bars, but no water or matches."

Several other volunteer groups joined the search in the rugged area north of Indian Creek where night temperatures hit the low teens, he said. A helicopter from the 48th Air Rescue Wing at Holloman Air Force Base transported Romero back to the search base camp, reuniting her with her son, Rico Romero, and Brown.

Ironically, the rescue group passed out survival brochures in the Indian Creek area Friday.

Principal sues state policeman for DWI arrest

The principal of Ruidoso's Nob Hill Early Childhood Center contends a New Mexico State Police officer violated his civil rights by arresting him for DWI last September.

Principal Roger Sowder filed a lawsuit for punitive damages Oct. 31 in Lincoln County District Court against Officer Michael Ramirez. He accused Ramirez of ignoring a breath analysis test showing he was not legally intoxicated.

The driving while intoxicated charge against Sowder was dismissed by Ruidoso Magistrate Judge William Butts, said Gary Mitchell, Sowder's attorney.

"Our position is that once the officer found out (Sowder) was not intoxicated, he should have dismissed the complaint, but he refused," Mitchell said Friday. "From the information I have, (the approach seems to be) once they pick up somebody, even if evidence shows the person is innocent and should be released, they don't want to do so for fear of being sued."

"They file a complaint to convince a judge there's something there. I find that behavior outrageous, ridiculous and unconstitutional."

"I don't want any more innocent people arrested and I admire (Sowder's) courage in taking a stand in hopes that it will prevent it from happening to another innocent person."

Ramirez arrested Sowder for driving while intoxicated on Sept.

18 as the principal was driving on State Road 48.

The officer stopped Sowder, claiming he had clocked his car at 52 mph in a 30 mph zone, according to information in the suit. Ramirez told Sowder he smelled alcohol and Sowder explained he had a glass of wine with his dinner. The officer administered a battery of field sobriety tests, which he claimed Sowder failed.

In the suit, Sowder contended Ramirez exposed him to public humiliation and ridicule by requiring him to perform the sobriety tests on the side of the road "in full public view," with only the headlights of the patrol car providing light.

Sowder was taken to jail and tested on the Intoximeter 300 machine. He scored a .04 reading, half of the legal intoxication threshold of .08.

Despite the result, Ramirez filed criminal charges against Sowder, who was fingerprinted, photographed and booked into jail until he posted bond, Mitchell said.

The suit contends Ramirez violated Sowder's right to be free from unreasonable searches and seizures, that he acted maliciously and has "demonstrated a consistent pattern of violating the civil rights of motorists as a direct result of his overzealous enforcement (of laws) to the injury, ridicule and humiliation of numerous motorists."

Capt. William Relyea of the State Police in Alamogordo said the department does not comment on civil suits.

Father remembers fallen son

World War II veteran Romeo Klein knows the high price of freedom.

His son Jerome "Donnie" was killed in 1971 when his tank was blown up in Vietnam. Jerome Don Klein's name now prefixes Ruidoso's Veterans of Foreign War Post #7072.

He was only 21 when he died. "They said he was burned up pretty bad," Klein relates.

Donnie was the only native Ruidosoan to die in the Vietnam War.

Klein remembers his son, drafted into the Army in 1970, every day — especially on holidays like Veterans Day.

"Veterans Day is a celebration for those living; Memorial Day is to remember those who died," the Marine says. "But of course on Veterans Day, we also remember those who died."

"Time heals, but still, you think."

Back in 1944 on the South Pacific island of Saipan, Klein was injured in action, and later received a Purple Heart and the Presidential Unit Citation Medal. He was wounded by exploding artillery shell, which

pierced his right leg with shrapnel.

He was sent to Hawaii for surgery and recuperation, and over a six-month period his leg healed.

Despite his injury and the horrors of war, Klein remembers his four years in the Marines as a peak experience.

"I wouldn't trade it for anything — my best experience," he says.

He returned to Ruidoso, married Catherine Randolph in 1945, and began working for the Bureau of Indian Affairs in Mesquero.

The Kleins raised seven children who learned of their dad's war experiences in Saipan, as well as battles in Tarawa and Tinian. Donnie proudly watched his father juggle his responsibilities while remaining very active in veteran's affairs.

"We wanted Donnie to go to school," Klein recalls. "But he said, 'No, I'm going to do my two years and when I come back I'll finish on the GI Bill.'"

He set his sights on being a Marine, but was drafted by the Army before he got to enlist.

Klein respected his son's desire to fight for his country

and says he wouldn't have tried to stop him.

"It would be like telling your daughter she can't marry someone she loves," he says. "I've always been a believer in freedom."

Today, Klein remains active in veteran's affairs, serving as the finance officer for the American Legion, which has 52 area members; the adjunct treasurer for the Disabled American Veterans, which has 85 local members; and the quartermaster for the VFW, which has 64 members.

Like many veterans, Klein grimaces when he thinks about the effects of U.S. Veterans Administration cuts.

"My feeling is, there shall always be wars and wars and wars and wars," he relates. "I'm still much in favor of freedom, which has a high cost, and the country has to be willing to pay."

During the days of World War I, the nation's attitude was "nothing's too good for the veteran," Klein recalls. "Now they say they're still trying to protect our rights while cutting a lot of benefits."

"If this continues, I don't know who will be fighting."

Private lessee sought for Glencoe Rural Events Center

The Rural Events Center in Glencoe will be advertised Jan. 1 for lease.

Lincoln County Commissioners last week approved a draft of the request for proposals to lease the 16,800 square-foot building and 10,800 square-foot canopied area about 12 miles east of Ruidoso on U.S. 70.

The county purchased the property for \$250,000 more than a year ago with money allocated by the state Legislature. Commissioners at that time hoped to expand and improve the building to keep it rented for events throughout the year.

Although the electric wiring was improved, major construction such as a proposed indoor arena has been too expensive to undertake. But without more amenities, it's been difficult to attract renters.

Two months ago, commissioners said they would consider leasing the facility to offset annual operation costs, and possibly to start accumulating money for larger improvement projects at the former horse sales barn.

The county will consider lease proposals of 1-25 years.

Nine criteria will be used to rank the proposals. Up to 15 points each may be awarded for:

- the length of the lease;
- the rental fee offered;
- plans that include repairs, renovations, rehabilitation or new construction of buildings;

- and proposals that reflect plans for community involvement, attracting other economic activities into the area and bring the greatest number of jobs.

