#### Word due on Fort Stanton Thursday

By next Thursday, state General Services officials should have an idea which direction to take in finding a new tenant for Fort Stanton.

The lone bidder to lease the fort was rejected, and that company has until Dec. 13 to protest the decision, said public information officer Carolyn Jackson.

Although the letter rejecting the proposal of New Mexico Outreach Inc. was dated Nov. 21, executive director Terry Brannan didn't receive it in Albuquerque until Nov. 27, she said, so that's when the protest period started.

Meanwhile, general services officials are trying to find out why more than 300 companies expressed an interest, but did not bid on a lease. The state's specs may be modified to attract more bidders in a second round.

The fort was closed as a state hospital in March, when Gov. Gary Johnson said it cost too much to operate. It was the second-largest employer in the county.

#### Thursday concert benefits Rodeo Club at Capitan

A benefit concert for the Capitan Rodeo Team is set for 7 p.m. Thursday, Dec. 14 in the multipurpose room of the school complex.

For the third year, community musicians, dancers, poets and singers will lend their talents to raise money for the young cowboys and cowgirls. The money will be used to help defray expenses connected to the state and national finals.

Tickets are \$2 at the door and plenty of treats will be ready to sample.

## Ruidoso councilors hear another request for obscenity ordinance

As Ruidoso councilors gather Tuesday to hear a legal report on obscenity laws, they'll also hear a new proposal for one drafted by a local homemaker.

Dora LaBrecque says she decided to draft a law after the obscenity issue was last brought before the councilors Oct. 31.

"It looked like nothing was going to happen," LaBrecque said Friday. "I thought I'd see what I could do to push an ordinance through."

Her proposal puts a different spin on public obscenity. It refers to the public display of explicit sexual or obscene matter as a nuisance. According to state law, municipalities may define and

abate public nuisances and impose penalties.

LaBrecque's ordinance defines sexual material, obscene matter and obscene displays. It proposes village officials seize the public nuisance material if the violator fails to promptly remove it, and recommends maximum penalties of \$300 and 90 days in the county jail.

LaBrecque said her proposal would prevent public, outdoor displays of sexually explicit art like the statue carved by Ruidoso artist Candace Garrett outside her Sudderth Drive studio this summer.

"When I first saw the Garrett statue displayed on Sudderth Drive," LaBrecque wrote the councilors, "my jaw fell to the floor."

The statue, which is no longer

here, depicted a couple locked horizontally in a sensuous embrace. It prompted area residents in October to request a minimum standard of decency law.

Dennis Johnston, who co-filed a citizen's criminal complaint against Garrett in October over her art, is now helping LaBrecque in her pursuit of an ordinance. Johnston's complaint was dismissed in late October by the Ruidoso Magistrate Court after District Attorney Bert Atkins said it had no basis in law.

About the same time, the village council put off further consideration of an obscenity ordinance until its attorneys researched similar ordinances.

## Elks reluctantly disconnect video gaming machines

Electronic gaming machines tucked in the side room of the Ruidoso Elks Lodge have been the bulk source of scholarship and charity money for many Lincoln County residents.

But the Elks say the machines have been removed to storage, unplugged because the state supreme court ruled two weeks ago they were illegal.

Their removal precedes a sweep of Lincoln County's fraternal and charity organizations this week by the Department of Public Safety's special investigations bureau, deputy secretary Robert Perry said Friday. The bureau has already checked out Albuquerque-area clubs.

It's unfair, says Bobby Caudle, the local Elks' Exalted Ruler. The lodge never questioned its need to comply with the law, he said — but abiding by it doesn't make the Supreme Court ruling any more palatable.

"The Indians still have their machines going, but any charity organization — which donates all that money to charity — can't keep their machines going," Caudle complained.

His voice grew louder inside the dimly-lit Elks Lodge lounge, where he sat with his Chaplain, Pete Esquibel.

It was Saturday, a chilly but clear blue-sky day. Caudle, a construction worker by trade, had joined Esquibel after checking out a few job sites. Esquibel had just finished celebrating a birthday party

for his two children at the lodge on Highway 70 West. A few people sat up at the bar, sharing their tales.

"More charity is given out of our lodge per capita than any other (Elk) lodge in the state," Caudle said.