Up to 10 points each can be earned for proof of financial responsibility, a comprehensive plan for normal maintenance of buildings, and other unspecified incentives. Up to five points can be awarded for a fire protection and site security plan, and for a proposal that provides for the continued use of the premises by the annual Lincoln County Cowboy Symposium.

The deadline for proposals is 3 p.m., March 1. A review committee will meet March 4, and its recommendation will be submitted to the commission at its meeting March 5.

Commissioners allocated \$5,000 to cover advertising for bids.

In other business, the commission:

- learned that Wayland Hill, administrator of the Lincoln County Detention Center, has been named vice president of the South Central Juvenile Task Force.

- appointed Van Shamblin to the District 4 seat on the county planning and zoning board.

Commission Chairman Monroy Montes suggested reducing the number of board members from seven to five.

- reappointed four commission district representatives of the county public lands advisory committee: Rex Wilson, Bob Hollis, David Koch, Israel Miranda; and two at-large members, Carl Stubbs and Tom Sidwell. Dick Swenor was a new district appointment.

- heard a gloomy report from Tony Elias of the Southeastern New Mexico Economic Development District, about availability of state money next year.

- had to reschedule a review of several road requests from residents, because Commissioner Stirling Spencer did not attend the drive-through session two weeks ago.

Three commissioners must attend as members of the review committee.

County Attorney Alan Morel suggested returning to the previous system of assigning the duty to a citizen volunteer board. He said that would avoid having the same commissioners making recommendations and decisions.

But the majority of commissioners said they prefer seeing the situations firsthand before voting.

Water conservation requested during Alto Lake repair work

As Alto Lake is drained and a new valve control tower is built, Ruidoso officials want residents to use water more conservatively.

Conservation steps include:

- voluntary watering on calendar days that correlate with your house number. The odd-even outdoor watering system allows those with addresses ending with odd numbers to water on odd-numbered days, etc;

- watering outdoors only between 8 p.m. and 6 a.m.;
- reduced municipal uses of water;

- verbal warnings from the water department for poor watering practices, such as watering on

streets, sidewalks, etc.

— and suspension of water leak credits.

Construction will begin next week, said Assistant Village Manager Alan Briley. A five million gallon water storage tank at the site will also be rehabilitated.

Briley said the lake was already empty, as it usually is at this time of year. Area water wells are already being taxed, and with the temporary loss of the storage tank, extra water conservation efforts are necessary.

The Grindstone Lake Treatment Plant is also working to treat "as much as it can" right now, Briley said. It treats more than one million gallons a day. It will be expanded in the next year to treat

about two million gallons a day.

The new Alto Lake tower will provide three levels of water inlet valves, "so we can pick and choose the level of water quality we need," Briley said.

Water quality changes with depth, Briley said, with more oxygen at the upper levels and heavier water at the bottom.

Presently, the reservoir only has one valve at the very bottom of the lake.

The lake is owned by the Eagle Creek Inner Community Water Supply Association, Inc. Its joint powers agreement is upheld by the villages of Capitan and Ruidoso, with three people from each community representing the board.

Know what you're getting when you purchase cord of firewood

The process of buying wood can confound mountain newcomers.

George Duda with the Bernalillo District of the New Mexico State Forestry offered advice for new buyers.

For less impact on the environment, wood should be cut into smaller pieces and air dried (seasoned) for at least six months, Duda said.

If it is not properly dried, wood produces less heat, increases fire danger and creates more air pollution, Duda said.

"This instant drying out in your fireplace or woodstove results in up to 25% of the heat value of your wood purchase going to waste."

Duda recommended installation of smoke and carbon monoxide detectors in every home with woodburning.

"This instant drying out in your fireplace or woodstove results in up to 25% of the heat value of your wood purchase going to waste," Duda said. "Plus, the combination of water vapor and wood smoke will condense in your chimney in the form of potentially dangerous creosote, which can accumulate over time and lead to chimney fires."

"Emissions from damp or green wood greatly add to smoky conditions in residential areas."

- Other hints for efficient burning include:
- keep fireplaces or wood-burning units in good working order;
 - keep your chimney clean;
 - use approved screening around chimneys and stove flues to prevent the release of sparks;
 - and operate an air-tight EPA-approved unit with maximum air to reduce the amount of smoke dumped into the atmosphere.

If you don't have year-old firewood, it should at least be collected in May or June so it will be seasoned by October, Duda said. He suggested storing a year's supply of wood ahead.

Permits are required to cut wood on public land. Carry a letter of permission from a landowner if cutting on private land.

Firewood is sold by the cord, which translates to 128 cubic feet. Depending on the size of the cut, when stacked, the load should measure 4 feet wide by 4 feet high by 8 feet long, or 2x4x16.

Some people judge a woodpile's size by the way it fills a truck. Small pickup beds without racks hold about a third of a cord, Duda said. Full-size pickups without racks carry about a half cord.

To be sure about the amount of wood being purchased, measure the width, length and depth of the pickup bed and multiply the three values together to determine the cubic footage. Deduct for spare tires, fender wells and truck boxes. Then divide this number by 128 to determine the fraction of a cord the truck holds.

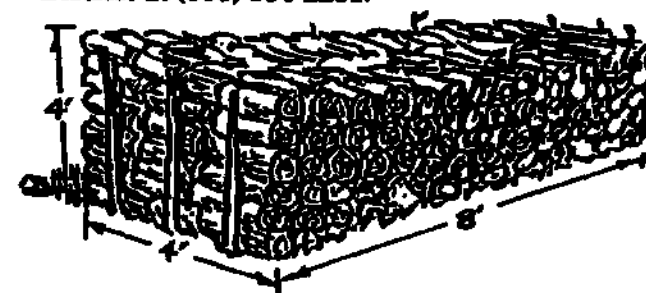
Woodburning choices popular with New Mexico residents are pine, oak, pinyon, juniper and mesquite.

Pecan is an excellent wood for heating fires if a person has access to an orchard when periodic pruning is scheduled. In general hardwoods are better for fire than soft woods.

Hardwoods include ash, red oak, white oak, beech, birch, hickory, hard maple, pecan, dogwood and mesquite. Among softwood, high raters are Douglas fir and southern yellow pine. Juniper, pinyon and western red cedar are rated medium for heat, good to excellent for kindling.