The 266 lodge members donate about \$60,000 annually to cerebral palsy programs, college scholarships, and activities for children, Caudle said. They also support other charitable needs, like a voice computer they bought last year to enable a severely disabled woman to speak after a serious accident (just a couple of days after her wedding), or the shelter provided last week for a Ruidoso man left homeless.

"We've never ignored a person in need if we can assist," Esquibel said.

A good half of that charity money came from the lodge's electronic poker machines, Caudle said. They'd been in the fraternal club for at least eight years, probably longer, he said.

Other funds come from the lodge's "fish night," rental of the lodge for special events, Bingo night (which is scheduled to start again in January), and other fundraisers.

Esquibel, a Ruidoso police detective, described the state court ruling as "very disheartening."

An organization like theirs focuses on helping people and making the community a better place to live, he said, but the Elks

# Young handicapped skier wins Ski Apache pass

Little Maria Trujillo, a handicapped skier, was asked to pick the name of a Ski Apache lift ticket winner out of a basket Saturday.

She picked her own name.

Some people in the audience at the Apache Snowflake Ball whispered that was unfair, but Maria was the only person in the room that couldn't be accused of unfairness: she is blind.

The ball, held at the Inn of the Mountain Gods on the Mescalero Apache Reservation, is a benefit for the Ski Apache Handicapped Skiers Association sponsored by *The Ruidoso News*. Maria joined SASHA last year. Also crippled with cerebral palsy, she expressed her excitement about winning the \$700 ticket, in her own way.

Emcee Ron Anderson and *Ruidoso News* advertising manager Christine Volquardsen both stood next to 11-year-old Maria as she picked up a handful of tickets. Anderson told her to shake them out and hold onto one. The lone remaining ticket, out of more than 100 in the basket, was upside down (although that made no difference).

"I just always thought she was real lucky," said Maria's mother, Cathy DeHerrera. Maria often picks

up matching symbols in a card game similar to Go Fish.

The DeHerrera family moved to Alamogordo four years ago from Taos so Maria could attend the state's School for the Visually Handicapped. An experienced skier, at first DeHerrera was sad she couldn't ski here — then she found out Ski Apache was nearby.

DeHerrera was recruited to be a SASHA volunteer for her daughter's school.

"At first I thought, 'Oh, my God, how will I teach blind people to ski?' DeHerrera recalled pondering. It wasn't long until someone suggested Maria join SASHA. DeHerrera was even more worried.

"I was terrified for Maria," DeHerrera admits, thinking her daughter would fall and injure her spine or something. But Maria was faithful to her instructors' directions, and she was soon snowplowing on the first day.

"I had tears in my eyes just to watch these kids and how hard they tried," DeHerrera said. "It's wonderful just as a parent to see there is hope out there...sometimes as a parent you get discouraged."

"It might be a little thing for you or me, but to them it's big."

Maria soon fell in love with the sport.

"She always wanted to take that one last run,"

DeHerrera recalled of Maria's first season. Now she's ready to ski again soon.

Maria called her father, who is divorced from DeHerrera, to tell him about how she won the ski pass Saturday night.

"She was just so excited," DeHerrera related. Maria talked so fast DeHerrera had to get on the phone and explain what her daughter was saying.

Maria also told her father about how she had modeled ski fashions at the Apache Snowflake Ball.

"She loves to show off," DeHerrera explained.

Maria was born blind with cerebral palsy and has about 5% of normal vision, DeHerrera said.

need money to make that happen. "It's difficult for us because we're upset. We do it for charity, they do it for profit," Esquibel said. "There's no regulatory oversight for their gaming and no one can stop them. The state allows it, and the feds allow it. But the reservation is still within the confines of New Mexico."

U.S. Attorney General John Kelly asked Indian leaders in a Friday meeting to shut down their casinos in light of the latest Supreme Court ruling, the *Albuquerque Journal* reported Saturday.

The paper quoted Mescalero Apache President Wendell Chino saying after the meeting that tribes will continue their gaming operations. The Mescalero operate a full-blown casino.

Both Esquibel and Caudle stressed the lodge is not a public gambling house, and Elks don't come to the lodge specifically to gamble. They come to socialize and pool their ideas on how to help people, the men said.

The Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks of the United States of America (formerly the Jolly Order of Elks) was founded circa 1890. The Elks welcome new Elks-sponsored members who are Americans with "upstanding moral values who meet our criteria to join the lodge," Caudle said.

Humility underlies lodge statutes, the "let's not pat ourselves on the back" credo that makes the Elks so misunderstood by the general public, both men said.

The lack of bravado has made the club's gambling machines and its proceeds appear somewhat secretive. But that shouldn't be so, the Chaplain and Exalted Ruler said.

"We don't just sit around and say, 'Someone should do something about that,'" Esquibel said. "We say, 'We will do something about it.'"

Caudle said he called the state police in Alamogordo Thursday after anticipated instructions from the Department of Public Safety regarding the state Supreme Court's ruling failed to come.

"They advised me to disconnect them," Caudle said. "It's the reason we jerked the machines out immediately, so we're with the state laws."

## Burglary charges filed against 13-year-old boy from Ruidoso

Residential burglary charges were filed against a 13-year-old Ruidoso boy Thursday after police found a match in fingerprints left at a crime scene, a police detective reported.

The same boy was already referred to juvenile authorities Monday of last week, after an alleged weekend crime spree. Police arrested him for allegedly shoplifting Dec. 3, and filed a complaint against him for allegedly stealing \$50 from a girl and assaulting a Ruidoso Middle School bus driver at a Port Drive bus stop on Dec. 1.

When caught shoplifting, the boy was fingerprinted at the police station. Detective Jim Biggs found the boy's right index finger print was a clear match to a latent print found at a burglarized Grove Drive house, Biggs said.

The match cleared the way for Biggs to file the third-degree felony burglary charge against the boy.

Residents of the burglarized

house found it had been entered when they returned home Nov. 11. It could have been broken into as early as Oct. 30 when they left town, police said.

The homeowners found books thrown about, rooms rummaged, and a portable radio/cassette player missing, police said.

On Nov. 11 one of the homeowners saw the 13-year-old suspect by a neighborhood dumpster and asked him if he might know who stole his radio.

The boy allegedly said he knew who took it and that he could get the radio back, Biggs said.

The man watched the boy go into his house a few doors down the street. He allegedly returned with the radio within five minutes.

The owner offered the boy a reward, asked him his name, and wrote him a \$25 check. He then contacted police and gave them the boy's name and address.

The boy was unknown to police until his name was revealed on the check.

A few days after the homeowner gave the boy the reward, Biggs

called the boy and his parents to his office for an interview. The boy allegedly told Biggs a rich friend gave him the radio.

"The kid has not been in any trouble previously," Biggs said, adding that he does not know the boy's history. "When I interviewed him, he didn't seem to have an attitude toward me or the law. I wanted to give him the benefit of doubt. Then he was involved in all this over the weekend."

Police plan to interview the other boy this week, but said only one set of fingerprints were found at the burglarized house.

During his interview with the 13-year-old, Biggs asked him if he might have touched the glass at the house. The boy allegedly said he may have touched it after returning the radio, but he wasn't sure.

The prints were lifted by Sergeant Robert Achterberg before the radio was returned, Biggs said.

If found guilty of the felony charge, juvenile probation and court authorities could send the boy to Springer for up to two years, Biggs said.

The attorneys will give a report on their findings at Tuesday's council meeting.

LaBrecque, a mother of two girls, said she wants councilors to approve her law so images of sexual activity aren't forced on children

before parents think they're ready.

"Ms. Garrett has three more blocks of granite out in her drive," LaBrecque wrote the councilors in a cover letter. "I think one can safely assume that the new statues will be in a similar vein."

Morality in Media president Robert Peters helped LaBrecque

draft the proposed ordinance.

Peters, a New York attorney, suggested LaBrecque use a Kenosha, Wisc. ordinance as her model, because it applies only to material displayed "in a manner or location so as to be easily visible...from the public street, thoroughfare or highway, or from the property of others."

# Commissioners finalize donation to Nevada county to fight feds in court

Unless the state nixes the payment, Lincoln County will send \$5,000 to the Nye County Commission toward its fight with the federal government over public lands ownership.

Lincoln County Commissioners voted 3-1 last week to approve a \$5,000 contract with the Nye Commission. The money will help cover Nye's legal fees in a lawsuit filed against them by the U.S. Forest Service and Bureau of Land Management.

A direct donation to the lawsuit is illegal under state law, so the commissioners have specified they will receive services for the \$5,000 contribution. A contract says the county will receive copies of pleadings and other documents, as well as briefings from the Nye commission.