Whatever wood is used, stoves generally give off about three times as much usable heat as fireplaces.

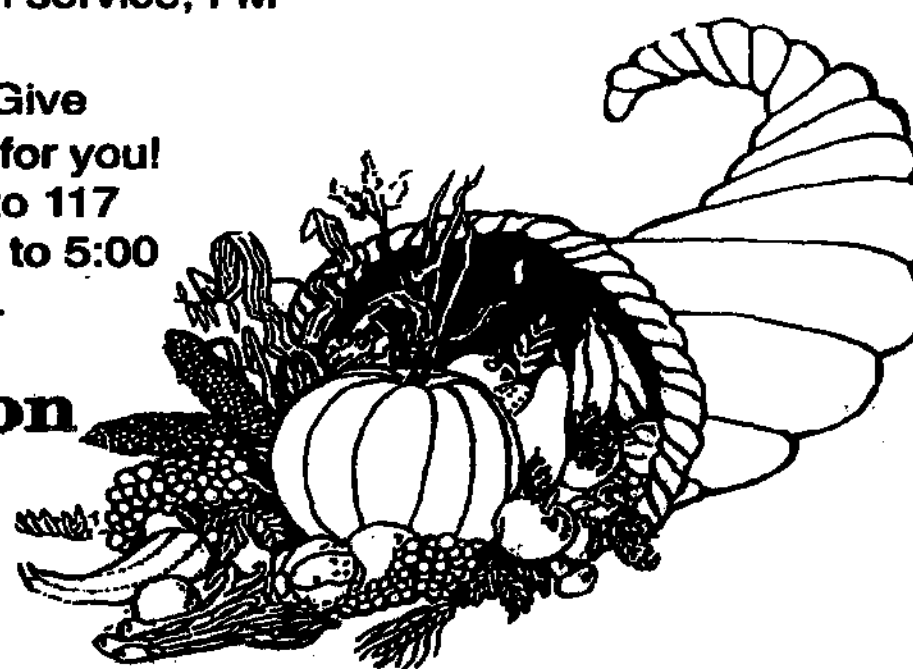

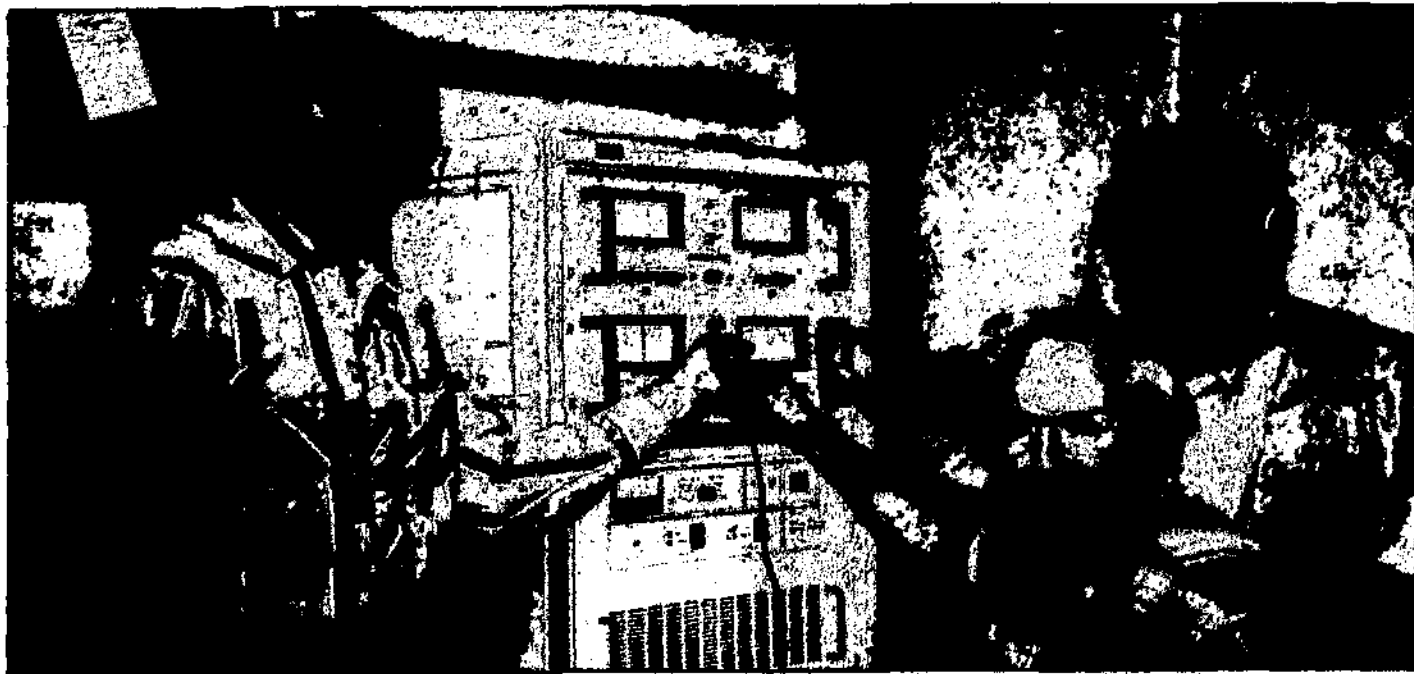

Classical music station seeks monetary, listening support

The hills are alive with the sound of classical music.

Tune in your radio to 95.9 on the FM band and you'll hear something new. KHFM classical radio is on the air 24 hours a day in Ruidoso.

The classical music station does not broadcast locally. KHFM is based in Albuquerque and beamed into Ruidoso via translator, a device which picks up the signal and sends the music through the air after processing it through a 10-watt, state-of-the-art transmitter.

Efforts to bring classical music to Ruidoso began in August 1994 when Eastern New Mexico University-Ruidoso director Jim Miller contacted Dick Weber, a former broadcaster and now a local realtor, and asked if he thought it would be possible to get a classical radio station for Ruidoso.

The Federal Communications Commission (FCC) allows small communities in rural areas that can't afford to start a standard radio station to transmit another

station through a translator, Weber said.

"The laws say that if it's at all possible to receive a distant signal, a community can clean that signal up, reprocess it and rebroadcast it through a very low power transmitter in their area," he said. "But it has to be done by the citizens of the community."

Under FCC laws, even the radio station to be rebroadcast may not help with the effort, Weber said.

An advertisement was placed in *The Ruidoso News* to find out if there was enough interest in classical music to pursue the endeavor, and Friends of KHFM was born.

About 90 people joined Friends of KHFM and the effort to get classical music broadcasting in Ruidoso was underway.

Friends of KHFM gained permission from the FCC for permission to set up the station, and leased space for the translator on a tower located on Buck Hill.

Start-up costs for the station were around \$11,000, with \$5,700 coming from varied contributions.

The rest of the money was donated by Weber and Brian Seale, a retired Los Angeles superior court clerk and now Friends of KHFM treasurer.

"Unfortunately, we had a lot of people who never came through on their pledges," Seale said. "So we are still taking donations."

At 5 p.m. Tuesday, Oct. 10, the group's efforts were rewarded when KHFM was heard for the first time in Ruidoso.

"We've tried our very best to engineer the heck out of it to optimize the 10 watts that we are allowed," Weber said. "One thing we want to get across to the public is that if you can't get KHFM, call us and we'll see that you're able to receive the station."

Friends of KHFM will meet next at 7 p.m. Wednesday, Nov. 29, at Family Practice Center, 304 Sudderth Drive.

"Arts Celebration" planned after Night for Arts kickoff

A major new arts event may debut next November, thanks to the efforts of the Ruidoso Art and Film Board.

The board is applying for a grant to help fund the 1996 Arts Celebration.

Board chairman Jay Wright, the Museum of the Horse director, announced the application at the Art and Film Board's monthly meeting Thursday. The board is seeking a New Mexico Arts Division grant.

In the notification letter, the board describes the event as a "multi-disciplinary arts weekend culminating in a performance by a major arts organization such as the Roswell Symphony."

The letter outlines three goals of the event:

- to highlight various art forms in Ruidoso, organized around an arts celebration theme;

- to create support for the various arts;

- and to establish avenues of communication so various arts organizations and artists can work together.

This Thursday's Night for the Arts at the Museum of the Horse is a mini-festival serving as a preview of next year's arts celebration, the

notification says.

The board is seeking a \$5,000 grant for the 1996 Arts Celebration. The board hopes to generate another \$5,000 through ticket sales and fundraising efforts, and \$5,000 worth of contributed services is expected from artists and performers.

The grant request is based on the recently completed "The Arts in Ruidoso: Needs Assessment" study, which will be formally presented to the Ruidoso Village Council tomorrow.

Study findings indicate the visual arts, theater, and music are the most recognized art forms in Ruidoso, with nearly 70% of respondents identifying those areas. Next in recognition was art, drama and music education at 40%; and dance, film and literature at 33%.

The study calls for the development of "a support network for the arts and local artists in Ruidoso."

It also calls for the creation of "avenues of communication which allow people to work together and serve as a public forum of the arts."

It urges development of "collaborative processes where strength adds to strength and overcomes weakness through multi-disciplinary events which join forces of arts organizations around a central theme."

Conducted by Dr. David Eisler from Portales, the purpose of the study was to determine what arts are located in Ruidoso, the needs of the arts, and what arts are in demand. From July through September, board members canvassed 69 Ruidoso residents and visitors.

The study makes several recommendations, including:

- work closely with the school system;

- develop more activities to publicize the arts;

- host a Celebration of the Arts Week and an annual Ruidoso Poster Contest, with the winner being used in village promotional materials;

- create an arts events calendar;

- and incorporate the arts in tourism and economic development plans.

Eisler will present his findings and recommendations at a public meeting at 4:30 p.m. tomorrow at the Ruidoso Village Hall. Public input is invited, Wright said.

Following the public meeting, Eisler will present the study findings to village council members.

The next Arts and Film Board meeting is at 4:30 p.m. Thursday, Dec. 14 at Ruidoso Village Hall. Call 378-4809 for more information.

Share with Wildlife nets \$37,312 from N.M. tax refunds

Share with Wildlife (SwW), a program that channels state income tax refund donations to wildlife species and programs, received \$37,312 from New Mexico taxpayers for the 1994 tax year.

The figure is a \$1,495 increase from the previous tax year, said program coordinator Claire Tyrpak. For the 1994 tax year, the average individual's donation increased from \$13.03 to \$13.98.

While the increase is good news, the funds pay for only part of the requested projects submitted to the program, Tyrpak said. The Share with Wildlife Task Force, an advisory committee that oversees distribution of SwW funds, selected projects needing \$80,780 in funding for July 1996 through June 1997. Requests for funding totaled more than \$128,000.

Share with Wildlife was implemented in 1981, and has since funded 230 projects. Income held steady at more than \$200,000 through the mid-1990s but is now only about \$35,000 per year — partly because of competing programs for checkoffs on the state income tax form. And while funds have declined the past few years, requests for funding continue to increase.

New Mexico's income tax check-off program is not the only one suffering, Tyrpak said. Nationally, nongame programs are experiencing decreased funding, particularly those reliant on state income tax checkoffs, and some are considering other funding options, such as wildlife license plates.

Friday's semifinal match with Silver marked the fourth time the two teams had met. The Warriors and the Colts split regular season district matches, but the Colts won the district title game and Friday's semifinal.

WHEN SPOTS ARE A PROBLEM

If you see spots in your field occasionally, only a thorough eye examination can determine whether they are harmless or indicate a serious vision problem. Spots or floaters, as they are sometimes called, are usually described as clouded or semiopaque specks or particles within the eye. To some people they appear as dust-like particles, cobwebs, or brilliant crystals. They tend to move across as the eye moves and can be very disturbing when they drift into the field of vision.

They may be particles of protein or other natural materials left floating in the fluid of the eye when the eye was formed before birth. Sometimes the spots or floaters are more noticeable when nearsightedness develops or becomes more severe. Whatever may be causing the spots in your eyes, have this condition checked by your eye doctor to find out if a change in glasses or contact lenses or some other treatment is needed.

Ruidoso Machine Shop opens on Sudderth

For 36 years, Bill Nippes worked as a marine biologist overseeing shellfish and fishery operations for the Alaska Department of Fish and Game.

When Nippes retired from the department three years ago, he and his wife Peggy passed through Ruidoso on the way to El Paso. The couple liked the area so much that they decided to move here to open a machine shop. Ruidoso Machine Shop, which opened in October, is the result of their decision.