County Attorney Alan Morel said he will send the contract to the state Department of Finance and Administration (DFA) for its review and approval. If it does not meet the necessary standards, he will bring up the issue at the commission meeting in January.

County Manager Carolin Cooney

said the budget director at the DFA had some concerns about the agreement, and the Nye County Commission had not yet approved it.

Commissioner Wilton Howell voted against the motion, saying Lincoln County is not truly receiving any services for the \$5,000 and had no business contributing to another county's battles.

"If we paid directly for those documents, it would cost only \$255 to provide copies," Howell said. "The Nye commission has the ability to tax its own citizens to cover the litigation costs. I still contend it's wrong. We're not a party to the suit."

Nye's legal bills already have hit \$280,000 and it budgeted only \$80,000, Howell said — and the final bill may be \$2 million.

The Nye County case could set a precedent for counties' future relationships with the federal government, said Commissioner Stirling Spencer. Many Western counties have pushed for their states to take management of public lands out of federal hands, saying they could do a better job.

# Residents support return of wolves on local missile range

A League of Women Voters poll has found that the majority of New Mexicans support the reintroduction of wolves on the White Sands Missile Range.

League officials said an anonymous person gave them the money to conduct the scientific poll, because the league is considered unbiased in the hot debate.

The U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service proposes to release the wolves on the missile range, which lies west of Ruidoso on the other side of the Sacramento Mountains. Farm organizations and some state agencies have taken a stance against it.

Overall, people throughout the state were slightly more open to the idea of reintroducing wolves to the wild than were people in counties near the release areas.

Pollsters from Responsive Management of Harrisonburg, Va. interviewed 218 adult residents statewide, plus another 204 adults in the counties of Grant, Sierra, Catron and Otero, because they are closest to the wolf release areas. Results of the statewide poll and regional poll were separated.

The poll has a plus or minus 7% margin of error.

The poll's respondents were about evenly split between age, political parties and rural vs. urban areas.

**Results include:**

60% of the people in the state strongly support reintroduction of the wolf into the White Sands Missile Range, while 52% of those in the region moderately or strongly support it;

— the main reasons New Mexicans gave for their support of the wolves' return at WSMR were: save from extinction (32%), they were here before us (25%), part of ecosystem (18%), love for animals (6%), good location (5%), wolves are beautiful (3%), and other (10%);

— the main reason opponents didn't want the wolves to return were: will kill livestock (46%), dangerous to people (13%), poor location (9%), would not work (7%), wolves would roam outside WSMR (7%) and other (18%);

— 60% in the state moderately or strongly supported compensating ranchers for livestock killed by wolves;

— 74% of statewide respondents agreed that "although I may never see a Mexican wolf in the wild, it is important to know they exist in New Mexico;"

— and 50% of the state's residents disagreed with the statement, "the country's Endangered Species Act is an anti-development act being used to lock up land," while 35% agreed.

One measly offensive rebound was the difference between the Ruidoso boys playing for third place or the championship at the Bruce King Invitational in Moriarty during the weekend.

With Ruidoso and Moriarty tied at 52, and 17 seconds left in Friday's semifinal game, the Pintos set up their offense for the game-winning shot. Moriarty's best player got off an attempt, but missed.

Unfortunately for the Warriors, they missed the rebound. A Pinto grabbed the loose ball and hit a 3-foot shot for the winning basket, advancing Moriarty to the finals.

The 54-52 loss to the Pintos was the only blemish on the Warriors' weekend mark. Ruidoso polished off Shiprock, 58-46, for third place Saturday.

All in all, Ruidoso coach Ben Sanchez liked the way his team played — defensively and offensively — in Moriarty. The Warriors improved to 4-2 overall.

"We played a good tournament. We played good defense. We out-rebounded people," Sanchez said.

Ruidoso's defense made it tough for opponents, holding Las Vegas Robertson to 40% shooting from the field, Moriarty to 38%, and Shiprock to a paltry 31%.

The Warriors also increased their accuracy from the field, hitting 43% for the weekend.

"We've been shooting the ball better," Sanchez said. "I'd like to think it's because we've been shooting the ball in practice more, but

shooting is a strange thing."

Ruidoso opened the tourney with a 61-68 win over Las Vegas Robertson Thursday. The Warrior held the two best Cardinals, Lenny Gallegos and Clyde Sanchez, to 16 points.