"We were tired of living in Kodiak (Alaska) because it's an island and it rains all the time," Nippes said. "We thought that Ruidoso was the place for us and it wasn't the wrong decision."

Nippes' interest in machine shop work goes back several generations, when his ancestors began a gunsmithing mill.

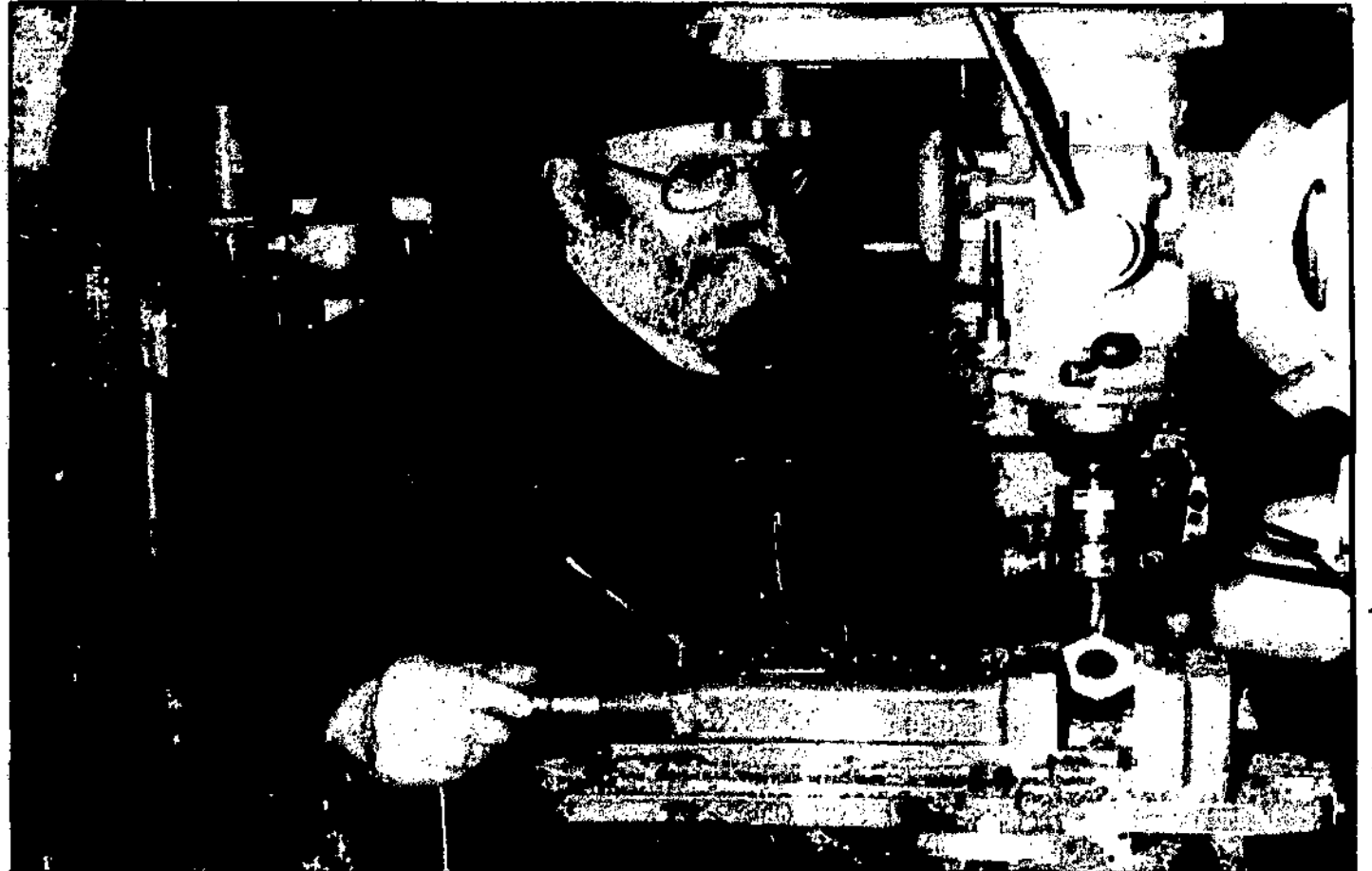
"My great-great-grandfather made the patent models of the Sharp's rifle at the Nippes' Mill outside of Philadelphia," he said. "So I became interested in guns and gunsmithing, and along with that, I became interested in other aspects of machine shop work and it turned into a business."

After working full-time at his fish and game job in Alaska, Nippes used to go home and do machine work all night long, he said.

"Even though I have the shop now, it feels like I'm retired because I have one job instead of two," he said.

Ruidoso Machine Shop does general machine repair work and Nippes' extensive background in hydraulics gives him the edge in being able to solve just about any machine problem that comes his way.

Building automobile drive lines, facing flywheels, cutting gears, and building and repairing printing press shafts are just some of the

things Nippes can do at his shop.

"Just about anything mechanical that is repairable, I can repair," he said.

"I do a lot of wrought iron, security bars, railings and ornamental work," he added.

Nippes' wife designs pot racks, wood holder racks and other household projects which he fabricates and sells.

"I'm willing to make just about anything that somebody might want," he said.

In his spare time, Nippes is rebuilding a 1931 Chevy for use as a shop truck. Other automotive restoration buffs may find his experience and equipment valuable for their own projects.

The spacious work area of Ruidoso Machine Shop has an im-

pressive array of machine tools and shelves filled with Jacob's chucks, drill chucks and other tools of the trade, including a lathe.

"The lathe is set up so I can cut metric, American and British threads," Nippes said. "I can also do very small precision-type work with the lathe, including just about any type of tooling someone might want."

Ruidoso Machine Shop also sports several milling machines, including a portable machine which Nippes uses for jobs in the field.

"I used to use it quite a bit on rock crushers and fishing boats up north," he said. "But if a key gets sheared on a shaft, I can repair it in the field without tearing the machine down."

Nippes' machine shop also has

a tool grinder, surface grinder, hydraulic press, drill presses, large band saw, power hack saw, welding machine, shape cutter and plasma torch.

"With the plasma torch machine, I can cut anything metallic," he said. "It will cut copper, aluminum and stainless steel."

Nippes also makes hand saw blades to order on the premises.