The Warriors controlled the game, leading by eight to 10 points most of the way. But the Cardinals' press got that team back in it and made it close at the end. Senior point guard Cory Hood paced the Warriors with 24 points.

Only one Shiprock player cracked double figures in the third-place game. Post player Mike Johnson scored 17 points, but Shiprock's other threat, guard Waco Wade (who should be an all-name tournament team candidate), was held to three points.

As a testament to the Warriors' team play, Hood was the only Ruidoso player on the all-tourney team.

The Warriors have a tough week ahead of them. Ruidoso hosts New Mexico Military Institute Tuesday, and then travels to defending Class AAA champion Artesia Friday.

NMII's Colts no longer have Taymon Domzalaki, who is playing for Duke University, but they do have 6-11 Jared Peña.

"He's every bit of 6-11. He's not as good as Taymon Domzalaki, but he's good. It's a chore to stop him," Sanchez said.

Ruidoso will try to take the big guy out of the game by pressing and dropping back into a match-up zone, Sanchez said. "We're going to put a lot of people around and keep him off the glass," Sanchez explained.

## Rams too much for girls

Coach Dwayne Rogers' girls team fell to Portales, 68-41, Friday. Still, the Warriors had their best outing on the floor for the season.

"We played our best game. We didn't beat ourselves. They just beat us on the boards," Rogers said.

Ruidoso needs to get more aggressive rebounding the ball, Rogers explained.

"We're still a little tentative. I need to find that five who are willing to push and shove (for rebounds)," he said.

Senior forward Angelica Figueroa scored 15 points in the first half against the Rams to lead the Warriors.

The 0-4 Warriors had trouble at the start of the season taking care of the basketball, but not so against the Rams.

# Turn on headlights vs. DWIs on Friday

The next time you raise a glass of alcohol to toast the holiday season, it might be a good idea to remind yourself of some sobering facts.

Statistics from the New Mexico State Highway and Transportation Department show that during 1994, 50,275 vehicle accidents happened in New Mexico. Of that number, 447 people died and 29,910 were injured.

Alcohol was involved in 5,165 of the crashes, or 10.3%.

Lincoln County had 699 crashes resulting in six deaths and 323 injuries in 1994. Alcohol was involved in 45 (14%) of those accidents.

Nationwide last year, 16,600 people died as a result of alcohol-related crashes.

To highlight the drinking and driving problem here, the Region IX Safe and Drug-Free Schools are joining law enforcement and other groups in the Lights on for Life program Friday, Dec. 15.

Lights on for Life is a one-day nationwide observance in remembrance of people killed or injured in alcohol-related crashes.

Participants in the program are urging motorists throughout the country to turn their vehicle head-

lights on as they drive throughout that day.

"This sends a positive message to the community and reminds the public that during the holidays, law enforcement officials will be cracking down on those who choose to drink and drive and place innocent people's lives in jeopardy," said Kathy Garrett, the Safe and Drug Free Schools and Communities coordinator at Region IX. "I encourage all residents to join us and take a stand against impaired driving by turning on their headlights on Friday, Dec. 15."

Ruidoso Police Chief Lanny Maddox also supports the program.

"This observance is important because with all of the parties and celebrations during the holidays, impaired drivers are always a problem," Maddox said. "This event will help to focus attention on the impaired driving issue and hopefully prevent people from getting behind the wheel after drinking."

Local police plan to step up patrols, DWI checkpoints and traffic enforcement tactics during the holiday season, Maddox said.

"Anything and everything that we can do, we will do," he said. "Just the fact that it's the holiday season is no excuse to break the law."

## Christmas Season Sky Colors

A glimpse into Lincoln County's past, compiled by Polly E. Chavez with excerpts from John Haley's 1913 Lincoln County Yearbook.

John C. West was born in Tularosa in 1870. He was education in the public schools and at Loretta Academy in Las Cruces. He and his wife had one child. In 1913 he resided in San Patricio. For a number of years he was employed with Rosenthal Co. West was engaged in the mercantile business at San Patricio, where he was postmaster for

three years.

Robert A. Hurt came to New Mexico in 1891 and to Lincoln county and Capitan in 1899. He was born at Whitewright, Grayson County, Texas. Hurt was educated in public schools of Texas, Buffalo Gap College and the University of Texas, Department of Pharmacy. He was in the drugstore business at Capitan for many years. He and wife, Myrtle had three children. Hurt served as justice of peace at Capitan 1901-1902. He was Lincoln County assessor in 1903-1906 and again in 1909-1911.