Ruidoso Machine Shop is open from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday. Nippes closes the shop from noon to 1 p.m. for lunch.

"But I'm willing to work on the weekends or at night if somebody needs my services," he said.

October building permits rise

The total value of building permits in Ruidoso rose 94% this October compared to October 1994.

The village issued 97 building permits this October, including commercial and alteration/addition permits, versus 87 permits issued last October.

Single-family home building permits rose from 12 last October to 20 this October, a 6% increase.

For the January through October period, 120 single-family home permits have been issued versus 94 permits by the same time last year, a 28% increase.

Following is a breakout of Oc-

tober construction values:

— New residential construction: \$2,888,239, a 114% increase from October 1994;

— Residential alterations/additions: \$325,890, a 18% increase from October 1994;

— There was no new commercial construction this October. Last year there was \$28,200 in new commercial construction;

— Commercial alterations/additions: \$70,000, a 29% decrease from October 1994;

Overall, construction activity for October of 1995 was \$3,391,532, a 94% increase from the October 1994 figure of \$1,750,452.

Kick the habit with exercise

It's not easy to quit smoking, but the rewards are well worth the effort. Many new ex-smokers find that involvement in a program of regular physical activity enhances their efforts to remain smoke-free and helps them face the challenges of beating a serious addiction.

What kind of exercise is best?

Whatever you enjoy most, have access to and won't associate with smoking. If you have smoked for a number of years, check with your physician before embarking on a course of vigorous exercise. Once you have the go-ahead, get some advice from a fitness professional on designing a program that meets your fitness goals and health concerns.

Aerobic exercise that stimulates the cardiorespiratory system has many benefits, and counteracts some of the damage imposed by a smoking habit. For example, while smoking raises blood pressure, exercise helps normalize it. While smoking increases the rate of plaque build-up in the arteries, exercise slows it down. This doesn't mean that exercise can cancel out the damage if you continue to smoke. But it can help your body heal once you've stopped. Working out at least three times a week will lead to the physical changes we call a training effect. Many new ex-smokers find more frequent exercise helps them manage the stress of quitting.

But quitting smoking is so stressful. Won't adding exercise to my life make me even more stressed?

Most people find that exercise reduces stress, and helps them cope with the difficulties of quitting smoking. But it is important to design an exercise routine that is appropriate for your fitness level and lifestyle. An overzealous beginning often leads to a quick ending as sore muscles and time constraints intrude on your Olympic fantasies. Be realistic about scheduling. Many people find that a mixture of exercise classes and walking on their own makes daily exercise feasible.

Since I quit smoking, I'm too tired to exercise. Fatigue is a common withdrawal symptom, as are irritability, tension, difficulty concentrating and depression. All of these can be good reasons to head for the fitness center. Many exercisers report that exercise calms their

nerves while relieving fatigue. Sometimes it is hard to get started, but you almost always feel better after a workout. *Will exercise keep me from gaining weight if I quit smoking?*

It will certainly help. While not everyone who quits smoking gains weight, it does not hurt to devise a strategy to prevent, or at least reduce, this possibility. Nicotine increases metabolic rate, so some metabolic slow-down often occurs when smoking stops. In addition, hunger accompanied by cravings for sweet foods sometimes increases during nicotine withdrawal. People who have used smoking as an appetite suppressant may be especially distressed at this. Increased hunger plus decreased metabolic rate often equals weight gain.

Exercise helps primarily by burning calories, thus increasing daily energy expenditure. This can help compensate for calories that used to go up in smoke. In addition, exercise may help raise your resting metabolic rate if you increase your muscle tissue mass, such as through weight training. Exercise itself may act temporarily as an appetite suppressant. If helps with blood sugar regulation and, thus, helps reduce craving for sweets.

You'll need to eat. Hot, brothy soups are low in calories and help reduce hunger. So does plain water. Fresh crunchy vegetable sticks help with the munchies, and sugarless gum can reduce a craving for sweets. Regular, healthful, low-fat meals and snacks help prevent the hunger and irritability that go with nicotine withdrawal.

Sometimes weight gain occurs despite good efforts. It may take months to get back to a healthful weight. If this occurs, be kind to yourself and remember why you quit smoking. The health effects of additional body fat are negligible compared to those of smoking. *Will I be the only smoker at the fitness center? Maybe it's not the place for me.*

Although you probably won't see anyone smoking in your exercise classes, you can be sure there are many smokers and ex-smokers in the crowd. The fitness center is a great place for smokers who want to quit because it can supply the social support and smoke-free environment that will help you stick to your resolve. As you work out, visualize success, yourself as an ex-smoker, committed to healthful lifestyle. The fitness center environment can reinforce your resolve to make your health a priority.

LINCOLN COUNTY SCRAPBOOK

A glimpse into Lincoln County's past, compiled by Polly E. Chavez with excerpts from John Haley's 1913 Lincoln County yearbook.

Scipio Salazar was elected county commissioner of district one in Lincoln County in 1900, serving for a term of four years. He was chairman of the board for a portion of his term.

A native of New Mexico, Salazar was born in San Miguel County on Dec. 17, 1847. His family was one of the oldest in the state. His forefathers were among the early Spanish pioneers. He arrived in Lincoln in 1877 and was engaged in

farming and sheep raising. Salazar and his wife, Dolores, had one son and four daughters. He was county treasurer in 1891-94.

Thomas W. Henley was on the board of county commissioners in the early days. He came to Nogal in 1883. In 1913 he was operating Rosedale Gardens. He and his wife had nine children, of whom five were living in 1913.

Henley was justice of peace at Nogal for many years and postmaster for 18 years. He was a native of Missouri. He was born Oct. 24, 1840. He was educated at Montgomery College.