## New hours set for landfill at Capitan

The debris landfill at Capitan will operate under different hours starting this week.

The new hours are from 8 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.

The landfill, recycling center and administration offices of the Lincoln County Solid Waste Authority will be closed Dec. 24-25.

## County to look at medical director

To better define the role of medical director for Lincoln County emergency medical services, commissioners want to draft a contract.

They also voted last week to advertise for all interested physicians to apply.

The contract will spell out the duties and authority of the medical director and the job's relationship with the county government. It may also include some compensation for the job, which has been a volunteer position up to this point.

Dr. Michael Hall agreed to continue to serve as medical director until commissioners decide who to hire. Hall indicated he may respond to the county's advertisement. The medical director supervises emergency medical technicians on ambulance runs.

## Subdivision regulations revised by county

In the fourth hearing on revisions to Lincoln County's subdivision regulations, county commissioners last week unanimously approved the amended ordinance

after walking through each change.

The only significant difference from a draft hammered out last month was to specify that land developers' disclosure statements must tell buyers that future lot subdivisions require commission approval.

Previously, commissioners wanted the provision included as a deed restriction, but now decided it was more appropriate in the disclosure statement. The provision is not retroactive.

## County and village work on finding new cemetery

Lincoln County Commissioners are willing to work with the village of Ruidoso to establish a new community cemetery.

The existing village government cemetery on Mechem Drive will run out of plots in six to 10 years, Village Manager Gary Jackson told commissioners last week. The cemetery lies in the unincorporated portion of the county, one of several pockets the Ruidoso council is trying to annex.

"Will it make any difference if it's 10 miles away as long as the county owns the land?" Commissioner Bill Schwettmann asked in reference to a new cemetery site. "We don't want bodies thrown all over the county."

The county owns lots in Alto, an old landfill on the way to Sierra Blanca Regional Airport and land around its sub-office near village hall on Kansas City Street, Chairman Monroy Montes said.

Commissioner Wilton Howell said he didn't want the county to compete with private enterprise, pointing out that a longtime resi-

dent runs a cemetery in the Hondo Valley.

Commissioners asked County Manager Carolin Cooney to coordinate the joint project.

## Capitan senior center roof will be replaced

Local contractor Lloyds of Logan will replace the roof on the Zia Senior Citizens building in Capitan.

Lincoln County Commissioners awarded a \$11,759 contract to the company last week, although County Manager Carolin Cooney and County Attorney Alan Morel recommended that all six bids be rejected.

Morel cited complaints by two bidders that they did not receive addendums to the bid specifications sent by regular mail.

But Commissioner Bill Schwettmann said state law does not require the bids and addendums to be sent by registered mail. Bidders have a responsibility to call and check before they send in their responses, he said.

His motion to award the bid passed 3-1 with Commissioner Wilton Howell voting against it and Commissioner L. Ray Nunley absent. Howell said commissioners should listen to the advice of their attorney. Morel and Cooney have been revamping the methods used by the commission office in handling bids.

## Commissioners fill vacant board seats

Three members of the Lincoln County Agriculture and Rural Af-

fairs Committee were reappointed by county commissioners last week to serve new terms. They are Jolinda Perryman, Kathleen Hellman and Joel Bonnell.

David Vigil was reappointed to serve as a property owner representative on the Lincoln Historic Preservation Board. Commissioners named Dick Swenor to serve as a member-at-large, replacing Herahel Anderson.

Reappointed to the county Senior Citizens Olympic Committee were Wayne Mason and Virginia Danielson, both from Capitan.

## County wants judge to order inmates use of ankle monitors

Lincoln County jail inmates may have no choice whether to stay in jail or to live on the outside while being tracked by an ankle monitor.

Commissioners told detention center administrator Wayland Hill to talk to local judges about ordering certain inmates to participate as part of their sentence. They want a six-month test to determine whether the monitors will work in Lincoln County.

The county has been eyeing the use of ankle devices as a way to free up space in the county jail. Nearly all of its 50 beds are full.

But when Hill asked inmates if they were interested, they rejected the idea, primarily because they had to pay for the program.

Judges in Otero County order inmates to use the monitors, which also relieves the county of liability for inmates' actions while on the program, said John Whitely in a meeting with Lincoln County com-

missioners last week. Whitely monitors inmates in Otero County. Since January, Otero had four failures out of 72 clients. Three escaped and one became intoxicated, Whitely said.

During that same time period, the county avoided 2,000 man days in jail that would have cost the county \$130,000, he said. It cost

\$12,000 to monitor the inmates and \$8,000 of that was recouped through payments by the participants.

Whitely said the program prevents people from losing their jobs, helps them pay off fines and keeps them better motivated, while decreasing medical care and other maintenance costs to the county.



### Keep that chimney clean for Santa — and for your own protection

When the Ruidoso Downs mayor was recently called out of a council meeting because the chimney on his house caught fire, it brought home a common problem.

As the woodburning season gets underway, homeowners need to think about chimney fire prevention. Ruidoso fireman Robby Hall confirms that every year, local firemen are called to several chimney fires. Many could have been prevented with a little maintenance.

If your woodstove isn't drawing well, it's a sure sign it has too much creosote buildup. Shine a flashlight through both ends of the chimney, and you'll see the problem.

There are several hardware stores where you can buy a chimney cleaning kit, or you can save yourself the hassle and mess and hire someone to do it. Professionals are likely to do a better job because they know more about pipe separations, etc.

Other tips include:

- check with a flashlight for separations in the chimney pipe;

- burn well-seasoned hardwood to reduce the amount of creosote (it's amazing how much more tar is produced by wood cut less than a year ago);

- make sure the top of your chimney has a spark arrestor because sparks can easily catch your roof on fire, especially if you have a wood shingle roof — and if you have an arrestor, make sure there aren't any holes in it;

- and of course, you have to dispose of wood ashes regularly, so always put them in a metal container, wet them down, and leave them a few days before disposing of them in a community dumpster (this is another common reason for calls to the fire department).




### The facts behind Senate's Medicare plan

New Mexicans are hearing a lot about Medicare. The most important thing I can do is provide the facts — especially on Medicare.

The first fact New Mexicans should know is that Medicare is going bankrupt. The six Medicare trustees, four of whom work for the president, said that Medicare "will be able to pay benefits for only about seven years and is severely out of financial balance in the long range." The bipartisan public trustees said, "We strongly recommend that the crisis presented by the financial condition of the Medicare Trust Funds be urgently addressed on a comprehensive basis, including a review of the program's financial methods, benefit provisions, and delivery mechanisms." To claim there is no crisis, or that we can save Medicare by doing less, is irresponsible and false.

It is a fact that the Senate plan will prevent Medicare from going bankrupt past the year 2006. Guy King, former chief actuary of Medicare, has testified that the alternative plan offered by Democrats, which would save

\$89 billion, would keep Medicare solvent only through the next election.

Another fact is that under the Senate Medicare reform plan, Medicare spending will increase \$1,900 per person over the next seven years. Some say the Senate plan cuts Medicare. That's false. Under the Senate plan, the federal government would spend \$414 million more on New Mexico Medicare beneficiaries in 2002 than it will spend this year. Nationwide, over the next seven years, the Senate plan would spend \$1.6 trillion on Medicare.

Two years ago the President told AARP, "Medicare is going up at three times the rate of inflation. We propose to let it go up at two times the rate of inflation. That is not a Medicare cut...We are going to have increases in Medicare."

The Senate Medicare plan slows the program's growth from more than three times inflation to two times inflation, or about 6.4% per year. Two years ago, the president said that wasn't a cut.

Also, the Senate plan keeps the Medicare premium at its current 31.5%. However, af-

luent retirees — the richest 10% — may pay slightly more than 31.5%. Finally, the plan would increase the part B deductible from \$100 to \$150. Had the original \$50 deductible in 1965 kept up with inflation, it would be \$242 today.

The real focus of the Senate Medicare reform plan is to give senior citizens more choices in Medicare. It attempts to give seniors the same choices that privately employed citizens (and members of Congress) have. The Senate Medicare reform plan provides seniors with many more choices than the current Medicare system. Seniors can choose any of several types of managed care health plans, a privately-offered fee-for-service option, or remain in the current Medicare system. No one will be forced to give up their doctor.

If we make the hard choices necessary to balance the budget and save Medicare, New Mexico and the rest of the nation will experience economic growth. Interest rates will fall, the economy will grow faster, and more jobs will be created. The true economic danger that faces New Mexico is the danger of inaction.