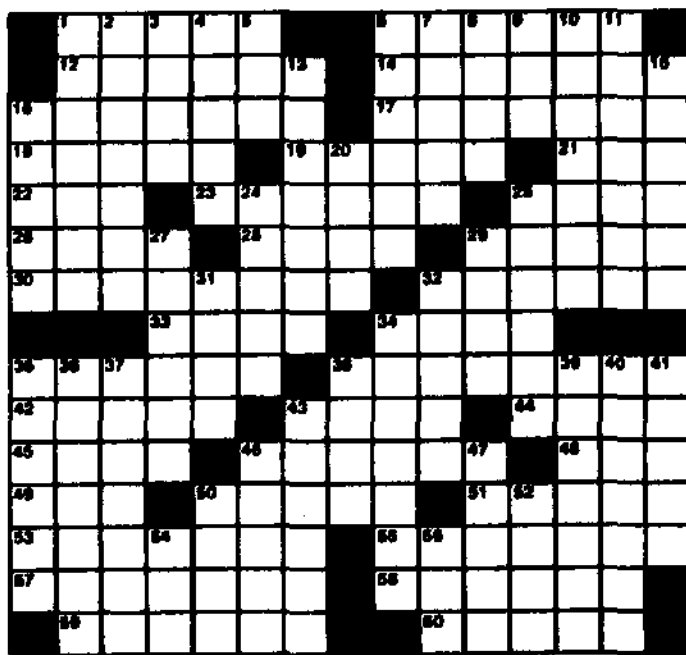

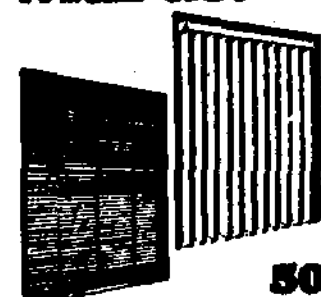

Ruidoso School Board votes on election day

Every three years, New Mexico school districts must hold a special two-mill election asking voters to renew a capital improvements tax.

The Ruidoso School Board will vote tomorrow on a resolution to hold its tax election on Tuesday, Feb. 6, 1996.

He has a strong ethic for active listening, open communications and public service. This was apparent in his recent family meetings with

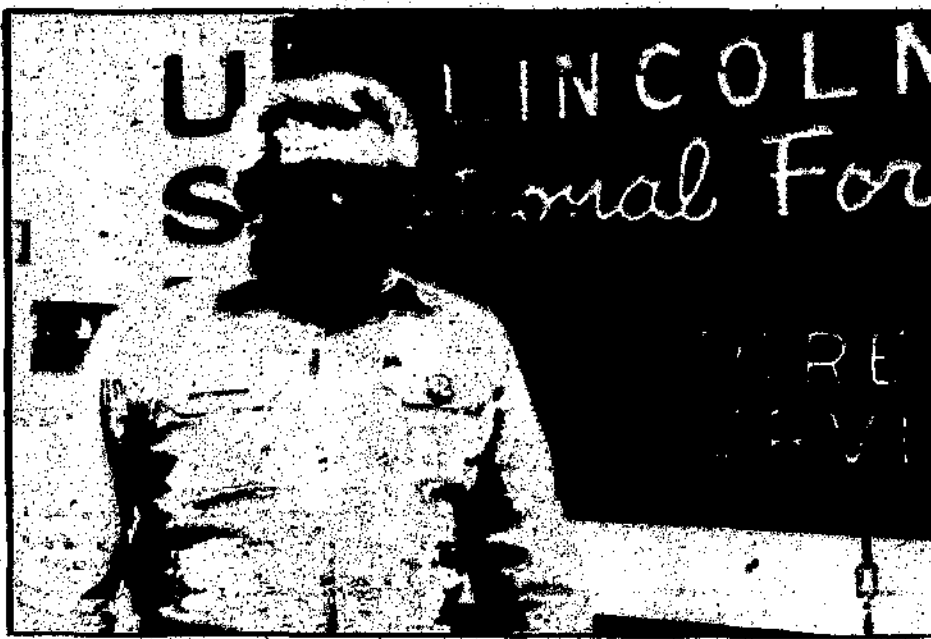
first employees.

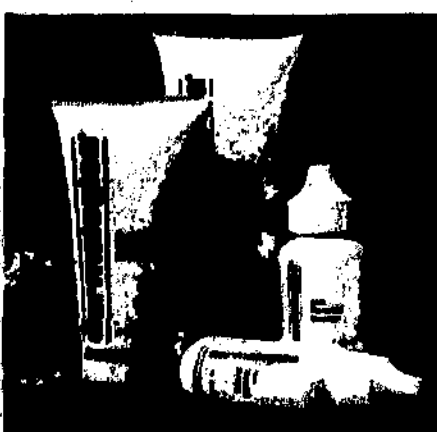

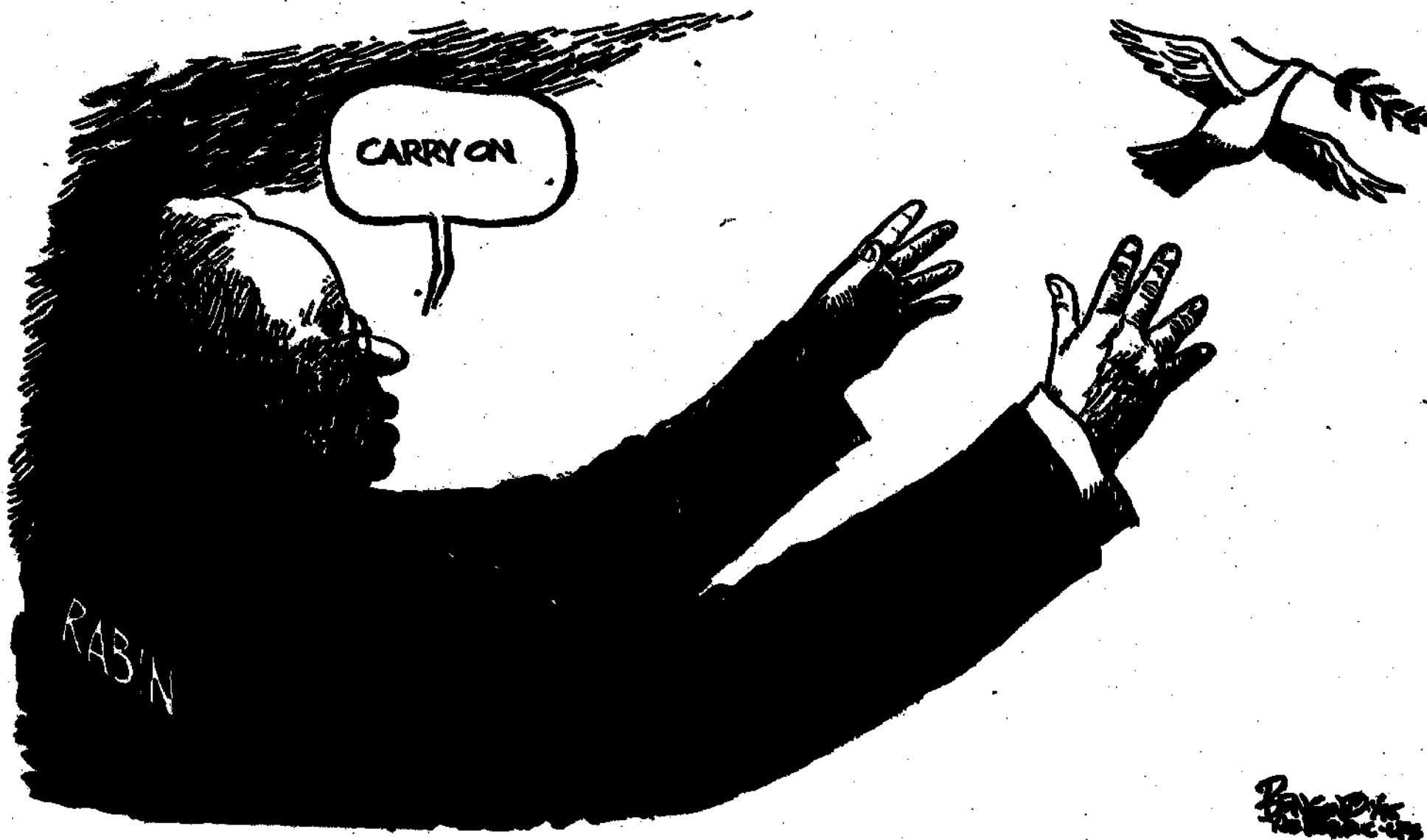
The Arts & Film Board will be canvassing local organizations connected to the arts, to gain even more input.