It is difficult to imagine a better, more perfect example of a tyrannical feudalistic organization being occultly protected by what popularly but mistakenly passes for a modern democratic state than the relationship between the PUBLIC UTILITY COMMISSION and THE JEMEZ MOUNTAIN ELECTRIC COOPERATIVE.

Why this relic from the epoch when the rural electrification program was a useful device to make more generally available a useful energy source for an otherwise deprived section of the community should be allowed, nay encouraged, to translate its mandate into a tool of suppression, harassment and a public annoyance lies only in the power of graft, with the end result that what started out as a service to the rural community is now a source of its enslavement.

While this relationship is tolerated and Jemez continues to ignore its responsibilities and federal court orders to change its behavior, P.U.C. stands by castrated by legislative inaction and happily collects its salaries from statewide tax revenues.

In the meantime those who are

"served" by Jemez have their literary compositions erased from their computers, their VCR capabilities seriously interrupted amounting to a massive program of corporate censorship, perhaps even more effective than that of the Vatican, their digital clocks stopped contributing to work tardiness, their motion detectors and security alarms compromised leaving other wise safe people open to possibly fatal intrusions, meanwhile the service is turned on and the Jemez meters run until clients are able to reestablish a normal situation. Who knows what added revenues are metered by Jemez through their design and opposed to the desires of the consumers. What other businesses are allowed to extort from its clients?

Jemez attributes the frequent outages to circumstances beyond their control. This assumed innocence is pure artifice since their outrageous, illegal and immoral behavior in the area of criminal trespass continues, however, if Governor Johnson is serious about public expenditures and in balancing the state budget he might make himself politically popular among tens of thousands of rural voters nationally were he to work for the dissolution of the Rural Electrification Administration.

Take to the streets with protest signs and if all else fails, march on the capitol.



## ABOUT CATARACTS

Cataracts — the clouding over of the lens of the eye — are associated with aging. As the cataracts develop, images of light entering the eye become distorted; vision gets fuzzy.

There's no telling how long it will take for a cataract to develop; it may take years before it clouds over the entire lens. This varies from person to person, even between eyes in the same person. While the cataract is forming, eyeglasses are usually effective to correct vision. When the clouding is complete and eyeglasses no longer can improve vision in that eye, surgery is often indicated.

What causes cataracts? Chemical changes associated with aging and/or hereditary factors may be prime causes. There is also evidence that sun damage over the years may hasten cataracts. Diabetes may be a factor, too. A sudden eye injury can cause a traumatic cataract — yet another reason to see Drs. Gutowski and Sonnenmoser promptly in case of injury.

**For those considering adopting a potbellied pig, Jim Riggs, director of the Lincoln County Humane Society shelter, offered some advice.**

Some of the advantages of owning a potbellied pig, included they do not bark or bite; do not have an unpleasant odor; and they can be trained to use a litter box, a pet door and to walk on a leash.

**Pothellies originated in Southeast Asia and China, Riggin said. They're descended from Eurasian feral pigs and were domesticated as house pets and for food as early as the 10th century.**

Most communities don't have any laws governing potbellied pigs, Riggins said.

"They usually are classified as an exotic pet, not native to the United States and are to be kept for personal enjoyment and companionship," he said.

Unfortunately, like many pet fads, when owners tire of the animals, they dispose of them at shelters. But others continue to appreciate the animal's special qualities and have formed rescue groups.

**"To be classified as potbellied, they should have a straight tail," Riggins said. "A**

**curly tail indicates it is not a mini and could become huge."**

Other points mentioned by Riggins included:

— potbellied pigs will eat anything you feed them. More food is needed in colder months;

— foods that seemed to irritate their digestive systems include corn, chocolate, tomatoes and green peppers;

— foods considered treats are watermelon rind, grapes, cereal, salad, sliced apples, oranges, raisins, melons and unsalted, unbuttered popcorn;

— and they get along well with other animals, but will try to dominate dogs.

**Always keep water available for a potbellied pig, because it can dehydrate in a matter of hours, Riggins said. A spill-proof heavy crock works best, because the pig will root the bowl with its snout.**

**Specially formulated foods for miniature pigs are available at most pet and feed stores. Purina sells a nutritionally complete pig chow.**

**Papaya is recommended for their diet, because of its high vitamin C content and minerals. The black seeds act as a natural wormer. Avocados are good for skin conditioning.**