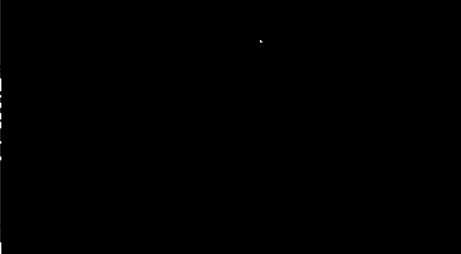

Army to Hold Public Information Sessions

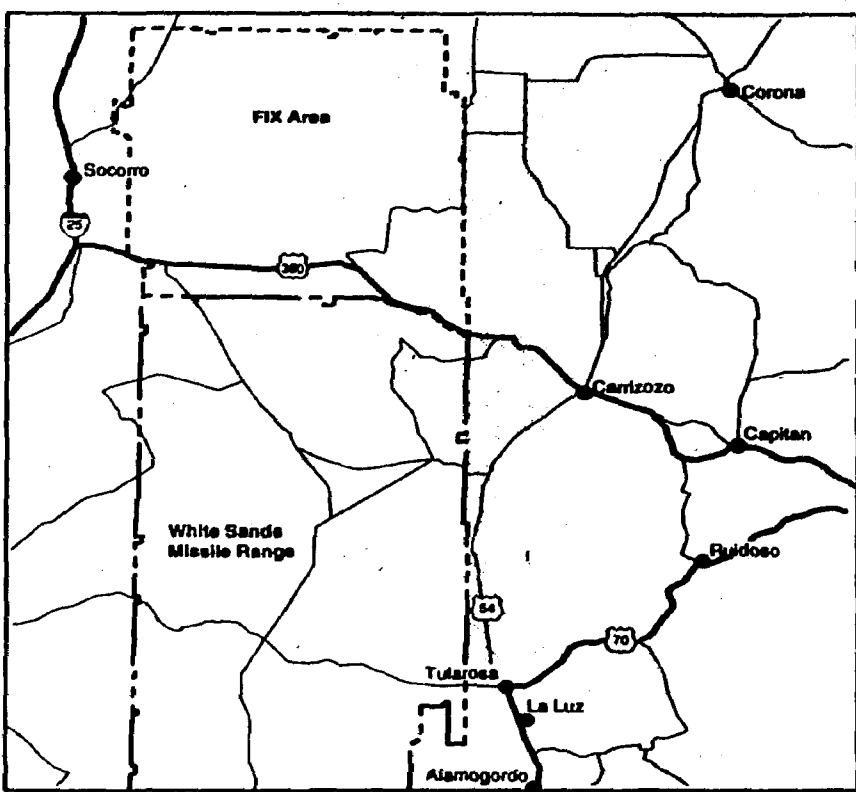
White Sands Missile Range (WSMR) in conjunction with the U. S. Army Space and Strategic Defense Command (USASSDC), will hold public information sessions on Monday, November 20, in Carrizozo, NM and on Tuesday, November 21, in Tularosa, NM.

During the sessions WSMR and USASSDC representatives will be available to discuss the potential for a small portion (less than 10 percent) of debris from missile-intercept tests at WSMR going beyond the east boundary of WSMR-controlled areas, including the currently restricted airspace.

The Theater Missile Defense Flight Test Environmental Assessment (EA), published in April 1995 indicated that all debris from TMD intercept tests would land within WSMR restricted airspace. As promised by the April 1995 EA, additional analyses have been conducted as the parameters for the intercept tests have been refined. These recent analyses indicated that, under certain wind conditions, there is a possibility that intercept debris may drift beyond the eastern boundary of WSMR-controlled areas and leave the currently restricted airspace.

Accordingly, the TMD Flight Test Supplement Environmental Assessment (SEA) is being prepared to analyze: (1) the potential for and risks associated with intercept debris landing beyond the eastern boundary of WSMR-controlled areas; and (2) a request for additional temporary restricted airspace. The SEA is scheduled to be completed and distributed on November 13, 1995. During the public information sessions on Nov. 20 and 21, WSMR representatives will be available to discuss flight safety, airspace procedures, and other related activities at WSMR. Representatives from USASSDC will be available to discuss ongoing missile programs and the process for evaluating the environmental impacts of these programs.

The sessions at Carrizozo will be held at the Carrizozo Recreation Center located near Spencer Park and U.S. Highway 380. The first session will be from 3 to 5 p.m. and the second session will be from 6:30 to 8:30 p.m. The sessions at Tularosa will be held at the Tularosa Community Center located at 1050 Bookout Rd. The first session will be from 3 to 5 p.m. and the second session will be from 6:30 to 8:30 p.m.
